The Game: Johns Hopkins opens the 2013 season on the road at Randolph-Macon. This will be the 10th meeting between the two teams since 2002 and the 36th overall meeting in series history.

A Look Back: Johns Hopkins posted a 10-2 record, won a fourth straight Centennial Conference title and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Playoffs last season.

Randolph-Macon posted a 7-3 record and tied for second place in the ODAC with a 5-2 league mark last season. The 'Jackets won their final three games of the 2012 season.

Series History: This week's game will be the 36th all-time meeting between Johns Hopkins and Randolph-Macon with JHU holding an 18-16-1 advantage. A complete series history can be found on page 2.

Poll Position: Johns Hopkins earned top 20 preseason rankings in three polls. The Blue Jays were ranked 9th by the *Sporting News*, 10th by *Lindy's College Football* and 17th by *D3football.com*.

The first AFCA Poll of the 2013 season will be released in late September.

For Openers: Johns Hopkins is 13-9-1 in season-opener under head coach **Jim Margraff** and the Blue Jays have currently won 10 of their last 14 openers.

Road Openers: Johns Hopkins is 13-10 under head coach **Jim Margraff** in its first road game of the year.

I'm Honored: Seniors **Armand Jenifer** and **Ben Cranston**, two key pieces of a prolific Blue Jay offense a year ago, were selected as preseason All-Americans. They are two of the four returning starters on an offensive line that paved the way for a unit that averaged 485.2 yards and 36.8 points per game last season.

Jenifer grabbed first team honors from *D3football.com*, *Lindy's College Football*, *Sporting News* and *Phil Steele's College Football Preview*, while Cranston grabbed second team honors from *D3football.com* and *Lindy's College Football*.

Returning All-Centennial Jays: Johns Hopkins dominated the 2012 All-Centennial Conference Football Team as the Blue Jays claimed the coach (**Jim Margraff**), offensive (**Jonathan Rigaud**) and defensive player of the year awards (**Taylor Maciow**) and had 12 players earn All-Centennial honors.

While Margraff and his staff will need to replace Rigaud and Maciow, the Blue Jays do return nine of the premier players in the league.

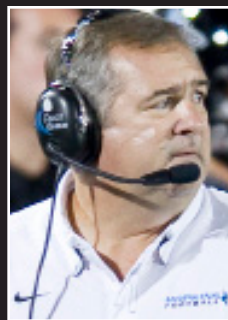

Four in a Row: **Jonathan Rigaud** became the fourth straight Johns Hopkins player to win Centennial Conference Offensive Player of the Year honors when he grabbed the honor last season. Rigaud joins **Hewitt Tomlin** (2011), **Sam Wernick** (2010) and **Andrew Kase** (2009) as JHU's recent CC Offensive Players of the Year. They join **Anthony Triplin** (2005) on the list. **Mark Campbell** (QB) was named the Centennial Player of the Year in 1985 (a single POY was selected in the league from 1983-1992). Starting in 1993 an Offensive and Defensive Player of the Year were selected).

Centennial Favorites: For the fifth consecutive year and the eighth time in the last 10 years Johns Hopkins was selected as the favorite in the league's preseason poll of coaches and SIDs. The Blue Jays received 17 of 20 first-place votes and totaled 161 points to easily out-distance Franklin & Marshall, which checked in at number two in the poll with three first-place votes and 139 points.

Head Coach Jim Margraff



Jim Margraff (JHU '82) is now in his 24th season as the head coach at Homewood and ranks as the all-time winningest coach in school history with an overall record of 157-81-3 (.658).

Margraff has guided the Blue Jays to some of the greatest seasons and moments in program history with the 2011 and 2012 seasons among the

best of the best.

Johns Hopkins posted a combined record of 20-3 in 2011 and 2012, claimed back-to-back Centennial Conference titles, advanced to the second round of the NCAAAs in 2012 and spent the entire 2011 and 2012 seasons ranked in the top 25 in the nation.

The 2009 season was also one of the most successful in school history and among the most successful in Centennial Conference history. The Blue Jays grabbed their fifth Centennial title since 2002 and advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals. JHU finished 8th in the final AFCA Division III Poll, 11th in the final d3football.com Poll and 2nd in the Lambert Cup Poll. For his efforts, Margraff was named the d3football.com South Region Coach of the Year.

