Johns Hopkins (0-0) vs. St. Lawrence (0-0)

Saturday, September 6, 2008 • Noon
Homewood Field • Baltimore, MD

The Game: Johns Hopkins opens the 2008 season by hosting St. Lawrence. The Blue Jays and Saints are meeting for just the second time.

A Look Back: Johns Hopkins won two of its final three games last season to finish with a 4-6 record, including a 3-5 mark in the Centennial Conference. Five of the Blue Jays' six losses were by nine points or less, including a tough seven-point loss at league champion Muhlenberg. St. Lawrence also finished strong with wins in its final two games to complete the 2007 season with a 4-5 record.

The Coaches: Johns Hopkins is coached by **Jim Margraff** '82, who opens his 19th season as the head coach at Homewood with the game against St. Lawrence. Margraff is JHU's all-time leader in games won (111) and coached (183) and he enters the game with a career record of 111-69-3 (.615).

Chris Phelps is entering his eighth season as the head coach at St. Lawrence. A standout quarterback during his playing days for the Saints, Phelps has turned around the St. Lawrence football program since taking over. From 1999-2002 the Saints won exactly one game.

Since then they've won 17 games and are a combined 9-9 in the last two years. That 9-9 could easily be 12-6 as three of the losses have come by seven points or less during that time.

Captain, My Captain: In vote of his teammates, junior running back **Andrew Kase** was selected to serve as the team captain for the Blue Jays this season. According to records in the Johns Hopkins Sports Information Office, he is the first player to serve as a solo captain for the Blue Jay football team since 1983 (**Francis Mullan**).

On This Date: Johns Hopkins has played just one game all-time on September 6; a 27-9 win over Rochester in 2003. Close followers of the program remember that the victory over the Yellowjackets, which was fueled by three touchdown receptions by **Brian Wolcott**, jump-started the greatest season in Johns Hopkins football history as the Blue Jays went on to post a 10-1 record that season.

Head Coach Jim Margraff



Jim Margraff (JHU '82) is now in his 19th season as the head coach at Homewood. Margraff is the all-time winningest coach in school history as he sports an overall record of 111-69-3 (.615). He picked up career win number 100 with a 14-0 victory over Gettysburg (10-14-05). Prior to Margraff the previous record for wins by a Johns Hopkins football coach was 60 by Ray Van Orman (1920-35).

The 2005 season saw Margraff lead the Blue Jays to several firsts, including the program's first-ever outright Centennial Conference

Championship and first-ever NCAA Playoff appearance. JHU finished with an 8-3 record, marking the fourth straight season JHU won eight or more games. Prior to this four-year run JHU had never won more than seven games in a season.

Margraff guided the Blue Jays to a then school-record-tying seven wins in 1996, 1997 and 1998 before leading the Blue Jays to their first-ever post-season appearance (and victory), first-ever Centennial Conference title and a school-record nine wins in 2002. He topped that in 2003 as JHU posted a 10-1 record with Centennial and ECAC South Atlantic Championships before leading JHU to a 9-2 record and Centennial and ECAC Southeast titles in 2004. Margraff's .615 winning percentage is second among JHU coaches who have coached 30 or more games and the Blue Jays are 87-45-1 (.658) since 1995.

Margraff's Resurrection: Since taking over as the head coach prior to the 1990 season, **Jim Margraff** has guided JHU to 12 winning seasons and 111 wins. The 111 wins are three more than Hopkins accumulated in the 30 previous years combined (1961-89). During that time, Hopkins posted 11 winning seasons and won 108 games.

For Openers: Johns Hopkins has won six of its last seven and nine of its last 11 season-openers and the Blue Jays are 10-7-1 in season-openers under head coach **Jim Margraff**. The Blue Jays are 53-62-8 (.463) on opening day since the inception of the program in 1882.

September Reign: Johns Hopkins is 21-9 in the month of September since the start of the 2000 season and 32-14 since the start of the 1995 season.

