## 2008 LAFAYETTE FOOTBALL SPRING STORYLINES

• Inside linebacker **Andy Romans** and fullback **Joe Russo** will serve as co-captains for the 2008 season. Romans is the reigning Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year and Lafayette team MVP. He has led the team in tackles the past two seasons and averaged 10.3 tackles per game in 2007. Russo is a triple threat at the fullback position, leading the way for the Lafayette running game which gained 1,907 yards on the ground behind his able blocking. He also carried the ball 26 times for 126 yards and one touchdown and reeled in 12 catches for 96 yards and two touchdowns.

• From a statistical standpoint, it will be hard for the Lafayette defense to top its output from the 2007 season. The Leopards ranked first in the nation in total defense, surrendering 260.9 yards per game. Lafayette was ranked fourth in rushing defense (85.7 ypg), eighth in scoring defense (16.9 ppg) and 15th in pass efficiency defense (108.3).

• **Rob Curley** comes into the season as the starter at quarterback. Curley entered the 2007 slate as the backup, but displaced Mike DiPaola by week seven. Curley started the final four games of the season, guiding the team to a 3-1 record. He was named the MVP of the Lafayette-Lehigh game as Lafayette rolled up a 21-17 win in the 143rd meeting.

• The tailback situation is up for grabs as the Leopards make their way through spring practice. Senior **Maurice White** was the heir apparent coming into 2007, but injuries kept him sidelined for much of the season. He collected 249 yards over the first four games but was sidelined for the remainder of the year with an ankle sprain. Juniors **DeAndre' Morrow**, **Tyrell Coon** and **Matt Ferber**, who all spent significant time at tailback last season, will compete with White for the starting spot. That junior trio combined to carry the ball for 726 yards and each started at least one game.

• The offensive line will need to make up for the losses on the left side of the line with the graduation of All-Patriot League selection Jesse Padilla and Greg Lippert. Junior **Ryan Hart-Predmore** and senior **Leo Plenski** return at right guard and tackle while **Michael Wojcik**, who started seven games in 2007, will look to be the center. Senior **Joe Moore** started the last four games in 2007 and will look to be a starter. Junior **Mike Conte** and **Adam Gill** will occupy the tight end spots.

• Lafayette also returns six starters on defense, led by senior LB **Andy Romans**. Defensive end **Luke Schade** returns for a fifth year and will anchor the line. In the backfield, All-Patriot League CB **Marvin Cleidor** will be joined by FS **Nigel Bryant**. Junior LB **Mark Leggiro** and junior NG **Andrew Poulson** also return.

## 2008 Season Outlook

As Lafayette enters the 2008 season, **Frank Tavani's** Leopards have positioned themselves to make a run at the program's fourth Patriot League title in five seasons. The team is coming off a 2007 campaign in which it finished 7-4 overall, 4-2 in league play and second in the conference standings. That added to a four-season mark of 19-5 in conference play and a 29-18 clip overall.

While "defense wins championships," an offensive note stands out for the Leopards in their Patriot League runs over the years. In each of its six Patriot League championship seasons (1988, 1992, 1994, 2004, 2005 and 2006), Lafayette has returned at least one starter at either quarterback or tailback, and in two years - including 2006 - the Leopards brought back starters at both positions. After having newcomers at both positions last year, the Leopards welcome back starters at both positions for 2008.

Junior quarterback **Rob Curley** leads a group of seven returning starters. Curley took over the signal-calling duties past the midway point of the 2007 season and finished with a 3-1 record.

Senior tailback **Maurice White** heads a talented and experienced stable of ballcarriers. He is an explosive back who missed most of 2007 due to injury but appears ready to take on the workload on a team coached by a former tailback who likes to pound the ball on the ground.

Paving the way for the running game are three returning starters on the offensive line and All-Patriot League First-Team fullback **Joe Russo**. Russo will serve as team co-captain after being voted to the role by his teammates.

His defensive counterpart is reigning Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year **Andy Romans**. The two-time All-Patriot League selection heads a defensive corps that was ranked first in the nation in total defense in 2007. The 2008 defense returns six starters and will be anchored by its linebacking corps of Romans, **Mark Leggiero** and **Spencer Brown**.

