QUICKLY -- After winning its first five games to open the season, Kansas (5-4, 1-4 Big 12) will look to end a four-game losing streak when it hosts Nebraska (6-3, 3-2 Big 12) on Saturday, Nov. 14 at 2:30 p.m... The game will be televised regionally on ABC.

- The game will be Senior Day for 15 Jayhawk seniors making their final appearance at Kivisto Field at Memorial Stadium.
- KU will be looking to stop a four-game losing streak, its longest since dropping four straight in 2006. Kansas has not lost five straight since dropping the final seven games of the 2002 campaign.
- KU is 27-5 at home in the last five seasons.
- KU is looking for its sixth win of the year, which would give the Jayhawks at least six victories for the fifth consecutive season, a streak which has only been accomplished twice in school history (1895-99 and 1902-06).

SENIOR DAY -- Saturday's game will be the final home appearance for the following seniors: LS Kayl Anderson, DT Caleb Blakesley, WR Kerry Meier, DE Maxwell Onyegbule, WR Raimond Pendleton, OL Jose Rodriguez, LB Angus Quigley, QB Todd Reesing, LB Jake Schermer, RB Jake Sharp, DE Dustin Spears, S Darrell Stuckey, S Justin Thornton, DE Jeff Wheeler, LB Arist Wright.

SENIOR NOTES -- Here are a few notes on this year's senior class:

- In the last four seasons, the group is a combined 31-16 with three regular season games remaining.
- Has posted a 21-5 record at home.
- Has been to bowl games in consecutive seasons for the first time in school history.
- Has posted KU's best two Big 12 North finishes tying for first in 2007 and placing third in 2008.
- Has five players who have started at least 20 games (S Darrell Stuckey 39, QB Todd Reesing 35, WR Kerry Meier 35, DT Caleb Blakesley 29, S Justin Thornton 27).

DID YOU KNOW? -- KU QB Todd Reesing is averaging throwing just one interception for every 45 passes attempted this season for the third-best mark among Big 12 quarterbacks with 100 completions (Jerrod Johnson, Texas A&M, is one for every 87 attempts and Baylor's Nick Florence is second with one for every 47 attempts).

DID YOU KNOW? -- In conference games only KU QB Todd Reesing leads the Big 12 in both passing yards per game (297) and total offense per game (298).

Head Coach Mark Mangino

Mark Mangino (Youngstown State, 1987) is in his eighth season as the head coach at Kansas. Mangino has continually improved the Kansas program, which had not posted a winning record in any of the six seasons before his arrival. Prior to coming to Kansas, Mangino helped in the turnaround of the Kansas State football program in the 1990s before becoming an assistant at Oklahoma. He also coached at New Castle (Pa.) High School, Youngstown State, Geneva College, and Ellwood City (Pa.) High School.

MANGINO HIGHLIGHTS

- Consensus National Coach of the Year (2007).
- Only coach in NCAA to earn both the national coach of the year and the national assistant coach of the year honors (Broyles Award in 2000).
- Has been a part of 13 bowl games in his last 16 years of coaching.
- Is the first Kansas coach to have a winning record since Jack Mitchell (44-42-5) in 1966 (KU had seven full-time coaches in between).
- Was the offensive coordinator for the national champion Oklahoma Sooners in 2000.

KANSAS ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN MANGINO ERA

- Four bowl games in a six-year span (2003-present). That represents one-third of KU's bowl appearances in just six years (eight bowl games in the previous 56 years since KU's first bowl game in 1948).
- Bowl games in consecutive years (2007 and 2008) for the first time in school history.
- Three consecutive bowl victories for the first time in school history.
- Eight wins in consecutive seasons (2007 and 2008) for the first time since 1908 and 1909.
- Twenty wins in a two-year period, the most in consecutive years in school history (won 18 games combined in 2006-07 and 1904-05).
- Six wins in four-straight seasons (2005-08) for the first time since 1903-06.
- Combined 33-17 record from 2005-08 for the most wins in a four-year period in school history.
- Set new home attendance average records in each of the last four seasons.
- KU returned to the national polls in 2007, the Jayhawks' first ranking since 1996.
- KU was ranked in a school-record 19 consecutive Associated Press polls from 2007 through half of 2008.
- Reached No. 2 in the polls after winning first 11 games in 2007.

KANSAS HONORS IN MANGINO ERA

- KU has produced 72 All-Big 12 selections.
- KU has produced 45 Academic All-Big 12 First Team selections.
- Four Jayhawks were drafted after the 2007 season, including first-round selection Aqib Talib.
- In 2007 and 2008 KU had a combined three All-Americans and 24 All-Big 12 selections.
- A number of Jayhawks have made national award lists, including two finalists in Aqib Talib (Nagurski Award) and Anthony Collins (Outland Trophy) in 2007.

