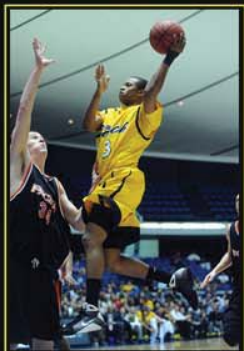
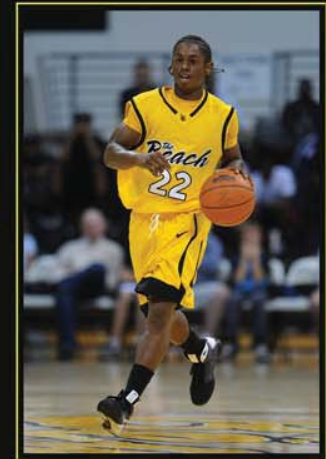

# WALTER PYRAMID

## "Home of the 49ers"

The Walter Pyramid is believed to be the largest space-frame structure in North America. The building's infrastructure utilizes 18,000 steel tubes and connection modules, joined by more than 160,000 three-quarter inch bolts. If the tubes were laid end-to-end, they would form a pipe span 26 miles long.

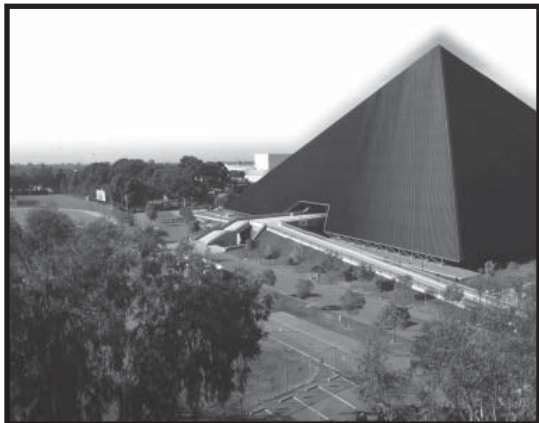
The Walter Pyramid has played host to several NCAA sponsored events including numerous women's volleyball matches, the 2001 and 2003 Men's Volleyball Championships and the 2003 NCAA Women's Volleyball Regionals. The venue has also served as the host site for the NBA Summer Pro League and CIF Basketball Playoffs. It's also the site of many commercials and feature films.

Celebrating its 15-year anniversary, the Walter Pyramid has become a nationally-recognized icon for the University and the city of Long Beach. Because of its dramatic appearance, its unique multi-purpose capability and its lure for television production, the Walter Pyramid is one of the finest collegiate athletic facilities in the western United States.

On March 5, 2005, the Pyramid's name was changed to the Walter Pyramid, thanks to the generous donations presented to the university by Dr. Mike and Arlene Walter. Long-time supporters of the school, the Walters gift to athletics and academics was one of the largest single gifts in 49er athletics history.

Officially opened on November 30, 1994, the 49ers rolled to a 71-64 win over Detroit before a crowd of 5,021 and an ESPN television audience.

The structure's distinctive cobalt blue exterior has permanently altered the city's skyline. It rises 18 stories above north campus and can be seen for miles in all



directions. It has provided a quantum leap in both the image and effectiveness of the Long Beach State athletics programs, with an immediate impact on the 49ers' fan base, scholarship fundraising, recruiting and revenue generation. Nearly 200,000 visitors pass through the Walter Pyramid's entrances annually.

Designed by Long Beach architect Don Gibbs and built by the Nielson Construction Company of San Diego, The Walter Pyramid cost approximately \$22 million.

The Walter Pyramid measures 345 feet on each side of its perfectly square base. Its floor space accommodates nine volleyball courts or three full basketball courts and four additional half basketball courts on the "activity" level.

One of three true pyramids in the United States (others are located in Las Vegas and Memphis), The Walter Pyramid's most unique feature is its cantilevered seating system, mounted on moveable platforms. When use of the floor level is required, each 81-ton seating platform can be raised hydraulically to expose over 39,000 square feet of beechwood flooring.

**Returning Starters:** Larry Anderson (6-6, 215, So., G) – Named first-team All-Big West and Big West Freshman of the Year ... The first freshman in the BWC to be named to the first team since LBSU's Clifton Pondexter following the 1973-74 season ... Averaged 10.8 points, 4.0 rebounds and 2.7 assists while making 54.6 percent of his shots and 40 percent of 3-pointers ... Improved his numbers in league games averaging 12.3 points, 4.1 rebounds and 3.2 assists per game ... Scored in double figures 17 times, including in 12 of 16 conference games. Stephan Gilling (6-2, 207, Sr., G) – Started 25 of Long Beach State's 30 games and averaged 11.0 points, 2.2 rebounds and 0.8 assists per game ... Had the second-most productive season from 3-point range in Long Beach State history making 83 shots from 3-point range, four off Jabril Hodges' school record ... In his second season at the helm of the Long Beach State program, Dan Monson may have done the best coaching job of his career.

