No. 4/5 Kansas (22-5, 12-2) heads into the final two weeks of Big 12 play at Texas A&M (13-13, 4-10), Wednesday, Feb. 22, at 8 p.m. on ESPN2, to start a three-game six-day stretch. The Jayhawks will then host Border Showdown foe Missouri on Saturday, Feb. 25 at 3 p.m. on CBS. Kansas and Missouri sit atop the Big 12 standings at 12-2 with four league games to play. Kansas takes a four-game winning streak to College Station, Texas, while Texas A&M looks to rebound from a 71-62 loss to Missouri on Saturday.

No. 4/5 Kansas enters the week tied for first in the Big 12 standings with Missouri at 12-2. The Jayhawks are 14-0 at home, 6-2 in road games and 2-3 on neutral courts this season. Kansas averages 74.9 points per game and allows 60.4 for a +14.5 scoring margin, which ranks second in the Big 12. KU leads the Big 12 in rebound margin at +6.4, field goal percentage defense at 37.8 and assists per contest at 16.0, tied with Missouri.

The Jayhawks are led by national player of the year candidate Thomas Robinson, who is the only player in the Big 12 to average a double-double with 17.7 points and 11.8 rebounds per game. A three-time Big 12 Player of the Week, Robinson has nine double-doubles in 14 conference games, including four of his last six games. His league-leading 18 double-doubles on the season rank second nationally. Senior guard Tyshawn Taylor, who was named the Big 12 Player of the Week on Jan. 16, leads KU in conference games with an 17.9 scoring average. He leads KU with 137 assists and 45 three-pointers made in 2011-12. Taylor is scoring 16.6 ppg overall. Junior center Jeff Withey averages 9.5 points and 6.6 rebounds for the season, yet in his last four games, he is averaging 17.5 ppg, 11.0 rpg, 5.8 blocked shots and is 63.6 percent (21-33) from the field and 80 percent (28-35) from the free throw line. He was named the Big 12 Player of the Week on Feb. 13 and leads the Big 12 with 3.4 blocked shots per game. His 57 blocked shots in conference play are twice as many as any other player in the Big 12. Junior guard Travis Releford, who was named the Big 12 Player of the Week on Jan. 9, averages 10.0 ppg in league play and 9.1 in all games. Junior guard Elijah Johnson is second on the team with 42 three-pointers and leads KU with 42 steals this season. Johnson scores 8.6 points per game and is second on the team with 98 assists.

Senior guard Conner Teahan, an Academic All-Big 12 performer, is third on the team with 41 three-pointers this season while averaging 6.4 points per game. Sophomore forward Justin Wesley is a regular who averages 1.4 points and 1.9 rebounds per contest. Junior forward Kevin Young (3.5 ppg, 2.6 rpg) and freshman guard Naadir Tharpe (1.0 ppg, 19 assists) are also KU regulars.

Kansas women's basketball raised more than \$6,400 Saturday for Jayhawks for a Cure during the team's contest with Border Showdown rival Missouri. The money will benefit Lawrence Memorial Hospital and the KU Cancer Center.

Senior Aishah Sutherland scored 23 points against the Tigers that afternoon but it was not enough as the Jayhawks were edged 70-65. The Jayhawks also suffered a setback at Iowa State last Wednesday.

KU, 17-9 overall and 6-8 in the Big 12, will travel to Texas Tech on Tuesday, Feb. 21 looking to complete a series sweep. Kansas knocked off then-No. 21 Texas Tech on Jan. 25 already this season. The Jayhawks then face top-ranked Baylor this Friday, Feb. 24 at 6:30 p.m. The game will be televised on Fox Sports Network.

At Iowa State, Sutherland scored a team-high 19 points but a strong second-half push by the Cyclones was too much to overcome as the Jayhawks fell 66-47. Junior Angel Goodrich also finished in double figures, contributing 10 points, and dished a team-best four assists. A 9-0 KU run helped Kansas close out the first half leading 23-21 but ISU came out of the break with a hot hand and proceeded to shoot 60.0 percent from the field in the second half, including 5-for-8 (62.5 percent) from beyond the arc.

