



SEASON OUTLOOK

After winning three of the last four games to close the 2006 season, Kansas players and coaches are anxious to take another step forward as the Jayhawks prepare for their sixth season under head coach Mark Mangino. For the third time in the last four years KU posted a bowl-eligible record last season and with 33 returning lettermen, a strong nucleus appears set to have a positive year.

Among the returning lettermen are 16 starters from last year's 6-6 team. That group includes six offensive and eight defensive starters and both kickers.

While KU graduated the Big 12 Conference's leading rusher in Jon Cornish on offense, the Jayhawks do return the team's leading passer and receiver from a year ago in Kerry Meier and Dexter Fields, respectively. In addition fullback Brandon McAnderson was a second-team all-conference selection by the Big 12 coaches and offensive tackle Anthony Collins was an All-Big 12 Honorable Mention pick by the AP.

Defensive returnees include 2006 first-team all-league and 2007 preseason All-America selection, Aqib Talib at cornerback among its eight returning starters. Other Big 12 honorees from last year include lineman James McClinton (second-team by the AP), linebacker Mike Rivera (honorable mention) and Anthony Webb (all-freshman team).

The special teams group returns both punter Kyle Tucker and place kicker Scott Webb as well as Marcus Herford, who averaged 26.1 yards per kickoff return and earned second-team all-league honors as a return man.

The season starts with four straight non-conference home games and after a bye week, the Jayhawks will open league play at Kansas State before finishing the league slate against Border Showdown foe Missouri in Kansas City's Arrowhead Stadium on Thanksgiving weekend.

Entering the season a pair of sophomore quarterbacks, Kerry Meier and Todd Reesing, will battle to see who will guide the team. Both bring a year of experience and tenacity to the position after a season of Big 12 play. They will have a vast assortment of pass catchers to call upon in 2007. Junior Dexter Fields, who hauled in a team-high 45 receptions, returns along with an assortment of speedy, talented options for Meier and/or Reesing to use.

Seniors Marcus Henry and Jeff Foster and juniors Marcus Herford and Raymond Brown all provide excellent speed and reliability at the wideout positions. Throw into the mix senior tight ends Derek Fine and Marc Jones, and the Jayhawks air attack looks like it could be effective this year.

Despite the loss of All-Big 12 standout Jon Cornish, the 2007 KU backfield will feature an array of ball carriers that will offer a mixture of toughness and agility. There is little doubt that senior Brandon McAnderson will use 2007 as a chance to showcase his powerful running ability, a tough-nosed approach that saw him score five rushing touchdowns in 2006. Teaming with the bruising McAnderson will be sophomore Jake Sharp, a stealthy back able to gap and slash opponents for large gains.

In the trenches, the Jayhawks will rely upon their two returning offensive tackles, senior Cesar Rodriguez and junior Anthony Collins, to stabilize the line-of-scrimmage.

The offensive line welcomes a host of newcomers prepared to form a nucleus as talented as the one that departed in 2006. Senior Cesar Rodriguez and junior Anthony Collins return from the starting group which guided Jon Cornish to a new single-season Kansas rushing record. Both tackles started all 12 games for the Jayhawks last season. Joining them will be an array of offensive linemen hopeful to crack the starting lineup.

Junior college transfers Chet Hartley and Jason Hind will look to make immediate impacts. Look for a spirited battle in the trenches among this group as they compete for a spot on the top unit.

Headlining the pack of wide receivers is junior Dexton Fields, who led the team with 45 receptions for 455 yards and five touchdowns a year ago.

Teaming with Fields on the outside will be senior Marcus Henry, who finished 2006 with 25 catches, 316 yards and three touchdowns, and junior Marcus Herford, who averaged 17.1 yards-per-reception in 2006.

Joining the trio is a group of underclassmen in Tertavian Ingram, Micah Brown and Xavier Rambo, all of whom are eager to make their mark quickly in the receiving corps. Senior Jeff Foster also returns to the squad, adding more Big 12 experience to the talented group.

Replacing a school's single-season rushing leader and an All-Big 12 performer is not an easy task, yet KU appears poised to quickly fill the void left by the departure of Jon Cornish.

Headlining the group of rushers is sophomore Jake Sharp. In his rookie campaign last season, the Salina, Kan., native appeared in 12 games for the Jayhawks, amassing 129 yards on only 21 carries, good for a 6.1 average per carry. He also caught six passes out of the backfield for 73 yards and totaled 278 all-purpose yards.

