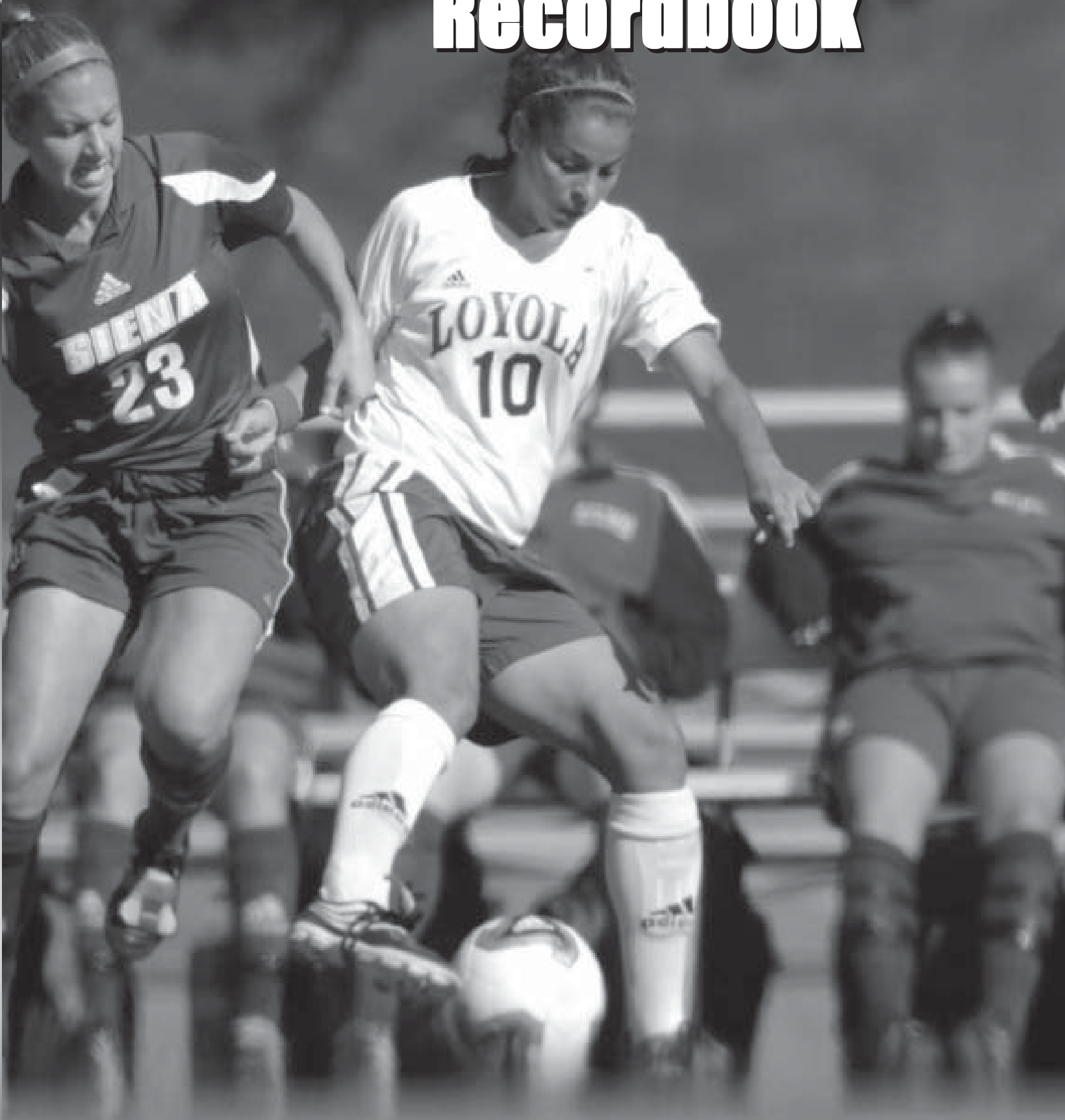

The more time Joe Mallia spends as the Loyola College head women's soccer coach, the more difficult the schedule gets. But in a testament to his coaching ability and recruiting, Mallia's players, veterans and rookies always seem to rise to the challenge. In 2003, despite losing three of their top players in Audra Garuccio, Annie DiPalo and Becky Bienaman, the 'Hounds came together, filling in those gaps and forging ahead and ultimately winning their fourth Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference title and third trip to the NCAA College Cup.

