NEW CHAPTER BEGINS WITH MANY NEW FACES FOR 2008-09 GREYHOUNDS

While no significant changes were anticipated heading into last season following three seasons of major adjustments to the roster of the Greyhounds, change is back as the norm for 2008-09. After establishing yet another Division I high for wins in a season with 19 and the first back-to-back MAAC Semifinal appearances in the history of the program, head coach **Jimmy Patsos** enters his fifth season looking to replace three starters and will guide a roster that has 10 sophomores and freshmen on it.

Gone are almost 42 points per game from last year's squad, a team that posted its third straight winning campaign. A fourth consecutive winning season will match the quartet put together between 1983-87 which is just one of the goals of this year's edition.

Two years ago, Greyhounds followers wondered how Andre Collins' 26.1 scoring average would be replaced. Those fears were put to rest when Providence transfer Gerald Brown first became eligible for Loyola and proceeded to lead the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference with 22.2 points per outing. Another Friars transfer becomes eligible for Loyola this season when Baltimore native Jamal Barney dons a Greyhounds uniform for the first time, one of six eligible newcomers this season.

How quickly those six can mesh with the players that return will go a long way in determining the success of the Greyhounds this season.

Now a preview of the 2008-09 Greyhounds:

STARTERS RETURNING

Three fifth-year senior starters are gone, leaving the backcourt tandem of junior **Brett Harvey** and sophomore **Brian Rudolph** as the lone returning starters. Harvey has started 61 games in his two seasons while Rudolph started the final 18 games of last year, helping Loyola to a 13-5 record during that stretch. Senior guard **Marquis Sullivan** has made 48 starts in his career, including nine a season ago, but was chosen by the league's coaches as the MAAC's Sixth Man of the Year and is expected to return to that role again this season.

Sophomores **Isaac Reid** and **Tony Lewis** each made a start during their freshmen campaigns and are the only other returning players to have earned starts in their careers.

SENIORS

This year's senior class has been a part of 52 wins over the previous three seasons — the best three-year run at the College since the early 1970s. A big part of that equation has been the play of long-range shooter **Marquis Sullivan**. Already Loyola's all-time leader in three-pointers made, Sullivan is 24 points away from 1,000 for his career and has been the team's second leading scorer each of the last two years. The Baltimore product scored in double figures in 15 of his last 17 games, including a career-high 28 points in the home finale against Canisius.

A key reserve off the bench in early January with the Greyhounds' bench thinned, forward **Dan Ficke** should serve in a similar role this season. He averaged 16 minutes over a four-game stretch, scoring 10 points with 15 rebounds in helping Loyola to a pair of wins.

Back in the program after a two-year hiatus is **Brad Farrell**. A starter a various times in his two previous seasons at the guard spots, this highly athletic player's primary role will be to spell play-

ers along the front line as he finishes his eligibility.

JUNIORS

Back in this category after sitting out all of last season as a non-participating redshirt, how quickly forward **Jawaan Wright** can find his game after not playing since March 2007 will dictate if he can grab one of the two starting spots in the frontcourt. An athlete who runs the floor well, he played in 52 games during his first two seasons.

The starter at point guard as a freshman and at shooting guard last season, **Brett Harvey** is the team's second-leading returning scorer at 8.2 points per game. Inserted as the starter at shooting guard at Fairfield, he responded with a career-high 20 points in the win over the Stags and matched that total a month later in the home game against Niagara. He has scored 500 points and handed out 252 assists in his two seasons thus far.

Returning to the team after making the squad as a walk-on is forward **Garrett Kelly**. The 6-6 shooter appeared in 14 games last season and was successful on his only two attempts from the free-throw line.

SOPHOMORES

After sitting out last season following his transfer from Providence, **Jamal Barney** returns to the court this season and will have three seasons of eligibility remaining. An extremely athletic big guard, he is expected to compete for a starting position and utilize his skills as a shooter and scorer.