Overall 14 starters, including three All-Patriot League selections on each side of the ball, return for the 2008 installment on College Hill along with 40 letterwinners.

"Depth is my major concern entering the season," Tavani said. "We have a strong core group coming back when you look at the starters, but last year the guys we had in back-up were more experienced. This season many of those players will step into starting spots."

### ON OFFENSE

The quarterback situation resolved itself, albeit in a delayed fashion, midway through the 2007 season. Curley enters the spring season and presumably the 2008 fall campaign as the Leopards' signal caller.

Curley came on to the scene full-time during week seven of the 2007 season, taking over the reigns with six minutes left in the Fordham game. He held down the starting spot for the final four games of the season when Lafayette posted a 3-1 record.

Curley passed for seven touchdowns to four interceptions on the season and was 77-for-124 for 929 yards. Against Colgate, he threw three touchdowns and ran

for another, finishing with 49 yards rushing. In the Leopards' biggest game of the year, the season finale at Lehigh, the second-year player went 15-for-25, threw for one TD and ran for another on his way to game MVP honors. He engineered the game-winning drive while playing with a fractured finger that also severed a tendon and required off-season surgery.

"Rob really took advantage of his opportunity to play last season. He played with great confidence and really handled things well in the pocket. He didn't let anything shake him," Tavani said.

Curley will be backed up by a junior and three sophomores. Junior **Josh Jones** will miss the spring season after sustaining injuries in a car accident. In his absence, **Pat Carey**, **Marc Quilling** and **Peter Raymond** will compete for the backup spot. Quilling seems to have caught the coaches' eye through the early weeks of spring ball. Freshman **Ryan O'Neil**, the only freshman QB, will also look to take some snaps.

The Leopards' stable of quarterbacks will benefit from the addition of passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach **Mickey Fein**. Fein, who served as offensive coordinator at Murray State and Tennessee-Martin, was a standout player at the FCS level, graduating from Maine where he was a four-year starter and two-time team MVP. With Fein and offensive coordinator **Bob Heffner** working together with Tavani on the play calling, the Leopards' offensive game plan will be simplified in 2008.

Running the ball will continue to be a focus for Lafayette, but who Curley will be handing it off to has yet to be decided for the 2008 season. The likely starter is senior **Maurice White** who was slated to be the Leopards' workhorse in 2007, but saw his season limited by injury.

## 2008 Season Outlook

White rushed for 249 yards over four games, but missed the final seven with a high ankle sprain. White scored four touchdowns as a junior following a sophomore season in which he averaged 6.3 yards per carry and punched it in the end zone four times.

Three juniors will be pushing White for playing time, each of whom made their case for carries in the 2007 season. **Tyrell Coon** played in every game and started the final two contests of the season. He ripped off 96 yards in his first career start against Holy Cross and followed with 95 yards in a win at Lehigh.

**Matt Ferber** is a changeup back coming out of the Leopards' backfield, bringing more power and less speed to the tailback spot. Ferber played in every game and started the Bucknell contest when he pounded his way to 102 yards on 26 carries. Sophomore **Joshua Trouser** is also pushing for time.

The speedy **DeAndre' Morrow** saw time in eight games and started the Harvard and Fordham contests for the Leopards. He carried the ball 58 times for 245 yards and a touchdown.

"At tailback, we really have a very talented, hungry group of kids. It's really a luxury to have a stable of running backs like them," Tavani said.

Russo returns to the fullback position where he will also serve as the team's co-captain. The Utica, N.Y. native is one of the top players at his position in the conference and is coming off a 2007 campaign in which he earned All-Patriot League First-Team status. Russo carried the ball 26 times for 126 yards and 4.8 yards per carry and a touchdown. In addition to his blocking abilities, Russo was used as a receiver out of the backfield, catching 12 balls for 96 yards and two touchdowns.

Junior **Jeff Cumming** is a more than capable backup

for Russo, and proved that with starts in his final two games of the 2007 season. Against Lehigh, Cumming reeled in a 37-yard pass that led to a score before halftime.