ANOTHER TOUGH SCHEDULE -- Based on the opponents' record, Kansas had the nation's seventh-most difficult schedule in 2008 as Jayhawk opponents were a combined 79-53 for a 59.8 winning percentage when not playing KU. This year KU's 11 FBS opponents were a combined 78-54 last season for a winning percentage of 59.1 percent when not playing the Jayhawks.

20-6 LAST TWO YEARS -- Kansas posted a combined 20-6 record in 2007 and 2008. Five of those six losses were to ranked teams, including three teams that were ranked fourth in the nation at game times. The only non-ranked team the Jayhawks lost to in the previous two seasons was at Nebraska in 2008. The Huskers would finish the year 9-4 after defeating Clemson in the Gator Bowl.

EXPLOSIVE OFFENSE -- In the last two years the Kansas offense has ranked among the best in the country. The 2007 team set school records in total offense, passing and scoring. Last year's team set a new record in passing offense.

FORCING TURNOVERS -- In the last two years the Kansas defense forced a combined 60 turnovers (35 in 2007 and 25 in 2008). That total was the ninth best in the nation in that span.

PRESEASON POLLS -- For the second year in a row, and seventh time overall, Kansas was ranked in the Associated Press AP Top 25 poll at the start of the 2009 season. This year the Jayhawks were listed No. 25. In 2007 KU was ranked 14th. KU's other preseason AP Top 25 listings include 1952 (17th), 1961 (8th), 1968 (12th), 1976 (19th), and 1996 (25th).

KU VS. AP TOP 25 -- Kansas has won five of its 18 games against ranked teams in the Mark Mangino era. Prior to his arrival KU had posted five wins in its previous 60 games against ranked teams.

KU CONFERENCE FINISHES -- Kansas tied for the Big 12 Conference North Division title in 2007 with a 7-1 conference record and placed third in 2008 with a 4-4 league mark. Prior to the last two seasons, KU had not finished higher than fourth in the North Division in the first 11 years of the conference.

TV EXPOSURE -- In 2007 and 2008 19 of 26 Kansas football games were televised nationally, including 11 straight in 2008. For the first time in history, all four KU non-conference games were broadcast in 2009 and it is expected that all 12 regular season games will be televised for the first time as well.

BOWL APPEARANCES (AND WINS) -- Kansas has played in four bowl games in the first seven years of the Mark Mangino era. The Jayhawks had played in eight bowl games in the previous 55 seasons. Under Mangino KU appeared in consecutive bowls for the first time in history. KU has also won each of its last three bowl appearances, a first in Kansas football history.

NEW STUFF -- Prior to the start of the 2008 season a football facility was built adjacent to Memorial Stadium. In 2009 a new playing surface was added to the stadium as FieldTurf was laid down this past summer.

RED JERSEYS -- Kansas is 7-1 (lost to Texas Tech last year) when wearing red jerseys in the Mark Mangino era, including 1-0 this year (beat Southern Miss.). Prior to the Mangino era, KU last wore red jerseys in the 1947 Orange Bowl.

This Week's Game

KU-NU SERIES -- Nebraska leads the all-time series by an 89-23-3 count, including a 46-8-1 advantage in games played in Lawrence. Kansas has won the last two meetings in Lawrence, posting a 75-39 victory in 2007 and a 40-15 win in 2005. The 2005 victory snapped a 36-game losing streak to the Huskers, which began in 1969. Since that streak, the teams have split the last four games with the home team winning each time, including a 39-32 overtime victory by the Huskers in 2006 and last year's 45-35 NU win in Lincoln.

KU-NU IS NATION'S LONGEST UNINTERRUPTED SERIES -- The Kansas-Nebraska series will be played for the 104th consecutive year. That marks the nation's longest uninterrupted series. Minnesota and Wisconsin will be meeting for the 103rd time this year. KU and NU first met in 1892 and actually played 12 straight years until not playing each other in 1904 or 1905. Since resuming the series in 1906 the teams have met every season.

SERIES IS THIRD-MOST PLAYED AS WELL -- The 115 prior meetings between the Jayhawks and Huskers rank as the third-most played rivalry in FBS history behind 118 games between Minnesota and Wisconsin and 117 games between Kansas and Missouri.

