GREYHOUNDS LOOKING TO BUILD ON SUCCESSES OF 2006-07

For the first time in the last three seasons, there will not be significant changes within the Loyola Greyhounds men's basketball program. Head coach Jimmy Patsos enters his fourth season at the helm and has steadily increased the Greyhounds' win total since his arrival, reaching 18 last season, the most since the 1970-71 team posted a 19-7 mark. Also back from the team that reached the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) Championship Semifinals are nine letter winners and four starters, including the nation's third returning scorer in senior guard Gerald Brown. Add to the mix four new players and Loyola will be in search of a third straight winning season for the first time since Mark Amatucci put together four straight winning campaigns between 1983-87.

The biggest question entering last season was how the Greyhounds would replace Andre Collins' 26.1 points per game. Brown, a newly eligible transfer from Providence College, delivered from the onset, averaging 22.2 points per outing to lead the MAAC and finish eighth nationally. A unanimous All-MAAC First Team Selection, Brown received plenty of support from his teammates last season, many of whom return. The leadership of graduated Josko Alujevic and Shane James will be missed, but five seniors are ready to fill those roles and welcome four newcomers as the Greyhounds look for continued improvement from last season.

Here now a preview of the 2007-08 Greyhounds:

STARTERS RETURNING

Four full-time starters from last season return, including seniors Brown and forward Omari Isreal, junior guard Marquis Sullivan and sophomore guard Brett Harvey. Senior forward Michael Tuck started 35 games over his first two seasons, but was the first reserve of the bench last season, resulting in his being named the MAAC's Sixth Man of the Year. Senior center Hassan Fofana started 30 straight games over two seasons before a leg injury forced him to miss 15 games at mid-season and relegated him to coming off the bench. Add to that list, junior guard Joe Miles, an eligible transfer from Marshall University, who started nine games in two years for the Thundering Herd, and Patsos has many options from which to select in putting five players on the floor at tip-off.

SENIORS

The largest of the four classes in the program, much of the attention will be directed toward Loyola's seniors. Clearly the focal point will be guard **Gerald Brown**. The team leader in scoring 22 times last season, Brown posted 19 outings of more than 20 points and five times he poured in more than 30. More than just a scorer, the Baltimore native led the conference in steals and ranked among the MAAC leaders in eight of 13 categories.

After entering last season as the team's top returning scorer and rebounder, **Michael Tuck** battled injuries all season and became the top choice off Patsos' bench when able to play. Limited to 21.4 minutes per game, Tuck shot nearly 60 percent from the floor (.599) and more than 50 percent from three-point range (.522) while averaging 9.1 points and 4.9 rebounds per game. Maintaining his health will be critical toward Tuck's availability and production.

Health and availability is also a concern for **Hassan Fofana**. The 6-10 center started the first eight games of last season before injuring his leg prior to the game at High Point. He missed the next 15 contests, returning for the final eight. He ended the campaign with his strongest offensive performance of the year, coming off the bench to make five-of-six from the floor for 11 points in the season finale with Niagara.

The first game without Fofana marked the debut of **Omari Isreal** and the Notre Dame transfer proceeded to start the final 23 games, posting three double-doubles while averaging 9.1 points and 5.7 rebounds. Having the 6-8 athletic forward for the entire season gives the Greyhounds a weapon on both ends of the floor with his moves around the basketball and shot-blocking ability.

The final member of the senior class is sharp-shooting **Greg Manning**. The designated three-pointer shooter off the bench, Manning possesses limitless range and scored half of his season total of points (25) over the final six games of the campaign. He also showed an ability to get to the free-throw line, making 13 of his 17 attempts in limited playing time.

JUNIORS

There was no "sophomore slump" for shooting specialist **Marquis Sullivan**, finishing second on the team in scoring (13.1 ppg) and on the All-MAAC Third Team. With an ability to make shots from every spot

on the floor, Sullivan scored 20 or more four times while finishing second in the conference after making 42.9 percent of his long-range shots. Increasing his ability to create his own shot will make him an even more potent weapon this season.

An athletic forward, **Jawaan Wright** played in 29 games a year ago and filled in admirably as a reserve forward off the bench while the Greyhounds saw their roster hurt by injury at various points during the season. He recorded three blocks in just eight minutes against Canisius and grabbed five rebounds at Michigan State. Continuing his growth as a player will determine his playing time in the upcoming season.

Injury and illness have interrupted the career of **Dan Ficke** thus far, having played in just eight games over two seasons. He missed the entire 2005-06 season following a shoulder injury and mononucleosis kept him out of the lineup for the campaign's final 20 contests last year. Expected to receive an additional year of eligibility, Ficke's strength around the basket gives him a chance to play.

