GREYHOUNDS EXPECT CONTRIBUTIONS FROM ALL CLASSES IN 2010-2011

One thing that was evident during the 2009-2010 season for the Loyola Greyhounds.

The team had balance.

In part due to injuries to a pair of starters, but mostly because of the talent that existed on the roster, the Greyhounds had unique balance among its four classes in both scoring in rebounding.

The just-graduated senior class carried the largest amount of the scoring mostly because of the exploits of Brett Harvey, who graduated as the 20th all-time leading scorer in school history with 1,208 career points. He led a four-person senior class that combined to account for 29.2 percent of the team's scoring and 24.2 percent of the rebounding.

The remaining 70 percent of the scoring and 75 percent of the rebounding is fairly balanced among the returning classes with the four-person class of rising juniors leading the list. Not to be forgotten is a two-person senior class that more than holds its own with all-time leaders in scoring and assists among it and a two-person sophomore class that increases by one with the addition of an eligible transfer who is expected to contribute right away.

Those three classes, combined with three freshmen recruits, will determine the successes of the 2010-2011 Loyola men's basketball team, the seventh edition put together by head coach **JIMMY PAT-SOS**.

Now a preview of the 2010-2011 Greyhounds:

STARTERS RETURNING

While 11 players made starts last season, only six of those appeared in the starting lineup 10 or more times and Brett Harvey is the only one of those who has graduated. Three new faces last year – transfer Shane Walker and freshmen Robert Olson and Julius Brooks – joined Harvey in making more than 20 starts. Anthony Winbush was a consistent starter before his season ended following a mid-January injury and Brian Rudolph became a full-time starter as a result of injuries to Winbush and Harvey.

Rudolph has 68 career starts in his three seasons at point guard. Jamal Barney started for most of his sophomore season when he led the MAAC in scoring and could be challenged by Olson, a starter 26 times as a freshman. Depending on his rehabilitation, Winbush could be fingered to return to a starting role while Walker led the team with 27 starts last year and ended his season with a 26-point outburst in the MAAC Tournament. Brooks started 24 games last year, but expect transfer Erik Etherly to push for a spot.

SENIORS

Both members of the class have had their share of personal and team successes over the last three years and will be counted on for leadership as they use their final season of eligibility.

JAMAL BARNEY ended the campaign as the team's leading scorer for the second straight season, despite missing six games in January. He is 105 points away from scoring 1,000 for his career and if he achieves that goal it would mark the fourth straight season that a Greyhounds player reaches that milestone. He showed flashes of the scoring explosiveness that he demonstrated as a sophomore and a return to that form would be good news for the Greyhounds.

BRIAN RUDOLPH had his scoring and assists numbers decrease from his first two seasons, but ended with seven double-digit scoring outings over the final 15 games. He posted four games with seven assists, but 12 times had two or fewer. Similar to his classmate, more consistency will be a key to Loyola's success.

JUNIORS

SHANE WALKER saved his best for last, posting a pair of double-doubles to open February, then closing with a 14-rebound

effort in the regular-season finale and a 26-point outburst in the MAAC Tournament. After a season establishing his residency and then rehabilitating from a knee injury, the late-season blooming is understood.

The rehabilitation of **ANTHONY WINBUSH** will similarly be monitored closely. Having earned the reputation as a defensive stopper upon his arrival on campus, he showed scoring prowess last season with six double-figure outings. He bettered his shooting percentage by nearly 140 points from his freshman year and matched his career high with 17 points at Bucknell.

Guard **J'HARED HALL** picked up some of the minutes available following Winbush's injury and made them count. He averaged 11.3 points over his four starts in mid-January, including a career-high 16 points against Marist, sinking five three-pointers in the game. Renowned for his scoring, he exploded for double figures seven times during a 10-game stretch.

Forward **PAOLO IVIS** saw his first action in a Greyhounds uniform last year and appeared in 16 games, playing a career-best 14 minutes at Niagara with three points and five rebounds.

