GAME INFORMATION

► Louisiana Tech (0-0, 0-0 WAC) opens the 2009 season at Auburn (0-0, 0-0 SEC) on Saturday at Jordan-Hare Stadium in Auburn. The game will be broadcast on ESPNU and will kickoff at 6:05 p.m. CT.

GAME NOTES

► Louisiana Tech is entering its third season under the direction of head coach Derek Dooley. The Bulldogs have improved dramatically under Dooley, going from a 3-8 record prior to his arrival to an 8-5 season and an Independence Bowl win last year.
 ► Louisiana Tech enters the 2009 season as the ONLY Western Athletic Conference (WAC) team to bring a winning streak into the new year. Tech closed the 2008 season with two wins, including an Independence Bowl victory over Northern Illinois. Utah State is the only other WAC team to finish 2008 with a victory.
 ► LA Tech's 2008 Independence Bowl victory over Northern Illinois marked the Bull-

dogs as the only WAC team to record a bowl win in 2008.

► Louisiana Tech will be hosting two games that will air live on ESPN2, the first time that Joe Aillet Stadium will be the stage for multiple live national television audiences.
 ► LA Tech is 2-0 in season opening games under the direction of head coach Derek Dooley and hold a 49-47-5 record all-time in season openers. The last time LA Tech lost a season opener was in 2006 when the Bulldogs dropped a 49-10 decision at Nebraska.
 ► Dooley is looking to become the first coach to win his first three season openers since Maxie Lambright did so in his first three years as head coach of LA Tech.
 ► Louisiana Tech is looking for its program's first win over Auburn. LA Tech has tied Auburn once (13-13 in 1948) and Tech forced Auburn into overtime in 2001 before the Tigers prevailed, 48-41.
 ► LA Tech has lost 13 consecutive games at BCS Stadiums entering tonight's game.

WEEKLY MEDIA LUNCHEON

Louisiana Tech Head Coach Derek Dooley will hold a weekly press luncheon at 11:30 a.m. each Monday during football season in the Dr. Guthrie Jarrell Room at the Charles Wyly Athletic Center. Lunch will be served at 11:30 a.m. followed by a press conference with Coach Dooley and selected Louisiana Tech players discussing the upcoming game. All media are welcome to attend.

GAME DAY

All Louisiana Tech post-game press conferences will be held in the Dr. Guthrie Jarrell Room in the Charles Wyly Athletic Center after each game following a 12-15 minute cooling off period. No interviews will be allowed on the field with players and/or coaches immediately following games. A member of the Louisiana Tech Media Relations Department will escort all media to the interview area following the game. Coach Dooley and selected Louisiana Tech players will be available in the press conference following the games.

CREDENTIALS

Requests for credentials should be sent to Patrick Walsh via email to pwalsh@latech.edu. Requests must be submitted by a sports director/editor at least eight days prior to the contest.

PRACTICE

All practices are open to the media ONLY during the individual drills on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of game week. All practices are closed to members of the media following Wednesday of game week. During the individual drills, Louisiana Tech permits both still photographers and video photographers to shoot practice. Media wishing to conduct interviews are requested to arrive 10-15 minutes prior to the end of practice. Members of the media cannot use cell phones at practice, and they are not permitted to report on injuries that occur during practice. All practices are closed to the general public.

Interviews

Coach Dooley: Head Coach Derek Dooley will do general interviews following practice Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. All other requests during his office hours must be submitted to Patrick Walsh.

Assistant Coaches: The coaches are available after Tuesday practices. Topics of discussion are to be limited to coach/player feature stories.

Players: All player interviews will be conducted at the media luncheon or after practices Monday and Tuesday. It is not permissible for members of the media to call student-athletes on their cell phones or in their dorm rooms/apartments. Requests for player interviews need to be made at least 24 hours in advance. Selected players will be available in person following Coach Dooley's press conference at the media luncheon. Players are also available to out of town media by telephone. Louisiana Tech true freshmen are not available for interviews with the media at any time. Players who attend the media luncheon are not available after Monday's practice.

Post-Game: The Louisiana Tech locker room is closed at all times. Head Coach Derek Dooley and requested players will be brought to the Dr. Guthrie Jarrell Room in the Charles Wyly Athletic Center for interviews for home games and to a designated media area for road games. Interviews with the visiting coach and players will take place outside the visitor's locker room. Tech Media Relations personnel will take interview requests for the Bulldogs mid-way through the fourth quarter.

