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UofL Men Finish Seventh at NCAAs; Three All-America Honorees

The University of Louisville men's track and field team earned the program's best ever finish at the NCAA Championships with a seventh-place overall. The Cards' tied with reigning indoor champion Wisconsin with 22 points, the most points ever for U of L at an NCAA meet. Leading the way for the Cards were sophomore jumpers Tone Belt (long jump) and Andre Black (triple jump) with runner-up finishes, while senior Wesley Korir closed his track career with a third-place finish in the 5,000m, giving the Cards' three All-America performances in 2007.

UofL Men Ranked No. 6, No. 14 in Final National Polls

The U of L men's track and field team moved up one position to No. 6 in this week's Trackwire Outdoor Top 25 and remained at No. 14 in the USTFCCA Top 20. The No. 4 ranking in the Trackwire 25 on May 8 was the highest national ranking in school history, three positions better than the previous best No. 7 ranking on April 24. The Cards' highest outdoor national ranking prior to this season was No. 23 on May 9, 2006, while U of L's highest national ranking of any kind prior to May 8 was No. 5 in the Trackwire Indoor Top 25 on Feb. 21, 2007.

Cardinal Men Win BIG EAST Title; Women Finish Second

On May 6, the Louisville track and field teams closed the best conference weekend in school history as the Cardinal men won the BIG EAST Championship, the program's first ever conference title, while the women finished second overall for their best finish ever at a conference meet.

Overall, the Cardinals won a total of 11 event titles, including seven for the men and four for the women, and 21 total medals (13 men, eight women). Leading the way for the Cards was senior thrower Arthur Turland, who was named Most Outstanding Men's Field Performer of the Meet after winning the discus and javelin titles, finishing second in the hammer and scoring 31 total points.

Cards' Andre Black Atop Triple Jump, Long Jump Dandy Dozen

Reigning 2007 NCAA indoor triple jump champion Andre Black sits atop the Trackwire Dandy Dozen rankings in both the triple jump and long jump for the third straight week. Black, a sophomore, moved to the top of the Dozen in both events after winning the long jump and triple jump titles at the BIG EAST meet on May 5-6 in Storrs, Conn. On March 10, Black won the NCAA indoor triple jump title with a school record mark of 53-05.50.

Sophomore Tone Belt, the 2007 NCAA indoor long jump champion and 2007 NCAA Mideast Regional long jump champion, is currently ranked No. 3 in the Dandy Dozen in the long jump and No. 8 in the high jump. On March 9, Belt won U of L's first ever individual NCAA track championship with a school record leap of 26-01.75 in the long jump.

UofL Men Win Three Regional Titles, Finish Third Overall

Led by its first regional event titles, the U of L men finished third overall at the NCAA Mideast Regional for its best ever finish at the meet. Arthur Turland won the discus, Tone Belt won the long jump and Andre Black won the triple jump as the No. 7 Cards scored 50 total points over the two days to trail only No. 2 LSU with 70 and No. 3 Auburn with 55.

Overall, the Cardinal men and women earned five automatic bids to the NCAA Championships at the regional event.

2007 Outdoor Meet Recaps

Baldy Castillo Invitational **Tempe, Ariz.** **March 16-17, 2007**

TEMPE, Ariz. – The University of Louisville track and field program carried the momentum from the indoor season into the outdoor season as the Cards earned nine Mideast Regional qualifying marks, won seven event titles and set four school records at the season-opening Baldy Castillo Invitational on Friday and Saturday at Arizona State University.

Leading the way for the Cards were throwers ZeNai Savage and Arthur Turland, who earned NCAA Mideast Regional qualifying marks in two events each during the two-day meet. Savage, a junior from Indianapolis, Ind., earned regional qualifying marks in the women's shot put and hammer throw with personal best marks in each. In the shot put, she had a mark of 47 feet, 1 inch to finish third overall, while in the hammer she had a top mark of 185-08 to finish third in that event as well.

On the men's side, Turland, a senior from Kincardine, Ont., earned regional qualifying marks in the hammer throw and discus. The 2007 indoor weight throw All-American won the hammer with a mark of 198-07, and finished fourth overall in the discus with a throw of 172-06.

Also adding regional qualifying performances for the Cardinal women was senior Emily Turland and junior Holly Geibel. Turland, a native of New Albany, Ind., won the hammer throw with a school record mark of 198 feet, breaking her own previous school record of 194-03 set at last year's Penn Relays. Geibel, a native of Butler, Pa., finished fourth overall in the javelin with a regional qualifying mark of 143-00.

The Cardinal men had three other qualifiers for the NCAA Mideast Regional, scheduled for May 25-26 in Columbia, Mo. Leading the way was sophomore Steven Hnat, from Floyds Knob, Ind., who earned his first regional qualifying berth with his school record mark of 55-07.50 to finish fourth overall in the shot put. The mark breaks the previous school record of 55-05.50 set by former Cardinal standout James Dennis in 1999.

Also adding regional marks for the Cardinal men was Rudon Bastian, a sophomore from Nassau, Bahamas, with his first-place mark of 24-02.25 in the long jump, and senior Brandon Cook, from Borden, Ind., with his mark of 185-10 in the hammer to finish fifth overall in the event.

Another top performance for the Cardinal men included senior Wesley Korir's win in the 3,000m with a school record time of 8 minutes, 13.01 seconds, breaking the previous school record of 8:17.1 set by Jim Estes in 1989.

On the women's side, senior LaShondra Durias (100m), freshman Tarah McKay (1500m) and sophomore Heather Trimiew (400m hurdles) each won event titles for the Cards, while freshman Elisabeth Slettum set a school record in the 400m with her fourth-place time of 55.0, breaking the previous school record time of 56.13 set by Anita Winters-Dixon in 2005.

Up next, the Cards will have a week off from competition prior to returning to action at the Missouri Relays in Columbia, Mo., March 30-31 and at LSU's Tiger Classic in Baton Rouge, La., on March 31.

Stanford Invitational, LSU Tiger Classic **& Missouri Relays** **March 30-31, 2007**

LOUISVILLE, Ky. – The University of Louisville track and field program concluded a busy weekend of action Saturday with six NCAA Mideast Regional qualifiers, three school records and three event titles at three different meets around the nation, including the Stanford Invitational, the LSU Tiger Classic and the Missouri Relays.

On the men's side, leading the way was distance runners Wesley Korir and Cory Thorne and sophomore jumpers Tone Belt and Andre Black. Korir, a senior from Eldoret, Kenya, earned an NCAA regional qualifying mark and a school record setting time of 13 minutes, 50.64 seconds in the 5,000-meter run to finish eighth overall in the Section 1 Final at the prestigious Stanford Invitational. Korir shattered his own previous school record time of 14:08.01 in the 5,000m set last season.

Joining Korir with an NCAA regional qualifying mark was Thorne, a sophomore from Portsmouth, N.H., with his personal best time of 14:07.88 to finish fifth in the Section 2 Final of the 5,000m at Stanford.

At LSU, Belt and Black each earned event titles and NCAA regional qualifying marks on Saturday. Black, the 2007 NCAA indoor triple jump and a native of Mobile, Ala., won Saturday's triple jump title with a top jump of 51 feet, 4.5 inches. Belt, the 2007 NCAA indoor long jump champion and a native of Berkeley Springs, W.Va., cleared a height of 7 feet, 0.25 inches to win the high jump title in Baton Rouge, La.