At wide receiver, the Leopards were hit hard by graduation, but senior **Shaun Adair** returns to head the corps. Adair was the Leopards' leading receiver in 2007, making 41 catches for 538 yards and four touchdowns while coming off a sophomore campaign in which he made 33 catches for 501 yards. As a junior, Adair broke into the top 10 on Lafayette's career receiving yards list (1,431) and now ranks 10th in school history. He is three catches shy of the top 10 career receptions list with 96.

**Tim Watson** is the projected starter at the other wide receiver slot. The senior saw time in every game last season while grabbing nine balls for 98 yards.

Juniors **James Fisher** and **Troy Robinson** will be in the mix as well as sophomores **Nathan Padia**, **Mitchell Bennett** and **Mark Layton**.

"Nathan Padia has gotten a lot stronger during his first year here and I think he is one of those guys you look at who could see a lot more playing time this season," Tavani said. "We really need a couple of guys to step up at wide receiver."

The Leopards return two outstanding tight ends in senior **Michael Conte** and junior **Adam Gill**. Conte earned All-Patriot League Second-Team honors last season and started the last two games of the season. Conte averaged 11.1 yards per catch. Gill started eight games as a sophomore and made six grabs for 104 yards (17.3). Also joining the mix is senior **Brendan Willard** who played in seven games.

On the offensive line, Lafayette will need to replace an All-American at left tackle in Jesse Padilla and a two-time

All-Patriot League selection in Greg Lippert. The right side of the line remains in tact as junior **Ryan Hart-Predmore** and senior **Leo Plenski** return at right guard and tackle, respectively. Hart-Predmore started in all but one game last season while Plenski started six and played in all but one. Sophomore **Scott Lavon** and junior **Roy Wotring** will challenge for playing time. **Michael Wojcik**, who started seven games in 2007, will occupy the center position and will be backed up by sophomore **Michael Butler**.

On the other side of the line, senior **Joe Moore**, who worked his way into the starting lineup four times last season, will compete with sophomore **Will Sloat** for the left tackle spot while junior **Brian Wycinowski** will battle with **Anthony Mangovski** for the guard spot.

Associate head coach Heffner, who has taken over offensive coordinator and play-calling duties, will still manage the offensive line. He will be without the services of D.J. Brown who was forced to end his career due to a recurring back injury. Heffner has moved senior **Jerrell Robinson** from the defensive line to the offensive side of things where he will compete for a tackle spot.

"How soon we can get the offensive line pieced together and working well is going to be an early determining factor in our success," Tavani said.

### ON DEFENSE

From a statistical standpoint, Lafayette featured the top-ranked defense in the nation during the 2007 season. Under the tutelage of defensive coordinator **John Loose**, the Leopards were first in the nation in total defense, surrendering 260.9 yards per game. Lafayette was ranked fourth in rushing defense (85.7 ypg), eighth in scoring defense (16.9 ppg) and 15th in pass efficiency defense (108.3).

The de facto leader of the defense last season has a title go along with his leadership role this season, as senior Romans has been named a team co-captain. Romans, who is the reigning Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year, holds down one of three linebacker spots in the Leopards' ever-changing 4-3 set.

The mobile, hard-hitting Romans has led the team in tackles the past two seasons and averaged 10.3 tackles per game in 2007 while earning team MVP honors. He made 12.5 tackles for loss, including three sacks, and forced three fumbles.

Junior **Mark Leggiere**, who is one of three returning defensive players to earn All-Patriot League honors, will hold down the middle linebacker spot. Leggiere was the youngest starter in an experienced linebacking corps a year ago and finished second on the team with 77 tackles (6.5 for a loss) and tallied three sacks. **Spencer Brown** is expected to play the other outside linebacker spot. Brown played in nine games with 11 tackles, two sacks and a fumble recovery.

Sophomore **Lewis Irving** and junior **Samuel Leland** are listed as the backups at outside linebacker while **Evan Nardone** will compete at middle linebacker.

"Obviously, our linebacking corps is one of the strongest areas for us this season," Tavani said. "Romans and Leggiere are returning starters and we expect Spencer Brown, who has been a big contributor on special teams, to be able to step in for us."

