Jim Rogalski most recently served as the Head Coach at the University of Scranton and joins the Lafayette coaching staff as the 19th head coach in the program's 86-year history.

As the head man at Scranton, Rogalski led the Royals to the 2011 Landmark Conference Championship and the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance in his first season on the sidelines. He compiled an 18-15 record after two consecutive winning seasons and also coached Scranton's first All-American this past year.

Prior to taking over at Scranton, Rogalski spent six seasons on the coaching staff at Rutgers, beginning in 2004. He spent three seasons as the head assistant lacrosse coach before being promoted to associate head coach in 2007.

In his first three seasons under Jim Stagnitta at Rutgers, Rogalski handled various coaching and administrative duties, including game and practice planning, recruiting, monitoring NCAA compliance, as well as organizing clinics for local youth players and youth coaches. In his role as associate head coach, he oversaw the Scarlet Knights' recruiting efforts, which resulted in nationally-ranked recruiting classes by Inside Lacrosse magazine in 2007 and 2008 and commitments from five High School All-Americans for the 2011 season.

He has also served as an assistant coach at Drexel University, Washington & Lee University, Goucher College, Western New England College, and St. Mary's College of Maryland, his alma mater.

Rogalski's time at Drexel spanned three years, when he served as the defensive and recruiting coordinators. In his first season with the Dragons, the team recorded nine wins, the fourth-most in the program's history at the time. He also coached three players who earned All-Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) honors and another who was named the conference's rookie of the year in 2002.

At St. Mary's, Rogalski was a four-year letterman and three-year starter, in addition to a two-time All-Capital Athletic Conference honoree.



Matt Musci enters his first season under Head Coach Jim Rogalski and will handle running the Lafayette offense and the program's recruiting efforts.

Musci spent the previous four seasons as the first assistant lacrosse coach at St. Leo University in St. Leo, Fla. where he was the defensive coordinator for three seasons before taking over as offensive coordinator this past season. He was also in charge of recruiting and travel planning in addition to helping maintain St. Leo's scholarship budget.

Under the guidance of Head Coach Brad Jorgensen, Musci was on the sidelines for St. Leo's Deep South Conference Tournament Championships in 2009 and 2010. In those two championship seasons, St. Leo finished ranked in the top-10 nationally in Team Defense PPG. For his efforts in 2010, Musci was a finalist for the USILA Division II Assistant Coach of the Year. He also graduated with a Masters of Business Administration from St. Leo in May of 2011.

Prior to his time at St. Leo, Musci was an undergraduate assistant coach at Drexel, his alma mater. He graduated in 2007 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Psychology after serving as a team captain during his final two years in Philadelphia. Musci played for two seasons ('02-'04) under Rogalski during his tenure as an assistant at Drexel.

A native of Garden City Park, N.Y., Musci was selected to the USILA North/South Senior All-Star team and was the Most Valuable Player during his senior year. He was also named the program's Most Outstanding Player in 2005. The 2006 Colonial Athletic Association Scholar Athlete was also the winner of the Randy Voight Coaches Award in 2004.

Williams hails from Florham Park, N.J. and was an assistant under Rogalski the past two seasons at Scranton where he was the program's recruiting and travel coordinator.

A former standout player at Lycoming College in Williamsport, Pa. he graduated in 2010 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in criminal justice. He was a four-year starter at midfield for the Warriors, earning First Team All-Middle Atlantic Conference honors in 2009 and second team recognition in 2010. Williams finished his career with 97 goals and 40 assists for 137 total points.

The Program

The program is designed to provide high school athletes with an understanding of the “Division 1 Lacrosse Experience at Lafayette College.” Our approach and format includes several different aspects of what current Lafayette lacrosse players experience on a daily basis within our program.

The Schedule

Five sessions that are unique to Lafayette College lacrosse. Practice, film/game preparations, weight room training, player skill development, and full team scrimmages will all be incorporated; as well as, exposure to NCAA Division 1 college game rules.

Lafayette College

Students say Lafayette is a special place because of the breadth of the curriculum, encompassing the arts and humanities, social and natural sciences, and engineering. It gives Lafayette a “university feel” in an environment dedicated to the undergraduate. Professors work with students from vastly different disciplines on a regular basis to solve real problems. This is the hallmark of a Lafayette liberal arts education.

Founded in 1826 by citizens of Easton, Pennsylvania, and named for the Marquis de Lafayette in honor of his “talents, virtues, and services in the great cause of freedom.” Lafayette offers Bachelor of Arts in 37 fields; Bachelor of Science in 10 fields of science and 4 fields of engineering. At Lafayette, there are approximately 2,400 students; 53 percent men, 47 percent women. Students come from 42 U.S. states and territories and 37 countries.

Lafayette offers 215 full-time faculty members, 99 percent holding a doctorate or other terminal degree and offers 10.5 to 1 student-faculty ratio. Located in Easton, Pennsylvania, the campus is about 70 miles west of New York City and 60 miles north of Philadelphia and the Pocono Mountains are about 35 miles north.

Lafayette’s 23-sport, NCAA Division I athletics program competes in the Patriot League in 11 sports for men. According to the latest NCAA report, Lafayette ranks third in the nation in student-athlete graduation success rate.

5. Participants are expected to wear all of the necessary and required equipment for participation in lacrosse.
6. Participants are expected to report any and all injuries to a member of the event medical staff.
7. Participants are expected to treat all Ski Lax, Inc. facilities with respect. There is no tolerance for any acts of vandalism or actions that result in damage to property.