Picked eighth in the Preseason Big West Conference Coaches Poll after finishing his first season at The Beach 6-25, Monson led a team with four true freshmen in the regular rotation, including three freshmen starters at the end of the season, to a nine-win (15-15) improvement and a second-place finish in the Big West Conference. All this despite losing Donovan Morris, an All-Big West selection after Monson's first season, for a big portion of the conference schedule.

Monson has injected talent into the 49ers program in his last two recruiting classes. His 2007-08 recruiting class featured five freshmen, four of whom (Larry Anderson, Eugene Phelps, T.J. Robinson and Casper Ware) were key players as true freshmen in the 49ers turnaround.

Anderson became the first freshman to be named first-team All-Big West since LBSU's Clifton Pondexter earned the honor following the 1973-74 season. Anderson also became just the third 49er to be named Big West Freshman of the Year joining Lucious Harris (1990) and James Cotton (1994).

Robinson and Ware joined Anderson on the five-player Big West All-Freshman Team to mark the second time three

49ers have made the all-freshman team in the same season.

Monson's 2008-09 recruiting class may be better than the 2007-08 class. ESPN.com and Scouts Inc. named the 2008-09 class, which includes sophomore Lin Chang, freshmen Kyle Richardson and Jules Montgomery, and junior Tristan Wilson, the 10th-best recruiting class among mid-major programs.

Monson was tabbed as the new head men's basketball coach at Long Beach State April 7, 2007, where he inherited a depleted roster.

Monson has been a Division I head coach for 12 years, during which he has compiled a career record of 191-163 (.540), with seven trips to postseason play, including a trip to the Elite Eight in 1999 with Gonzaga University.

Monson is the 16th head coach in Long Beach State men's basketball history, dating back to 1950-51.

In addition to his 20-plus seasons coaching Division I basketball, as either a head or assistant coach, Monson has served on two coaching staffs for USA Basketball representing the United States in international competition.

He served as an assistant coach at the 1999 World University Games and for the USA 20-and-Under Qualifying team, winning gold medals at both competitions.

Monson was the head coach at the University of Minnesota for seven-plus years, compiling a 118-105 mark and reaching postseason play in five of his seven seasons.

In 2004-05 he led the Gophers to a memorable year. He engineered the second-best Big Ten turnaround in the previous 20 seasons, finishing the season with a 10-6 conference mark after posting just three league wins the previous campaign. Minnesota reached the 20-win plateau for the first time since 1992-93 and Monson led the Golden Gophers to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1999.

In 2005-06 the Gophers advanced to their fifth postseason appearance in six years. Senior guard Vincent Grier was named All-Big Ten and All-District for the second straight year. In 2002-03 Minnesota went 19-14 and earned the program's first trip to the NIT semifinals in Madison Square Garden.

Monson reached two personal coaching milestones in 2004-05. With a victory over Indiana in the Big Ten Tournament quarterfinals, he earned his 100th victory at Minnesota. When he defeated Purdue on February 26, 2005 he picked up his 150th career head-coaching victory. With 100 victories in his first six years at Minnesota, Monson ranks second all-time at the school behind Jim Dutcher (1975-85) in wins during his first six years as head coach.

Monson stepped into the Minnesota job on the heels of NCAA sanctions against the school. Those NCAA violations during the

school-record with its 24 wins and Monson was also named the National Rookie Coach of the Year by *Basketball Times*.

Monson was a key figure in the Bulldogs turnaround in the 1990's. Gonzaga had a record of 223-89 over 10 seasons and he was responsible for recruiting many of the key players in Gonzaga's NCAA Sweet 16 appearances from 1998-2001. From the time Monson was named associate head coach in 1995, Gonzaga averaged 22 wins per season and reached postseason play every year but one.



mid-1990's severely limited scholarships and put strict recruiting sanctions on the program since the summer of 1999, coinciding with Monson's arrival at Minnesota. The summer of 2005 was the first Monson and his staff could recruit on par with every other college basketball program and that season concluded with a trip to the NCAA Tournament, the programs first year off probation.

Prior to accepting the Minnesota job on July 24, 1999, Monson was the head coach at Gonzaga for two years. In 1998-99 he led the Bulldogs to within a breath of the Final Four.

