Eighth-Ranked Kansas Hosts Nebraska In Annual Homecoming Game

QUICKLY -- After two straight road games #8 Kansas (8-0 overall, 4-0 Big 12) will return home to host Nebraska (4-5, 1-4) in its annual homecoming game... The game, which will kickoff at 11:30 a.m., will be televised nationally on Fox Sports Net (FSN)... Kansas has played three of its last four games away from Lawrence... KU has won seven straight home games (5-0 this year) as well as 16 of its last 18 at home in the last three seasons... KU has the nation's 23rd-best home record in the last five years at 24-7, 77.4 percent according to research by the Navy SID office... KU will be looking to match a school record with six home wins in a season (done eight previous times)... KU has won 11 of its last 12 games played anywhere dating back to last season... KU's eight straight victories give KU its longest winning streak since winning nine in 1951-52... The 8-0 record is the best eight-game mark since posting an 8-0 mark in 1908 (that team went 9-0)... KU's eight-game winning streak is tied for the fourth longest active streak in the NCAA behind nine by Hawai'i, Ohio State and Boston College... KU will be playing on national television for the fourth time in five weeks.

ALREADY SOLDOUT -- This week's game against Nebraska was announced as a sellout on Oct. 9. The Jayhawks are already on a school record attendance pace for the third straight season (averaged a then record 43,675 in 2005 before breaking that mark last year with a 44,137 average). This season KU is averaging 44,096 through five games prior to this week's sellout. The last KU sellout was last season's home finale against Kansas State when 51,821 were in attendance.

IN THE POLLS -- Kansas enters the week ranked eighth in all four major polls (AP, USA Today, Harris Interactive and Bowl Championship Series). The ranking of eighth is the highest for KU since being listed sixth in the AP poll on Oct. 28, 1995. It is also just the 29th week the Jayhawks have been listed among the nation's top 10 in the AP poll all-time. The highest KU has ever been ranked by the AP? Third, for three weeks in 1968. (KU's 2007 week-by-week rankings in the polls can be found on page 21 of this release).

LAST TIME OUT -- Brandon McAnderson rushed for a career-high 183 yards and two scores on 21 carries and the Jayhawk defense came up big once again as Kansas posted a 19-11 victory at Texas A&M on Saturday. McAnderson had four rushes of more than 20 yards as the Jayhawks ran for 227 yards and passed for another 180 in the road victory. KU limited Texas A&M to 127 yards and no points through three quarters before the Aggies rallied and had a chance on their final possession. However, four straight incompletions, including a toss into the end zone on the game's final play gave KU the win. Todd Reesing was 21 of 33 passing for 180 yards and no interceptions. Dezmon Briscoe was the team's leading receiver with six catches for 49 yards. Defensively James Holt and Mike Rivera each had 10 tackles, while Aqib Talib added six stops and four passes broken up.

DID YOU KNOW? -- The last time Kansas had a better record than Nebraska prior to their meeting was 1974 when the Jayhawks entered the game with a 4-1 mark and Nebraska was 3-2. The teams had identical records in 1981 (both 5-2) and 2006 (both 3-1).

HEAD COACH MARK MANGINO

-- Mark Mangino (Youngstown State, 1987) is in his sixth season at Kansas and sixth overall as a collegiate head coach. In his first five years Mangino has guided the Jayhawks to three bowl-eligible seasons. During his tenure at KU the Jayhawks played in two bowl games (2003 and 2005) in a three-year span for the second time in school history (other was 1973-75). In each of the last two years, KU has won at least six games, a feat that had not been accomplished at the school since 1994 and 1995. In his tenure at KU, five different players have earned All-America recognition, 49 have earned All-Big 12 postseason honors, including seven first-team selections, two were named conference offensive newcomers of the year and one the conference defensive player of the year and 27 have earned Academic All-Big 12 First Team recognition. Prior to coming to KU, Mangino spent three seasons (1999-2001) at Oklahoma, including the final two years as the offensive coordinator. He also coached at Kansas State from 1991-98. Other coaching stints include New Castle (Pa.) High School (1981-84), Youngstown State (1985-86), Geneva College (1987-89) and Ellwood City (Pa.) High School (1990).

