**UK OPENS SEC SCHEDULE WITH NO. 20/19 FLORIDA AT HOME**

Kentucky will begin the 2013 Southeastern Conference campaign with a night game against No. 20/19 Florida in Commonwealth Stadium on Saturday. Kentucky will face its second-straight ranked opponent as UK's next three opponents – including Florida – are all currently ranked inside the AP top 25.

Coming off a bye week, the Wildcats will look to bounce back from a 27-13 loss to top-10 ranked Louisville the last time out. Florida is coming off a 31-17 home victory over Tennessee last Saturday.

The Wildcats have embraced a youth movement in head coach Mark Stoops' first season. Multiple newcomer players have seen action in the early part of the 2013 season.

Kentucky's leading rusher in 2013 is Jojo Kemp, as the true freshman has run for 167 yards and is averaging 9.3 yards per attempt. The Wildcats' top-three receivers this season are all newcomers to the team as well, led by transfer junior Javess Blue, who has 15 catches for 197 yards this season.

Senior linebacker Avery Williamson leads the SEC with 35 tackles as he is averaging 11.7 tackles per game this season. Junior transfer defensive end Za'Darius Smith ranks second in the conference with 4.5 sacks so far in 2013 with a league-high average of 1.5 per game.

**QUICK NOTES**

- Kentucky is in its first season under head coach Mark Stoops, who was hired on Nov. 27, 2012 as the 37th head coach in school history. Since arriving, Stoops has reenergized the UK fan base and made a huge impression on the recruiting trail.
- Saturday's game is the SEC opener for Kentucky after three non-conference games to start the season. This is the fifth-straight season that Kentucky has opened SEC play against the Gators.
- Kentucky's offense ranks high in the SEC in several categories, including tied for fourth in total offense with 490.0 yards per game. UK's pass attack ranks fourth in the conference with 276.7 yards per game, while Kentucky is third in the conference in converting fourth downs (4-of-5; 80%).
- The Wildcat defense is also ranked high in several statistical categories, sitting third in the SEC in pass defense and third in 1st downs against. UK's defense has had success on third down, sitting second in the SEC by allowing teams just nine third-down conversions this season in 39 attempts. UK ranks first in the SEC in redzone defense only allowing opponents to score 69.2 percent of the time they enter the redzone.
- Junior defensive end Za'Darius Smith ranks high nationally in several statistical categories. Smith sits first in the SEC and third in the nation with 1.5 sacks per game, while he also ranks second in the SEC and 22nd in the nation in tackles for loss.
- Senior linebacker Avery Williamson is first in the SEC and sixth nationally in tackles per game with 11.7.
- Senior kicker Joe Mansour is first in the SEC and 11th nationally in field goals per game with 2.0.
- Kentucky is beginning a stretch of four games against opponents currently ranked in The Associated Press Top 20, including No. 7 Louisville, No. 20 Florida, No. 12 South Carolina and No. 1 Alabama.
- UK was one of the most inexperienced teams in the nation last season and the youth movement has continued in 2013 as 14 newcomers, including eight true freshmen, have played for the Wildcats this season.
- UK had 11 first-time starters in the season-opening game against WKU, which is a school record for first-time starters in a game according to records kept back to the 1993 season.

**HEAD COACH  
MARK STOOPS  
FIRST SEASON**

- Named the 37th head coach of the Kentucky football program on Nov. 27, 2012
- First task as UK coach was to put together a bright and energetic coaching staff. Accomplished that feat by hiring two of the best up-and-coming coordinators in the game in D.J. Eliot and Neal Brown.
- Inherited a recruiting class ranked in the 60s by the national evaluation services before Stoops and Co. hit the trail hard to sign a top-30 class, securing the highest recruiting class ranking in school history.
- Offseason momentum paved the way for a school record 50,831 fans at UK's spring game - which was the sixth highest spring game attendance in the nation.
- Accomplished major defensive turnarounds at Arizona and Florida State. Full breakdowns at both places below.
- During Stoops' three seasons at FSU, the Seminoles went 10-4, 9-4 and 12-2, including wins over South Carolina in the 2010 Chick-fil-A Bowl, Notre Dame in the 2011 Champs Sports Bowl and Northern Illinois in the 2013 Orange Bowl.
- Developed many players to NFL careers, including Antoine Cason, Michael Johnson, Philip Buchanon, Kelly Jennings, Brandon Meriweather, Ed Reed, Antrel Rolle, Mike Rumph, Sean Taylor and Brian Lee.

## GAME NOTES VS. FLORIDA

### SERIES RECORD VS. FLORIDA

- Florida leads the all-time series against Kentucky 46-17. Florida leads the all-time series in Lexington 18-10 and in Gainesville 26-4. The two teams met a few times at neutral sites with UK leading the series in those games 3-2. This is the 64th meeting. UK's last win in the series was a 10-3 victory in 1986 in Lexington.
- The first-ever meeting between the two schools was in 1917 with UK earning a 52-0 victory. The two teams have met annually since the 1967 season.
- Biggest UK win: 52 (52-0) in 1917 in Lexington ... Biggest Florida win: 66 (73-7) in 1994 in Gainesville.
- Games decided by 7 points or less: Florida leads 13-6
- Current streak: Florida has won 26 in a row