KU-NU LAST YEAR -- Nebraska outscored Kansas 31-21 in the second half en route to a 45-35 victory on a cold (35 degrees with 21 mile per hour winds) in Lincoln in 2008. The teams were tied at 14 at halftime behind Todd Reesing touchdown passes to Kerry Meier and Dezmon Briscoe. KU led 21-17 with 4:32 left in the third quarter before NU's Roy Helu, Jr., scored twice. KU fought back with a Jake Sharp touchdown with 9:55 left in the game to come within 31-28 before the Huskers iced the game with two straight touchdowns. Reesing became the Kansas all-time passing yardage leader on his scoring toss to Meier. He finished the day 15 of 30 for 304 yards and three touchdowns, while Briscoe caught six passes for 176 yards and Sharp rushed 22 times for 90 yards. Darrell Stuckey recorded a team-high 15 tackles. NU produced 495 yards of offense to 422 by Kansas as the Huskers controlled the ball for 34:46.

KU-NU LAST TIME IN LAWRENCE -- Todd Reesing threw a school-record six touchdown passes and had 354 yards through the air, while Brandon McAnderson ran for 119 yards and a school-record tying four touchdowns as then No. 8 Kansas defeated Nebraska 76-39 in Lawrence on Nov. 3, 2007. After a three and out on its first possession, the Jayhawks scored on 10 of their next 11 possessions (exception was a one-play kneel down to end the first half). KU's 76 points were the third-most in team history, as well as the most allowed by Nebraska in its history. The Jayhawks ran 90 plays en route to 572 yards of total offense. Reesing set school records for touchdown passes in a game (six) and in a single-season (23). Four of his TD passes came in the first half to four different receivers. KU forced four straight Nebraska turnovers in the second half, while forcing five on the day.

KU-NU SERIES NOTABLE -- KU has two players from the state of Nebraska in starting TE Tim Biere (Omaha/Westside HS) and true freshman DE Tyrone Sellers (McCook)... NU DC/DL Coach Carl Pelini was a restricted earnings coach at Kansas State when KU Head Coach Mark Mangino was an assistant with the Wildcats... NU RB Coach Tim Beck was an assistant at KSU with Mangino and was an assistant at Kansas from 2005-07... NU WR Coach Ted Gilmore was born in Wichita, Kan. and was a tight ends coach at KU in 1999. Gilmore was a WR coach at Wyoming when KU CB Coach Je'Ney Jackson was a DB for the Cowboys... NU DE Coach John Papuchis was a defensive GA at KU from 2001-03... NU players from the state of Kansas include LB Joseph Camarata (Overland Park/Rockhurst HS), LB Blake Lawrence (Shawnee Mission/West HS) and TE Kyler Reed (Shawnee/St. Thomas Aquinas).

THINGS TO LOOK FOR AGAINST NEBRASKA:

- WR Kerry Meier (2,082) needs 80 receiving yards to pass Mark Simmons (2,161) for third on the KU career receiving yardage list.
- Meier (16) needs one touchdown catch to tie Willie Vaughn and Bruce Adams (17 each) for second on the KU career list. Dezmon Briscoe is first at 28.
- Meier has caught at least two passes in 30 consecutive games.
- WR Dezmon Briscoe (2,820) needs just three receiving yards to pass Jordy Nelson of Kansas State (2,822) for 10th on the Big 12 career receiving yardage list.
- Meier (197) and Briscoe (196) are just shy of 200 receptions for the their career. Jordy Nelson of Kansas State is 10th on the Big 12 career list with 206.
- Briscoe has caught at least four passes in 12 straight games and at least two in 27 in a row.

Kansas Team Notes

LAST TIME OUT -- Kansas dropped its fourth straight game after starting the season 5-0 as the Jayhawks lost 17-10 at Kansas State last Saturday. The loss also snapped KU's three-game winning streak against the Wildcats.

- QB Todd Reesing became the fifth player in Big 12 history to throw for 10,000 yards in a career.
- Reesing hit WR Dezmon Briscoe for a 17-yard touchdown in the second quarter. The two have combined for 28 career touchdown passes, the most of any active duo in the NCAA.
- WR Kerry Meier became the fourth Jayhawk to record 2,000 career receiving yards.
- KU's 301 yards were a season low and the fewest in the last 40 games.
- KU had at least three turnovers for the third straight game and did not force a turnover.
- KU limited KSU to just 17 points, the fewest by the opponent in the last six games.

KU'S BIG 12 STAT NOTABLE -- QB Todd Reesing is one of two players in the Big 12 averaging better than 300 total yards per game (A&M's Jerrod Johnson) and his 21 touchdowns responsible for are second in the league... Reesing's four 300-yard passing games are tied for second in the Big 12 behind five by Taylor Potts of Texas Tech... WR Dezmon Briscoe's five 100-yard receiving games are tied for first in the Big 12 with Dana Alexander of Missouri and Jordan Shipley of Texas... WR Kerry Meier (9.2) and Briscoe (8.6) rank first and second in the Big 12 in receptions per game in league play only... P Alonso Rojas owns a 42.8 punting average in conference games, the second-best mark in league play behind only Derek Epperson of Baylor.

