SETTING THE SCENE

Indiana kicks off its 126th year of football on Thursday, Sept. 2, as the Hoosiers welcome the Tigers of Towson to Bloomington. Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. EDT and the game will be televised on the Big Ten Network. This is the first-ever meeting between the two teams and the second straight Thursday season opener for IU. Indiana downed Eastern Kentucky, 19-13, in the first Thursday evening game in Memorial Stadium history on Sept. 3, 2009.

Bill Lynch is entering his fourth season as Hoosier head coach. Indiana returns 14 starters from 2009, including eight on offense, four on defense and two on special teams. The Hoosiers are multiple on both offense and defense.

FOR STARTERS

The Hoosiers are 34-16 in home openers at Memorial Stadium and have won their last eight season kickoffs at The Rock. In fact, IU has won 25 of its last 28 home starters. Indiana has also won its last six season openers and seven of its last eight. Head Coach **Bill Lynch** is 3-0 in openers, as the Hoosiers dominated Indiana State (55-7) and Western Kentucky (31-13) in 2007 and 2008, before last year's win over Eastern Kentucky.

SEASON CAPTAINS

The team elected **Ben Chappell** and **Tyler Replogle** as season captain. Head Coach **Bill Lynch** will also announce two game captains each week to join Chappell and Replogle. Chappell was a team captain in 2009 and Replogle was elected a game captain twice a season ago.

SCOUTING TOWSON

For the second straight season, Towson will open its season on the road against a Big Ten foe. In 2009, the Tigers fell to Northwestern, 47-14. Towson completed the 2009 campaign with a 2-9 record and a 1-7 mark in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA).

The Tigers have held a quarterback battle during preseason camp after an injury-plagued 2009, which saw them average 146.5 yards through the air and 251.1 total yards of offense per game. Senior Hakeem Moore returns as the team's most experienced receiver, posting 28 receptions, 286 yards and one score a year ago.

Sophomores Tremayne Dameron and Dominique Booker led Towson's rushing attack (104.6 per game). Dameron paced the squad with 588 yards on 177 carries (3.3 average) and eight touchdowns, while Booker averaged 4.0 yards per carry with 218 yards.

Towson returns three starters on the defensive line, including preseason All-CAA selection Yaka Ibia. The defensive tackle led the team with 11.5 tackles for loss to go along with 52 tackles and 2.5 sacks last year. In the secondary, Jeremy Gardner (28 starts) and Ollie Thomas (27 starts) return for their fourth seasons as starters. The Tigers surrendered 364.2 yards per game last season, including 185.0 passing and 179.2 rushing.

Rob Ambrose is in his second season at Towson. Ambrose spent nine seasons as an assistant with the Tigers and seven years at Connecticut before taking over the helm at his alma mater. He began his playing career as a quarterback before moving to wideout.

JOHNNY U.

Towson plays its home games in Uinitas Stadium, which is named in honor of Hall of Fame quarterback and former Baltimore Colt Johnny Uinitas. Uinitas was the parent of three Towson students and served as a community liaison for Tiger Athletics.

FINISH

Head Coach **Bill Lynch's** theme for his team since the end of the 2009 season is one simple word in bold capitalized letters - **FINISH**. The coaching staff singled out 12 plays from last year that the team should have made, and if it had made, likely would have put the Hoosiers in a bowl game.

"It wasn't that we weren't good enough, that we couldn't block that guy or cover that guy; we simply didn't execute," Lynch stated at IU's Media Day. "I'd show the play and ask, 'Can we make that play?' 'Yes.' 'Can we make that play?' 'Yes.'"

To hammer the point home, the team finishes every huddle saying "FINISH," has FINISH printed in big red letters on the back of their work-out shirts and FINISH appears on most everything the players receive from their coaches.

IU lost three of its conference games by a total of seven points. The Hoosiers fell by three in Ann Arbor against Michigan, by a field goal at home vs. Wisconsin, and lost a 29-28 heartbreaker at Northwestern. Indiana also held a 10-point fourth-quarter edge against Iowa in Iowa City before falling short.

In each of their first three Big Ten road games against Michigan, Northwestern and Iowa, the Hoosiers held leads at the end of the first half and at the end of the third quarter. It marked the first time that Indiana held a halftime lead in three conference road games since 1994. IU entered the break tied with the Nittany Lions in its final road test and trailed by one score entering the fourth.

CHAPPELL IN CHARGE

Ben Chappell entered 2009 with three starts under his belt and went on to complete one of the best seasons a Hoosier signal-caller has ever seen. He heads into the 2010 season in the school's top 10 in career completion percentage (1st), passing yardage (8th), completions (7th), attempts (8th), passing touchdowns (9th), total offense (10th), 300-yard games (3rd) and 100-yard games (6th). Chappell became the first QB in IU history to complete over 60 percent of passes in a single season.

One of the team's two season captains, along with senior linebacker **Tyler Replogle**, Chappell is on the Johnny Uinitas Golden Arm Award Watch List. He also

sits in the top 20 among returning players nationally (2009 stats) in completions per game (22.33; 6th), passing yards (2,941; 12th), passing yards per game (245.08; 13th) and total offense (2,932; 20th). Those totals all rank first among Big Ten returners.

Chappell ended the year in the Hoosiers' single-season top 10 in passing yardage (2nd), passing touchdowns (T-3rd), completions (1st), attempts (2nd), completion percentage (1st) and total offense (2,932 - 4th) last year. In Big Ten games only, he led the league in passing yards per game (261.2) and attempts (303), and he placed second in passing touchdowns (14), third in completions (183), total offense per game (261.5) and completion percentage (60.4). He ranked second in the Big Ten (overall games) in completions, third in passing yards per game (245.1), completion percentage and attempts, and fourth in total offense each time out (244.1).

The Bloomington South graduate threw for three TDs three times and two-or-more scores five times, surpassed 300 yards three times, 250 yards six times and 200 yards eight times, and he completed 20 passes eight times and reached the 60-percent completion mark seven times. Chappell completed 33 passes over 20 yards, nine over 30 yards, four over 40 yards and a 56-yarder. He also threw six touchdowns over 25 yards (26, 28, 29, 33, 44 and 46) to push his career total to 10 (43, 43, 64 and 77 in 2008).

CLASS ACT

It is easy to see why **Ben Chappell** is considered one of the brightest quarterbacks Head Coach **Bill Lynch** has ever coached when you look at everything he has accomplished off the field as well.

Chappell, a nominee for the AFCA Good Works Team and the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, completed his bachelor's degree in accounting on June 30, 2010, with a 3.70 GPA. For the second straight summer, he interned with BKD, LLP, in Bloomington, one of the 10 largest CPA and advisory firms in the country.

The fifth-year senior is currently working toward his MBA in accounting. Chappell is a three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection and will likely earn his fourth straight honor this season. He garnered a spot on the *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District V team as a junior.