### SCOUTING FLORIDA

- Florida enters Saturday's game ranked in the top 20 of both major college football polls after a 2-1 start. The Gators started the season with a win over Toledo before falling at Miami (Fla.) 21-16 in week two. UF started its SEC slate last weekend with a 31-17 home win over Tennessee. Florida is in its third season under head coach Will Muschamp.
- The Florida defense has been very strong so far this season, ranking first in the SEC in scoring defense (14.7), total defense (212.3), rushing defense (55.3) and pass defense (157.0). Overall, the Gators rank second in the nation in total defense and sit in the top 20 nationally in nearly every defensive category. Sophomore linebacker Antonio Morrison leads the team in tackles this season with 13, while junior linebacker Michael Taylor has 12 tackles, a tackle for loss, a pass breakup and a quarterback hurry. Dante Fowler is tied for the team lead with four tackles for loss, adding a sack and three quarterback hurries, while Ronald Powell has four tackles for loss and two sacks.
- Quarterback Jeff Driskel leads the team in passing, but will miss the rest of the season after sustaining an injury vs. Tennessee. Junior quarterback Tyler Murphy saw most of the playing time against Tennessee leading the Gators to the win. Murphy is 8-for-14 this season for 134 yards and one touchdown. Murphy has also rushed 10 times for 84 yards and a touchdown. Mack Brown leads the team in rushing with 227 yards and three touchdowns, while Matt Jones has 96 yards on 30 carries for a touchdown. Trey Burton is the leading receiver with 14 catches for 160 yards, while Solomon Patton has 10 catches for 212 yards and two TDs.

### KENTUCKY-FLORIDA TIES

- Kentucky has 12 players on its current roster from the state of Florida, including Jeff Badet (Orlando), Javess Blue (Babson Park), Mike Douglas (Largo), Nick Haynes (Niceville), Jojo Kemp (DeLand), A.J. Legree (Fort White), Blake McClain (Winter Park), Regie Meant (Cape Coral), Ramsey Meyers (Orange Park), Alexander Montgomery (Weston), Jordan Swindle (St. Johns) and Nate Willis (Pahokee).
- Florida has one player on its 2013 roster from the state of Kentucky in freshman defensive back Garrett Stephens. Stephens went to Saint Xavier High School in Louisville, Ky.
- Former Kentucky head coach, assistant coach and player Joker Phillips is now the recruiting coordinator and wide receivers coach at Florida. Phillips played at Kentucky from 1981-84, was a member of the staff from 1988-96 and 2003-09 and was head coach from 2010-12.
- Current Florida offensive coordinator Brent Pease had a two-year stint at Kentucky as the offensive coordinator from 2001-02.

**MILESTONES TO WATCH FOR ...**

- Senior running back Raymond Sanders has 1,231 career rushing yards and needs 19 more to tie Rod Stewart for 25th place on the UK career rushing list.
- Senior running back Jonathan George has 786 career rushing yards and needs just 214 more to become the 34th player in school history with 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Sophomore punter Landon Foster has 77 career punts, qualifying him for UK's career punt records. His career average of 42.5 yards per punt over 72 career punts ranks third all-time.
- Junior defensive end Bud Dupree has 10.5 career sacks, needing 7 more to tie for fourth most all-time in school history.
- Junior defensive end Za'Darius Smith has 4.5 sacks this season needing just 4.5 more to tie for the fourth most sacks in a season in school history (Jeremy Jarmon 9 in 2007, Oliver Barnett 9 in 1988).

**MEILINGER SELECTED TO COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME**

Steve Meilinger, a two-year first-team All-American who excelled at several positions on offense and defense for the Kentucky Wildcats, has been named to the College Football Hall of Fame.

Meilinger played at Kentucky from 1951-53 under Coach Paul "Bear" Bryant. Meilinger helped the Wildcats to a record of 20-10-3, including an 8-4 mark in 1951 that was capped by a Cotton Bowl win over Texas Christian. UK was ranked in the nation's top 20 all three seasons in the final Associated Press and United Press International rankings. He was a freshman (ineligible to play at that time because of NCAA rules regarding first-year players) on the 1950 Kentucky squad that went 11-1 and is the national champion according to the Sagarin Computer Ratings.

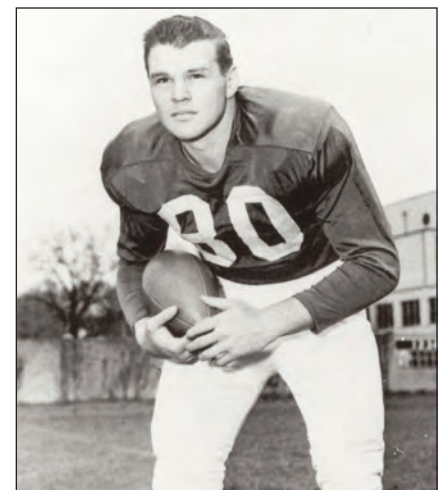
Known as "Mr. Anywhere" for the Wildcats, he split time between end, halfback and quarterback on offense; on defense, he played end, linebacker and defensive back – basically, every position on the field except the interior offensive and defensive lines, a remarkable combination. On special teams, he was a two-year starting punter and also returned punts and returned kickoffs.

Meilinger set Kentucky's career records for pass receptions, receiving yardage and touchdowns with 75 catches for 1,210 yards and 16 touchdowns. He also rushed 134 times for 714 yards and five TDs and passed for 127 yards and a TD. On defense, no tackle stats were kept during that era but he made six pass interceptions.

Meilinger was a first-team All-American as a junior by the Newspaper Enterprise Association and the All-Players team. He was first-team All-America as a senior according to the NEA, American Football Coaches Association/Colliers Magazine and the All-America Board.

On the league level, he was named first-team All-Southeastern Conference all three of his varsity seasons, the first of only five Wildcats in school history to be a three-time first-team All-SEC selection.

2013 UK Opponents in Bold

- Current Florida defensive backs coach Travaris Robinson spent a season at Texas Tech with current UK coaches Neal Brown and Chad Scott.
- In Coach Mark Stoops' three years at Florida State (2010-12) as a defensive coordinator he faced the Gators three times, earning two wins. Stoops' defense limited the Gators to seven points in each of the wins against the in-state foe.

