#### TONIGHT'S MATCHUP

Lamar enters tonight's contest with a 10-5 overall record and a 2-2 record and Southland Conference play, which is tied with Stephen F. Austin for fifth place in the league standings. The Cardinals are coming off a 66-60 home loss to Southeastern Louisiana on Wednesday, the second loss in two weeks to the Lions. That snapped Lamar's two-game winning streak, but the Cardinals have still won six of their last eight games. Stephen F. Austin, who is 8-7 overall and 2-2 in SLC play, is coming off an 85-67 win at Nicholls State on Wednesday. The Lumberjacks have also won six of their last eight games. This will be the 41st meeting between Lamar and SFA with the Cardinals holding a 22-18 all-time series advantage. Lamar is 15-7 in games played in Beaumont and 7-11 in Nacogdoches ... Lamar won the only meeting between the two schools last season, 63-60, on Feb. 25, 2004. SFA won both meetings during the 2002-03 season, 74-62 in Nacogdoches (1/16/03) and 77-73 in Beaumont (2/20/03). Lamar has won 13 of the last 16 meetings in the series. Since returning to the SLC, Lamar is 9-3 vs. SFA. Billy Tubbs is 3-0 vs. SFA (2-0) at Lamar. Danny Kaspar is 3-5 vs. Lamar. Kaspar, who played at North Texas when Tubbs was an assistant coach with the Mean Green, was an assistant coach on Tubbs' staff during the 1979-80 season, when the Cardinals advanced to the Sweet 16. Tonight's game will be televised "live" on KFDM-TV Channel 6 with Dan Gresham and Mike Friedman calling the action.

#### LAST GAME - Southeastern Louisiana 66, at Lamar 60 (1/19/05)

Junior Alan Daniels led three players in double-figures for Lamar, but it was not enough as Southeastern Louisiana used a 20-4 second half run to claim a 66-60 win over the Cardinals in Southland Conference men's basketball action at the Montagne Center. The Cardinals took a 30-29 lead into the locker room at

halftime and quickly extended their lead to eight points to start the second half in a three-pointer by Mike Levy, a dunk by Nashid Beard and a jumper by Levy. That put Lamar up 37-29 at 17:56 of the second half. After SLU's Nate Lofton hit a pair of free throws and Ricky Woods converted a layup, Daniels nailed a three-pointer that put Lamar up seven, 40-33, with 15:54 remaining. That was the Cardinals last made field goal until Daniels broke the drought with a three-pointer at 5:29. Lamar's only points during that run were a pair of free throws by Daniels, three free throws by Teddy Davis and one free throw by Beard. Trailing 35-42, SLU scored nine straight points to take a two-point lead, 44-42, on a layup by Jonathan Walker. After Beard's and Davis' free throws tied the game, Walker put the Lions up for good with a jumper at 12:26. Walker capped the run with a pair of free throws at 7:40 that put the Lions 55-46. Daniels tried to his best to keep the Cardinals close, hitting back-to-back three-pointers to cut SLU's lead to three, 57-54, with 5:03 left in the game. A Daniels layup and a tip-in dunk by Jason Grant trimmed the lead to two, 60-58, at 2:55. After Woods hit a pair of free throws to push the lead to 62-58, Levy hit a jumper in the lane to make the score 62-60 with 1:52 on the clock. Woods converted a layup and Lamar turned the ball over twice in the final minute to enable the Lions escape with the win. Daniels was 5-of-8 from the field, including 3-of-4 from 3-point range, and 7-of-9 from the free throw line in scoring his game-high 20 points. Levy, making his first start of the season, added 13 points and Beard chipped in 10. Grant came off the bench to grab 10 rebounds and block two shots. Lamar shot 43.2 percent from the field, 30.8 percent from 3-point range and 72 percent from the free throw line. Woods recorded a double-double for SLU with 17 points and 13 rebounds. Walker came off the bench to score 15 points on 6-of-8 shooting from the field. Terry Bryant added 13 points on 5-of-9 shooting, including 2-of-3 from 3-point range. Lofton scored 11 points, grabbed nine rebounds and dished out seven assists. SLU shot 42.3 percent from the field, 25 percent from 3-point range and 65.5 percent from the free throw line. The Lions outrebounded Lamar 35 to 30, including grabbing 13 on the offensive glass.