Up front, Lafayette will have to deal with the departure of All-Patriot League First-Team selection Kyle Sprenkle. Junior **Ian Dell** and senior **Kody Babcock** will both make their play for the opportunity to replace Sprenkle. Junior **Andrew Poulson** returns to the noseguard spot

where he started six of the Leopards' last eight games. Poulson registered 35 tackles (6.5 for loss) and 3.5 sacks. Sophomore **Michael Phillips** slides in behind him on the depth chart.

The defensive ends will likely have a much different look in the fall than they do in the spring as at least one senior starter, **Luke Schade**, is not participating in the spring practice. Schade will return as a fifth-year senior and is not currently enrolled in school. Fellow senior **Jason Mills** will likely occupy the other end. Sophomore **Jeff Katz**, who is out for the spring with a torn pectoral muscle, and junior **Alan Whitesell** will also compete for significant playing time along with sophomores **Doug Gerowski** and **Matt Shula**.

The entire Leopard defensive backfield brings experience to the starting lineup led by senior cornerback **Marvin Clecidor** and senior strong safety **Nigel Bryant**. Clecidor was second in the Patriot League in passes defended with 10 pass breakups and two interceptions. He will enter his third year as a starter. Bryant is the team's third-leading returning tackler, after making 53 stops while starting all but one game in 2007. Bryant will be backed up by sophomore **Nick Nardone**.

Junior **Carlos Lowe** played in nine games last year with two starts and looks to be at the top of the depth chart at the other cornerback position. Lowe and Clecidor will be backed up by sophomores **Donald Ellis** and **Jarred Ricks**.

Junior **Nick Oliver** is expected to take over at free safety where he will compete with sophomore **Eric McGovern** for playing time. Oliver made three starts during his sophomore season and was used when Loose employed his spread-option containing defense. Oliver collected Patriot League Defensive Player of the Week honors following the Princeton game when he made 12

tackles (3.5 for loss) with a sack.

"In the defensive backfield, we have two guys who have a lot of experience in Marvin (Clecidor) and Nigel (Bryant)," Tavani said. "We expect Carlos Lowe and Nick Oliver to step up for us as full-time starters."

### ON SPECIAL TEAMS

One of the questions answered by the 2007 season was who would play the role of placekicker. Sophomore **David Rodriguez** stepped into the void and has cemented himself in the role. With five seconds remaining on the clock at Penn, Rodriguez booted the game-winning field goal to give Lafayette an 8-0 victory and a 3-0 start to the season. He went on to make 8-of-13 field goals, including a season-long of 41 yards in a win over Holy Cross. Rodriguez was more than solid on PAT's, nailing 31-of-33 to finish the season with 55 points. Junior **Chris Cosgrove** will serve as his backup and will likely handle kickoff duties, as he did in 2007.

Cosgrove will also serve as the backup punter to projected starter **Tom Kondash**. Coming out of State College High School, Kondash was an all-state selection and a Big 33 Game participant.

One constant in the special teams game has been Plenski, who enters his third season as the long snapper. Curley will serve as the holder and will likely be backed up by Cosgrove and Raymond.

In the return game, Adair will continue to be the go-to guy for Tavani. The senior averaged 14 yards per return on 19 attempts in 2007 and returned a punt 78 yards for a touchdown in the season opener vs. Marist. Padia has been inserted as the No. 2 punt returner. Adair fielded 18 kickoffs and averaged 18.4 yards per return with a season

long of 56 vs. Princeton. Watson, who returned seven kicks for an average of 23.3 yards, will also be deep on kicks.

### THE SCHEDULE

Lafayette's 2008 football schedule has been solidified in terms of dates and opponents. Times will be announced as they become available and are less likely to change.

The schedule will feature multiple home games under the lights of Fisher Stadium. Last year marked the first time in the program's 126-year history that the Leopards played a home night game.

The Leopards will kick off their 127th season on Sept. 6 when they travel to Poughkeepsie, N.Y. to take on Marist for the fifth time in program history. This will be the fourth straight year that Lafayette has played the Red Foxes in its season opener. The Leopards' home opener will be the following week (Sept. 13) against Patriot League foe Georgetown.

After facing Georgetown, Lafayette will have a week to rest before hosting Ivy League members Penn (Sept. 27) and Harvard (Oct. 4). The Leopards beat Penn in 2007 at Franklin Field with an exciting last-minute field goal in an 8-7 victory.