### BIG GAMES VS. FLORIDA

- 1950 - One of Kentucky's big wins in its national championship season was a 40-6 home victory over No. 17 Florida. All-America quarterback Vito "Babe" Parilli threw two touchdown passes and led the Wildcats to 459 yards total offense.
- 1976 - Kentucky played seven ranked teams in the 1976 season, winning four of those games. One of those victories was a 28-9 home win over No. 15 Florida as the Wildcats eventually won the Southeastern Conference championship. Coach Fran Curci termed Kentucky's effort, "The most complete game I have ever been associated with as a coach."
- 1986 - Kentucky's last win over Florida came in 1986 as the Wildcats defeated the Gators, 10-3, on a cold, drizzly day in Lexington. Quarterback Bill Ransdell completed 20-of-23 passes for 161 yards as the Kentucky offense controlled the ball for 41 minutes. Mark Higgs rushed for 95 yards and scored the game's only touchdown on a one-yard run in the first quarter.

### UK-UF COACHES TO WEAR "COACH TO CURE MD" PATCH

- The Kentucky and Florida coaching staffs will be wearing Coach to Cure MD patches this week to raise awareness and funding for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy research. This is the sixth year of the Coach to Cure MD program, which has now surpassed the million dollar mark for donations. The goal is to raise money and awareness of Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy, which is the most common fatal genetic disorder among boys worldwide. The program is a partnership between Parent Project Muscular Dystrophy and the American Football Coaches Association.

### ON THIS DATE IN WILDCAT HISTORY

- Saturday marks the 18th time in school history that the Wildcats have played on Sept. 28, holding a 12-5 record on this date. UK was actually credited with two wins on this date in 1907 after Winchester A.C. forfeited and UK beat Louisville Manual 30-0.
- Kentucky and Florida have met twice on this date with the Gators winning both games. UF took down UK 65-0 on Sept. 28, 1996 in Gainesville before a 41-34 UF win in Gainesville on Sept. 28, 2002.
- The 2002 game against Florida was the last time that UK has played on Sept. 28.

### LAST TIME VS. FLORIDA

The No. 14-ranked Florida Gators got a solid defensive effort en route to shutting out Kentucky in the Wildcats' Southeastern Conference opener 38-0 at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium.

The two teams battled back-and-forth in the first quarter with neither able to get much going offensively. Florida went three-and-out on its first two possessions of the game before taking advantage of good field position midway through first quarter to get on the board with a Caleb Sturgis 27-yard field goal. Kentucky moved the ball well on the ensuing series before missing a 54-yard field goal that would have tied the game late in the first quarter.

Florida increased its lead to 10-0 early in the second quarter with a 10-play 63-yard drive that ended with a 1-yard touchdown rush by Mike Gillislee. Florida increased the lead to 17-0 when Jaylen Watkins intercepted a pass and returned it 26 yards for a touchdown to give the Gators a 17-0 lead.

UK's Collins Ukwu blocked a Florida field goal attempt, but late in the quarter, Florida pieced together a two-minute drill that ended with Jeff Driskel connecting with Quinton Dunbar for a 19-yard touchdown reception.

Each team had four drives in the second half, with Florida scoring a touchdown in each quarter. Driskel made it 31-0 with a one-yard touchdown rush late in the third quarter, while Jacoby Brissett also rushed in from one-yard out midway through the fourth quarter.

Kentucky did not have its starting quarterback or tailback in the game as sophomore quarterback Maxwell Smith did not play due to a shoulder injury and tailback CoShik Williams also was sidelined. QB Morgan Newton threw for 48 yards and added 34 rushing yards. TB Jonathan George ran for 52 yards and Raymond Sanders picked up 48 as the Wildcats rushed for 159 yards.

Linebackers Avery Williamson and Bud Dupree led the defense with eight tackles each, including a quarterback sack by Dupree. The Cats had three sacks during the game, plus an interception by cornerback Martavius Neloms.

### KENTUCKY VS. THE RANKED

- Florida is the second ranked foe that Kentucky has played this season. UK has also played No. 7/7 Louisville.
- UK's last win over a ranked team was Oct. 16, 2010 over No. 10 South Carolina (31-28) in Commonwealth Stadium.
- UK's last win over a ranked Florida team was a 28-9 decision in 1976. The Gators were ranked No. 15. Kentucky is 3-30 against Florida when the Gators have been ranked.

### TOUGH SCHEDULE AWAITING YOUNG WILDCATS

The Wildcats consistently play one of the toughest schedules in the nation and 2013 appears to be no different for Mark Stoops and Co. According to numerous online web sites and publications, Kentucky plays one of - if not the - toughest schedules in the country in 2013. In fact, GAMEDAYR.com and Fansided.com ranked UK's strength of schedule No. 1 nationally this preseason, while 4DOWN20.com ranked it third-hardest and Phil Steele's College Football ranked it ninth-hardest before the season started.

- According to the Sept. 22 rankings by the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll, UK will play five teams that are currently ranked in both polls, including No. 1 Alabama. In fact, Kentucky started a stretch two weeks ago with No. 7/7Louisville, before a bye week and a tough stretch against No. 20/19 Florida, No. 12/13 South Carolina and No. 1/1 Alabama in consecutive weeks.
- Of UK's 12 opponents this season eight played in a bowl game in 2012, including three in BCS bowls.