### SCOUTING STEPHEN F. AUSTIN

Stephen F. Austin is 8-7 overall and 2-2 in Southland Conference play under fifth-year coach Danny Kaspar (72-56). The Lumberjacks are coming off an 85-67 win at Nicholls State on Wednesday. SFA has won six of its last eight games. The Lumberjacks opened SLC play with a home loss to league-leading Northwestern State (63-69), and have won two of their last three games all on the road, winning at UL-Monroe (67-59) and Nicholls State with a loss at Sam Houston (57-63) in between. Junior guard Marcus Clark scored a game-high 29 points, going 12-of-18 from the field and 4-of-5 from the free throw line in Wednesday's win at Nicholls. Sophomore Josh Porter added 19 points on 7-of-13 shooting, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range. Clark leads SFA in scoring at 15.3 ppg (19.2 ppg in SLC play) and is shooting 47.7% from the field and 87.4% (76-87) from the free throw line. Porter is second on the team in scoring at 13.4 ppg and is shooting 44.0% from the field and is the team's top 3-point shooter at 43.7% (31-71). Anthony Paez is the only other Lumberjack averaging double-figures at 11.5 ppg on 50% (65-130) shooting from the field. Hank Rivers leads the team in rebounding at 6.3 rpg and Clark is tops in assists (68) and steals (24). SFA is averaging 70.1 ppg and is shooting 46.6% from the field, 40.4% from 3-point range and 74.9% from the free throw line.

### ON THIS DATE IN LAMAR BASKETBALL HISTORY

This will be Lamar's 14th game on January 22. The Cardinals are 8-5 all-time on this date with a 7-4 record in games played in Beaumont and 1-1 on the road. Lamar has played Louisiana Tech three times on this date, posting a 2-1 record against the Bulldogs. La. Tech won the first meeting on this date, 107-100, in 1973 and Lamar won the next two meetings in Beaumont - 68-65 in 1979 and 51-43 in 1983. The Cardinals have won the last two games on this date, beating Nicholls State 70-63 in 2000 and Southeastern Louisiana 74-46 in 2001.

### IN SOUTHLAND CONFERENCE PLAY

In Southland Conference play only, Alan Daniels leads the team in scoring at 18.3 ppg and is shooting 53.7% from the field, 46.7% (7-15) from 3-point range and 73.3% (22-30) from the free throw line. He is also averaging 4.5 rpg. Teddy Davis is second on the team in scoring at 12.0 ppg and is shooting 59.1% (13-22) from the field and 90.9% (20-22) from the free throw line. Raymond Anthony is averaging 10.5 ppg and is shooting 43.8% (14-32) from the field, 36.4% (8-22) from 3-point range and 54.5% (6-11) from the free throw line. He also leads the team with 18 assists and seven steals. Lamar is averaging 70.2 ppg and is shooting 43.3% from the field, 32.8% from 3-point range and 75.2% from the free throw line. The Cardinals have a plus-0.3 scoring margin and a minus-2.5 (35.0 to 37.5) rebound margin.

### LAMAR RANKS AMONG THE NCAA LEADERS

Junior Alan Daniels ranks 32nd in the NCAA (1/17) in both scoring (19.2 ppg) and three-point percentage (.443). Raymond Anthony ranks 48th in the NCAA in three-point percentage (.394). Lamar ranks 16th in the NCAA in scoring at 81.7 ppg, and is 42nd in blocked shots per game (4.9) and 47th in scoring margin (10.1). The NCAA updates the stats every Monday.

## 4 • 2004-05 Lamar Basketball Game Notes

### DOUBLING UP THE COMPETITION

Lamar players have recorded eight double-doubles in points and rebounds this season. Junior Josh Goodwin has recorded four double-doubles and Alan Daniels and Thomas Fairley have each recorded two double-doubles. The following is a list of Lamar's double-doubles this season.