COSTLY TURNOVERS -- Kansas committed five turnovers in the first five games combined, but had 12 miscues in the last four games combined. Those last 12 turnovers have led directly to nine opponent touchdowns. In the first five games, KU's five turnovers only led to one opponent score.

OPPONENTS GIVEN SHORT FIELD -- The opponents have started 10 drives on the KU side of the 50-yard line in the last four games and the result has been seven touchdowns on those 10 occasions. Colorado took possession on the KU three and one yard lines, Oklahoma started a drive on the KU 46, while Texas Tech scored touchdowns on drives of six, 23 and 19 yards. Last week at Kansas State, the Wildcats ended a drive on downs, missed a field goal and scored a touchdown on its three starts on the KU side of the field. In addition the opponents' defense has scored directly off two KU turnovers in that time with an interception return by Oklahoma and a fumble return by Texas Tech for touchdowns.

GETTING THE QUARTERBACK -- Kansas has recorded 25 sacks through nine games after registering just 29 sacks in 13 games last season. KU's 2.78 sacks per game are tied for 16th in the NCAA. KU has recorded at least five sacks in three different games with six at UTEP and five vs. Duke and five at Texas Tech. Two weeks ago at Texas Tech, KU's five sacks all came in the first half and were by five different players. Last week at Kansas State, Justin Thornton recorded his first career sack.

OFFENSIVE NOTES -- KU had three drives with at least 10 plays at Kansas State, but they resulted in an interception, missed field goal and a made field goal... KU's previously high scoring offense (ranked no. 5 in the NCAA before the Oklahoma game) has failed to reach 30 points in three straight games for the first time since 2005... KU has averaged just 288 total yards in the last three games after averaging 503 in the first six games... KU's 303 passing yards per game are just behind the school record of 305.6 set last season... In the last 35 games, KU has produced 400 yards of total offense 26 times, 500 yards in 12 games and one 600-yard game. In that time frame KU has also scored at least 30 points 25 times, 40 points 15 times, 50 points six times and 70 points once.

DEFENSIVE NOTES -- KU held KSU to just three of 11 on third-down conversions last Saturday... KU held KSU to 332 yards, the fourth-best yardage defense by KU this season... KU did not force a turnover against KSU for the second time this season (did not get a turnover vs. Iowa State)... KU had held opponents to an average of just 99 rushing yards per game before KSU ran for 266 last Saturday, the most given up on the ground by the Jayhawks since Texas ran for 336 in 2005.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES -- KU had better average field position than its opponent in each of the first four games, but in just one of the last five contests.

ROJAS PUNTING WELL -- Kansas junior Alonso Rojas celebrated being named to the Ray Guy Award Watch List two weeks ago with the best punting day of his Jayhawk career at Texas Tech. Rojas averaged 47.9 yards on eight punts with a long of 72 yards. On the six punts from his side of the 50-yard line he averaged 53.8 yards. His punts were 56, 47, 48, 52, 48, 30, 30 and 72 yards. He placed two punts inside the 20-yard line. Last week at Kansas State, Rojas averaged 45.0 yards per punt.

McDOUGALD CATCHING BALL ON BOTH SIDES -- Two weeks ago against Texas Tech freshman WR Bradley McDougald became the first Jayhawk to record a reception and an interception in the same game since Aqib Talib accomplished the feat against Kansas State in 2007. McDougald, who has started five games on offense and has 28 receptions, has seen time on the defensive side of the ball in the last four games as well. In addition, McDougald has returned 16 kickoffs for a 19.9 average this year, including five for 76 against Texas Tech. He has been KU's punt returner the last two games as well.

YOUTHFUL DEFENSE -- In the last four games Kansas has started four freshmen on defense, including DT John Williams (four season starts), LB Huldson Tharp (five starts), CB D.J. Beshears (three starts) and FS Lubbock Smith (four starts). In addition freshman WR Bradley McDougald saw time on defense in the last four games and recorded three tackles and had an interception against Texas Tech.

FIRST-TIME STARTERS -- This season 16 different Jayhawks have made their first collegiate starts, including four true freshmen in RB Toben Oporum, WR Bradley McDougald, LB Huldson Tharp and cornerback D.J. Beshears. Redshirt freshmen who have started include OT Tanner Hawkinson, DT John Williams, FS Lubbock Smith and last week at Kansas State, OG Trevor Marrongelli. Other first-time starters this year include OG Brad Thorson, OG Sal Capra, DE Maxwell Onyegbule, DT Patrick Dorsey, LB Drew Dudley, LB Justin Springer, CB Anthony Davis and DB Ryan Murphy.

