## SETTING THE SCENE

Starting 2-0 for the sixth straight season, the Indiana football team hits the road for the first time in 2009 with a visit to Akron. The Hoosiers will be the second team to visit brand new InfoCision Stadium (30,000) on Saturday, Sept. 19. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. EDT and the game will be televised on ESPNU.

IU moved to 2-0 following a 23-19 victory over Western Michigan on Sept. 12. Senior **Demetrius McCray** ran for a career-high 134 yards with a 59-yard score and senior defensive end **Greg Middleton** forced a WMU fumble at the Hoosier 8-yard line with 1:20 remaining to preserve the victory.

**Bill Lynch** became the first Indiana head coach to open his career with three consecutive 2-0 starts.

## THE AKRON SERIES

Indiana and Akron will meet for the second time on Saturday. The Hoosiers beat the Zips, 41-24, at Memorial Stadium on Sept. 15, 2007.

## AKRON TIES

Indiana offensive line coach **Bobby Johnson** is an Akron native and he spent four years at Akron as a graduate assistant (1995-96) and defensive line coach (1997-98).

Akron offensive coordinator and tight ends coach Shane Montgomery was the offensive coordinator under Terry Hooppner at Miami (Ohio) from 2001-04 and the RedHawks head coach from 2005-08. He coached on the same staff as Johnson, IU co-defensive coordinators **Brian George** and **Joe Palcic**, wide receivers coach **Billy Lynch** and defensive ends coach/co-special teams coordinator **George Ricumstrict**.

Defensive quality control assistant **Tim Cooper** served as Montgomery's defensive backs coach from 2005-08.

## IU VS. THE MAC

This is the second of back-to-back Mid-American Conference opponents for the Hoosiers. IU downed Western Michigan, 23-19, at Memorial Stadium on Sept. 12, to improve to 33-6-1 (.838) all-time against MAC foes.

## SCOUTING AKRON

Akron enters Saturday's contest with a 1-1 record. The Zips blanked Morgan State in the InfoCision Stadium debut, 41-0, on Sept. 12, after Penn State dropped them 31-7 in the season opener on Sept. 5.

Senior quarterback Chris Jacquemain leads an offense with nine starting returnees from 2008. He has thrown for 320 yards with four touchdowns and

one interception on the young season. Jacquemain has completed 26-of-44 passes (59.1 percent) and owns a 145.64 passing efficiency.

The Zips return two talented wide receivers from a year ago. Jacquemain's top target thus far has been Deryn Bowser. A 2008 third team All-MAC selection, Bowser (64 catches, 785 yards and 4 TDs last year) leads the Zips with 149 yards and 11 receptions and is responsible for all four of the team's scores through the air. Senior Jeremy Bruce (47, 678, 7) has seven catches for 72 yards.

In addition to its 172 passing yards per game, Akron is averaging 139 yards on the ground. Sophomore Dale Martin leads the backs with 64 yards on just six carries, all against Morgan State, while senior Alex Allen has the team's lone rushing score with 52 yards on 18 attempts.

Akron runs a 3-4 defensive scheme and returns six starters from last year. The Zips have picked off three passes, recovered one fumble and recorded two sacks thus far in 2009.

Redshirt freshman middle linebacker Brian Wagner paces the team with 18 tackles and 10 solos to go along with one sack, one interception and two forced fumbles. Sophomore strong-side linebacker Aaron Williams is right behind Wagner with 16 tackles and leads the team with three tackles for loss.

J.D. Brookhart is in his sixth season at Akron and is 28-34 during his tenure. He earned 2004 MAC Coach of the Year honors, and he led the school to its first MAC East division title, first MAC championship and the Motor City Bowl in 2005.

#### OHIO CONNECTION

Sixteen Hoosiers hail from the state of Ohio. **Chris Banks** (Alliance), **Larry Black, Jr.** (Cincinnati), **Ted Bolser** (Cincinnati), **Javon Cornley** (Columbus), **Mitchell Evans** (West Milton), **Ray Fisher** (Cleveland), **Kyle Kozak** (Columbus), **Brad Martin** (Marion), **Pat McShane** (Stow), **Adam Replogle** (Centerville), **Tyler Replogle** (Centerville), **Rodger Saffold** (Bedford), **Pete Saxon** (Plain City), **Damon Sims** (Cincinnati), **Jarrod Smith** (Fairborn) and **Eric Thomas** (Cleveland) all came to Bloomington from the Buckeye State.

#### THE CLOSERS

For the second straight week, IU forced a crucial fumble inside the 10-yard line in the waning moments of the Western Michigan game. Senior defensive end **Greg Middleton** forced his third career fumble at the Hoosier 8-yard line and senior linebacker **Justin Carrington** collected his first fumble recovery with 1:20 remaining to preserve the 23-19 victory.

In the season opener against Eastern Kentucky, senior cornerback **Ray Fisher** jarred a fumble loose with 11:49 left at the Indiana 5-yard line. Senior defensive end **Jammie Kirlew** recovered and the Hoosiers pulled out a 19-13 victory.

#### D-MAC ON TRACK

**Demetrius McCray** earned the starting running back job in camp and has proved why the first two weeks. The fifth-year senior rushed for a career-high 134 yards on 17 attempts (7.9 average) with a 59-yard TD jaunt vs. Western Michigan.

His 134 yards were the most by an IU running back since Marcus Thigpen ran for 140 against Purdue in the 2007 Old Oaken Bucket Game. It is also the most

by a Hoosier since Kellen Lewis ran for 148 against Ball State in 2008. His 59-yarder was the longest rush of his career. It marked the Hoosiers' longest play from scrimmage since a **Ben Chappell** 64-yard scoring strike to **Ray Fisher** against Central Michigan (Nov. 1, 2008) and the longest run since a Thigpen 77-yard scamper in the same game.

The Brandon, Fla., native leads the Hoosiers with 183 yards, 30 attempts and a 6.1 average through two games. He also tops all IU backs with 855 career yards on 199 rushes, good for a 4.3 average, and has crossed the goal line five times.

#### MITCHELL ON THE MOVE

After dabbling at quarterback last season, **Mitchell Evans** was back at it again vs. Western Michigan. The junior wideout rushed six times for 35 yards and threw one pass in 11 snaps behind center.

As a wideout, Evans caught two balls for 31 yards. He even made two tackles on special teams.

The West Milton, Ohio, native arrived to Indiana as a true freshman quarterback during 2007 preseason camp. Evans moved to safety and played the entire 2007 season at the position. He played quarterback during 2008 spring practice and opened preseason camp there before moving to his current position of wide receiver. Evans saw action at wideout most of 2008, but he also played quarterback against Central Michigan, Wisconsin and Penn State.

He has been a special teams stalwart since playing as a true freshman. Following each of the first two games, Evans was named one of the team's special teams players of the week after earning the honor six times in 2008.

#### NEW SEASON, NEW LEADERSHIP

Following the 2008 season, the senior class immediately took it upon themselves to make sure there would not be a repeat performance in 2009. The 19 scholarship seniors, all of whom will contribute significantly this season, brought a new intensity, beginning with 6 a.m. winter workouts, and held themselves and their teammates accountable.

Coupled with the 18 scholarship juniors, the Hoosiers have 35-plus scholarship upperclassmen for the first time since 2001 (36). The upperclassmen made it a point to keep the players around this summer, as nearly the entire team stayed in Bloomington.

That attitude carried over into camp, as observers and coaching staff noted a different feel around this team. The extra work and perseverance continued with the most physical camp during their IU tenures.

It has also carried over into the regular season. Seniors **Ray Fisher** and **Greg Middleton** forced game-saving fumbles inside the IU 10-yard line that were recovered by seniors **Jammie Kirlew** and **Justin Carrington** in games one and two, respectively. After going 1-4 in contests where the score was within one possession in the fourth quarter a season ago, the Hoosiers are 2-0 in 2009.

#### END GAME

The Hoosiers own two of the nation's top defensive ends in **Jammie Kirlew** and **Greg Middleton**. The All-America candidates own 38 career combined sacks, the highest total for a tandem in the country.

Both players appear on the Watch List for the 2009 Ted Hendricks Defensive End of the Year Award. Kirlew, one of six finalists for the honor in 2008, and Middleton, one of eight finalists for the award in 2007, are two of 30 preseason candidates. The two are one of only a pair of teammates from the same university on the list, joining Oklahoma ends Jeremy Beal and Austin English.

Kirlew recovered a key fourth quarter fumble in the opener and moved up the Hoosier career charts with three tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks against Western Michigan. He moved into third on IU's tackles for loss career list (41) and jumped into fifth on the career sacks chart (18). Kirlew now has three career games with three-or-more tackles for loss and 12 multi-TFL games in his career.

The Orlando native was also selected to the Chuck Bednarik and Rotary Lombardi Award Watch Lists in addition to being named first team All-Big Ten by *Lindy's* preseason magazine and *Sporting News*

and preseason All-Big Ten by *Athlon Sports*. *Lindy's* also rated him the eighth-best end in the country.