Leading the way for the Cardinal women on Saturday was sophomore jumper Seidre Forde and freshman sprinter Elisabeth Slettum. Forde, from Green's St. George, Barbados, earned an NCAA regional qualifying mark with a school record mark of 40-08.75 in the triple jump to finish second overall. The jump shattered the previous school record of 39-04.5 set by Delicia Haynes in 2000. Slettum, from Stavanger, Norway, set a new school record in the 200m with her NCAA regional qualifying time of 23.78 seconds to finish eighth overall in the event. Her time broke the previous school record of 24.36 set by Jen Carlsen in 2000.

Adding an event title for the Cardinal women was freshman Rachel Gehret with her victory in the high jump with a cleared height of 5-03.25, while the Cards also matched the school record in the 4x100m relay with a time of 46.31 to finish fourth overall.

Through two weekends of competition, the Cardinal men and women have a total of 15 qualifiers for the NCAA Mideast Regional, set for May 25-26 in Columbia, Mo., and with five weeks of competition remaining before that meet, U of L is well on its way to shattering last year's school record number of 17 regional qualifiers.

Day One

The U of L track and field team earned four NCAA Mideast Regional qualifying marks and four top five finishes on the first day of competition at the Missouri Relays Friday.

On the women's side, senior Emily Turland and junior Holly Geibel led the way with runner-up finishes in a pair of throwing events. Turland finished second overall in the hammer with an NCAA regional qualifying mark of 195 feet, 11 inches, while Geibel was second in the javelin with a personal best and regional qualifying mark of 146-01.

Leading the way for the Cardinal men's team was senior Arthur Turland with fourth-place finishes in the hammer and the javelin. In the hammer, Turland earned a regional qualifying mark of 197-06 to finish fourth in the field of 44 throwers, while his mark of 186-06 was fourth in the javelin in a field of 32.

Joining Turland with a regional qualifying mark in the hammer was senior Brandon Cook from Borden, Ind., with his throw of 188-06 to finish eighth overall.

Texas Relays **Austin, Texas** **April 5-7, 2007**

AUSTIN, Texas – In his first long jump competition of the outdoor season, University of Louisville sophomore Tone Belt earned the top outdoor collegiate mark in the nation in 2007 to win the Texas Relays on Friday at Mike A. Myers Stadium on the campus of the University of Texas.

Belt, a native of Berkeley Springs, W.Va., and the reigning 2007 NCAA indoor long jump champion, won Friday's event with an NCAA Mideast Regional qualifying mark of 25 feet, 9.25 inches. Belt also remained unbeaten against collegiate competition in the long jump in 2007 after winning all six of his indoor events this season. His only defeat in the long jump in 2007 was his fifth-place finish at the USA Indoor Championships, which included a field of some of the nation's top professional jumpers.

Joining Belt with a strong performance in the long jump on Friday was teammate Andre Black, native of Mobile, Ala., and the 2007 NCAA indoor triple jump champion, who finished third overall with a personal best and NCAA regional qualifying mark of 25-02.00. Both Black and Belt will return to action Saturday at the Texas Relays in the triple jump and high jump events respectively.

With two more regional marks on Friday, the Cardinal men and women now have school record total of 18 qualifiers for next month's NCAA Mideast Regional in Columbia, Mo., breaking the previous record total of 17 set last season. Overall, the Cardinal men have 11 regional qualifiers, while the U of L women have seven.

Leading the way for the Cardinal women on Friday was sophomore jumper Seidre Forde and freshman hurdler Theresa Lewis. Forde, a native of Green's St. George, Barbados, earned a school record and NCAA Mideast Regional qualifying mark of 41-10.50 to finish second overall in the Section B Final of the triple jump. She broke her own previous school record of 40-08.75 set last weekend at the LSU Tiger Classic in Baton Rouge, La.

Lewis, a native of Randallstown, Md., set a new school record in the 100-meter hurdles with a time of 13.94 seconds to finish 16th overall in a field of 74 athletes from around the nation. She broke the previous school record time of 13.99 held by Heather Trimiew and Aajah Showell.

Day One

University of Louisville sophomore Heather Trimiew earned an NCAA Mideast Regional qualifying time in the 400-meter hurdles Thursday at the prestigious Texas Relays at Mike A. Myers Stadium on the campus of the University of Texas.

Trimiew, a native of Chattanooga, Tenn., had a time of 1 minute, 0.44 seconds to finish 15th overall in the preliminary round of action in the 400m hurdles and earn her second straight berth to the NCAA Mideast Regional, scheduled for May 25-26 in Columbia, Mo.

Last season, Trimiew qualified for the NCAA Outdoor Championships in the 400-meter hurdles where she advanced to the semifinal races. Trimiew is the reigning BIG EAST champion in the 400m hurdles and she will look to defend that title on May 4-6 at the 2007 BIG EAST Outdoor Championships in Storrs, Conn.

Day Three

Due to inclement weather moving through Austin, Texas, on Saturday, no University of Louisville athletes competed on the final day of action at the prestigious Texas Relays on the campus of the University of Texas.



2007 Outdoor Meet Recaps

Sea Ray Relays & Mt. SAC Relays April 13-14, 2007

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. – The U of L women's 4x100-meter relay team of Theresa Lewis, Elisabeth Slettum, Heather Trimiew and LaShondra Durias set a new school record during the weather shortened final day of action at the University of Tennessee's Sea Ray Relays.

The quartet of U of L sprinters finished fifth overall in the women's 4x100m relay with a time of 45.96 seconds, breaking the previous school record time of 46.31 first set at the 2002 Conference USA Championships and then matched earlier this season at the LSU Tiger Classic.

Action at the Sea Ray Relays was suspended at 2:22 p.m. ET with the arrival of lightning and inclement weather at Tom Black Track at LaPorte Stadium in Knoxville. At 2:46 p.m. ET, the decision was made to cancel the final three and a half hours of action, the first-time in the 41-year history of the event that the meet was cancelled prior to completion.

Prior to the stoppage, U of L sophomore Tone Belt earned a second-place finish in the high jump with an NCAA regional qualifying height of 7 feet, 0.5 inches.

Late Friday night, the Cards completed a busy day of action in Knoxville and in Walnut, Calif., at the prestigious Mt. SAC Relays Distance Carnival. Friday's events for U of L included three school record performances and a pair of new NCAA Mideast Regional qualifiers taking the Cards' school record total to 20 (13 men, seven women), three more than last year's previous school record of 17.

Leading the way for the Cardinal men, ranked 14th in this week's Trackwire Top 25 and 18th in the latest USTFCCCA Top 20, was sophomore Cory Thorne, senior Wesley Korir and junior Soimo Kiplagat at Mt. SAC. Thorne, from Portsmouth, N.H., set a new school record in the 3,000-meter steeplechase with his regional qualifying time of 8 minutes, 49.41 seconds and finished 10th overall in the invitational race. Thorne's time on Friday night shattered his own previous school record of 9:05.61 set at last year's NCAA Mideast Regional in Knoxville.

In the 5,000-meter Invitational, Korir, from Eldoret, Kenya, set a new school record with his time of 13:50.44 to finish 23rd overall in the race. He broke his own previous school record of 13:50.64 set earlier this season at the Stanford Invitational.

In the 10,000-meter run at Mt. SAC, Kiplagat, from Kapsabet, Kenya, set a new school record with his time of 29:44.38 to finish 18th overall in the race. He broke the previous school record of 29:58.74 set in 1988 by Aaron Smith at the Ohio University Relays.