In his eight semesters of classroom work, he has never recorded a GPA lower than 3.3 and has earned Alpha Beta honors each of those semesters. Chappell was also a 2009-10 Big Ten Distinguished Scholar Award recipient (3.7 GPA over the academic year).

Chappell is one of the most active Hoosiers in the community. As a member of the team's Leadership Council, he was instrumental in organizing the program's two community initiatives - visiting Riley's Children's Hospital in Indianapolis and welcoming the Bloomington Boys & Girls Club to Memorial Stadium each season.

TD ON TOP

After one of the top seasons in the Big Ten last season, **Tandon Doss** has started garnering national attention. The junior wide receiver has been named to the Biletnikoff Award (nation's top receiver) and the Paul Hornung Award (nation's most versatile player) Watch Lists. Doss is the fourth Hoosier receiver in five years up for the Biletnikoff and enters this year 11th among returning players nationally (2009 stats) in receptions per game (6.64), 15th in yards per game

(80.2) and 28th in all-purpose yards per game (138.8). Those numbers improve to second, second and first, respectively, among all Big Ten returners.

Doss is an *SI.com* and *Sporting News* preseason All-Big Ten receiver and a first team All-Big Ten selection by *Phil Steele's* preview magazine. He was named a first team All-Big Ten punt returner and a second team All-Big Ten wide receiver by *Athlon Sports*, and he was rated the 20th-best wide receiver nationally and as a second team All-Big Ten honoree by *Lindy's Sports*.

A first team All-Big Ten selection by the conference media in 2009, Doss led the Hoosiers in receptions in nine games and receiving yards eight times. He paced the team with 962 yards, 77 receptions, five touchdowns and in yards per game. Doss finished second in the Big Ten and 27th nationally in yards per game and third in the league and tied for 21st nationally in catches per game.

The Indianapolis native's 962 yards were 14th in the country and the second most for an underclassman. Doss closed out the year second on IU's single-season receptions list, just two shy of James Hardy's record of 79 in 2007, and fifth in the school's single-season yardage rankings.

Along with his three 100-yard receiving games, Doss owned 533 kick return yards, 127 rushing yards, 44 punt return yards and led the conference in all-purpose yards per contest. He finished ninth on IU's single-season list with 1,666 all-purpose yards, surpassed 100 all-purpose yards in seven of the last nine games and eight times overall in 2009, including a season-best 242 against Purdue.

BELCHER BREAKS THROUGH

Damarlo Belcher took the field along with **Tandon Doss** as a true freshman, and just like his classmate, he has worked his way in to the discussion as one of the Big Ten's top receivers. Belcher enters 2010 28th among returning players nationally (2009 stats) in yards per game (64.2), 30th in receptions per game (5.08) and is third in both categories among conference returnees.

Belcher shared the team lead with five receiving touchdowns and finished second on the Hoosiers with 61 catches, 770 yards, a 12.6 average per catch and in yards per game a year ago. He closed the season tied for fourth on Indiana's single-season receptions list and 13th on the school's single-season yardage list. Belcher ranked fifth in the Big Ten in catches per game and sixth in yards per game, and in league games only, he finished fourth with 5.25 catches per game and 71.1 yards per game.

The Fort Wayne native came on strong in the final six games of the year. Belcher led the team with 462 yards and 80.3 yards per game, shared the top spot with four touchdowns, and he sat one catch behind Doss with 35 (5.8 per game).

On the season, he reached 90 yards three times, 80 yards five times and 60 yards in each of the final six games. Belcher caught nine passes for 20-plus yards, including four touchdowns and three for 30-or-more yards, and he led the team in yards three times and in catches twice.

1-2 PUNCH

As sophomores in 2009, the duo of **Tandon Doss** and **Damarlo Belcher** produced 11.5 catches and 144.4 receiving yards per game. They became the first

duo in IU history to each collect 60-plus receptions and 700-plus yards in a season.

Their 138 combined catches rank first in Hoosier lore (third in Big Ten in 2009) and their 1,732 yards sit second (second in Big Ten in 2009). Current New Orleans Saints standout Courtney Roby (1,039) and Glenn Johnson (837) combined for 1,876 yards in 2002.

They enter 2010 with the fourth most combined catches from a season ago among returners nationally and the fifth-most receiving yards. Both totals are tops in the Big Ten.

Doss and Belcher combined for a career-best 222 yards in last year's season opener against Eastern Kentucky. The total eclipsed their combined high of 189 from 2008, which set an Indiana true freshmen record, in the team's win over No. 22 (BCS) Northwestern.

ELITE COMPANY

Fifth-year senior **Terrance Turner**, and juniors **Tandon Doss** and **Damarlo Belcher** combined for 2,175 yards, 184 receptions and 11 touchdowns in 2009. Their combined yardage is the sixth-most for a returning trio nationally, while their 184 receptions are fifth and their 11 touchdowns share 18th.

The trio is also on the verge of a rare feat that has never been accomplished before in Hoosier history. Indiana has never seen three receivers play together at the same time where each wideout had reached 100 career receptions and 1,000 career yards.

Doss enters the year with 1,148 yards and 91 catches and Belcher sits at 1,107 yards and 86 receptions. A theatre and drama major who has starred in two plays on campus – an American Ma(u)l and The America Play - Turner has 755 yards and 76 grabs.

WHERE THERE'S A WILLIS

The Hoosiers owned one of the top passing attacks in the Big Ten last year and showed they can be one of the top all-around offenses in the league when the running game is hitting on all cylinders. Enter sophomore **Darius Willis**, who battled injuries to start six times and play in nine games last season.

Willis, who grew up watching film of and idolizing Walter Payton, paced the team with 607 yards, 67.4 yards per game, a 4.9 average, 123 attempts and six scores a year ago. His per game average ranked eighth among freshmen nationally and second among freshmen in the Big Ten, while he ranked fifth in the Big Ten and shared eighth with 4.0 points per game.

Those numbers improved in conference play, where Willis finished fourth with 76.9 rushing yards per game and 10th with 89.4 all-purpose yards per game. His 607 yards were the most for an IU freshman since BenJarvus Green-Ellis had 938 in 2003, and he became the first freshman since Green-Ellis to lead the team in rushing. The Indianapolis native compiled three 100-yard games, three 60-plus yard TD runs (85, 70 and 64), all in Big Ten play, and five 20-plus yard runs overall.

In just his third career game on one of the grandest stages in college football, Willis collected the most yards for a Hoosier running back since 2005 (Chris Taylor, 176 vs. Kentucky) and led Indiana to its second-highest rushing total in 60 all-time games vs. Michigan (197). Willis finished with 154 yards on 16 carries, a 9.5 average, with two scores at Michigan

Stadium. His second touchdown run went for 85 yards and put the Hoosiers ahead 33-29 with 8:57 remaining. It was the third-longest rush in IU history and the longest allowed by a Michigan defense since 1987.