Kirlew earned first team All-Big Ten from the conference media and second team by the league's coaches and collected honorable mention *SI.com* All-American honors last season. He also secured second team *Rivals.com* All-Big Ten and received the team's Anthony Thompson MVP Award, outstanding defensive lineman award and defensive player of the year honors. Kirlew finished the 2008 campaign with 10.5 sacks and 19.5 tackles for loss, both ranked fourth on Indiana's single-season list. Additionally, he was second in the Big Ten and tied for 14th nationally in sacks and third in the league and sixth nationally in tackles for loss.

Middleton ranks fourth in school history with 20 career sacks and showed what an imposing force he can be against Western Michigan. He forced a fumble at the IU 8-yard line that **Justin Carrington** recovered with 1:20 left to preserve the victory. He finished the game with two tackles for loss.

The 2007 All-American became the first IU defensive lineman since Adewale Ogunleye in 1997 to earn first team All-Big Ten honors. He set a new single-season school record with 16 sacks, which also led the nation.

**BROTHER, BROTHER**

True freshman defensive tackle **Adam Replogle** was the lone true freshman to appear in the Hoosiers' opener against Eastern Kentucky and he received his first start vs. Western Michigan.

Adam's brother, Tyler, has started the first two games at strong-side linebacker. They became the first brothers to start together at IU since Antwaan (QB) and Curtis (DB) Randle El started 14 games together in 1998-99.

**NEW STADIUM, NEW EXPERIENCE**

After two years of construction, the North End Zone Student-Athlete Development Center is complete. The 138,000-square-foot facility opened in August for football and administrative personnel. At the heart of the new structure is the largest strength and conditioning center in the country. The 25,000-square-foot area is located at field level and provides student-athletes in every varsity sport with access to brand new weight training and cardio equipment.

The Hoosier Football program enjoys spacious new offices, position and staff meeting rooms and a team auditorium, all equipped with state-of-the-art technology. Indiana's Henke Hall of Champions celebrates Hoosier greats from all sports and is located on the top level of the North End Zone Student-Athlete Development Center. It features museum-quality displays and a large banquet area where Hoosier fans can gather to celebrate the past, present and future of IU Athletics.

In the seating bowl directly in front of the Henke Hall of Champions, the 425-seat club section is sold out for the 2009 season. Western Michigan, Indiana's running game reaped the benefits. Left guard **Justin Pagán** returned from an ankle injury to join left tackle **Rodger Saffold**, center **Will Matte**, right guard **Pete Saxon** and right tackle **James Brewer**.

After rushing for just 73 yards on 31 carries (2.4 average) in the season opener, IU racked up 187 yards on two more attempts (5.67) and two rushing TDs. Indiana would have surpassed the 200-yard rushing mark if not for sophomore punter **Chris Hagerup's** intentional safety with under 30 seconds to play which lopped 17 yards off of IU's total. The Hoosiers also did not allow a sack and have only surrendered one sack through two games.

**STUFFING THE RUN**

As the offensive line helped the Hoosiers roll up their highest rushing total since a 272-yard effort against Central Michigan on Nov. 1 last season, the defensive line helped the IU defense hold Western Michigan to just 22 yards on the ground (29 attempts). The total is the lowest for an Indiana opponent since William & Mary finished with -32 rushing yards on Aug. 31, 2002.

With another MAC opponent coming up on Saturday, the Hoosiers have now held back-to-back

MAC foes under 50 yards on the ground, as Central Michigan had 37 rushing yards in the 2008 contest.

**GOING TO THE CHAPPELL**

Junior **Ben Chappell** took over the reigns at quarterback in the spring and has showed he is in control of the offense as the team has jumped out to a 2-0 start. Chappell posted a career-high 326 yards, going 27-for-36 with one touchdown in the season opener against Eastern Kentucky. He became the 15th player in school history to pass for 300 yards in a game and the first Hoosier to eclipse 300 yards since Kellen Lewis (354) did so against Ball State on Nov. 3, 2007. Chappell completed 18-of-28 for 185 yards with one rushing score and no turnovers vs. Western Michigan.

An accounting major with a 3.7 grade point average, Chappell carries those smarts onto the field. The Bloomington South High School graduate is now 3-2 as a starting quarterback with three touchdowns, three rushing scores, a 60.5 completion percentage, 205.6 yards per game and two interceptions. He has completed 70.3 percent this season for 511 yards with a 136.3 passing efficiency.

Chappell played in 11 contests with three starts last season and threw for 1,001 yards with four touchdowns and three interceptions. He completed 52.3 percent of his passes (80-of-153) and carded a 111.95 efficiency rating. In the team's victory over No. 22 (BCS) Northwestern, Chappell threw a 43-yard touchdown, rushed for another and went 21-of-34 (61.8) for a career-high 219 yards.

**BIG PLAY GUNSLINGER**

When **Ben Chappell** hit **Damarlo Belcher** with a 33-yard TD strike against Eastern Kentucky, it marked his fifth career score. All five of Chappell's touchdowns have come from 30-plus yards (33, 43, 43, 64, 77).

Chappell teamed up with four different receivers for six 20-plus yard passes in the season opener. He connected twice with Belcher, twice with **Tandon Doss** and once with **Mitchell Evans** and **Terrance Turner**. Doss and Evans each recorded one catch over 20 yards vs. WMU to push the 2009 total to eight.

**1-2 PUNCH**

**Tandon Doss** and **Damarlo Belcher** flashed moments of brilliance as true freshmen last season and after the 2009 opener, it became clear more is on the way. Doss matched a career high with eight receptions against Eastern Kentucky and set a new career best with 125 receiving yards, his second career 100-yard receiving game. Belcher matched his career best with six receptions and racked up a career-high 97 receiving yards.

With their 222 combined yards, the duo eclipsed its combined high from last season of 189, which set an Indiana true freshmen record, in the team's win over No. 22 (BCS) Northwestern. The last time two Hoosiers reached the 100-yard mark in the same game came against Ball State on Nov. 3, 2007, when Ray Fisher (134) and James Hardy (116) broke the century mark.

Doss, a 6-3, Indianapolis product, led the Hoosiers with 85 yards and six catches against Western Michigan. In 2008, he played in eight games and caught 14 passes for 186 yards, averaging 13.3 yards per reception, and added one touchdown. Doss hauled

in eight passes for a team season-high 107 yards and a TD vs. Northwestern. He became the first true freshman since O.J. Conner in 1997 to go over 100 receiving yards, just the third true freshman (fourth time) in IU history to record a 100-yard receiving game (Ernie Jones, twice; Conner) and the fifth freshman (10th time) to reach the 100-yard mark (James Hardy, five times; Jones, twice; Levron Williams; Conner).

Belcher, a 6-5, Fort Wayne native, played in all 12 games and finished the 2008 season fourth on the team with 25 receptions, third with 337 yards, tied for second with two touchdowns, and third with 13.5 yards per catch and 28.1 yards per game. His 337 yards and 25 grabs rank third in IU history among true freshmen.

Their 523 combined yards in 2008 rank second and their 39 combined receptions rank third all-time by a true freshman duo in IU lore.

### SWITCH TO LOCKDOWN

Of the six position changes made during spring practice, none carried more importance than senior **Ray Fisher's** move to cornerback. Fisher has shown solid coverage and tackling skills in the first two games en route to posting 13 tackles (second on team), one forced fumble, one pass defended and one pass breakup in six quarters of play.

In his defensive debut against Eastern Kentucky, Fisher made an instant impact. With 11:49 remaining and the Hoosiers holding a 19-13 advantage, Fisher forced a fumble by Eastern Kentucky quarterback Cody Watts at the IU 5-yard line. Senior defensive end **Jammie Kirlaw** recovered and the Hoosiers earned a season-opening victory. The Cleveland native also closed out the game with a team-best five solo tackles. He followed that performance with eight tackles, seven solo, and a pass breakup against Western Michigan.

Fisher is one of 14 Hoosiers with 100 career receptions and 1,000 career receiving yards, but he showed during preseason camp and in the opener he is comfortable at the position he manned as a two-way player at Glenville High School. He has the speed and now weighs 185 pounds, up 13 pounds from last year's playing weight of 172.

### MIDDLE MEN

Two-thirds of one of the deepest and most talented positions on the team last season returned this season and have been joined by a junior who turned in one of the top defensive performances in the 2008 finale. Senior linebackers **Will Patterson** and **Matt Mayberry** welcomed **Tyler Replogle** at the strong-side position.

Patterson, who missed spring practice with a wrist injury, was named captain prior to the 2008 campaign and finished fourth on the team with 55 tackles (42 solos) despite missing nearly three games with a knee injury. He leads all active Hoosier players with 214 career tackles and 138 career solo stops following his team-best nine tackles, eight solo, against Western Michigan. Patterson started nine games at weak-side linebacker and posted 8.5 tackles for loss, which shared second on the club, with one interception and one fumble recovery last year.

Mayberry, in his first season as a starter patrolling the middle, led the team and finished 10th in the Big Ten with 89 tackles a year ago. He became the first member of the front seven to lead IU in tackles since

2005 (Kyle Killion). Mayberry also finished second with five sacks and shared second with 8.5 tackles for loss, as he started all 12 games.

The duo each recorded five tackles and a sack - Mayberry's for 15 yards and Patterson's for 10 and a safety - in the season-opening victory over Eastern Kentucky. Mayberry added a half-sack and six tackles against Western Michigan and he owns 1.5 sacks and two TFLs on the year. Patterson's safety accounted for Indiana's first points of the 2009 campaign.