ASSISTANT COACHES

- Here is a quick look at the KU assistant coaches:
- * Offensive Coordinator/QB - Ed Warinner (3rd year)... Was run-game coordinator at KU in 2003 before serving in same position at Illinois in 2004-05... Was offensive coordinator at Army for 13 years (1987-99).
 - * Offensive Line/Running Game Coordinator - John Reagan (3rd year)... As run-game coordinator and offensive line coach, KU has averaged 40 more yards in each successive season (94 before he arrived in 2004 to 134 in 2005 and 176 last year).
 - * Tight Ends/Recruiting Coordinator - Brandon Blaney (6th year)... Is entering his eighth year on a coaching staff with Mark Mangino (was an offensive line graduate assistant at Oklahoma).
 - * Wide Receivers/Passing Game Coord. - Tim Beck (3rd year)... Very successful high school coach in Texas before joining the KU program in 2005.
 - * Running Backs/Special Teams Coordinator - Louie Matsakis (1st year)... Was at KU in 2004-05 as quality control coordinator... Has coached specials teams throughout his career and is working with running backs for first time this year.
 - * Defensive Coordinator/DL - Bill Young (6th year)... Has been a defensive coordinator at the college level for 20 years (Tulsa, Ohio State, Oklahoma, USC and KU)... KU was third in NCAA in rushing defense in 2005.
 - * Linebackers - Steve Tovar (1st year)... Spent 2006 as a defensive assistant with the Miami Dolphins... Played in the NFL for eight years after an All-America playing career at Ohio State.
 - * Safeties/Co-Defensive Coordinator - Clint Bowen (7th year)... Played at KU (1990, 92-93) and was the team's leading tackler as a senior... Is in second year as co-defensive coordinator... Grew up in Lawrence.
 - * Cornerbacks - Je'Ney Jackson (1st year)... Former assistant strength coach is in his first year as a field coach... Was an all-WAC cornerback during his collegiate career at Wyoming.

THE SERIES

-- Nebraska leads the all-time series by an 88-22-3 count, including a 46-7-1 advantage in games played in Lawrence. After consecutive wins by Kansas in 1967 and 1968, Nebraska ran off 36 straight victories before the Jayhawks posted a 40-15 win in 2005 - the last time these teams met in Lawrence. Last year Nebraska posted a 39-32 overtime victory in Lincoln. KU's 72 combined points in the last two games in this series are three more than KU combined for in the 10 games against Nebraska before that (69 total points from 1995-2004). KU head coach Mark Mangino is 1-4 against the Huskers as the Kansas head coach.

KU-NU LAST YEAR -- Adam Barmann threw for 405 yards while Jon Cornish ran for 145, but it was not enough as a furious Jayhawks rally fell short against 21st-ranked Nebraska as Kansas fell 39-32 in overtime in Lincoln, Neb. on Sept. 30, 2006. KU erased a 17-point first-half deficit (24-7) and forced overtime when Barmann found Brian Murph on a 26-yard scoring pass with 46 seconds left in regulation. However, Cody Glenn scored on NU's overtime possession and KU failed to score after getting the ball to the nine-yard line. Both teams produced 500-plus yards of total offense as KU had 574 and Nebraska had 511. Two Jayhawks had more than 100 yards receiving as Murph had eight catches for 129 yards and Dexton Fields grabbed eight balls for 108 yards. Mike Rivera and James McClinton each had seven tackles for KU, while Russell Brorsen added six stops. After trailing 24-7 KU scored 18 straight points (two touchdowns with failed PATs and two field goals) before Nebraska went ahead 32-25 at the 4:13 mark. KU then responded with the game-tying touchdown to force the extra period.

KU-NU LAST TIME IN LAWRENCE -- Kansas stopped Nebraska's 36-game winning streak in the series with a 40-15 victory against the Huskers on Nov. 5, 2005. Kansas built up a 14-2 first-quarter lead and led 17-9 at halftime. KU led 24-15 after three quarters before out-scoring Nebraska 16-0 in the final quarter. KU ran up 428 yards of total offense with 215 passing yards and 213 rushing yards, while holding Nebraska to just 138 yards. KU had two 100-yard rushers in Jon Cornish (101 yards) and Clark Green (100), while Jason Swanson threw for 215 yards, including six tosses for 100 yards to Mark Simmons. Kansas controlled the ball for 34:49, while NU had just 25:11 in possession time.

KU-NU CONNECTIONS -- Kansas has one player on its roster from the state of Nebraska in WR Micah Brown, who is from Kearney... Nebraska players from the state of Kansas include LB Lance Brandenburg (Overland Park/St. Thomas Aquinas HS), LB Blake Lawrence (Shawnee Mission/SM West HS), and IB Kenny Wilson (Liberal)... NU wide receivers coach Ted Gilmore was born in Wichita, Kan. and played at Butler Community College from 1986-87 and was a graduate assistant coach at Wyoming when KU CB coach Je'Ney Jackson was a player at Wyoming.

KU TO CELEBRATE 94TH HOMECOMING -- Kansas will be playing its 94th homecoming game, a tradition, which began in Lawrence in 1912... KU is 40-48-5 all-time in homecoming games, including a 3-21-1 mark against Nebraska... KU has won three of its last four homecoming games, but lost 21-18 to Texas A&M in last year's contest... Since 1990, KU is 13-4 in homecoming games... This year's meeting will mean KU's most common homecoming opponent is a tie between Missouri and Nebraska with 26 meetings with both... From 1912-1939, Kansas' homecoming opponent alternated each year between Nebraska and Missouri... The last time KU played Nebraska in a homecoming game was 1966.