### LAMAR INCONSISTENT AT FREE THROW LINE

Lamar, who entered the game at Tulsa shooting 63.2% from the free throw line, shot a blistering 92.0% (23-of-25) from the charity stripe in the Cardinals 91-85 win. Lamar made 12-of-13 in the final 1:11 to seal the win. Raymond Anthony leads the team and the SLC in free throw percentage (.880) and Teddy Davis is second on the team at 80.6%. However, the Cardinals slipped to 58.6% (17-29) in their 86-70 win over Arkansas State (12/28) and 60% (27-45) in their win vs. Central Oklahoma (12/30). The Cardinals shot 84.2% (14-17) from the free throw line at SE Louisiana (1/5/05) and 76% (19-25) vs. Texas State (1/8/05). Lamar is now shooting 67.7% from the free throw line as a team and 75.2% in SLC games.

### TRENDY CONDITIONS

Lamar is 9-2 at home and 1-3 on the road this season. The Cardinals are 9-2 when leading at halftime and 1-3 when trailing at halftime, 5-4 when outrebounding opponents and 5-1 when being outrebounded. Lamar is 9-1 when shooting better than its opponent and 7-0 when committing less turnovers. The Cardinals are 4-1 when forcing 20 or more turnovers and 2-2 when turning it over 20 or more times; 5-0 with more assists than opponents and 5-5 when opponents have more assists. Lamar is 6-5 in games decided by 10 points or less and 2-2 in games decided by five points or less. Lamar is 6-0 when scoring 80 or more points and 8-3 when allowing opponents 80 points or less.

### SAGARIN RATINGS

Lamar is currently 172 in the Sagarin Ratings (1/20) and Northwestern State the highest of any Southland Conference team at 155, followed by SE Louisiana at 160. Stephen F. Austin is rated 280. The SLC is rated 24th of 31 conferences and the ACC is the top rated conference.

### HOME SWEET HOME

Lamar will play 16 games in the Montagne Center this season. The Cardinals also played 16 home games last season, posting an 11-5 record. Since the Montagne Center opened (1984-85), Lamar has won 67.9% of its games in the 10,080-seat arena. During his previous stint at Lamar, Billy Tubbs' teams posted a 49-8 (.859) home record at McDonald Gym. Overall, Lamar has won 73.8% of its home games since the 1951-52 season, the Cardinals' first year competing as a four-year institution. The Cardinals are 9-2 at home this season.

### ROAD LOSING STREAK SNAPPED

Lamar snapped its 17-game road losing streak in a big way, winning 91-85 at Tulsa (12/22/04). Dating back to the final two games of the 2002-03 season, the Cardinals had lost 17 straight games away from the friendly confines of the Montagne Center. Lamar was 0-11 on the road and 0-2 at a neutral site last season and is 0-2 on the road this season following losses at North Texas, 70-66 (11/27) and at Rice, 81-75 (12/16). Prior to Tulsa, the Cardinals last road win was 62-47 at Northwestern State (2/27/03).

### LAMAR'S TV SCHEDULE

Lamar's television package for the 2004-05 season includes a games being televised on KFDM-TV in Beaumont, Fox Sports Net-Southwest and Cox Cable. For the fifth straight season, Lamar and KFDM-TV (Ch. 6) have reached an agreement that will televise "live" seven (7) games this season, three at home and four on the road. This marks the fourth year that Lamar has been included in the Southland Conference's TV package with FSN-Southwest. The Cardinals will be featured twice this season with both games being televised from the Montagne Center. Lamar's game Mar. 2 at UL-Monroe will be televised on Cox Cable Sports. ### LAMAR LOOKS TO IMPROVE RECORD IN TV GAMES

For the fifth straight season, Lamar and KFDM-TV have worked an agreement that will televise "live" seven Cardinal basketball games this season. Four of the seven games will be televised on KFDM-Ch. 6 while the remaining three will be shown on Time Warner-Ch. 18. However, Lamar hopes to improve its record in televised games. In fact, Lamar enters this season with a 5-19 over the last four years in games televised by KFDM-TV, going 0-6 in 2000-01, 0-4 in 2001-02, 3-4 in 2002-03 and 2-5 last season. Lamar also dropped both games televised on Fox Sports-Southwest last season, losing home contests to Rice and UL-Monroe. The Cardinals are 1-2 this season following an 87-81 win over McNeese State (1/12/05) on KFDM-TV (Ch. 6). The Cardinals have TV losses to Houston, 85-77, on Fox Sports Net-Southwest (12/4/04) and a loss at Rice, 81-75, on KFDM-TV (TW-Ch. 18) (12/16/04).

