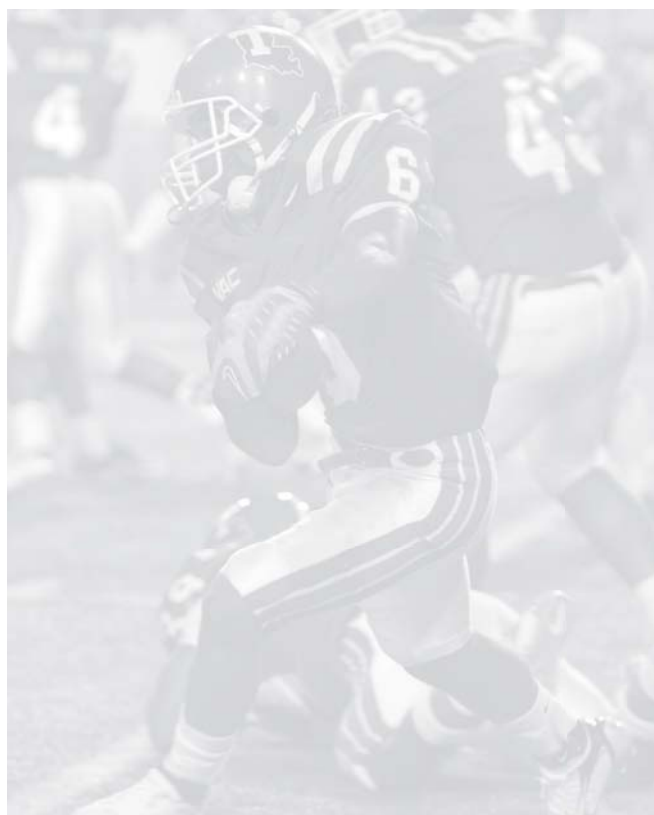

Coach Derek Dooley

Louisiana Tech head coach Derek Dooley will be available for interviews following each practice during the spring. On off days during the week, Coach Dooley will be available from 11:45 a.m. till 12:15 p.m. for interviews. Please contact Malcolm Butler or David Wiechmann at least 24 hours in advance for interview requests.

Practices

Louisiana Tech spring football practices are open to the media ONLY during the individual drills. During the individual drills, Louisiana Tech permits both still photographers and video photographers to shoot practice. Following individual drills, members of the media will be escorted off the practice field. Members of the media cannot use cell phones at practice, and they are not permitted to report on injuries that occur during practice. All practices are closed to the general public.

Scrimmages

Louisiana Tech's March 29 and April 5 will closed to the general public. Tech's April 12 T-Day Spring game will be open to the media. Players and coaches will be available for interviews following the scrimmages.

Assistant Coaches

Louisiana Tech assistant coaches will be available by request. Topics of discussion are to be limited to coach/player feature stories.



SPRING 2008 OUTLOOK

Recap 2007

Head Coach Derek Dooley's first season at Louisiana Tech showed signs the program is headed in the right direction. It started off with a season-opening win against Central Arkansas followed by an exciting yet heart-breaking overtime loss to BCS-bound Hawaii.

Dooley's mantra of: Attitude, Discipline, Toughness, Effort and Team transcended the players and set the tone for the season. The Bulldogs were going to play hard and give their best to win on Saturday.

The Hawaii loss triggered a four-game losing streak before a come-from-behind victory against New Mexico State got the Bulldogs back in the win column. Tech rallied back in the fourth quarter to get the win on Homecoming 22-21.

The win over the Aggies sparked a series of strong appearances by the Bulldogs. Tech battled Boise State the following week before falling behind late in the fourth quarter. The next week, Tech dominated Utah State on the road, and backed that performance up with a 28-16 win at Idaho. It was Tech's first back-to-back road wins since getting wins over the same teams in 2005.

Tech won four of its last six conference games to improve by three wins from the previous season in WAC play. The Bulldogs were victors just once in conference play in 2006 and won three games overall. In 2007, Tech went 4-4 in the WAC and finished 5-7 overall with a chance to go to a bowl game on the line in the season finale at Nevada.

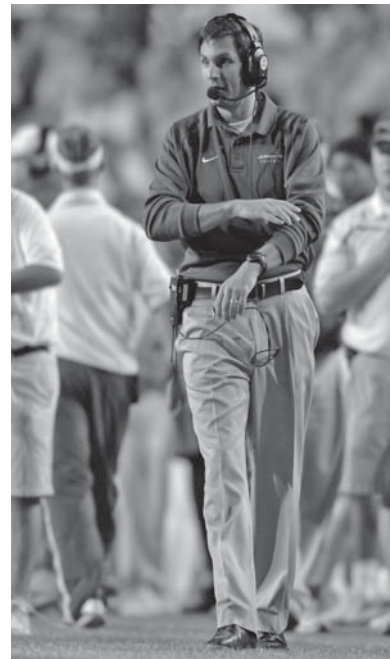
With one year at the helm under his belt, Dooley and his Bulldogs begin preparing for their next season on the grid iron together hoping to build on the momentum gained from 2007 and come out on top of the WAC.