2007 KANSAS FOOTBALL ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Defeated a ranked team (#24 Kansas State) for first time since beating #25 Iowa State in 2005.
- Beat a ranked team on the road (#24 Kansas State) for the first time since winning at #15 Oklahoma in 1995.
- Earned a national ranking for first time since 1995 (ranked #6 on Oct. 28, 1995).
- Earned highest national ranking since finishing ninth in the final AP poll in 1995.
- Opened a year 8-0 for first time since starting 8-0 in 1909.
- Won eight straight games for first time since 1951-52 (nine consecutive wins).
- Produced at least six wins in three straight years for the first time since 1960-61-62.
- Became the only remaining undefeated conference team since the 1968 Kansas team started that season 7-0 (i.e. the last time KU was the only undefeated team in the conference at any point in a season).
- Opened Big 12 play with a victory for the first time since 2003.
- Opened Big 12 play with a 4-0 record for the first time since 1992 (never been 5-0).
- KU became the first Big 12 North school since Nebraska in 2002 to open league play 3-0.
- Posted back-to-back road wins in the same season for the first time since 1995.
- Posted three road wins in the same season for the first time since 1996 (3-3 on the road that year).
- Post two wins against South Division teams in the same season for first time in Big 12 history.
- Post an eight-win season for just the 12th time in school history.
- Expect to be in a bowl game for third time in the Mark Mangino era and no Kansas coach has taken KU to more than two bowls.
- On pace to establish school record in attendance for third straight season as KU has averaged 44,906 through five home games and the next home game against Nebraska is already sold out (last game is vs. Iowa State). KU set mark in 2005 with 43,675 and then bested that mark last year with an average of 44,137.
- Beat in-state rival Kansas State three of last four years (have beaten other big rival Missouri three out of last four meetings, but have not played this year). Also defeated KSU in consecutive years for the first time since winning three straight from 1988-90.
- Snapped an eight-game losing streak at Kansas State (had not won at Manhattan since 1989 before this year).
- Recorded back-to-back 50-point games for the first time in history after opening the year with a 52-7 win against Central Michigan and a 62-0 victory against Southeastern Louisiana.
- Scored 30 or more points in six straight games (first six games) for the first time in history.
- Started the year with two straight turnover-free games for the first consecutive games without a turnover since 2003.
- Scored 52 points in season opener vs. Central Michigan for most points in a season opener since 1912.
- Scored most points in a conference game in school history with 58 vs. Baylor.
- Shutout Southeastern Louisiana for first shutout since beating Southern Illinois 42-0 in 2000.
- Held consecutive opponents to less than 10 points for the first time since 1975 as KU beat Central Michigan 52-7 and Southeastern Louisiana 62-0.
- Limited opponents to just 23 combined points in four straight games (first four games) for the fewest allowed in a four-game span since 1961 (held four opponents to a combined 23 points as well).
- On pace to have five of the top 10 passing yardage seasons in school history come in the Mangino era, as KU is currently averaging a school-record pace of 264.4 yards per game.
- On pace to have four of the top 10 rushing defense yardage seasons in school history come in the Mangino era as KU is currently averaging a school record of 77.5 yards allowed rushing per game (three of current top five seasons have come in the Mangino era).
- Posted consecutive wins against Colorado for the first time since 1980 and 1981.
- Stopped a seven-game losing streak to Texas A&M with win at College Station.

BACKS SHARING LOAD -- The one-two punch of rushing tandem Brandon McAnderson and Jake Sharp has been a successful one for Kansas this year after the graduation of 2006 Big 12 rushing leader Jon Cornish. Both players have produced three 100-yard rushing games this year, marking just the third time in history two Jayhawks have rushed for three 100-yard games in a season (2005 - Jon Cornish (4) and Clark Green (3) and 1974 - Laverne Smith (7) and Robert Miller (3)). McAnderson has 688 yards (6.7 average) and Sharp has 617 (5.9 average) so far this season.

NOWHERE TO RUN -- In four Big 12 Conference games, Kansas has allowed just 241 total rushing yards combined (60.25 per game) with Texas A&M gaining the most - 74 yards last week. A&M entered the game ranked fifth in the nation in rushing, but was held to 186.1 below its average of 260.1 per game. Two weeks ago against Colorado, KU stopped a four-game 100-yard rushing streak by Hugh Charles, limiting the back to just 39 yards.

WINNING CLOSE GAMES -- This season Kansas has won three games that were decided by one score (3-0). Last year KU was 3-4 in one-score games. In fact, the KU defense has had to seal the game with stops on basically the final possession in all three of those close games this year. Here is a closer look:

at Kansas State - KSU started a drive from its own 20 with 2:21 left trailing 30-24. The Wildcats reached the KU 49 before Aqib Talib intercepted a pass with 1:12 remaining and KU ran out the clock.

at Colorado - CU started a drive at its own 42 with 2:16 left trailing 19-14. The Buffs lost eight yards on four plays and KU ran out the clock with three kneel downs with 1:46 left.

at Texas A&M - A&M started a drive on its own 20 with 0:52 left trailing 19-11. The Aggies moved the ball to their own 48-yard line and threw an incomplete pass into the endzone on the game's final play.