Replogle finished the 2008 season with 26 tackles over the last two Saturdays, including a team season-high 19 tackles, nine solo, with the first sack of his career at Purdue. He earned the Terry P. Cole "Impact Player" Award as the team's most outstanding player in the Old Oaken Bucket game. Replogle, who appeared in 11 games and was named Indiana's special teams player of the year, finished with 38 tackles, 20 solo, one sack, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. He posted six tackles, a half-TFL and one pass breakup vs. Western Michigan.

### THE HITMEN

Of all the injuries the Hoosiers suffered last season, the Indiana secondary was hit the hardest. Three-quarters of the unit, including safeties **Austin Thomas** and **Nick Polk**, sustained season-ending ACL injuries. Thomas missed seven starts due to injuries (ankle and ACL), while Polk missed five starts (knee, ACL). Both players showed no ill effects from their offseason surgeries and are back to bolster what should be a much-improved defense.

Thomas finished 2008 with 41 tackles, 22 solo, and led the team with two interceptions. He is second on the Hoosiers with 211 tackles and 127 solos since the start of the 2006 season (Will Patterson, 214 and 138). In his career, Thomas has seven double-digit tackle games, including a 22-tackle effort at Michigan State in 2007.

He also forced a fumble, recorded two tackles for loss and broke up a pass last season. In the Hoosiers' win over No. 22 (BCS) Northwestern, Thomas collected 10 stops, five solo, picked off a pair of passes and netted one pass breakup.

Polk, who missed the second half of the Western Michigan game with an injury, has three double-digit tackle games in his career and has a knack for always being around the ball. In his two-plus seasons with the defense (receiver as a freshman), Polk has forced four fumbles, recovered two and picked off three passes.

He finished sixth on the team with 52 tackles and fifth with 40 solos in 2008. Polk recovered one fumble and returned it 31 yards for a score against Ball State. In addition, he shared the team lead with two forced fumbles, picked off one pass, broke up two passes and recorded 1.5 tackles for loss.

### IN GOOD HANDS

**Jammie Kirlaw** is also one of the most talented Hoosiers off the field. A 3.25 SPEA management and public financial double major, Kirlaw is a nominee for the Allstate/AFCA Good Works Team and a candidate for the Lowe's Senior CLASS award (achievements in the classroom, character, community and competition).

The fifth-year senior defensive end out of Orlando, studied abroad in Italy during the 2007 summer, volunteered for President Barack Obama's

presidential campaign and directed, produced and wrote a film for the Campus MovieFest competition this spring. Junior wideout **Terrance Turner** and junior running back **Trea Burgess** starred in the film titled *Spring Break-up*.

Kirlew is one of several notable Hoosiers to excel in extracurricular activities off the field. Turner is a theatre and drama major. He has starred in two campus plays - *An American Ma(u)* and *The America Play*. Teammate and junior cornerback **Adrian Burks** also performed in *An American Ma(u)*.

Fifth-year senior running back **Bryan Payton** wrote for IU's student paper, the *Indiana Daily Student*, last year and interned with his hometown paper, the *Fort Wayne Journal Gazette*, this summer.

Two Kelley School of Business student-athletes took advantage of the school's internship program this summer. Long snapper **Brandon Bugg** traveled to Hong Kong working for KPMG, while quarterback **Ben Chappell** stayed in Bloomington and interned with BKD CPAs & Advisors.

### BRINGING THE HEAT

A year after setting a school record and sharing eighth nationally with 42 sacks, the Hoosier defense posted the fourth-highest total in IU history with 31 sacks in 2008. The two-year total of 73 sacks is the top two-year total in IU history and averaged out to just under three sacks per game.

IU's defense bested that average with four sacks for 45 yards in the season opener vs. Eastern Kentucky. Redshirt freshman defensive tackle **Larry Black, Jr.**, and sophomore defensive end **Darius Johnson** each made their first career sack in the second quarter. Senior linebacker **Matt Mayberry** had his sixth career sack in the first quarter, while senior linebacker **Will Patterson** added a sack of his own, for a safety and the first Hoosier points of the season, moving his career total to 5.5. Indiana also recorded seven tackles for loss in the win, led by Mayberry and Black, Jr., who each tallied two.

The Hoosiers added two sacks and eight tackles for loss in their win over Western Michigan. Indiana has posted 79 sacks the last two-plus seasons (2.9 per game), which ranks second in the Big Ten only to Penn State (85) and over that same span has posted 177 tackles for loss (6.5 per game).

### WELCOME TO THE SHOW

Several Hoosiers made their first career starts against Eastern Kentucky. Redshirt freshmen **Larry Black, Jr.** (defensive tackle), **Will Matte** (center) and **Marc Damisch** (left guard) joined sophomore **Tandon Doss** (wide receiver), junior **James Brewer** (right tackle) and senior **Brian Zematis** (tight end). Junior **Jarrold Smith** (defensive tackle) made his first career start on defense, though he started at offensive guard against Penn State last year.

True freshman defensive tackle **Adam Replogle** made his first career start vs. Western Michigan.

### IN THE TRENCHES

The Hoosiers used seven different starting lineups and nine total offensive linemen, including three players receiving their first career action, in 2008. Everyone being pressed into action should pay dividends for the Hoosiers this season. Seven linemen return with 84 starts, making Indiana's line one of the most experienced in the country. In addition, IU has

nine linemen with at least three years of experience and seven with at least four years.

Left guard **Justin Pagán** (5 starts entering 2009) started the Western Michigan game after missing the opener (ankle), giving the Hoosiers what they hope will be their starting five for the rest of the season. The most experienced duo in the group is left tackle **Rodger Saffold** (29) and right guard **Pete Saxon** (28). Starters since their true freshman seasons, the two entered their senior campaigns as the undisputed leaders on the offensive line.

In 2008, Saffold started 10 games at left tackle, while Saxon started five games at left guard before moving to center and starting five times. Saffold has started 31 of the team's last 35 games and has appeared in 32 games in his career, and Saxon has started 30 of IU's last 33 games and appeared in 34 games in his career.

Joining Saffold and Saxon are Pagán, **Will Matte** and **James Brewer**, at left guard, center and right tackle, respectively. Pagán had his redshirt lifted and started the last five games of 2008 and played in seven games overall. The Chicago native, who was one of three true freshmen to see playing time, made two starts at left tackle, two at left guard and one at right tackle, and he played four of the five positions on the offensive line (center). In his five starts, the team averaged 144.4 rushing yards per game.

Mike Stark, started 11 games and played in all 12 contests at right tackle in 2008, but his career was cut short due to a back injury and he is now serving as a student assistant. Brewer has started the first two games, the first of his career, after turning in arguably the Hoosiers' most valuable performance this spring. The 6-8, 331-pounder has battled foot and ankle injuries throughout his career, but has shown he is a dominant force when he is on the football field.

Matte, who was named the team's 2008 co-offensive scout player of the year, started most of the spring at center and has started the first two games this season. The Wheaton, Ill., native is a smart and athletic athlete with good size (6-2, 285).

### LOCK AND LOAD

The Hoosiers installed the Pistol offense this spring after visiting with the Nevada coaching staff in the offseason. With **Ben Chappell** at quarterback, an improved and veteran offensive line and five running backs capable of receiving meaningful playing time, head coach **Bill Lynch** wanted to become more of a "downhill" running team with a more multiple offensive attack.

In the Hoosier Pistol offense, the quarterback lines up four yards behind the center and the running back lines up three-to-four yards behind the quarterback. The running back receives the ball deeper in the backfield, enabling him to run "downhill" and allowing the offense to use more play-action pass.

### STABLE OF BACKS

Running behind the improved offensive line will be a stable of backs who will vie for meaningful playing time this season. Fifth-year senior **Demetrius McCray**, has started the first two games for the Hoosiers and leads the team with 183 yards, 30 attempts and a 6.1 average.

After redshirting last year, former Franklin Central standout **Darius Willis** will receive the opportunity to display the talent that made him one of the

highest-rated recruits in the state two seasons ago. The 2008 co-offensive scout team player missed the Western Michigan game with an ankle injury. Willis rushed for 1,728 yards (6.0 average) and 28 scores and was runner-up for Indiana Mr. Football his senior campaign. He collected all-state, All-Marion County and all-conference honors.

Junior **Trea Burgess**, who contributed 54 yards last year and scored the team's lone rushing TD in the opener, moved to linebacker to start spring practice before returning to his original position. He impressed the remainder of the spring, leading the team with 92 yards on 10 carries with two touchdown scampers of 30-or-more yards in the spring game.

Fifth-year senior running back **Bryan Payton**, nicknamed "Pops" - he will turn 24 on Sept. 21 - finished third on the team with 339 yards and a 4.3 average with two scores in 2008. In his career, Payton owns 790 yards, 193 attempts, a 4.1 average and six touchdowns.

Sophomore **Zach Davis-Walker**, who has been slowed by the rehab from offseason shoulder surgery and has not seen the field this year, debuted in 2008 following a redshirt season with 106 yards and a 4.6 average. He carried the ball 23 times and scored one touchdown.