FRESHMEN EXPERIENCE -- Freshmen who have played this season include true freshmen D.J. Beshears, WR Bradley McDougald, RB Toben Oporum and LB Huldson Tharp and redshirt freshmen CB Greg Brown, OT Tanner Hawkinson, OL Trevor Marrongelli, QB Kale Pick, S Lubbock Smith, DT John Williams, and DT Duane Zlatnik.

50,000-PLUS -- Kansas has drawn crowds of 50,000-plus for four of five home games this season (48,203 in the cold vs. Iowa State), as well as in 11 of its last 14 home games. The Jayhawks set season attendance average records in four straight years entering the 2009 campaign. This year KU is averaging 50,392, a figure which is on pace for the second-best mark in school history behind last year's 50,907 (see top attendance marks on page four of this release).

TODD REESING - Has thrown at least one touchdown pass in 33 of his 35 career starts... Has thrown one or fewer interceptions in 32 of 38 career games... In two games against Nebraska he is a combined 45 of 71 (63 percent) for 658 yards and nine touchdowns... Threw for 354 yards and six touchdowns in 2007 and 304 yards and three scores last year.

KALE PICK - Has seen limited time as a backup quarterback... Was in for a few plays as a running back at Kansas State on Saturday.

KERRY MEIER - Started eight games at QB as a freshman in 2006... Career passing numbers are 134 of 219 (61.2 percent) for 1,612 yards and 17 touchdowns... In the last two years he is 29 of 33 for 363 yards and four touchdowns... This season he is two of three for 70 yards.

RUNNING BACKS

JAKE SHARP - Rushed for 100 yards in each of the first two games this year before suffering an injury... Has rushed for 141 yards in the last five games he has played in combined... Ran for 90 yards and one touchdown against Nebraska last year and 27 yards and another score in 2007.

TOBEN OPURUM - In the six games he has rushed at least eight times he has averaged 79.5 yards and in the three games he has fewer than eight carries has averaged 7.0 yards... Has rushed for at least one touchdown in seven of nine games... Against Southern Mississippi he became the first KU freshman since 2002 to rush for 100 yards in a game (106)... Is bidding to become just the fourth freshman in KU history to lead the team in rushing in a season. (see chart on page seven).

WIDE RECEIVERS

KERRY MEIER - Caught six touchdown passes in a four-game stretch before not catching one in the last three games... Coming off an eight-catch, 92-yard game at Kansas State... Has four 100-yard games this season... Has caught at least three passes in 22 straight games and at least one in 32 consecutive... Had four catches for 42 yards and one touchdown vs. Nebraska in 2007 and three for 52 and another score last year.

DEZMON BRISCOE - Has caught at least seven passes in five straight games... Has at least four receptions in 12 consecutive games and at least two catches in 27 in a row... In 2007 he had five catches for 52 yards and three touchdowns against Nebraska and then last year had six for 176 and another touchdown.

BRADLEY McDUGALD - Had four catches for 12 yards at Kansas State Saturday, his most catches in the last five games... Had 18 receptions for 180 yards in the first four games of the season and then six total catches in the four games before KSU... Started seeing some time on defense and recorded an interception against Texas Tech... In addition to returning kickoffs he is also returning punts.

JOHNATHAN WILSON - Has recorded at least two receptions in every game this season, including three for 23 at Kansas State Saturday... Has caught at least two passes in 14 consecutive games... Had three catches for 51 yards at Nebraska last season.

TIGHT ENDS

TIM BIERE - From Omaha... Has at least one catch in five of the seven games he has played in, including one for 13 at Kansas State Saturday.

OFFENSIVE LINE

LT TANNER HAWKINSON -- Started in first collegiate game against Northern Colorado this year... Redshirt freshman who came to KU as a TE and was switched to DE midway through 2008... Was moved to OT this past spring.

LG SAL CAPRA - Started the first eight games at RG before moving to LG at Kansas State last Saturday... Was a backup in 2007 and 2008... Was the top backup at guard in 2008 and saw plenty of action... Was the KU Offensive Player of the Week for his efforts at UTEP this year.

JOHN WILLIAMS - Began the season on the offensive line and saw limited action as a backup early in the year before starting on the defensive line at Colorado (first game on defense)... Did not record a tackle against Colorado, but has had at least one in each of the last three games.

CALEB BLAKESLEY - Returned to the starting lineup at Kansas State Saturday and responded with four tackles to tie for the second most in his career... Did not play two games ago against Texas Tech and had just seven tackles on the season before last week... Has started 29 games in his career.