QUICK RESPONSE -- Kansas has fallen behind its opponent three times this season (twice at Kansas State and once at Colorado). While it took KU almost a full quarter to respond to trailing the first time at Kansas State, each of the last two times KU fell behind, the Jayhawks scored on their next possession to tie or re-gain the lead.

LINEBACKING TRIO -- KU's starting three linebackers Joe Mortensen (73 tackles), James Holt (62) and Mike Rivera (51) are the team's top three tacklers this season. Mortensen has recorded double-figure tackles totals in three of the last five games, Holt had a career-high 15 tackles at Colorado and his second-best total of 10 at Texas A&M in consecutive weeks and Mike Rivera had a season-best 10 stops at Texas A&M on Saturday.

DID YOU KNOW? -- Kansas is one of five schools to have both its football and basketball programs ranked in the current USA Today polls. The Jayhawks are the only program to have both teams in the top 10. Here is a look:

KU had three drives against A&M that resulted in missed field goals, including two 10-plus play, 50-plus yard drives in the first half... Kansas has produced 400 total yards in seven of eight games this season (333 vs. Colorado)... After passing for more yards than it ran for in the first five games, KU has rushed for more yards than it has passed for in the last three games... KU's 38 offensive touchdowns have been split with 19 rushing and 19 passing... Five of KU's last six offensive touchdowns have been rushing scores... KU has not thrown an interception in six of eight

games this year (one vs. Florida International and three at Kansas State)... After averaging 50.33 points in its first six games, KU has averaged 19.0 in its last two games... Kansas and Oklahoma State are the only two schools in the Big 12 averaging at least 200 yards rushing and 200 yards passing in a game... KU's 479.4 total yards per game are on a school record pace (421.5 in 2003)... KU's 264.4 passing yards per game are second to the 286.0 in 1983... KU has been shutout in a quarter just five times this year (in 32 quarters) and has scored at least twice in 22 quarters... KU has produced 39 explosives (plays of 20 or more yards) this year by 11 different players... Seven different players have a receiving touchdown and six different Jayhawks have a rushing touchdown (Jake Sharp is the only KU player with both a rushing and receiving score)... Fifteen different players have at least one reception with 14 having at least two this season.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

-- Against Texas A&M on Saturday, KU held the nation's fifth-leading rushing team to 186.1 yards below its average as the Aggies produced just 74 rushing yards a week after they ran up 359 against Nebraska... Only one opponent has run for more than 125 yards in a game against KU this season (Toledo had 174)... KU has allowed just two rushing touchdowns this year (Toledo and Kansas State each had one)... On Saturday Texas A&M had just 127 yards on 39 plays through three quarters and then had 191 on 33 plays in the fourth quarter... KU forced six three and outs, one drive end on downs and one fumble on A&M's first eight possessions... Through three quarters A&M was one of nine on third downs and then four of seven in the fourth... KU's rushing defense is on a school record pace (record is 83.2 allowed in 2005)... The opponents have reached the red zone just 13 times this season (and scored just eight times - five touchdowns and three field goals)... KU has been tough to score on in the first half, allowing just 27 total points all year... The opponents have scored on just 11.2 percent of their possessions this year (13 of 116)... The opponents have started nine drives in KU territory, but only scored three times (all touchdowns)... This year the opponents have scored on just 13 offensive drives and three times the opponent had an extremely short field (21, 13 and 16-yard scoring drives)... KU had allowed just one individual 100-yard rusher in a stretch of 27 games (Leon Patton of Kansas State rushed for 102 yards last season) before DaJuane Collins of Toledo ran for 102 yards this year (now just two 100-yard rushers in the last 33 contests)... After starting the same defensive lineup in the first seven games of the year, Kendrick Harper replaced Chris Harris at cornerback against Texas A&M on Saturday... Ten different players have recorded interceptions, the most since an identical 10 in 1985... Three KU defensive linemen have interceptions this season.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

-- KU is the only school in the country with at least two kickoff and two punt returns for touchdowns this season... KU has two kickoff returns for scores in the same season for the first time since at least 1972... KU has scored five times on special teams this year with two punt returns, two kickoff returns and a safety on a bad punt snap... KU has allowed one kickoff return for a touchdown this year (Baylor).

QUARTERBACK NOTES

-- Sophomore Todd Reesing earned the starting position this fall and has etched his name into the KU record books a number of times (see page xx of this release)... He has not thrown an interception in the last three games (93 attempts) and in fact enters the Nebraska game having attempted 98 straight without a pickoff (he opened the year with 119 attempts before throwing his first pickoff)... In his starting debut he was 20 of 29 for 261 yards and four touchdowns vs. Central Michigan... He did not play in the fourth quarter in any of the four non-conference games and averaged 299 yards per game in those contests... In his first collegiate game last year Reesing came off the bench to complete seven of 11 passes for 106 yards and two touchdowns, while rushing for another to lead a come-from-behind win against Colorado... Sophomore Kerry Meier started eight games a year ago, but has come off the bench this year as both a quarterback and wide receiver... He started the year completing his first seven passing attempts... He has started two games at wide receiver... He has 10 receptions for 70 yards... Meier had a 40-yard run against Southeastern Louisiana in the second game this year... Meier is the first KU player with a rush, pass, reception and punt in the same season since Donald Shanklin accomplished that feat in 1968... Tyler Lawrence, a redshirt freshman, who was the offensive scout team player of the year last season, saw his first collegiate action against SLU, but did not record any statistics.