Joining Thorne as a new NCAA Regional qualifier on Friday was senior Brandon Cook in the discus throw in Knoxville with his mark of 170-02 to finish fifth overall in the invitational event, one spot behind teammate Arthur Turland (177-03).

Multi Events Recap

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. – University of Louisville junior Robbie Moore used a strong second day of competition to set a new school record in the decathlon Thursday at the Sea Ray Relays at Tom Black Track at LaPorte Stadium on the campus of the University of Tennessee.

Moore, a native of Eminence, Ky., scored a school record total 6,436 points in the 10 events to gain two positions after Wednesday's first day of action and finish in fifth-place overall. The performance breaks his own previous school record of 6,368 set at last year's EIU Big Blue Classic in Charleston, Ill.

A big factor in Moore's move up the standings on Thursday was his performances in the discus, 1,500m run and javelin. He finished third in the discus with a personal best throw of 128 feet, 11 inches, was fourth in the 1,500m with a personal best time of 4:46.94 and was fifth in the javelin with a throw of 159-08. He also finished sixth in the pole vault with a cleared height of 13-11.25 and was 10th in the 110m hurdles with a time of 16.82.

On the women's side, junior Christine Krellwitz finished eighth overall in the heptathlon with 4,458 points for the two days. A native of Big Rapids, Mich., Krellwitz closed the event on Thursday with a sixth-place time of 2:30.41 in the 800m, was seventh in the javelin with a throw of 94-01 and was ninth in the long jump with a mark of 16-03.75.

Day One

University of Louisville juniors Christine Krellwitz and Robbie Moore completed the first day of competition in the multi-events at the Sea Ray Relays in seventh place overall Thursday at Tom Black Track at LaPorte Stadium on the campus of the University of Tennessee.

Led by a strong third-place mark of 5 feet, 6 inches in the high jump, Krellwitz, a native of Big Rapids, Mich., scored a total of 2,767 points through the first four events of the heptathlon to stand in seventh place overall. She also finished seventh in the shot put with a mark of 33-06.50, ninth in the 100m hurdles with a time of 16.11 and ninth in the 200m with a time of 27.24. Wisconsin's Melissa Talbot leads the way with 3,515 points overall.

Moore finished day one with a total of 3,249 points and a seventh-place standing in the decathlon after five of 10 events were completed. Moore's top event finish was seventh in two events, including the 100m (11.54) and the 400m (52.34). He also finished eighth in the shot put with a top mark of 37-06.50, ninth in the high jump with a cleared height of 5-09.75 and 10th in the long jump with a mark of 20-02.50.

Cardinal Invitational Louisville, Ky. April 20-21, 2007

LOUISVILLE, Ky. – UThe nationally ranked University of Louisville track and field program won 12 event titles, added three new NCAA Mideast Regional qualifiers and set three school records on the final day of competition at the Cardinal Invitational Saturday at Cardinal Park.

The Cards opened the day in exciting fashion earning its three new regional qualifiers in the first four running events of the day. In the women's 4x100-meter relay, the Cards' team of freshman Theresa Lewis, freshman Elisabeth Slettum, sophomore Heather Trimiew and senior LaShondra Durias won the event title with a school record time of 45.48 seconds breaking the previous school record of 45.96 set by the same group at the Sea Ray Relays last weekend in Knoxville, Tenn., and clinching a spot at the NCAA Mideast Regional on May 25-26 in Columbia, Mo.

U of L's second regional qualifier of the day was freshman Tarah McKay, who finished second in the women's 1,500m run with a personal best time of 4 minutes, 25.0 seconds, the second fastest time in school history in the event behind only Bettina Bard's school record time of 4:23.07 set in 1997. Later in the day, McKay completed a nice double with a win in the 800m with a personal best time of 2:13.18.

The Cards final regional qualifier of the day was senior Wesley Korir with his school record time of 3:45.57 to win the men's 1,500m run and break his own previous school record time of 3:49.52 set at last year's Cardinal Invitational. Korir is also a regional qualifier and the school record holder in the

5,000m at 13:50.44. The three new regional qualifiers on Saturday take the Cards' school record total to 23 for 2007, including 14 for the men and nine for the women.

Also leading the way for the Cardinal men's team, ranked 11th in this week's Trackwire Top 25, was sophomore Andre Black with wins in the long jump and triple jump. Black, the 2007 NCAA indoor triple jump champion, won Saturday's long jump competition with a career best mark of 25 feet, 8.25 inches, the third best mark in the nation entering the weekend. He followed the long jump win with a victory in the triple jump with a jump of 50-06.25.

Black wasn't the only Cardinal jumper with a strong weekend as the Cards' swept the top four positions in the men's long jump with sophomore Tone Belt, the 2007 NCAA indoor long jump champion and the top ranked long jumper in the nation entering the weekend, finishing a close second to Black with a jump of 25-08.00. Belt also won the high jump on Saturday reaching the regional qualifying standard again this season with a cleared height of 6-10.75.

Fellow sophomore Rudon Bastian moved to sixth on the national performance list in the long jump with a personal best mark of 25-04.00 to finish third overall, while yet another sophomore, Darin Bright, was fourth with a personal best jump of 23-11.

Not to be outdone, the men's throwers also had a strong Saturday led by senior Brandon Cook and sophomore Steven Hnat. Cook won the discus and improved his regional ranking with a personal best mark of 181-09 and was followed closely by senior Arthur Turland in second at 179-10. In the men's shot put, Hnat set a new school record and improved his regional qualifying standing with a third-place mark of 56-08.00 breaking his own previous school record of 55-07.50 set earlier this season.

On the women's side, a quintet of Cardinal athletes joined the 4x100m relay team and McKay with event titles on Saturday, including relay members Durias and Slettum. Durias won the 100m dash with a time of 11.86 seconds, the second fastest time in school history, while Slettum won the 200m dash with a time of 23.89 seconds, also the second fastest ever at U of L.

The Cardinal women also added three wins in the field events, led by junior throwers ZeNai Savage and Holly Geibel. Savage won the shot put with a mark of 46-00.75, while Geibel won the javelin with a throw of 138-02. The Cards' final win of the day was turned in by sophomore Seidre Forde, who won the women's triple jump with a mark of 40-09.50.

Day One

University of Louisville junior ZeNai Savage earned a personal best and NCAA Mideast Regional qualifying mark to win the women's hammer throw, while senior Arthur Turland was the top finishing collegiate thrower in the men's hammer on the first day of the 2007 Cardinal Invitational Friday at the U of L Throws Field.

Savage, from Indianapolis, Ind., led the way with a career best throw of 194 feet, 1 inch as the Cards swept the top three positions in the women's hammer. The throw moves Savage from 10th to fifth in the Mideast rankings in the hammer.

Closely behind Savage was senior Emily Turland in second with an NCAA regional qualifying mark of 190-06, while freshman Lindsey Cook was third with a personal best throw of 170-01.

On the men's side, Arthur Turland, from Kincardine, Ont., finished fourth overall and was the top collegiate thrower with a season's best mark of 199-04. Senior Brandon Cook was sixth overall with a mark of 185-11, while sophomore Andrew Hackney was eighth at 178-08.