# ***Commonwealth Stadium***

***On game day, Commonwealth Stadium often becomes the third-largest city in Kentucky.***

- The Wildcats are in their 41st season at Commonwealth Stadium.
- Since its opening in 1973, Kentucky has played 256 games within the friendly confines of Commonwealth Stadium. UK has a 137-117-4 record (.539) in Commonwealth.
- Since the 1999 expansion, UK has averaged 63,701 fans per game and ranked in the nation's top 30 teams in attendance for 12 seasons. Both the single game and season attendance record has been broken in recent years.
- The crowd of 71,024 vs. Florida on Oct. 20, 2007 was the largest crowd in the 40-year history of Commonwealth Stadium. The previous stadium record was 71,022 for the 1999 Tennessee game.
- The playing surface is named C.M. Newton Field in honor of the former UK Director of Athletics.

### **Commonwealth Stadium Renovations on the Way:**

Kentucky has received legislative approval for a \$110 million renovation of football facilities, primarily Commonwealth Stadium. The stadium project features a new look for the exterior of the stadium, redesigned concourses, additional suites, a new press box and upgraded support facilities. Plans are in the design process, with construction expected to begin in 2014 and completion targeted for 2015. Shown above is an artist conception of what the stadium exterior might look like.

### **Facts and Figures on Commonwealth Stadium:**

Seating Capacity: 67,942, including the Commonwealth Suites. With game workers, media, etc., total attendance can exceed 70,000.

Video Boards: Video boards by Daktronics measuring at 39 by 79 feet, each, bring a total of 6,162 square feet of video capability. The video boards put UK among the nation's leaders in video square footage.

Sound System: Sportsound system will deliver pounding bass energy, smooth mid- and high-range frequencies, and high-impact entertainment. Components of the sound system include a main speaker cluster behind the end zone, under-balcony speakers and concourse speakers.

Ribbon Boards: Commonwealth Stadium's interior seating bowl has LED ribbon boards, allowing fans a more enjoyable experience.

### **Game Day Experiences**

The "Cat Walk": Fans are encouraged to greet the team when the Wildcats arrive for the "Cat Walk." The team buses will arrive at the Nutter Field House approximately two hours and 15 minutes before the game and the players will make the "Cat Walk" to their stadium entry point at Gate 1. Fans are encouraged to line up on the sidewalk and cheer the players as they enter the stadium. A siren will be sounded while the team buses are on their way to the stadium. That's the fans' cue to proceed to the Cat Walk area to greet the team.

Wildcat Refuge: Fans of all ages, but especially the younger Wildcats, will enjoy playing at the Wildcat Refuge, located outside of the southwest corner (outside Gate 9) of Commonwealth Stadium. There are five giant inflatable games that are available two hours before kickoff.

UK Marching Band Will Parade Around Stadium: The UK Marching Band will parade around the stadium, beginning approximately one hour prior to kickoff. The band parade will begin at and return to Gate 4.

### WILDCAT OFFENSE MAKING THE "HOME RUN" PLAYS

- Kentucky head coach Mark Stoops and offensive coordinator Neal Brown have talked about the Wildcats needing to be a consistent offense with the ability to make the "home run" play. In just a few weeks in the new "air raid" offensive system, UK has showed improvements.
- So far this season, UK has had 48 offensive plays of 10 yards or more, which puts the Wildcats on pace for 192 offensive plays of 10 yards or more in 2013. That would shatter the number of 10-plus yard plays UK had last year, which was 146. UK had 15 plays of 10 yards or more vs. WKU, 17 vs. Miami (Ohio) and 16 vs. Louisville.
- Kentucky had 10 plays of 30 yards or more in 2012, while the "air raid" offense has accounted for nine plays of 30 yards or more already this season.
- UK has six plays of 40 yards or more this season which is more than UK had all year in 2012 (4).
- UK has made the big play through the air and on the ground so far this season. Kentucky has three 40-plus yard rushing plays this season which is more than the two UK had in 2012. UK has three 40-plus yard passing plays this season after having two in 2012.

- While the UK offense has been making the "home run" play, the Kentucky defense has been limiting them under defensive coordinator D.J. Eliot and head coach Mark Stoops.
- Kentucky has allowed 39 plays of 10-plus yards this season, setting a pace for UK to allow its fewest amount of 10-plus yard plays since 2010. UK is also on pace to allow fewer 20-plus, 30-plus and 40-plus yard plays than it did a season ago.

### OFFENSIVE HIGHLIGHTS

- UK started the season by posting over 200 yards passing and rushing in consecutive games for the first time since 2010.
- The "home run" plays have led to quick drives this season as seven of UK's nine touchdown drives have had a possession time of two minutes or shorter.
- UK has converted 11-of-14 trips into the redzone this season after going 5-for-5 vs. WKU and 4-for-5 vs. Miami (Ohio). One of the three non-conversions was when UK allowed the game clock to expire and end the game with the ball on the five-yard line vs. Miami (Ohio).
- The Wildcat offense is 4-for-5 this season on fourth-down conversions, which ranks top five in the SEC.

an average of 5.2 per attempt. UK has averaged at least five yards per rush in all three games this season.

- Jalen Whitlow and Maxwell Smith both threw for 100-plus yards against Louisville, marking the second consecutive game that has happened.

### vs. Miami (Ohio):

- Kentucky had one of the best offensive showings in school history in its home opener against Miami (Ohio), amassing 675 yards of total offense - which is the third-most total offense in program history and the most since 1998.

- Several other offensive stats stood out against Miami, including 413 passing yards being the most UK has earned since 2007, while its 262 yards rushing was the most since 2012.

- The Wildcats' 24 points in the first quarter vs. Miami (Ohio) was the highest-scoring first quarter in school history. UK scored on each of its first five possessions in the game.

- UK connected on an 88-yard touchdown play in the game, which is the fourth-longest pass play in UK history and the longest pass completion for UK since 2000 vs. Georgia when Jared Lorenzen connected with Derek Smith.

### vs. WKU:

- The Wildcats scored 26 points in their opener vs. WKU, rushing for 216 yards and passing for 203. It was the first time UK had rushed for over 200 yards and passed for over 200 yards since 2010 against Vanderbilt.