The conference's reigning Rookie of the Year, point guard **Brian Rudolph** was a significant piece to Loyola's surge during the second half of the season once he was inserted as the starter. All told, the Greyhounds won 18 of the 25 games in which he started as he averaged 7.1 points per game while handing out 143 assists.

A scrappy player who saw significant minutes late in the season as a defensive stopper off the bench, guard **Tony Lewis** averaged 11 minutes an outing over the last five contests. He was perfect from the field in scoring nine points in the win over Howard after having earned a start in a home win against American.

Returning after missing the second half of last season is forward **Isaac Reid**. Prior to leaving the team, he averaged 10.4 minutes and 2.3 points over 17 games, earning a start at Illinois after grabbing seven rebounds at Dayton. Having the 6-5 forward for the entire season will have a significant impact on the fortunes of the Greyhounds this year.

Sitting out this season following his transfer from Maryland, **Shane Walker** will be eligible in 2009-10 and have three seasons remaining in a Greyhounds uniform. An athletic forward who can run the floor, Walker should fit well into Loyola's style of play when he is able to contribute a year from now.

FRESHMEN

The largest freshman class since Patsos arrived at Loyola is comprised of four forwards and a guard. Area products **Josh Wiegand** from Bel Air, Md., and **Anthony Winbush** from Alexandria, Va., are joined along the front line by a pair of international players — **Paolo Ivis** from Croatia and **Joe Muvuna** from Rwanda. The lone guard is **Jhared Hall**, a high-scoring guard from New Rochelle, N.Y.

HEAD COACH JIMMY PATSOS

Fifth Season • Catholic University '89

Greyhounds head coach Jimmy Patsos enters his fifth season at the helm armed with a contract extension to go along with a roster mixed with returnees who have been part of 37 wins and a pair of MAAC Championship Semifinal appearances the last two campaigns and a list of seven players who did not take the floor for Loyola last season.

How Patsos and his staff can mesh those two elements will go a long way toward the successes of the 2008-09 edition. If past results are any indication, Loyola should again be one of the teams to watch in the MAAC despite the losses to graduation and influx of new faces.

Patsos has led the Greyhounds to three straight winning seasons, the longest such stretch since Loyola enjoyed four straight winning campaigns two decades ago. The 19 wins last season eclipsed the mark set the previous year for Division I wins and the back-to-back MAAC Semifinal appearances are the only time that has happened in the history of the program.

The accolades have continued for the man who has made the most of the opportunity provided to him when he was named Loyola's 20th men's basketball coach on April 1, 2004.

Taking over a team that had recorded just one win the season prior, Patsos and his staff injected immediate energy into the program and generated legions of followers through its fast-paced, pressing style of play. That first season featured the college's first three-game winning streak in five years and the snapping of a 39-game road losing streak. Patsos registered his first career coaching win over eventual MAAC regular-season and championship titlist Niagara when the Purple Eagles left Reitz Arena saddled with a 97-89 defeat.

There was plenty more to come in Season Two. A five-game winning streak to start the season ballooned into a 10-3 start with the only blemishes being losses to MAAC regular-season champion Manhattan, Virginia of the Atlantic Coast Conference and Providence of the BIG EAST. Regrouping at the end of the season, Patsos rallied the team to finish with four wins in the final five regular-season games to secure a winning record and the No. 6 seed at the MAAC Championships, where the season ended with a tough two-point loss in the opening round.

Patsos' third season saw the successes come more frequently and the wins began to pile up. After concluding December with a three-game losing streak, the Greyhounds ran off six straight MAAC wins in January for a school-record seven straight conference victories. By mid-February, Loyola had secured a bye in the MAAC Championship for the first time since 1998 and finished tied for third in the conference standings and as the No. 3 seed in the Championship. The quarterfinal win over Fairfield gave the Greyhounds wins over all nine MAAC opponents for the first time in school history and that spot in the Championship Semifinals.

