## Catholic (8-2) at Johns Hopkins (8-2)

Saturday, November 22, 2008 • Noon  
 Homewood Field • Baltimore, MD

### • ECAC Southeast Championship Game •

**The Game:** Johns Hopkins (8-2) hosts Catholic (8-2) in the 2008 ECAC Southeast Bowl Game. This is the first meeting between the two schools since 1990.

**A Look Back:** Johns Hopkins ran its winning streak to five games with a 27-10 victory against McDaniel last Saturday. Catholic had its hopes for an NCAA Playoff bid dashed as the Cardinals dropped a 37-26 decision to Bridgewater last week.

**The Coaches:** Johns Hopkins is coached by **Jim Margraff** '82, who is in his 19th season as the head coach at Homewood. Margraff is JHU's all-time leader in games won (119) and coached (193) and he enters this week's game with a career record of 119-71-3 (.624).

**David Dunn** is in his third season as the head coach at Catholic. He sports a 16-14 record as the head coach of the Cardinals and has improved CU's record from 3-7 to 5-5 to 8-2 in his three-year tenure.

**Margraff Now Second in CC Victories:** Johns Hopkins head coach **Jim Margraff** notched his 78th career Centennial Conference victory with last week's win against McDaniel (78-49-2). The victory moved him into sole possession of second place on the league's career coaching victories list as he eased past former F&M coach **Tom Gilburg**. Only **Barry Streeter**, who has won 85 league games at Gettysburg, ranks ahead of Margraff on the CC's all-time victory list.

**Double Your Pleasure:** A win this week against Catholic would improve Jim Margraff's career victory total to 120 - or exactly double the number of wins the next winningest coach in school history has (Ray Van Orman - 60 (1920-35)).

**Captain, My Captain:** In a vote of his teammates, junior running back **Andrew Kase** was selected to serve as the team captain for the Blue Jays this season. According to records in the Johns Hopkins Sports Information Office, he is the first player to serve as a solo captain for the Blue Jay football team since 1983 (**Francis Mullan**).

**ECAC Bowl History:** Johns Hopkins is making its fourth appearance in an ECAC Championship game and all four have come since 2002. Below is a look at JHU's previous ECAC Bowl Game appearances:

## Head Coach Jim Margraff



**Jim Margraff** (JHU '82) is now in his 19th season as the head coach at Homewood and ranks as the all-time winningest coach in school history with an overall record of 119-71-3 (.624). He picked up career win number 100 with a 14-0 victory over Gettysburg (10-14-05). Prior to Margraff the previous record for wins by a Johns Hopkins football coach was 60 by Ray Van Orman (1920-35).

The 2005 season saw Margraff lead the Blue Jays to several firsts, including the program's first-ever outright Centennial Conference Championship and first-ever NCAA Playoff appearance. JHU finished with an 8-3 record, marking the fourth straight season JHU won eight or more games. Prior to this four-year run JHU had never won more than seven games in a season.

Margraff guided the Blue Jays to a then school-record-tying seven wins in 1996, 1997 and 1998 before leading the Blue Jays to their first-ever post-season appearance (and victory), first-ever Centennial Conference title and a school-record nine wins in 2002. He topped that in 2003 as JHU posted a 10-1 record with Centennial and ECAC South Atlantic Championships before leading JHU to a 9-2 record and Centennial and ECAC Southeast titles in 2004. Margraff's .624 winning percentage is second among JHU coaches who have coached 30 or more games and the Blue Jays are 95-47-1 (.668) since 1995.

**Margraff's Resurrection:** Since taking over as the head coach prior to the 1990 season, **Jim Margraff** has guided JHU to 13 winning seasons (including 2008) and 119 wins. The 119 wins are 11 more than Hopkins accumulated in the 30 previous years combined (1960-89). During that time, Hopkins posted 11 winning seasons and won 108 games.

### Margraff's Championships at Johns Hopkins

**Post-Season History:** Johns Hopkins had never played a post-season game prior to 2002, but made the three straight ECAC appearances and topped off the greatest four-year run in school history with a trip to the 2005 NCAA Playoffs. The Blue Jays dropped a first round game at Thiel in the NCAAs that year to bring their all-time post-season record to 3-1.

**More Post-Season:** While the 2002 ECAC Southwest Championship game appearance was the first post-season game in school history, it was not the first invitation Johns Hopkins ever received. The 1948 team posted a 7-1 record and was invited to play in the Tangerine Bowl on New Year's Day.