**CATCHING ON**

A deep and talented pool of wideouts allowed the coaching staff to move members of the corps to the secondary this spring. Along with **Tandon Doss** and **Damarlo Belcher's** career nights in the season opener, junior **Terrance Turner** matched his career high with five grabs and posted a career-high 57 yards in the win vs. Eastern Kentucky. The elder statesman of the group, Turner played in all 12 games last season and finished third on the team with 29 receptions and fourth on the club with 289 yards.

On the inside, junior **Mitchell Evans** has five catches for 56 yards this season. Evans has played wideout, quarterback, safety and on special teams in his career. Last season, Evans played in all 12 games at wide receiver and quarterback (three games). The tough and adaptable West Milton, Ohio, native caught nine balls for 129 yards, threw for 37 yards with one TD and rushed for 26 yards with a score.

Finally, sophomore **Matt Ernest** saw time in five games and made three catches for 18 yards in 2008.

**HANG TIME**

Sophomore punter **Chris Hagerup** was limited during spring practice due to offseason ACL surgery, but showed he was ready in preseason camp. He averaged 42.4 yards on five punts with a long of 48 in IU's win over Western Michigan. With the Hoosiers holding a 23-17 lead with 32 seconds left, Hagerup erased nine seconds off the clock before stepping out of the end zone. He then punted the ensuing free kick 51 yards to the Western Michigan 29.

Hagerup received honorable mention All-Big Ten recognition from the conference media and was a *Sporting News*, *Rivals.com* and *Phil Steele Magazine* Freshman All-America second team selection last season. The Whitefish Bay, Wis., native finished the year with an average of 42.4 yards on 61 punts, which was the seventh-best single-season average in school history, and ranked third in the Big Ten and 22nd nationally. Hagerup's average was the third best by a freshman in the country.

He netted 13 punts over 50 yards, kicked at least one 50-yarder in nine games, landed 14 punts inside the 20-yard line and five inside the 10. He averaged over 40 yards per kick in six of the last seven games and eight of the last 10 and his 67-yard punt against Michigan State shared the longest in the conference. Hagerup finished the year with a 43.0 average, 11 punts over 50 yards and 13 inside the 20 over the final 10 games (37.0 average first two games).

**FOR STARTERS**

With its victory over Eastern Kentucky, the Hoosiers improved to 34-16 in home openers at Memorial Stadium and have now won their last eight season kickoffs at The Rock. In fact, Indiana has won 25 of its last 28 home starters. IU has also won its last six season openers and seven of its last eight. Head coach **Bill Lynch** is 3-0 in openers, as the Hoosiers dominated Indiana State (55-7) and Western Kentucky (31-13) in 2007 and 2008, respectively, to go along with their ECU triumph.

**SCOUTING COMBINE**

In a testament to the talented seniors on the IU roster, scouts from 26 of the 32 NFL teams made their way to Bloomington during preseason camp.

**STAYING HOME**

A native and lifelong Hoosier with 31 years coaching experience in the state, head coach **Bill Lynch** has stressed the importance of recruiting Indiana kids and keeping them in the state. The 2009 Hoosier roster proves Lynch is doing just that. Forty-eight players on the 105-man roster hail from the Hoosier state.

**TRADITIONS CONTINUE**

In his first season in Bloomington, late head coach Terry Hoepfner installed several new traditions that have grown into can't miss gameday events. The team will continue The Walk with a new route this season. Two hours before kickoff the team will be dropped off at the West doors of Assembly Hall and walk across the parking lot into The Rock.

The IU Marching Hundred and Cheerleading Squads will still perform for the fans and form a pathway to show their support for the Hoosiers as they head toward the crimson gates of Memorial Stadium.

The Rock is the symbol representing Memorial Stadium. After a two-year move due to the stadium construction, the three-ton piece of limestone atop a two-ton limestone base has returned to its familiar place beyond the north end zone. Prior to each game, Coach Lynch and the players will march out of the weight room in the North End Zone Student-Athlete Development Center and touch The Rock before hitting the field.

Additionally, the players will continue to join the fans and band in the singing of *Indiana, Our Indiana* following each home victory.

# NEW STADIUM, NEW EXPERIENCE

The Indiana University Department of Athletics has developed several new experiences and promotions designed to enhance the gameday experience at Memorial Stadium for home football games. New experiences at Memorial Stadium include:

**Knothole Park:** Knothole Park is a brand new recreation area behind the south end zone at Memorial Stadium. The park features a Field-Turf replica of the playing field at Memorial Stadium and children ages 13 and under will get to play with Nerf footballs, hang out with IU student-athletes from a variety of sports and chalk the driveway behind the field that has been appropriately renamed Knothole Road.

**Kicks-for-Keeps:** The large nets behind the two goalposts are gone and much like going to a baseball game, field goals and extra points will head into the stands. If a fan catches or retrieves a ball kicked by the Hoosiers, they will be allowed to exchange the ball for an official IU adidas game ball that will feature an embossed IU logo on the ball. If a spectator catches or retrieves a ball kicked by the opposing team, they are encouraged to throw it back onto the field. By doing so, the spectator will receive a free T-Shirt acknowledging that they threw the ball back at Memorial Stadium.

**Red Light Specials:** Once every game, a special IU vehicle will drive down Knothole Road with a red siren on top of the vehicle. An announcement will then be made about what concession item will be that game's Red Light Special. As long as the red light is on, the noted concession item will cost just one dollar. Concession items and the time of the Red Light Special will change each week.

**Shorter Lines:** To cut down on the long lines before kickoff, Indiana Athletics has purchased more scanners and hired additional staff to expedite the process of getting fans into Memorial Stadium.

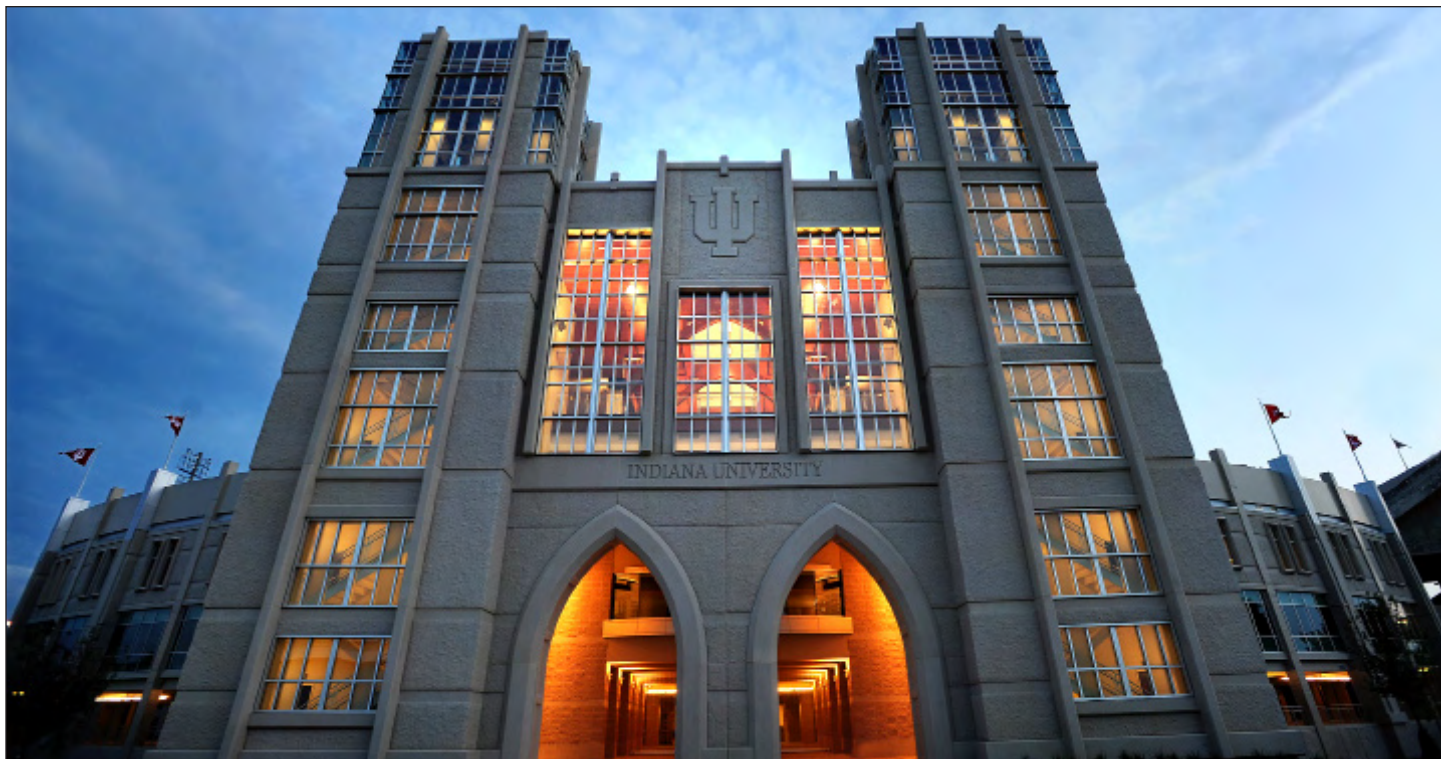
**"Little 5 Feel":** By purchasing a certain number of tickets, residence halls, fraternities, sororities and other student organizations can have painted bed sheets, flags, and part of Knothole Road painted with their letters, logo or organization name.