AUBURN, Ala. (AP) - Jason Campbell passed for 201 yards and two touchdowns, including a school-record 87-yarder to Silas Daniels, leading No. 6 Auburn past Louisiana Tech 52-7 on Saturday.

The Tigers are 6-0 for the first time since the 1997 season, with only one game decided by under 24 points. They are in line for another move in the rankings after Oklahoma's 12-0 victory over No. 5 Texas.

Auburn fashioned a stress-free tuneup to Southeastern Conference division rival Arkansas. The Tigers have allowed one touchdown or fewer in all but one game, rapidly scaling the rankings after opening at No. 17.

The anticipated showdown of top tailbacks never materialized. Louisiana Tech's Ryan Moats, the nation's No. 2 rusher, limped off the field in the first quarter with a sprained right ankle and didn't return. Moats finished with no yards on three carries after coming in averaging 185.6 per game for the Bulldogs (3-3).

The Tigers still haven't given up a rushing touchdown and collected nine sacks, forcing three turnovers.

Ronnie Brown gained 109 yards on 10 carries with a touchdown for Auburn. Carnell Williams had 56 yards on 12 carries and also scored while setting up a TD with a 50-yard punt return. Both sat out the final 18 minutes, along with most of the other starters.

Coming off a career game in a 34-10 win at Tennessee, Campbell supplied a characteristically efficient 13-of-18 passing performance.

The teams exchanged a flurry of big plays midway through the third quarter, mostly courtesy of Auburn.

The Tigers capped an 11-play, 99-yard drive with Campbell's 9-yard touchdown pass to Ben Obomanu midway through the third quarter. Tramon Williams nearly made a leaping interception but was bobbling the ball as he fell backward in the end zone and Obomanu scooped it out of the air.

Brown had a tackle-breaking 43-yard run to set up the TD.

The Bulldogs answered on the next play with Matt Kubik's 78-yard scoring pass to Jonathan Holland, who had slipped behind safety Will Herring down the right sideline.

Three plays later, Campbell rolled right and hit a streaking Daniels, topping Auburn's record of 85 yards, accomplished twice before.

Two minutes later, Obomanu outfought Williams again for a 37-yard score from backup quarterback Brandon Cox. Cox attempted three passes, two for touchdowns.

Moats' sub, Freddie Franklin, gained 75 yards on 13 carries after coming in with zero yards on five carries.

Auburn outgained Louisiana Tech 472-222. The Bulldogs pushed into Auburn territory five times in the first half, but couldn't get points against the nation's No. 4 scoring defense and trailed 24-0.

Louisiana Tech finished a string of four straight games with ranked opponents at 1-3, unable to duplicate last week's 28-21 upset of Fresno State.

The Tigers broke Alabama's 17-year-old record of 199 consecutive made extra points after their first TD.

▶ This marks the third consecutive year that Louisiana Tech has played a member of the Southeastern Conference. LA Tech lost to Ole Miss, 24-0, in 2007 but beat Mississippi State at home, 22-14, in 2008.

DAUNTING SCHEDULE - PART II

Louisiana Tech is not afraid to face any opponent and its recent schedule reflects that. Over the last five years, LA Tech has led the nation with nine non-conference games against ranked opponents. Of note for this week's game at Auburn, the Tigers on the Plains have played none out of the 117 conference-affiliated teams in Division I FBS. Only Temple and Troy have equaled LA Tech's challenge in playing nine non-conference games against ranked opponents.

HOPING TO BE THE FIRST

Auburn enters Saturday night's game with a nearly unblemished record against current members of the Western Athletic Conference. The Tigers have a 14-0-1 record against current WAC members.

HOPEFULLY UNLUCKY 13 WILL BE LAST OF UNLUCKY STREAK AT BCS STADIUMS

Louisiana Tech enters Saturday's game at Auburn with an unlucky streak the Bulldogs hope to break at the unlucky number of 13. LA Tech has lost 13 consecutive games in BCS stadiums and hopes to break that streak at game #14. The last time LA Tech won at a BCS stadium was in 2003 when the Bulldogs pulled the 20-19 upset at Michigan State. LA Tech pulled the upset victory in front of 72,387 at Spartan Stadium in John L. Smith's first season as head coach of Michigan State.