On Oct. 11, Lafayette will play its first of five straight road games against Columbia at Wien Stadium in New York City. It will be the first time the Leopards go five straight weeks without a home game since the 1996 season. They will then travel to Lynchburg, Va. to play the 2007 Big South Conference champions Liberty University for the first time in school history on Oct. 18. The Flames went 8-3 last year with a perfect 4-0 conference record.

The Leopards will resume league play on Oct. 25 with a road trip to the Bronx, N.Y. to take on reigning conference champ Fordham. Games at Colgate (Nov. 1) and Bucknell (Nov. 8) close the five-game road swing.

Lafayette returns home for its final two regular-season games, the first against Holy Cross on Nov. 15. The team will wrap up the 2008 season by hosting the 144th meeting of college football's most-played rivalry between Lafayette and Lehigh. The Leopards have won four straight and five of the last six against the Mountain Hawks, sewing up a 21-17 victory at Goodman Stadium in 2007. Lafayette has the opportunity to win five straight over Lehigh for the first time since 1943-49 when Lafayette ripped off nine straight.

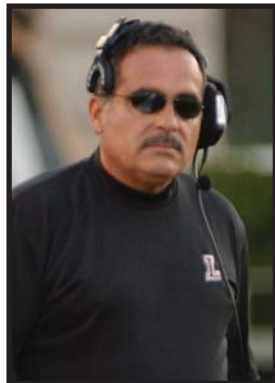

## Head Coach Frank Tavani



Now entering his ninth season as head coach, **Frank Tavani** has transformed the Lafayette football program into a consistent championship contender. The Leopards have spent time in the top 25 each of the last four seasons.

Tavani's teams hold a 19-5 Patriot League record over the last four years and won three consecutive Patriot League championships from 2004 to 2006, resulting in three straight NCAA Playoff appearances.

A top motivator, Tavani became Lafayette's 27th head coach on Dec. 11, 1999 after having served as the Leopards' running backs coach for 13 seasons. His mission was simple: restore the once proud Lafayette program to glory. Since then, the Leopards have made the first three postseason appearances in school history, laying claim to the Patriot League's automatic bid to the playoffs in 2004 and 2006, while earning the program's first at-large bid in 2005.

In addition to Patriot League championships and NCAA Playoff appearances, Lafayette has taken care of business close to home. In 2007 the Leopards defeated their crosstown rival Lehigh, 21-17, for the fourth straight time while dashing the Mountain Hawks hopes of 10th straight winning season. The victory allowed the Class of 2008 to leave College Hill without ever having lost to its archrival, a feat not equaled since the since the Class of 1950.

Tavani's ability to get the most out of his team is unmatched. Over the last four years, Lafayette has compiled 29 wins for the best record since the Class of 1927 won 29 games from 1923-1926. The Leopards' near upsets of defending national champion Delaware in 2004 and eventual national champion Appalachian State in 2005, both in enemy territory, cemented Tavani's reputation for getting his teams ready for big games.

In 2004, Tavani was named Patriot League Coach of Year after leading the Leopards to their first championship in a decade, despite being picked no higher than fifth in the preseason poll of the league's coaches. He was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award for his efforts, and signed a five-year contract extension following the season. Tavani added two more years to his contract after 2006's successful title defense and tacked on another two following the 2007 season, allowing him to patrol the sidelines at Fisher Stadium through at least 2014.

Tavani has been a part of six Patriot League championship teams in his 20 years at Lafayette. He came to College Hill in 1987, and the Leopards captured their first league crown the next year. He was also the running backs coach on the 1992 and 1994 championship teams, and has secured each of the last three titles as the head coach.

During his tenure, Tavani has coached some of the top players in the program's history. **Andy Romans**, the 2007 Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year, anchored the No. 1-ranked defense in the country which allowed just 85 yards per game on the ground and 175.2 yards per game through the air. He led the Leopards with 113 tackles and is the third Lafayette player, and first under Tavani, to win the award. Romans and the Leopards finished in second place in the Patriot League standings, one conference win away from a fourth straight title.