However, the invitation was declined as Hopkins did not believe in the commercialism of athletics. The trip to the bowl game could only be financed by accepting the guarantee that accompanied the invitation and the University administration declined. As it turned out, 54 years would pass before the Blue Jays received another post-season invitation.

**A Star-Studded Group:** Johns Hopkins placed eight players on the 2008 All-Centennial Football Team, which was announced on Monday. The Blue Jays had three first team selections, four second team selections and one honorable mention pick. Seven of the eight players who earned All-CC honors are due to return next season, including **A.J. Albert**, who was the only sophomore in the league to grab first team honors. **On This Date:** This week's game against Catholic will be the 10th the Blue Jays have played on November 22. Johns Hopkins currently boasts a 4-3-2 all-time record in games played on November 22 and has won its last two games played on this date. Included among the games are Johns Hopkins' 41-13 win over King's in the 2003 ECAC South Atlantic Atlantic Championship Game.

**Road Warriors:** With the 26-25 win at Franklin & Marshall on November 8 the Blue Jays improved to 4-1 this season and 8-2 since the start of the 2007 season on the road. JHU is 30-11 on the road since the start of the 2001 season and 18-7 in away league games since the start of the '01 season.

**Noting the Recent Shutouts:** The 14-0 shutout victory at Ursinus was JHU's first shutout since October 14, 2005, when the Blue Jays knocked off Gettysburg, 14-0. It was also JHU's first shutout on the road since a 30-0 victory at Dickinson on October 4, 2003 • The Blue Jays' 12-0 shutout against Juniata in their next game marked the first time since 2003 that Hopkins has posted back-to-back shutouts as the blanking of the Eagles followed the shutout of Ursinus. JHU actually posted three straight shutouts in 2003.

**A Program First:** The 14-0 win at Ursinus and the 12-0 win against Juniata mark the first time in school history that Johns Hopkins has posted back-to-back shutouts against Centennial Conference opponents (league formed in 1983).

**Margraff's Shutouts:** The 12-0 win against Juniata was the Blue Jays' 17th shutout since head coach **Jim Margraff** took over in 1990.

**That's a Blue Jay First Down:** In rolling up 497 yards of total offense against Gettysburg the Blue Jays also set a school record for first downs in a game. JHU's 31 first downs against the Bullets topped the previous record of 30 set against then third-ranked Bridgewater in 2001.

**Offense Rolls Past 400 - Again:** Johns Hopkins rolled up 481 yards in the win against Juniata. This marked the fourth time this season the Blue Jays have topped the 400-yard mark as they previously turned the trick against Gettysburg (497), Muhlenberg (511) and Dickinson (477).

The Blue Jays are averaging 413.3 yards per game in their last nine games and currently rank fourth in the Centennial Conference in total offense (383.3), fifth in rushing offense (182.4) and third in passing offense (200.9).

**Series History:** Johns Hopkins and Catholic are meeting for the eighth time in a series that dates to a 47-0 Johns Hopkins victory during the 1947 season. The series is tied at 3-3-1 with the Blue Jays winning the first three and Catholic winning the last three.

Johns Hopkins handily won the first three games in the series by an average of 40 points, before the Cardinals rallied for a 13-13 tie in 1950. A 38-year hiatus in the series followed the tie before the schools inked a three-year deal to resume the series in 1988.

Catholic took 24-6 and 21-7 decisions in 1988 and 1989, respectively, before claiming a 22-20 victory in 1990. The 1990 game was the first for **Jim Margraff** as the head coach at Johns Hopkins.

**Scoring Surge:** Johns Hopkins ranks fourth in the Centennial Conference in scoring offense (27.0) with 270 points scored. Johns Hopkins has averaged 30 or more points per game just twice in school history (1967 • 36.4 / 1968 • 34.0). The school record for total points scored in a season is 315 (2003).

**November Reign:** Johns Hopkins has played some of its best football of the **Jim Margraff** era in the month of November. Dating back to 2001 the Blue Jays are 19-3 in games played in the month of November. Johns Hopkins did not lose a game in the month of November from 2001 through 2004 and last season's 19-11 loss to Franklin & Marshall was the Blue Jays' first home loss in the month of November since the final game of the 2000 season. Johns Hopkins is 31-15-1 under Margraff's guidance in games played in November.

**Streaking:** Since the start of the 2002 season the Blue Jays sport a 53-21 (.716) record. Taking it back farther the Blue Jays are 59-24 (.711) since the start of the 2001 season and 64-29 (.688) since the beginning of the 2000 season. The 64 wins the Blue Jays have amassed this decade are already the most wins in a decade in school history. The previous record of 55 wins came in the 1990s.