Streiking: Since the start of the 2002 season the Blue Jays sport a 45-19 (.703) record. Taking it back farther the Blue Jays are 51-22 (.699) since the start of the 2001 season and 56-27 (.675) since the beginning of the 2000 season. The 56 wins the Blue Jays have amassed this decade are already the most wins in a decade in school history. The previous record of 55 wins came in the 1990s.

In the Zone: Johns Hopkins was by far the most effective offensive team in the Centennial Conference in the red zone during the 2007 season. The Blue Jays finished the year 25-of-27 (92.6%) on the year with 17 touchdowns and eight field goals to their credit. In Centennial games the Blue Jays were a stunning 22-of-23 (.957) on trips inside the zone with 14 touchdowns and eight field goals. No other team in the Centennial converted on even 80% of its overall red zone chances.

Playing the Best: Johns Hopkins played the most difficult schedule in the Centennial Conference last season as the Blue Jays' 10 opponents posted a combined record of 61-44 (.581). Hopkins' two non-conference opponents a year ago (Hampden-Sydney and Randolph-Macon) combined to post a 16-5 record.

JHU Picked Fourth in CC Preseason Poll

The Johns Hopkins football team, which has grabbed at least a share of four Centennial Conference Championships in the last six years and sports a 45-19 overall record since the start of the 2002 season, was picked fourth in the 2008 Centennial Conference Preseason Poll.

The Blue Jays picked up two first-place votes and totaled 86 points in the poll of league coaches and sports information directors. Muhlenberg compiled 126 points on the strength of 14 first-place votes and grabbed the top spot in the poll.

Series History: This will be just the second all-time meeting between Johns Hopkins and St. Lawrence. The Blue Jays and Saints signed a two-game contract earlier in the decade with the first game taking place in Canton, New York in 2006.

The meeting two years ago came down to the final drive of the game as **Brett Young** caught a six-yard touchdown pass from **Matt Bezio** with 28 seconds remaining to cap a stunning 15-play, 88-yard drive that lifted the Saints to a 21-20 victory.

The Saints actually led 14-0 late in the third quarter before the Blue Jays scored 20 unanswered points in a span of just over 12 minutes to take a 20-14 lead with 3:41 remaining.

Phil Roberts led the way for the Blue Jays in the loss as he rushed for 162 yards and two touchdowns, while **Anthony Triplin** added 10 receptions for 78 yards.

Bezio enjoyed one of the finest games of his career as he was 16-of-26 for 267 yards and three touchdowns, including the game-winner to Young late in the fourth quarter.

Seven's Heaven: Since the beginning of the 2003 season the Blue Jays are 36-12 when scoring more than seven points and 0-5 when they have been held to seven points or less.

It's All Academic: Johns Hopkins has earned 26 CoSIDA Academic All-District selections since 2003. JHU's 26 selections in that time are more than the other CC football-playing schools combined (22). Taking it back even farther, Johns Hopkins has earned 52 CoSIDA Academic All-District selections since 1991. During that time the other CC football-playing schools have combined for exactly 52 selections as well.

Johns Hopkins has had at least three players earn CoSIDA Academic All-District honors every year since 2001.

Youth Shall be Served: A total of 47 players are listed on this week's depth chart for Johns Hopkins and it doesn't take long to notice that the Blue Jays may field one of the youngest teams in the Centennial Conference this season.

Of the top 23 players on offense, only five are seniors, while just five of the top 22 on defense are in their final year. In addition, both returning kickers are sophomores so just 10 of the 47 players on the two-deep are seniors.

Lachman Earns Preseason Honors: Johns Hopkins sophomore place kicker **Alex Lachman** was named a Second Team Preseason All-American by *Lindy's* after establishing himself as one of the top young kickers in the nation a year ago.

In addition to earning First Team All-Centennial last season, Lachman garnered Third Team All-America honors from d3football.com.

Lachman hit 34-of-35 kicks last season as he was good on all 23 of his extra-point attempts and nailed 11-of-12 field goal attempts. His 91.7% accuracy rate on field goals tied for the national lead among players with 10 or more attempts.

Making a Kase: Junior running back **Andrew Kase** enters the 2008 season as one of the top returning running backs in the nation after averaging 112.1 yards per game last season.