- UK also had 419 yards of total offense in the season opener, which was the most for a UK offense in a season lid-lifter since 2010.

- UK averaged 6.8 yards per rushing play in the WKU game. When the three quarterback sacks are factored out, the Wildcats averaged 8.0 yards per rush.

- The Wildcats scored 26 points in the season opener vs. WKU, which is the most in a season opener game for UK since 42 points to start the 2009 season.

### The Quarterbacks:

- Both Maxwell Smith and Jalen Whitlow moved the ball at times against Louisville, however, two redzone turnovers hurt the Wildcats. Smith threw for 109 yards in the game, missing time due to injury in the fourth quarter. Whitlow threw for 105 yards against the Cardinals' defense, including his first touchdown pass of the season in UK's lone touchdown drive.

- Whitlow threw an interception against Louisville, breaking a streak of 160 consecutive passes without an interception - the second longest streak in school history.

- UK used a two-quarterback system against Miami (Ohio) very effectively with Smith (who got the start) completing 15-of-23 passes for 310 yards and three touchdowns, while Whitlow completed 10-of-12 passes for 103 yards and rushing seven times for 48 yards and a touchdown. It was the first time since Oct. 13, 2001 that UK has had two players throw for 100 yards or more.

- Smith threw a 48-yard, 56-yard and 88-yard touch-

down pass against Miami (Ohio), becoming the first UK quarterback since Tim Couch in 1998 vs. Louisville (48-yard, 56-yard and 57-yard) to accomplish that feat.

- Smith's big game vs. Miami (Ohio) marked the third time in five games played (including just one series vs. South Carolina in 2012) that he has thrown for 300 yards or more. Smith had 170 yards passing in the first quarter, including an 88-yard touchdown pass, which was the longest completion of his career and fourth-longest pass in UK history.

- Smith is 35-for-56 this season for 544 yards and four touchdowns. The sophomore ranks fifth in the SEC and 22nd nationally in passing efficiency at 162.3, while also ranking 10th in the SEC in passing yards per game with 181.3.

- Whitlow has been solid for UK at quarterback both through the air and on the ground. The sophomore has completed 28-of-44 passes for 286 yards while sitting second on the team in rushing with 160 yards on 26 carries with two touchdowns.

- Whitlow had a nine-yard TD rush in UK's opening drive vs. Miami (Ohio), which was his fifth career rushing touchdown. Whitlow ranks 13th in the SEC in total offense at 148.7, while he is 28th in the conference in rushing yards.

- The Wildcats used both quarterbacks in the season opener vs. WKU (Whitlow started with Smith playing most of the second half).

### The Wide Receivers and Tight Ends:

- Newcomer Javess Blue led the way for Kentucky vs. Louisville with six catches for 58 yards, while Ryan Timmons had three catches for a career-high 72 yards against the Cardinals. Timmons and fellow freshman Alexander Montgomery made their first career starts against the Cardinals. Montgomery had his first touchdown catch in the game.

- A total of eight different wide receivers/tight ends caught a pass against Miami (Ohio) - five of whom being newcomers. Of UK's 413 yards passing in the game, 298 yards were hauled in by those newcomers, which amounted to 72 percent of its production.

- Blue led the way through the air with a career game vs. Miami (Ohio) totaling six catches for 114 yards and a touchdown. Blue had a 88-yard catch, which was the fourth-longest pass play in school his-

tory.

- Other newcomers that showed play-making ability vs. Miami (Ohio) were Ryan Timmons, who rushed for 37 yards and caught five passes for 55.

- Fellow true freshman Jeff Badet made his first career start in the game vs. the Redhawks and caught three passes for 80 yards, including an impressive 56-yard touchdown reception in which he broke several tackles to score.

- Other players that shined vs. Miami (Ohio) were freshman Alexander Montgomery, who had four catches for 37 yards and senior TE Anthony Kendrick, who had a career-long 37-yard reception.

- Seven different receivers/tight ends caught a pass in the season opener vs. WKU with Demarco Robinson leading the way with five catches for 69 yards and a touchdown - the first touchdown of his career.

- UK's tight ends corps combined for 69 yards vs. WKU, which is the most since UK's tight ends had over 80 yards receiving vs. Middle Tennessee State in 2008.

### The Running Backs:

- Kentucky rushed for 162 yards on 31 carries against Louisville for a 5.2 yards per attempt average.
- So far this season, UK's running backs have rushed 62 times for 381 yards and two touchdowns for 6.1 yards per carry.

- True freshman Jojo Kemp paces UK in rushing this season with 18 carries for 167 yards. Kemp, who was UK's leading rushing against Louisville with five carries for 80 yards, had a career-long 47-yard carry against the Cardinals.

- Senior Raymond Sanders is third on the team in rushing with 153 yards on 26 carries and a touchdown. Sanders rushed six times for 39 yards and a TD vs. Miami (Ohio), while fellow senior Jonathan George rushed six times for 27 yards against the Redhawks. George caught a 48-yard touchdown pass vs. the RedHawks for a career-long reception.

- Kemp led UK in rushing yards vs. Miami (Ohio) with 78 yards on 12 carries for a 6.5 yards per carry average.

- The Wildcats rushed for 216 yards vs. WKU, which is the most rushing yards for UK in a season opener since 2010. Senior Raymond Sanders led the way

with 98 yards on 14 carries.

- Kentucky's depth at running back took a hit before fall camp even began when it was announced that sophomore Josh Clemons would miss the 2013 season with an injury. However, UK looks to have plenty of consistent options to fill the void.