The Greyhounds backed up that success a season ago by collecting 11 home wins — the most victories in Reitz Arena since the first team to play there won 12 games in 1984-85. Another MAAC Quarterfinal win over Fairfield vaulted Loyola back into the Semifinals where they lost to the eventual champion for the season straight season.

The turnaround is not surprising after looking at Patsos' pedigree. He was been surrounded by winners and learned from some of the best basketball minds in the nation during his rise to the helm of the Greyhounds.

Patsos came to the Loyola campus straight from the University of Maryland where as an assistant on the staff of Gary Williams for 13 seasons he helped guide the Terrapins to 11 consecutive NCAA Tournaments, including seven Sweet Sixteen appearances, consecutive trips to the Final Four (2001 and 2002) and the 2002

NCAA National Championship. In those 13 seasons, Maryland finished in the top half of the rugged ACC 10 times, won two ACC regular-season championships (1995 and 2002), captured the 2004 ACC Tournament title and posted a school-record eight straight 20-win seasons. Additionally during his tenure with the Terrapins, 13 players who Patsos coached were drafted into the NBA, including six first-round selections with four of those being tabbed as lottery picks — Walt Williams (1992), Joe Smith (1995), Steve Francis (1999) and Chris Wilcox (2002). Former Terrapins Keith Booth (1997) and Juan Dixon (2002) round out the sextet and Patsos currently teams with Dixon to hold an annual basketball summer camp held on the Loyola campus.

While at College Park, Patsos was recognized by ESPN's Andy Katz as a "Coach on the Rise" after helping Maryland to their seventh Sweet Sixteen appearance, a fifth Top-10 ranking in the final coaches poll and a victory over No. 1 Duke in the inaugural season at the Comcast Center in 2003.

Patsos joined the Terrapins as a volunteer assistant prior to the 1991-92 season and immediately became an integral part of Williams' staff. His numerous responsibilities included on-court coaching and the academic development of Maryland's players. His role as an academic mentor during his first 10 seasons on Williams' staff proved productive, as the teams' overall academic performance improved under his guidance. As a recruiter, he helped Maryland land a 2002-03 incoming class ranked as high as fourth in the nation and a group of Terrapins newcomers for the 2003-04 season rated as high as second in the country by several national publications.

Prior to his appointment at Maryland, Patsos was the assistant coach at Archbishop Carroll HS in Washington, D.C. He helped Carroll to a 21-8 record and a national ranking of No. 6 during his first season before the team lost to famed DeMatha Catholic HS in the city playoffs. Patsos was involved in the maturation of Charles Harrison (Wake Forest) and Lawrence Moten (Syracuse), both of whom became stars on the collegiate level.

A three-year varsity letter winner at The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., Patsos played for the late Jack Bruen, who later led Colgate University to a pair of NCAA Division I Tournament appearances in the 1990s. The Cardinals posted a record of 51-26 during his career as a player and captured four in-season tournament championships, highlighted by a 106-99 victory over Manhattanville in the championship game of the Manhattanville Tournament as Patsos led the Cardinals with career highs for points (17) and rebounds (14). Other top games during his senior campaign included 12 points and five rebounds against Frostburg State, 10 rebounds at Scranton, and 12 points and nine rebounds against St. Mary's (Md.).

As a junior, Patsos recorded season highs of 14 points against Upsala and 11 rebounds against Washington College. He scored 12 points and grabbed five rebounds to lead Catholic to the championship of the Alfred University Charity Cage Classic with a 90-88 victory over the host Saxons. The Cardinals were 18-8 during both his junior and senior years, then school records for victories in a single season.

A native of Boston, Mass., Patsos grew up attending games at the Boston Garden. He earned his Bachelor's Degree in History from Catholic in 1989. His brother Chris captained the Florida Southern baseball team to the 1981 NCAA Division II World Series championship.
