Lamar makes its final non-conference road trip of the 2007-08 campaign to face Texas Tech on Jan. 1. Tuesday's game will mark just the second time for a Cardinal squad to play on New Year's Day. A year ago, LU defeated Louisiana College, 91-76, in Beaumont.

Lamar-Texas Tech Series History

This is the second all-time meeting between Lamar and Texas Tech. The Red Raiders won the first game, 83-68, on Dec. 13, 1979 in a game played at Lubbock's Municipal Coliseum. Since Lamar moved to four-year status in 1951-52, the Cardinals have played 33 games in the west Texas cities of Abilene, Alpine, El Paso and Lubbock.

Lamar Versus Big 12 Schools

Lamar enters Tuesday's game with a 12-36 all-time record against Big 12 member schools. Since the league's inception in 1996-97, the Cardinals are 2-7 with wins over Baylor in 1997-98 and Texas A&M in 1999-00. LU has lost its last five dating back to the A&M win in Beaumont.

coach Steve Roccaforte, with a 5-6 mark thus far in 2007-08. The Cardinals will conclude the non-league portion of their schedule at home next Tuesday when Utah Valley State visits the Montagne Center.

Lamar Looking To Stop Road Woes

When Lamar faces Texas Tech in Lubbock on Tuesday, it will be looking to snap an 11-game non-conference road losing streak. The Cardinals' last road win over a non-SLC foe came on Dec. 14, 2006 at Arkansas State in Billy Tubbs' final season. Under current head coach Steve Roccaforte, LU is 2-16 away from the Montagne Center and 0-10 in non-league action.

Close Ones

The Cardinals have lost six games this season but three have been especially agonizing for the LU faithful. In losses to Wyoming (75-71), Oral Roberts (65-57) and at Northern Illinois (65-63), Lamar was unable to maintain second-half leads in each contest. LU led Wyoming by 12 with 18:03 left and by 5 with 5:36 left; five days later against ORU the Cards had an 11-point lead in the first half and led 49-48 with 7:41 to play before being surrendering 11-consecutive points over the next 3:41; and after taking a 13-point lead on NIU with 16:54 remaining, LU was outscored 29-14 the rest of the way as the Huskies second-chance tip-in at the buzzer proved to be the difference.

Forcing Turnovers

The Cardinals' defense has done a very good job in forcing turnovers this season. Lamar has forced 224 turnovers while committing 181 miscues. LU leads the SLC with a 3.91 turnover margin. The Cardinals have forced their opponents into at least 20 turnovers seven times this season, including five of the last six. Rice, Lyon College, Louisiana College and LeTourneau all committed more turnovers than field goals made.

Triple Double-Double Sets School Record

Darren Hopkins, Justin Nabors and Lamar Sanders combined to make school history when the trio became the first group of Lamar players to post three double-doubles in the same game.

What Have You Done For Me Lately

Lamar enters Tuesday's game having won four of its last five games after dropping five consecutive - despite holding second-half leads in three of those setbacks. Regardless of that, the current five-game stretch has seen improved play across the board for the Cardinals.

The Season of Giving... and Keeping

Over the last five games, Lamar has averaged 19.8 assists per game, compared to just over 12 apg during the first six games. In fact, the Cardinals have assisted on 60.4 percent of their field goals over the stretch. They have also done a better job of taking care of the basketball, turning it over 15.0 times - well below the 17.7 early on in the season. In fact, LU's turnover margin has gone from +1.5 to +6.8 and sits at +3.9 on the season, which leads the Southland Conference.

Sharing The Rock

In Saturday's win over Lyon College, Lamar assisted on 28 of its 40 baskets for a 70 percent rate - a season high. A week earlier, the Cardinals handed out 14 dimes on 23 buckets for a 60.9 mark. Prior to Saturday, the previous high mark this year was 62.5 percent against Wyoming.

