## Staff Coaches:

**Arnie Ball:** Coach Ball reached a milestone in 2005. He eclipsed the 400 career win mark. Only three other coaches have more wins than Ball. Under Balls leadership, the Mastadon-shave won 6 MIVA Championships, 14 All-Americans, 2 Olympians, and 6 MIVA players of the year. Ball also has a wealth of international experience. In 2003, USA Volleyball called Ball on to lead a young and inexperienced U.S. World University Team and South Korea. In 2000, Ball had the opportunity to scout for the U.S. National Team in the 2000 Olympics in Australia. In 1997, he was an assistant coach for the World University Games team—a role he fulfilled in both 1991, and 1985. In 1994 his North Team won the gold in the Olympic Festival. In 1990, Ball coached the 1990 Olympic Festival Team to a silver. Ball is a graduate of Ball State University.

**Lloy Ball:** His accomplishments read like a “who’s who” in men’s volleyball. He just completed his Olympic career with a fourth place finish at the 2004 Athens games. It was his 3rd Olympic appearance, twice as team captain.

Career Highlights: 2003 Best Setter NORCECA Zone Championships, 2001 Lead Casa Modena to Italian Domestic League title; World Championships 2002, 1999, 1998, and 1997.

Professional Teams: Dyanmo Kazan (Russia); Daytona Volley, Casa Modena in Italy, Torey in Japan, and Iraklis Thessaloniki in Greece.

### How do we register for the IVA Elite Camp?

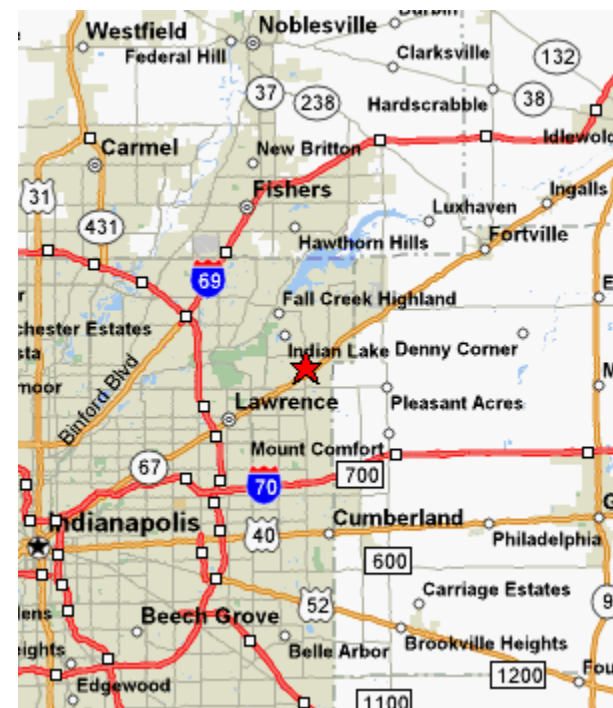