Things started with a tournament in Florida. The Greyhounds faced the host first and things clicked defensively, unfortunately though, they clicked for both teams with a 1-1 tie forcing overtime play. Florida Atlantic was able to score first in overtime to get the win. In the consolation round, Loyola faced Miami. Against the Hurricanes, the Greyhounds had several opportunities to put the ball away with nine shots, including six on goal. Miami keeper Alex Alford came up big, however knocking all six away. Miami got two tallies on the board for the 2-1 defeat and the Greyhounds left Florida 0-2.

Mallia kept his team on the road, next visiting Baton Rouge for a tournament at Louisiana State. The Greyhounds got their first taste of victory against McNeese State in the first round, trouncing the Cowboys, 5-0. The offense finally gelled and capitalized on their chances with goals from senior Katie Elliott and two each from Carolyn Kennington and junior Ellen Sroka while the defense continued to play strong in the shutout with Erica Niemann in the cage. It was on to the championship game to face the Tigers of LSU. Once again the defense came together, holding both teams without a goal for 85 minutes of play but it was in that last five minutes that the Tigers were able to sneak past Niemann for a 2-0 win. Now at 1-3, the 'Hounds were being tested. The squad had so much promise and according to Mallia, had played "some of the best soccer Loyola has ever played" but continued to fall short.

Despite their record Kennington, gained early recognition from the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) by being named the Rookie of the Week and Sroka gained an early conference nod by being named the MAAC Offensive Player of the Week after adding two goals in the 5-0 win over McNeese State.

Finally, Mallia brought his troops home. Well nearly. The Greyhounds faced American in Washington D.C. The road had taken its toll and that much was clear. The lone Loyola score actually came from American's keeper as she missed a pass back from one of her defenders early in the contest for a 1-0 Greyhound lead. But the Eagles came together on offense in the second half, scoring three consecutive goals for the 3-1 win, but it wasn't for a lack of effort on the Greyhounds part. American only held a one-shot advantage in the game, 17-16. Loyola's Kate Gilfillan made her first collegiate start in goal, making five saves while American's Lauren Wohl stopped 10 shots.

Mallia and the 'Hounds began to prepare for their third tournament, the University of Maryland's addidas Classic with Hurricane Isabelle lurking on the horizon. Isabelle forced Maryland to start the Classic a day early, in hopes of avoiding the storm. The Terrapins' scored just two minutes into the contest. The defense held Maryland for the remaining 88 minutes but once again, on offense the Greyhounds seemed to have all the chances they needed, but failed to capitalize. Post-Isabelle, Loyola faced William & Mary in the consolation round. Loyola dominated much of the first half of play, controlling the tempo and pace of the game. The Greyhounds created numerous chances for goals, outshooting the Tribe 12-3 and scoring the first goal when freshman Courtney Arikian crossed the ball from the right side of the net to Elliott who then tapped it along to junior Jeannetta McGettigan for the goal at 7:40. Niemann and the 'Hounds held that lead for more than 60 minutes before Taline Tahmassian tallied the game tying goal. That momentum proved to be enough for William & Mary as they went on to score the game winner. Loyola now stood at 1-6 but Mallia and his team continued to drive forward.

Next up was Rutgers and things finally came together. The 'Hounds visited East Rutherford, N.J. to face the Mid-Atlantic Region's fifth ranked Scarlet Knights. Loyola jumped out to an early lead, as Kennington broke away behind the Rutgers defense, sending a shot across the box that ricocheted off the far post and into the goal. The defense once again proved their worth while Gilfillan earned her first career-shutout, denying eight Scarlet Knight shots. Kennington earned the conference Rookie of the Week award for her second time while Gilfillan was made the MAAC Defensive Player and ECAC Goalkeeper of the Week.