Sharp's potential and Cornish's success is due in

large part to the steady performance of senior fullback Brandon McAnderson. Providing sturdy guidance for the backs, McAnderson cleared many lanes for Cornish in his record-setting season. McAnderson also saw action carrying the ball, rushing for 122 yards and five scores on 31 carries. For his effort, McAnderson was named to the All-Big 12 Second Team by the league's head coaches. Former wideout Angus Quigley could see action here as well

Kansas showcases a pair of young signal callers who have successfully undergone the transformation from raw prospects to legitimate Division I quarterbacks. Kerry Meier returns for his second season under center. Meier put up impressive numbers in his first season for the Jayhawks, throwing for 1,193 yards and 13 touchdowns in his rookie campaign. He completed 104 passes at a 56.5 percent completion clip in eight starts. Meier also displayed a tremendous ability rushing the ball, totaling 447 yards and five touchdowns throughout the season.

Todd Reesing provides KU with an intriguing change up. Reesing presents KU's opponents with a quarterback capable of entering a game and paying immediate dividends, both with his arm and his scrambling ability. Filling in for Meier and then-senior Adam Barmann, Reesing ignited a spark for the Jayhawks against Colorado, throwing for 106 yards and two touchdowns and rushing for 90 yards and another score in the Kansas victory.

Much to the chagrin of offensive coordinators everywhere, Kansas retains a large portion of a defensive squad that ranked among the NCAA's top units a year ago. The defensive line returns several key contributors including All-Big 12 Second Team selection James McClinton, sophomore Caleb Blakesley, sophomore Jeff Wheeler, junior John Larson and junior Russell Brosen, who all saw extensive playing time in 2006.

At linebacker, the Kansas features several explosive and tenacious defenders equally adept at causing havoc in the backfield or dropping off into pass coverage. Juniors Joe Mortensen, Mike Rivera and James Holt will team with sophomores Jake Schermer, Arist Wright and Olaitan Oguntodu to form what could be the team's deepest unit.

The Jayhawk secondary is in solid hands with cornerback Aqib Talib returning for his junior season after being named All-Big 12 First Team last year. The Richardson, Texas, native, is garnering attention from around the league, as he has already been named a preseason All-American. Junior Kendrick Harper and will patrol the other side of the field, while Tang Bachevie and Darrell Stuckey will provide support for both the run and the pass from their safety positions.

Anchored by returning team captain defensive tackle James McClinton, the defensive line looks to continue its dominance as it yielded just one individual 100-yard rushing performance in the past two seasons. A 2006 All-Big 12 Honorable Mention pick, McClinton, a senior, returns for his final year coming off a highly successful junior campaign which saw him finish fourth on the team in tackles with 51, record six sacks and register 16 tackles-for-loss. He will be joined in the middle by Todd Haselhorst.

Coming off the edge for the Jayhawks will be a pair of defensive ends who experienced tremendous success in limited reps. Juniors Russell Brorsen and John Larson combined for 46 tackles, 19 tackles-for-loss and six quarterback sacks. Max Onyegbule will also push for starting time after redshirting in 2006.

A talented group of athletes comprise this year's linebacker corps, a group whose maturation and development became apparent in each subsequent week of the 2006 season. Junior middle linebacker Mike Rivera, who tallied a team-high 90 tackles -- 63 solo -- in the 2006 campaign, anchors the unit for the Jayhawks. A 2006 All-Big 12 Honorable Mention

selection, Rivera also notched eight tackles-for-loss, two sacks, five pass deflections and eight quarterback hurries. Joining Rivera on the outside is junior Joe Mortensen and the combination of sophomores James Holt and Arist Wright. Mortensen finished third on the team with 82 tackles and also registered 12 tackles-for-loss and four sacks. Holt and Wright combined to notch 56 tackles. Wright also had a dramatic interception return for a touchdown against Baylor. Jake Schermer will also join the fracas in making KU's linebackers one of the best units in the Big 12.

While the linemen and linebackers receive a good amount of attention, it is the Kansas secondary that could be the unit's most talented group. Junior Aqib Talib, an All-Big 12 First Team selection at cornerback, returns after finishing fourth in the nation and first in the Big 12 with his six interceptions last year. When teams look on the other side of the field, they shouldn't be too optimistic though. Junior college transfer Kendrick Harper won the starting job on the other side of the field and brings a load of experience to that position. The safety positions are manned by a solid two-deep of Tang Bacheyie and Patrick Resby at strong safety and Darrell Stucky and Justin Thornton at free safety. Sadiq Muhammed also adds valuable experience to the group. Thornton registered the most tackles (46) and pass break-ups (four) and also had an interception. Stuckey chipped in with 32 tackles, three pass break-ups and a fumble recovery while Muhammed added 16 tackles and an interception.