Eligible this season after sitting out 2006-07 as a transfer, **Joe Miles** is expected to compete for minutes at guard. A point guard with an ability to score, Miles averaged 10.3 points and handed out 106 assists in two seasons at Marshall. One of the quicker players whenever he is on the floor, he can go by opponents or shoot over them with similar productivity.

SOPHOMORES

The only member of the class to see court time last season, **Brett Harvey** started at point guard from the first game of the season and earned two MAAC Rookie of the Week awards. A pass-first leader on the court, Harvey averaged 7.4 points and recorded 129 assists in his first season. He recorded seven double-figure scoring outputs, including a career-best 19 against Rider.

Sitting out this season following his transfer from Providence, **Jamal Barney** will be eligible in 2008-09 and have three seasons remaining in a Greyhounds uniform. An athletic guard who uses his strength and quickness on both ends of the floor, Barney will use the year to learn Patsos' system.

FRESHMEN

Two recruits and a hold-over from last year's recruiting class make up the Class of 2011. The repeat in this category from a year ago is **Tony Lewis** who sat out all of last season following shoulder surgery

in November. A rangy left-handed shooter, Lewis should challenge for playing time as a defender off the bench. **Isaac Reid** was an early signee from Texas who wrapped his senior season by being named the state's 4A Player of the Year. The 6-5 forward has a nose for the basketball and should contend for playing time off the bench. A late signee, **Brian Rudolph** also will be in contention for minutes as a reserve. A 5-11 point guard who uses his quickness on both ends of the floor, creating offense for his teammates and causing fits as a defender.

SCHEDULE

This year's schedule will certainly be one of the more challenging ones that Loyola has undertaken. In addition to MAAC champion Niagara, three other NCAA Tournament teams dot the schedule – Ivy League champ Pennsylvania and perennial powers Kansas of the Big XII and Illinois of the Big 10. Other non-conference road tests await with trips to Seton Hall and Dayton plus visits to long-time rivals Towson and Mount St. Mary's.

The home game with Penn and the game at Seton Hall are part of the field in the inaugural Philly Classic, an eight-team event with eight games on campus sites culminating with four doubleheaders over two days during Thanksgiving Weekend at the fabled Palestra. The Greyhounds will be joined in a bracket by Howard, Drexel and Robert Morris.

Home games with American and Vermont are joined by a game at New Jersey Institute to round out the non-conference portion. The final game will be a home contest against an opponent to be determined as part of the BracketBusters event in February.

The 18-game MAAC schedule includes a pair of games in December and the remainder of the slate after the New Year. The MAAC Championship returns to Albany, N.Y., this March.

OUTLOOK

A top-four seed in the MAAC Championships and appearance in the semifinals left the Greyhounds 40 minutes from a shot at an NCAA Championship berth a year ago. Going one game further to get that shot at the NCAA's this season is the ultimate goal. Navigating through the always rugged MAAC 18-game slate and securing one of the top seeds is the goal of all 10 teams with the ultimate prize to be raising the trophy on Monday night and securing an automatic bid into the 2008 NCAA Championship.

HEAD COACH JIMMY PATSOS

Fourth Season • Catholic University '89

The progress has been undeniable in the three seasons that head coach Jimmy Patsos has been at the helm of the Loyola College Men's Basketball Program. After reaching the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) Championship Semifinals in March, the bar has been raised for 2007-08 and Patsos is undoubtedly looking forward to the challenge.

After posting the college's first winning season in more than a decade with a 15-13 mark in 2005-06, Patsos guided the Greyhounds to an 18-13 record last year for consecutive winning campaigns for the first time since Loyola enjoyed four straight winning seasons two decades ago. With just three years of coaching under his belt, he already is seventh in winning percentage (.448) and tied for seventh in wins (39) in Loyola's 98-year men's basketball history. For his successes, Patsos was named one of 15 finalists for the 2007 Hugh Durham Coach of the Year Award, given annually to the nation's top mid-major head coach by collegeinsider.com. Pretty heady accomplishments for the man who has made the most of the opportunity provided to him when he was named the 20th men's basketball coach on April 1, 2004.

Taking over a team that had recorded just one win the season prior, Patsos and his staff injected immediate energy into the program and generated legions of followers through its fast-paced, pressing style of play. That first season featured the college's first three-game winning streak in five years and the snapping of a 39-game road losing streak. Patsos registered his first career coaching win over eventual MAAC regular-season and championship titlist Niagara when the Purple Eagles left Reitz Arena saddled with a 97-89 defeat.

