HEAD COACH JODY WYNN ♦ *Third Year*

Jody Wynn enters her third year at the helm of the Long Beach State women's basketball program. Wynn became the sixth head coach in 49er history on April 7, 2009, after spending five seasons as the senior assistant, recruiting coordinator and head of scouting at USC.

LBSU failed to advance to the conference tournament the year before her arrival, but Wynn has now guided the 49ers to consecutive postseason appearances. In her first year at Long Beach State, Wynn led the team to a fourth-place finish in league play and a spot in the Big West Tournament quarterfinals.

The 49ers, who swept eventual Big West Tournament champion UC Riverside and defending Big West champion UC Santa Barbara during the regular season, closed out the campaign with a 13-17 overall record and a 9-7 mark in conference action. Three 49ers were named to the all-conference team with Karina Figueroa earning first-team honors. Figueroa was the first LBSU player to receive first-team recognition since Crystal McCutcheon in 2006.

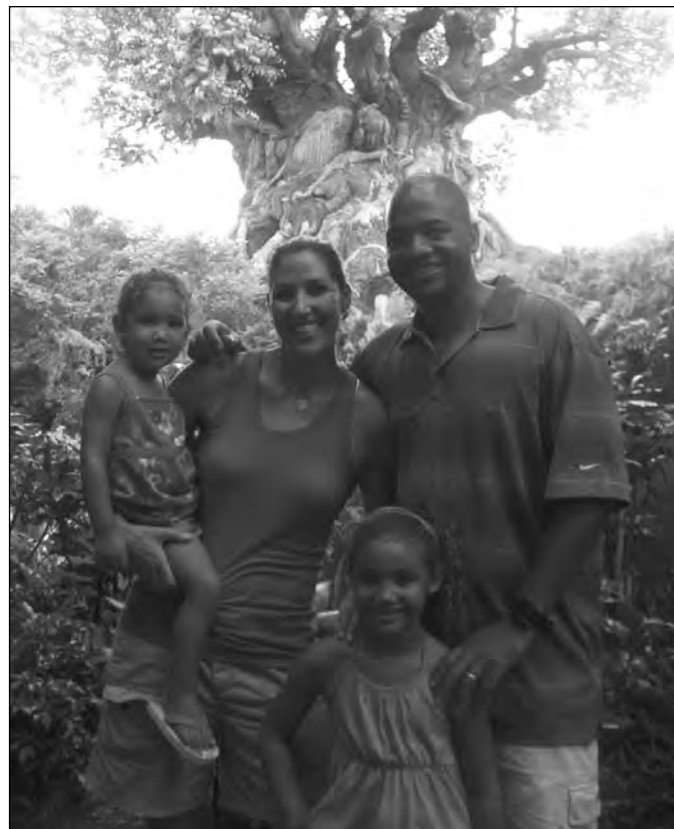
In 2010-11, Long Beach State finished sixth in the Big West and had two players named to the all-conference team. The 49ers also claimed the Big West Freshman of the Year and the Big West Hustle Player of the Year awards.

Wynn came to LBSU with 13 years of collegiate coaching experience under her belt. While at USC, she was in charge of bringing in four nationally-ranked recruiting classes, including the No. 1-ranked group in 2006. On the court, Wynn coached seven All-Pac 10 performers, a conference freshman of the year and a WNBA draft pick.

In 2008-09, Wynn helped the Trojans advance to their first-ever Pac-10 championship game, with five players garnering all-league honors. In her first season at USC (2004-05), the Women of Troy tied for second in the conference and rolled into the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1997, finishing the campaign ranked 22nd in the nation. One year later, the Trojans were back in the postseason, advancing to the second round.

Wynn entered the coaching ranks in 1996-97 as an assistant at Pepperdine under former USC head coach Mark Trakh. She helped the Waves to six postseason appearances, including three bids to the NCAA Tournament. In her eight seasons in Malibu, Pepperdine had six 20-win campaigns and captured four West Coast Conference championships.

The Brea, Calif., native was a four-year letterwinner and starting guard at USC from 1993-96. During her playing career, the Trojans compiled a record of 79-35 (.693), won the 1994 Pac-10 Conference championship and made three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances. She enjoyed her best season as a junior in 1995, starting 27 games and averaging 8.2 points, 5.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists per contest.

