FIRST PITCH

Indiana will open the program's 39th season at the Hotel Encanto Invitational, hosted by New Mexico State University in Las Cruces, N.M. The Hoosiers will play Illinois-Chicago to open play on Friday followed by the host NMSU. Then on Saturday, IU squares off with Saint Mary's College and Santa Clara before driving to El Paso, Texas, on Sunday to play UTEP to close the tournament.

The Hoosiers return 11 letterwinners from last season's 37-18 team that advanced to the NCAA Regional in Columbia, Mo., including six starters.

HERE'S WHAT COMING BACK

Returning to the fold in 2012 for the Hoosiers will be a number of experienced upperclassmen and underclassmen that broke into the lineup last season. Leading the way is junior shortstop Breanna Saucedo, who hit .326 last year and stole 15 bases. She is just the second player in IU history to lead the team in hits in her freshman and sophomore seasons.

Another one of the top returners is sophomore outfielder Jenna Abraham, who was a Third Team All-Big Ten performer last year. Junior infielder Amanda Wagner, who was a Second Team All-Big Ten honoree in 2011 returns to help anchor the infield and the heart of the Indiana lineup after hitting six home runs and driving in 20 last year.

The rock behind the plate that will work with the very young pitching staff is fifth year senior Cassie Gogreve. While her offensive numbers might now "wow" many, it is her defense and communication with the pitching staff that has earned her respect. Last season alone, she threw out 15 runners attempting to steal and opponents still attempted to steal a base once per game against her. In her two season with IU, she has caught 38 runners attempting to steal.

In the circle, the Hoosiers have just one pitcher returning - sophomore Meaghan Murphy - and she threw a total of 5.0 innings in 2011. She tossed a five inning shutout against Arkansas-Pine Bluff in her only appearance. She will be used this season along with freshmen Lora Olson and Miranda Tamayo.

TOUGH TO REPLACE

The Hoosiers will have the unenviable task of trying to replace one of the best pitchers in Big Ten history as well as one of the top hitters in program history from a year ago with the losses of Morgan Melloh and Sara Olson to graduation.

Melloh was the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year in 2011 and was named to the All-Midwest Region First Team by the NFCA. She set Big Ten and IU single-season records with 494 strikeouts on the season and finished her career with 1,532 strikeouts, good for ninth on the NCAA career list.

Olson was named First Team All-Big Ten at first base and joined Melloh on First Team All-Midwest Region from the NFCA. She hit eight home runs and drove in 35 runs on the season and finished sixth and fifth, respectively, on the IU career lists for both.

WE WENT STREAKING!

Last season, the Hoosiers got on a roll once they returned to Bloomington following the early season tournament schedule. IU was 17-1 at home and won their final 11 home contests to close out the year.

Overall, the Hoosiers had a 15-game winning streak during the year, 14 of which were in Big Ten play to set a school record for consecutive Big Ten victories. The 15-game win streak was the longest since a 16-game streak during the 1994 season.

MARKED IMPROVEMENT

As head coach Michelle Gardner enters her fourth season leading the Hoosiers, she has seen a marked improvement in a number of statistical categories since she took over prior to the 2009 season. Here's a look at just a couple of the categories where the Hoosiers have improved as a team:

SCHEDULE NOTES

- As is the case for many teams around the country, the Hoosiers will be criss-crossing the country over the first five weeks of the season to play in a variety of tournaments. In those five weeks, the Hoosiers will play in four different time zones

- The Big Ten Conference has changed the conference schedule this season. This season, teams will play a doubleheader on Saturday followed by a single game on Sunday against the same opponent. In some cases, teams play one game on Saturday and then a doubleheader on Sunday. This is a change from the 2011 season that saw teams play one game on Saturday and one game on Sunday against the same team

- The Hoosiers will play in the Phyllis Rafter Memorial tournament in Woodstock, Ga., hosted by Kennesaw State. The last time the Hoosiers played in Woodstock was 2010 - and snow nearly wiped out the entire tournament. The schedule had to be changed so the tournament was played on KSU's home field because the park in Woodstock was not playable. And in order to make the KSU field playable, the Hoosiers chose to remove two inches of snow from the entire outfield Friday afternoon so there was a chance they could play Saturday.

TRUSTEES APPROVE NEW STADIUM; TO BE READY FOR 2013 SEASON

The Indiana University Board of Trustees today (August 19) officially approved construction of a new baseball and softball complex -- to be located just north of the Mellencamp Pavilion and the Indiana Tennis Center along North Woodlawn Avenue and the 45/46 Bypass on the IU Bloomington campus. The approval of the new facility fulfills a promise made to both programs that new stadiums would be constructed.

