Raheem Appleby - 3 **Guard** **Senior**

Two-time All-WAC selection. Was team's leading scorer (16.1 ppg) last year until suffering ligament damage in ankle on Jan. 9 against FAU.

Kenneth Smith - 4 **Guard** **Senior**

Named first team All-CUSA and C-USA Defensive Player of the Year. Ranked top 10 nationally in A/TO ratio, assists per game and steals per game.

Michale Kyser - 1 **Forward** **Senior**

Named to the All-Defensive team his sophomore year in the WAC and his junior year in Conference USA.

Alex Hamilton - 0 **Guard** **Junior**

Named third team All-CUSA and to the C-USA All-Tournament team. Led the team in scoring with an average of 14.5 points per game.

Chris Anderson - 5 **Forward**

Started 36 of 37 games last season and was the team's second leading scorer, averaging 11.9 points per game.

Erik McCree - 2 **Forward** **Redshirt Sophomore**

Leo Edwards - 33 **Forward** **Redshirt Freshman**

Redshirted as a freshman last season. In high school, led his team to the Michigan class A championship.

7 NEWCOMERS

Joniah White - 5 **Center** **Freshman**

Rated second best player in Mississippi by ESPN. Led team to the Mississippi 6A title game. Recorded six triple-doubles his senior year.

Dayon Griffin - 10 **Guard** **Freshman**

Ranked 38th best player in Florida by Florida Hoops. Averaged 21 points, seven assists, five rebounds and six steals as a senior.

Xavian Stapleton - 11 **Guard** **Freshman**

Rated second best player in Mississippi by Mississippi Hoop Report. Named first team all-state after averaging 20.9 points per game as a senior.

Jacobi Boykins - 13 **Guard** **Freshman**

Three-star recruit per Rivals. Led team to the Florida Class 5A state championship. First team all-state averaging 22 points and eight boards.

Branden Sheppard - 15 **Forward** **Freshman**

Named first team all-district and third team all-state in Louisiana after averaging 13 points, 10 rebounds and three blocks per game as a senior.

Merrill Holden - 21 **Forward** **Sophomore**

Chose LA Tech over Washington State, Nevada, Florida Gulf Coast and Tulane. Played one year at Pratt Community College.

Qiydar Davis - 25 **Guard** **Junior**

Played for the No. 1 ranked junior college, Indian Hills CC. Started in the NJCAA championship.

MICHAEL WHITE

Michael White's pressuring man-to-man defense and fast-paced, dribble drive offense continues to rack up wins and shatter program records for the Louisiana Tech men's basketball team as he enters his fourth season as head coach.

White has re-energized the program and the fan base both locally and nationally with multiple conference championships and post-season appearances which played a huge part in him agreeing to a new six-year, \$3.6 million contract extension on April 3.

He earned the LABC Major College Coach of the Year honor after his Bulldogs completed an impressive 2013-14 season that saw the team post an overall record of 29-8, tying for the most victories ever in a single season in program history.

With the 29 wins came a share of the Conference USA regular season title in the school's first year in the league and a runner-up finish in the C-USA Tournament. LA Tech also registered wins over Big 12 second place finisher Oklahoma and SEC second place finisher Georgia and was one victory shy of reaching the National Invitation Tournament Final Four.

On five different occasions, the Bulldogs received points in one of the two Top 25 national polls. The team also won the inaugural Gulf Coast Showcase tournament and finished in the top 20 nationally in scoring offense, scoring margin, assists per game, steals per game and turnover margin.

All of this came a year after White guided the 'Dogs to an incredible 27-7 record in 2012-13 which included a program-record 18-game winning streak that was also the second longest streak in NCAA Division I.

LA Tech made more history that season by earning a Western Athletic Conference regular season championship for the first time and the school's first AP Top 25 ranking in 28 years.

White was rewarded by the league for his efforts as the Don Haskins WAC Coach of the Year, the first Bulldog head coach to receive the honor, by the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) as the District VII Coach of the Year and as the NABC District 6 Coach of the Year by his peers.

The Bulldogs also went a perfect 14-0 at home and won eight straight road games in the process, feats that tied or broke previous school records.

The Bulldogs went on to advance to the second round of the NIT after a road upset of Florida State.

In his first season as head coach, he guided the eighth youngest team in the country as one of the youngest head coaches in the country at 35 years of age to the school's first ever WAC Tournament final after upsetting perennial powers Utah State and top-seeded Nevada.

LA Tech came within 40 minutes of reaching the NCAA Tournament for the program's first time since 1991, finishing 18-16 on the season which was a six-win improvement from the year before.

White already boasts a 74-31 record. At the 100-game mark, he had the highest winning percentage and the most wins of any coach in LA Tech history.

Prior to coming to Tech White spent the previous seven seasons on the Ole Miss coaching staff and developed a reputation as one of the top assistant coaches in the country.