Since the streak began, LA Tech has dropped games at stadiums in the ACC, Big 12, Pac-10 and SEC. Of the toughest challenges, every time LA Tech has played Auburn or LSU in that stretch, the Bulldogs have either faced a team that eventually went on to finish the season undefeated (Auburn, 2004) or a team that went on to win the national championship (LSU, 2003 and 2007).

ANTONIO BAKER AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS IN CAREER TACKLES

Louisiana Tech's Antonio Baker enters the 2009 season with 301 career tackles to his credit, a mark that ranks him third in the nation among active players. Baker has led LA Tech in tackles over the past two seasons, recording 115 in 2008 and 118 in 2007 and he is knocking on the door of Louisiana Tech's career tackle top-10 list. Derek Dooley

Head Coach/Athletics Director

As the only head football coach in the country who also serves as the university's athletics director, Derek Dooley enters his third season at Louisiana Tech leading both the football program and the athletic department into a new era of unprecedented change.

Since he stepped on campus Dec. 17, 2006, when he was named the 31st head coach in Bulldog football history, Dooley has rebranded not only the reputation but the perception of Louisiana Tech Athletics on a regional and national level. His work ethic and incredible vision during his first year as the Bulldog head coach was so impressive that Louisiana Tech President Dr. Dan Reneau added a line to Dooley's business cards March 6, 2008 when he named him athletics director.

Dooley's hiring and immediate success at Louisiana Tech have drawn rave reviews from some of the university's top alumni.

"Derek is exactly what I hoped he would be," said NFL Hall of Famer Terry Bradshaw. "As far as I am concerned, he has exceeded everyone's expectations, including the 65,000 alumni. He is making people stand up and take notice of Louisiana Tech."

"What we have is a man who has a vision for this program and this university; he wants to make it something special. He has a plan. It is an energetic, aggressive plan, and I could not be more proud to have him as our AD and our football coach."

As a football coach, the son of former Georgia coaching legend Vince Dooley comes by his talent honestly.

In just two short years as head football coach, Dooley has led the Bulldogs to their first bowl victory in more than 30 years as LA Tech defeated Northern Illinois in the 2008 Independence Bowl. The bowl appearance was only their third since Louisiana Tech joined the FBS ranks 20 years ago.

After posting a 3-10 mark in 2006, the year before Dooley was hired, Tech recorded an 8-5 mark last season, which includes wins over SEC foe Mississippi State and bowl-bound Fresno State, and a second-place finish in the Western Athletic Conference standings -- a conference that boasts six bowl eligible teams out of the nine members.

Dooley's work the past two years didn't go unnoticed as he was named the Coach of the Year in the state of Louisiana by the Louisiana Sports

Writers Association, the first time a LA Tech coach earned the honor in a decade.

Dooley's influence has been seen in all phases of the Bulldog program, and the three-year comparisons show the differences that Dooley has made during his first two years at the helm.

Not only has Tech seen improvements over a three-year span, but some of the Bulldogs numbers are also the best since the program joined the FBS in 1989.

- Tech's defense ranked 13th in the country against the run allowing only 103.8 yards per game in 2008, the best mark by a Bulldog team since the program joined the FBS in 1989.
- Tech's defense allowed 23.7 points per game, the fewest by a Bulldog program since 1992.
- Tech's defense recorded a 21-0 road shutout over San Jose State last season, the first shut out by a Bulldog team since 1996 (148 games). It was the first road shutout since 1988 (225 games) and the first time San Jose State had been shutout at home since 1968.
- Tech's defense allowed only 376.5 yards per game, the best by a Bulldog team since 1999.
- Tech's punt return unit averaged 13.0 yards per return in 2008 (14th nationally) and 14.5 yard per return in 2007 (8th nationally), the best two averages since the program joined the FBS in 1989.
- Tech's kickoff return units averaged 23.8 yards per return in 2008 (17th nationally) and 23.1 yards per return in 2007 (26th nationally), two of the top three averages since the program joined the FBS in 1989.
- Tech has returned four kicks (two kickoffs, two punts) for touchdowns in the last two years (two other returns for TDs were called back due to penalty). In the previous 18 years (1989-2006), Tech returned a total of five kicks for touchdowns.
- Tech's special teams have blocked 10 kicks (5 FGs, 5 punts) in the last two years. The previous two years Tech only blocked three kicks.