Margraff guided the Blue Jays to a then school-record-tying seven wins in 1996, 1997 and 1998 before leading the Blue Jays to their first-ever post-season appearance, first-ever Centennial Conference title and a then school-record nine wins in 2002. JHU made its first appearance in the NCAA Playoffs in 2005, when the Blue Jays also grabbed their first-ever outright CC title. That capped a four-year run that saw JHU win three ECAC titles and four CC titles.

The 157 wins JHU has accumulated under **Jim Margraff** are 15 more than Hopkins accumulated in the 40 previous years combined (1955-89).

JHU Ties Victory Record: Johns Hopkins posted a 10-2 record in 2012 and tied the school record for victories in a season. Only three times previously - 2003, 2009 & 2011 - had Hopkins won 10 games in a season. Johns Hopkins had never won more than seven games in a season prior to 2002, but the Blue Jays have posted eight or more wins nine times in the last 11 years.

Centennial Conference Champions: Johns Hopkins claimed its eighth Centennial Conference title last season with all eight championships coming since 2002. JHU's eight CC titles are just one shy of the record of nine, which is shared by Dickinson and Muhlenberg.

NCAA History: Johns Hopkins made its fourth trip to the NCAA Playoffs last season with all four appearances coming since 2005 under the direction of **Jim Margraff**, the all-time winningest coach in school history. The Blue Jays are 3-4 all-time in the NCAAAs with a run to the NCAA Quarterfinals in 2009 and last year's trip to the second round highlighting JHU's NCAA history.

Post-Season Regulars: Johns Hopkins has advanced to the post-season nine times since 2002 as JHU has played in five ECAC Bowl Games and the four NCAA Tournaments since 2002. Including the 3-4 record in NCAA action, Johns Hopkins sports a 7-5 all-time post-season record as the Blue Jays are 4-1 all-time in ECAC Bowl Games. Including ECAC games, Johns Hopkins has advanced to the post-season in each of the last five years.

Sweet September: Johns Hopkins enters the 2013 season having won 11 straight and 14 of its last 15 games in the month of September. The only team to beat JHU in the month of September in its last 15 games? Randolph-Macon, which posted a 41-37 win over JHU on September 11, 2010.

Series History: Johns Hopkins and Randolph-Macon are meeting for the 36th time in a series that dates back to 1904, when JHU picked up a 6-0 victory. Johns Hopkins holds a two-game advantage in the series (18-16-1) and the Blue Jays have won six of the nine meetings since the series resumed in 2002 after a 34-year break. The road team has won three of the last six meetings in the series.

The series has been marked by dominant stretches for both teams as Johns Hopkins won the first nine meetings before the Yellow Jackets responded by going 14-3-1 against JHU in the next 18. Those 18 games spanned 1936-2002 with the 34-year break immediately preceding a 17-12 RMC win in 2002.

Johns Hopkins erased a 14-0 deficit at Randolph-Macon twice in recent years, including 2008, when the Blue Jays pulled out a 39-31 triple overtime victory. A **Mike Mahon** interception in the back of the end zone in the third extra session sealed the win for JHU. Five of the last six meetings have been decided by nine points or less.

More September: Johns Hopkins has not lost a home game in the month of September since September 22, 2007, when Moravian escaped Homewood with a 44-41 victory. Since then the Blue Jays have won nine straight at home in September.

Margraff Ranks Second on State Victory Chart: Johns Hopkins head coach **Jim Margraff** sports a career record of 157-81-3 (.658) entering this week's game at Randolph-Macon. He is just the second college football coach in Maryland state history to win 150 career games. Only Morgan State's **Eddie Hurt**, who won 174 games from 1929-59, has won more games as the head football coach at a college or university in the state of Maryland than Margraff.

Sustained Success: Since the start of the 2002 season the Blue Jays sport an 91-31 (.746) record. Taking it back farther the Blue Jays are 97-34 (.740) since the start of the 2001 season and 102-39 (.723) since the beginning of the 2000 season.