Willis closed out 2009 in style with 142 yards, his third 100-yard game, on just 19 carries (7.5 average) with a long of 64 yards vs. Purdue. He added his second 100-yard game, his second two-touchdown contest and his second 70-plus yard rushing score at Northwestern. Willis got the corner and rumbled 70 yards on IU's first play, the first time since Nov. 6, 2004, the Hoosiers scored on their first play from scrimmage. He added a 3-yard touchdown in the second quarter and finished the contest with 103 yards on 14 carries (7.4 average).

As a redshirt in 2008, Willis earned co-offensive scout team player honors. He rushed for 1,728 yards (6.0 average) and 28 scores and was runner-up for Indiana Mr. Football his senior campaign at Franklin Central High School. He collected all-state, All-Marion County and all-conference honors.

HOOSIER 3-4

After making the offense more multiple a year ago with the addition of the Pistol formation, it was the defense's turn this spring. The Hoosiers added the 3-4 formation to their defensive package and will play exclusively with a stand-up defensive end, no matter the formation.

IU will employ two defensive ends, an anchor and a drop. The anchors will get down in a three-point stance and rush the passer, while the drops will line up in a two-point stance or stand-up position and can either rush the passer or drop into coverage.

MITCH OF ALL TRADES

Another season, another position change for **Mitchell Evans**. As Head Coach **Bill Lynch** has said since Evans stepped foot on campus, Evans is just a "football player" and will do anything to help the team win. Evans is on the move again, this time finding himself at the same position he manned as a true freshman, safety.

The West Milton, Ohio, native arrived at Indiana as a true freshman quarterback during 2007 preseason camp. Evans moved to safety once camp began and played the entire 2007 season at the position. He played quarterback during 2008 spring practice and opened preseason camp there before moving to wide receiver. Evans saw action at wideout for most of 2008, but he also played quarterback against Central Michigan, Wisconsin and Penn State.

In 2009, Evans ranked fourth on the team with 33 catches for 366 yards and third on the team with three touchdowns and 11.1 yards per receptions. He also took 69 snaps in the Wildcat and rushed for 131 yards on 32 attempts (4.1 average) and threw for 21 yards.

Looking back at his freshman campaign, Evans was one of two true freshmen (**Tyler Replogle**) to take the field and he appeared in all 13 games at safety and on special teams. He finished the year with 13 tackles and two interceptions, both of which came in his first career start at Western Michigan. Evans became the first true freshman to record a pair of picks in one game since Tracy Porter vs. Central Michigan in 2004.

THE ORIGINAL REPLOGLE

With Matt Mayberry and Will Patterson chasing their NFL dreams, senior **Tyler Replogle** enters 2010 as the undisputed leader of the defense. This was supported by his election as one of two team season captains, along with fifth-year senior quarterback **Ben Chappell**.

Known for his relentless work ethic and love for contact, Replogle is the sixth-leading returning tackler in the Big Ten heading into 2010. He finished 12th in the Big Ten with 7.3 tackles per game and 13th in league games only with 7.7 stops each time out last season. Replogle played in 11 games and started nine times at strong-side linebacker.

The Centerville, Ohio, product ended the year second on the team with 80 tackles and 51 solos to go along with two sacks, 6.5 tackles for loss and his first-career interception in the team's win over Akron. He has three double-digit tackle games in career, including two in 2009.

REPLOGLE 2.0

As evidenced by a 290-pound menace on the defensive line, Tyler's non-stop motor and passion for the game might just run in the family. His brother, **Adam Replogle**, demonstrated the same qualities as the only true freshman to play in 2009.

Adam played in all 12 games and started the final 11 games of the season at defensive tackle. With the team's addition of the 3-4 formation, Replogle will play some defensive end as well in 2010.

He finished third on the team with four sacks a season ago, which ranked second among freshmen defensive tackles and third among all freshmen players in the Big Ten. Replogle added 32 tackles, five tackles for loss and also played fullback in each of the final three games, serving as a lead blocker, en route to selection on *CollegeFootballNews.com*'s Freshman All-America third team.

Together, Tyler and Adam started eight games together and became the first brothers to start together at IU since Antwaan (QB) and Curtis (DB) Randle El started 14 games together during the 1998 and 1999 seasons.

BIG BOYS

Adam Replogle's presence along with sophomores **Larry Black, Jr.**, **Mick Mentzer** and **Nicholas Sliger** provide the Hoosiers with a full cupboard of young and talented defensive tackles. Replogle is entering his second year with the program and Black, Mentzer and Sliger are beginning their third seasons.

Black earned a spot on the *Sporting News* freshman All-America and All-Big Ten teams and was a *CollegeFootballNews.com* Freshman All-America honorable mention selection. He started all 12 of the team's games and finished fourth on the team with 7.5 tackles for loss (27 yards), which ranked second among freshmen defensive tackles and shared third among all freshmen in the Big Ten. Black closed out the season with 29 tackles, 14 solo, 1.5 sacks and one fumble recovery.

Mentzer played in all 12 games and added 16 tackles and a half-sack, while Sliger also saw time in every game and recorded one tackle for loss and one interception.

HERO COMES HOME

One of the players in contention for the drop defensive end position is **Kevin Bush**. Bush always dreamed of being an Indiana Hoosier. He never dreamed the route he would take to Bloomington.

The 25-year-old began his career at the University of Toledo in 2005 before returning to his hometown of Fort Wayne after one month. He found a factory job, decided it wasn't for him, and went on to join the United States Armed Forces. Bush spent the next 3 1/2 years in the Army, including a 14-month stint in Iraq and one year in Korea. Upon his return, he blazed through walk-on tryouts to earn a spot on the 2009 team, eventually earning co-defensive scout team player of the year honors. Now, he will get his opportunity to realize his dream, at defensive end for the 2010 Indiana Hoosiers.

FORGIVE AND FORGET

Kevin Bush is behind **Darius Johnson** on the depth chart at stand-up defensive end. Ironically, it was Bush who ended Johnson's season a year ago with a vicious hit during the special teams portion of practice. The duo actually gets along great off the field and were roommates during preseason camp.

Johnson moved from linebacker to defensive end during 2009 spring practice and made eight tackles with one sack in the first three games before suffering the season-ending injury.

NEW FACES BOLSTER DEPTH

The defense added some much-needed depth through the junior college ranks and a couple of position changes. Linebacker **Jeff Thomas** (Foothill CC) and defensive back **Lenyatta Kiles** (Cerritos College) joined the program in the spring, while cornerback **Andre Kates** (ASA College) arrived for preseason camp. All three are on the depth chart and will see plenty of action in the season opener.

Along with senior strong safety **Mitchell Evans**, junior cornerback **Matt Ernest** moved from wide receiver to the secondary in the spring. Ernest, who threw 12 2/3 innings with a 4.97 ERA for the Hoosier baseball team this spring, played defensive back in high school and re-adjusted quickly to cornerback.