**Hoosier Helpers and 'Ask Me' Buttons:** To enhance everyone's gameday experience, Indiana Athletics has enlisted volunteers to serve as Hoosier Helpers. Hoosier Helpers will be on hand to answer questions and help with emergencies and uncomfortable situations. Ushers will be wearing 'Ask Me' buttons to encourage spectators to approach them with questions that they might have.

**'Greening' Memorial Stadium:** In an effort to mix red with green, there will be prominently labeled recycling bins located around all the concourses of Memorial Stadium.

**Crimson Club:** A rewards system to thank students for attending IU athletic events. Every time an IU student attends an IU sporting event, they will be awarded points. By accruing points over the year, they will be eligible to win valuable prizes like iPods and TVs.

**Game Day T-Shirt:** Hoosier students are encouraged to wear their IU Game Day T-shirt. The shirt was designed by a student and won in an online vote against nine other designs.



## INSIDE THE NUMBERS

**138,000** square footage of the North End Zone Student-Athlete Development Center. The two-year project, which was completed in July, features bowl seating with an outdoor club seating area that encloses the North end of Memorial Stadium. A new weight room, staff offices, position meeting rooms, administration offices and Hall of Champions highlight the interior of the structure and addresses several critical needs for not only the football program, but the entire Department of Athletics.

**25,000** square footage of the new strength and conditioning center in the facility. It is the largest weight room in the nation. The center is located on the bottom level of the new facility with glass windows looking out to the field. It is nearly five times the size of the previous weight room and all Hoosier varsity sports will have access to the center.

**22,000** square footage of the new academic center in the football complex. Previously located in a 3,000 square foot area in Assembly Hall, the new center is located on the East side of Memorial Stadium. The academic center adds state-of-the-art technology and equipment as well as nearly 20,000 square feet.

**2,003** the Hoosiers rushed for 2,003 yards (sixth in the Big Ten) last season. IU broke the 2,000-yard rushing barrier for the second straight year, the first time since 2000 and 2001 an Indiana team has accomplished the feat. The Hoosiers averaged 4.5 yards per carry and carded 19 rushing scores, their best numbers since 2001 (5.5, 33). The team rushed for over 250 yards four times with a season-best 297 yards in its season-opening win over Western Kentucky.

**523** total receiving yards for true freshmen **Tandon Doss** and **Damarlo Belcher** in 2008, the second-highest total for a true freshmen pair in school history. The duo of O.J. Conner and Tyrone Browning combined for 887 yards in 1997. Doss and Belcher's 39 receptions rank third among true freshmen pairings behind Conner and Browning (52) and John Pannozzo and Tyke Spencer (43 in 2002).

**337** receiving yards for **Damarlo Belcher** in 2008. That total ranks third in IU history among true freshmen. He also caught 25 passes.

**189** combined receiving yards for true freshmen **Tandon Doss** and **Damarlo Belcher** in the Hoosiers' win over No. 22 (BCS) Northwestern. They set an Indiana true freshmen record with the yardage. Doss also became the first IU true freshman since O.J. Conner in 1997 and just the third true freshman (fourth time) in Hoosier history to reach the century mark, as he hauled in a career-high eight receptions for 107 yards and a touchdown.

**125** years of IU Football. The program began its 125th season when it opened the campaign against Eastern Kentucky on Sept. 3. The players will wear a commemorative patch on their uniforms and held a former player reunion against Western Michigan on Sept. 12.

**93** career wins for Indiana head coach **Bill Lynch** in his 17th season as a head coach. Lynch owns a 93-82-3 (.531) overall record. He is in his third year as Hoosier head coach and has 31 years of coaching experience in the state of Indiana. In his first two seasons, the Hoosiers reached the postseason and won seven games in a season for the first time since 1993, won the Old Oaken Bucket for the first time since 2001 and won 10 games in his two years - the most for one head coach since 1993-94. IU also has boasted three All-Americans, two second-round NFL Draft picks, six All-Big Ten selections, one Academic All-American and a school-record 22 Academic All-Big Ten honorees in 2008.

**89** tackles by middle linebacker **Matt Mayberry** last season. Mayberry led the team and became the first Hoosier from the front seven to lead the team in tackles since Kyle Killion in 2005. The Darien, Ill., native finished 10th in the Big Ten with 7.4 tackles per game and 10th in league games only with 7.8 stops each time out.

**84** Indiana owns one of the most experienced lines in the country with 84 returning offensive line starts (entering the season). Fourth-year starters **Rodger Saffold** (29) and **Pete Saxon** (28) lead the way for the Hoosiers followed by juniors **Cody Faulkner** (11) and **Alex Perry** (5), sophomore **Justin Pagán** (5), fifth-year senior **Mike Reiter** (4) and sophomore **Andrew McDonald** (2). In addition, IU has nine linemen with at least three years of experience and seven with at least four years.

**73** sacks the Indiana defense has recorded during the 2007 and 2008 seasons - the best two-year total in school history. After posting a school-record 42 sacks in 2007, tied for eighth in the country, the Hoosiers added 31 in 2008, the fourth-best mark in IU history.

**73** public appearances head coach **Bill Lynch** made during the offseason. Lynch toured the state of Indiana and hit students especially hard, as he visited 19 Greek houses in April.

**42.4** **Chris Hagerup's** punt average last season. It ranked seventh on IU's single-season list, third in the Big Ten, third among freshman punters in the nation and 22nd nationally. Hagerup received honorable mention All-Big Ten recognition from the conference media and was a *Sporting News*, *Rivals.com* and *Phil Steele Magazine* Freshman All-American second team selection.

**41** starting games lost to 17 starters due to injuries last season. Indiana lost three-quarters of its secondary to ACL injuries - CB **Christopher Phillips** (9), SS **Austin Thomas** (7) and FS **Nick Polk** (5). Six offensive linemen combined to miss seven games due to injuries.

**38** career sacks between senior defensive ends **Jammie Kirlaw** and **Greg Middleton**. No duo in the country owns a higher total. Middleton ranks fourth on the Indiana career list with 20, while Kirlaw is in fifth place with 18. Kirlaw is also third all-time with 41 career tackles for loss.

**37** scholarship upperclassmen on the Hoosier roster, the first time since 2001 (36) IU has 35-plus scholarship upperclassmen. Nineteen scholarship seniors and 18 scholarship juniors appear on the roster. Thirty-four of the players are listed on the depth chart or figure to provide significant contributions during the 2009 season.

**22** rank of Northwestern in the BCS when the Hoosiers dropped the Wildcats, 21-19, last season. **Ben Chappell**, who started and played the entire game, had 219 yards passing and a touchdown and rushed for another score. Strong safety **Austin Thomas** had a pair of interceptions, halting NU drives at the IU 11- and 32-yard lines.

# INSIDE THE NUMBERS

**22** Hoosiers earned Academic All-Big Ten honors in 2008, a school record. Twenty-eight Hoosiers, accounting for 26 percent of the roster, recorded grade point averages of 3.0 or higher last fall and 28 players (27 percent) finished 2008 with cumulative GPAs of 3.0 or higher.

**19.5** **Jammie Kirlew's** tackles for loss in 2008, which ranks fourth for a single season in Hoosier lore. Kirlew's total finished third in the conference and sixth in the country. He was one of six finalists for the Ted Hendricks Defensive End of the Year Award and was voted first team All-Big Ten by the conference media and second team by the league's coaches.

**19** student-athletes signed National Letters of Intent to continue their playing careers at Indiana University on Feb. 4. Head coach **Bill Lynch's** second recruiting class featured one four-star recruit and 12 three-star recruits in the *Rivals.com* and *Scout.com* rankings. Eight players in the class reside from Indiana, five from Ohio, two each from Illinois and Michigan, and one from Pennsylvania and California. The Hoosiers bolstered their depth on the offensive line, signing a quintet of linemen. Indiana added two quarterbacks, two wide receivers, two defensive linemen, two linebackers and two defensive backs. The Hoosiers also welcomed one running back, one tight end, one kicker and one fullback/linebacker for the incoming class of 2009.

**16** starters returning in 2009. On the defensive side of the ball, nine starters return, eight of whom are upperclassmen and seven of whom are seniors. The offense returns six starters, including five upperclassmen and three seniors. Indiana returns 48 letterwinners overall.

**10.5** **Jammie Kirlew's** sack total from one season ago, which is fourth on IU's single-season list. The Orlando native finished second in the Big Ten and tied for 14th nationally with his sack total. Kirlew has been selected a first team All-Big Ten defensive lineman by *Athlon Sports*, *Lindy's* and *Sporting News* pre-season magazines heading into 2009. He is rated the eighth best defensive end in the country by *Lindy's*.

**9/3** Indiana opened the 2009 season on Sept. 3 against Eastern Kentucky. It marked the first Thursday night game at Memorial Stadium in school history.

**8** different starting lineups used on the offensive line in 2008, including seven different lineups over the final seven weeks.

**7** Hoosiers currently on NFL rosters. Victor Adeyanju (St. Louis Rams), Kris Dielman (San Diego Chargers), Gibran Hamdan (Buffalo Bills), James Hardy (Buffalo Bills), Adewale Ogunleye (Chicago Bears), Tracy Porter (New Orleans Saints) and Antwaan Randle El (Washington Redskins) appear on NFL teams heading into the 2009 campaign.

