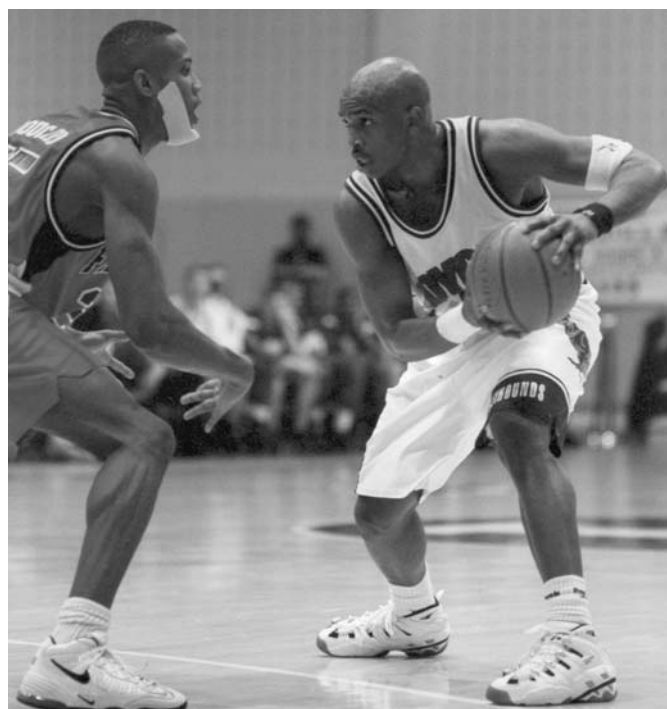

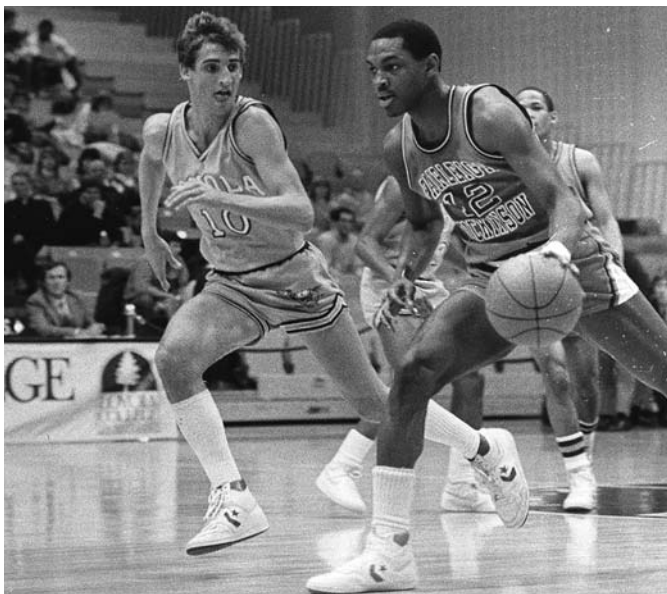

He also coached the baseball team at Loyola for 32 years and collected 290 career wins with another 11 Mason-Dixon titles. In 1984, the College's basketball arena was dedicated and re-named Reitz Arena.

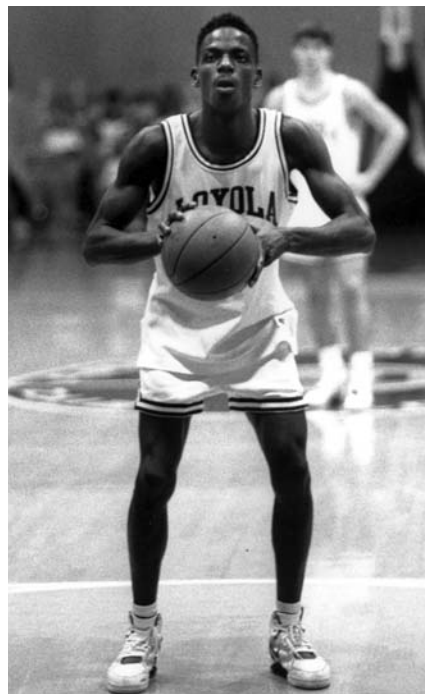

GREYHOUNDS PLAYING PROFESSIONALLY

Loyola basketball has produced its share of professional athletes over the years. Whether it has been in the States or overseas, numerous former Greyhounds have been able to follow their dreams and continue playing after their time at Evergreen had passed.