RUNNING BACK NOTES

-- Brandon McAnderson is coming off a career-best 183 rushing yard performance against Texas A&M for the third most yards by a Jayhawk in the last seven years (Jon Cornish had 201 vs. Kansas State and 196 vs. Baylor last year)... McAnderson rushed for two touchdowns against A&M for his fourth multiple touchdown game this season... McAnderson enters this week's game with 916 career rushing yards (688 this season), just 84 shy of 1,000... McAnderson has three 100-yard rushing games this year... Jake Sharp made his first career start two weeks ago at Colorado... He also has three 100-yard rushing games this season... Sharp had produced a rushing touchdown in four straight games before getting shutout against Texas A&M on Saturday... Sharp is the only player on the team with a rushing and receiving touchdown this year... A trio of players have battled for the third spot, including Carmon Boyd-Anderson, who had a season-best 13 attempts for 54 yards against Southeastern Louisiana, but has not played in the last

three games, Donte Bean, who has played in two games and Angus Quigley, who had eight attempts for 47 yards and a touchdown against Baylor in his only action.

WIDE RECEIVER NOTES -- With 585 receiving yards Marcus Henry is just 15 yards shy of becoming just the fourth Jayhawk with 600 receiving yards in a season in the last 11 years (Charles Gordon had 769 in 2003 and both Mark Simmons had 631 and Brandon Rideau had 677 in 2005)... Henry opened the season with a school-record tying three straight 100-yard receiving yardage games (on 19 combined receptions)... Henry has produced a team-best tying eight explosives (20-plus yard plays)... Dexton Fields has caught at least two passes in 18 of his last 19 games (exception was one catch at Colorado this year)... Freshman Dezmon Briscoe recorded a career-best six receptions at Texas A&M on Saturday (for 49 yards) a week after not catching a pass at Colorado... He is tied for the team lead with four touchdown receptions... Briscoe's first collegiate reception was a 16-yard touchdown catch against Central Michigan in the season opener... Kerry Meier has caught at least one pass in each of the five games since he was moved to wide receiver... He has pulled in at least two in each of the last three games with three at Colorado... Part-time wide receiver Aqib Talib had eight catches for 182 yards and four touchdowns... After catching seven passes for four touchdowns in the first five games, he has just one catch in the last three games (Saturday for eight yards at Texas A&M)... Raimond Pendleton had three receptions in the season opener but just one in the last seven games combined... Marcus Herford had three catches in the first four games combined, but none in the last four... Tertavian Ingram, who started the first two games of the season, recorded his first receptions of the year in game six against Baylor as he pulled in two for 15 yards.

TIGHT END NOTES -- Derek Fine has recorded at least three receptions in each of the last five games as well as at least two receptions in 10 of the last 11 games... Senior Marc Jones is the only other tight end on the team with playing experience before this year, but he has not recorded a reception in his career... Freshman Bradley Dedeaux is listed as the backup and recorded his first career catch (11 yards) against Florida International.

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTES -- Senior Cesar Rodriguez started his team-best 37th game against Colorado last Saturday... He started six games as a freshman, 11 as a sophomore and 12 as a junior... He started at right tackle his first year and left tackle the last two years before returning to right tackle this season (started this year's Toledo game at left tackle)... Junior Anthony Collins started all 12 games at right tackle last year and has 19 career starts, but did not start against Toledo for disciplinary reasons (was in on the second series)... Collins is the starter at left tackle... Junior Ryan Cantrell has been the starter at center and had started five games as a freshman and none as a sophomore... Junior Adrian Mayes made his first collegiate start at left guard against CMU... Junior college transfer Chet Hartley started in his first major college game against Central Michigan, manning the right guard spot... Redshirt freshman Ian Wolfe made his first collegiate start against Toledo manning the right tackle spot.

DEFENSIVE LINE NOTES -- DT James McClinton has had three tackles in each of the last two games and has made at least three stops in six of eight contests this year... Against Colorado two weeks ago, he had an interception and a sack... His 9.5 tackles for loss are second on the team... DE John Larson has made at least four tackles in five games this year... Larson recovered a fumble against Texas A&M on Saturday after forcing three earlier this season... Larson had an interception against Toledo earlier in the year... DE Russell Brorsen had three stops against Texas A&M as well as a PBU... Brorsen had an interception and assisted on a sack against Kansas State earlier in the year... Jake Laptad has made at least one tackle in every game off the bench this year... Todd Haselhorst matched a season high with two tackles against Texas A&M on Saturday... Jeff Wheeler has recorded a sack in each of the last two games... Maxwell Onyegbule has 2.5 sacks despite coming off the bench... Mortensen ranks second in the Big 12 in tackles for loss (1.38 per game) and seventh in tackles per game (9.13)... Mortensen had a career-high 13 tackles against Florida International... James Holt has recorded the best two tackle games of his career in the last two weeks with a career-best 15 at Colorado and 10 last week at Texas A&M... Holt has recorded at least five tackles in every game this year... Mike Rivera had a season-best 10 tackles at Texas A&M on Saturday... Rivera has recorded at least four tackles in every game this season.

