## 2003 Year In Review

2004



A testament to the soccer tradition Loyola has built over the years, the 2003 Greyhounds were preseason favorites to win the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference.

The 'Hounds graduated a very strong senior class in 2002 and replaced familiar faces with a new corps of freshmen that had much to prove. Still, Loyola was picked to win the conference with what Head Coach Mark Mettrick had hoped to be a competitive, albeit young, 2003 squad.

To Mettrick's delight, the Greyhounds played like veterans and quickly erased everyone's doubts, winning the regular season MAAC title for an impressive fifth straight year. With freshman Omar Alfonso leading the nation's rookie class in scoring, senior Steve Coleman captained his squad to an 11-7-3 overall record. The Greyhounds had many highs and lows and experience growing pains throughout the season. Still, nobody at Evergreen could deem 2003 anything but successful.

Playing non-conference home games at Germantown, the 'Hounds opened the year hosting No. 22 Syracuse. A scoreless 90 minutes set up a dramatic finish and gigantic win for the young 'Hounds. With less than two minutes left on the overtime clock, freshman Danny Wheelen sent a corner kick to junior Kevin Nash, who scored the winner, helping Loyola score the upset.

Nash and the 'Hounds would test their magic at the Battle of Baltimore with a first-round game against Navy.

Alfonso showed a glimpse of his offensive prowess with an early goal to give Loyola a 1-0 lead. Victory, however,

would not come quite so easy and for the second straight game, overtime was necessary.

Once again, it was Nash working the extra period, scoring at 92:56 to end the game at 2-1 and improve Loyola's mark to 2-0. A loss to UMBC in the Battle of Baltimore Championship Game and a road defeat at No. 1 Maryland left

the 'Hounds at .500 entering their second home game of the year.

The Big Red of Cornell came to Germantown and the Greyhounds needed a win. Nash scored early and Alfonso followed with a goal of his own to give Loyola a 2-0 halftime advantage. Cornell, however, stormed back with two goals in the second stanza and the 'Hounds went to Alfonso for the game-winner. Scoring his second goal of the day and third of the season, the 5-9 freshman out of Staten Island improved Loyola to 3-2 on the year.

A tournament at Princeton would continue Loyola's Ivy League swing with games against the host Tigers and the Quakers of Penn. The Greyhounds extended their stay with a pair of overtime contests, the first coming against Princeton. Jay Joyce scored for the 'Hounds and Darren Spicer for the Tigers while the defense did the rest. Dan

Mulcahy made four saves for Loyola and after 110 minutes a 1-1 draw was called.

Two days later, the 'Hounds faced Penn on Princeton's turf. Although the game ended in a 2-2 tie, Wheelen's bicycle kick to the tie the contest in the 77th minute, may have been the play of the year. The Greyhounds were at 3-2-2, but more importantly, they were beginning to gel and feel more confident.

With only two non-conference games left on the schedule and those slated for late October, Loyola's game against Rider marked the start of MAAC play. The 'Hounds had dominated the conference of late, earning the league's automatic NCAA bid each of the prior two seasons. The Broncs would play visitor on this particular bright and sunny September day.

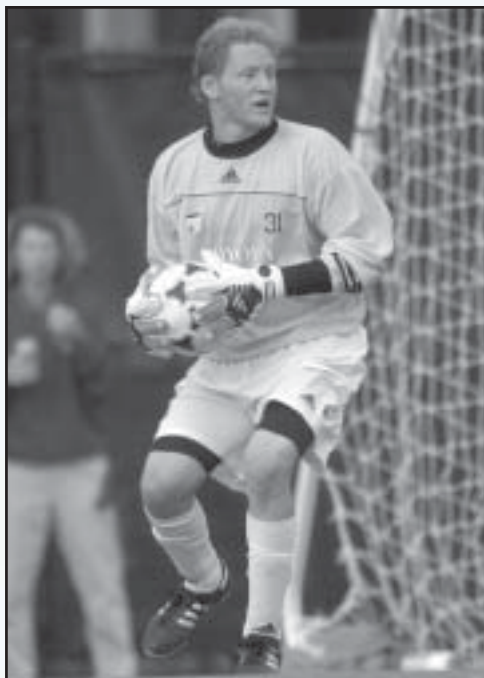


Alfonso scored three times and the 'Hounds cruised to a 5-1 win. A surprise setback at Siena was followed by three straight wins and shutouts against Marist, Fairfield and Iona. Freshman Justin Chelland, who had earned some time in the goalkeeper rotation, had two shutouts while junior Greg Peters had one.

A tie at Manhattan left the 'Hounds at 7-3-3. A tough 1-0 loss at St. Peter's and non-conference losses to American and George Mason had Loyola feeling pressures of a late-season lull. Canisius and Niagara would wrap up the regular season for Loyola, who would be playing on Curley Field for the final time.

The Golden Griffins came first and the Greyhounds were ready. Alfonso scored on a free kick from outside the 18 and Loyola led 1-0. Alfonso doubled the lead with his 13th goal of the season and the score was 2-0 at the half. Chelland made sure that would be all Loyola would need with his third shutout of the year.

The Greyhound defense, behind freshmen Gabe Ortega, Rade Kokovic, junior Chase Franklin and senior John Alecci, would give Chelland another shutout in the season finale against Niagara. Alfonso scored twice more, John Dalziel found the cage for the third time all season and Nash capped a 4-0 win and a fifth straight MAAC regular season title.