These improvements have not gone unnoticed by Dooley's peers in the Western Athletic Conference as the Bulldogs landed 13 players on the all-WAC team in Dooley's two years, including a program record four first teamers last season. Tech also had a program record eight WAC Player of the Week honorees in 2008.

Tech's football program has also been recognized nationally for the student-athletes work off the playing field.

Dooley is no stranger to collegiate athletics, growing up as the son of legendary Georgia head coach Vince Dooley, who also served in the dual

role of athletic director during his time in Athens.

He's seen first-hand what it takes to succeed. He has brought that knowledge and the roll-up-your-sleeves-and-get-to-work mentality with him to Ruston. It's not going unnoticed.

Dooley came to Louisiana Tech following a two-year stint as the tight ends coach for the Miami Dolphins, and at age 41, he is one of the youngest head coaches in the FBS ranks.

During his two years with the Dolphins, Dooley oversaw the continued development of tight end Randy McMichael, who ended his Dolphins career as the all-time leader in receptions by a tight end.

Prior to joining the Dolphins, Dooley spent the previous five years at LSU, including the 2004 season when he served as assistant head coach/special teams coordinator/running backs coach.

In 2003, running back Justin Vincent set an LSU freshman record by rushing for 1,001 yards, as he went on to be named MVP of both the SEC championship game as well as the Sugar Bowl, in which LSU claimed the BCS national title.

In 2004, the Tigers finished first in the SEC in rushing (193.8 yards per game), led by Alley Broussard (867 yards, 6.1 avg.) and Joseph Addai (680 yards, 6.7 avg.), a first-round draft choice of Indianapolis in 2006.

Dooley's special teams unit ranked among the best in the conference during his tenure at LSU, as they finished first in the SEC in net punting (2003), punt returns (2003) and kickoff coverage (2003 and 2004).

Dooley first went to Baton Rouge in 2000 as the Tigers' recruiting coordinator/tight ends coach, a position in which he served three years (2000-02). During this time, Robert Royal set an LSU single-season record for touchdowns by a tight end (5 in 2000) and was named first-team All-Southeastern Conference in both 2000 and 2001.

As a recruiting coordinator, Dooley's 2003 recruiting class ranked No. 1 in the country by every major recruiting publication, while his 2001 class was ranked in the top three nationally.

Prior to joining LSU, Dooley spent the 1997-99 seasons as wide receivers coach at SMU, while also holding the duties of assistant recruiting coordinator for his final two years. That followed a one-year stint (1996) as a graduate assistant at the University of Georgia.

Dooley was named athletic director - replacing the retired Jim Oakes - in a press conference on March 6, 2008 held in the Hall of Fame Room of the Thomas Assembly Center. He follows in his father's footsteps who also held the dual role at the University of Georgia for many years.

CHANGING THE FACE...

...OF TECH ATHLETICS

Louisiana Tech athletic director/head coach Derek Dooley has a vision for the future of the university's athletic programs. Here are a few of the changes that have already taken place:

► **New Logo** - Louisiana Tech hired Rick-enbaugh Graphics to create an official Bulldog logo as well as official wordmarks and a sleeker-looking state and T logo. Louisiana Tech will also be using LA Tech as a reference, something it has not done in the past.

► **Learfield Sports** - Louisiana Tech signed a 10-year multi-media contract with Learfield Sports to be the university's exclusive athletics marketing partner starting in 2009-10. Learfield has established LA Tech Sports Properties and oversees every aspect of the Bulldogs and Lady Techsters rights, including television, radio, corporate sponsorships, event marketing, athletic website advertising, venue signage and more. The deal also helped LA Tech install its brand new videoboard at Joe Aillet Stadium, which will debut on Sept. 19 for Louisiana Tech's home opener against Nicholls State.

► **Facilities** - Louisiana Tech has built new tennis court facilities, new bowling alley facilities, a new track and field complex, new student housing, new basketball court, new baseball scoreboard and press box, new football locker rooms and more just in the last year. There are plans in the works for more athletic facility upgrades, renovations and new facilities in the next few years.