this season... Talib had a stretch of three straight games with an interception, but has not had one in the last three games... CB Chris Harris did not start against Texas A&M Saturday after making seven straight starts to begin his college career... In his collegiate debut he had nine tackles against Central Michigan in the season opener... CB Kendrick Harper made his first collegiate start at Texas A&M on Saturday after coming off the bench in Big 12 play (missed the non-conference games due to injury)... He responded to his first start by making seven tackles and has 11 stops in the last two games... In his first game at Kansas he recorded an interception against KSU earlier this season... S Sadiq Muhammed came off the bench to record four tackles and two PBUs at Texas A&M on Saturday... S Patrick Resby had made at least three tackles in four straight games before making just one at Texas A&M on Saturday... S Justin Thornton has had three interceptions in the last five games, including back-to-back contests against Baylor and at Colorado... CB Gary Green had his first career interception against Baylor earlier this season.

SPECIALISTS NOTES -- PK Scott Webb had made eight consecutive field goal attempts as well as 11 of 12 this year and 16 of his previous 17 before missing two straight (first one blocked) at Texas A&M on Saturday... Webb made two of five attempts against the Aggies and is now 13 of 17 on the year... Webb has still made 18 of his last 22 attempts and has made a field goal in 10 consecutive games... Webb has made at least two field goals in three straight games... Webb is listed all over the KU record books (see pages 25 and 26 of this release)... P Kyle Tucker has produced his best two punting days of the year in the last two weeks, averaging 43.8 on five punts at Colorado and 43.3 on three boots at Texas A&M, after averaging 36.0 in the first six games... Tucker had a 53-yarder at Colorado and a 49-yarder at Texas A&M to trail only his season-long of 57 yards vs. Toledo... Tucker has placed three punts inside the 20 in the last three games... Marcus Herford leads the Big 12 and ranks 10th in the NCAA with a 31.06 kickoff return average... He has two kickoff returns for scores this year and is one of three players in the nation with two touchdown returns this season (Felix Jones of Arkansas and Kevin Robinson of Utah State, who Mike Strauss used to publicize)... His 88-yard return against Baylor tied his 88-yard return vs. Northwestern State a year ago for the 10th longest in school history... KU has tried two punt returners this year with Anthony Webb the current returner... Webb has 10 returns for 20 yards... Raimond Pendleton returned a punt 77 yards for a touchdown in the season opener against Central Michigan.

KU NOTES -- KU has had a better average field position than its opponents in five of eight games, including two of the last three when the Jayhawks averaged starting at its own 46 against Baylor and its own 35 against Texas A&M... KU has started 27 different players this season, including four freshmen, five sophomores, 13 juniors and five seniors... Kansas has only one senior starter on defense in DT James McClinton... McClinton has started a team-best 28 consecutive games, while three other Jayhawks have made at least 20 consecutive starts in OT Cesar Rodriguez (23), LB Joe Mortensen (20) and LB Mike Rivera (20)... Rodriguez has made a team-best 37 total starts, followed by McClinton (31), CB Aqib Talib (27) and TE Derek Fine (25)... KU leads the Big 12 in eight team categories including scoring defense (10.2), total defense (263.9), kickoff returns (29.9), turnover margin (+1.38), pass efficiency defense (93.8), opponent third-down conversions (26.4 percent), opponent fourth-down conversions (33.3 percent), and red zone defense (61.5 percent).

2007 CAPTAINS -- As selected by their teammates, TE Derek Fine, RB Brandon McAnderson, DT James McClinton, and CB Aqib Talib, will serve as team captains in 2007. Fine and McClinton were captains a year ago, while Talib, a junior, is the only non-senior among the group.

END ZONE FACILITY WORK HAS BEGUN -- The Anderson Family Football Complex, a \$31 million facility that will house the Kansas football team beginning in 2008, is being built adjacent to the southwest side of Memorial Stadium. The complex will include offices, academic areas, a weight room, locker rooms, an audio-visual room, meeting rooms, a cardio room, a hydro-therapy room, a nutrition area and a display area. In addition, two practice fields will be built just southeast of the stadium as well.

LONG-TIME HOME -- For the 87th straight season, Kansas is playing its home games in Memorial Stadium, which was built in 1921. The stadium is tied for the seventh oldest in the nation behind Georgia Tech (1913), Mississippi State (1914), Cincinnati (1916), Wisconsin (1917), Oklahoma State (1920), and Washington (1920). Other schools who started play in their current stadiums in 1921 include Stanford and Tennessee.

NEW UNIFORMS AND HELMETS -- Kansas football has new uniforms and helmets this season. The new look features writing in the University's Trajan font.