The new \$19.8 million facility will replace Sembower Field and the IU Softball Field which are both located on Fee Lane across the street from the Paul V. McNutt Quadrangle. Construction is expected to begin in the spring of 2012 with the goal that the stadiums will be completed in time for the 2013 baseball and softball seasons. Private donations and athletic department funds will fund the project.

The North Woodlawn and 45/46 Bypass location was cited as the preferred location for the venues in the university's master plan to consolidate IU Bloomington's major athletic facilities into one neighborhood and support the new North Woodlawn Avenue and Alumni Walk corridor.

Browning Day Mullins Dierdorf Architects of Indianapolis, will design the complex.

"I am extremely excited for the future of the baseball and softball programs with this announcement", said head softball coach Michelle Gardner. "The commitment shown by Director of Athletics Fred Glass, President McRobbie and Indiana University has been amazing. "There's no doubt in my mind that this facility will further enhance our program moving forward."

Michelle Gardner will be entering her fourth season as the head coach of the Indiana softball program in the 2012 season. She was named the eighth head coach IU softball history on June 9, 2008 after spending the previous six seasons as the head coach at the University of Nevada, where she was named the 2008 Western Athletic Conference Coach of the Year.

In her inaugural season in Reno in 2003, Gardner and the Wolf Pack went 22-35 on the year and were still able to place a pair of players on the All-WAC Second Team.

She was hired by Nevada in December of 2001 when the university decided to bring softball back a varsity sport following a 14-year hiatus. The Wolf Pack began competing in the WAC with the start of the 2003 season and Gardner led them to 22 overall wins, the first of six consecutive seasons with 20-plus wins

Before heading up the Nevada program, Gardner was an assistant coach at Arizona State (1999-2001) and Florida State (1995-1998) helping lead both schools to NCAA Regional appearances and a College World Series appearance at Arizona State. She was also an assistant coach at Bowling Green State University as well as a hitting and pitching instructor at the high school level.

Gardner is a 1989 graduate of the University of Michigan with a degree in Physical Education, where she was a standout pitcher from 1984-1988. In her senior season, she was named the Big Ten Player of the Year and garnered first team all-region honors as well. After exhausting her eligibility at Michigan, Gardner participated with several nationally-ranked Amateur Softball Association (ASA) teams in addition to competing in three Olympic festivals. She was also part of softball's first appearance in the 1996 Olympic Games when she took part in the Olympic Trials.

Garner is married to William "Gard" Gardner and they have three children, Lucas (10), Jillilyn (6) and Lydia (5).

Gardner led the Hoosiers resurgence last year behind the arm of strikeout queen Morgan Melloh and the bat of Sara Olson. Melloh was named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year and Olson was named First Team All-Big Ten. Both were named First Team All-Midwest Region and paced the Hoosiers as they advance to the NCAA Regional for the first time since 2006. Melloh set Big Ten and IU records for strikeouts in a single-season (494).

In 2010, Jennifer Glueckert became the first All-Big Ten honoree from Indiana to receive Second Team accolades since 2006 as she led the team with a .389 conference batting average and had a hit in all but three conference games.

While at Nevada, Gardner had an overall record of 187-176 and 60-56 in WAC play and coached 34 Academic All-WAC selections, 13 preseason All-WAC selections, 21 postseason All-WAC honorees, 21 WAC Players of the Week, eight WAC All-Tournament selections, one WAC Tournament MVP and 2008 WAC Player of the Year, Vanessa Briones. The success of her players also began to show itself on the national scene, as three Wolf Pack players on the 2008 roster received NFCA All-West Region honors.

Gardner, a native of Petersburg, Mich., led the Wolf Pack to an appearance in the NCAA Regional in 2008 and was named WAC Coach of the Year and her coaching staff was named NFCA West Region Staff of the Year following a school-best 44-18 overall record. She also posted a 16-2 record in conference play to claim the WAC regular season title, also the first in program history. Yet another first in the 2008 season for Gardner came at the end the year when freshman catcher Noelle Micka was named NFCA Second Team All-American, the first Wolf Pack player to ever receive all-american laurels.

The 2007 season saw four Wolf Pack players receive All-WAC honors en route to 28 wins and an appearance in the WAC Tournament finals. All of this came one year after Gardner led Nevada to the WAC regular season and tournament titles and the first-ever appearance in the NCAA Regionals in 2006.

The Wolf Pack record dipped below .500 in 2005 but they were still able to land a player on the first and second all-conference teams. In 2004, Gardner led Nevada to a then-school record 38 wins and saw Candice Rainwater earn First Team All-WAC honors, the first time in school history a player was named to the first team.