In Saturday's contest versus Missouri, KU nearly stormed back from a 15-point halftime deficit, but the Tigers escaped with the 70-65 win. A first half three-point barrage by Missouri got the Jayhawks down early as the Tigers knocked down 6-of-8 shots from beyond the arc in the opening period. KU opened the second half on a furious comeback as the Jayhawks quickly trimmed the Missouri 37-22 halftime lead to four points at 47-43 with 14 minutes to play by going on a 17-6 run. The Jayhawks went on to cut the Tigers' lead to three points on two occasions, the second time with just over a minute to play, but could not get their last second shot attempts to fall. KU shot 45.6 percent from the field, but went just 3-of-14 from beyond the arc. MU made 57.4 percent from the field, and also hit 7-of-12 from three-point range.

After a two-week layoff, the Jayhawks return to action this weekend for the 2012 Big 12 Indoor Championships. They will travel to College Station, Texas's Gilliam Indoor Stadium Feb. 24-25 for the two-day conference event. The Jayhawks will have 26 men and women competing on both sides hoping to bring the Jayhawks their first Big 12 conference championship.

The seventh-ranked women boast nine athletes who are among the top-five in their events in the Big 12, including both the 4x400-meter and distance medley relay teams. Sophomore Diamond Dixon, who is the defending Big 12 champion in the outdoor 400-meters, will try to collect the same title for the indoor 400 meters as well as lead her NCAA championship-qualifying 4x400-meter relay team to a conference crown. Junior Andrea Geubelle ranks in the NCAA's top-15 in both the triple jump and long jump and will try to become the first multiple-event conference champion from KU since 2008.

The KU men also have several Jayhawks who are among the top-five athletes in the conference in 2012. Led by seniors Donny Wasinger, Darryl Trotter and Nick Canton, Kansas is looking for its first top-five finish at the Big 12 Indoor Championships since 1996. A talented group of young Jayhawks will also accompany the team to College Station; sophomore Alex Bishop and freshman Casey Bowen each are ranked in the top-five in the conference in the pole vault, while freshman Kenneth McCuin holds the third-fastest 600 yard time in the Big 12 this season.

Action begins Friday at 11 a.m., with the 60-meter hurdles of the women's pentathlon and Saturday at 3 p.m., with the women's shot put. Stay updated on all of the team's progress at the Big 12 meet through the meet central page at kuathletics.com and follow on twitter at @KU_Track.

The Kansas swimming and diving team will make its return trip to the Mizzou Aquatic center this week for the Big 12 Championships (Feb. 22-25), as the Jayhawks look to finish the 2011-12 season on a high note. KU competed in Columbia earlier this season at the Mizzou Invite (Dec. 1-4), where the Jayhawks finished in third place, with 604 points.

"We are going back to Mizzou, where we historically swim very well," said head coach Clark Campbell. "The meet that we had in December is only going to help us be better in February."

Campbell knows he will have four seniors in Shannon Garlie, Sarah Hettenbach, Kath Liggett and Stephanie Payne, who will be looking to finish their season and Big 12 careers strong and fast. "Hopefully a couple of them will make the NCAA Championships, so they will have another meet as Jayhawks under their belt," Campbell said. "But it is their final Big 12 meet, so the number one thing is that each athlete goes in there and maximizes their potential and reaches their individual goals."

But as the 10-year KU coaching veteran explained, the senior corps will also play an important role in the team's overall performance. "What we want to do is not only help them (the seniors) be the best athletes they can be, we want them to help those around them be better as well," he said about his core four. "Our seniors have a great opportunity to do that because they have done this before and know what it takes to help their teammates be better too."

For Campbell and his athletes, this week's championship meet will also serve as the culmination of a season-long training regimen to get to this point. "We are ready," Campbell concluded. "The team has never been healthier; we have never trained harder for a longer period of time, so we are really excited to see how we perform."

Also competing at the conference championships with Kansas will be Texas, Texas A&M, Iowa State and host Missouri.

Led by solid doubles play, the University of Kansas women's tennis team notched a 6-1 victory over the Arkansas-Little Rock Trojans Sunday at the Jayhawk Tennis Center. The Jayhawks remain undefeated at 5-0 in dual competition, while the Trojans dropped to 5-7 for the spring season. This marks the best start KU tennis has had since the 1991-92 campaign.