BULLDOG OPENER HISTORY

After its 22-14 win over Mississippi State last year, Louisiana Tech moved to 49-47-5 in season openers, including a record of 9-1 at Joe Aillet Stadium. Tech's only loss in Joe Aillet Stadium on opening day was 12-7 to Tennessee-Chattanooga in 1978. Despite 11 prior meetings, this year will mark the first time Louisiana Tech has opened the season against Auburn.

ESPN2 TO BROADCAST TWO GAMES FROM LA TECH THIS YEAR

For the first time in Louisiana Tech's history, Joe Aillet Stadium will be the host of a live national television audience for multiple times. ESPN2 will be broadcasting two games from LA Tech this year – the Sept. 30 game against Hawai'i and the Nov. 6 game against Boise State. That goes along with seven other LA Tech games being broadcast on television – either live or tape delay – this season.

BACK TO HIS ROOTS

When Louisiana Tech plays at Auburn to open the season on Sept. 5, it will be the first trip to Jordan-Hare Stadium for all of the players with one exception. Steven Ensminger, a back-up quarterback and all-around utility player, transferred to Louisiana Tech from Auburn and sat out the 2007 season due to NCAA transfer rules.

HOME, HOME ON THE PLAINS

LA Tech has two Auburn connections on the sidelines. Defensive line coach Jimmy Brumbaugh was a defensive lineman at Auburn from 1995-99. He was a first-team All-SEC honoree as a junior and totaled 291 career tackles with 22 tackles for a loss and 15 sacks.

Also, LA Tech head athletic trainer Keith Bunch earned his master's degree from Auburn in 2004 while working on the AU Sports Medicine staff.

BULLDOGS FROM THE YELLOWHAMMER STATE

Two LA Tech players hail from the Yellowhammer State: LB Adrien Cole and LB Solomon Randle both come from Mobile.

HE'S BACK!

Offensive line coach Pete Perot has returned to the sidelines at Louisiana Tech after sitting out most of the 2008 season. Perot, entering his third decade on the Louisiana Tech staff, missed most of the 2008 season due to health issues after undergoing triple bypass heart surgery. Perot made his return to the sidelines in time for LA Tech's 17-10 Independence Bowl win over Northern Illinois.

AN EXPERIENCED SQUAD

Louisiana Tech boasts one of the most experienced teams in recent memory this season as the Bulldogs have 17 returning starters from last year. Those 17 starters recorded an 8-5 record, LA Tech's most successful season since 1999.

OPPONENTS BEWARE THE PUNT RETURN

Not only is junior Phillip Livas a threat as a wide receiver, but Livas was among the national leaders last year in punt returns. Ranked seventh in the nation, Livas averaged 15.31 yards per return and ran back two punt returns for touchdowns. As a sophomore, Livas returned 16 punts for a total of 245 yards.

LA TECH'S QUARTERBACK COMPETITION – AT SECOND STRING

Heading into the 2009 season, Ross Jenkins is a lock as the starting quarterback for Louisiana Tech... but who follows him? Throughout spring practice and fall camp, Randy Hardin (a sophomore transfer from Southern Miss) and Colby Cameron (a redshirt freshman from Newbury Park, Calif.) continue to challenge each other for the No. 2 spot in the depth chart.

LIVAS RECORDS CATCH IN 23 CONSECUTIVE GAMES

Wide receiver Phillip Livas enters the 2009 season with a streak of 23 consecutive games played with at least one reception. Livas, also LA Tech's kick and punt returner, has played in 25 games during his career and the junior is looking to continue that streak when LA Tech opens the 2009 season at Auburn on Sept. 5.

PORTER LOOKING TO BREAK CAREER RUSHING RECORD

Senior Daniel Porter enters the 2009 season ranked 10th all-time in Louisiana Tech history with 2,220 career rushing yards. Porter has a chance to break the school record of 3,342 rushing yards held by Jason Cooper (1991-94) with current Houston Texans running back Ryan Moats (2002-04) ranked second with 3,112 rushing yards in his career at Tech. If Porter has another 1,000 yard rushing season (he registered 1,164 yards in 2008), he will have the opportunity to set the school record this season.