RICHARD JOHNSON - Had a season-high three tackles at Texas Tech two games ago... Had made at least two stops in five straight games before KSU... Recovered a fumble against Colorado.

LINEBACKERS

HULDON THARP - True freshman has started five straight games... Had nine stops at KSU on Saturday... Has averaged 7.3 tackles in the last three games... Season best was 10 tackles in third game vs. Duke.

ARIST WRIGHT - Has started two straight games and seven of nine this year... Had 11 tackles in Big 12 opener against Iowa State, but just 12 combined in the last four games... Two games ago he recovered a fumble, broke up two passes and had two tackles against Texas Tech... Had just one tackle at KSU... Entered the year as the only KU linebacker with any career starts (six).

DREW DUDLEY - Started the first seven games of the year before coming off the bench the last two contests... Twice has had at least 10 tackles with 17 at Colorado and 10 vs. Southern Mississippi... Made six tackles at KSU Saturday... Leads team with 63 tackles this year, including eight tackles for loss and three sacks... Was named a Big 12 Community of Champions honoree two weeks ago and an Academic All-District First Team selection last week.

JUSTIN SPRINGER - Had four tackles at Kansas State Saturday for his second-most stops this season... Had nine tackles in last home game against Oklahoma.

SECONDARY

Cornerbacks

CHRIS HARRIS - Leads team with seven PBUs and ranks third with 58 tackles... Has recorded at least four tackles in every game this season... Had a PBU in five straight games before the KSU game when he didn't have any... Had 15 tackles against Southern Miss. earlier this year.

D.J. BESHEARS - A true freshman, who had his redshirt taken off at Colorado... Played extensively against Colorado and made five tackles in first collegiate game... Has started the last three games and responded with seven tackles vs. Oklahoma, four tackles and a PBU at Texas Tech and one tackle at Kansas State.

DAYMOND PATTERSON - Had started 11 straight games before coming off the bench in two games and not playing at all at KSU Saturday... Broke up three passes against Southern Mississippi and had an interception against Duke... Last year, as a true freshman, was one of three players nationally to start on offense and defense (he also returned punts).

Safeties

DARRELL STUCKEY - Last year vs. Nebraska he had a career-high 15 tackles... His 62 stops this year are second on the team... Had six tackles at KSU on Saturday... Has three 10-plus tackle games this year... Was KU's special teams player of the week vs. KSU.

LUBBOCK SMITH - A redshirt freshman, who has started the last four games... Recorded eight tackles in first start at Colorado and then added seven against Oklahoma, had four tackles and a PBU at Texas Tech and then a career-high nine tackles at Kansas State Saturday.

JUSTIN THORNTON - Recorded his first career sack and had a PBU at KSU Saturday... Has three PBU's in the last two games combined... Made 14 tackles vs. Iowa State in Big 12 opener.

RYAN MURPHY - Started two of the last five games at nickel back... Lawrence, Kan. product leads the team with two interceptions (Southern Miss. and Oklahoma).

LAWRENCE, Kan. – To get the Jayhawks' 2009 season off on the right foot, senior quarterback Todd Reesing took matters into his own hands – and feet. Before a record crowd of 52,530, Reesing rushed for KU's first two scores and threw a pair of second quarter touchdown passes to give the 25th-ranked Jayhawks a 49-3 triumph over visiting Northern Colorado in the season-opener at Kivisto Field at Memorial Stadium Saturday evening. The senior quarterback accounted for 287 of KU's 543 yards in the game, carrying the ball 13 times for 79 yards and throwing for 208. On the Jayhawks' first play from scrimmage, Reesing hit fellow senior Kerry Meier on a slant pattern for 30 yards, which set the tone for the KU offense. Reesing capped the drive with a one-yard scamper around the left end in which he juked his way through a group of would-be tacklers to give KU a 7-0 lead. Reesing capped another long drive with a 13-yard run early in the second quarter and then threw touchdown passes to Jake Sharp on a shovel pass and Tertavian Ingram to give Kansas a 28-0 lead heading into the halftime break. Reesing led Kansas on one more scoring drive, a seven-play, 64-yard march, before giving way to backup quarterback Kale Pick early in the fourth quarter. Kansas ran for 328 yards, compared to just 74 on the ground for Northern Colorado. As impressive as the Jayhawk offense was, the defense might have been better. Kansas held the Bears to 246 yards of total offense, including 95 in the first half. Northern Colorado penetrated the Jayhawk 20-yard line just twice in the contest, with both drives ending with field goal tries.

