THE STORYLINE: Lafayette travels to Louisville for the Cardinals' home opener at Freedom Hall. The Leopards were 1-3 in November, while Louisville was 3-1 and played all four games in Hawaii. It is the first meeting between the two schools, and Lafayette's first game against a ranked team since playing No. 5 Temple on March 17, 2000. Lafayette, the 15th seed in the East Region, fell to the Owls 73-47 in Buffalo. It was the Leopards' second straight, and most recent, appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

LAST TIME OUT: Four Leopards came off the bench to score in double figures, led by a career-high 14 points from freshman **Matt Betley**, but Drexel came away with a 78-67 win over Lafayette in non-conference play on Tuesday night at Kirby Sports Center. Phil Goss led Drexel with 26 points, including five three-pointers, and sparked a critical 9-0 run which gave the Dragons a 57-49 lead with 11:58 left. Lafayette would only get as close as six the rest of the way. **Sean Knitter** (13), **Andrei Capusan** (12) and **Bilal Abdullah** (10) complemented Betley's career-high 14 points and seven rebounds.

THE STARTING FIVE: With the graduation of four senior starters who started at least two seasons apiece for Lafayette, the 2004-05 starting lineup has a much younger look. Sophomore **Marcus Harley** runs the show from the point guard position and has been joined in the backcourt by junior **Pat Betley**. Betley is the Leopards' only returning starter, having played in 25 of Lafayette's 28 games a season ago. Sophomore **Jamaal Hilliard** has taken up the third guard spot in the Leopards' three-guard motion offense. In the frontcourt, another sophomore, **Jamaal Douglas**, has cemented himself at one of the forwards and has been partnered with senior co-captain, center **Jamie Hughes**. Junior forward **Andrei Capusan** replaced Hughes in the starting lineup on Saturday, Nov. 27 vs. Princeton, while freshman guard **Paul Cummins** garnered a start on Tuesday against Drexel when Betley (shin injury) was unable to play.

ON THE SIDELINE: Two-time Patriot League Coach of the Year **Fran O'Hanlon** (Villanova, '70) is in his tenth season as the Leopards' mentor. He has twice led Lafayette's non-scholarship program to the NCAA Tournament and lays claim to three Patriot League regular-season titles among his credentials. O'Hanlon's career record stands at 142-120, a mark that includes two 20-win seasons.

COMING UP: The Leopards will continue their road trip, playing at Cornell on Dec. 6 and Marist on Dec. 10 before finally returning home on Dec. 13 to play Cal State Northridge. Lafayette has won seven of its nine match-ups with Cornell in the Fran O'Hanlon era. The Leopards last played Marist in 2000-01, and lost to CSUN in the series' only meeting in California last December.

ON THE BOARDS: The Leopards did the job on the boards in their first three games. In the season opener, Lafayette out-rebounded Duquesne 39-36 thanks to strong rebounding performances from **Sean Knitter** (8) and **Andrei Capusan** (8). At St. Peter's, the rebounding was even between the two teams (38-38) with Knitter accounting for eight boards and **Jamaal Douglas** seven. The Leopards held a 29-27 edge on the boards against Princeton, as **Marcus Harley** had six rebounds from his guard spot.

DEFENDING THEIR TURF: In the friendly confines of Kirby SportsCenter, Lafayette cruised to an 11-2 record at home last season. Throughout the O'Hanlon regime, the Leopards sport a home record of 93-31. This year, the Leopards have 13 home contests, but started the season 0-2 at Kirby.

FROM THE LINE: In the Leopards' season-opening win over Duquesne, Lafayette shot 81 percent from the free throw stripe, hitting 20-of-26 free throws in the second half after a 6-for-6 effort in the opening session. **Jamaal Hilliard** led the way with a perfect 10-for-10 day at the line. It was the first time since Jan. 23, 2004 (Justin DeBerry) that a Lafayette player had made 10 or more free throws.

CAPTAIN COMBO: Seniors **Jamie Hughes** and **Sean Knitter** have been selected as co-captains for the 2004-05. Knitter was one of the Leopards' top players off the bench last season and Hughes' role has increased steadily with his experience.

COACH "O" MOVES TO NO. 2: Fran O'Hanlon is the second winningest coach in Lafayette history with 142 victories. He needs just 29 wins to break George Davidson's record of 170 wins at Lafayette. In 2003-04, he surpassed Butch Van Breda Kolff who had 132 career wins.

YES, THEY'RE RELATED: **Pat Betley**, a junior guard, is being joined on the squad this season by his first cousin **Matt Betley**, the 2004 South Jersey Player of the Year. Pat is the Leopard's lone returning starter, and averaged 6.6 points per game last season. Matt dropped a career-high 14 points vs. Drexel on Tuesday.

THE EUROPEAN CONNECTION: Freshman **Paul Cummins** hails from Ireland and is the next player in a long line of European standouts recruited by Fran O'Hanlon. The list includes 1998 Patriot League Player of the Year Stefan Ciosici, Lafayette's all-time leading shot blocker Rob Dill, and current Leopard **Andrei Capusan**.

SUMMER SEASONING: Sophomore forward **Jamaal Douglas** and junior **Andrei Capusan** spent their summers playing for their home countries. Douglas played with the Bahamas National Under-21 team and Capusan competed with the Romanian Senior National team.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS: Senior **Jamie Hughes** enters the 2004-05 season ranked 15th in career blocks at Lafayette. Hughes needs just six blocks to crack the top ten.