The 74 wins the Blue Jays amassed from 2000-09 are the most wins in a decade in school history. Johns Hopkins had never won more than seven games in a season prior to this decade. In the decade completed in 2009, the Blue Jays *averaged* more than seven wins per season (7.4).

Seven's Heaven: Since the beginning of the 2003 season the Blue Jays are 82-21 (.796) when scoring more than seven points and 0-7 when they have been held to seven points or less.

An Offensive Group: Johns Hopkins returns eight starters to an offense that averaged 485.2 yards and 36.8 points per game last season. The Blue Jays ranked 12th nationally in scoring offense, 18th in rushing offense (252.8) and 26th in scoring.

The Blue Jays ran a school-record 954 plays and set school marks for total yards (5,823), rushing yards (3,3034), rushing touchdowns (47), first downs (317) and total points scored (441).

Defense Among Nation's Best: With seven starters back on defense, the Blue Jays will look to pick up right where they left off a year ago. Hopkins ranked among the top 40 in the nation in sacks per game (3.25/14th), rushing defense (102.1/28th), scoring defense (17.8/36th) and total defense (306.6/40th).

It's All Academic - Part I: When the 2012 CoSIDA/Capital One Academic All-District II Team was announced it was dominated by Johns Hopkins. JHU produced six selections - three more than any other team in the district produced (Thomas More & Montclair St. - 3).

The Blue Jays' six selections give the team 29 Academic All-District players in the last four years, 58 in the last 10 years and 84 since 1991. Five of the six players named are back this season

It's All Academic - Part II: Of the six players who earned Academic All-District honors in 2012, two went on to be selected to the CoSIDA/Capital One Academic All-America Team. The two selections were **John Arena** (1st Team) and **Vincenzo Bonaddio** (2nd Team).

The two selections boost JHU's all-time total of football Academic All-Americans to 17. Of that total, 15 have come since head coach **Jim Margraff** took over in 1990.

Player Notes of Interest:

JD Abbott (Sr • RB) - Rushed for a career-high 539 yards and eight TDs a year ago and enters the 2013 season needing just 273 yards to reach 1,000 for his career.

Hani Annabi (Jr. • LB) - Quietly finished fourth on the team in tackles (55) last season • JHU's second-leading active career tackler (87).

John Arena (Sr. • LB) - 1st Team CoSIDA Academic All-American last season • Enters 2013 season as JHU's active career leader with 115 tackles and has 13.5 TFLs, five sacks and four INTs as well • Finished third on the team in tackles (64) a year ago • Recently nominated for a National Football Foundation Scholarship • Only returning defensive player that has played in all 34 games in last three years.

Vincenzo Bonaddio (Sr. • OL/T) - 2nd Team CoSIDA Academic All-American and 2nd Team All-Centennial Conference selection last season.

Richie Carbone (Sr. • PK/P) - Averaged 36.6 yards punting and connected on 50-of-55 extra points and 2-of-3 field goals last season • Ranks fourth in school history in career points by a kicker (117).

Brandon Cherry (So. • RB) - Finished fourth on the team in rushing (252) and fifth in all-purpose yards (531) as a freshman last season • Averaged 17.2 yards on six receptions as well.

Matthew Connery (Jr. • DL) - Totaled 38 tackles, including a team-high 11.5 TFLs and 5.0 sacks, last season • Ranked third on the team in sacks in 2012.

Keith Corliss (So. • LB) - Played in all 12 games and posted 36 tackles • Started JHU's two NCAA Playoff games for an injured **Taylor Maciow** and responded with a career-high eight tackles against Washington & Jefferson in the first round.

Ben Cranston (Sr. • OL/C) - Latest in a long line of outstanding centers for JHU • Earned First Team All-Centennial honors last season as the anchor of the Blue Jays' offensive line.

Bob D'Orazio (Sr. • WR) - Burst on the scene last season with 52 receptions for 634 yards and four TDs • Entered 2012 with seven career receptions to his credit in two seasons.

Joe DiTrollo (Sr. • DL) - Anchor of interior of Johns Hopkins' defensive line • 2nd Team All-Centennial with 39 tackles, five TFLs and three sacks last season.