Kase, who missed one full game and part of another, didn't take over as the Blue Jays' featured back until the fourth game of the season (Moravian) and proceeded to top the 100-yard rushing mark in six of his seven starts. He will carry a streak of three straight 100-yard games into this week's season-opener against St. Lawrence and can tie the school record for consecutive 100-yard games if he tops the century mark against the Saints.

Player Notes of Interest

A.J. Albert (So/LB) - Played in all 10 games with starts in the last six at linebacker • Finished fifth on the team, (and first among all freshmen) in tackles (53) and added 3.0 tackles for losses and 2.0 sacks • ECAC Southwest and Centennial Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts in the win at Dickinson when he registered a career-high 11 tackles, two fumble recoveries and one forced fumble.

Records Watch: As the 2008 season begins, the following are some records and numbers to track:

- **Andrew Kase** needs 61 yards to pass **Kevin Johnson** (1999-2002) for 15th place on JHU's career rushing list. He currently has 1,319 yards in two seasons.
- With two more 100-yard rushing games, **Andrew Kase** will become just the fourth player in school history to record 10 or more career 100-yard rushing performances.
- **Michael Murray** needs 48 yards passing to reach 2,000 for his career.
- **Alex Lachman's** next field goal will be the 12th of his career and tie him with **Chris Smolyn** (2000-03) for 5th place on JHU's career list.
- Junior LB **Colin Wixted** needs just four tackles to reach 125 for his career.
- **Jim Margraff** needs three Centennial Conference victories to become just the third coach in league history to win 75 conference games.

Chris Baldwin (Sr./DB) - Returns to secondary after playing running back last season • First year as a running back at JHU after two years at safety • Totaled 39 tackles and three pass breakups as a safety during the 2006 season.

Aaron Chance (Jr./OL) - Has started all 20 games at right tackle in the last two years.

Greg Chimera (Sr./FB) - Totaled 13 carries for 39 yards and five receptions for 51 yards and two touchdowns last season.

Devin Collins (So./DL) - Emerged as a solid young defensive lineman for the Blue Jays as he played in nine games with two starts at nose guard last season • Totaled 20 tackles, including one sack, on the year • Registered a career-high seven tackles against Randolph-Macon.

Austin Ehrhart (Sr./SS) - Played in seven games with three starts a year ago • Finished the season with five tackles and one interception to his credit • Posted a career-high three tackles and half a sack against Hampden-Sydney and added one tackle and his first career interception against Randolph-Macon • Missed three games and part of another with an injury.

Scott Goldsmith (Sr./OL) - Started nine games at left guard during the 2007 season • Played defensive line in goal-line situations.

Brian Hopkins (So./TE) - Played in all 10 games and had five receptions for 14 yards, but three of the receptions went for touchdowns • Three TDs were tied for second on the team • Touchdown receptions came against Moravian, Muhlenberg and Juniata.

Max Islinger (So./QB-P) - Played in all 10 games with one start • Majority of action came as JHU's punter, but did see action in four games at quarterback and earned first start at QB in the season-finale at McDaniel • Was 25-of-54 for 316 yards with three touchdowns and two interceptions on the year • Averaged 31.4 yards on 61 punts and dropped 14 of the 61 inside the opposition's 20-yard line.

Andrew Kase (Jr./RB) - Second Team All-Centennial and a Second Team *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District selection in 2007 • Enjoyed one of the finest seasons in school history as he rushed 194 times for 1,009 yards and five touchdowns and added 23 receptions for 212 yards and four more TDs • 1,009 rushing yards is the second-highest single-season total in school history, while his 1,221 all-purpose yards ranks seventh • Tied school record with six 100-yard rushing games (record had stood alone since 1959) and his 112.1 yards per game is the fourth-best average in JHU history • Averaged 134.1 yards over the final seven games of the season • Totaled just 70 yards on 19 carries in the first two games before missing the third game of the year with an injury • Jump-started a run of three straight 100-yard games with a 163-yard, one-touchdown effort against Moravian, when he also added four receptions for 67 yards for a personal-best 230 all-purpose yards • Rushed 24 times for 140 yards and one touchdown and added three receptions for 32 yards against Muhlenberg a week later • 140 yards were just 11 less than Muhlenberg had allowed in its first three games combined • Fueled a stunning 20-17 win at Dickinson with 103 rushing yards and

32 yards receiving and a touchdown reception • A 156-yard, two-touchdown effort at Juniata ignited a season-ending three-game run that ranks among the best in school history • Added 111 yards on 28 carries against Franklin & Marshall and capped the season with a 227-yard effort against McDaniel that ranks as the fourth-best performance in school history.