The depth has helped provide spirited competition and allowed the coaches with some flexibility when junior free safety **Chris Adkins** suffered an ankle injury in camp. With the competition at cornerback six-deep between senior **Richard Council**, Ernest, fifth-year senior **Adrian Burks**, Kates, Kiles and redshirt freshman **Lawrence Barnett**, Kiles and Barnett will get looks at safety as back-ups to Evans and the new starting free safety junior **Donnell Jones**.

IT'S A FAMILY THING

Bill Lynch is in his fourth season as Hoosier head coach and 33rd year of coaching overall. His three sons have a long way to go to match that number, but each has joined the coaching ranks to give it a shot.

Bill's oldest son, Billy, is in his sixth season as Indiana's wide receivers coach. His middle son, Joey, is in his second season at Ball State and serves as the team's recruiting coordinator and wide receivers coach. Bill's youngest son, Kevin, spent the 2009 season as a quality control coach with the Hoosiers before being hired as the wide receivers coach with the University of Indianapolis in Feb. 2010.

FANS IN THE STANDS

Indiana had the third-largest one-year percentage increase in average attendance in 2009, increasing by 10,051 to 41,833. It marked the Hoosiers largest home attendance since 1992 (44,074) and the first time they exceeded 40,000 since the same year.

IU also sold out an expanded student section twice, against Ohio State (11,000 seats) and again against Purdue (15,200 seats). The Purdue total was the fourth-largest student section in Memorial Stadium history and the largest since 1989.

PISTOL FIRING

Indiana installed the Pistol formation to the offense in the spring of 2009 after visiting with the Nevada coaching staff in the offseason. In the Hoosier Pistol offense, the quarterback lines up four yards behind the center and the running back lines up three-to-four yards behind the quarterback. The running back receives the ball deeper in the backfield, enabling him to run "downhill" and allowing the offense to use more play-action pass.

THE LYNCH SHOWS

The Bill Lynch Show will air weekly on the Big Ten Network. The show premieres at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, Sept. 1, and will re-air prior to the season opener with Towson at 2:30 p.m. on Sept. 2. Following the bye week and beginning on Friday, Sept. 17, the show will broadcast at 4:30 p.m. on Fridays. IU Assistant Athletic Director for Broadcast Services, Jeremy Gray, will host the show.

Coach Lynch's radio show, *Inside IU Football with Bill Lynch*, will be held Monday evenings at 7 p.m. on the IU Radio Network. The Holiday Inn Hotel in Bloomington will host the show, which debuts Aug. 30 and runs through Nov. 22 (no show on Sept. 6). The Voice of the Hoosiers, Don Fischer, hosts the call-in show.

Two hours before kickoff the team will be dropped off at the West doors of Assembly Hall and walk across the parking lot into The Rock.

The IU Marching Hundred and Cheerleading Squads will perform for the fans and form a pathway to show their support for the Hoosiers as they head toward the crimson gates of Memorial Stadium.

The Rock is the symbol representing Memorial Stadium. The three-ton piece of limestone atop a two-ton limestone base sits beyond the north end zone. Prior to each game, Coach Lynch and the players march out of the weight room in the North End Zone Student-Athlete Development Center and touch The Rock before hitting the field.

Additionally, the players will continue to join the fans and band in the singing of Indiana, Our Indiana following each home victory.

138,000 square footage of the North End Zone Student-Athlete Development Center. The two-year project was completed in August of 2009 for football and administrative personnel. The Hoosier football program enjoys spacious new offices, position and staff meeting rooms and a team auditorium, all equipped with state-of-the-art technology. At the heart of the new structure is the Student-Athlete Physical Development Center, one of the largest strength and conditioning centers in the country. Indiana's Henke Hall of Champions celebrates greats from all sports and is located on the top level of the North End Zone Student-Athlete Development Center. It features museum-quality displays and a large banquet area where Hoosier fans can gather to celebrate the past, present and future of IU Athletics. A 425-seat club section is located directly in front of the Henke Hall of Champions. Fans can enjoy the chair-back seating and food, beverage and all the amenities the Henke Hall of Champions has to offer.

41,833 Indiana had the third-largest one-year percentage increase in average attendance in 2009, increasing by 10,051 to 41,833. Previously located in a 3,000 square foot area in Assembly Hall, the new center is located on the East side of Memorial Stadium and opened this season. The academic center adds state-of-the-art technology and equipment in a convenient location for all Hoosier student-athletes. It is the fourth-largest academic center in the Big Ten.

25,000 square footage of the Student-Athlete Physical Development Center in the North End Zone Student-Athlete Development Center - one of the largest weight rooms in the nation. The center is located on the bottom level of the new facility with glass windows looking out to the field. It is nearly five times the size of the previous weight room and all Hoosier varsity sports have access to the center.

2,941 passing yards for quarterback **Ben Chappell** in 2009. The fifth-year senior's total is the

12th-best among returning quarterbacks nationally and the most in the Big Ten. Chappell enters 2010 in the top 10 on IU's career lists for completion percentage (.599 - 1st), passing yardage (3,956 - 8th), completions (349 - 7th), attempts (583 - 8th), passing touchdowns (21 - 9th), total offense (4,022 - 10th), 300-yard games (three - 3rd) and 200-yard games (nine - 6th).

2,175-184-11 yards, receptions and touchdowns combined for **Tandon Doss**, **Damarlo Belcher** and **Terrance Turner** in 2009. Their combined yardage is the sixth-most for a returning trio nationally, while their 184 receptions rank fifth and their 11 touchdowns share 18th. Doss paced the team with 962 yards and 77 receptions as a sophomore and shared the team lead with five TDs. Belcher matched Doss with five scores and finished second with 61 catches and 770 yards as a sophomore. Turner, who is the elder statesman of the group entering 2010 as a fifth-year senior, added 46 catches for 443 yards and one touchdown.

1,732 combined receiving yards for **Tandon Doss** and **Damarlo Belcher** in 2009. The total ranked second in Hoosier history and second in the Big Ten. Doss finished second in the league and 30th nationally in yards per game (80.2) and second on Indiana's single-season yardage list (962). Belcher ranked sixth in the Big Ten with 64.2 yards per game and 13th on IU's single-season yardage list (770).

607 yards rushing in nine games by **Darius Willis** as a redshirt freshman last season, the most by an IU freshman since BenJarvus Green-Ellis (938) in 2003. Willis paced the team and led the way with 67.4 yards per game, a 4.9 average, 123 attempts and six scores. His per game average ranked eighth among freshmen nationally and second among freshmen in the Big Ten. He was selected to the *ESPN.com* and *Rivals.com* All-Big Ten freshman teams.

262.4 passing yards per game in Big Ten contests for the Hoosiers last season, which ranked second in the league. In Big Ten games only, quarterback **Ben Chappell** led the league in passing yards per game (261.2) and attempts (303), placed second in passing touchdowns (14), and third in completions (183), total offense per game (261.5) and completion percentage (60.4). Chappell ranked second in the Big Ten (overall games) in completions (268), third in passing yards per game (245.1), completion percentage (62.6) and attempts (428), and fourth in total offense per game (244.1). The IU offense finished fourth in the Big Ten in pass offense (247.9).