At the top of the list would be Mike Morrison, who in June of 1989, became the first modern Greyhounds player ever chosen in the NBA draft. Selected by the Phoenix Suns in the second round as the 51st pick overall, Morrison played at Loyola from 1985-89, and finished fourth on the school's all-time scoring list with 1,697 points.

Facing difficult odds, Morrison made the team and saw considerable action as the Suns advanced to the NBA Western Conference Finals. The Suns sent Morrison back to his hometown in September 1990 when they traded him to the Washington Bullets. Morrison spent the 1990-91 campaign in the Continental Basketball Association, helping the Wichita Falls (Texas) franchise to the league title. He moved on and was one of the top scorers of the Global Basketball League during the 1991-92 season, competing for the Raleigh-Durham Bullfrogs. Following that experience, Morrison ventured overseas and continued his pro career in Australia and Venezuela.

Anthony Smith, a Greyhound from 1994-97, played in France for many years. Jason Rowe, a Greyhound from 1996-2000 played for the Gravelines of the French Professional League in 2001 and 2002. Former Greyhounds have also represented Loyola in the Netherlands with B.J. Pendleton and Roderick Platt. Pendleton, a 1996 graduate, also was a member of the Greyhounds' 1994 NCAA tournament squad. He signed a professional contract in the Netherlands after graduation. Pendleton is the 10th all-time leading scorer in Loyola basketball history, having poured in 1,465 points. Michael Reese, the leading scorer and rebounder for the 1993-94 NCAA tournament team, also played professionally in Europe, most recently in Luxembourg. His basketball pursuits led him to Portugal and Cyprus as well.

There is also Kevin Green, a Greyhound from 1988-92, who completed his Loyola career as the school's second-leading scorer with 2,154

points. He played for the New Jersey Jammers of the United States Basketball League during the summer of 1992.

Most recently, Andre Collins finished up his Loyola career and headed overseas to continue playing. The Greyhounds' leading scorer and fourth nationally during his one season at Evergreen, Collins currently plays for Ferrara in the Italian League.

It all started with Andy O'Donnell, the first former Greyhound to see action at the professional level. O'Donnell played for the old Baltimore Bullets in the late 1940's.

The 1970's, however, would produce Loyola's most complete professional lineup. Many Greyhounds turned pro after leaving Loyola. Among them, Bob Connor, a 1971 Loyola graduate, played briefly in the old Eastern League. Connor's teammate, Mike Krawczyk, played pro ball in Italy after graduating in 1972. Jimmy Smith, a Greyhound from 1972-76, extended his basketball career in France and England while both Tim Koch, who played in the CBA, and Rich Brittain, who played in Europe, also were Greyhounds standouts in the late 1970s.

On the outer fringes of those talented '70s teams was Mark DiGiacomo, who played at Loyola from 1977-81. After graduation, he went to South America and played professionally in Chile from June until December 1981. DiGiacomo spent a year away from the game before traveling to Norway, where he played for three different teams and also coached for several years.

The European experience also proved rewarding for three Greyhounds from the mid-1980's era. Kevin Carter '86 played briefly in Sweden. David Gately '87 and Tommy Lee '87 both played in Ireland after Loyola. Gately, the third-leading scorer in Loyola history, nearly won the Irish scoring title in 1987-88 by averaging better than 35 points per game.

Mike Malone, who led the Greyhounds in assists as senior team captain in 1993, followed in the footsteps of his father (Brendan Malone) and entered the professional ranks as a coach. Malone was an assistant with Cleveland last season, helping the Cavaliers to an appearance in the NBA Finals.

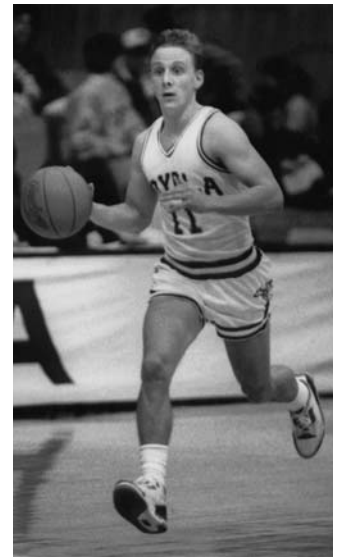