Kansas once again swept the doubles matches with the No. 1 tandem of sophomore Dylan Windom and freshman Maria Belen Ludueña starting KU off with a dominating 8-0 win over Viktoriya Plyuta and Yana Kakovkina. Sophomore Claire Dreyer and junior Victoria Khanevskaya secured the doubles point for the Jayhawks by winning at the No. 3 spot, 8-2, while junior Monica Pezzotti and sophomore Paulina Los completed the sweep with their 8-3 win at No. 2.

Ludueña and Dreyer continued their singles success with respective victories, both remaining undefeated this spring. Ludueña, a newcomer from Curico, Chile, grabbed the first singles point of the day for KU when she came from one game behind in the second set to win 6-0, 6-1 over Michaela McShane at the No. 4 position. Dreyer, a St. Louis native, took down UALR's Nina Yates, 6-2, 6-2 at the No. 5 singles spot.

KU's win-clinching point came from Windom's hard-fought win at No. 3 singles. The Tifton, Ga., sophomore battled to a 7-5, 6-3 victory over Kakovkina to give the Jayhawks a 4-0 advantage on the Trojans.

Los and Khanevskaya also recorded singles victories on the day, winning at the No. 2 and No. 6 spots, respectively.

The Jayhawks hit the road for the first time in spring dual competition next weekend. KU heads to Des Moines, Iowa, where the team will take on Drake Saturday at 5 p.m., and Montana Sunday at 11 a.m.

Kansas baseball opened the season with three-straight wins at the Music City Classic last weekend, defeating Middle Tennessee (7-3), Bowling Green (3-1) and Belmont (2-0) in Nashville, Tenn. It marked the Jayhawks' best start since opening the 2007 season with five consecutive wins.

The Jayhawks' pitching staff posted a 1.33 ERA in three games with all three starting pitchers - Frank Duncan, Wes Benjamin and Thomas Taylor - picking up victories. Junior Tanner Poppe and senior Jordan Jakubov each picked up a save in Saturday's games.

Junior infielder Kevin Kuntz was the hitting star, going 6-for-12 with a double and two RBIs, while junior catcher Alex DeLeon drove in four runs in the win over Middle Tennessee.

KU will look to continue its winning ways next weekend in Starkville, Miss. The Jayhawks will play two games against Mississippi State and two against Mississippi Valley State.

Kansas (7-2) stretched its win streak to seven after collecting its first tournament title of the season last weekend at the Charlotte Classic. The Jayhawks went 4-0 over the weekend, defeating Middle Tennessee in the first (7-3) and last (6-3) games of the weekend, while also taking down tournament host Charlotte (9-6) and Stony Brook (2-0).

Head coach Megan Smith swapped her leadoff and two-hole hitters for the second weekend of the season and reaped the benefits at the Charlotte Classic. Sophomore second baseman ran with the leadoff spot, hitting .500 (7-for-14) over the weekend with five runs scored. Her 10 runs on the year are tied for fifth in the Big 12. Meanwhile, junior left fielder Maggie Hull took over in the No. 2 spot in the lineup and responded by hitting at a .468 (7-for-16) clip over the weekend with two doubles and her second career triple. However, Hull's twin sister, Rosie, had the biggest weekend of the bunch, earning her first starts of the season and cranking out a .538 (7-for-13) average over the weekend.

Against a tough Charlotte team, Rosie Hull provided the offensive spark more than once in a game that saw five lead changes. Hull tied the game with a leadoff home run in the top of the fourth and gave KU the lead with her two-out RBI single in the following inning. The junior doubled and scored on a suicide squeeze in a close 2-0 victory against Stony Brook. She also helped start the four-run rally KU recorded in the bottom of the sixth for the comeback win against Middle Tennessee State, to clinch the Charlotte Classic championship.

In the circle, freshman Alicia Pille (4-2) recorded her fourth-straight victory in two starts at the Charlotte Classic. Over the weekend, the rookie went 2-0, allowing two runs in 11.1 innings of work for a 1.59 ERA that included 17 strikeouts to two walks. Both runs she allowed occurred during the Charlotte game, which she existed in the fifth with six strikeouts and one walk to her credit. The Royse City, Texas, native was nearly unhittable against Stony Brook – facing four over the minimum. Pille struck out 11, walked one and surrendered

just two hits to the Seawolves for her third complete game shutout in KU's first nine games. Entering the week, Pille's 49 strikeouts are second-most in the Big 12.