2007 Outdoor Meet Recaps

Drake Relays & Penn Relays April 26-28, 2007

DES MOINES, Iowa – University of Louisville duo Tone Belt and Andre Black swept the top two positions in Friday's long jump competition finishing first and second respectively to lead the No. 7 ranked Cardinal men's track team at the prestigious Drake Relays at Drake Stadium.

Belt, a sophomore from Berkeley Springs, W.Va., won his second outdoor long jump title of the season with a mark of 25 feet, 3.25 inches. The 2007 NCAA indoor long jump champion and the nation's top rated outdoor jumper entering the weekend, Belt has won 11 of his 16 collegiate long jump competitions, including eight of nine this season.

Finishing a close second to Belt on Friday night was Black, a sophomore from Mobile, Ala., with a jump of 25-00.75. The 2007 NCAA indoor triple jump champion, Black became the first collegiate athlete to defeat Belt in a long jump this season after winning last week's Cardinal Invitational with a mark of 25-08.25, the third best outdoor jump in the nation this season.

Day One at Drake

University of Louisville sophomore Andre Black earned a third-place finish in the triple jump Saturday to lead the No. 7 ranked men's track and field team at the Drake Relays.

Black, a native of Mobile, Ala., and the 2007 NCAA indoor triple jump champion, had a mark of 51 feet, 0.25 inches to finish third in a field of 25 of the nation's top collegiate jumpers. On Friday, Black finished second in the long jump competition to teammate Tone Belt.

Penn Relays

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. - University of Louisville sophomore Heather Trimiew finished 27th in the women's 400-meter hurdles at the prestigious Penn Relays on Thursday morning, while freshman Shaquan Brown finished 21st in the men's 400-meter hurdles at Franklin Field on the campus of the University of Pennsylvania.

Trimiew, a native of Chattanooga, Tenn., finished with a time of 1 minute, 2.31 seconds to earn 27th overall in the event, which included a field of more than 60 entries from around the nation.

Brown, from Paterson, N.J., finished with a time of 54.16 seconds to earn 21st overall in the event, which included a field of 57 athletes from around the nation.

Stan Lyons Invitational Indianapolis, Ind. April 26-28, 2007

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. – U of L won four event titles and added its 24 NCAA Mid-east Regional qualifier at Saturday's Stan Lyons Invitational hosted by Butler University.

Earning wins for the Cards was sprinter Patrick Carter and throwers Arthur Turland, Emily Turland and Holly Geibel. Carter, a junior from St. Petersburg, Fla., won the 100m dash with a personal best time of 10.71 seconds, while Arthur Turland, a senior from Kincardine, Ont., won the discus with a season-best throw of 185 feet, 1 inch.

For the women, Emily Turland, a senior from New Albany, Ind., won the hammer with a throw of 185-08, while Geibel, a junior from Butler, Pa., won the javelin with a throw of 138-09.

The Cards added their 24th regional qualifier as sophomore Andrew Hackney had a personal best throw of 171-05 in the discus to finish fourth overall in the event. The Cardinal men have 15 regional qualifiers, while the women have nine. The 24 total qualifiers for the NCAA Mid-east Regional, set for May 25-26 in Columbia, Mo., shatters the previous school record total of 17 set last year.

BIG EAST Championships Storrs, Conn. May 4-6, 2007

STORRS, Conn. – Led by a school record seven event champions, the No. 15 ranked University of Louisville men's track and field team won its first BIG EAST Conference team title on Sunday afternoon at the George J. Sherman Family Complex on the campus of the University of Connecticut, while the Cardinal women earned the program's highest ever conference finish with second place overall.

Led by senior Arthur Turland, who was named Most Outstanding Men's Field Performer of the Meet with wins in the discus and javelin and scoring 31 points, the Cardinal men finished with 142 points overall, 21.5 points clear of second place Connecticut with 120.5 points. The win clinches the Cardinals' first ever track and field conference title.

On the women's side, the Cards won a school record setting four event titles and scored 106.5 points overall to finish second to Notre Dame with 120.5 points. The second-place finish is two positions better than the program's previous best finish at a conference championship.

Turland opened the day for the Cards by winning the javelin title with a school record and NCAA Mid-east Regional qualifying mark of 202 feet, 1 inch, on his final throw of the event. A five-time BIG EAST champion, Turland came back in the afternoon and earned a second-place finish in the hammer to help clinch the Cards' title. With Turland's performance this weekend, U of L has won the last three BIG EAST Most Outstanding Men's Field Performer of the Meet awards (Tone Belt, 2007 indoor and 2006 outdoor).

Also turning in an impressive weekend for the Cardinal men was sophomore Andre Black, who won Sunday's triple jump title with a season's best jump of 52-06.50. The reigning 2007 NCAA indoor triple jump champion, Black is a perfect 4-0 in BIG EAST triple jump competitions (two indoor and two outdoor) and with Saturday's win in the long jump, he is also a five-time BIG EAST champion.

Leading the way for the Cardinal women on Sunday was a trio of event champions, including Elisabeth Slettum, Seidre Forde and Emily Turland. Slettum, a freshman from Stavanger, Norway, became a two-time BIG EAST champion and swept the indoor and outdoor 200m titles by winning Sunday's race with a school record time of 23.59 seconds. The time breaks her previous school record of 23.65 set during Saturday's preliminary round.

Another school record performance was turned in by Forde with a record leap of 42-07.50 to win the triple jump title and her first career BIG EAST championship. The jump shattered her previous school record of 41-10.50 set at the Texas Relays.

The third and final win on Sunday for the Cardinal women came from Emily Turland in the hammer throw with a mark of 191-04 to clinch her second career BIG EAST title. On Feb. 17, Turland won the indoor weight throw championship in Akron.

Also turning in medal winning performances for the Cards on Sunday was freshman Chris Brautzsch for the men, while junior ZeNai Savage, freshman Theresa Lewis and the Cards' 4x100-meter relay team earned medals for the Louisville women. Brautzsch earned a strong third-place finish in the 110-meter hurdles with a time of 14.33 seconds, just one hundredth of a second out of second place.

Savage earned runner-up honors in the hammer throw with a mark of 190-04 and scored a total of 18 points for the Cards on the weekend. On Saturday, Savage won her first career BIG EAST title with a school record performance in the shot put. Lewis finished third in Sunday's 100-meter hurdles with a time of 13.65 seconds, and that performance followed the third-place performance of the Cards' 4x100m relay team of Lewis, Slettum, sophomore

Heather Trimiew and senior LaShondra Durias, which finished with a time of 45.65 seconds.

Overall, the Cards finished the weekend with 21 medal winning performances (13 men, eight women) and added a pair of new regional qualifiers, taking the school record total to 26 (16 men, 10 women). The 11 conference titles is a new school record breaking the previous outdoor record of six set last year, and eclipsing the overall record of eight set in Feb., at the BIG EAST Indoor Championships. Also, the 96 points on Saturday for the Cardinal men is believed to be the most points ever scored on the first day of a BIG EAST Championship meet.

Day Two at the BIG EAST Championships

Led by five event champions and nine total medalists, the 15th-ranked University of Louisville men's track and field team leads after Saturday's second day of competition at the BIG EAST Outdoor Championships, while the Cardinal women stand in third place overall.

The Cardinal men won five of seven event finals on Saturday to score 96 total points and earn a 66-point lead over second place Notre Dame with 33 points. Syracuse stands in third with 22 points, followed by UConn in fourth with 21 points and USF in fifth with 20 points.