It was off to Orlando for the 2003 MAAC Championships. The top-seeded Greyhounds would have to win three games to get the league's automatic bid with all 10 conference schools invited to the MAAC Tournament. First up was Iona and Chelland was ready. The Loyola goalkeeper made 10 saves as Joyce and Nate Lyden scored to give the 'Hounds a 2-1 win over the Gaels.

The semifinal match pitted Loyola against a Marist team it defeated 2-0 in the regular season. Nash and Lyden quickly gave the 'Hounds a 2-0 lead, but before Loyola could think about the championship match, Marist scored two unanswered and tied the score with 20 minutes left in regulation. Alfonso, just as he had all season, answered the call with a

fast-break goal at 75:10. He then put the game away, beating three Red Fox defenders in the 89th minute, sealing a 4-2 win and another trip to the conference championship game.

would be enough to send St. Peter's to the dance. It was Coleman, however, who would clean up a flurry in front of the cage and tie the score with two minutes to play. Just as quick as the 'Hounds

breathed new life, St. Peter's took it away, scoring 45 seconds later and ended Loyola's 2003 campaign at Disney's Wide World of Sports Complex.

Loyola would not hang its head. The Greyhounds exceeded preseason expectations and showed everyone that Loyola soccer does not re-build - it re-loads.

Head Coach Mark Mettrick could take solace in that the fact that his squad dominated the All-Rookie team and that Omar Alfonso, both the MAAC Rookie of the Year and Offensive Player of the Year, would be around for a few more years. Freshmen Michael Kolosvary, Gabe Ortega and Danny Wheelan all found themselves on the All-Rookie squad with senior Steven Coleman earning first-team All-MAAC honors. Ortega was a second-team All-MAAC pick and the Greyhounds, although disappointed, have found a winning nucleus to raise expectations to the next level.

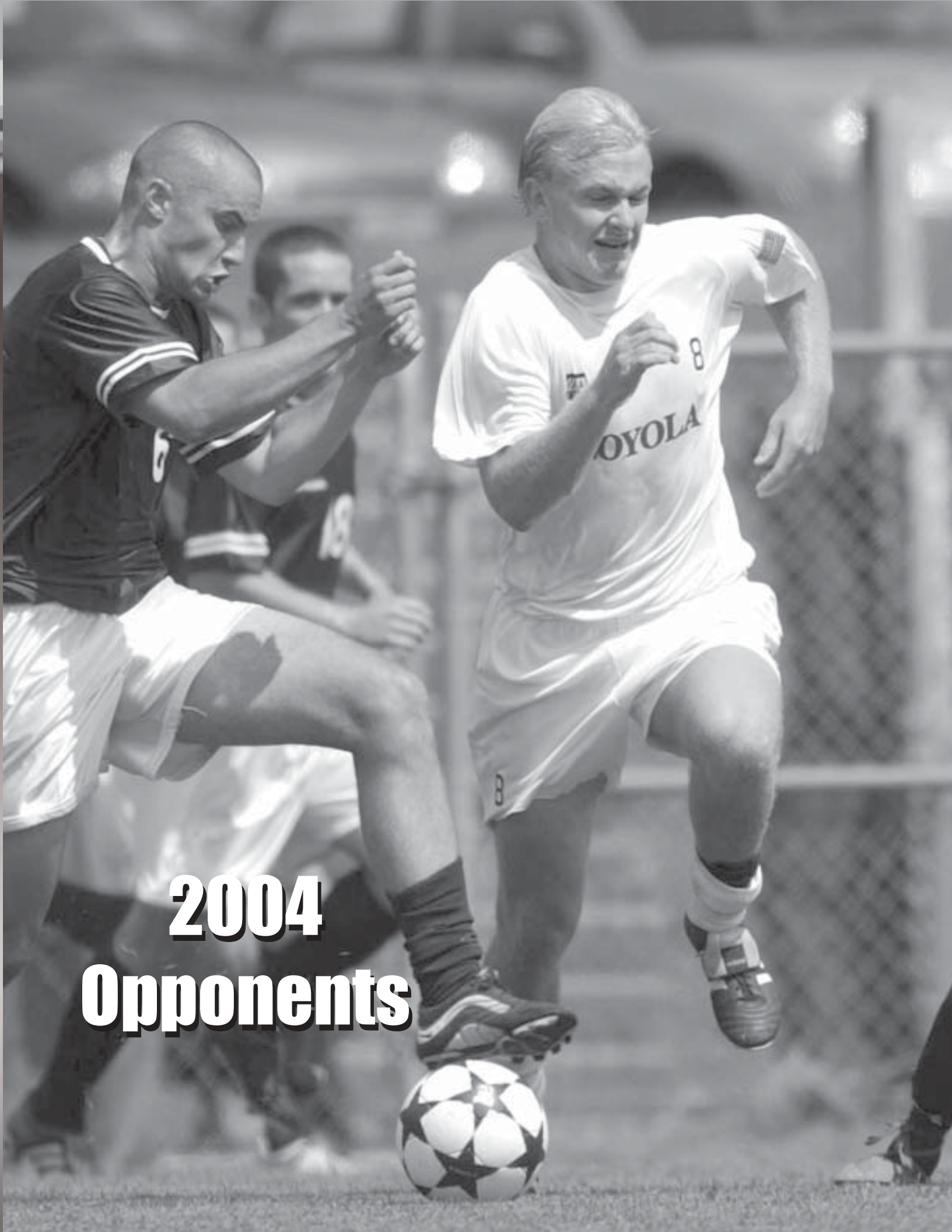