### FOR OPENERS

Lamar improved its all-time record in season openers to 39-15 (.722) following its 115-67 win over Jarvis Christian, including a 27-3 mark at home, 9-9 on the road and 3-3 on a neutral court. Billy Tubbs is 5-1 in season openers at Lamar, the lone blemish was a 98-85 loss to Long Beach State (11/30/79) at the Great Alaska Shootout. Lamar's 92-72 win over LeTourneau to open the 2003-04 year snapped a two-game season-opening losing streak. The Cardinals had lost at Rice (91-62) to open the 2001-02 season and at Pacific (73-69 OT) in 2002-03. Prior to that, the Cardinals had won five straight season openers.

### FOR CONFERENCE OPENERS

Lamar is 34-20 all-time in conference openers with a 21-3 record at home and 13-17 on the road. The Cardinals are 20-11 in Southland Conference openers with a 10-2 record at home and 10-9 on the road, following Wednesday's 60-56 loss at Southeastern Louisiana (1/5/05). Lamar defeated Sam Houston State 89-80 to open SLC play last season, which snapped a three-game losing streak in conference openers. Since returning to the SLC for the 1998-99 season, Lamar is 3-4 in conference openers (2-0 at home and 1-4 on the road).

Freshmen Chuck Foster (Austin, Texas/Lyndon B. Johnson HS), Larry Handy (Houston, Texas/Hightower HS), Durand Murray (Lithonia, Ga./Redan HS) and Tony Taccolini (Sugarland, Texas/Westbury Christian HS), and sophomore John Mertz (Orange, Texas/Lee JC) are going to be redshirted this season.

### CORNER WITHDRAWS FROM TEAM

Junior Golden Corner, a walk-on from Beaumont, Texas/West Brook HS (Western Nebraska CC), has withdrawn from the men's basketball team. He played in two games for a total of eight minutes and did not score.

### DEE BURCHETT LAMAR'S LONE EARLY SIGNEE

Dee Burchett, a 6-3 guard from Southwest Tennessee CC, was Lamar's lone signee during the NCAA's early signing period. Burchett started his collegiate career at Arkansas-Fort Smith, where he played with current Cardinal Alan Daniels for one semester before transferring to Southwest Tennessee CC. Burchett was a prep standout at Hamilton HS in Memphis. As a senior, he averaged 22 ppg and earned all-district and all-region honors. He averaged 21 ppg and helped Hamilton post a 23-12 record and advance to the state playoffs as a junior. A three-year letterwinner, Burchett averaged 18 ppg as a sopho-

Lamar holds a commanding 14-2 all-time series advantage against Nicholls State, including a 9-0 mark in games played in Beaumont.



## Head Coach Billy Tubbs

Entering his 30th season as a head coach, and second in the return to his alma mater, Billy Tubbs has wasted little time in letting the Southland Conference and the rest of the country know that tradition-rich Lamar basketball will once again be a program to be reckoned with in the near future.

Tubbs, who has built a reputation of building programs through recruiting and an exciting brand of basketball, and his coaching staff had their first full recruiting class ranked as high as No. 3 in the nation by Clark Francis of HoopScoop Online.

With limited time to put a recruiting class together and a completely new offensive scheme, Lamar still managed to post an 11-18 overall record and a 5-11 mark in conference play in 2003-04. In five years at Lamar, Tubbs has an 86-64 (.573) overall and 36-20 (.643) conference record. The season included many highlights but none as important as Tubbs reaching the milestone of becoming the 28th coach in NCAA Division I history to record 600 career wins in Lamar's 79-67 win over Texas Southern. Fans were also treated to Tubbs' trademark up-tempo style of play as the Cardinals led the SLC and ranked 15th in the NCAA in scoring at 79.1 points per game. Lamar also ranked 18th in the NCAA in steals at 9.3 per game.