Lamar With Three In SLC Top 15 In 3-Pointers

Lamar is the only school in the SLC with three players ranking in the top 15 in 4-point field goal percentage. Brandon McThay ranks second at 47.8 percent on 11-of-23 this season, Kenny Dawkins is rated fourth at 44.1% and Currye Todd is 15th at 36.4%. As a team, the Cardinals rank fourth at 33.7% and third in 3-pointers made per game at 7.5.

More On The 3-Ball

Since Steve Roccaforte took over at Lamar last season, the Cardinals have made 348 total 3-pointers for an average of 8.1 per game. In those 43 games, LU has made at least 10 treys 14 times, including three this year. The season-high 16 made against Louisiana College on Dec. 8 are tied for the third-most in school history, 13th-most in the NCAA in 2007-08 and the second-most in the SLC this season. Only once in the past two seasons have the Cardinals failed to make less than four in a game (vs. NSU in the 2007 SLC Tournament).

Sanders Eclipses 500-Point Mark At Lamar

With 12 points on Saturday against Lyon College, senior F Lamar Sanders surpassed the 500-point plateau as a Cardinal. He enters the Texas Tech game with 503 points in 43 games in a Cardinal jersey. The preseason All-SLC pick from Hickory Flat, Miss., has averaged 11.7 points in 43 games - all starts. Sanders was named Second Team All-SLC a year ago after scoring 391 points for a 12.2 ppg average and pulling down a league-best 9.8 rpg.

Barrow Sitting On 99 Career 3-Pointers Made

Senior G Matthew Barrow has made 99 career three-point field goals in his 2-plus seasons with the Cardinals. He connected on 35 treys as a sophomore and 50 a year ago. He is currently 27 away from cracking the Lamar career top-10 list.

Dawkins Third In SLC In Minutes Played; 11 Cardinals With 10-plus MPG

Junior G Kenny Dawkins enters the Texas Tech game ranked third in the SLC in minutes played at 31.5. While that is nearly six minutes more per outing than Lamar Sanders' 25.7 mpg, all 11 regular players for the Cardinals are averaging at least 10 mpg. Over the last five games, head coach Steve Roccaforte has implemented the same starting lineup and has nine players averaging 10-plus mpg, with no players on the floor for more than 29 mpg.

Home Sweet Home

Lamar will play 16 games in the Montagne Center this season. The Cardinals played 14 home games last season, posting an 11-3 record, which ranked as the fifth-best home winning percentage (.786) in the Montagne Center. Since the Montagne Center opened (1984-85), Lamar has won 68.6% of its games in the 10,080-seat arena. Overall, Lamar has

won 73.7% of its home games since the 1951-52 season, the Cardinals' first year competing as a four-year institution. Lamar is 5-2 at home this season and 16-5 (.762) under coach Roccaforte.

Double-Double Trouble

Following the record-setting three double-doubles on Saturday, a total of three players have combined for six double-doubles this season. Justin Nabors ranks third in the SLC with three on the year. Senior Lamar Sanders, who led the team with 12 double-doubles last season, has a pair thus far and Darren Hopkins has posted one.

Checking the RPI and Sagarin Ratings

Lamar is ranked 282 in the Sagarin Ratings (12/30/07). Sam Houston State is the highest ranked Southland Conference team at 56, followed by Stephen F. Austin at 64 and UTA at 76. The SLC is rated 23rd among 31 conferences and the Pac-10 is the top-rated conference.

Mississippi Connection

Lamar's roster features four players from the state of Mississippi - Kenny Dawkins (Holly Springs), Justin Nabors (Holly Springs), Lamar Sanders (Hickory Flat) and Currye Todd (Byhalia). Dawkins and Nabors helped Holly Springs HS to back-to-back state championships in 2004 and 2005. Sanders and Todd were teammates for two years and Northwest Mississippi CC, where they were coached by current Lamar assistant Don Skelton. Nabors joined Sanders and Todd at Northwest Mississippi for his freshman year (Sanders and Todd were sophomores).