**Must be the Speech:** Johns Hopkins has played some of its best football in the third quarter of its games this season as the Blue Jays have outscored the opposition 69-24 in the third period. Prior to Muhlenberg and Dickinson both scoring touchdowns in the third period, the Blue Jays had gone eight games without allowing a touchdown in the third quarter. In the last 13 games dating back to last season, the Blue Jays have outscored the opposition 100-24 in the third quarter.

**Working Overtime:** The 39-31 triple overtime win at Randolph-Macon was JHU's first overtime game since a 21-14 win at Washington & Lee in the 2002 season-opener (one overtime period). The Blue Jays are now 2-2 all-time in overtime and all four extra-session games the Blue Jays have played in their history have been on the road.

**In the Zone:** Johns Hopkins has converted on 28-of-36 (.778) chances in the red zone this season. The Blue Jays currently rank second in the Centennial Conference in red zone offense.

The success in the red zone for the Blue Jays extends back to last season, when Hopkins finished the year 25-of-27 (92.6%) on the year with 17 touchdowns and eight field goals to its credit. Since the start of the 2007 season Johns Hopkins has 40 touchdowns and 13 field goals on 63 trips to the 'zone.

**Seven's Heaven:** Since the beginning of the 2003 season the Blue Jays are 44-14 when scoring more than seven points and 0-5 when they have been held to seven points or less.

**Statistical Youth:** Through 10 games the Blue Jays have rushed the ball 396 times (does not include kneel-downs) and have 166 receptions. Of the 562 offensive touches, exactly two (a three-yard reception in the season-opener and a 27-yard completion on a fake punt last week vs. McDaniel) have been by seniors. In other words, 99.2% of JHUs total offense (3,803 of 3,833 yards) has been accumulated by players who will return next season.

**Youth Shall be Served:** Johns Hopkins may field one of the youngest starting lineups in the nation as nine of last week's 22 starters were freshmen or sophomores and eight more were juniors. **Below is a breakdown of JHU's starters by game broken down by class:**

**Note of the Day:** Johns Hopkins totaled 228 yards rushing and 253 yards passing in the win over Juniata. This marked the second time this season the Blue Jays have totaled more than 200 yards rushing and passing in the same game (Gettysburg). This was also the 10th time the Blue Jays have turned the trick under head coach **Jim Margraff** (the Blue Jays have won eight of the 10 games).

**It's All Academic:** Johns Hopkins had three players named to the 2008 *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District Team last week. Junior defensive lineman **Steve Levinson** was named to the first team, while classmates **Mike Stoffel** and **Anthony Catanzano** garnered second team honors. Johns Hopkins has earned 29 CoSIDA Academic All-District selections since 2003. JHU's 29 selections in that time are the same number the other CC football-playing schools have combined for (29). Taking it back even farther, Johns Hopkins has earned 55 CoSIDA Academic All-District selections since 1991. During that time the other CC football-playing schools have combined for 59 selections. Johns Hopkins has had at least three players earn CoSIDA Academic All-District honors every year since 2001.

## Player Notes of Interest

**A.J. Albert (So/LB)** - First Team All-Centennial • Ranks third on the team with 49 tackles, including team-highs of 7.5 for losses and 4.0 sacks, and also has two pass breakups • Had nine tackles, including one for a loss, at Gettysburg and came back with eight tackles, including 1.5 for losses, and one pass breakup against Moravian • Posted six tackles against fifth-ranked Muhlenberg • Totaled five tackles, including two sacks, against Dickinson and had nine tackles, including two sacks, and forced a fumble in the win over Ursinus • Totaled three tackles, including the 100th of his career, at F&M • Also intercepted potential game-winning two-point conversion pass with 29 seconds remaining after the Diplomats had pulled within 26-25.