Loyola turned now to their MAAC schedule and it was just in time. The squad that had been clicking together all that time, finally had proof of all their hard work. The 'Hounds still had non-conference meetings with Penn and Villanova later in October but their main focus lie directly ahead. Loyola started with Siena, stifling the Saints. The Greyhounds possessed the ball for nearly the entire game while freshman Kaitlin Klar earned the early tally with assists from Arikian and Kennington. In the second half, the youngsters shined again with Kennington scoring an insurance goal on an easy shot into the left corner of the net on a pass for Arikian. Gilfillan nabbed another shutout in goal.

The Greyhounds hit the slightest road bump in their travels towards success against Mairst. After 110 minutes of play, the game ended in a 0-0 tie. The Greyhounds created several quality chances at goals in all four periods of play and at the end of regulation, Ashley Kramer just missed. The 'Hounds continued to outshoot their opponents, 34-3 while Meredith Fabian was what decided the game, stopping all 11 shots on goal. The Red Foxes' took just three shots, two saved by Niemann and one went wide of the goal.

Mallia hoped his team would get right back on track in their next conference contest and they did. Initially, Fairfield nabbed the lead with a goal 16 minutes into the game but Elliott was determined not to let the Stags keep the lead. Elliott scored back-to-back goals, first beating Stag keeper Katie Ely down low from 25-yards out in the 63rd minute and then scoring off the rebound of Kennington's shot in the 68th. Loyola continued to dominate in their offensive efforts, this time outshooting the Stags 18-7 for the 2-1 win.

Another 2-1 win over Iona kept the momentum rolling. McGettigan tallied her second goal of the year when she headed in a crossing pass from Ashley Kramer at 24:31 and the 'Hounds took a two-goal lead less than two minutes later when Kennington scored on a one-on-one situation with Iona goalkeeper, Ticiana DiCarlo, giving the Greyhounds all the offense they would need.

With their conference record continually improving, 3-0-1, Mallia and his squad took a detour from their MAAC competition to face Penn. The Greyhounds were able to keep Penn in their reins early, answering a 2-0

Quaker lead by capitalizing on both of their attempts in the first half. The Greyhounds' first goal came when Daniels fired a shot into the crossbar that dropped into the goal at the 25:05 mark. Loyola would score the equalizer less than ten minutes later, when Kramer sent a penalty kick past the goalkeeper. But Penn's Katey Cross added her second goal of the game and earned the game winner with a goal in the 60th minute in the 3-2 loss for Loyola.

Next, the 'Hounds got back to their MAAC foes and took on Manhattan. In another outstanding defensive effort by Mallia and his troops, Loyola did not allow a single shot in the first period of play. Loyola took just five shots in that first stanza but the game remained scoreless until the second. Kennington scored her seventh goal of the season with one late in the second half off a quick pass from classmate Arikian, dead-center in front of goal for the 1-0 win. Gilfillan, meanwhile, was credited with her third shutout of the season.

Peter's the offense put forward its best scoring effort all season, winning 4-0 with goals from four different players. The 'Hounds split things up, scoring back-to-back goals in the first as well as two goals in the second half. Daniels made the initial score for Loyola when she rebounded a shot off the post at 26:07. Just minutes later, with the clock at 33:21, McGettigan scored her third goal of the season on a direct pass from Kramer for a 2-0 Loyola lead. Kennington and Leigh Ann Mastrini scored in the second half. The Loyola defense continued to hold strong, holding Saint Peter's without a single shot attempt while Niemann earned the shutout.

The 'Hounds hosted Rider before finishing up their non-conference schedule at Villanova. Against the Broncs, Loyola once again outshot their opponent and sealed the victory with a goal from leading scorer Kennington. While visiting the Wildcats, the Greyhounds once again had opportunities early but couldn't capitalize on their chances for the win. Although Villanova only outshot the Greyhounds 17-13, the Wildcats came out victorious with a 3-0 win.