Reunited

Junior Kenny Dawkins and Justin Nabors were high school teammates, helping Holly Springs (Miss.) win back-to-back state titles in 2004 and 2005. After high school, Nabors stayed close to home and played two years at Northwest Mississippi CC, playing his first year under head coach Don Skelton, who is now an assistant on the Cardinals staff. He was an NJCAA honorable mention All-American last season as a

sophomore. Dawkins played two years at Arizona Western College where he earned NJCAA All-American second-team honors last season as a sophomore.

Lamar Part of Southland's TV Package

Lamar will play two games on Fox Sports Net - Southwest as part of the Southland Conference's package with the network. The Cardinals' game Feb. 16 at Texas State and the Feb. 28 game at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi will be televised on FSN-Southwest. Lamar has been a regular on the network with at least one game in each of the last five years.

For Openers

Lamar has a 41-16 (.719) all-time record in season openers, including a 29-3 mark at home, 9-9 on the road and 3-4 on a neutral court. The Cardinals opened the 2007-08 season with a 103-64 home win over LeTourneau. Lamar has won nine of its last 12 season openers, including 10 straight at home.

Returning Fire Power

Lamar returns four starters and six letterwinners from last year's 15-17 squad. Those returning players accounted for 66 percent of the scoring and 59 percent of the rebounding. Senior Lamar Sanders led the team in rebounding last season at 9.8 rpg and senior Darren Hopkins is the team's leading returning scorer at 13.4 ppg.

Sanders, Hopkins Named to Preseason All-Southland Conference Teams

Seniors Lamar Sanders (Hickory Flat, Miss./Northwest Mississippi CC) and Darren Hopkins (Baltimore, Md./Panola JC) were both named to preseason All-Southland Conference teams. Sanders, who was a second-team all-SLC selection and SLC newcomer of the year last season, was named to the preseason all-SLC first-team. He

averaged 12.2 ppg and 9.8 rpg, which led the SLC and ranked 12th in the NCAA. He shot 59.3% from the field and led the team with 103 assists. Hopkins, who was an honorable mention all-SLC selection last season, was named to the preseason all-SLC second-team. He is the team's leading returning scorer at 13.4 ppg and averaged 3.6 rpg. He shot a team-best 43.5% (67-154) from 3-point range, tied for second with 27 steals and was third in assists with 89.

Preseason Predictions

The Southland Conference split into two divisions for the first time in league history last season and the alignments will remain the same for the 2007-08 season. Lamar will compete in the East Division with Central Arkansas, McNeese State, Nicholls State, Northwestern State and Southeastern Louisiana. The West Division has Sam Houston State, Stephen F. Austin, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, Texas-Arlington, Texas-San Antonio and Texas State. Lamar was picked as the team to beat in the East Division in the preseason coaches' poll grabbing six first-place votes and 61 points. Defending East winner Northwestern State claimed five first-place votes and was second with 59 points, followed by McNeese State (1) with 48 points, SLU (32), Central Arkansas (25) and Nicholls State (21). Sam Houston State garnered eight first-place votes and was the overwhelming pick in the West Division with 63 points. Defending SLC regular-season and tournament champion TAMU-CC received one first-place vote and was second with 50 points. UTA grabbed two first-place votes and was third with 47 points, followed by SFA (1) with 40 points, UTSA (27) and Texas State (18). Each team will play the other members of its division twice, and the members of the other division once, three at home and three away, for a 16-game league schedule. The SLC Tournament format will include eight teams with the top two teams from each division automatically mak-

LAMAR'S EARLY SIGNEE INFORMATION

Lamar University signed three players during the early signing period, including local product **Brandon Moton** who prepped at Central High School, to national letters-of-intent to continue their education and play men's basketball for the Cardinals, announced Head Coach Steve Roccaforte.

In addition to Moton, **Charlie Harper** of San Antonio Madison High School and **Skyler Williams** of Chipola College will be joining the Cardinals for the 2008-09 season next fall.