Offense

The Bulldog offense loses just three starters from the 2007 squad. Perhaps the biggest question will be who will fill one of those slots. The graduation of quarterback Zac Champion leaves the most important position on the field available for the taking. Backup Michael Mosley was moved to receiver during the season and Ross Jenkins played just 12 snaps in the fourth quarter of the season finale at Nevada. Newcomer Steven Ensminger will battle for the job as well. Ensminger transferred to Tech from Auburn in the fall and is eligible to play after sitting out a year due to NCAA rules. He will be a sophomore after redshirting in 2006 with the Tigers.

Whoever wins the starting quarterback job before the season starts should feel well protected. Both tackle positions are open after Ryan Considine and Tyler Miller graduated, but the return of David Accardo from an injury means four linemen have significant starting experience coming into the spring.

Tech's corps of running backs will remain strong as Patrick Jackson enters his senior season. Daniel Porter saw his carries increase significantly in his sophomore campaign and is expected to play a large role again as a junior. William Griffin added some punch to the offense as well and could see more playing time in 2008 with a solid spring.



The receiver position saw two newcomers make a huge impact for the Bulldogs in 2007. JUCO transfer Philip Beck was the only receiver to catch a pass in every game and was one of the team's go-to guys when the chains needed to be moved. Freshman Phillip Livas became the offense's big play threat. He led the team with three touchdown receptions that went for 30, 50 and 70 yards. Brian Jackson and Shane Womack both look to improve on their 2007 seasons after showing they also could move the chains. Josh Wheeler is also expected back after missing much of the season with an injury.

The tight end position keeps all three Anthony Harrison, Dustin Mitchell and Dennis Morris in the pack. All three are big bruising ends that are versatile enough to run fast routes, catch passes, block and even run the ball out of the back field. Harrison led the tight ends with 293 yards receiving this season and caught a pass in every game except at Idaho.

Defense

The defense lost six starters and a number of key reserves from the 2007 unit that improved from worst in the country to one of the top rush defenses in the WAC. The returning starters all played a big role in the defense's success, however, and the coaching staff is looking to see which young players are ready to step up and take on a starting role.

D'Anthony Smith is the only returning starter on the defensive line. The departure of sack leader and second team All-WAC Chris Pugh, second team All-WAC Josh Muse and end Ben McGilton means the coaches are looking for three players to be noticed during spring workouts. Mason Hitt appeared in 10 games as a true freshman and made four tackles, and end Randy Grigsby made 10 tackles in eight games. Breon Jackson saw a lot of time spelling Smith during the season to stuff the run and had four tackles, three in a start against New Mexico State. Ramone Randle had 16 tackles on the year in 10 games, and redshirt freshman Matt Broha is also expected to make some noise on the D-line. Smith leads all returning defensive linemen with 42 tackles, 6.5 for loss and three sacks.



Two members of the 2008 recruiting class have already enrolled at Tech and will begin preparation to contribute on the D-line. JUCO transfer Kwame Jordan and high school standout Eric Harper will both fight for a starting spot at defensive end. Harper graduated high school in December so he could get an early start working with the Bulldogs, and Jordan was named All-KJCCC with 17.5 sacks as a sophomore this season at Fort Scott CC.

The linebacking corps loses a lot from this past season. Starters Anthony Crosby and Mark Dillard are both gone, and Marquis McBeath had some starting experience. Reserves Chris Lowery and Marvin Lubin also have departed. Replacing five linebackers who all played an important role on the team might be a difficult task, but the coaches believe they have the players to do it. Alabama transfer Zach Schreiber was a force on the scout squad and is expected to make a push for a starting role. Senior Brannon Jackson returns after missing 2007 with an injury and second team All-WAC Quin Harris is back for his senior year.

The secondary only has one hole to fill with the departure of corner back Tony Moss. Weldon Brown will lock down the other side of the field for his senior campaign and both starting safeties Antonio Baker (first team All-WAC) and Deon Young are back. Stevon Howze, Tarrence Calais and Josh Victorian all could plead their case for the vacant corner back position.

Special Teams

Punter Chris Keagle is ready to defend his first team All-WAC punter award in his senior campaign. Keagle led the league in punting average and was No. 27 in the nation in net punting. He placed 26 punts inside the 20-yard line and forced 21 fair catches. The departure of four-year kicker Danny Horwedel could not hurt the Bulldogs as much as one would think. Kickoff specialist Brad Oestricher is back after redshirting last season for his senior year. Oestricher was used for his strong leg on kickoffs prior to Dooley arriving at Tech and is 2-for-5 on field goals in his career and 9-of-10 on extra points. Deep snapper Thomas Graham is back for his third season at the job. He continues a family tradition as his brother Matt was the snapper before him.

All kick and punt returners for the Bulldogs last season will be back so more excitement can be expected in that phase of the game. Tech was one of the nation's best all-around return teams last season. The Bulldogs ranked No. 8 in punt return and No. 26 in kickoff returns.

New Staff

Dooley welcomes three new coaches to his staff for the 2008 season as well. Chino Fontenette is familiar with the team after serving as an intern and working with the offense last season. He will be heading the running backs this season.

Stan Eggen comes to Tech from Texas A&M where he coached the defensive line. Eggen will lead the linebackers for the Bulldogs and bring 27 years of coaching experience with him. The third addition to the coaching staff is Jimmy Brumbaugh, who comes to Tech after serving as an assistant strength and conditioning coach at LSU. Brumbaugh also previously coached defensive line at Tennessee-Chattanooga and Jacksonville State.