EL PASO, Texas – Senior DE Maxwell Onyegbule and the Jayhawk defense set the tone early as Kansas rolled past UTEP 34-7. In the first half alone, Onyegbule had two sacks and four total tackles for loss to lead a defense that finished the half with five sacks, an interception and a pair of quarterback hurries. UTEP was forced to punt on six of its seven possessions of the period and mustered just three first downs. With the defense and special teams setting the tone, it gave the offense the breathing room it needed to get in rhythm. As it turned out, it was just what the offense needed after putting just three points on the board for the first quarter and a half. Kansas opened the scoring with a 21-yard field goal from junior PK Jacob Branstetter. After forcing UTEP to punt on its opening possession, the Jayhawks drove the ball 75 yards on their opening drive with the key play coming on a trick play where senior WR Kerry Meier hit streaking junior WR Dezmon Briscoe for 56 yards through the air. Kansas punted on its next two possessions then came to life, scoring on its next three. Kansas racked up 250 yards of total offense in the first half compared to just 49 for UTEP. Reesing went 17-of-26 through the air for 134 yards and a TD. UTEP was able to get on the board at the 12:39 mark of the fourth quarter on a 75-yard touchdown pass from Trevor Vittatoo to Donavon Kemp. The TD wiped away KU's attempt at a shutout, but the defense still had to walk away happy. For the game, the defense held UTEP to just 208 yards and seven first downs. Seven players recorded tackles for losses led by Onyegbule with five. Add to that line six quarterback hurries, three passes broken up and an interception, and it was a good night in El Paso. Reesing finished 25-of-41 for 260 yards, one touchdown and one interception. Kansas racked up 576 total yards and outdid the Miners 23-7 on first downs.

LAWRENCE, Kan. – Kansas QB Todd Reesing threw for 338 yards and three touchdowns and also collected 51 yards on the ground to lead Kansas to a 44-16 win over Duke. Reesing completed 28-of-41 passes against the Blue Devils, including touchdowns to three different receivers. His 338 yards in the air marked his seventh-straight game with 200 or more passing yards and his 14th career 300-yard passing game. Duke opened the game with a two-play 87-yard scoring drive capped by a 21-yard touchdown run by QB Thaddeus Lewis. Kansas answered right back with a 14-yard touchdown reception by WR Dezmon Briscoe just two and half minutes later to knot the score at 7-7 midway through the first quarter. The two teams traded punts on the next few possessions before Reesing connected with RB Jake Sharp for a six-yard TD with just under five minutes remaining in the first half. Reesing collected his third TD pass of the first half as he hit WR Kerry Meier in the end zone for a six-yard score with just over a minute to play before the break. The Jayhawk defense got the scoring started in the second half of play as DE Maxwell Onyegbule picked off a Lewis pass on the opening possession of the third quarter. Onyegbule returned the interception for a 48-yard touchdown pushing the Kansas lead to 27-7. Briscoe finished the game with 117 yards receiving, his sixth-straight 100-yard receiving game. S Darrell Stuckey led the Jayhawk defense with a season-high 11 tackles. LB Huldon Tharp recorded a career-high 10 tackles, while LB Drew Dudley finished with a career-best eight tackles. KU finished with five sacks on the afternoon.

The Jayhawks took advantage of the kick return, and Reesing found Meier uncovered for a 12-yard touchdown, his second of the game, to make the score 35-28. The KU defense then held USM to 27 yards in the fourth quarter as USM threw an interception, punted twice and had a drive end on downs to end the game.

Reesing's main two targets for the afternoon were Meier, with his record-setting 16 receptions and junior WR Dezmon Briscoe, who had 12 catches for 186 yards and two touchdowns. Meier and Briscoe ended the day as KU's career receptions leaders with Meier first at 167 and Briscoe at 165. For Reesing, his 442 yards were second in school history. Despite the offensive fire power displayed by the Jayhawks, the team needed a fourth-down stop at its own 31-yard line to solidify the win. Trailing by five with 2:36 remaining in the game, ISU regained possession on its own 34-yard line and marched to the KU 31 before the Jayhawks' defense held fast to produce a turnover on downs. KU CB Chris Harris made a huge tackle of Iowa State receiver Jake Williams on second-and-10 and then broke up the third-down pass, resulting in a fourth-and-nine attempt for the Cyclones. On fourth down, pressure forced ISU quarterback Austen Arnaud's pass to sail incomplete. KU scored what proved to be the winning touchdown when Reesing hit Meier in the end zone with a six-yard touchdown pass, giving Kansas a 41-30 with 8:42 remaining on the game clock. Reesing went 5-for-6 for 61 yards on the drive, while Meier caught three passes and tallied his fifth touchdown of the season.