A 6-4, 200 pound guard, Moton was a three-time first-team all-district performer at Central, where he was coached by former Lamar player Calvin Rice. He was a Top 50 players in the state of Texas as a senior and was a James Gamble Award nominee and a McDonald's All-America nominee.

Moton, who is a sophomore at Angelina College this year, averaged 9.4 ppg, 1.6 rpg and 1.3 apg as a freshman last season. He shot 43 percent from the field, 41 percent from three-point range and 70 percent from the free throw line. He led Angelina with 55 3-pointers made.

A 6-4, 185-pound guard, Harper has helped Madison win to straight district championships and advance to the Class 5A semifinals last season. He

averaged 8.0 ppg last season and was an honorable mention all-district performer. Madison is ranked among the Top 20 Class 5A teams in the state.

Harper, who is a three-year varsity letterwinner, is ranked as the 48th best prospect in the state by Texas Roundball and 72nd by Texas Hoops. He played for the San Antonio AAU team last summer where he averaged 17.5 ppg and 10.0 rpg. He helped lead the team to the 2007 Las Vegas Main Event championship.

Williams, a 6-2, 190-pound guard, averaged 4.8 ppg, 2.5 rpg and 1.1 spg as a freshman last season at Chipola College, which was ranked No. 1 in the NJCAA Top 25 poll much of the year and advanced to the NJCAA National Championship game. He shot 43 percent from the field, 38 percent from 3-point range and 65 percent from the free throw line. Williams is redshirting this season which will give him three years of eligibility at Lamar.

A native of Dublin, Ga., Williams prepped at East Laurens High School where he was also one of the top quarterbacks in the state. Chipola College, who has had six players sign early to play next year at four-year institutions, is off to a 14-0 start this season and is ranked as the No. 1 team in the country.

The Cardinals travel to Ole Miss (Nov. 16) before returning home for games against Wyoming (Nov. 19) and Oral Roberts (Nov. 24). Lamar hits the road for two straight at New Orleans (Nov. 28) and Northern Illinois (Dec. 1). The Cardinals return home for four of its next five games starting with St. Gregory's (Dec. 4) and Louisiana College (Dec. 8). After a trip to BYU (Dec. 12), Lamar closes out 2007 with games against Rice (Dec. 22) and Lyon College (Dec. 29). The Cardinals ring in the new year with a New Year's Day game at Texas Tech. Lamar closes out its non-conference schedule at home against Utah Valley State (Jan. 8). The Cardinals will play the other five East Division members twice and the six members of the West Division once, three home and three away, for a 16-game schedule. Lamar will play UTSA, Sam Houston State and Texas-Arlington at home and Stephen F. Austin, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi and Texas State on the road. The SLC Tournament format will still include eight teams with the top two teams from each division automatically making the tournament, followed by the next four best conference records. The O'Reilly Auto Parts SLC Tournament will be March 13-16 at the Merrell Center in Katy. The championship game is schedule for Sunday, March 11 at 1 p.m. on ESPN2 with the winner getting the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

2006-07 Year in Review

Under the direction of first-year coach Steve Roccaforte, Lamar University advanced to the semi-finals of the Southland Conference Tournament for the third straight year, two Cardinals earned all-SLC honors and Lamar Sanders became the first player in school history to record a triple-double. Lamar posted a 15-17 overall record and tied for third place with an 8-8 mark in the SLC East Division. The seventh-seeded Cardinals upset No. 2-seed Sam Houston State, 99-98, in the first round of the SLC Tournament at the Campbell Center in Houston before falling to No. 3-seed Northwestern State in the semifinals for the third straight year. Sanders' triple-double came against Louisiana Tech when he scored 11 points, grabbed 13 rebounds and dished out 12 assists, which also ranked as the seventh-most in a single-game in school history. The season also included a thrilling 77-69 overtime home win over BYU, who went on to win over 20 games and receive an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament. Sanders, who averaged 12.2 ppg and 9.8 rpg to lead the SLC and rank 12th in the NCAA, earned second-team all-SLC honors and was named SLC newcomer of the year. Darren Hopkins, who averaged 13.4 ppg and 3.6 rpg, was named honorable mention all-SLC. As a team, Lamar ranked 12th in the NCAA in assists at 17.3 per game, 31st in three-pointers made per game (.379) and 52nd in three-point percentage (.379). The Cardinals set a new single-season school record for three-point attempts with 702 and its 266 three-pointers made ranked as the second-most.

