## Outlook

A year ago, the University of Louisville men's basketball team entered the season predicted to finish among the nation's top ten teams.

The Cardinals did not disappoint.

U of L posted a 27-9 record -- just the ninth time in school history the Cards have won as many games -- earned a runner-up finish in a rugged BIG EAST Conference race that went down to the final game of the season for the league title, and reached the NCAA Elite Eight for the third time in 11 years.

That successful campaign may be a prelude to another stellar season. Armed with four returning starters and a recruiting class ranked among the nation's top five, Coach Rick Pitino has painted a bright future for his eighth Cardinal team.

The season will not come without its challenges, though. Nine BIG EAST teams are among preseason Top 25 rankings and nine non-conference opponents participated in post-season tournaments last year.

"We'll again play one of the toughest schedules in the nation and I want it that way because of our returning players," said Pitino, whose team faced the nation's sixth-toughest schedule by the RPI last season.

Pitino will welcome the return of stellar forwards 6-6 senior Terrence Williams and 6-9 junior Earl Clark -- both with NBA-level talent -- as well as his starting backcourt in 5-10 senior Andre McGee and 6-1 junior Jerry Smith.

Williams and McGee will co-captain the Cards this season. "I expect them both to be tremendous leaders," said Pitino. "Both have an unbelievable sense of humor, are extremely bright and work extremely hard."

Williams averaged 11.1 points last season and was among the BIG EAST Conference leaders in assists (4.5), rebounding (7.2), assists-turnovers ratio (1.54) and minutes played (35.9). A two-time All-BIG EAST Conference and NABC All-District 7 second team selection, Williams produced two triple-doubles as a junior -- only the third and fourth triple-doubles in U of L history. He will enter his senior year No. 48 in career scoring at U of L with 1,102 career points.

McGee was the Cardinals leader last season in three-point field goal percentage (.394), hitting 52-of-132 threes. He averaged 6.5 points and 1.9 assists as a junior while starting 27 games in the Cards' backcourt.

Clark delayed a decision to take his skills to the NBA to return for his junior year. During the Cardinals' NCAA Elite Eight tournament run, Clark averaged a team-leading 14.5 points, 8.3 rebounds and blocked seven shots while hitting 62.2 percent of his shots (23-of-37). An NCAA East Region All-Tournament selection, Clark produced a double-double in 10 games last season while averaging 11.1

points per game and a team-high 8.1 rebounds and 1.7 blocked shots.

"Earl will be one of the finest forwards in the nation this season," said Pitino. "He has as much potential as any player I've coached and has developed a great work ethic."

A 6-3 junior guard, Smith has led the Cards' in three point goals each of the past two seasons. He started every game last season while averaging 10.7 points and burying 68 three-point goals. He scored in double figures in 21 games and was among the BIG EAST leaders in steals (1.7).

"Our backcourt will be very experienced and it's what you want playing against a difficult schedule," said Pitino.

Four additional lettermen return in U of L's backcourt. Edgar Sosa, a 6-0 junior guard, hopes to progress from a freshman year in which he earned BIG EAST All-Rookie honors and was the primary starter at point guard. He averaged 7.6 points and 1.8 assists as a junior, starting nine games.

"I expect a big change in Edgar this year", said Pitino. "With certain young men, it just takes longer to mature, and I think he's finally understanding what team is all about and is maturing into the type of basketball player I want him to become."

Will Scott, a 6-3 senior guard, is an adept long-range shooter who has hit 36 threes in a reserve role the last two years. A 6-1 sophomore guard, Preston Knowles provided a spark off the bench at both ends of the floor over the last half of the season and averaged 2.5 points. Lee Steiden, a 6-4 sophomore walk-on guard, appeared in four games last season.

Pitino added seven newcomers to the U of L roster, including 6-4 guard Reginald Delk, a two-year starter at Mississippi State who sat out last season. Delk averaged 9.5 points, 2.0 rebounds and connected on 35.5 percent of his three-point attempts as a sophomore in 2006-07 at Mississippi State.

Cardinal fans are eager to see 6-8 forward/center Samardo Samuels, the 2008 USA Today national high school player of the year and McDonald's All-America selection who averaged 24.2 points, 10.7 rebounds and 2.7 blocked shots as a senior last season in leading St. Benedict Prep to a 24-1 record and the No. 2 ranking in the USA Today Super 25 high school rankings.

Ranked among the top 25 prospects nationally, 6-10 forward Terrence Jennings averaged 12.2 points, 8.3 rebounds, 3.6 blocked shots in helping Notre Dame Prep in Fitchburg, Mass. reach the semifinals of the 2008 National Prep Championship.

A top 100 prospect nationally, 6-8 forward George Goode averaged 17 points, 11.6 rebounds, 5.7 blocks, 2.1 assists as a senior in leading Raytown South to a 22-5 record. He was enrolled at U of L last year, but did not play while shoring up his academic requirements.

A versatile 6-7 forward, Jared Swopshire averaged 22.1 points, 9.2 rebounds as a senior at IMG Academy in Bradenton, Fla. where he was among the nation's top 100 prospects.

A good long-range shooter, 6-4 guard Kyle Kuric averaged 20.8 points, 6.7 rebounds, 1.8 steals and 1.3 blocked shots as a senior in leading Memorial High School in Evansville, Ind., to a 21-2 record and the regional finals.