Brendan Hartman (Sr. • TE) - Enjoyed a breakout season in 2012 with 16 receptions for 244 yards (15.2) • 15.2 yards per reception was highest on the team among players with more than six receptions on the year.

Armand Jenifer (Sr. • OL/T) - One of the top returning offensive linemen in the nation after earning First Team AFCA and Fourth Team D3football.com All-America honors and First Team All-Centennial a year ago.

Andy Laychur (Sr. • DL) - Totaled 29 tackles, 8.0 tackles for losses and 7.5 sacks last season • Led the team in sacks and tied for second in TFLs despite not starting a game.

Michael Longo (Jr. • DL) - Grabbed Honorable Mention All-Centennial honors last season • Led all JHU defensive linemen with 55 tackles.

Robbie Matey (Sr. • QB) - Boasts a 12-2 career record as JHU's starting quarterback • Threw for 2,453 yards and 12 TDs while rushing for 276 yards and six more scores last season • 2,453 yards is the fifth-highest single-season total in school history.

Kevin Quinn (Sr. • OL/G) - Quietly earned Second Team All-Centennial honors last season after starting all 12 games at guard.

TJ Reeves (So. • DB) - Led all JHU freshmen in tackles last season (37) and led the team with three interceptions as well.

Ryan Rice (Jr. • DB) - Two-year starter at cornerback and senior member of the secondary • 2nd Team All-Centennial and First Team CoSIDA Academic All-District last season.

Michael Rocca (Jr. • DL) - Played in 11 games last season with 10 starts • Totaled 23 tackles, 2.5 TFLs and 2.0 sacks.

Joe Trumbetti (So. • LB) - Played in all 12 games with 11 starts at safety • Making the move to OLB after posting 25 tackles and two interceptions as a freshman.

Dan Wodicka (Sr. • WR) - Enters season with 216 career receptions, the most of among all returning NCAA Division III receivers • Has career totals of 216-2,642-11 • Ranks fourth in school history in both receptions and receiving yards.

Mike Zikoski (Sr. • DL) - Played in all 12 games last season and totaled a career-high 25 tackles and four TFLs • 25 tackles was just one less than he had in first two years combined.

Scouting the Yellow Jackets

Randolph-Macon Quickly: Randolph-Macon welcomes Johns Hopkins to Day Field for the 2013 season opener for both teams. The Yellow Jackets were 4-1 at home last season en route to posting a 7-3 overall record. RMC tied for second place in the ODAC with a 5-2 league mark.



Yellow Jackets Picked Second in ODAC Poll: Randolph-Macon placed second in the 2013 Pre-season ODAC Poll of head coaches. The Yellow Jackets earned three first-place votes and totaled 40 points to earn the number two spot in the poll. Four different teams earned at least one first-place vote with Hampden-Sydney earning 43 points to grab the top spot. Bridgewater (39 points) and Washington & Lee (38) were just behind the 'Jackets.

On a Roll: Randolph-Macon will enter the 2013 season with a three-game winning streak to its credit. The Yellow Jackets topped Shenandoah, Bridgewater and Hampden-Sydney in their final three games of the 2012 season.

Six Starters Back on Offense: Head coach **Pedro Arruza** welcomes back six starters from an offense that scored 35 points or more five times last season. Included among the six is perhaps the top quarterback-running back-wide receiver trio in the ODAC.

Junior **Zac Naccarato** returns after throwing for 1,835 yards and 16 touchdowns against just four INTs last season, while **Christian Cook** is back after grabbing 37 of Naccarato's passes for 355 yards.

Will McGhee returns after enjoying one of the finest seasons in school history by a running back as he rushed for 1,276 yards and five touchdowns and added 17 receptions for 165 yards as well.

Defense Returns Seven Starters: Four starters are back on the defensive line for the Yellow Jackets, including **Cross Trued** and **Calvin Davis**, who combined for 68 tackles, 14.5 tackles for losses and 11 sacks last season. Trued and Davis are two of seven overall returning starters on defense for RMC.

Arruza Needs One for Fifty: Head coach **Pedro Arruza** enters the 2013 season needing just one win for 50 in his career at Randolph-Macon. He currently boasts a nine-year record of 49-42.