Jonathan Hurt '07, the 2006 Patriot League Offensive Player of



the Year, grinded out 1,165 rushing yards as a senior, giving Tavani a 1,000-yard rusher in 10 of his 20 seasons on the Leopards' coaching staff. He has recruited and coached the top four rushers in Lafayette history (five of the top six) and has mentored four different tailbacks to Offensive Player of the Year honors. Erik Marsh '95, the Patriot League's all-time leading rusher, was recognized in 1992 and 1993, while Joe

## Head Coach Frank Tavani

McCourt '05 took the honors in 2004 and Tom Costello '92 was the recipient in 1989.

An explosive offense guided by that running attack has been a staple of Tavani-led football programs. McCourt finished his career in 2004 as the all-time school and Patriot League-leader with 50 rushing touchdowns and is second in Lafayette annals with 4,474 yards on the ground. Marko Glavic and John Weyrauch concluded their careers in 2003 after rewriting the Lafayette record book. Glavic owns nearly every school passing record as well as Patriot League records for passing yards (9,819) and total offense (10,064 yards) while Weyrauch is Lafayette's all-time leader in both receptions (162) and receiving yards (2,406).

While Lafayette won when outside expectations were low in 2004 and defended its championship with an experienced senior class last season, the difficulties of an anticipated "three-peat" may have made the Leopards' 2006 performance Tavani's best coaching job. The Leopards broke into the top 25 early in the season, only to drop the next four against an extremely challenging Ivy League slate, and the losing streak was extended to five by Holy Cross. Lafayette went to Colgate on Oct. 28 facing a 10-game losing streak to the Raiders, a perennial conference contender, but a convincing 27-10 victory in Hamilton, N.Y. resurrected the Leopards' season and provided the impetus for the stretch run.

After wins over Fordham and Georgetown, Lafayette entered the 142nd game with Lehigh in a familiar situation - win and you're in. Tavani went back to the black jerseys that the Leopards wore for the 2004 game, which resulted in a 24-10 win over the Mountain Hawks. While the sartorial switch wasn't the reason for Lafayette's 49-27 triumph this time around, it allowed Tavani and the Leopards to claim their third straight championship in style.

The Leopards' postseason performances have been just as impressive against a trio of teams that have competed for the national championship. In 2006, Lafayette trailed No. 3 seed Massachusetts 21-14 late in the third quarter before the Minutemen shook the Leopards with a pair of late scores for a 35-14 victory. UMass went on to play Appalachian State in the national championship game.

In 2005, Lafayette traveled to Appalachian State, the No. 2 seed in the field. The Leopards led 17-10 at the half and entered the fourth quarter tied at 20-all before the Mountaineers emerged with a 34-23 victory, and went on to win the first of three straight national titles. The previous season, Tavani took his team to defending national champion Delaware and gave the Blue Hens all they could handle. A long touchdown drive capped by a one-yard run by McCourt gave the Leopards a one-point lead in the fourth quarter, before an 87-yard fumble return for a touchdown in the final three minutes turned the tide for Delaware in a 28-14 victory.

Tavani resurrected the program with the second-best turnaround in I-AA football during the 2002 season. Lafayette improved upon a 2-8 season in 2001 with a 7-5 overall record and 5-2 league mark, which included a 14-7 win vs. Lehigh for the first victory over the Mountain Hawks in seven seasons. Although the Leopards finished 5-6 in 2003, the still proved the turnaround was no fluke. Four of those losses were by a touchdown or less, including two against Top 25 opponents.

Tavani's student-athletes are also getting the job done in the classroom, with 23 CoSIDA Academic All-District honorees in his eight seasons as head coach, and a total of 38 players have earned the distinction since 1995. Lafayette has also claimed four of the last seven Patriot League Football Scholar-Athletes of the Year and three straight



(Brad Maurer – 2006, Maurice Bennett – 2005, Stephen Bono – 2004, Stewart Kupfer – 2001). The Leopards also boasted 21 student-athletes qualify for the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll in 2007, the most the team has had since the 2001 season.

Tavani's impact has extended beyond the playing field and the classroom. He worked with college officials and major donors on the \$23 million transformation of Fisher Stadium. The project included new spectator seating, a FieldTurf playing surface, a new press box, 19'-by-35' video matrix board and the construction of the 24,000 square foot home of Lafayette Football at the Bourger Varsity Football House.