With eight events completed on the women's side, the Cards scored 38.5 points to trail only first place Notre Dame with 40 points and second place Connecticut with 39 points. Rutgers is fourth with 32 points followed by Cincinnati in fifth with 31 points and Georgetown in sixth with 29 points.

Leading the way for the Cardinal men were event champions Arthur Turland in the discus, Andre Black in the long jump, Cory Thorne in the 3,000-meter steeplechase, Tone Belt in the high jump and Wesley Korir in the 10,000-meter run. Turland became a four-time BIG EAST champion and won his first discus title with a throw of 181 feet, 7 inches.

The U of L men's team's second title of the day came from Black with his jump of 25-07.50 to win his first BIG EAST long jump title and his fourth conference title overall. Not to be outdone, Thorne added the Cards' first running title of the day in the 3,000m steeplechase with a time of 8 minutes, 55.25 seconds. Moments later, Belt won his second straight high jump title and this sixth career BIG EAST title clearing a meet record height of 7-03.00.

The Cardinal men returned to the track for their final win of the day in the final event of the day as Korir won his second career BIG EAST title with a school record shattering time of 29:06.83. He finished more than 33 seconds clear of the second place finisher and broke teammate Soimo Kiplagat's previous school record of 29:44.38.

On the women's side, ZeNai Savage won the Cards' only title of the day with a personal best mark of 48-06.75 to win the shot put title, her first career BIG EAST title.

The Cardinal men and women also had five runner-up finishes on Saturday, led by junior Robbie Moore's school record setting performance in the decathlon. Moore, a native of Eminence, Ky., had personal best performances in three of five events on Saturday and six of 10 overall to score 6,649 points in the decathlon and shatter his own previous school record total of 6,436 set earlier this season at the Sea Ray Relays in Knoxville.

Joining Moore with runner-up finishes for the Cardinal men was Steven Hnat (Floyds Knob, Ind.) in the shot put with a throw of 55-09.75, Belt in the long jump with a mark of 25-04.50 and senior Brandon Cook (Borden, Ind.) in the discus with a throw of 180-00. Adding a runner finish for the Cardinal women was freshman Andrea Sabbatine (Georgetown, Ky.) in the pole vault with a cleared height of 11-11.75.

Joining Korir and Moore with school record performances on Saturday was a pair of women with strong performances in the preliminary rounds of track events. Leading the way was freshman

Elisabeth Slettum, the reigning BIG EAST indoor 200m champion, who set a school record in the outdoor 200m with a time of 23.65 seconds to advance to Sunday's final as the top qualifier in the event. Earlier in the day, Slettum set a new school record in the 100m dash with a time of 11.80 to advance to Sunday's final in that event as well.

The third school record performance of the day for the Cardinal women came from freshman Theresa Lewis, a native of Randallstown, Md., who became the Cards' school record setting 25th NCAA Midwest Regional qualifier of the season with a time of 13.52 seconds in the 100m hurdles to advance to Sunday's final round as the No. 3 qualifier. The 25 regional qualifiers shatters last year's previous school record total of 17.

The Cards had three other athletes advance through Saturday's prelims as freshman Chris Brautzsch (Ft. Wayne, Ind.) was the No. 4 qualifier in the 110m hurdles with a personal best time of 14.32 seconds, freshman Shaquan Brown (Paterson, N.J.) was the No. 8 qualifier in the men's 400m dash with a time of 48.02 seconds and sophomore Heather Trimiew (Chattanooga, Tenn.) was the No. 8 qualifier in the women's 400m hurdles with a time of 1:02.33.

Day One at the BIG EAST Championships

University of Louisville junior Robbie Moore stands in seventh place after five of 10 events in the decathlon, while junior Christine Krellwitz is in ninth place with the completion of four of seven events in the heptathlon during Friday's first day of competition at the BIG EAST Outdoor Track & Field Championships at the George J. Sherman Family Sports Complex on the campus of the University of Connecticut.

Moore, from Eminence, Ky., had personal best performances in three events, including the 100m dash (11.28 seconds), the 400m dash (51.26) and the long jump (6.26m/20-06.50) to finish with 3,320 points and seventh-place at the halfway point of the event. He is the Cards' school record holder in the event scoring 6,436 points earlier this season at the Sea Ray Relays in Knoxville, Tenn.

Krellwitz, from Big Rapids, Mich., also had personal best performances in three events, including the 110m hurdles (15.36), 200m dash (27.09) and the shot put (11.27m/36-11.75) to stand in ninth place overall with 2,883 points.

NCAA Midwest Regional Columbia, Mo. May 25-26, 2007

COLUMBIA, Mo. – Sophomore Andre Black won the Cards' third event title of the weekend to lead the No. 7 ranked University of Louisville men's track and field team to a program best third-place finish at the NCAA Midwest Regional Saturday at the Audrey J. Walton Stadium.

The Cardinal men finished the event with a school record setting 50 points to finish behind only No. 2 ranked LSU with 70 points and No. 3 Auburn with 55 points. No. 6 Tennessee was fourth with 49 points, while No. 12 ranked and reigning 2007 NCAA indoor champion Wisconsin was fifth with 45 points. The third-place finish is one spot better than last year's previous school record best of fourth, while the 50 points is 12 points better than last year's previous best total of 38.

"We're definitely seeing signs of improvement from year to year and I'm proud of the way our kids competed this weekend," said U of L head coach Ron Mann. "It appears we're going to have twice as many athletes at the NCAA Championships this year than we had a year ago and we're starting to compete with and defeat some of the most formidable programs in the nation. For our men's team to defeat the SEC (Tennessee) and Big Ten (Wisconsin) champions shows the progress we're making. I felt like 55 points and second place was

within our grasp, and we're capable of moving up the ladder in the future."

Black, a native of Mobile, Ala., and the reigning 2007 NCAA indoor triple jump champion, won his first career regional title with a school record setting and stadium record setting leap of 53 feet, 3.75 inches. Saturday's mark broke his own previous U of L record of 53-00.75 set at the 2006 BIG EAST Championships and the previous Audrey J. Walton Stadium record of 52-08.75 set by Texas' Chris Hercules in 1998. And with his Top 10 national ranking in the long jump, Black should advance to the NCAA Championships in two events.

Joining Black as an automatic NCAA qualifier on Saturday was sophomore Tone Belt, a native of Berkeley Springs, W.Va., who cleared a height of 7 feet, 2.25 inches to finish second in the high jump behind reigning NCAA indoor high jump champion and outdoor national leader Donald Thomas of Auburn. Belt, a 2006 NCAA All-America performer in the high jump and the reigning 2007 NCAA indoor long jump champion, has qualified for the 2007 NCAA Outdoor Championships in two events for the second straight year after winning Friday night's long jump competition.

Closing out the scoring for the Cardinal men on Saturday was sophomore Cory Thorne with an eighth-place finish in the 3,000-meter steeplechase and a time of 8 minutes, 54.22 seconds. Thorne was caught up with a downed runner in the water pit early in the race, but recovered for the scoring finish and a top 12 finish, which should assure an at-large bid to the NCAA Championships.

On the women's side, the Cards scored a school record 12 points to finish 21st overall, the program's best ever finish at the regional meet. U of L's previous best finish was 23rd last season with nine total points.