Gonzaga, which went 28-7 on the year and won the West Coast Conference regular season and tournament championships, defeated such notable NCAA powers as Minnesota (75-63), Stanford (82-74) and Florida (73-72) before bowing out to eventual national-champion Connecticut (67-62) in the Elite Eight.

His first year as head coach at Gonzaga resulted in a 24-10 mark, as the Bulldogs advanced to the second round of the NIT. Monson had a sparkling 52-17 (.754) record in his two seasons as the head coach of the Bulldogs.

Monson spent 11 years helping build the Gonzaga program. He began at GU as an assistant coach in 1988 and spent six years laying the groundwork. In 1994-95 he was elevated to associate head coach under head coach Dan Fitzgerald.

Three years later he took over full control of the Gonzaga program. He led Gonzaga to a West Coast Conference title in 1998 and was named the WCC Coach of the Year. The squad set a

Prior to joining the Bulldogs' staff, Monson spent two seasons as a graduate assistant coach under Gene Bartow at the University of Alabama-Birmingham.

A 1985 graduate of the University of Idaho with a bachelor degree in mathematics, Monson earned his Masters degree in education with a concentration on athletic administration from UAB in 1988.

Monson played one year of football for the Vandals, but turned his attention to coaching when a knee injury cut short his gridiron career. He coached the boys' basketball team at Oregon City (OR) High School for one year prior to taking the UAB graduate assistant post.

Monson gained valuable experience by coaching on the international level with USA Basketball. 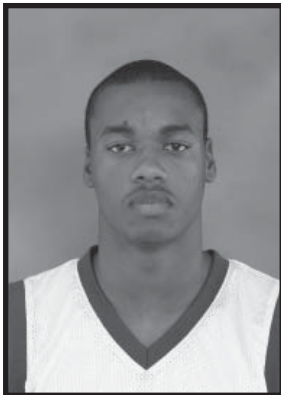

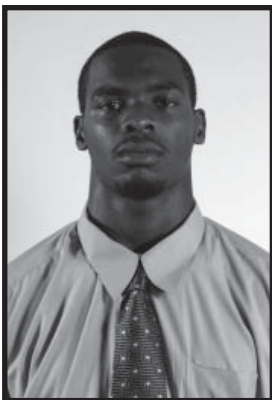

**LONG BEACH STATE IN NATIONAL POSTSEASON ACTION**

The Long Beach State men's basketball program has advanced to postseason play 13 times since 1970, including eight trips to the NCAA Tournament. The 49ers have compiled a 7-9 record playing in the NCAA Tournament, while going 2-5 in National Invitation Tournament (NIT) action.

The Beach put together five tournament appearances in eight years in the 1970s, including four straight from 1970-1973. LBSU advanced to a pair of West Regional finals losing to eventual national-champion UCLA both times, 57-55 in 1971 and 73-57 in 1972.

Long Beach State won at least one NCAA Tournament game in each of those four years (1970-73) with a 92-73 win over Weber State in the first round in 1970 in Provo, Utah; a 77-66 win over Weber State in the first round and a 78-65 win over Pacific in the regional semifinals in 1971 in Logan, Utah; a 95-90 overtime win over BYU in the first round and a 75-55 win over San Francisco in the regional semis in 1972 in Pocatello, Idaho; and a 88-75 win over Weber State in the first round and a 84-80 win over Arizona State in the consolation game in 1973 in Logan, Utah.

Long Beach State returned to the NCAA Tournament four years later losing to Idaho State, 83-72, in the first round of the West Regionals in Pocatello, Idaho.

The 49ers snapped a 15-year NCAA Tournament drought in 1993 when they advanced to the Western Regional in Salt Lake City, Utah, losing to Illinois in the first round, 75-72. LBSU returned to the tournament two years later, in 1995, losing 76-64 in the first round in Boise, Idaho. The Beach's last trip to the NCAA Tournament came in 2007 when the 49ers lost to Tennessee, 121-86, in the first round of the South Regional in Columbus, Ohio.

Long Beach State made five trips to the NIT between 1980 and 2000. The 49ers advanced to the second round of the tournament twice winning first round games against Pepperdine, 104-87, in Anaheim, Calif., in 1980, and against Arizona State, 86-71, in Tempe, Ariz., in 1990.

In 1980, the 49ers were eliminated in the second round losing at UNLV, 90-81. The Beach was knocked out in the second round of the 1990 tournament losing 84-79 at Hawaii.

LBSU made its second trip to the NIT in 1988 losing at Stanford 80-77. After the 1990 tournament, the 49ers qualified for the NIT again in 1992 losing 73-61 at TCU. The Beach's final NIT appearance came in 2000 when it lost 70-66 at California.