With two of its top three scorers returning and the addition of a top five recruiting class, Tubbs has Lamar poised for an upper division finish in the race for the 2004-05 Southland Conference championship.

Tubbs, who had spent 18 years as a player, assistant coach, head coach and faculty member at Lamar University, returned to his alma mater as director of athletics May 27, 2002. Tubbs is set to continue an already highly successful head coaching career that has spanned 29 years with a career record of 606-315 (.658). His 606 career wins ranks 43rd all-time in NCAA history, and his .658 career winning percentage ranks 78th all-time.

He has led teams to 12 NCAA Tournament appearances, six National Invitation Tournament appearances, eight conference championships, three conference tournament championships and 18 20-win seasons. He has been named conference coach of the year eight times and is a two-time national coach of the year.

Tubbs' most recent coaching stint was eight years at Texas Christian University, where he guided the Horned Frogs to a 156-95 (.622) record. He took TCU to one NCAA Tournament and a pair of NITs, and earned Southwest Conference (1995) and Western Athletic Conference (1998) Coach of the Year honors.

Prior to TCU, Tubbs spent 14 years as the head coach at the University of Oklahoma. He led the Sooners to the NCAA championship game in 1988 and posted a 333-132 (.716) record. He took OU to nine NCAA Tournaments and four NITs during his tenure, including a streak of six straight "Sweet 16" appearances from 1985-90. He was named Big Eight Coach of the Year four times (1984, 1985, 1988, 1989) and earned Basketball Weekly National Coach of the Year honors in 1983 and 1985.

Tubbs gained national attention during his four-year coaching stint at Lamar from 1976-80. He guided the Cardinals to a 75-46 (.620) record and the school's first two NCAA Tournament appearances. Lamar posted a 23-9 record in 1978-79, won the Southland Conference championship, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament where the Cardinals upset Detroit in the first round before losing to eventual national champion Michigan State in the second round.

A year later, the Cardinals went 22-11, won another SLC championship, and advanced to the Sweet 16 (third round) of the NCAA Tournament with wins over Weber State and No. 5-ranked Oregon State before losing to Clemson. He twice (1978 and 1980) earned SLC Coach of the Year honors.

Tubbs began his head coaching career at Southwestern University, where he posted a 31-24 (.564) record over two years.

Born in St. Louis, Mo. and raised in Tulsa, Okla., Tubbs was a two-year letterman at Lamar for coach Jack Martin. He began his coaching career as Martin's assistant coach from 1960-71. He was a three-year basketball letterman at Tulsa's Central High School and played at Lon Morris College, where he helped the Bearcats to the National Junior College semifinals.

Trailing 32-27 at halftime, Lamar hung tough in the second half, cutting SLU's lead to two, 40-38, on a three-pointer by Alan Daniels with 12:06 left in the game. The Lions Jonathan Patton answered Daniels' three and fed a driving Nate Lofton for a dunk to push the lead back to seven, 45-38, with 11:10 remaining.

After SLU extended its lead to a game-high 10 points, 52-42, on a Neill Berry three and a dunk by Patton, the Cardinals made another run at the Lions. Daniels' three with 13 second left cut the lead to two, 58-56. Terry Bryant converted a pair of free throws to stave off Lamar.

Fairley was 6-of-13 from the field in scoring his 12 points and grabbed a game-high nine rebounds. Raymond Anthony added 11 points and six rebounds. Daniels, who entered the game as the SLU's leading scorer at 19.5 ppg, was held to 10 points, all coming in the second half, on 3-of-9 shooting from the field. Lamar shot 37.3 percent from the field, 28.6 percent from 3-point range and 82.4 percent from the free throw line.

Patton led SLU with 16 points on 6-of-10 shooting from the field, including 4-of-6 from 3-point range. Lofton and Bryant each scored 12 points and Ricky Woods chipped in 11.