Leading the way for the Cardinal women on Saturday was a quartet of individuals and the Cards' 4x100-meter relay team. Included in that mix was sophomore Seidre Forde, a native of Green's St. George, Barbados, who earned a sixth-place finish in the triple jump with a mark of 42-00.75 to score three points for the Cards.

In the women's hammer, the Cards' duo of Emily Turland and ZeNai Savage finished sixth and seventh respectively. Turland, a senior from New Albany, Ind., and the 2007 BIG EAST hammer throw champion, had a throw of 196-03, while Savage, a junior from Indianapolis, Ind., and the 2007 BIG EAST runner-up in the hammer, had a personal best mark of 196-01. Both Turland and Savage will have to wait and hope for at-large bids to the NCAA Outdoor Championships.

In the finals of the 200-meter dash, freshman Elisabeth Slettum from Stavanger, Norway, finished seventh overall with a time of 23.58 seconds, which equals her school record performance in Friday's preliminary race. The Cards' final point of the day came from the 4x100m relay team of freshman Theresa Lewis, Slettum, sophomore Heather Trimiew and senior LaShondra Durias, which finished eighth overall with a time of 46.07 seconds.

Overall, the Cards won three regional titles and earned five automatic bids to the NCAA Championships, including Tone Belt in the long jump and high jump, Andre Black in the triple jump and Brandon Cook and Arthur Turland in the discus.

Day One at the NCAA Midwest Regional

Led by senior Arthur Turland's discus title and sophomore Tone Belt's long jump victory, the No. 7 ranked University of Louisville men's track and field team earned three automatic bids to the NCAA Championships and held the lead in the team standings after the first day of competition at the NCAA Midwest Regional Friday at the Audrey J. Walton Stadium.

Turland became U of L's first ever NCAA regional event champion with his victory in the discus on Friday afternoon, while Belt joined Turland as an NCAA Midwest champion with his win in the

long jump on Friday night. Joining Turland and Belt as automatic qualifiers for the NCAA Outdoor Championships was senior Brandon Cook with a fourth-place finish in the discus.

Overall, the Cardinal men scored 31 points on Friday to hold the team lead at the NCAA Midwest Regional for the second straight year. Last year, the Cards scored 25 points on day one in Knoxville, Tenn., and went on to earn a fourth-place team finish, the program's best ever finish at the NCAA regional event. In second place after day one is Kent State with 28 points, while No. 12 and reigning NCAA indoor champion Wisconsin sits in third along with No. 3 Auburn with 18 points each.

Turland added his name to the Cardinal record books yet another time with an event winning mark of 183 feet on his third attempt of the day to earn his second straight automatic bid to the NCAA Championships in the discus. Last season, Turland finished 19th overall in the discus at the national championships.

Along with becoming the Cards' first regional champion this season, Turland also became the Cards' first ever NCAA indoor All-American with his eighth-place finish in the weight throw at the NCAA Championships on March 9. And on May 6, Turland was named Most Outstanding Men's Field Performer of the Meet at the BIG EAST Outdoor Championships after winning the discus and javelin titles and scoring 31 points for the BIG EAST champion Cardinals.

Belt, the reigning 2007 NCAA indoor long jump champion, won his third long jump title of the outdoor season with a mark of 24-10.50 on a night when big marks were a challenge for the Midwest's top jumpers. Belt entered the event seeded second in the region and ranked No. 3 overall in the nation.

Cook had a throw of 177-09 on his third attempt of the day to advance to the NCAA Outdoor Championships in the discus for the second time in his career. As a sophomore, Cook finished 20th overall at the 2004 NCAA Championships after earning the bid with a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Midwest Regional.

Also scoring points for the Cardinal men on Friday was senior Wesley Korir and sophomore Andre Black. Korir finished sixth overall in the 5,000-meter run with a time of 14 minutes, 4.65 seconds, while Black, the reigning 2007 BIG EAST long jump champion, finished sixth overall in the long jump with a mark of 24-06.25. Only the top five finishers in each event earning automatic bids to the NCAA Championships, but both Korir and Black should be in strong position to earn at-large bids to the 2007 national championships based on their previous performances this season.

On the women's side, the Cards scored one point as a team and advanced to a pair of event finals during Friday's action. Leading the way was junior Holly Geibel who finished eighth overall in the javelin with a mark of 145-05 to score one point for U of L, which stands in 27th place overall after the first day. No. 13 Arkansas leads the way with 19 points, followed by Purdue in second with 15 points and Southern Mississippi in third with 14 points.

The Cardinal women also turned in a pair of school record performances in preliminary action on Friday, led by freshman Elisabeth Slettum in the 200m dash. Slettum, the reigning 2007 BIG EAST champion in the 200m, advanced to Saturday's final in the event with a seventh-place and school record time of 23.58 seconds, breaking the previous school record mark of 23.59 set at the BIG EAST Championships earlier this month.

Earlier in the day, Slettum was joined by freshman Theresa Lewis, sophomore Heather Trimiew and senior LaShondra Durias as the Cards' 4x100m relay team advanced to Saturday's final after finishing eighth in Friday's prelims with a school record time of 45.25 seconds. The performance breaks the previous school record of 45.48 set by the same foursome at the Cardinal Invitational on April 21.



2007 Outdoor Meet Recaps

NCAA Championships Sacramento, Calif. June 6-9, 2007

SACRAMENTO, Calif. – Sophomore Andre Black used a clutch leap on his final attempt to earn a runner-up finish in Saturday's triple jump and lead the Louisville men's track and field team to a school record seventh-place finish at the 2007 NCAA Outdoor Championships in front of 10,165 fans at the Alex G. Spanos Sports Complex and complete the greatest season in school history.

The seventh-place team finish is the best ever for University of Louisville track and field and is the latest in a season of best-ever finishes for the Cards at the NCAA Championships. In the fall, the Cardinal men's cross country team finished 15th at the NCAA Championships and in March, the Cardinal men won a pair individual national titles and earned a 10th-place finish overall. In May, the Cards earned their first ever conference title with a victory at the BIG EAST Outdoor Championships and two weeks ago, the Cards finished third overall at the NCAA Mid-east Regional, the program's best ever finish at that meet.

"I'm proud of the team because there's always some ups and downs at a meet like this, but it's a team effort," said Cards' head coach Ron Mann. "With 15th in cross country, 10th indoors and seventh outdoors, you can take that into next season and really build upon it. I can say this exceeds my expectations for where I thought we'd be three years into this. It's just awesome and we're very appreciative of the support from (U of L Director of Athletics) Tom Jurich and (U of L Associate AD/SWA) Julie Hermann and the entire support staff we have in place at the University of Louisville."

Overall, the Cards scored 22 points, the most ever for U of L at an NCAA event, to finish tied for seventh-place with reigning NCAA indoor champion Wisconsin. No. 1 ranked Florida State repeated as men's national champion with 54 points, while No. 2 ranked LSU was second with 48 points. Auburn was third with 34 points, followed by Tennessee in fourth with 31 points, USC in fifth with 27 points and North Carolina in sixth with 26 points. UCLA finished ninth with 21 points and Oregon closed the top 10 with 20 points. The Cards' previous best finish at the NCAA Outdoor Championships was 30th last season.

"We were hoping to be in the top 10 and we thought it would take 30 points to do that, but it didn't take quite that many," said Mann. "We had some great performances across the board this week, and I'm really proud of Andre, particularly on his last jump when the pressure was on. He was very consistent all day long and had a great attempt on his fifth jump, which set him up for that sixth great and he did a great job."