Senior place kicker Scott Webb and senior punter Kyle Tucker return to anchor the Kansas special teams units. Webb finished sixth in the Big 12 last season in field goals (13) and field goal percentage (72.2). He set a new career long with a 49-yard make in KU's victory against Kansas State. He was also eight of eight on field goal attempts between 30-39 yards and registered 35 touchbacks on his kickoffs. Tucker aims to return to the form that made him a Ray Guy semifinalist in 2005. Last year, Tucker pinned 23 of his punts inside the 20-yard line while limiting his touchbacks to only six. On returns, junior Marcus Herford looks to pick-up where he left off as the team's top kick-returner, when he amassed 757 yards on 29 returns, a 26.1 yard average, including an 88-yard return. The team will audition several candidates for punt returner as the team's top two returners from last season, Jonathan Lamb and Brian Murph, have both graduated.

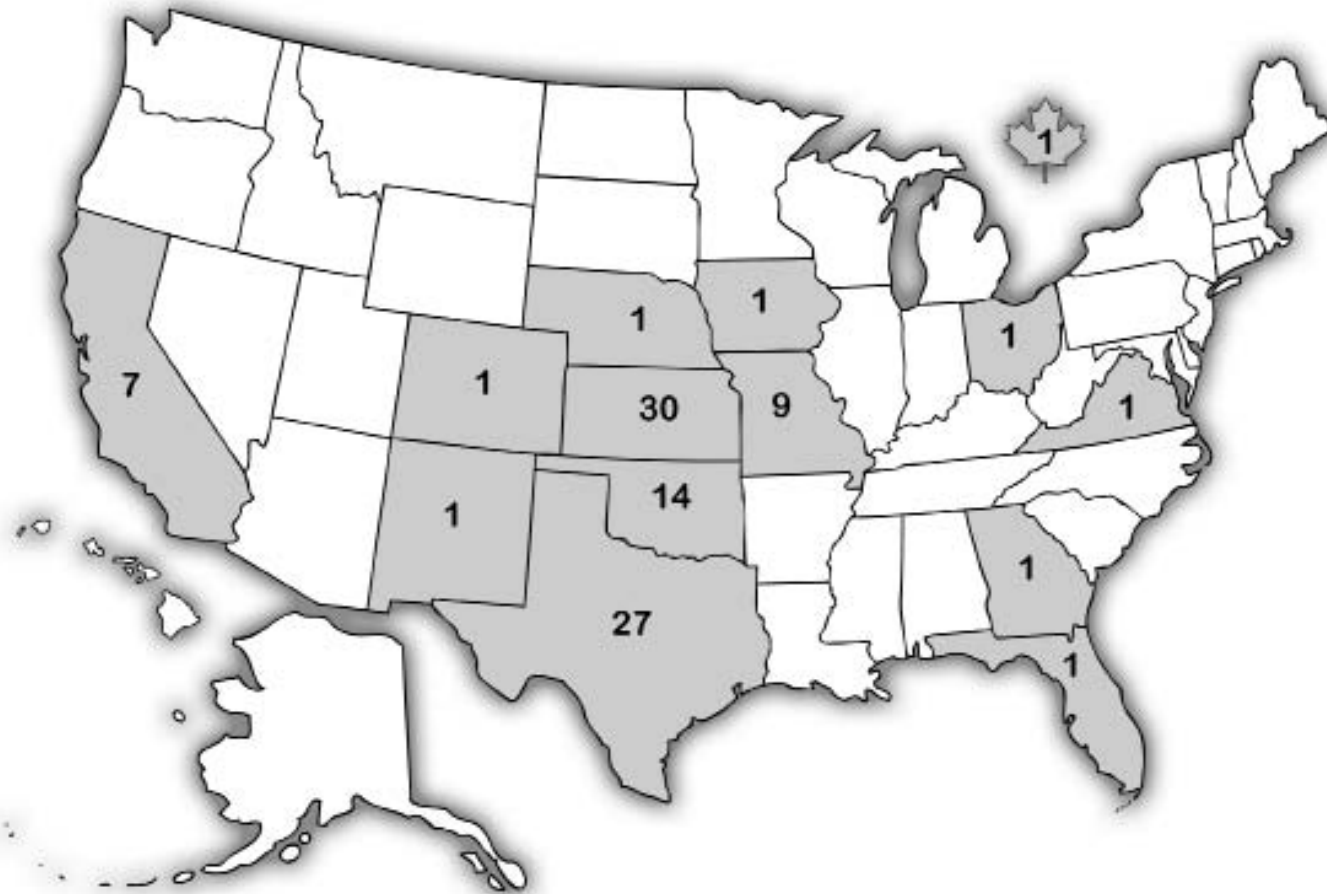
