Michelle Gardner
Head Softball Coach

Gardner is a 1989 graduate of the University of Michigan where she was a standout pitcher from 1984-1988. She has garnered Big Ten Player of the Year and first team all-region accolades. She was also part of softball's first appearance in the 1996 Olympic Games when she took part in the Olympic Trials. Michelle Gardner is in her third season as the head

coach of the Indiana Softball program. She was named the eighth head coach IU softball history on June 9, 2008 after spending the previous six seasons as the head coach at the University of Nevada, where she was named the 2008 Western Athletic Conference Coach of the Year.



Christy Hebert
Assistant Softball Coach

Hebert was an assistant coach for the 2007 season with the New England Riptide of the National Pro Fast-pitch league before moving on to be an instructor for Perfect Game USA in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. Prior to moving on to the Riptide, Hebert coached at the University of Northern Iowa for seven seasons, the last five as the head coach.

Before joining Northern Iowa, Hebert was an assistant coach at Northwestern for the 1999 and 2000 seasons. Upon the completion of her collegiate career at Iowa, Hebert played three summers, from 1998-2000, as a shortstop with the North Carolina Diamonds of the WPSL. During her career at the University of Iowa, she was an All-American shortstop in 1996 and 1997.



Becky Keogh
Assistant Softball Coach

Keogh is in her first season at IU. Keogh was an assistant at Michigan for the past four seasons and was the starting catcher on the Wolverines 2005 National Championship team. Keogh was a Third Team Louisville Slugger/NFCA All American catcher in 2006 as a senior at the University of Michigan after leading Michigan in batting average, home runs, RBI and slugging percentage. Keogh graduated from

the University of Michigan with a degree in Secondary Education in 2007 and recently received her masters degree in Kinesiology with a focus on Sports Management from Michigan.