BOWL VICTORY

Louisiana Tech won the 2008 Independence Bowl over Northern Illinois 17-10 and was the only team from the Western Athletic Conference to earn a bowl victory in 2008.

IMPROVEMENT ACROSS THE BOARD

Bulldog fans have seen a vast improvement in their football team since Derek Dooley took over the reigns of the Louisiana Tech football program in 2007, following a season in which the Bulldogs posted a 3-10 mark and finished only 1-7 in the Western Athletic Conference. Under Dooley's leadership, the Tech football program has made huge strides not only statistically but in the win column over the last two years.

Not only has Tech seen improvements over a three-year span, but some of the Bulldogs numbers are the best since the program joined the FBS in 1989.

► Tech's defense ranked 13th in the country against the run allowing only 103.8 yards per game in 2008, the best mark by a Bulldog team since the program joined the FBS in 1989. It was also an improvement of over 125 yards per game from the 2006 season when the Bulldogs ranked dead last in the country.

► Tech's defense also allowed 23.7 points per game, the fewest by a Bulldog program since 1992 (this was an improvement of over 17.0 points per game from 2006).

► Tech's defense recorded a 21-0 road shutout over San Jose State last season, the first shutout by a Bulldog team since 1996 (148 games). It was the first road shutout since 1988 (225 games).

► Tech's defense allowed only 376.5 yards per game in 2008, the best by a Bulldog team since 1999.

► Tech's punt return unit averaged 13.0 yards per return in 2008 and 14.5 yard per return in 2007, the best two averages since the program joined the FBS in 1989.

► Tech's kickoff return units averaged 23.9 yards per return in 2008 and 23.1 yards per return in 2007, two of the top three averages since the program joined the FBS in 1989.

► Tech has returned four kicks (two kickoffs, two punts) for touchdowns in the last two seasons. Prior to Dooley's tenure, Tech had only returned five kicks for TDs since the program joined the FBS ranks in 1989 (18 years).

► Tech's special teams have blocked 10 kicks (five FGs, five punts) in the last two years. The previous two years Tech only blocked three kicks.

BREAKING 1,000

Louisiana Tech running back Daniel Porter rushed for 1,164 yards on 222 carries on the 2008 season. This makes Porter the eighth Tech player ever to rush for over 1,000 yards in a season and it is only the ninth time a Tech player has accomplished this feat.

WINNING THE CLOSE ONES

Louisiana Tech's 17-10 win over Northern Illinois on Dec. 28 was the fifth game in 2008 that the Bulldogs have won by eight points or less (one possession). Tech was 5-2 in one-possession games last year with the two losses coming at Army (14-7) and against Nevada (35-31). Tech defeated Mississippi State (22-14), Fresno State (38-35), Utah State (45-38), New Mexico State (35-31) and Northern Illinois (17-10) all by eight points or less last year.

SPIRIT OF 1988 -- ROAD STYLE

Before every home game the Louisiana Tech players and coaches walk out of the locker room and down the ramp onto the field, with each individual rubbing the Spirit of '88 -- a bronze statue of a Bulldog located in the south end zone. The Spirit of '88 commemorates

the 1988 Bulldog football team which blazed the path into the FBS (see page 114 of media guide). Last year with the Bulldogs undefeated at home and winless on the road, Tech head coach Derek Dooley had equipment manager Jeff Springer find a road version of the Spirit of '88 which the team took with them to both San Jose State and New Mexico State. It worked as Tech won both of those games, helping the program clinch their first bowl berth since 2001. Springer bought the ceramic road version of the Spirit of '88 from the Tech Bookstore and it is expected to make a return to the travel squad in 2009.

MANAGING THE GAME

Quarterback Ross Jenkins enters the 2009 season as the starting quarterback for Louisiana Tech and brings a 6-2 record as the starter into the season.

In the first four starts of his college career, sophomore quarterback Ross Jenkins threw 67 passes without an interception. Jenkins went 35-of-67 for 461 yards and two touchdowns in those four starts with a 119.89 passer efficiency rating. In those four games, Jenkins directed 52 offensive drives and the Bulldogs only turned it over once (fumble) in those possessions. On his fifth start Jenkins' turnover streak ended after throwing two interceptions and losing a fumble in a 45-38 win over Utah State.