Wynn was also a prep standout at Brea Olinda High School, where she guided the Ladycats to three California state championships. She earned CIF Southern Section and Orange County Player of the Year accolades in 1991 and 1992, while also being tabbed a *USA Today* and *Streets & Smith* honorable mention All-American.

Wynn earned her bachelor's degree in exercise science from USC in 1996 and attained a master's in education from Pepperdine in 2000.

The former Jody Anton is married to Derek Wynn and the couple has two daughters, Jada and Kaeli.

ASSISTANT COACH DEREK WYNN ♦ *Third Year*

Derek Wynn begins his third season as an assistant coach at Long Beach State.

In 2009-10, Wynn helped lead LBSU to a fourth-place finish in the Big West and an appearance in the quarterfinals of the conference tournament. The 49ers posted their first winning record in Big West action since 2005-06 as they finished with a 9-7 mark.

Long Beach State returned to the Big West Tournament last year after placing sixth in the conference.

Wynn came to the 49ers from USC where he served as an assistant from 2004-09. In each of his first two seasons, the Trojans advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Prior to his stint at USC, Wynn was an assistant at Pepperdine (2000-04). During his time in Malibu, he helped lead the Waves to five postseason appearances and three West Coast Conference titles.

Before entering the college ranks, Wynn spent six seasons (1994-99) as the assistant boys' basketball coach at Upland High School, where he helped the Highlanders earn five consecutive CIF Southern Section playoff berths. The 1996 and 1997 teams captured the Baseline League championship, while the 1999 team notched a school-best 25-4 mark. During his time at Upland, Wynn coached 12 athletes who went on to play collegiate basketball, including six Division I players.

In addition to coaching, Wynn taught physical education during the 1998-99 school year at St. Edward's School in Corona, Calif., and worked extensively as a substitute teacher in the Upland Unified School District. As a prep, Wynn played basketball at Upland High, where he garnered All-Baseline League accolades as a senior.

Wynn earned his bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Cal State Fullerton in 1996 and a master's and teaching credential from Azusa Pacific in 1999.

Wynn is married to 49er head coach Jody Wynn and the couple has two daughters, Jada and Kaeli.

ASSISTANT COACH JEFF CAMMON ♦ *Third Year*



Jeff Cammon enters his third season as an assistant coach at Long Beach State.

With Cammon on the 49er staff, LBSU has advanced to the Big West Tournament in each of the last two years. In 2009-10, Cammon helped lead Long Beach State to a fourth-place finish in conference play and an appearance in the quarterfinals of the conference tournament. LBSU posted its first winning record in Big West action since 2005-06 as it finished with a 9-7 mark.

Cammon re-entered the collegiate coaching ranks after spending two years as the head girls' varsity basketball coach at Bishop Alemany High School, where he also taught history. Prior to that, Cammon had served as an assistant men's basketball coach at Kentucky Wesleyan College, Chaffey Community College and Alcorn State University.

Cammon has also worked numerous camps in the Southern California area, including USC's Elite Camp and Pepperdine's Malibu Hoop Camp.

As a student-athlete, Cammon was a three-year starting point guard and two-time team captain at Alcorn State. He helped lead the Braves to three conference championships and an NCAA Tournament berth in 2001-02.

Cammon received both his bachelor's degree in political science (2003) and his master's in physical education (2005) from Alcorn State.

Laura Freimuth begins her third season as an assistant coach at Long Beach State after spending six years working with the USC women's basketball program.

Freimuth helped lead the 49ers to a fourth-place finish in the Big West and an appearance in the quarterfinals of the conference tournament two years ago. LBSU also posted its first winning record in Big West action since 2005-06.

In 2010-11, the 49ers were sixth in conference play and qualified for the Big West Tournament.

For her first two seasons with the Women of Troy, Freimuth served as a team manager, including one as head manager in 2004-05, while completing her bachelor's degree in communications. She then took a position as video coordinator while earning her master's degree in postsecondary administration and student affairs. In 2008-09, Freimuth worked as the Trojans' director of basketball operations.

Freimuth played basketball for two seasons at Fullerton College, serving as a team captain in 2002-03 and earning a scholar-athlete award in 2003.

In high school, Freimuth competed in basketball, volleyball, golf and track at Henry M. Jackson High School in Mill Creek, Wash., and became the first student-athlete in school history to earn 12 varsity letters.