138 combined catches for **Tandon Doss** and **Damarlo Belcher** in 2009. The total ranked first in Hoosier history and third in the Big Ten. Doss finished third in the league and tied for 22nd nationally in catches per game (6.64) and second on Indiana's single-season receptions list with 77. Belcher ranked fifth in the Big Ten with 5.08 grabs per game and shared fourth on Indiana's single-season receptions list with 61. The sophomores became the first duo in IU history to each collect 60-plus receptions and 700-plus yards in a season.

98 number of sophomore defensive lineman **Adam Replogle**. The lone true freshman to play for the Hoosiers last season, Replogle finished third on the team with four sacks (16 yards), which ranked second among freshmen defensive tackles and third among all freshmen players in the conference. The brother of Hoosier senior linebacker, Tyler, played in all 12 games and started the final 11 at defensive tackle and added 32 tackles and five tackles for loss.

97 number of sophomore defensive tackle **Larry Black, Jr.** As a redshirt freshman, Black earned a spot on the *Sporting News* freshman All-America and All-Big Ten teams. He finished fourth on the team with 7.5 tackles for loss (27 yards), which ranked second among freshmen defensive tackles and shared third among all freshmen players in the Big Ten. Black, who started each of the team's 12 games, made 29 tackles and recorded 1.5 sacks.

95 career wins for Indiana Head Coach **Bill Lynch** in 17 seasons as a head coach. Lynch owns a 95-90-3 (.513) overall record. He is in his fourth year as Hoosier head coach and has 32 years of coaching experience in the state of Indiana. In his three seasons, the Hoosiers reached the postseason and won seven games in a season for the first time since 1993 and won the Old Oaken Bucket for the first time since 2001. IU has boasted three All-Americans, three second-round and five total NFL Draft picks, nine All-Big Ten selections, one Academic All-American and 52 Academic All-Big Ten honorees.

87.1 percent or 3,814 yards from last season's 4,380 yards of total offense returns this year. The Hoosiers only lose 443 of 1,403 rushing yards and 123 of 2,975 receiving yards.

80 tackles by strong-side linebacker **Tyler Replogle** last season, which ranked second on the

team. He finished 12th in the Big Ten with 7.3 tackles per game and 13th in league games only with 7.7 stops each time out. The senior is the sixth-leading returning tackler in the Big Ten heading into 2010. Replogle added two sacks, 6.5 tackles for loss, one interception and two pass breakups in 2009.

74 yards former Hoosier **Tracy Porter** returned his game-clinching interception for a touchdown in Super Bowl XLIV. With the New Orleans Saints holding a 24-17 lead with 3:12 remaining in the contest, Porter picked off a Peyton Manning pass and returned it for six points. Porter celebrated the franchise's first championship with former Hoosiers **Courtney Roby**, and **Mike Mallory**, the son of IU's all-time winningest coach **Bill Mallory** who spent the 1986-87 seasons as a graduate assistant in Bloomington. Roby is a wide receiver and kick returner and Mallory is an assistant special teams coach for the Saints.

53 Hoosiers carried a 3.0 grade point average (GPA) or a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher during the 2009-10 academic year. Quarterback **Ben Chappell**, running back **Trea Burgess** and long snapper **Brandon Bugg** earned *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District V honors and 18 Hoosiers carded Academic All-Big Ten honors.

25 student-athletes signed National Letters of Intent to continue their playing careers at Indiana University on Feb. 3. Head Coach **Bill Lynch's** third recruiting class included the Illinois and Indiana Players of the Year in addition to 16 three-star recruits in the *Rivals.com* and *Scout.com* rankings. Eight players in the class reside from Ohio, four from Indiana, three from Michigan, two each from Illinois, Wisconsin and California, and one from Georgia, Kentucky, Maryland and Washington, D.C. The Hoosiers signed 15 players on the defensive and 10 on the offensive side of the ball. Indiana added six linebackers, four cornerbacks, three defensive linemen and two safeties. IU also welcomed three running backs, two wide receivers, tight ends and offensive linemen, and one quarterback/athlete for the incoming class of 2010.

16 sacks allowed by the Hoosier offensive line in 2009. That total ranked second in the Big Ten and shared 28th nationally. The Hoosiers' front five surrendered one sack per 27.5 pass attempts, which ranked second in the Big Ten. Three of the five starters return, including fifth-year senior right tackle **James Brewer**, junior **Justin Pagán** and sophomore center **Will Matte**.

11/20 The Indiana Department of Athletics reached an agreement with the Washington Redskins and FedExField to move its 2010 Big Ten Conference home football game with Penn State to the Redskins' home facility in Landover, Md. The game will be played on Nov. 20. IU will play in metropolitan Washington, D.C., for the first time since a 1935 meeting with the University of Maryland in Baltimore. FedExField, with a seating capacity of 91,704, is the largest venue used by a professional sports team in the United States. Opened in 1997, the venue has hosted several college football games, including the 2004 BCA Classic between Virginia Tech and USC.

9/2 Indiana opens the 2009 season on Sept. 2 against Towson. It marks the second Thursday night game in Memorial Stadium history with the first coming in last year's opener against Eastern Kentucky. Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. and the game will be televised on the Big Ten Network.

6 true freshmen have played in Head Coach **Bill Lynch's** first three seasons. Lynch's philosophy has been to redshirt student-athletes as freshmen and he has done just that. Safety **Mitchell Evans** and linebacker **Tyler Replogle** hit the field as true freshmen in 2007. The following year offensive lineman **Justin Pagán** and wide receivers **Tandon Doss** and **Damarlo Belcher** played their first seasons. Last year defensive lineman **Adam Replogle** was the lone true freshman to receive time.

5 Hoosiers have been selected in the NFL Draft during Head Coach **Bill Lynch's** tenure. In 2010, left tackle **Rodger Saffold** (second round, St. Louis), de-

fensive end **Jammie Kirlaw** (seventh round, Denver) and cornerback/kick returner **Ray Fisher** (seventh round, Indianapolis) were selected. In 2008, cornerback **Tracy Porter** (second round, New Orleans) and wide receiver **James Hardy** (second round, Buffalo) were chosen 40th and 41st, respectively.

4 Four members of IU's signing class participated in spring practice. Junior college transfers **Lenyatta Kiles** (defensive back) and **Jeff Thomas** (linebacker) were joined by true freshmen **Antonio Banks** (running back) and **Jack Denton** (tight end).

3-4 formation implemented by the Hoosier defense this spring. "We lost a number of guys from our 2009 defense, we looked at our returning players and we thought we had the personnel for the 3-4. After looking at some film on the formation, we implemented it this spring and were happy with the results. We have some outstanding young linebackers in the program right now and being able to move into a 3-4 along with our base 4-3 will make us more multiple and make us a little tougher to prepare for week to week," Head Coach **Bill Lynch** said.