#### The Offensive Line:

- The UK offensive line has helped UK rush for an average of 6.3 yards per attempt this season.
- Senior Kevin Mitchell was named SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week against Miami (Ohio) grading out at 90 percent by the UK coaching staff with nine knockdown blocks.
- Redshirt freshman Jon Toth earned his first career start at center in the Miami (Ohio) game, while sophomore Zach West started his first game of the year.
- Three of the five starters against WKU were first-time starters for the Wildcats in left guard Teven Eatmon-Nared, center Zach Myers and right tackle Jordan Swindle. Junior Darrian Miller and senior Kevin Mitchell anchored the lineup up front in game one.

#### DEFENSIVE HIGHLIGHTS

- D.J. Eliot's crew continued to show its improvement against Louisville with a solid first half against the high-powered Louisville offense. limiting UL to 153 yards of total offense in the first half with 62 rushing yards and 91 passing yards.
- The Kentucky defense showed great improvement in week two with an impressive outing vs. Miami (Ohio). Kentucky only allowed 122 yards of total offense to Miami (Ohio), which is the fewest since Samford had 102 in 2012 and the fourth-lowest total allowed in the last 25 years (since 1988). It is the third-lowest total allowed in the last 25 years to a FBS team.
- After the Miami (Ohio) game the coaching staff praised their players for being able to adjust UK's defensive game plan after the coaching staff noticed Miami (Ohio) running a different offense in pregame warmup than they had seen on tape in game prep.
- UK has been good on third-down defense this season only allowing opponents to convert 23.1 percent of third-down chances. The UK defense has played 39 third-downs this season, allowing opponents to convert a first down only nine times.
- Ten different players on the UK defense this season have posted five or more tackles in a game.
- The UK defense has forced four fumbles this season, recovering three of them.
- Kentucky ranks second in the SEC in redzone defense, allowing opponents to only score 69.2 percent of the time they enter the redzone. Teams have traveled into UK's 20-yard line 13 times this season with nine scores (seven touchdowns, two field goals).

#### vs. Louisville

- The UK defense limited Louisville to 250 passing yards in the game - UL's lowest output of the season.
- The Wildcats used a big personnel formation at times against the Cardinals, bringing in freshman defensive end Jason Hatcher as a linebacker.
- Kentucky had four pass breakups in the game,

**vs. Miami (Ohio):**

- The Kentucky defense had six sacks against Miami (Ohio).
- UK held Miami (Ohio) to 1-of-16 on its third down chances, the best defensive performance for Kentucky on third down since holding Georgia to 0-for-10 on third down in 2005.
- In all, 22 defensive players had tackles in the game with four different players recording tackles-for-loss and four different players recording sacks.

**vs. WKU:**

- In the opener vs. WKU, UK had two players with 10 or more tackles for the first time since Sept. 29, 2012 vs. South Carolina.
- The Kentucky defense was stiff on third down vs. WKU, only allowing the Hilltoppers to convert 2-of-10 third-down chances.

**The Defensive Line:**

- Junior defensive end Alvin "Bud" Dupree had a season-best, team-high seven tackles vs. Miami (Ohio), with two going for loss and one sack. Dupree also had a half sack against Louisville, taking his career total to 10.5 sacks. Dupree has three or more tackles in 18 consecutive games.
- Junior college transfer Za'Darius Smith played well vs. Miami (Ohio) with three sacks and six tackles. Three sacks in a game is the most for a UK player since Deion Holts vs. Indiana in 2003. Smith also had a half sack against Louisville, becoming the first UK player with a sack in three straight games since Jeremy Jarmon in 2007. Smith ranks second in the SEC and 22nd nationally in tackles for loss and first in the SEC and third nationally in sacks.
- True freshman Jason Hatcher has played well this season and recorded his first quarterback hurry against Miami (Ohio). Hatcher, a native of Louisville, had four tackles against the Cardinals in significant playing time.
- UK has seen some good depth on the defensive line this season as nine different defensive linemen have tackles this season. Starting tackles Donte Rumph and Mister Cobble helped clog the rush vs. Miami (Ohio). Rumph has five tackles and a tackle for loss this season, while Cobble has five tackle. Backup Mike Douglas has seven tackles and a sack, while Tristian Johnson has 11 tackles.

**The Linebackers:**

- Avery Williamson had another strong game against Louisville with a game-high 15 tackles, including a tackle for loss. Williamson had a streak of 22 consecutive games of three or more tackles. He has 229 career tackles.
- Junior TraVaughn Paschal made his first career start vs. Miami (Ohio) at linebacker after starting the year as a backup defensive end. Paschal had seven tackles vs. the RedHawks with his first career sack. He responded with eight tackles against Louisville.
- Avery Williamson led Kentucky defense vs. WKU with 14 tackles - his ninth career double-digit tackle game - with a fumble recovery.
- Junior Kory Brown, who earned his first career start in the game, made four tackles and a tackle for loss in the first quarter before missing the remainder of the game with an injury. Brown has not played since.
- Freshman Blake McClain saw his first time as a linebacker/nickelback in the opener with seven tackles and a fumble forced. McClain earned his first career start vs. Miami (Ohio) and had six tackles and a pass breakup in UK's Nickel package. McClain had two tackles and a pass breakup vs. UL.

**The Defensive Backs:**

- The UK secondary had four pass breakups against Louisville, limiting the Cardinals to a season-low 250 passing yards. Ashely Lowery had three tackles against UL with a fumble recovery and a career-high two pass breakups.
- Sophomore Fred Tiller, who earned his first career start vs. WKU, had seven tackles and a fumble recovery in the game, while safety Ashely Lowery had six tackles.
- Junior safety Eric Dixon started his first game vs. WKU with five tackles before a career-high seven tackles vs. Louisville.
- At cornerback. sophomore Cody Quinn led the team in pass breakups last season with five but saw his first playing time of the season vs. Louisville with a tackle and a pass breakup. Freshman Jaleel Hytchye provides depth at the position with outstanding speed.
- Safety is a position the Wildcats have some depth and experience with returning starter Ashely Lowery. Senior Dakotah Tyler, junior Eric Dixon and sophomores Glenn Faulkner, Daron Blaylock and Zack Blaylock provide much needed depth at the position.