BOULDER, Colo. – Kansas erased a 21-point deficit, but couldn't manage to come up with a victory as the Jayhawks fell at Colorado 34-30. Kansas trailed 24-3 late in the second quarter before fighting back to take a 30-27 lead with 13:02 remaining. Colorado responded with the go-ahead touchdown at the 8:36 mark to lead 34-30. Kansas then had two potential go-ahead touchdown drives stopped at the Colorado six and 19-yard lines to end the game. QB Todd Reesing threw for 401 yards and two touchdowns, while WR Dezmon Briscoe pulled in eight balls for 154 yards and one score and WR Kerry Meier had 11 receptions for 103 yards and another touchdown. Two rare Kansas turnovers gave Colorado the ball at the three and one-yard lines and the Buffaloes took advantage with touchdowns. On the day Kansas registered 431 passing yards, but had minus-eight rushing yards due to five Colorado sacks for 50 yards. KU played six players on defense for the first time on the season. No. 25 OKLAHOMA 35, No. 24 KANSAS 13

LAWRENCE, Kan. – Defensively Kansas held Oklahoma to nearly 100 yards less than its season average and offensively put up 80 yards more than the Sooners had been allowing, but three turnovers led to 14 first-half points for OU as the No. 25 Sooners posted a 35-13 win at No. 24 Kansas. Oklahoma held a 7-0 lead after the first quarter. Kansas drove to the Oklahoma 10-yard line early in the second quarter, but threw an interception which was returned 85 yards for a Sooner score. Prior to the end of the half, KU kicked two field goals, including a career-long 57-yarder by Jacob Branstetter at the end of the half as OU led 14-6 at the break. At halftime KU had out-gained Oklahoma 171 to 110 yards and controlled the ball for 19:19 to OU's 10:41. Oklahoma scored touchdowns on each of its first two second-half possessions and tacked on another score early in the fourth to take control of the game. KU QB Todd Reesing had his NCAA best active streak of throwing a touchdown pass stopped at 24 games. He threw 224 yards with three interceptions as KU's total offense of 305 yards was its lowest output in its last 38 games. Defensively Ryan Murphy came up with his second interception of the season, while Justin Springer recorded a career-high nine tackles and a trio of freshmen - D.J. Beshears, Lubbock Smith and Huldon Tharp - all had seven stops.

LUBBOCK, Texas – Four turnovers resulting in 28 Texas Tech points spoiled any chance of Kansas picking up its sixth win as the Jayhawks fell to the Red Raiders 42-21. Despite the scoreboard suggesting otherwise, the defense did well, holding TTU to its second lowest total yards of the season, forcing three turnovers, breaking up seven passes and sacking the quarterback five times. Jake Laptad, Chris Harris, Darrell Stuckey, Maxwell Onyegbule and Jeff Wheeler all posted sacks. WR Bradley McDougald became the first player since Aqib Talib in 2002 to record a catch on offense and an interception on defense in the same game. MANHATTAN, Kan. – Despite a combined 168 yards receiving for KU senior Kerry Meier and junior Dezmon Briscoe, Kansas fell to Sunflower Showdown rival Kansas State 17-10. Kansas quarterback Todd Reesing racked up 266 yards, including 241 through the air, but committed three costly turnovers. Trailing 7-3 late in the first half, the Wildcats recovered a fumble by Reesing at the Jayhawk 43 yard line regained the when Grant Gregory hit Lamark Brown with 20 seconds remaining in the half. Brown made three catches on the drive, including a 31-yard grab for a touchdown. After surrendering a touchdown on its first defensive stand of the second half, KU put together two drives in the second half. However, the Jayhawks only managed a 46-yard field goal by Jacob Branstetter with 5:20 remaining in the fourth quarter. K-State ran out the final five minutes to clinch the win. Kansas threatened early in the game as senior Darrell Stuckey returned the opening kickoff 67 yards to the Kansas State 30 yard line. However, the Jayhawks came up empty as Branstetter missed a 30-yard field goal wide to the right. After K-State took a 3-0 lead early in the second quarter, the Jayhawks responded with the first touchdown of the afternoon as Reesing found Briscoe with a quick screen from the Wildcat 17-yard line. The 10 points scored by the Kansas offense was a season low. Reesing completed 27-of-41 passes for 241 yards and a touchdown, while Meier led the receiving corps with eight catches for 92 yards. Senior running back Jake Sharp gained 35 yards on 11 carries, while Reesing ran eight times for 25 yards. Kansas freshmen Huldon Tharp and Lubbock Smith led the defense with nine tackles a piece, while Darrell Stuckey and Drew Dudley chipped in six.