3 **Mitchell Evans** has played three positions in his Hoosier career. He arrived to Indiana as a true freshman quarterback during 2007 preseason camp. Evans moved to safety and played the entire 2007 season at the position. He played quarterback during 2008 spring practice and opened preseason camp there before moving to wide receiver. Evans saw action at wideout most of 2008, but he also played quarterback against Central Michigan, Wisconsin and Penn State. In 2009, Evans caught 33 balls for 366 and three scores while taking 69 snaps as quarterback in the Wildcat formation. During the spring of 2010, Evans was on the move once again and now finds himself back at safety, where he is projected to start at strong safety.

2 prime time games on Indiana's schedule. Both games will be televised as Big Ten Network prime time broadcasts. IU will face Towson on Thursday, Sept. 2, at 7:30 p.m. and Akron on Saturday, Sept. 25, at 7 p.m.

1 the Hoosiers will face Towson and Arkansas State for the first time in program history. Indiana opens the season with the second Thursday night game in Memorial Stadium history against Towson on Sept. 2. IU hosts Arkansas State for 2010 Homecoming on Oct. 16.

FAN FRIENDLY MEMORIAL STADIUM

The Indiana University Department of Athletics has developed several new experiences and promotions since the completion of the North End Zone Student-Athlete Development Center last year designed to enhance the game-day experience at Memorial Stadium for home football games. New experiences at Memorial Stadium include:

Knothole Park: Knothole Park opened in 2009 and is a recreation area behind the south end zone at Memorial Stadium. The park features a FieldTurf replica of the playing field at Memorial Stadium and children ages 13 and under will get to play with Nerf footballs, hang out with IU student-athletes from a variety of sports and chalk the driveway behind the field that has been appropriately renamed Knothole Road.

Kicks-for-Keeps: The large nets behind the two goalposts are gone and much like going to a baseball game, field goals and extra points will head into the stands. If a fan catches or retrieves a ball kicked by the Hoosiers, they will be allowed to exchange the ball for an official IU adidas game ball that will feature an embossed IU logo. If a spectator catches or retrieves a ball kicked by the opposing team, they are encouraged to throw it back onto the field. By doing so, the spectator will receive a free T-shirt acknowledging that they threw the ball back at Memorial Stadium.

Red Light Specials: Once every game, a special IU vehicle will drive down Knothole Road with a red siren on top of the vehicle. An announcement will then be made about what concession item will be that game's Red Light Special. As long as the red light is on, the noted concession item will cost just one dollar. Concession items and the time of the Red Light Special will change each week.

Shorter Lines: To cut down on the long lines before kickoff, Indiana Athletics has purchased more scanners and hired additional staff to expedite the process of getting fans into Memorial Stadium.

"Little 5 Feel": By purchasing a certain number of tickets, residence halls, fraternities, sororities and other student organizations can have painted bed sheets, flags, and part of Knothole Road painted with their letters, logo or organization name.

'Greening' Memorial Stadium: In an effort to mix red with green, there will be prominently labeled recycling bins located around all the concourses of Memorial Stadium and there will be several volunteers collecting recyclables in tailgating areas.

Crimson Club: A rewards system to thank students for attending IU athletic events. Every time an IU student attends an IU sporting event, they will be awarded points. By accruing points over the year, they will be eligible to win valuable prizes like iPods and TVs.

Game Day T-Shirt: Hoosier students are encouraged to wear their IU Game Day T-shirt. The shirt was designed by a student and won in an online vote against nine other designs.

The Quarry: After taking suggestions from students, the student section has been named The Quarry.

-There will be a Quarry Rig that is a replica of what is used in the quarries around this area.

-The rig will have a horn that will be used at critical times in the game. This horn will be operated by students.

-A student will run out with the team carrying the official Quarry Flag. The student will then take the flag to the top of the Quarry Section, where he will put it on the student section flag pole.

-For the second year students voted for the student shirt. Students submitted their designs and the top 10 were all voted on.

New Scoreboard: A new, state-of-the-art HD scoreboard has been constructed at Memorial Stadium. It is 36x91 feet wide and ranks as one of the 10 largest college scoreboards in the country. The new scoreboard is 325 percent larger than the video screen within the old scoreboard that was installed in 1999. The screen's HD15 technology offers the most dramatic resolution for any college scoreboard in the country.

Partnering with IU Auditorium: The IU Auditorium, noted for their outstanding customer service, will provide the ushers and ticket takers for home games this season.

Knothole Card: A new card that will be given to all youth season ticket holders. Non-season ticket holders will be able to sign up for cards in Knothole Park on the day of the game. With each card, Knothole members will be able to get a prize for each game. Those who attend every game this season are eligible to win a Grand Prize at the end of the year.

William Tell Overture: The William Tell Overture will be played by the band at the end of the third quarter at all home games.

DON FISCHER

This marks the 38th year that Don Fischer has been the radio play-by-play "voice" of Indiana University football and men's basketball games. The past 23 years, Fischer has worked as an independent contractor and is currently serving the Indiana University Radio

Network owned by Learfield Communications out of Jefferson City, Mo.

In addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the weekly coaches radio talk shows for both football and basketball and has a daily show, Monday through Friday, from September through March. The daily show is called "IU Sports Today" and is syndicated throughout the state of Indiana. Fischer also offers stations a weekly talk show about IU football and basketball that airs in several markets around the state during the school year.

Fischer does freelance sportscasting, which for the past 16 years has included being the television voice of the Indianapolis Colts.

During his 37 years of work with IU, Fischer has been named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year 24 times by two different organizations. The National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association has awarded him 20 times, including 2009, while the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association has named him its honoree four times. The Indiana

Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association (ISSA) inducted Fischer into the ISSA Hall of Fame in 2004.

He has won several awards for best play-by-play performance, and he has been honored by Indiana University with the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University. He also has been named an Honorary "I" Man.

In addition, the City of Indianapolis, and the State of Indiana have each honored Fischer with a special "Recognition Day" for his service and abilities as the play by-play broadcaster for IU.

Fischer has broadcast more than 1,500 Indiana University games - a total that includes eight bowl games, four NCAA basketball championship games and two N.I.T. championship games. From 1973 through 1987, he worked for ABC Radio, Canada's CBC and several additional major market radio stations, including WIRE in Indianapolis, as their source for reports during the month of May coverage of the Indianapolis 500. During that period, Fischer also served WIRE and Network Indiana, a statewide news network, as their sports director.

A native of Rochelle, Ill., Fischer has been in the radio business for 42 years. His previous broadcast experience includes stops in Butte, Mont.; Ottawa, Ill.; Springfield, Ill.; and Terre Haute, Ind.

Fischer has four sons and eight grandchildren. Don and his wife, Susy, reside in Greenwood, Ind.



