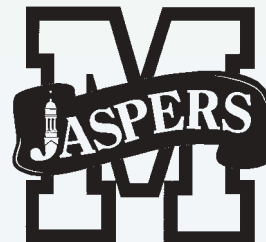

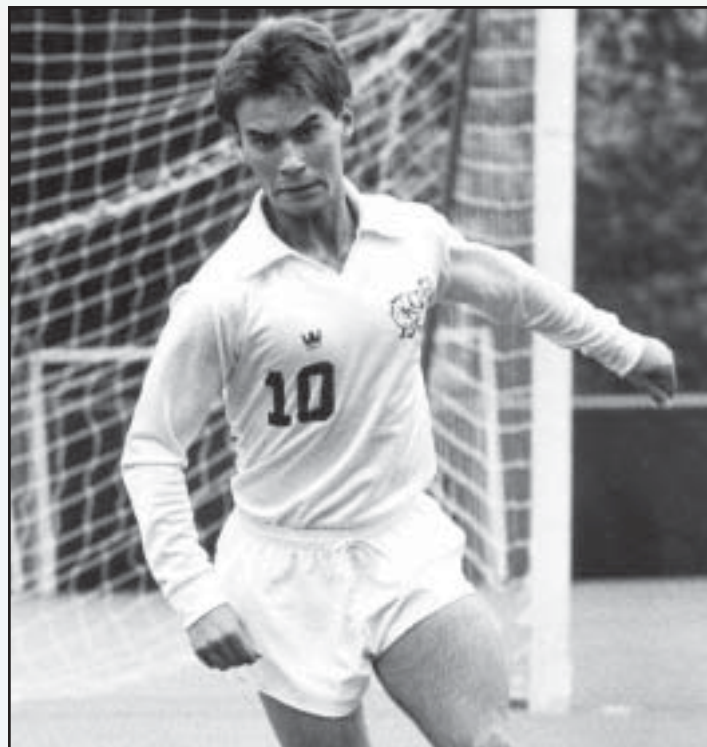

Loyola Soccer All-Americans

Loyola has been well represented through the years on the NCAA All-America teams. During the past 25 years, 10 Greyhounds have earned national recognition.

Ernie Cox was the Greyhounds' first All-America, earning second-team honors in 1973, while moving up to the first team a season later. John Houska was Loyola's second two-time All-America selection, receiving honors in 1975 and 1976.

Pete Notaro, another two-time All-America at Evergreen, was an honoree in both 1977 (Honorable Mention) and 1978 (First Team) while Stan Koziol earned second-team All-America status during both the 1986 and 1987 seasons.

In 1994, Zach Thornton became just the fifth player in school history to be named an All-America twice in his career. Thornton, a first-team choice in 1993, was named to the third team in 1994.

Greyhounds In The Pros

Since 1973, the Loyola College soccer program has sent 35 players into the professional ranks. Dennis Wit was the first Greyhound to turn pro, playing for two teams in the old North American Soccer League.