BOMBS AWAY: Since taking over the Lafayette basketball program in 1995-96, Fran O'Hanlon has coached eight of the top ten three point shooters in school history. The latest addition to the O'Hanlon monopoly on the list is **Marcus Harley**, who needs to make just one three to break into the top 20 during his sophomore season. Harley also is a career 42.4 percent shooter from beyond the arc, which is the fourth highest percentage in Lafayette history. Harley hit four three's in a two-minute stretch early in the game vs. Duquesne and has hit a three in each game this season.

PATRIOT PRESEASON POLL: Lafayette has been picked to finish sixth in the Patriot League Preseason Poll. The Leopards are coming off an 18-10 season in which they finished one game out of first place in the Patriot League standings.

INJURY REPORT: Junior **Pat Betley** has been slowed by severe shin splints in both legs. Betley has recently been fitted with an air cast and played in the first three contests, but missed Tuesday's game against Drexel.

Scouting Report

SCOUTING LOUISVILLE: The Cardinals open their 2004-05 home schedule after playing four games in Hawaii. Louisville opened with a 10-point win at BYU-Hawaii on Nov. 20 before making an appearance at the Maui Invitational. The Cardinals fell 76-71 to Iowa on Nov. 22, then defeated Chaminade by 30 and Stanford by 15.

Junior guard **Taquan Dean**, a native of Red Bank, N.J., is the reigning Conference USA Player of the Week after scoring 30 points against the Stanford Cardinal in Louisville's final game in Maui. Dean is averaging 19.3 ppg while shooting 57 percent from the floor and 48 percent from long range.

Preseason Wooden Award candidate **Francisco Garcia** was the fourth-leading scorer in C-USA with 16.4 a year ago. The junior enters with averages of 14.3 ppg, 3.8 rpg and 3.5 apg.

Senior forward **Ellis Myles** is averaging 12.5 points and 9.3 rebounds, while **Larry O'Bannon**, a senior from Louisville's Male H.S., is the fourth Cardinal who averages double figures this season with 13.3 ppg.

Lafayette's Last Game

DREXEL 78, LAFAYETTE 67 NOV. 30, 2004 -- KIRBY SPORTS CENTER

EASTON, Pa. - Four Leopards came off the bench to score in double figures, led by a career-high 14 points from freshman **Matt Betley**, but Drexel came away with a 78-67 win over Lafayette in non-conference men's basketball play on Tuesday night at Kirby Sports Center. Lafayette led 49-48 with 13:15 remaining after senior **Sean Knitter** followed a three-pointer with a layup. Then Drexel's Phil Goss sparked a 9-0 run with his fifth three of the game on his way to a career-high 26 points. Jeremiah King knocked down a three, and Kenell Sanchez converted a three-point play to give Drexel a 57-49 lead with 11:58 left. A layup by Betley pulled the Leopards within seven with 7:42 to go, but King's three-pointer at 6:08 gave the Dragons a 10-point advantage and their first win of the season. Drexel held a 17-7 lead eight minutes into the contest until freshman **Bilal Abdullah** started an 11-0 Lafayette run with a three. He assisted on two buckets by junior **Andrei Capusan**, who scored eight straight points. Capusan gave the Leopards their first lead of the game, at 18-17, with an offensive rebound and putback. A driving reverse layup by freshman **Paul Cummins** accounted for the first of six lead changes in the final seven minutes of the half. Senior **Jamie Hughes** hit three straight layups for the Leopards as the squads traded baskets, but Drexel held a 33-30 lead at intermission. Betley posted career-highs of 14 points and seven rebounds, while Knitter (13), Capusan (12) and Abdullah (10) were also in double figures for the Leopards.

LAFAYETTE VS. CONFERENCE USA: Lafayette has played against a current Conference USA member just one other time. The Leopards played at Tulane on Dec. 28, 1996 and lost 92-73 to the Green Wave in **Fran O'Hanlon's** second season. Lafayette has never faced Louisville in men's basketball, but did face the Louisville Professionals in baseball on May 31, 1876 in Easton. The Louisville squad won the contest, 12-8.

ALL-TIME AT LAFAYETTE: In the 95 seasons of men's basketball at Lafayette College, the Leopards hold an overall record of 1152-995 (.538). Lafayette's first season of basketball was in 1900-01.

THE PATRIOT LEAGUE SLATE: The 2004-05 Patriot League schedule again features a new format. The latest incarnation disposes of men's and women's doubleheaders, which were common at many of the Patriot League schools in years past, in favor of split sites. Thus, when the Lafayette men's face Army in Easton, Pa., the Lafayette women will face the Army women in West Point, N.Y. The other major schedule change comes in the Patriot League Tournament when the top two seeds will host two mini tournaments on their home floors. The winners will advance to the championship game at the site of the highest seed.

The Leopards have 13 games televised and have the possibility of adding three more televised contests in the Patriot League Tournament. The Lafayette Sports Network will air 12

games to more than 9.1 million viewers in the Lehigh Valley, Pocono region, Philadelphia, central New Jersey, New York City and Boston. Locally the telecasts can be seen on RCN Cable channels 4 and 60, Service Electric Cable channel 51, Blue Ridge Cable channel 5 and broadcast channel 60. Several of Lafayette's games that appear on the Lafayette Sports Network will also be picked up by Empire Sports Network which reaches more than 19.5 million viewers in Upstate and Western New York as well as more than 60 million potential viewers on DIRECTV (626) and Dish Network (432).