BUCK SUHR

Buck Suhr rejoins the Indiana University Football Radio Network as color commentator for the 2010 season. Suhr, who served in the same capacity from 1997-2001, will reunite with the radio voice of the Hoosiers, Don Fischer, and Joe Smith (pre-game, post-game and halftime).

Suhr was a member of the Hoosier football program for 18 years as a coach and administrator. He spent 12 seasons (1984-95) as running backs coach under IU's all-time winningest coach, Bill Mallory, and he served on the same staff as current head coach, Bill Lynch, in 1993-94.

After his stint as running backs coach, including All-America selections Anthony Thompson and Vaughn Dunbar, Suhr was named administrative as-

sistant to the head coach and athletic director from 1996-2001.

As running backs coach, Suhr helped direct one of the nation's most productive rushing attacks. From 1984-95, the Hoosiers had three different 1,000-yard rushers who topped that mark on six separate occasions. In 1988, the IU offense rushed for a school-record 2,963 yards. During his tenure, Suhr coached Thompson, the 1989 Heisman Trophy runner-up, Dunbar and Alex Smith, the 1994 UPI National Freshman of the Year.

Suhr and his wife, Jane, are the parents of one son, Errek, and the deceased Jenny Suhr. Errek played in 74 games and earned four letters as a guard for the IU men's basketball program from 2004-07.



JOE SMITH

Joe Smith is in his 28th year with the IU Radio Network. He has handled pre-game, halftime, and post-game duties for Indiana football and men's basketball since 1983.

Smith, the sports director of WGCL-AM 1370 in Bloomington, is in his 41st

year of radio broadcasting in Bloomington. He began his broadcasting career in 1969 at WAIK Radio in Galesburg, Ill. From 1973-89, Joe worked on "RFD-4 Agri-Business Show" on WTTV-4 with the late Bob Cook. In 1998, Smith was named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year and in April 2003, he was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters/Sportscasters Hall of Fame. Joe handled the IU TV Warmup Shows from 1978-82 and hosted several IU Coaches Shows from 1983-96 and again from 2002-04.

In June 2004, Smith received the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

Joe has two children, both of whom are Indiana University graduates. Jeff, who currently resides in Indianapolis with his wife, Kristen, is a 2002 graduate with a bachelor's degree in sport communications. Joe's daughter, Jamie, who is engaged to Eric Graebe and currently resides in Kill Devil Hills, N.C. earned her bachelor's degree from Indiana University in kinesiology in 2005, and her master's in sports management at the University of Tennessee in 2006.

HEAD COACH BILL LYNCH



A native and lifelong Hoosier with 32 years coaching experience in the state of Indiana, **Bill Lynch** is in his fourth year at the helm of the IU football program. In his first three seasons, the Hoosiers reached the postseason and won seven games in a season for the first time since 1993 and they won the Old Oaken Bucket for the first time since 2001. IU has boasted three All-Americans, three second-round and five total NFL Draft picks, nine All-Big Ten selections, one Academic All-American and 52 Academic All-Big Ten honorees.

The nine all-conference selections are the most in a three-year stretch for the Hoosiers since 1993-95 and the 52 Academic All-Big Ten honorees are the most in a three-year period in IU history.

Lynch's charges have received national recognition both on and off the field over the last three seasons. Indiana has produced two Ted Hendricks Award finalists, one finalist for the Lou Groza Award and one semifinalist for the Biletnikoff Award. Three Hoosiers have been invited to the Texas vs. Nation Challenge, two have played in the Senior Bowl, two have participated in the East-West Shrine Game and eight have received invitations to the NFL Scouting Combine.

Additionally, the program has had six *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District V selections, two finalists for the ARA Sportsmanship Award, one finalist for the Wuerffel Trophy, one finalist for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, a member of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, a recipient of the Wayne Duke Postgraduate Award and a winner of the Big Ten Medal of Honor. Two Hoosiers were semifinalists for the William V. Campbell Trophy and one was a semifinalist for the John Wooden Cup.

Lynch is also an active member in the community, not only in Bloomington, but throughout the state. He has made more than 100 public appearances across Indiana this year. Lynch and his wife, Linda, were co-chairpersons for the 2010 Heroes for the American Red Cross campaign. The football program is also actively involved with the Bloomington Boys & Girls Club and the Riley Hospital for Children.

In 2009, the Hoosiers produced at least three All-Big Ten honorees for the second time in three seasons. Wide receiver Tandon Doss, defensive end Jammie Kirlow and left tackle Rodger Saffold earned all-conference honors. Doss collected first team accolades from the conference media and second team laurels from the conference coaches, while Kirlow garnered second team honors from both groups. Saffold was named a second team member by the coaches. Saffold, quarterback Ben Chappell, cornerback Ray Fisher, linebacker Matt Mayberry and defensive end Greg Middleton received honorable mention recognition from the media, and Chappell, Fisher and Mayberry carded honorable mention from the coaches.

Seven Hoosiers were either selected in the 2010 NFL Draft or signed free-agent contracts in April. Saffold was selected with the first pick in the second round by the St. Louis Rams. He became Indiana's highest draft pick since defensive end Nathan Davis (32nd pick, 1997).

Kirlow (Denver) and Fisher (Indianapolis) were both drafted in the seventh round, while Mayberry (Chicago) and weak-side linebacker Will Patterson (Houston) joined free safety Nick Polk (Houston) and tight end Troy Wagner (Cleveland) as free-agent signings.

Saffold, Kirlow, Middleton and Polk each participated in the 2010 NFL Scouting Combine, giving IU the third-most players at the Combine in the Big Ten. Three of the four also played in postseason All-Star games. Saffold shined at the 2010 East-West Shrine Game, while Kirlow and Polk received invitations to the 2010 Texas vs. Nation Challenge.

Kirlow was a member of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. He earned selection to the Ted Hendricks Defensive End of the Year Award Watch List, along with Middleton, the Chuck Bednarik Award Watch List and the Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List in addition to being one of 10 finalists for the ARA Sportsmanship Award. Kirlow was also a candidate for the Lowe's Senior CLASS award and selected as the team MVP for the second straight campaign.

In the classroom, 53 Hoosiers carried a 3.0 grade-point average (GPA) or a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher during the 2009-10 academic year. Chappell, Trea Burgess and Brandon Bugg earned *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District V honors and 18 Hoosiers carded Academic All-Big Ten honors.

Lynch completed his first season as Indiana head coach in 2007, leading the Hoosiers to a 7-6 record and a trip to the Insight Bowl. He is the only head coach in Hoosier history to guide a team to a bowl game in his debut season and just the fourth coach in IU lore to patrol the sidelines for a postseason contest. The team's seven victories were the second most for a first-year Indiana head coach, behind only James M. Sheldon, who went 8-1-1 in 1905.

Two of Lynch's 2007 charges were selected on the first day of the NFL Draft. The New Orleans Saints picked cornerback Tracy Porter with the 40th selection, while the Buffalo Bills took wide receiver

James Hardy in the 41st slot. Indiana and Michigan were the only Big Ten teams with multiple selections on day one. It also marked the first time IU had two players selected on day one since 1988.