Brandon McThay made three first-half 3 pointers and Lamar University closed the opening 20 minutes on a 21-7 run as the Cardinals defeated Rice, 66-49, at the Montagne Center last Saturday night.

All of McThay's game-high 13 points came in the opening half as he was perfect from the floor in converting a pair of layups to go with his triples. He has now scored 48 points in the last four games as the Cardinals have gone 3-1. Lawrence Nwevo finished with 11 points and Matthew Barrow came off the bench to add 10 points and six rebounds.

Lamar (4-6) shot 52 percent in the first half thanks in large part to a 6-of-11 effort from 3-point range. The Cardinals also executed their full court pressure to the tune of 20 points from 14 Owl turnovers.

With the scored tied at 2-2 two minutes into the game, Lamar opened up a 20-6 lead as six different players scored during the 18-4 stretch that included three 3-pointers and a pair of fastbreak layups.

Lamar saw its lead move to 25 points following three consecutive Nwevo buckets in the lane, with the last coming at 16:23. Rice then began chipping away and cut the margin to 55-48 with 5:56 remaining but couldn't get any closer. Lamar closed the game on an 11-1 run with its last seven points coming from the charity stripe. The Cardinals shot just 61 percent from the free-throw line but Rice wasn't any better, converting just 59 percent of its 22 attempts.

Lamar snapped a six-game losing streak to Rice and improved to 3-0 against the Owls in games played on Dec. 22. Rice leads the series 16-7.

The Cardinals out-rebounded the Owls 40-30, including an 18-8 edge on the offensive glass. Lamar also got 23 points from its bench.

Lamar 104, Lyon College 52

Justin Nabors, Lamar Sanders and Darren Hopkins each posted a double-double as Lamar University doubled-up Lyon College, 104-52, at the Montagne Center Saturday night.

Lamar (5-6) shot a season-high 58 percent and handed out a season-best 28 assists in winning its fourth game in the last five. The Cardinals also out-rebounded the Scots 45-20, with the 20 rebounds allowed a season-low and one shy of tying the Montagne Center record for fewest boards by an opponent.

Nabors finished with a career-high 25 points on 10-of-14 shooting and pulled down 10 rebounds for his third double-double of the season. Sanders posted his second double-double with a 12-point, 10 rebound game, while Hopkins recorded his first-career double-double with an identical line as Sanders.

Guard Kenny Dawkins made 4-of-8 from 3-point range and finished with a career-high 23 points as he matched his season-high with seven assists.

The win gives head coach Steve Roccaforte his 20th at his alma mater in his 43rd game, making him the fourth-fastest to reach 20 in school history. Only Billy Tubbs, Pat Foster and Mike Newell reached the mark in a shorter span.

After falling behind 9-5 five minutes into the game, the Cardinals took the lead for good with an 8-0 run that saw Nabors score five of his 15 first-half points. A Levi Taylor 3-pointer cut the Lamar lead to 24-21 with 9:37 to play but then the Cardinals closed the half on a 33-5 run for a 57-26 lead at the break.

Lyon (5-5) struggled to find an offensive rhythm for the final 25 minutes as Taylor was ineffective following a collision with a Lamar player with 4:48 to play in the first period. Their leading scorer coming into the game with a 18.2 points per game average, he took just one field goal the rest of the game and finished with a team-high 16 points on 6-of-8 shooting. Lyon shot 40 percent but committed 21 turnovers that Lamar turned into 30 points.