**6** players changed positions this spring. Most notably, senior **Ray Fisher** switched from wide receiver to cornerback. Two other wideouts - **Shane Covington** and **Kyle Dietrick** - joined Fisher in the defensive backfield at safety. **Jarrod Smith** and **Milton Owens** made the switch over from the offensive line to defensive tackle, while **Darius Johnson** moved from linebacker to defensive end. **Trea Burgess** opened the spring at linebacker before he returned to running back early on in spring practice.

**6** home games on the Hoosiers schedule in 2009. Indiana welcomes Eastern Kentucky (Sept. 3), Western Michigan (Sept. 12), Ohio State (Oct. 3), Illinois for Homecoming (Oct. 17), Wisconsin (Nov. 7) and Purdue (Nov. 21).

**5** games where the score was within one possession in the fourth quarter last season. Indiana finished 1-4 in those five games, with its lone victory coming over No. 22 (BCS) Northwestern, 21-19. In its four losses, IU trailed Ball State, 28-20, Michigan State, 36-29, Minnesota, 13-7, and led Central Michigan, 34-31, in the final stanza.

**4** starting quarterback **Ben Chappell** dons the same number as his favorite player, Brett Favre. The Bloomington South High School product took over the reigns at quarterback during spring practice after playing in 11 contests with three starts. He threw for 1,001 yards with four TDs and three interceptions. Chappell completed 52.3 percent of his passes (80-of-153) and carded a 111.95 efficiency rating while recording starts at Illinois, and against Northwestern and Wisconsin. In the team's victory over No. 22 (BCS) Northwestern, Chappell threw a 43-yard touchdown, rushed for another and went 21-of-34 (61.8) for a career-high 219 yards. An accounting major with a 3.7 grade point average, Chappell is also a two-time Academic All-Big Ten selection.

**4** different quarterbacks played for the Hoosiers in 2008. **Ben Chappell**, Kellen Lewis, **Mitchell Evans** and **Teddy Schell** each took snaps under center last year.

**3** **Mitchell Evans** has played three positions in his brief Hoosier career. He arrived to Indiana as a true freshman quarterback during 2007 preseason camp. Evans moved to safety and played the entire 2007 season at the position. He played quarterback during 2008 spring practice and opened preseason camp there before moving to his current position of wide receiver. Evans saw action at wideout most of 2008, but he also played quarterback against Central Michigan, Wisconsin and Penn State.

**3** primetime games on the Hoosiers' schedule. Indiana opened the season with the first Thursday night game in Memorial Stadium history against Eastern Kentucky at 8 p.m. on Sept. 3. IU will host Ohio State at 7 p.m. on Oct. 3 and welcome Illinois for Homecoming at 7 p.m. on Oct. 17. All three games will be televised by the Big Ten Network.

**3** true freshmen played for the Hoosiers in 2008. Wide receivers **Damarlo Belcher** and **Tandon Doss** joined offensive lineman **Justin Pagán**. Belcher finished the season fourth on the team with 25 receptions and third with 337 yards to go along with two touchdowns, while Doss caught 14 passes for 186 yards and one score. Pagán started the final five games of the season and started seven overall. He played both tackle and guard positions.

**2** teams returning to the Indiana ledger. Michigan and Ohio State replace Minnesota and Michigan State on the schedule for the next two seasons. IU has not faced the Wolverines or Buckeyes since 2006. The Hoosiers head to Ann Arbor, Mich., on Sept. 26, and welcome OSU to Bloomington on Oct. 3.

**1** the Hoosiers faced Eastern Kentucky and will battle Virginia for the first time in program history. Indiana opened the season with the first Thursday night game in Memorial Stadium history against EKVU on Sept. 3. IU travels to Charlottesville, Va., to face the Cavaliers on Oct. 10.

# IU RADIO NETWORK

Indiana University's football program receives some of the most extensive media coverage in the country. Learfield Communications holds the exclusive rights as IU's official radio outlet.

## DON FISCHER

This marks the 37th year that Don Fischer has been the radio play-by-play "voice" of Indiana University football and men's basketball games. The past 22 years, Fischer has worked as an independent contractor and is currently serving the IU Radio Network owned by Learfield Communications out of Jefferson City, Mo.

In addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the weekly coaches radio talk shows for both football and basketball and has a daily show, Monday through Friday, from September through March. The daily show is called "IU Sports Today" and is syndicated throughout the state of Indiana. Fischer also offers stations a weekly talk show about IU football and basketball that airs in several markets around the state during the school year.

Fischer does freelance sportscasting, which for the past 15 years has included being the television voice of the Indianapolis Colts. He broadcasts preseason games on WTTV-Channel 4 in Indianapolis.

During his 36 years of work with IU, Fischer has been named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year 23 times by two different organizations, the last time coming in 2006. The National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association has awarded him 19 times, while the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association has named him its honoree four times.

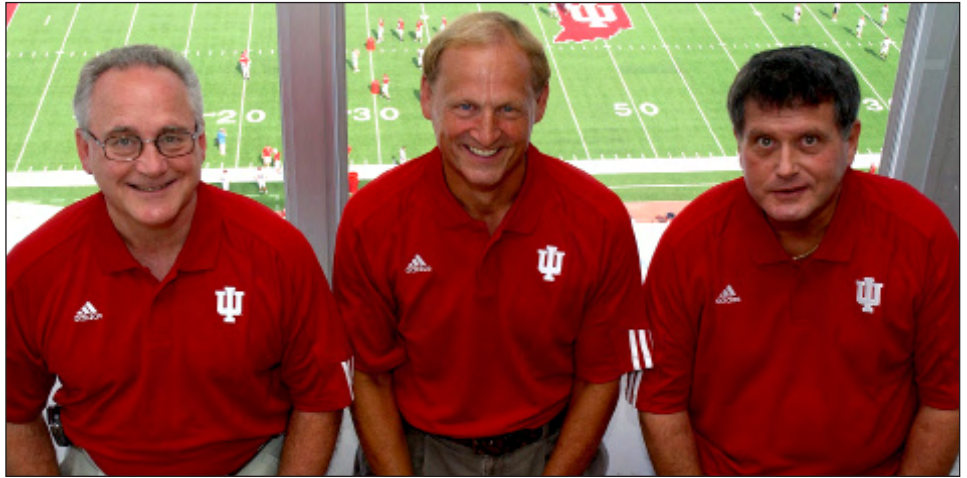
He has won several awards for best play-by-play performance, and he has been honored by Indiana University with the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University. He also has been named an Honorary "I" Man.

The Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association inducted Fischer into the ISSA Hall of Fame in April 2004.

Fischer has broadcast more than 1,500 Indiana University games a total that includes eight bowl games, four NCAA basketball championship games and two N.I.T. championship games. From 1973 through 1987, he worked for ABC Radio, Canada's CBC and several additional major market radio stations, including WIRE in Indianapolis, as their source for reports during the month of May coverage of the Indianapolis 500. During that 15-year period, Fischer also served WIRE and Network Indiana, a statewide news network, as their sports director.

A native of Mendota and Rochelle, Ill., Fischer has been in the radio business for 41 years. His previous broadcast experience includes stops in Butte, Mont., Ottawa, Ill., Springfield, Ill., and Terre Haute, Ind.

Fischer has four sons and eight grandchildren. Don and his wife, Susy, reside in Greenwood, Ind.

## PETE COMPISE

Former Indiana University assistant football coach Pete Compise is in his fifth year with the IU Radio Network as the color analyst for Hoosier Football. He previously spent 11 years in the same capacity at the University of Louisville.

A 1969 University of Louisville graduate and former full-back and place-kicker on the Cardinal football team, Compise served as team captain in 1968 and earned the Senior Leadership Award in his final campaign. He converted 76-of-88 extra-point attempts and scored 136 points in his collegiate football career, and he also was a three-year letterwinner in baseball.

Compise began his college coaching career as an assistant coach to Lee Corso at Louisville in 1972. The Cardinals posted a 9-1 mark and finished 14th in the nation that season.

He then followed Corso to Bloomington, where he served on the Hoosiers staff from 1973 through 1976, and earned his master's while at IU. Compise left Indiana in February 1977, to become the head football coach at Hanover College. He led Hanover to the 1979 and 1980 Hoosier Buckeye Conference Championships and was a three-time conference Coach of the Year honoree.

Compise left Hanover in June 1982 to enter the restaurant business. He owned and operated Alexander's Restaurant in the Louisville Galleria from 1982-87 and The Terrace Restaurant at Kaden Tower from 1987-97. During this time, Compise also worked as a color analyst for Louisville Cardinals Football telecasts on WDRB-Fox 41 TV in Louisville and on WHAS-840 AM for radio broadcasts.

Since 1997, Compise has worked in human resources and management for Maker's Mark Distillery and Thornton Oil

Corporation in Louisville, and he is currently a senior executive recruiter for Executive Leadership Solutions, an executive search firm specializing in the retail industry.

Pete and his wife, Rhonda, reside in Henryville, Ind.

## JOE SMITH

Joe Smith is in his 27th year with the IU Radio Network. He has handled pre-game, halftime, and post-game duties for Indiana football and men's basketball since 1983.