Hiegel came to LBSU from Temple where he spent four years as the head strength and conditioning coach for Olympic sports. While at Temple, he was responsible for the design and implementation of strength and conditioning, speed/agility and testing programs for all 22 of the Owl's men's and women's Olympic sports teams.

Hiegel spent two seasons (2003-05) at his alma mater, San Jose State, working as an assistant strength and conditioning coach. He was responsible for designing and implementing the strength and conditioning programs for eight men's and women's Olympic sports team and also assisted in the strength training for the Spartan football team.

In addition to his work at the collegiate level, Hiegel has spent time working in professional baseball, the National Hockey League and the National Football League. He served as an assistant strength and conditioning coach for the Wichita Wranglers, the Kansas City Royals AA team, between his time at San Jose State and Temple. He also spent time as a volunteer strength and conditioning coach for the San Jose Sharks and as a strength and conditioning intern for the Oakland Raiders.

Hiegel graduated from San Jose State, where he played baseball, with a degree in human performance/kinesiology in 2003. He recently finished his master's in sport and recreation administration at Temple.

In his capacity as head athletic trainer, Pocinich supervises five certified athletic trainers and two athletic training rooms, while overseeing policy and procedures development for the athletic training room in collaboration with staff, administration and physicians.

Pocinich is responsible for LBSU's drug testing program, is a committee member for the CSULB Influenza Response Planning and Health Services Oversight and is an approved curriculum instructor for the Undergraduate Athletic Training Education Program.

Before coming to Long Beach State, Pocinich spent seven years at USC where he served as an assistant athletic trainer. He provided coverage for football, men's basketball, women's water polo, baseball and crew for the Trojans.

Pocinich was an assistant athletic trainer and clinical instructor at Eastern Washington University from 1998-2000. At EWU, he worked with men's and women's basketball, women's volleyball, women's soccer and track & field. Pocinich started his career as a graduate assistant at Oregon where he worked with football, men's and women's basketball, wrestling and track & field.

Pocinich earned his undergraduate degree from San Diego State in 1996 before getting his master's in sports medicine from the University of Oregon.

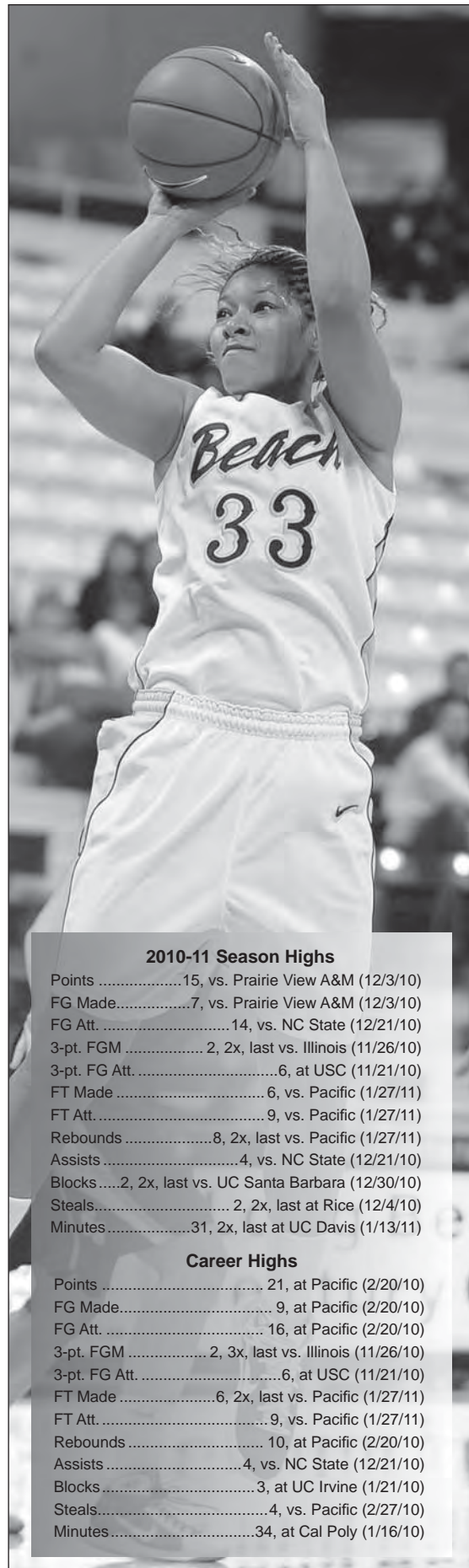