There was plenty more to come in Season Two. A five-game winning streak to start the season ballooned into a 10-3 start with the only blemishes being losses to MAAC regular-season champion Manhattan, Virginia of the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) and Providence of the BIG EAST. Regrouping at the end of the season, Patsos rallied the team to finish with four wins in the final five regular-season games to secure a winning record and the No. 6 seed at the MAAC Championships, where the season ended with a tough two-point loss in the opening round.

Last season, the successes came more frequently and the wins began to pile up. After concluding December with a three-game losing streak, the Greyhounds ran off six straight MAAC wins in January for a school-record seven straight conference victories. By mid-February, Loyola had secured a bye in the MAAC Championship for the first time since 1998 and finished tied for third in the conference standings and seeded third in the Championship. The quarterfinal win over Fairfield gave the Greyhounds wins over all nine MAAC opponents for the first time in school history and that spot in the Championship Semifinals.

The turnaround is not surprising after looking at Patsos' pedigree. He was surrounded by winners and learned from some of the best basketball minds in the nation during his rise to the helm of the Greyhounds.

Patsos came to the Loyola campus straight from the University of Maryland where as an assistant on the staff of Gary Williams for 13 seasons he helped guide the Terrapins to 11 consecutive NCAA Tournaments, including seven Sweet Sixteen appearances, consecutive trips to the Final Four (2001 and 2002) and the 2002 NCAA Championship. In those 13 seasons, Maryland finished in the top half of the rugged ACC 10 times, won two ACC regular-

season championships (1995 and 2002), captured the 2004 ACC Tournament title and posted a school-record eight straight 20-win seasons. Additionally during his tenure with the Terrapins, 13 players who Patsos coached were drafted into the NBA, including six first-round selections with four of those being tabbed as lottery selections – Walt Williams (1992), Joe Smith (1995), Steve Francis (1999) and Chris Wilcox (2002). Former Terrapins Keith Booth (1997) and Juan Dixon (2002) round out the sextet and Patsos currently teams with Dixon to hold an annual basketball summer camp held on the Loyola campus.

While at College Park, Patsos was recognized by ESPN's Andy Katz as a "Coach on the Rise" after helping the Terrapins to their seventh Sweet Sixteen appearance, a fifth Top-10 ranking in the final coaches poll and a victory over No. 1 Duke in the inaugural season at the Comcast Center in 2003.

Patsos joined the Terrapins as a volunteer assistant prior to the 1991-92 season and immediately became an integral part of Williams' staff. His numerous responsibilities included on-court coaching and the academic development of Maryland's players. His role as an academic mentor during his first 10 seasons on Williams' staff proved productive, as the teams' overall academic performance improved under his guidance. As a recruiter, he helped Maryland land a 2002-03 incoming class ranked as high as fourth in the nation and a group of Terrapins newcomers for the 2003-04 season rated as high as second in the country by several national publications.

Prior to his appointment at Maryland, Patsos was the assistant coach at Archbishop Carroll HS in Washington, D.C. He helped Carroll to a 21-8 record and a national ranking of No. 6 during his first season before the team lost to famed DeMatha Catholic HS in the city playoffs. Patsos was involved in the maturation of Charles Harrison (Wake Forest) and Lawrence Moten (Syracuse), both of whom became stars on the collegiate level.

A three-year varsity letter winner at The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., Patsos played for the late Jack Bruen, who later led Colgate University to a pair of NCAA Division I Tournament appearances in the 1990s. The Cardinals posted a record of 51-26 during his career as a player and captured four in-season tournament championships, highlighted by a 106-99 victory over Manhattanville in the championship game of the Manhattanville Tournament as Patsos led the Cardinals with career highs for points (17) and rebounds (14). Other top games during his senior campaign included 12 points and five rebounds against Frostburg State, 10 rebounds at Scranton, and 12 points and nine rebounds against St. Mary's (Md.).

As a junior, Patsos recorded season highs of 14 points against Upsala and 11 rebounds against Washington College. He scored 12 points and grabbed five rebounds to lead Catholic to the championship of the Alfred University Charity Cage Classic with a 90-88 victory over the host Saxons. The Cardinals were 18-8 during both his junior and senior years, then school records for victories in a single season.

A native of Boston, Mass., Patsos grew up attending games at the Boston Garden. He earned his bachelor's degree in history from Catholic in 1989. His brother Chris captained the Florida Southern baseball team to the 1981 NCAA Division II World Series championship.