A finalist for the 2009 Coaches Award presented by BasketballScoop.com - honoring the top assistants in the college game - White was instrumental in the Rebels' rise to prominence in the Southeastern Conference as he helped lead the program to four postseason berths and a pair of SEC West titles in the past five years. The Rebels won 20 or more games four of the last five seasons.

White was very well-known in the recruiting circles nationwide, especially in the Southern region of the country. He helped Ole Miss land three recruiting classes ranked in the Top 25 in the country by numerous recruiting publications, including the 2005 class that was ranked as high as No. 7 by Hoop Scoop.

Prior to his stint on the Ole Miss staff, White spent four years at Jacksonville State, helping coordinate the Gamecocks' recruiting efforts for three seasons. White had five recruits named all-conference in four seasons at Jacksonville State. During his time at the school, Jacksonville State also recorded the winningest season in its Division I history in 2002-03 while also recording the program's first-ever league tournament victory.

A native of Dunedin, Florida, White played high school basketball at Jesuit High School in New Orleans before signing at Ole Miss where he was a four-year starter at point guard for the Rebels in the late 1990s.

During his time in a Rebel uniform, he helped lead Ole Miss to consecutive SEC West Division titles, three straight NCAA Tournament berths and the program's first ever NCAA Tournament win in 1999. He was a two-time SEC Academic Honor Roll selection and a member of the 1999 SEC Good Works Team.

After being invited to the Utah Jazz's summer training camp following his college career, White spent the 1999-2000 season between playing professionally for the IBL's New Mexico Slam and in England before returning to Ole Miss in the spring of 2000 to complete his B.A. in business.

White's passion for and knowledge of college basketball came naturally as he grew up around the game as his father, Kevin White, served as athletic director at Notre Dame, Arizona State, Tulane and Maine. Kevin White is currently the AD at Duke. Michael's younger brother,

Danny, played basketball at Towson and Notre Dame, and is now the new athletic director at the University of Buffalo. Youngest brother Brian is an associate athletic director at Tulsa.

He is married to the former Kira Zschau, an all-SEC volleyball player at Ole Miss, who also has a law degree from the university. The couple has two daughters, Rylee and Maggie, and twin boys, Collin and Keegan, and a fifth baby on the way.

TEAM NOTES

- The Bulldogs racked up 29 wins, tying the program record, and in the process won another conference regular season title, this time as a member of Conference USA. They finished in a four-way tie with Tulsa, Southern Miss and Middle Tennessee.
- The team advanced to the National Invitation Tournament quarterfinals for just the second time in program history.
- Two highlight wins of the 29 came on the road against Oklahoma, the second place finisher in the Big 12, and against Georgia, the second place finisher in the SEC.
- LA Tech won the inaugural Gulf Coast Showcase tournament in Fort Myers, Fla. by defeating St. Bonaventure, 76-72, in the finals.
- The Bulldogs had three players last season, Raheem Appleby, Kenyon McNeail, and Cordarius Johnson, reach 1,000 career points.
- In the 126-52 thrashing of Longwood, seven different Bulldogs scored in double figures en route to the most points ever scored in a single game and the second largest margin of victory ever.
- The Thomas Assembly Center had 7,355 fans, fourth largest in the arena's history, who watched the Bulldogs defeat Marshall on Jan. 25.
- In the past three seasons under coach White, the Bulldogs are a perfect 66-0 when leading with five minutes to go in the game.
- Last season, the Bulldogs went 23-1 when forcing at least 15 turnovers in a game. The one loss came in the season finale loss at Florida State.
- In three seasons under coach White, the Bulldog defense has forced at least 15 turnovers in over half of their games (64 out of 105). In 22 of those games they forced at least 20 turnovers.
- Speedy Smith broke four school records in the span of five minutes against Middle Tennessee on Feb. 27. He set the record for most steals by a junior, most steals in a single game (eight) and most steals in a single season. He also set the single season record for most assists that game.
- After coming up just one block short of having the single season record for most blocks during his sophomore campaign, Michale Kyser shattered the record his junior year by tallying 109 swats.

HISTORY

- LA Tech has three jersey numbers retired in Leon Barmore (12), Karl Malone (32) and Jackie Moreland (44).
- The Bulldogs have reached postseason play 16 times, the last time being this past season as they advanced to the quarterfinals of the NIT.
- LA Tech All-Americans include Randy White, Karl Malone, Mike McConathy, Mike Green, Ray Germany and Jackie Moreland.
- Former Bulldog great Paul Millsap earned the Bob Pettit Award for 2014 for the fourth straight year. The award is given to the most outstanding professional basketball player from a Louisiana college. Millsap earned his first All-Star appearance playing for the Atlanta Hawks.
- The Bulldogs have won 32 of their last 33 home games. Under coach White, they are 39-5 in the TAC with 17 of those wins coming by 20 points or more.
- LA Tech All-Americans include Randy White, Karl Malone, Mike McConathy, Mike Green, Ray Germany and Jackie Moreland.