**SPECIAL TEAM HIGHLIGHTS**

- Senior placekicker Joe Mansour has started his first year as the primary placekicker by making all six field goals he has attempted, going 3-for-3 from 20-29 yards and 3-for-3 from 30-39 yards. Mansour has also handled the kickoffs with 17 kickoffs and seven touchbacks. Mansour ranks 11th nationally and first in the SEC in field goals per game.

- Sophomore punter Landon Foster has continued to punt well after a strong freshman season. Foster has 16 punts this season for a 41.2 yards per punt average. Foster ranks seventh in the SEC in punt average. Foster tied a career-long 58-yard punt vs. Miami (Ohio) which tied his career long.
- Junior Demarco Robinson handled most the kick returns vs. WKU with 74 yards from kickoff returns and 54 yards from punt returns. Robinson returned one punt 33 yards. He also returned one kickoff vs. Miami (Ohio) for 39 yards.
- Robinson's 33-yard punt return vs. WKU was the longest for Kentucky since Randall Cobb returned a punt 50 yards for a touchdown vs. WKU in 2010. Entering the 2013 season, UK had a combined 10 punt returns of 20 yards or more since the start of the 2010 season. Robinson had two returns of 20 yards or more in the 2013 opener vs. WKU.
- Josh Forrest blocked a field goal for Kentucky against Louisville, marking the first time a UK player has accomplished that since Collins Ukwu last season.

### RECORD-SETTING SPRING GAME IS SIXTH NATIONALLY IN ATTENDANCE

Everyone had heard about the way fans were gobbling up tickets to Kentucky's 2013 Blue/White Spring Game. It seemed a certainty that UK would set a school record for spring game attendance, but even the most optimistic experts could not have predicted the scene on the evening of April 13 in Commonwealth Stadium.

Fans came out early to tailgate, many of them taking advantage of a shuttle to and from Keeneland Race Course. When it was time for the Cat Walk, they lined up nine and 10 deep to cheer on the Wildcats as they walked into the stadium. Gates opened shortly after that and the stands were quickly full.

"I remember going out on the field and thinking, 'This looks like a game,'" Coach Mark Stoops said.

By the first quarter, an estimated 50,831 fans were in Commonwealth Stadium, shattering the previous school record for spring game attendance by more than 30,000. Just as impressively, the showing gave UK the sixth-largest attendance of any spring game in the nation.

They cheered as the Blue team held on for a 24-23 victory, giving the Cats a taste of what the atmosphere at Commonwealth will be like on Saturdays this fall.

As Stoops noted, the enthusiasm of the evening is still making an impact on Kentucky football. The coach has noted that recruits who were there on April 13 often commented on the fan turnout and energy.

### REMARKABLE RECRUITING

Of all the impact that new coach Mark Stoops and his staff have made in a short period of time, the largest mark undoubtedly has come in recruiting.

It didn't take long for Stoops and staff to establish themselves. Three weeks after being named head coach, Stoops inked two junior-college players, defensive end Za'Darius Smith and tight end Steven Borden. Smith was ranked as the nation's No. 1 strongside end by one national recruiting service. He ended spring practice as a starting end and Borden will be in the mix of receivers who will see game action.

When Stoops took over in late November, UK was ranked in the 60s by the national recruiting services. Despite the late start in recruiting, in only two months there were 14 new commitments and UK's ranking had soared to as high as No. 29 by Rivals.com.

### NEW COORDINATORS RIDING WAVE OF SUCCESS

Kentucky's new offensive and defensive coordinators, Neal Brown and D.J. Eliot, come to Lexington riding a wave of success in recent seasons.

Brown was offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach the last three years at Texas Tech. In all three seasons, Tech ranked in the nation's top-seven teams in passing offense, top 15 in total offense and top 25 in scoring offense, and increased production in all three categories each year since 2010. TTU finished the 2012 season scoring 37.5 points per game, passing for 355.9 yards per game, and piling up 495.8 total offensive yards per game.

Eliot served as defensive ends coach under coordinator Mark Stoops the

last three seasons at Florida State. The FSU defense zoomed from 108th in the nation in total defense in 2009, the year before their arrival, to second in the nation in that category last season. The 2012 FSU defense allowed a mere 254.1 yards per game.

With Stoops having resigned to assume the Kentucky head coaching post in December, Eliot took over as defensive coordinator for FSU during the 2013 Orange Bowl. FSU's opponent was Northern Illinois, which entered the game averaging more than 40 points and 485 yards per game. Under Eliot's guidance, the FSU defense limited the Huskies to only 10 points and 259 total yards.

### **GEORGE, MITCHELL, WILLIAMSON VISIT ETHIOPIA**

Three UK seniors, running back Jonathan George, offensive guard Kevin Mitchell and linebacker Avery Williamson, enjoyed an interesting experience in May as the Wildcats traveled to Ethiopia for an educational/service trip.

Guided by UK senior associate director of athletics Jason Schlafer, the players visited families, played with children, distributed food and did work projects. George told the most poignant story.

"We visited a leprosy community and there was an older man who didn't have any legs," George recalled. "He walked around with flip-flops on his hands and he used his hands to get around with. We were bagging food and charcoal for the people and he came in and started helping with his hands. He helped us bag the food that wasn't just for him but for other people as well. He had a bike that he rode on and pedaled with his hands and that's how he got around."