Smith, the sports director of WGCL-AM 1370 in Bloomington, is in his 40th year of radio broadcasting in Bloomington. He began his broadcasting career in 1969 at WAIK Radio in Galesburg, Ill. From 1973-89, Joe worked on "RFD-4 Agri-Business Show" on WTTV-4 with the late Bob Cook. In 1998, Smith was named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year and in April 2003, he was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters/Sportscasters Hall of Fame. Joe handled the IU TV Warmup Shows from 1978-82 and hosted several IU Coaches Shows from 1983-96 and again from 2002-04.

In June 2004, Smith received the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

Joe has two children, both of whom are Indiana University graduates. Jeff and his wife, Kristen, currently reside in Indianapolis. Jeff is a 2002 graduate with a bachelor's degree in sport communications. Joe's daughter, Jamie, earned her bachelor's degree from Indiana University in kinesiology in 2005, and her master's in sports management at the University of Tennessee in August 2006.

Moved from offensive line to defensive tackle this spring. Earned his first defensive start against Eastern Kentucky.

**DT** 98 Adam Replogle, 6-3, 282, Fr./Fr.

Earned first start against Western Michigan. Along with brother, Tyler (linebacker), became first brothers to start together since Randle Els in 1998-99.

75 Nicholas Sliger, 6-3, 295, So./Fr.

Redshirted the 2008 campaign and was named co-defensive scout team player of the year.

69 Mick Mentzer, 6-4, 308, So./Fr.

Made three tackles in his Hoosier debut against Eastern Kentucky. Athletic standout at Bishop Dwenger HS played defensive tackle and linebacker.

**RE** 57 Jammie Kirlew, 6-3, 259, Sr./5th

All-America candidate named to the Hendricks and Bednarik Watch Lists. Third in IU history with 41 TFLs and fifth with 18 sacks.

55 Deonte Mack, 6-3, 286, Sr./Jr.

Started nine games and played in 11 overall at defensive tackle. Made debut at defensive end against Western Michigan.

**WLB** 34 Will Patterson, 6-1, 237, Sr./Sr.

Four-year starter was a team captain a season ago. Accounted for the team's first points of the season with a safety and led team with nine stops vs. WMU.

42 Chad Sherer, 6-0, 217, So./Fr.

Redshirted the 2008 campaign and was named co-defensive scout team player of the year. His brother, Dustin, is a quarterback at Wisconsin.

**MLB** 43 Matt Mayberry, 6-2, 237, Sr./Sr.

Became first Hoosier from the front seven since 2005 to lead the team in tackles (89) last year. Has 11 tackles, 1.5 sacks and 2.5 tackles for loss this season.

48 Leon Beckum, 5-11, 224, Jr./So.

Bloomington North HS product is on academic scholarship through the 21st Century Scholars program. Special teams POW following the season opener.

**SLB** 46 Tyler Replogle, 6-2, 236, Jr./Jr.

First-year starter closed out 2008 with a team season-high 19 tackles, nine solo, and his first career sack at Purdue. Started first two games at strong-side linebacker.

25 Justin Carrington, 6-0, 224, Sr./5th

Began his career at running back before moving to linebacker during 2007 spring practice. Recovered fumble with 1:20 left to preserve Western Michigan victory.

**CB** 7 Ray Fisher, 5-9, 185, Sr./Sr.

Moved to cornerback, a position he played in high school, during spring practice. Forced key fourth quarter fumble vs. ECU and is second on team with 13 tackles.

22 Andre LaGrone, 6-0, 181, Jr./So.

Has appeared in both games this season. Made collegiate debut in the 2008 season finale at Purdue.

**FS** 8 Nick Polk, 6-0, 219, Sr./5th

Missed four games, three due to an ACL injury, in 2008. Ballhawk switched from wideout in the 2007 spring and has started 22 games at free safety.

14 Jeremy Finch, 6-1, 216, Jr./Jr.

Recovered two fumbles in win over Western Michigan. Recorded blocked punts in back-to-back games against Ball State and Michigan State last season.

**SS** 20 Austin Thomas, 6-2, 220, Sr./5th

Missed two games with an ankle injury and four games with an ACL injury one season ago. Second on the team with 211 tackles and 127 solos since 2006.

29 Chris Adkins, 6-1, 187, Jr./So.

Played safety most of preseason camp after starting 12 games at corner one year ago. Started at cornerback for Donnell Jones (hamstring) in the season opener.

**CB** 6 Richard Council, 6-1, 197, Sr./Jr.

Started seven times and played in 10 games in his first season as a starter last year. Has eight tackles, seven solo, in two starts this year.

10 Donnell Jones, 5-10, 207, Jr./So.

Started the final two games and appeared in 11 contests in 2008. Made his first career interception against Wisconsin. Missed first two games with hamstring injury.

**P** 12 Chris Hagerup, 6-5, 211, Jr./So.

Received honorable mention All-Big Ten honors in 2008. Ranked third in the Big Ten and third among freshmen nationally with a 42.4 average.

30 Charlie Klingensmith, 6-0, 181, Sr./Sr.

Walk-on started eight games for St. Bonaventure University's men's soccer team in 2005.

**PR** 2 Tandon Doss, 6-3, 199, So./So.

Did not return any punts in 2008. One of three true freshmen to play last year, he leads team with 14 catches and 210 yards in 2009.

7 Ray Fisher, 5-9, 185, Sr./Sr.

Returned 11 punts for 106 yards (9.6 average) one season ago. Collected a career-best 29-yard punt return at No. 7 (AP) Penn State.

HEAD COACH BILL LYNCH



A native and lifelong Hoosier with 31 years coaching experience in the state, Bill Lynch is in his third year at the helm of the Indiana football program. In his two seasons, the Hoosiers reached the postseason and won seven games in a season for the first time since 1993, won

the Old Oaken Bucket for the first time since 2001 and won 10 games in his two years - the most for one head coach since 1993-94. IU also has boasted three All-Americans, two second-round NFL Draft picks, six All-Big Ten selections, one Academic All-American and a school-record 22 Academic All-Big Ten honorees in 2008.

Lynch completed his first season as Indiana head coach in 2007, leading the Hoosiers to a 7-6 record and a trip to the Insight Bowl. He is the only head coach in Hoosier history to guide a team to a bowl game in his debut season and just the fourth coach in IU lore to patrol the sidelines for a postseason contest. The team's seven victories were the second most for a first-year Indiana head coach, behind only James M. Sheldon, who went 8-1-1 in 1905.

Two of Lynch's 2007 charges were selected on the first day of the NFL Draft. The New Orleans Saints picked cornerback Tracy Porter with the 40th selection, while the Buffalo Bills took wide receiver James Hardy in the 41st slot. Indiana and Michigan were the only Big Ten teams with multiple selections on day one. It also marked the first time IU had two players selected on day one since 1988.

Porter, Hardy, kicker Austin Starr, quarterback Kellen Lewis and defensive end Greg Middleton each collected All-Big Ten honors. Hardy and Middleton snared first team honors from both the conference coaches and media, while Starr and Porter added first team accolades from the media. The four first-teamers shared second most in the league with Penn State, trailing only Ohio State's six. Lewis was a second team selection by both the conference coaches and media, while Porter and Starr joined him on the coaches' ballots.

Hardy, Starr and Middleton also received All-America recognition. Hardy and Middleton both collected second team honors from the Walter Camp Football Foundation and third team laurels from the Associated Press, while Starr captured second team status from the AP. Starr was a Lou Groza Award finalist, Middleton was a Ted Hendricks Defensive End of the Year Award finalist and Hardy was a Biletznikoff Award semifinalist.

IU knocked off No. 22 (BCS) Northwestern last year behind the play of team most valuable player and All-Big Ten honoree Jammie Kirlaw. The junior,

who earned first team All-Big Ten honors from the conference media and second team recognition from the conference coaches, was also one of six finalists for the Ted Hendricks Defensive End of the Year Award.

In addition to success on the field, Lynch stresses the importance of earning a degree from one of the top academic institutions in the country. Last year, a school-record 22 Hoosiers earned Academic All-Big Ten honors, over 25 percent of the roster recorded a grade point average of 3.0 or higher for the second straight campaign, and Starr earned ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District V honors for the third straight season.

Forty-one Hoosiers completed the 2007-08 academic year with cumulative grade point averages of 3.0 or higher. Starr became the sixth IU player to be named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America First Team, while fullback Josiah Sears joined Starr on the Academic All-District V team. Kicker Kevin Trulock received the inaugural Wayne Duke Postgraduate Award, presented by the Indianapolis Big Ten Community Partnership.

Lynch signed an agreement on November 26, 2007, to remain Indiana head coach through July 1, 2012. He was named IU's 27th head coach on June 15, 2007. Lynch has compiled a 93-82-3 (.531) career record with stops in Bloomington, at Butler, Ball State and DePauw. He has won or shared six conference or divisional titles in his 16 seasons. Lynch has 32 overall years of coaching experience, spending 31 of those seasons in the state of Indiana.

A 2005 inductee into the Indiana Football Hall of Fame, Lynch served as interim head coach for two games in 2006 and led the Hoosiers during 2007 spring practice. During his first two seasons in Bloomington, he was the assistant head coach, offensive coordinator and tight ends coach.