The Cards, ranked sixth in the nation entering the weekend, moved into the top 10 on Black's final attempt in Saturday's triple jump after the reigning indoor triple jump champion entered the sixth and final round of jumps in eighth place overall. On his final leap, Black had a mark of 53 feet, the third best leap of his career outdoors, to earn All-America honors for the second time in his career and clinch a top 10 finish for the team.

"The last jump was a crucial jump and throughout the season, Coach Jacoby and I work on clutch performances just like that," Black said. "I thank God for the wonderful blessings that he's given to me and my team this week. As Coach Ron Mann says, we're a force to be reckoned with and we want to bring that fourth season to the city of Louisville."

Black entered the event as the No. 5 seed overall and finished fifth in Friday's triple jump prelims. On Saturday, the native of Mobile, Ala., moved into the lead on the second of six leaps with a mark of 52-02.50. After similar marks on his third

and fourth attempts, Black had a big leap on his fifth attempt, but his toe was over the foul line setting up the climactic finish in the final round.

"When I saw my mark on the final jump, my first reaction was 'Oh, I didn't win,' but it's all a blessing because I had a chance to come here and compete at the NCAA Championships," Black said. "For me, this was a great comeback from last year's outdoor championships when I didn't make the finals, and hopefully, I can continue to improve and mature as a jumper and continue to lead our team."

Overall, the Cardinal men closed the 2007 NCAA Outdoor Championships with three All-American performances, including second-place finishes for Black and Tone Belt (long jump) and a third-place finish for Wesley Korir (5,000m). Prior to head coach Ron Mann's arrival in Louisville in the summer of 2004, the Cardinal men had a total of two All-America performances, while in the last three NCAA track championship meets (2007 outdoor and indoor, 2006 outdoor), the Cardinal men have finished with eight All-America performances and two NCAA indoor champions.

Entering every season, we want to be a conference contender, which we were, we want to be a regional power, which we were and we want to be a strong national representative, and seventh is a pretty strong national finish," said Mann. "Finishing seventh out of more than 300 schools is like going to the Elite Eight in basketball and I couldn't be prouder of our team. This was a special season for not only Louisville track and field, but for Cardinal athletics across the board and we believe even bigger things are ahead for us."

Day Three at the NCAA Championships

University of Louisville senior Wesley Korir earned All-America honors in the 5,000-meter run Friday with a third-place overall to lead the No. 6 ranked Cardinal men's track and field team to 12th place overall entering the final day of action at the 2007 NCAA Outdoor Championships at the Alex G. Spanos Sports Complex.

Korir, a native of Eldoret, Kenya and a two-time BIG EAST champion, passed three runners on the final lap of the race to finish with a school record time of 13 minutes, 40.47 seconds and becomes U of L's first ever All-American in a running event. After entering the event seeded 10th overall, he became the Cards' second All-American of the week and the eighth in the last two years, while Friday's time shattered his own previous school record time of 13:50.44 set on April 13 at the Mt. SAC Relays.

"I was just relaxed and I was looking at my coach on each lap," Korir said. "I was listening to him and he kept yelling 'relax, relax'. Towards the end of the race with about one mile left I still felt great. I knew I could make a move. With 3000 to go, I started moving and then with 800 to go I was feeling really good."

"The only thing I can say is that this is the biggest blessing from God that I've ever had in my life. This is the best way to go out. I told Coach (Mann) this is the last time I will wear a Louisville jersey on the track, and I want to come out and star. God listened to me and made me come out and star."

Overall, the Cards closed Friday's action with 14 total points to stand alone in 12th place overall, while No. 1 ranked Florida State moved atop the leaderboard with 34 points overall. No. 2 Auburn is second with 32 points, while No. 3 LSU is third with 31 points.

"I just feel so happy for him specifically because he's come so far since last year at this meet, when he didn't make the finals," said Cards' head coach Ron Mann. "He was so dejected and now, a year later, he's third at the national meet. That says a lot to the rest of our athletes and to the kids we're recruiting that if you come here, you can go score points and you can be an All-American. That's how you start building a tradition."

The Cards will enter the final day of competition with one event remaining as sophomore Andre Black, the reigning 2007 NCAA indoor triple jump champion, closed Friday's triple jump prelims with a fifth-place leap of 51-10.50 on his third and final attempt to advance to Saturday's triple jump championship. Entering the final round of jumps, Black, a native of Mobile, Ala., was outside the top 12 in the standings, but moved up the leaderboard with the final leap.

"I didn't want to go through the same experience as last year at this meet and what I went through yesterday (in the long jump) and miss out on the finals," said Black. "I didn't want all of my hard work and all of the hard work of Coach (Jake) Jacoby and my teammates to go down the drain by not qualifying for the finals. I tried to stay focused and take care of what I can do and it was a pretty good pressure jump."

Black is attempting to become just the 10th athlete in 40 years to sweep the NCAA indoor and outdoor triple jump titles in the same season. LSU's Walter Davis was the last to do it with back-to-back sweeps in 2001 and 2002.

Also competing for the Cardinal men on Friday was sophomore Tone Belt, who finished 11th overall in the high jump with a cleared height of 7-00.25. On Thursday, Belt, a four-time NCAA All-America performer, finished second in the finals of the long jump with a leap of 25-02.50 on his first attempt and after a protest and appeal by Cards' head coach Ron Mann related to the a foul called on Belt's final attempt, the games committee denied the appeal in writing stating "as the appeal is a part of the protest policy, Article 6c states '...Evidence specifically excluded is all visual material, except that produced by official photo-timing and official video designated by the games committee before the meet. As such, this jury will not review personal video. Appeal denied."

"We asked for an appeal and that appeal was denied," Mann said. "We have no recourse. The final results will stand, and we'll move forward. Everybody learned from this - coaches and athletes. We'll make sure not to put ourselves in that situation again."

Belt's leap on Thursday equaled the jump of Cal State Northridge's Dashalle Andrews, but Andrews was awarded the championship title based on the tiebreaker, which compares the athletes' second best marks. Andrews' second best leap measured 25-00, while Belt was ruled to have fouled on each of his final five attempts.

Belt's sixth and final attempt was the jump in question for Mann, who, along with Belt, immediately protested the ruling of the event official and requested that a provisional measurement of the leap be taken. According to Rule 4, Article 6b of the 2007 NCAA Men's and Women's Cross Country and Track and Field Rule Book, "Any such protest may be immediate and oral by a competitor or competitor's coach in order to protect and preserve evidence, but must be submitted in writing by a coach to the protest table within the allotted time."

However, the long jump official denied the request by both Mann and Belt and the sand in the pit was immediately raked and leveled making it impossible to determine the distance on Belt's potential title-winning leap and limiting the outcome of a potential protest of the foul call. Mann immediately made his way to the protest tent and at 8 p.m. PT, officially protested the actions of the official in denying the provisional measurement.



2007 Outdoor Meet Recaps

Day Three at the NCAA Championships Cont.

At approximately 10 p.m. PT Thursday, more than two hours after the completion of the long jump and an hour after the completion of the day's final event, the head meet referee agreed with Mann and determined that "the official should have followed procedures for an immediate verbal protest, and measured the jump. The jump was ruled foul – a judgement call – and therefore it remains a foul." And though the head meet referee agreed with Mann's protest, he also determined that it was not possible to challenge the foul call and that no action would be taken related to the referee's foul call. Mann then immediately informed the referee that he intended to file an appeal to that decision, which was done on Friday morning.