Alex Lachman (So./PK) - Third Team d3football.com All-America and a Second Team d3football.com All-South Region selection • First Team All-Centennial Conference • First freshman football player in school history to earn All-America honors • Converted on 34-of-35 kicks as a freshman as he hit all 23 of his extra points and 11-of-12 field goals on the year • Tied for the national lead in field goal percentage among players with 10 or more attempts (.917) • 91.7% success rate was also a Johns Hopkins and Centennial Conference record • 11 field goals rank as the fifth-highest single-season total in school history and the most ever by a freshman • Tied a school record with four field goals (43, 28, 30, 37) and hit all three of his extra points to set a school record for points by a kicker in a game (15) against Moravian • CC Special Teams Player of the Week three times.

James Medaglio (Jr./DL) - Named to the Centennial Conference Academic Honor Roll • Played in nine games with one start at nose guard • Posted 17 tackles on the year, including 3.0 for losses and one sack.

Tucker Michels (So./WR) - One of just three offensive players - and the only freshman - to start all 10 games in 2007 • Finished second on the team in receiving with 27 receptions for 279 yards and three touchdowns.

Michael Murray (Jr./QB) - Started the first nine games of the 2007 season • Was 127-of-224 for 1,239 yards with 11 TDs and 12 INTs in nine games • 127 completions on the year rank 10th in school history • Ranks 10th in school history in career completions (186), 12th in passing yards (1,952) and seventh in career 200-yard passing games (5).

Brian Pascal (So./DL) - Played in all 10 games with five starts at defensive end • Posted 11 tackles on the year.

Bryan Power (Sr./WR) - Played in all 10 games and totaled 12 receptions for 99 yards • Finished fifth on the team in receptions and receiving yards.

Ryan Rasner (Jr./DL) - Played in all 10 games at defensive end • Posted 18 tackles, including 1.5 for losses, two fumble recoveries and one pass breakup on the year • Posted a career-high five tackles against Gettysburg.

Glen Rocca (Jr./DL) - Emerged as a solid young player on the defensive line • Played in five games and was in on 11 tackles on the year.

David Rokeach (Jr./WR) - Named to the Centennial Conference Academic Honor Roll last season • Played in nine games with two starts • Had five receptions for 48 yards on the year.

Scouting the Saints

St. Lawrence Quickly: The Saints make their first trip to Baltimore to play the Blue Jays. St. Lawrence posted a 4-5 record a year ago and finished strong with victories in each of its last two games. Johns Hopkins and St. Lawrence did not have any common opponents last season.

Quick Out of the Gate: Season-openers have been kind to St. Lawrence of late as the Saints have won five straight season-openers. During that stretch, the Saints have outscored their five opponents 123-48 and have not allowed more than 13 points in a season-opening game since 2002.

Hackett, Festa Fuel Offense: With a new quarterback under center, the fortunes of the St. Lawrence offense may rest in the capable hands of junior running back **Connor Hackett** and senior fullback **Carl Festa**, who will have the luxury of running behind an offensive line that returns all five starters.

Hackett rushed for a team-high 789 yards and seven touchdowns a year ago, while Festa added 125 yards on the ground and 28 receptions for 255 yards and four scores last season.

Bryant Leads Resurgent Defense: Just like Johns Hopkins, the St. Lawrence defense took a little while to get going a year ago, but when they did they were solid.

After allowing an average of just over 41 points per game during a five-game stretch midway through the season, the unit buckled down and surrendered just over 16 points per game over the final three games.

Junior defensive tackle **Gerard Bryant** is the leader of the defense as he totaled 13 tackles for losses and five sacks among his 66 stops a year ago.