2007 GAME-BY-GAME NOTES

Vs. Central Michigan

- * KU's 52 points were its most in a season opener since 1912.
- * KU had six different players score a touchdown.
- * 10 different KU players had receptions.

- * KU has now won consecutive games against KSU for the first time since 1988-90 and has won three of the last four meetings between the schools.
- * KU opened conference play with a victory for the first time since 2003.
- * LB Joe Mortensen recorded 11 tackles to register double-digit tackle totals in back-to-back games.
- * KU was held to just 38 yards in the first quarter, but produced 399 in the final three periods.
- * When KSU scored in the first quarter it marked the first time this season the Jayhawks trailed in a game.
- * KU's first road game on Oct. 6 tied for the second latest in the country a FBS team played a road game this season (Rutgers did not play on the road until Oct. 13).

Vs. Baylor

- * The opening kickoff was delayed one hour and 38 minutes due to a thunderstorm. After beginning play, a 30-minute delay occurred late in the first quarter due to lightning.
- * KU entered the game ranked in the national polls (20th by AP, *USA Today* and Harris) for the first time since 1996.
- * KU started a conference season 2-0 for the first time since 1997.
- * KU limited Baylor to just 202 total yards after the Bears entered averaging 393.7 per game.
- * KU recorded four interceptions, its most in a game since picking off four against Texas Tech in 2004.

KANSAS 52, CENTRAL MICHIGAN 7

The Kansas offense was firing on all cylinders in its season-opening game as the Jayhawks dominated Central Michigan 52-7 before a crowd of 46,815 at Memorial Stadium on Saturday night. The win gave the Jayhawks a season-opening victory for the fourth-straight year.

A pair of Jayhawk running backs notched 100-yard games for the first time since 2005 as senior Brandon McAnderson and sophomore Jake Sharp each eclipsed the century mark for the first time in their Kansas careers. McAnderson finished the game with 110 yards on 16 carries, all of which came in the first half. Sharp handled the load in the second half and finished the game with 106 yards on 15 rushes.

Central Michigan avoided the shut out with a seven-yard pass from Dan LeFevour to Kito Poblach to close out the third quarter of play.

Kansas piled up 538 yards of total offense on the evening, with six different players scoring touchdowns. Todd Reesing finished the game completing 20 of his 29 pass attempts, good for 261 yards and four TDs.

Henry led the Jayhawk receiving corps with seven receptions for 103, both career highs. Derek Fine hauled in five passes for 30 yards, while junior Dexton Fields had four catches for 49 yards.

The Jayhawk defense held Central Michigan to 294 yards of total offense and just seven points with junior linebacker James Holt and freshman cornerback Chris Harris leading the way with nine tackles a piece. Junior linebacker Joe Mortensen added eight tackles, including one sack for minus-10 yards.

KANSAS 62, SOUTHEASTERN LOUISIANA 0

Sophomore quarterback Todd Reesing threw for 257 yards and two scores, while the Kansas defense recorded its first shutout since 2000 as the University of Kansas trounced Southeastern Louisiana, 62-0 in front of 43,914 fans Saturday evening at Memorial Stadium.

Kansas dominated in nearly every phase of the game Saturday, outgaining SLU 474-75 and scoring as many as 62 points for the first time since 2004. KU's 62-point win tied for the fourth largest margin of victory in team history.

Reesing and senior wide receiver Marcus Henry led the Jayhawk offensive attack. The sophomore signal caller completed 13-of-23 passes for 257 yards and two scores, while Henry became the first Jayhawk since Harrison Hill to record back-to-back 100 yard receiving games, collecting five catches for 119 yards Saturday.

Junior fullback Brandon McAnderson led the Kansas rushing attack with 11 carries for 60 yards and two touchdowns in the first half. As a team, KU gained 209 yards on the ground and 280 through the air.

Senior defensive lineman James McClinton led the Kansas defense with five tackles and a sack as KU held the Lions to just 75 yards of total offense, marking the first time since 1992 that the Jayhawks held an opponent under 100 yards of offense.

KANSAS 45, TOLEDO 13

Todd Reesing threw for 313 yards and four touchdowns, while Brandon McAnderson rushed for two scores and the Kansas defense allowed just 251 yards as the Jayhawks improved to 3-0 on the season with a 45-13 victory against Toledo on Saturday.

The Jayhawks scored the game's first 17 points before Toledo scored just the second touchdown allowed by KU this year late in the second quarter. KU then scored 28 straight points before the Rockets found the endzone again with :05 left in the game after KU fumbled on its own 13-yard line.

Reesing's 313 yards were the 16th most in school history and the most by a Jayhawk since Adam Barmann threw for 405 vs. Nebraska last year. Marcus Henry was on the receiving end of seven of those completions for 133 yards and one score. Henry tied a school record with his third consecutive 100-yard receiving game. In all four, different KU players caught touchdown passes to go along with McAnderson's two rushing scores.