"Of course it is still painful because I hurt for the kid," Mann said. "At the same time it is part of being involved in sports. It's the thrill of victory and the agony of defeat. What can you do? We'll honor the officials that run the meet. I followed all the procedures to file a protest, but we were denied

"I believe this track meet will be a better place in years to come because of our appeal," said Mann. "I love this sport, and we'll have a better sport because of the recommendations that come out of this appeal. I hope we'll begin using video on the long jump takeoff board. I also think we should use plasticine, which is clearly stated in the rule book. There are some things that the committee will look at to make the event better."

Day Two at the NCAA Championships

Tone Belt's attempt to sweep both the indoor and outdoor long jump national titles in the same season was denied Thursday night at the Alex G. Spanos Sports Complex with a runner-up finish in the finals of the men's long jump at the 2007 NCAA Outdoor Championships, though the final results of the event are pending an appeal to a protest by Cardinals' head coach Ron Mann.

Belt, who became the Cardinal track and field program's first ever NCAA champion in March at the indoor championships, finished the event with a leap of 25 feet, 2.5 inches into a gusty head wind on his first attempt of the night. Belt's leap equaled the jump of Cal State Northridge's Dashalle Andrews, but Andrews was awarded the championship title based on the tiebreaker, which is comparing the athlete's second best marks. Andrews' second best leap measured 25-00, while Belt was ruled to have fouled on each of his final five attempts.

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However, the long jump official denied the request by both Mann and Belt and the sand in the pit was immediately raked and leveled making it impossible to determine the distance on Belt's potential title-winning leap, limiting the outcome of a potential protest of the foul call. Mann immediately made his way to the protest tent and at 8 p.m. PT, officially protested the actions of the official in denying the provisional measurement.

At approximately 10 p.m. PT, more than two hours after the completion of the long jump and an hour after the completion of the day's final event, the head meet referee agreed with Mann and determined that "the official should have followed

procedures for an immediate verbal protest, and measured the jump. The jump was ruled foul – a judgement call – and therefore it remains a foul." And though the head meet referee agreed with Mann's protest, he also determined that it was not possible to challenge the foul call and that no action would be taken related to the referee's foul call.

"Tone is gamer, as we all know, and I think he could have won the national championship on his last attempt," Mann said following the meeting of the officials. "He's won a lot of other meets on his last attempt. (The sixth attempt) appeared to be a very good jump and technically it was a great jump. I can't dispute whether it was or was not a foul because that was a judgement by the official. I will say that I feel that he was probably the best jumper in the competition today."

Following the decision, Mann immediately informed the referee that he intended to file an appeal to that decision citing Rule 4, Article 7, which states "the decision of the referee may be appealed through the games committee or an appointed jury of appeal, in writing, not later than 30 minutes after the decision of the referee has been announced. Any available evidence at the discretion of this panel, may be considered. If such evidence is not conclusive, the decision of the referee shall be upheld."

"We will appeal the decision to the games committee, and they are the final decision makers," Mann said. "The rule actually reads that you can use any outside evidence to support your appeal. Then the question becomes what other pieces of evidence are out there. One of the pieces of evidence that we are prepared to present is video of the toe board during Tone's jump. Whether they will use that or not, we don't know."

With the entire event being contested in a strong head wind, the winning leap of 25-02.50 is the shortest winning leap in the NCAA men's long jump since 1966, when Rainer Stenius of Cal State Los Angeles won with a leap of 25-01.00.

Including the current results of the men's long jump and the two other completed events from Thursday, the No. 6 ranked Cardinal men are in seventh place overall in the team standings with eight points, while No. 15 Wisconsin leads the way with 12 points. Also competing on Thursday for the Cards was sophomore Andre Black, who finished 11th overall in the long jump with a leap of 23-06.00 on his third and final attempt after fouling on his first two leaps.

"Today was supposed to be a big day for us and we had the opportunity to score up to 18 points in the long jump," Mann said. "A lot of our points as a team could have come from that event. Andre had some trouble on the boards early and then tried to rectify it later, but it wasn't good enough. We were all shocked about that."

Day One at the NCAA Championships

Sophomore Tone Belt advanced to the finals in both the high jump and long jump, senior Wesley Korir advanced to the finals of the 5,000-meter run and sophomore Andre Black advanced to the finals of the long jump to lead the No. 6 ranked University of Louisville men's track and field team on the first day of competition at the 2007 NCAA Outdoor Championships Wednesday in front of announced crowd of 6,508 at the Alex G. Spanos Sports Complex on the campus of Sacramento State.

Belt, the reigning 2007 NCAA indoor long jump champion and a native of Berkeley Springs, W.Va., opened the day with a third-place finish overall in the qualifying round of the long jump with a leap of 25 feet, 2.5 inches on his second of three attempts. Later in the evening, Belt returned to action and cleared a height of 6-10.75 to advance to Friday's 16-person high jump final, set to begin at 3 p.m. PT.

"Today is the most nerve-racking day because you only get three jumps in the prelims and anybody

can get through," Belt said. "It was really big getting through today in both events. I wish my long jump marks had been a little bit better, but I accomplished the goal of reaching the finals. I'll be happy after tomorrow's long jump finals if we can score as many points as possible."

Black, the 2007 BIG EAST long jump champion and a native of Mobile, Ala., finished ninth in the long jump prelims with a mark of 24-10.00. The top 12 athletes from Wednesday's qualifying round advance to Thursday's NCAA long jump finals, scheduled for 6:30 p.m. PT. Black will also compete on Friday in the prelims of the triple jump, which he enters as the No. 5 seed overall.

"I didn't jump as well as I had hoped to today, but I advanced to the finals and that's what I needed," Black said. "My goal for tomorrow is to win, but I'd also be happy if Tone wins as long I could finish second. We want to finish 1-2 and I don't think we should expect anything less than that."

The Cards closed the event with Korir's 11th-place finish in the semifinals of the 5,000m with a time of 13 minutes, 57.50 seconds. Overall, 16 runners advanced to the 5,000m final scheduled for Friday at 7:45 p.m. PT.

"There were ups and downs all day long for our team, but I'm really pleased with the results from Tone, Andre and Wesley," said U of L head coach Ron Mann. "It was a good first day for us and it was topped off by a great race by Wesley. Now we turn our focus to tomorrow's long jump championship and we want as many points as possible in that one."

Also competing for the Cardinal men on Wednesday was sophomore Cory Thorne from Portsmouth, N.H., who finished 21st overall in the men's 3,000-meter steeplechase semifinals with a time of 8:56.83, while seniors Arthur Turland and Brandon Cook closed their U of L careers in the qualifying round of the men's hammer throw. Turland, a native of Kincardine, Ont., finished 23rd with a throw of 169-02, while Cook, from Borden, Ind., was 24th with a throw of 169-01.

The Cardinal women's team closed its 2007 season with a pair of athletes competing in the hammer throw. Senior Emily Turland, a native of New Albany, Ind., led the way with 16th overall with a throw of 186-04, while junior ZeNai Savage from Indianapolis, Ind., had a mark of 164-10 to finish 28th overall. Turland closes her career as a two-time BIG EAST champion and the school record holder in the hammer, discus and weight throw. In March, she became the Cards' first ever woman to compete at the NCAA Indoor Championships earning 10th-place finish overall in the weight throw.