**Chris Baldwin (Sr/DB)** - Honorable Mention All-Centennial • Leads the team in tackles (81), interceptions (4 - 110 yards) and forced fumbles (2) and is tied for the team-lead with seven PBUs • Made an immediate splash in his first game back on defense after playing running back last season • Set a school record with three defensive touchdowns (2 INTs (45 and 28 yards) and one fumble return (32 yards)) in the win over St. Lawrence • Also tied career high with 10 tackles and forced a fumble to solidify his selection as the Centennial Conference and ECAC Southwest Defensive Player of the Week • As a running back last season, had 70 touches (40 rushes, 23 receptions, seven KOR) and did not score a touchdown • Posted a career-high 12 tackles, one forced fumble and one pass breakup in the win at Randolph-Macon and added nine tackles, one interception (which he returned 33 yards to set up a JHU touchdown) and a pass breakup in the win at Gettysburg • Totaled nine tackles against Moravian and six against fifth-ranked Muhlenberg • Added nine tackles, including one for a loss, one interception and one pass breakup against Dickinson and came back with five tackles and a pass breakup against Ursinus • Added four tackles, including one for a loss, against Juniata and a team-high 11 tackles at F&M • Added six tackles and three PBUs against McDaniel.

**Tyler Brown (Fr/SS)** - Has played in all 10 games with starts in the last three • Has 27 tackles, including 5.0 for losses and 2.0 sacks, two fumble recoveries, one forced fumble and two pass breakups • Saw significant action at Randolph-Macon and had five tackles, including a sack, and forced a fumble that he recovered and returned 22 yards for a touchdown late in the third quarter • Continued to be active near the ball against Gettysburg as he had three tackles and recovered a fumble • Totaled two tackles, including a sack, in the win over Ursinus and added four tackles, including one for a loss, and a pass breakup against Juniata • Enjoyed the finest game of his career with nine tackles, including two for losses, in the win at F&M.

**Greg Chimera (Sr/FB)** - Prototypical fullback • Has two receptions for 30 yards on the year, including a 27-yard reception (shovel pass) on a fake punt last week vs. McDaniel.

**Devin Collins (So/DL)** - Has 20 tackles, including 4.0 for losses and one sack • Had four tackles, including one for a loss, against Moravian and came back with two tackles, including another for a loss, against fifth-ranked Muhlenberg • Was in on two tackles and had one sack against Ursinus and came back with four tackles, including one for a loss, against Juniata • Totaled three tackles at F&M and two vs. McDaniel.

**Dan Crowley (So/WR)** - Made the switch to wide receiver late in camp (from QB) and played in his first game at Randolph-Macon • Has 10 receptions for 176 yards (17.6 ypr.) on the year • Had one reception for 22 yards - which converted a second-and-22 and led to a JHU touchdown - early in the third quarter at Randolph-Macon • Added three receptions for 67 yards at Gettysburg and also threw a 26-yard touchdown pass on a trick play midway through the second quarter • Had three receptions for 43 yards against Moravian • Threw his second touchdown pass of the season with a 60-yard scoring strike to Sam Wernick on a double-reverse in the third quarter of the

win over Ursinus • Totaled two receptions for 38 yards against Juniata - including an amazing 30-yard reception that converted a third-and-21 in the fourth quarter.

**Sam Eagleson (Fr/DB)** - Has played in all 10 games with five starts at CB and ranks fifth on the team with 42 tackles • Also has 3.5 tackles for losses, five pass breakups and one interception • Had two tackles against Randolph-Macon and came back with 12 tackles, including 1.5 for losses, and a pass breakup in the end zone against Gettysburg • Added three stops vs. Moravian and nine tackles, including one for a loss, against fifth-ranked Muhlenberg • Added three tackles and one pass breakup against Dickinson • Totaled six tackles, including one for a loss, and added his first career interception and a pass breakup in the win over Ursinus and came back with five tackles and a pass breakup against Juniata • Totaled two tackles and a PBU at F&M.

**Austin Ehrhart (Sr/SS)** - Has played in six games with five starts and has 15 tackles on the year • Had a career-high five tackles in the win against Gettysburg • Totaled two tackles, a sack and forced a fumble in last week's win vs. McDaniel ... fumble recovery led to a JHU touchdown.

**Nick Fazio (Fr/RB)** - Ranks second on the team in rushing with 42 carries for 155 yards and has one reception for 26 yards (a TD) • Also has nine kickoff returns for 157 yards (17.4) • Got the start at running back in the season-opener and rushed nine times for 20 yards • Totaled a personal-best 115 all-purpose yards and a touchdown in the win at Gettysburg as he rushed four times for 14 yards, had a 26-yard touchdown reception that gave JHU the lead for good in the second quarter and added five kickoff returns for 75 yards • Had four carries for 22 yards against Juniata and three carries for 17 yards at F&M • Added a career-high 10 carries for 31 yards and the first rushing TD of his career against McDaniel.