The 'Hounds returned to their MAAC route to wrap up the regular season up in Buffalo, N.Y. with Canisius on tap first. All the squad needed for the win was a goal from Kennington, her tenth of the season, from a direct kick.

The defense held the Golden Griffis at bay and Niemann got credit for the shutout. Two days later Loyola had a bit of a tougher battle with Niagara. In an effort to hold onto the regular season title and the No. 1 seed in the MAAC Tournament, the Greyhounds burst onto the field with energy after a scoreless first half. Loyola defender Lindsay Tracey scored her first goal of the season at 56:28 after a scramble in front of the goal left her open. Just two and a half minutes later, Elliott gave the Greyhounds insurance. The MAAC's leading scorer, Niagara's Rosie Luzak scored for Niagara in the final few minutes of play but wasn't enough to undo the damage that had already been done. Gilfillan tied a career-best eight saves in the 2-1 win.

The Greyhounds entered post-season play for the 12th consecutive time with an undefeated MAAC record at 8-0-1 and an overall mark of 11-9-1.

Leading scorer Kennington and her teammates faced host Rider in the first round. The Greyhounds had topped the Broncs 1-0 just two weeks before but this round would not be easy. Rider

got on the board quickly with a breakaway goal by Sarah Arytale at 9:15. But Kennington evened up the score at 13:36 when McGettigan's initial shot was saved by Rider keeper Erin Wolleon, who lost control of the ball, giving Kennington an open net. Kennington created the final goal of the first half when she directed a corner kick into Arikian's direction at 39:13. Arikian headed the ball into the goal amidst a group of Loyola and Rider players. In the second half, Loyola earned the eventual game-winner when Kennington crossed the ball directly to McGettigan's feet at 50:25 for a 3-1 score. Arikian would score for a 4-1 score. Rider's Tami Coyle attempted to rally her troops with a goal at 69:06 off a cross from Artale and Jennifer Marcella but it would not be enough to overcome their deficit and the Greyhounds advanced to the conference championship for the fifth season in a row.

The Greyhounds now had to face the team they had just topped 2-1 a week before for the regular season title, Niagara. Freshman Caitlin McCusker decided that game early with her goal at 19:36. Daniels later added the

insurance. Niagara's keeper Katy Owings made 11 saves while Gilfillan and the Loyola defensive unit stifled Niagara's offensive attack, allowing just one shot to their own 26. Kennington was named the 2003 MAAC Women's Soccer Championship Most Valuable Player after finishing the tournament with three assists and one goal. Joining Kennington on the All-Tournament Team were Loyola teammates Elliott, Daniels, McGettigan, Kramer and Tracey. In addition to the all-tournament team, Kennington gave Loyola its second MAAC Rookie of the Year in as many seasons and junior Lindsay Tracey was named the Co-Defensive Player of the Year.

With their fourth consecutive MAAC tournament trophy in hand, the 'Hounds quickly learned their fate. A repeat trip to Morgantown, WV to face sixth seeded West Virginia for the second year in a row. WVU's Leslie Barden scored the first goal of the game at 38:11 with a header off a pass from Rachael Minnich. The Greyhounds allowed that lead to last for only two minutes before Klar scored the equalizer for a 1-1 tie at the half. The Greyhounds outshot the Mountaineers 9-7 in that half but WVU took control of the second. Lisa Zanti gave WVU a 2-1 lead at 51:31 with an unassisted goal from 18 yards out and Chrissie Abbott scored what became the game winner about seven minutes later. Nicola Cauzillo added an insurance goal for the 4-2 final. Gilfillan made seven saves in goal for Loyola while Bannerman made two for the Mountaineers.

The Greyhounds travels ended at 12-9-1 but Mallia and the 'Hounds continue to build on their successes season after season. In just 11 years, the Evergreen has seen five regular season conference titles, six tournament titles, four trips to the NCAA College Cup, including a play-in game in 2000 and countless individual awards. The Loyola women's soccer program has proven itself to be one of the top teams in the MAAC and a team to content with on the national level.