### **WARFORD TAKEN IN THIRD ROUND OF NFL DRAFT**

Kentucky had one player selected in April's National Football League draft, offensive guard Larry Warford, who was tabbed in the third round by the Detroit Lions. Four other Wildcats signed free-agent contracts. During the last six years, 45 Wildcats have been drafted or signed as free agents.

## WESTERN KENTUCKY 35, KENTUCKY 26

AUG. 31, 2013 • LP FIELD - NASHVILLE, TENN.



Western Kentucky got ahead early and withstood a fourth-quarter Kentucky rally as the Hilltoppers won the season opener – UK's first game under new coach Mark Stoops – by a tally of 35-26.

The teams traded scores in the first half and WKU went into halftime with a 21-17 lead. WKU tallied three 3-yard touchdown runs while the Wildcats got a 22-yard field goal by Joe Mansour, a 19-yard touchdown run by quarterback Jalen Whitlow and a five-yard TD by running back Jonathan George. The Hilltoppers increased the advantage to 35-17 early in the fourth quarter before the Wildcats rallied.

Quarterback Maxwell Smith entered the game and directed a pair of scoring drives, ending with a 30-yard Mansour field goal and a 34-yard touchdown pass to

Demarco Robinson, but it was not enough as WKU held on to win.

Kentucky had good balance on offense, with more than 200 yards rushing and passing, the first time the Wildcats had done both in the same game since the 2010 season. As the starting QB, Whitlow completed 10 of 15 passes for 78 yards and also rushed for a career-high 75 yards and a touchdown. Smith completed 8 of 13 for 125 yards and a TD. Raymond Sanders led the ground game with 98 rushing yards.

Senior linebacker Avery Williamson led the Kentucky defense with 14 tackles, the ninth double-figure game of his career. He also had a fumble recovery, one of two fumbles recovered by the Cats. Linebacker Khalid Henderson had a career-high 10 tackles and caused a fumble.

Wide receiver Demarco Robinson turned in a fine all-around performance. He led UK in receiving with five catches for 69 yards, including a 34-yard TD, and also provided spark on special teams with two punt returns for 54 yards and a 24.7 average on kickoff returns.

## KENTUCKY 41, MIAMI (OHIO) 7

SEPT. 7, 2013 • LEXINGTON, KY



Kentucky scored a school-record 24 points in the first quarter and never looked back in a dominating 41-7 victory over Miami (Ohio), which gave Mark Stoops his first win as a head coach.

Maxwell Smith, who made his first start since Sept. 2012, threw three long touchdown passes and Jalen Whitlow and Raymond Sanders each added scoring runs as Kentucky amassed 675 yards on the day, the program's third-most total offensive output in school history, and the most in 15 years.

Both Smith and Whitlow took plenty of snaps on the day, often rotating in and out of the game multiple times in the same possession during a first quarter in which the UK offense scored the first five times it took the field.

Whitlow capped a 7-play, 61-yard opening drive with a 9-yard rushing touchdown before Joe Mansour concluded UK's second possession with a 22-yard field goal. Jonathan George caught a 48-yard touchdown pass from Smith to make it 17-0 early and return the air raid sirens to Commonwealth Stadium.

Kentucky's defense dominated the first interval, holding Miami to two three-and-outs from the RedHawks' first three possessions, but a Kentucky muffed punt resulted in a Miami fumble return for a touchdown, the visitors' only score of the afternoon. UK quickly responded with touchdowns on the next two possessions, an 88-yard bomb from Smith to junior transfer wideout Javess Blue and a 5-yard scamper from Raymond Sanders, respectively.

After a scoreless third quarter Kentucky added 10 points in the fourth, a 21-yard Mansour field goal and another long pass from Smith, this time 56 yards to freshman wide receiver Jeff Badet.

Kentucky's defense enjoyed a banner day for D.J. Eliot's unit as a whole, recording six sacks – including three by Za'Darius Smith – and limiting Miami to just 1-of-16 on third-down. The UK defense allowed no scores on the day while holding Miami to only 122 yards of total offense.

## NO. 7/7 LOUISVILLE 27, KENTUCKY 13

### SEPT. 14, 2013 • LEXINGTON, KY



The Kentucky defense got off to an impressive start holding seventh-ranked Louisville's high-powered offense to just 82 first-quarter yards, but three Wildcat turnovers were too much to overcome as UK fell 27-13 in front of 65,445 fans in Commonwealth Stadium.

Both teams traded field goals in the first quarter as dropped passes plagued the UK offense through the game's first few drives. Louisville put together an 11-play, 52-yard drive that ended with a 13-yard touchdown pass from Teddy Bridgewater to DeVante Parker at the end of the first half to take a 10-3 lead into the break.

Senorise Perry opened the second-half with a 1-yard touchdown run, and he added a 36-yarder early in the fourth on the other side of a John Wallace 21-yard field goal to round out Louisville's second-half scoring.

Kentucky scored 10 fourth-quarter points as Joe Mansour kicked his second field goal of the game before Alex Montgomery caught a 3-yard touchdown pass from Jalen Whitlow to cap a 15-play, 75-yard drive midway through the final interval. Avery Williamson continued his strong senior season with a game-high 15 tackles, while Alvin "Bud" Dupree and TraVaughn Paschal added eight stops each including a half sack shared between Dupree and Za'Darius Smith.

Kentucky rushed for 162 yards on 31 carries, averaging 5.2 per attempt. Freshman Jojo Kemp ran five times for a career-high 80 yards, leading UK in rushing for the second straight game. The Wildcats have averaged at least five yards per rush in all three games this season.

Both of UK's quarterbacks, Maxwell Smith who started and Jalen Whitlow who played for most of the second half, passed for at least 100 yards each for the second-consecutive contest.