**Paul Fields (Sr/CB)** - Has 23 tackles, two interceptions and one blocked field goal • Enjoyed the finest game of his career in the season-opener against St. Lawrence • Posted five tackles and had one interception and a blocked field goal • Added five tackles, including one for a loss, in the win over Ursinus • Totaled a career-high six tackles at Juniata and added four tackles and an interception at F&M • Totaled three tackles and two pass breakups against McDaniel.

**Scott Goldsmith (Sr/OL)** - Has started 19 of 20 games at left guard since the start of the 2007 season • Played defensive line in goal line situations last season.

**D.J. Hartigan (So/WR)** - Has played in nine games and got the first start of his career at Gettysburg • Ranks third on the team in receiving with 23 receptions for 200 yards and one touchdown • Had a career-high five receptions for a personal-best 53 yards in the win over Gettysburg and bettered those marks with personal-bests of six receptions for 54 yards and a touchdown at Moravian • Totaled three receptions for 19 yards and added five kickoff returns for 83 yards for a personal-best 102 all-purpose yards against fifth-ranked Muhlenberg • Added two receptions for 26 yards and two kickoff returns for 40 yards against Dickinson..

**Sean Hennessey (Jr/WR)** - Has played in all 10 games and has six receptions for 51 yards and one touchdown • Caught three passes in the win over Randolph-Macon - his 25-yard touchdown reception tied the game early in the third quarter.

**Brian Hopkins (So/TE)** - Has 11 career receptions ... four of which have resulted in touchdowns • Key player in JHU's 39-31 triple-overtime win at Randolph-Macon as he caught a three-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter and grabbed the two-point conversion pass in the third overtime • Had one reception for 17 yards against fifth-ranked Muhlenberg and added one reception for 15 yards against Ursinus • Played in all 10 games last season and had five receptions for 14 yards with three touchdowns.

**Young Offensive Line Coming Together:** Despite a starting group consisting of just one senior, the Johns Hopkins offensive line has done a nice job leading the way for an offense that is currently averaging 27.0 points and 383.3 yards per game. The Blue Jays rushed for a season-high 315 yards against Dickinson one week after the passing game produced 387 yards against Muhlenberg. In addition, the unit is doing a good job of protecting the quarterback, as the Blue Jays have allowed just 10 sacks on 308 passing attempts.

Primary starters on the offensive line include senior **Scott Goldsmith**, juniors **Mike Stoffel**, **Tim Miller** and **Anthony Catanzano** and freshman **Doug Drummond**. Senior **Matt Hintz** and junior **John Fox** have also been regular fixtures in the rotation.

**Max Islinger (So/QB-P)** - Averaging 32.5 yards on 55 punts • Punted and played a little QB in the season-opener • Punted 11 times (34.6 average) and was 1-of-4 passing against St. Lawrence • 11 punts were one shy of the JHU single-game record • Played in all 10 games with one start in 2007 • Majority of action came as JHU's punter, but did see action in four games at quarterback and earned first start at QB in the season-finale at McDaniel • Was 25-of-54 for 316 yards with three touchdowns and two interceptions on the year • Averaged 31.4 yards on 61 punts and dropped 14 of the 61 inside the the 20-yard line.

**Dan Kauffman (Fr/DB)** - Has played in six games and has six tackles to his credit • Saw significant time against Randolph-Macon and posted four tackles.

**Alex Lachman (So/PK)** - Tied for fourth in school history in field goals (17) and ranks fourth in career points by a kicker (102) • Enters this week's game against Catholic having hit 51-of-55 career extra points and 17-of-21 field goals • Named Centennial Conference Special Teams Player of the Week after hitting all four of his extra points and a 22-yard field goal in overtime at Randolph-Macon • Hit all four of his extra points in the win over St. Lawrence and added a personal-best seven extra points in the win at Gettysburg • Hit 3-of-4 extra points and 3-of-4 field goals in the 36-34 win over Dickinson - included was a career-best 46-yard field goal in the final three minutes to clinch the victory • Missed extra-point vs. Dickinson was the first of his career and snapped a streak of 42 straight successful extra-points - the longest streak in school history • Third Team d3football.com All-America and a Second Team d3football.com All-South Region selection last season • First Team All-Centennial Conference • First freshman football player in school history to earn All-America honors • Converted on 34-of-35 kicks as a freshman as he hit all 23 of his extra points and 11-of-12 field goals on the year • Tied for the national lead in field goal percentage among players with 10 or more attempts (.917) • 91.7% success rate was also a JHU and Centennial Conference record.