KU put up 557 yards of total offense for the 13th-best offensive day in school history. The KU defense also came up with its first interceptions of the year as Aqib Talib, Darrell Stuckey and defensive end John Larson all had pickoffs in the game. James McClinton led KU in tackles with nine, including one for loss.

KANSAS 55, FLORIDA INTERNATIONAL 3

Sophomore QB Todd Reesing accounted for 415 yards of total offense and two scores, while junior CB Aqib Talib highlighted the night with a 100-yard interception return for a touchdown as Kansas cruised to a 55-3 victory over Florida International back on Sept. 22. Reesing and fellow sophomore QB Kerry Meier led the team to 615 yards of total offense, KU's largest offensive output since posting 641 yards against Jacksonville State in 2003. Reesing was responsible for 415 yards of offense himself, throwing for 368 yards on 28-of-37 passing, while rushing for 47 yards on eight carries in just three quarters of action. Senior fullback Brandon McAnderson gained 105 yards on 13 carries and two scores, while senior TE Derek Fine had a career-high seven catches for 70 yards and a touchdown. For McAnderson it was his second 100-yard rushing effort of the season. Junior LB Joe Mortensen became the first Jayhawk to record double-digit tackle totals in a game this season as he recorded a career-high 13 tops. Fellow LB Mike Rivera added nine stops and added two fumble recoveries as the Jayhawks forced five turnovers on the night.

KANSAS 30, #24 KANSAS STATE 24

Dexton Fields hauled in the game-winning fourth-quarter touchdown to help Kansas defeat 24th-ranked Kansas State, 30-24 at Manhattan. The win was the fifth straight for KU, which started league play with a victory for the first time since 2003, defeated a ranked team for the first time since 2005 and defeated a ranked team on the road for the first time since 1995. The win also stopped KU's eight-game losing streak at Manhattan and gave the Jayhawks consecutive wins against its intrastate rival for the first time since 1988-90. KU has now won three of the last four against KSU. KSU scored first and had KU trailing for the first time this season. However the teams exchanged touchdowns in the first half and were tied at 14 at the break. KU then went ahead 21-14 on a Dezmon Briscoe 28-yard touchdown reception before KSU scored the next 10 points to go ahead 24-21. Dexton Fields caught a 30-yard scoring pass to put the Jayhawks back up 27-24 with 6:27 remaining. KU then added a field goal with 2:21 left to lead 30-24 and Aqib Talib's interception on KSU's final possessions sealed the game. After gaining just 38 yards on 16 plays in the first quarter, KU finished with 437 yards of total offense, while KSU managed 363. Three Jayhawks recorded interceptions in Talib, DE John Larson and CB Kendrick Harper, who was playing for the first time this year. Joe Mortensen recorded 11 tackles to reach double-digits in consecutive games.

Quarterback Todd Reesing threw two touchdown passes, while Jake Sharp gained 110 yards on 18 carries as 20th-ranked Kansas improved to 6-0 for the first time since 1995 with a 58-10 rout of Baylor. The teams faced a one hour and 38 minute delay due to lightning prior to the game. After a Marcus Herford kickoff return for a score with 4:08 in the first quarter, the teams faced another 30-minute delay due to more lightning. The game finally ended at 5:03 p.m., more than five hours after its scheduled kickoff time of 11:37 a.m. The Jayhawks took advantage of great field position during the game as their average starting position was its own 46-yard line. Baylor turned the ball over five times, leading to four Kansas scores, while the Jayhawks did not have a turnover for the third time this season. Kansas had seven different players score its seven touchdowns. KU produced 447 total yards, while holding Baylor to just 202 yards after the Bears entered the game averaging 393 yards per game. After the teams exchanged field goals to start the game, Herford returned a kickoff 88 yards for a score, his second kickoff return for a touchdown this year, and ignited a stretch of 35 straight points by the Jayhawks. KU came up with four interceptions.

Behind the leadership of quarterback Todd Reesing, 15th-ranked Kansas held off Colorado to defeat the Buffaloes 19-14 at Folsom Field Saturday. Kansas built up a 19-7 lead after scoring on a 15-play, 94-yard drive with 10:23 left in the game. Colorado scored a touchdown of its own to pull within 19-14 at the 3:42 mark. After Colorado forced KU to punt, the Buffaloes took over at their own 42-yard line with 2:16 remaining in the game. Kansas stopped the Buffs on four plays (CU lost eight yards on the possession) and the Jayhawks won their seventh straight game. Reesing completed 20 of 29 passes for 153 yards and a touchdown, while also rushing seven times for 84 yards. Jake Sharp added 53 rushing yards, while Brandon McAnderson bulled his way for 44 more on just seven carries, but it was the KU defense that came up big. KU registered seven tackles for loss, including three sacks, and came up with three turnovers, including interceptions by Justin Thornton and James McClinton and a fumble recovery by Kendrick Harper. James Holt had a career-best 15 tackles, while Joe Mortensen was in on 11 stops. KU had a season-low 333 yards of total offense (entered the game averaging 515.8), but limited CU to 353 yards on 78 plays (4.5 yards per play) en route to the win.