Taking It To the House

Junior Phillip Livas spent most of the 2008 season continuing to etch his name in the Louisiana Tech record books and is looking to do the same in 2009. Livas returned a kickoff 97 yards for a TD in Tech's 17-10 win over Northern Illinois on Dec. 28, his first kickoff return of the 2008 season for a score. Livas has four career returns for TDs now as he has had two punt returns for scores and a 78-yard return for a TD against Nevada in 2007. Livas had a 96 yard kickoff return for a touchdown and an 80 yard punt return for a touchdown each called back due to penalties against San Jose State last season.

Dating back to the 1998 season, history has shown that when the Louisiana Tech offense struggles the team tends to struggle. Since 1998 the Bulldogs have compiled a 3-42 record when scoring less than 21 points. Before the Bulldogs won the 2008 Independence Bowl vs. Northern Illinois 17-10, the last victory for Tech when scoring less than 21 points was in 2003 against Michigan State when the Bulldogs upset the then ranked Spartans, 20-19.

DEFENSIVE AND SPECIAL TEAMS IMPROVEMENT

Louisiana Tech has improved in a number of defensive and special teams categories since Derek Dooley and this Bulldog coaching staff took over prior to the 2007 season. The biggest improvement has come in rushing defense, where the Bulldogs allowed over 225 yards per game in 2006 but turned that around to allow only 103.8 yards per game in 2008.

SNL: SATURDAY NIGHT LIVAS

Sophomore wide receiver Phillip Livas has quickly made himself a fan favorite at Louisiana Tech as the former high school running back converted wide receiver has already developed a reputation as a big-play threat.

► A 30-yard TD Reception with 1:53 to play that gave Tech a 22-21 win over the Aggies.

Idaho Game

► A 70-yard TD reception midway through the fourth quarter that gave the Bulldogs a lead and the eventual win.

SJSU Game

► A 49-yard TD Reception in the first quarter of Tech's 27-23 win over San Jose State.

LSU Game

► A 76-yard kickoff return against the eventual national champions in Baton Rouge. He ended with 183 total yards on kickoff returns despite having another long one called back due to penalty.

Nevada Game

► A 78-yard kickoff return for a TD, the Bulldogs only TD in the game. He also returned a kickoff inside the Wolf Pack 10-yard line

but it was called back due to penalty.

TD MACHINE

Phillip Livas has already scored touchdowns in his young career via reception (4 TD receptions), rush (3), kickoff return (2) and punt return (2). Livas has scoring plays of at least 70 yards in each of the four categories.

JOE AILLET STADIUM FUN FACT

NFL Hall of Famer and four-time Super Bowl Champion Terry Bradshaw threw the first touchdown pass in the history of Joe Aillet Stadium connecting with Buster Herren from 5-yards out against East Carolina on Sept. 28, 1968. Tech went on to win the game 35-7.

FAMILY TRADITION

Senior Thomas Graham is back for his fourth year on the job as the Bulldogs deep snapper (he has started every game in his career). He continues a family tradition as his brother, Matt, was the deep snapper for LA Tech four straight years before him. The Graham brothers come from a football family has their grandfather Bill Graham, who is the Director of Special Events at Tech, played football for Florida State (and was roommates with Burt Reynolds) at running back and their father, Randy Graham, played rover back football at Missouri.

AUNT WAS NATIONAL CHAMP

Redshirt sophomore linebacker Dusty Rust is not the first in his family to play ball for Louisiana Tech. Except his relative did not play football. Rust's aunt Rita Rust played basketball for the Lady Techsters from 1979-82, playing on two national championship teams.

FASTEST MAN IN THE WAC (2009)

Red-shirt sophomore Terry Carter is battling for a starting cornerback position this fall. This past spring, Carter battled for a WAC championship title as Carter is also a member of the LA Tech's track and field team. In the WAC Outdoor Championships last spring, Carter was named the fastest man in the WAC after winning the conference title in the 100m (10.66) as well as finishing second in the 200m (21.16). Carter was also a member of Tech's 4 x 100-meter relay team that finished second in the WAC Outdoor Championships (40.91). Carter was a track star in high school as well, leading West Monroe High School to the 2006 Louisiana Class 5A state title.