Porter, Hardy, kicker Austin Starr, quarterback Kellen Lewis and Middleton each collected All-Big Ten honors. Hardy and Middleton snared first team honors from both the conference coaches and media, while Starr and Porter added first team accolades from the media. The four first-teamers shared second most in the league with Penn State, trailing only Ohio State's six. Lewis was a second team selection by both the conference coaches and media, while Porter and Starr joined him on the coaches' ballots.

Hardy, Starr and Middleton also received All-America recognition. Hardy and Middleton both collected second team honors from the Walter Camp Football Foundation and third team laurels from the Associated Press (AP), while Starr captured second team status from the AP. Starr was a Lou Groza Award finalist, Middleton was a Ted Hendricks Defensive End of the Year Award finalist and Hardy was a Biletnikoff Award semifinalist.

Kirlow earned first team All-Big Ten honors from the conference media and second team recognition from the conference coaches and was also one of six finalists for the Ted Hendricks Defensive End of the Year Award in 2008. Punter Chris Hagerup was recognized on three Freshman All-America Teams. *Sporting News*, *Rivals.com* and *Phil Steele* each selected the redshirt freshman as a second-teamer on the heels of honorable mention All-Big Ten merits.

In addition to success on the field, Lynch stresses the importance of earning a degree from one of the top academic institutions in the country. A school-record 22 Hoosiers earned Academic All-Big Ten honors in 2008, more than 25 percent of the roster recorded a grade point average of 3.0, and Starr earned *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District V honors for the third straight season.

Forty-one Hoosiers completed the 2007-08 academic year with cumulative grade point averages of 3.0 or higher. Starr became the sixth IU player to be named to the *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-America First Team, while Josiah Sears joined Starr on the Academic All-District V team. Kevin Trulock received the inaugural Wayne Duke Postgraduate Award, presented by the Indianapolis Big Ten Community Partnership.

Lynch signed an agreement on Nov. 26, 2007, to remain Indiana University's head football coach through July 1, 2012. He was named IU's 27th head coach on June 15, 2007. Lynch has compiled a 95-90-3 (.513) career record with stops in Bloomington, at Butler, Ball State and DePauw. He has won or shared six conference or divisional titles in his 17 seasons. Lynch has 33 overall years of coaching experience, spending 32 of those seasons in the state of Indiana.

With the Hoosiers' trip to the Insight Bowl in 2007, Lynch made his third appearance in a bowl game as a coach. He was the quarterbacks coach (1993-94) under former Hoosier head coach Bill Mallory when Indiana faced Virginia Tech in the 1993 Independence Bowl. Lynch served as the Ball State head coach and led the Cardinals to the 1996 Las Vegas Bowl.

Lynch, a 2005 inductee into the Indiana Football Hall of Fame, served as interim head coach for two games in 2006 and led the Hoosiers during 2007 spring practice. During his first two seasons in Bloomington, he was the assistant head coach, offensive coordinator and tight ends coach.

Under Lynch's leadership as offensive coordinator, Lewis posted one of the top freshman seasons in IU history. He racked up 2,221 yards passing and 19 total touchdowns in 2006. The Hoosiers scored their most points (277) since 2001 and averaged 23.1 points, 335.9 yards and 222.1 passing yards per game. Indiana scored over 30 points three times and at least 24 points on seven occasions.

The veteran coach returned to Bloomington after directing DePauw University to an 8-2 record en route to Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference (SCAC) co-Coach of the Year honors in 2004. Lynch was the first coach in SCAC history to earn the award in his debut campaign. DePauw finished 5-1 in league play.

Under Lynch's tutelage, seven DePauw players earned All-SCAC first team honors, and the Tigers compiled the second-best per-game rushing average (254.6 yards) in school history. Wide receiver Jamarus Shepard was one of only two Division III players invited to the 2005 Hula Bowl Maui All-Star Classic.

Lynch was head coach at Ball State University from 1995-02. During his tenure, the Cardinals won at least six games three times, including a 7-4 mark in 1995 and an 8-4 record the following season. The 1995 team posted a 6-2 conference record and tied for third in the Mid-American Conference (MAC), while Lynch's 1996 team captured the MAC championship at 7-1 and earned a trip to the Las Vegas Bowl. Ball State also staked claim to the 2001 MAC West title after third-place finishes in 1997 and 2000.

A 1977 Butler University graduate and four-year letterwinner in both football and basketball, Lynch quarterbacked the Bulldogs to a 28-12 overall record and three conference championships. He earned Indiana Collegiate Conference (ICC) Most Valuable Player honors in each of his final three seasons. Lynch led the nation in pass completion percentage in 1975 and captained both sports his senior campaign.

Lynch, a three-time Little All-American, became the first Butler student-athlete to twice be named recipient of the prestigious Tony Hinkle Award, presented by the ICC for both outstanding scholastic

and athletic achievement. He finished his playing career with 5,909 passing yards and 60 touchdowns. Lynch also set a Butler men's basketball record by handing out 121 assists during the 1975-76 campaign and was inducted into the Butler Hall of Fame in 2006.

Upon graduation, Lynch spent seven seasons as a Bulldog assistant coach, including stints as the quarterbacks and wide receivers coach, recruiting coordinator and offensive coordinator. He moved on to Northern Illinois University as quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator in 1984, and he was the quarterbacks coach of the United States Football League's Orlando Renegades in the winter of 1984. NIU and the Renegades were coached by former Hoosier head coach and current analyst on *ESPN's College Gameday* Lee Corso.

Lynch returned to his alma mater as head coach in 1985 and compiled a 36-12-3 (.735) record over five seasons. Butler won four Heartland Collegiate Conference titles, and he won conference Coach of the Year honors three times. Four of Lynch's five squads were ranked among the top 20 in NCAA Division II, and Lynch twice earned AFCA Regional Coach of the Year laurels.

He moved on to Ball State as the Cardinals' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 1990-92, where he worked with eventual NFL running backs Bernie Parmalee (Miami Dolphins and New York Jets) and Corey Croom (New England Patriots) before his first stint in Bloomington.

Bill and his wife, Linda, have four children - Billy (Carla), Kelly (Lucas Manor), Joey (Danielle) and Kevin - and nine grandchildren - Lindsey (4), Max (3) and Ryan (2) Lynch (Billy and Carla - parents); Joe Jr. (3) and Danny (1) Lynch (Joey and Danielle - parents); and Lexie (10), Maggie (8), Jonny (5) and Kate (3) Manor (Kelly and Lucas - parents). Billy is the Hoosiers' wide receivers coach, while Joey, who played quarterback at Ball State (2003-06), returned to his alma mater as wide receivers coach last year. Kevin spent the 2009 season as a quality control coach with the Hoosiers before being hired as the wide receivers coach with the University of Indianapolis in Feb. 2010.