In the opening game of the Charlotte Classic, Friday morning, a five-run first inning backed by a complete game from Kristin Martinez led Kansas past Middle Tennessee State, 7-3. In the eighth complete game effort of her career, Martinez (1-0) threw a complete game without surrendering a walk for the second time in her career. All three runs the Blue Raiders scored were the result of a pair of home runs, two of just six hits Martinez scattered over seven innings, while striking out seven. At the plate, Kansas benefitted from multi-RBI performances from freshman catcher Lexi Bryant and redshirt senior right fielder Liz Kocon, who finished the weekend five RBIs shy of becoming the all-time RBI leader at Kansas.

Facing Charlotte, Kansas churned out 16 hits, the most in the Megan Smith era, to fuel a thrilling seventh-inning comeback, wrapping up day one with a win over the Charlotte Classic host, 9-6. The Jayhawks brought a 5-2 lead into the top of the sixth before Charlotte rallied for four runs in the bottom of the inning to reclaim the lead with only three outs to play. But Kansas, who scored in each of the last five innings, refused to go down quietly and answered with a four-spot of its own in the top of the seventh to steal the win.

On day two, rookie pitcher, Pille, looked anything but inexperienced in the circle for the Jayhawks against Stony Brook, striking out 11 and surrendering just two hits over seven shutout innings. The only walk she allowed occurred in the Seawolves' final at bat. Although SBU's starting freshman pitcher Allison Cukrov kept KU's hitters off balance, the Jayhawks found a way to make their five hits count - including flawless suicide squeeze execution from senior first baseman Marissa Ingle to score Rosie Hull for the second and final run of the contest.

With the tournament's No. 1 seed, KU faced Middle Tennessee State in a rematch that saw the Jayhawks fall behind 3-0 before stringing together a five-run fourth inning to fuel the comeback victory. Junior Morgan Druhan (2-0) came in and struck out five in her first two innings of work, shutting down the Blue Raider lineup for the next six innings. She ended the day with seven strikeouts and walked two en route to her second win of the year.

At the plate, Kansas received multi-hit performances from its one-two hitters in Newnan and Maggie Hull. Junior shortstop Mariah Montgomery also belted out a 2-for-3 effort, both of which came in the pivotal fourth inning.

The 6-3 victory against Middle Tennessee State became the last game of the weekend for Kansas as the championship game scheduled for Sunday morning against Stony Brook was rained out. With a 4-0 record, the Jayhawks were declared the tournament champions.

UP NEXT

Kansas will head to North Carolina for the second-straight weekend to play in the Seahawk Classic hosted by UNC Wilmington, Feb. 24-26. The Jayhawks will kickoff the weekend against Fairfield University at 9 a.m. CT.

Kansas' women's golf team finished in 16th place at the UCF Challenge on Tuesday. The Jayhawks ended the tournament with a score of 917, including a first and second round score of 306 and 302, respectively and a third round score of 309. Kansas finished 54 strokes behind tournament winner Auburn.

Senior Katy Nugent (featured on www.golfweek.com last week) took charge for Kansas finishing in a tie for 38th with a score of 224. Nugent finished Tuesday with a round of 75, adding to her scores of 74 and 75 from the first two rounds. Her score of 224 is her best score of the 2011-2012 season so far.

Sophomore Meghan Potee finished in a tie for 58th on Tuesday with a score of 229. She concluded the tournament with a 75 after shooting 78 and 76 on Sunday and Monday.

Sophomore Thanuttra Boonraksasat struggled in the final round; carding an 81 and dropping to a tie for 68th while freshman Michelle Woods tied for 90th with a three-day total of 230 (78-78-83).

Junior Audrey Yowell improved each day of the tournament, coming in with a 78 for a total of 244 (85-81-78) to place 96th. Playing as an individual, Gabriella DiMarco concluded the tournament in a tie for 85th with a total of 237 (80-75-82).

Kansas will return to action on Feb. 27-28 when it travels to Weston, Fla., for the Sir Pizza CARDS Challenge.