The year before coming to Lafayette, Tavani served as the defensive coordinator at Lebanon Valley College, his *alma mater*. During that time, he was also Lebanon Valley's director of alumni services and parents' programs, activating 15 alumni chapters. From 1976-85, Tavani was the offensive coordinator at Franklin and Marshall College, helping guide the Diplomats to a 10-year record of 67-23-1.

As an undergraduate at Lebanon Valley, Tavani was an outstanding running back, earning the team's Most Valuable Player honors twice in his career. As a senior, he became the school's first player to rush for more than 1,000 yards in a single season. An Associated Press All-American as a senior, he was inducted into the school's Athletic Hall of Fame in the fall of 1988. Tavani was inducted into the Lebanon Catholic High School Hall of Fame in its inaugural class in March 2004 and joined the Central Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame in November 2006.

Tavani earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology from Lebanon Valley in 1975, and has completed postgraduate work in Counselor Education.

Tavani and his wife, Agnes, reside on College Hill with their dog Rocky, and are the parents of four children. Liam and Meghan are graduates of Lafayette, earning their degrees in 2003 and 2006, respectively. Daniel graduated from Wofford College in 2007 where he was a four-year letterwinner for the football team. Bridget is a high school junior at Notre Dame Green Pond.

In the second quarter, White added his second TD of the game, a seven-yard scoring run. White finished with nine carries for 55 yards. Lafayette's defense spent more time on the field in the second quarter as Marist scored its first points of the game on a 38-yard field goal by Rowe.

Lafayette led 35-3 after the first half following a 15-yard rush from **Anthony D'Urso** that finished off a 66-yard drive. The senior ended with 70 yards on 11 carries.

The Leopards added two more touchdowns in the second half, a 12-yard DiPaola strike to **Joe Russo** and a 23-yard TD run from **Brandon Mitchell**.

Defensively, **Andrew Poulson** finished the game with two sacks while **Andy Romans** added four tackles, a sack and a fumble recovery. **Chris Bacon** led the team with six tackles while cornerback **Marvin Clecidor** had an interception in the third quarter.

Battling intense heat, the Leopards scored on their first two possessions. Junior wide receiver **Shaun Adair** put the Leopards on the board four minutes into the game with an 11-yard touchdown catch from **Michael DiPaola**.

Lafayette increased its lead to 14-0 after an eight-play, 61-yard drive that ended with tailback **Maurice White** strolling into the endzone on a four-yard carry. With five minutes left in the first half, White scored again, this time on a 21-yard rush.

Georgetown linebacker John Cassidy kept the scoring gap from widening further by intercepting a DiPaola pass at the 43-yard line with two minutes remaining in the half. Senior free safety **Marcel Quarterman** returned the favor by breaking up a pass at the four-yard line that likely would have resulted in a touchdown for the Hoyas. The teams went into the locker rooms with the Leopards up 21-0.

Four minutes into the second half, linebacker **Spencer Brown** penetrated into the backfield and tackled Mychal Harrison for a four-yard loss on a fourth-and-one.

Lafayette's defense was highlighted by Quarterman's interception return for a touchdown in the third quarter, putting the Leopards up 28-0. **Andy Romans** led the defense with 11 tackles, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. **Ian Dell** recorded his first career sack.

The Hoyas were able to avoid a shutout when they scored on an eight-yard touchdown run with four minutes remaining in the game.

DiPaola went 9-for-17 for 152 yards and one touchdown. **Rob Curley** entered the game in the third quarter and played the remainder of the contest. On the final drive of the game, Curley showed his elusiveness by running the ball for 12 yards after initially being stopped at the line.

Lafayette had a chance to come back. On fourth-and-five DiPaola rushed for five yards to the Princeton 20 and a first down. A holding call negated the play and pushed Lafayette back to the Princeton 30. DiPaola was sacked on the next play to end the drive and seal the Princeton victory.

Defensively for the Leopards, sophomore **Nick Oliver** and senior **Kyle Sprengle** led the team with 12 tackles apiece.

Romans led a stout defensive effort and ended the game with a team-high 13 tackles, including three for a loss of 17 yards.