Walk-on center **JOSH WIEGAND** chose to sit out last season as a non-participating redshirt and has earned a scholarship for this year. He started five of his 14 appearances as a freshman, scoring 16 points.

SOPHOMORES

Both freshmen who joined the program last season made immediate impact as they started the first game of the season and combined to make 50 starts. **ROBERT OLSON** was rewarded by being named to the MAAC All-Rookie Team after his 26 starts and a 6.4 scoring average. He scored 10 or more six times during a nine-game mid-season stretch, including a career-best 20 points against Marist.

Forward **JULIUS BROOKS** put his stamp on the program from the onset, blocking three shots in his first game and following that with eight points at West Virginia. His best all-around effort may have been the 10-point, eight-rebound outing against Niagara last January.

After sitting out last season following his transfer from Northeastern, forward **ERIK ETHERLY** is expected to compete for a starting spot. He can score inside and outside, battles on both backboards and is an outstanding addition to this class.

LUKE WANDRUSCH was elevated from team manager to walk-on in late December and appeared in two games. He will have a similar role this year in leading the scout team and pushing the starters in practice.

FRESHMEN

Three newcomers are in the fold for the start of the season. The one who could make the most-immediate impact is guard **DYLON CORMIER**. A two-time all-Baltimore pick in high school, he was consistently one of the top guards in the Baltimore Catholic League while playing at now-defunct Cardinal Gibbons. A scorer who can get his teammates involved, he should compete for minutes at point guard.

Two wing players complete the class. The first, **JUSTIN DRUMMOND**, played out-of-position along the front line in high school and moves to his more-comfortable guard position with the Greyhounds. He is a slasher whereas classmate **PIERSON WILLIAMS** is a pure shooter who can knock down shots from anywhere on the floor. The California native comes from an area which was very good to Coach Patsos during his days as an assistant at Maryland.

HEAD COACH JIMMY PATSOS

Seventh Season • Catholic University '89

Since taking over the reins of the program in April 2004, head coach **Jimmy Patsos** has turned around the Greyhounds and continued to establish new school marks. Patsos led a young Greyhounds team to double-digit wins for the fifth consecutive season, the first time that a Loyola coach has achieved that mark in nearly three decades.

Entering his seventh season at the helm, Patsos looks to continue to build on the consistency that he has established since taking over.

Taking over a team that had recorded just one win the season prior, Patsos and his staff injected immediate energy into the program and generated legions of followers through its fast-paced, pressing style of play. That first season featured the college's first three-game winning streak in five years and the snapping of a 39-game road losing streak. Patsos registered his first career coaching win over eventual MAAC regular-season and championship titlist Niagara when the Purple Eagles left Reitz Arena saddled with a 97-89 defeat.

There was plenty more to come in Season Two. A five-game winning streak to start the season ballooned into a 10-3 start with the only blemishes being losses to MAAC regular-season champion Manhattan, Virginia of the Atlantic Coast Conference and Providence of the BIG EAST. Regrouping at the end of the season, Patsos rallied the team to finish with four wins in the final five regular-season games to secure a winning record and the No. 6 seed at the MAAC Championships, where the season ended with a tough two-point loss in the opening round.

Patsos' third season saw the successes come more frequently and the wins began to pile up. After concluding December with a three-game losing streak, the Greyhounds ran off six straight MAAC wins in January for a school-record seven straight conference victories. By mid-February, Loyola had secured a bye in the MAAC Championship for the first time since 1998 and finished tied for third in the conference standings and as the No. 3 seed. The quarterfinal win over Fairfield gave the Greyhounds wins over all nine MAAC opponents for the first time in school history and that spot in the Championship Semifinals.

The Greyhounds backed up that success in 2007-2008 by collecting 11 home wins — the most victories in Reitz Arena since the first team to play there won 12 games in 1984-1985. Another MAAC Quarterfinal win over Fairfield vaulted Loyola back into the Semifinals where they lost to the eventual champion for the second straight season.