The veteran coach returned to Bloomington after directing DePauw to an 8-2 record en route to Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference (SCAC) co-coach of the Year honors in 2004. Lynch was the first coach in SCAC history to earn the award in his debut campaign. DePauw finished 5-1 in league play.

Lynch was head coach at Ball State from 1995-02. During his tenure, the Cardinals won at least six games three times, including a 7-4 mark in 1995 and an 8-4 record the following season. The 1995 team posted a 6-2 conference record and tied for third in the Mid-American Conference (MAC), while Lynch's 1996 team captured the MAC championship at 7-1 and earned a trip to the Las Vegas Bowl. Ball State also staked claim to the 2001 MAC West title after third-place finishes in 1997 and 2000.

A 1977 Butler graduate and four-year letterwinner in both football and basketball, Lynch quarterbacked the Bulldogs to a 28-12 overall record and three conference championships. He earned Indiana Collegiate Conference (ICC) Most Valuable Player honors in each of his final three seasons. Lynch led the nation in pass completion percentage in 1975 and captained both sports his senior campaign.

He returned to his alma mater as head coach in 1985 and compiled a 36-12-3 (.735) record over

five seasons. Butler won four Heartland Collegiate Conference titles, and he won conference Coach of the Year honors three times. Four of Lynch's five squads were ranked among the top 20 in NCAA Division II, and Lynch twice earned AFCA Regional Coach of the Year laurels.

Lynch moved on to Ball State as the Cardinals' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 1990-92.

Bill and his wife, Linda, have four children - Billy (Carla), Kelly (Lucas Manor), Joey (Danielle) and Kevin - and nine grandchildren - Lindsey (3), Max (2) and Ryan (1) Lynch (Billy and Carla - parents); Joe Jr. (2) and Danny (infant) Lynch (Joey and Danielle - parents); and Lexie (9), Maggie (7), Jonny (4) and Kate (2) Manor (Kelly and Lucas - parents). Billy is the Hoosiers' wide receivers coach, while Joey, who played quarterback at Ball State (2003-06), returned to his alma mater as wide receivers coach this offseason. Kevin will serve as offensive quality control for the Hoosiers this season. He graduated from Franklin (Ind.) College in the spring of 2009 with a bachelor's degree in recreation.

**POSTGAME NOTES**

- With an attendance of 36,759, the Hoosiers posted their highest attendance for a home opener since 1997 (vs. Ball State, 38,006).

- Quarterback Ben Chappell posted a career-high 326 yards passing in the game, going 27-for-36 in the process. He became the 15th player in school history to pass for 300 yards in a game. He was the first Hoosier to throw for 300 since Kellen Lewis threw for 354 against Ball State on Nov. 3, 2007.

- Tandon Doss matched a career high with eight receptions in the game and set a new career best with 125 receiving yards. Terrance Turner matched his career high with five grabs and posted a career-high 57 yards. Damarlo Belcher matched his career best with six receptions and racked up a career-high 97 receiving yards.

- Will Patterson's sack of Cody Watts on EKU's first drive resulted in the first safety for the Hoosiers since Jerimy Finch blocked a Michigan State punt on Sept. 27, 2008. Patterson now has 5.5 career sacks.

- Redshirt freshman Larry Black, Jr., and sophomore Darius Johnson each made their first career sack in the second quarter for the Hoosiers. Matt Mayberry had his sixth career sack in the first quarter. Will Patterson added a sack of his own, moving his career total to 5.5. The four sacks for the Hoosiers were for a combined loss of 45 yards.

- Trea Burgess' 1-yard TD plunge in the first quarter was his second career TD, joining a score against Indiana State in the 2007 season opener. Damarlo Belcher's 33-yard TD catch in the second quarter was his third career touchdown reception.

- Ray Fisher forced his first career fumble in the fourth quarter to thwart an EKU drive at the 5-yard line. Jammie Kirlaw recovered the fumble, his fourth career fumble recovery. In Fisher's debut as a defensive player, he also posted five solo tackles to lead the Hoosiers.

- Redshirt freshman kicker Nick Freeland made his first career appearance for the Hoosiers and he made it count, connecting on a 38-yard field goal try at the 13:04 mark in the second quarter. Freeland also hit both extra points he attempted.

- Sophomore Tandon Doss and senior Nick Polk each recorded their first career kick returns. Doss took the opening kickoff 32 yards and Polk's return went 29. Combined with his 125 yards receiving, Doss accounted for 157 all-purpose yards for the Hoosiers.

- The Hoosiers recorded seven tackles for loss in the win, led by senior Matt Mayberry and redshirt freshman Larry Black, Jr., who each tallied two on the night.

- Several Hoosiers made their first career starts in the game. Redshirt freshman Larry Black (defensive tackle), Will Matte (center) and Marc Damisch (left guard) joined sophomore Tandon Doss (wide receiver), junior James Brewer (right tackle) and senior Brian Zematis (tight end). Jarrod Smith (defensive tackle) made his first career start on defense, though he started at offensive guard against Penn State last year.

- Black, Matte and Damisch all made their first career appearances in an IU uniform in addition to starting. Other Hoosiers who made their Hoosier debuts were redshirt freshmen Darius Willis, Shane Covington, Nicholas Sliger, Chad Sherer, Mick Mentzer and Nick Freeland and true freshman Adam Replogle.

- The game captains for the Hoosiers were Ben Chappell and Rodger Saffold on offense and Will Patterson and Jammie Kirlaw on defense.

- Earlier this week, head coach Bill Lynch announced that seniors Collin Taylor and Matt Kurz have been awarded scholarships, meaning that the Hoosiers now have 19 scholarship seniors and 18 scholarship juniors on the team.

- For the second straight week, IU forced a crucial fumble inside the 10-yard line in the waning moments of the game. Senior defensive end Greg Middleton forced his third career fumble on the play and senior linebacker Justin Carrington collected his first fumble recovery to give the Hoosiers the ball at their own 24-yard line.

- With 3.0 tackles for loss, senior defensive end Jammie Kirlew moved past Greg Farfall (1988-91) to third on the IU career list with 41.0 TFL in his career. He also had 1.5 sacks to move into fifth on that career list with 18.0. He is now just two sacks behind teammate Greg Middleton for fourth on the Hoosier list.

- Fifth-year senior Demetrius McCray's 59-yard touchdown run in the second quarter was his fifth career rushing score and the longest rush of his career. It marked the Hoosiers longest play from scrimmage since a Ben Chappell 64-yard scoring strike to Ray Fisher against Central Michigan (Nov. 1, 2008) and the longest run since a Marcus Thigpen 77-yard scamper in the same game.

- McCray's 134 rushing yards are the most by an IU running back since Thigpen ran for 140 against Purdue in the 2007 Old Oaken Bucket Game. It is also the most by an IU player since Kellen Lewis ran for 148 against Ball State in 2008. The 134 yards were a career high for the Brandon, Fla., native, and his first career 100-yard game.

- Indiana starts the year at 2-0 for the sixth consecutive year. Bill Lynch is the first coach in IU history to start his career with three straight 2-0 beginnings.

- Indiana's game-opening 12-play drive was the longest opening drive for the Hoosiers since a 13-play drive against Purdue on Nov. 17, 2007.

- The Hoosiers held the ball for 11:20 in the first quarter, IU's largest time of possession edge in a quarter since it held the ball for 12:21 in the fourth quarter against Murray State on Sept. 6, 2008.

- Indiana held WMU to just 22 yards on the ground on 29 carries, the fewest rushing yards for an IU opponent since William & Mary finished with -32 yards on the ground on Aug. 31, 2002. It marked the second straight game that Indiana held a MAC opponent under 50 yards on the ground, as CMU had 37 yards rushing in the 2008 contest between the two teams.

- Led by McCray, the Hoosier rushing attack rumbled for 187 yards, the most since running for 272 against CMU in 2008.

- Junior Mitchell Evans showed his versatility in the game, lining up under center several times for the Hoosiers. He was 0-for-1 passing and picked up 35 yards on six rushes while lined up at QB. As a receiver, he caught two balls for 31 yards as well. To round off his game even more, Evans picked up a pair of tackles on special teams.

- Redshirt freshman Nick Freeland hit his first three field goals before Western blocked his third attempt. He is now 4-for-5 in his career on field goals. He also hit both of his extra points and averaged 67 yards on his six kickoffs, including his first career touchback.

- Junior Jeremy Finch recovered his first career fumble, diving on a bad snap on a Western Michigan punt in the fourth quarter to give the Hoosiers the ball inside the red zone with less than 10 minutes to play. He picked up his second career fumble recovery on the final play of the game.

- Senior linebacker Matt Mayberry split a first-quarter sack with Kirlew to give him 1.5 on the season and 6.5 in his career. IU sacked Tim Hiller twice to give the Hoosiers six sacks on the season.

- For the second time in as many games, Indiana won the toss and elected to receive.

- The Hoosiers improved to 33-6-1 against the Mid-American Conference with the win. IU also moved to 5-0 all-time against Western Michigan.

- True freshman defensive tackle Adam Replogle made his first career start in the game, lining up at defensive tackle. He and his brother, Tyler (linebacker), became the first brothers to start in the same game for IU since Antwaan and Curtis Randle El started 14 games together in 1998-99.

- Indiana celebrated its 125th anniversary with a reunion for former players, coaches and managers. Over 400 people attended the event from all IU eras.
