- Johns Hopkins leads the all-time series, 42-3 and has won eight straight against the 'Hounds.
- The last six games between JHU and Loyola at Geppi-Aikens Field have been decided by a total of just 18 goals.
- For all the success the two teams have had, only once (1995) have Johns Hopkins and Loyola met in the NCAA Tournament. That year, JHU erased an early 3-0 deficit and cruised to an 18-5 win in the Quarterfinals.
- The road team has won six of the last 12 games in the series with JHU winning at LC in 1996, 2000, 2002, 2004 and 2006 and Loyola winning at JHU in 1999.
- The teams have met seven times since 1993 with Johns Hopkins entering as the number-one ranked team in the nation. The Blue Jays are 6-1 in those seven games.
- Johns Hopkins has been ranked in the top 10 for all 17 meetings (including this year) since the series was renewed in 1993.
- The higher ranked team is 12-4 in the head-to-head matchup since 1993 and has currently won seven straight in the series (all by JHU).
- A lower ranked Loyola team has picked off a higher ranked Johns Hopkins team twice (1998 and 1999). The lower seeded team won four of five matchups between 1996 and 2000.