Two years ago, despite losing more than 3,000 points and 1,500 rebounds to graduation, the young team found its mark at the end of January, winning six straight, including road wins at Manhattan, Marist and Rider. And last year, the team recorded arguably the biggest regular-season win in the 100-season history of the program with a 72-67 victory at five-time National Champion Indiana.

The turnaround is not surprising after looking at Patsos' pedigree. He was been surrounded by winners and learned from some of the best basketball minds in the nation during his rise to the helm of the Greyhounds.

Patsos came to the Loyola campus straight from the University of Maryland where as an assistant on the staff of Gary Williams for 13 seasons he helped guide the Terrapins to 11 consecutive NCAA Tournaments, including seven Sweet Sixteen appearances, consecutive trips to the Final Four (2001 and 2002) and the 2002 NCAA National Championship. In those 13 seasons, Maryland

finished in the top half of the rugged ACC 10 times, won two ACC regular-season championships (1995 and 2002), captured the 2004 ACC Tournament title and posted a school-record eight straight 20-win seasons. Additionally during his tenure with the Terrapins, 13 players who Patsos coached were drafted into the NBA, including six first-round selections with four of those being tabbed as lottery picks — Walt Williams (1992), Joe Smith (1995), Steve Francis (1999) and Chris Wilcox (2002). Former Terrapins Keith Booth (1997) and Juan Dixon (2002) round out the sextet and Patsos currently teams with Dixon to hold an annual basketball summer camp held on the Loyola campus.

While at College Park, Patsos was recognized by ESPN's Andy Katz as a "Coach on the Rise" after helping Maryland to their seventh Sweet Sixteen appearance, a fifth Top 10 ranking in the final coaches poll and a victory over No. 1 Duke in the inaugural season at the Comcast Center in 2003.

Patsos joined the Terrapins as a volunteer assistant prior to the 1991-1992 season and immediately became an integral part of Williams' staff. His numerous responsibilities included on-court coaching and the academic development of Maryland's players. His role as an academic mentor during his first 10 seasons on Williams' staff proved productive, as the teams' overall academic performance improved under his guidance. As a recruiter, he helped Maryland land a 2002-2003 incoming class ranked as high as fourth in the nation and a group of Terrapins newcomers for the 2003-2004 season rated as high as second in the country by several national publications.

Prior to his appointment at Maryland, Patsos was the assistant coach at Archbishop Carroll HS in Washington, D.C. He helped Carroll to a 21-8 record and a national ranking of No. 6 during his first season before the team lost to famed DeMatha Catholic HS in the city playoffs. Patsos was involved in the maturation of Charles Harrison (Wake Forest) and Lawrence Moten (Syracuse), both of whom became collegiate stars.

A three-year varsity letter winner at The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., Patsos played for the late Jack Bruen, who later led Colgate University to a pair of NCAA Division I Tournament appearances in the 1990s. The Cardinals posted a record of 51-26 during his career as a player and captured four in-season tournament championships, highlighted by a 106-99 victory over Manhattanville in the championship game of the Manhattanville Tournament as Patsos led the Cardinals with career-highs for points (17) and rebounds (14). Other top games during his senior campaign included 12 points and five rebounds against Frostburg State, 10 rebounds at Scranton, and 12 points and nine rebounds against St. Mary's (Md.).

As a junior, Patsos recorded season-highs of 14 points against Upsala and 11 rebounds against Washington (Md.) College. He scored 12 points and grabbed five rebounds to lead Catholic to the championship of the Alfred University Charity Cage Classic with a 90-88 victory over the host Saxons. The Cardinals were 18-8 during both his junior and senior years, then school records for victories in a single season.

A native of Boston, Mass., Patsos grew up attending games at the Boston Garden. He earned his Bachelor's Degree in History from Catholic in 1989. His brother Chris captained the Florida Southern baseball team to the 1981 NCAA Division II World Series championship and his father Charles received a Tony in 1987 for Best Revival as a member of the producing team for "All My Sons".