Chris Brickley, a 6-4 walk-on guard, played partial seasons at Northeastern and Southern New Hampshire University before transferring to U of L in January. He will be eligible following the 2008 fall semester.

Louisville will be without five lettermen from last year's team, including first team All-BIG EAST Conference center David Padgett, who led the Cardinals in scoring (11.2 ppg) and shot 66.7 percent from the field last season, and forward Juan Palacios, who finished his career with over 1,000 points.

■ **Cardinals Close Season in NCAA Elite Eight** -- Louisville closed a stellar season by reaching the NCAA Elite Eight for the second time in the last 11 years. The Cardinals, the No. 3 seed in the East Regional, beat No. 2 seed Tennessee (No. 5 AP, No. 6 ESPN/USA Today) 79-60 in the regional semifinals before falling 73-83 to top-seeded North Carolina (No. 1 AP, No. 1 ESPN/USA Today) in its final game of the season. The BIG EAST Conference is the only league in the nation to have a team advance to the NCAA Elite Eight each of the last seven years.

Louisville reached the NCAA Sweet 16 for the 16th occasion. Only four teams have been to more Sweet 16 appearances than Louisville's 16 since the NCAA began Sweet 16 records in 1975 (North Carolina 22, Kentucky 20, Duke 19 and UCLA 17; Kansas also has 16).

■ **Cards Win 20 Again** — Louisville has won at least 20 games for the last six straight seasons. Coach Rick Pitino has won at least 20 in a season on 16 occasions, ranking him tied for sixth among active coaches in 20-win seasons. The Cardinals have won at least 19 games in 35 of the last 39 years. Only four times in the last 42 years has U of L failed to reach either the NCAA or NIT postseason tournaments. U of L gained its 34th NCAA Tournament appearance with a No. 3 seed, its highest since 1994.

Louisville's 27 victories against the nation's third-ranked schedule was a significant achievement for the Cardinals. It was only the second time in the last 14 years and the ninth time in school history that the Cardinals won as many as 27 games.

■ **Magnificent March** -- Louisville has won nearly 70 percent of its games in the month of March over the past 36 years -- a collective 140-63 record -- with nearly half of those losses coming in the NCAA Tournament. U of L coach Rick Pitino has a collective 89-31 collegiate record in the month of March (.742). The Cardinals were undefeated in February this year and have won 13 straight in that month.

■ **Pitino Improves on Impressive Tournament Mark** -- U of L Coach Rick Pitino's 35-12 record in NCAA Tournament competition (.745) is third in winning percentage among active coaches behind Duke's Mike Krzyzewski (.775) and Florida's Billy Donovan (.759). He is fifth among active coaches in NCAA Tournament victories. He improved to 8-0 in NCAA Tournament regional semifinal games with the Cardinals' victory over Tennessee. He has a 5-3 record in regional championship games, winning on three of his last four opportunities.

■ **Clark Ended Season With Strong Performances** -- Forward Earl Clark improved his performance during the late stages of the season, earning NCAA East Region All-Tournament honors. In the Cardinals' four NCAA tournament games, he averaged 14.5 points, 8.3 rebounds, 1.7 blocked shots and shot 62.2 percent from the field (23-of-37). He scored in double figures in every NCAA Tournament game: 12 points and nine rebounds vs. North Carolina; 17 points, 12 rebounds, and four blocked shots against Tennessee in his 10th double-double of the season; 15 points, seven rebounds and two blocked shots against Boise State; and 14 points and five rebounds vs. Oklahoma. In the last eight games of the season, Clark averaged a team-leading 13.8 points, 8.5 rebounds and two blocked shots while shooting 63.6 percent from the field (42-of-66).

■ **Cards Tied For Most League Wins** -- Although it's with a first-ever 18-game league schedule, the Cardinals tied for its most conference victories in school history last year. U of L has won 14 league games three times: last season, 2004-05 (14-2 in Conference USA) and 1967-68 (14-2 in Missouri Valley). Louisville has finished second or better in its conference in three of the last four years and in 23 of the last 32 years.

■ **Home Sweet Home** -- Louisville owns a 653-135 record in its 52nd season in Freedom Hall (.829 winning percentage), the Cards' home since 1956. U of L was 15-2 at home during the 2007-08 season, averaging 19,481 fans (fifth in the nation). Louisville won its last eight straight at home. A crowd of 20,083 attended the Cards' game vs. Georgetown on Feb. 9, the fourth-largest in Freedom Hall history. Freedom Hall has been the site of six NCAA Final Fours, four additional NCAA events and 10 league tourneys.

Louisville averaged 18,488 fans in 20 home games in 2006-07, fifth highest in the nation. Sellout crowds are the norm and the Cards have a waiting list of over 3,000 wanting to purchase season tickets. U of L has ranked among the nation's top five in average home attendance each of the last 25 consecutive years.

... 12 of its last 15 games. The Cardinals' nine game win streak -- the longest of the season -- ended in its last regular season contest.

■ **Williams Could Finish Among Top 20 Scorers at U of L** -- Senior forward Terrence Williams could leave his mark on a number of career statistical rankings at U of L this season. Williams, who became the Cardinals' 59th career 1,000-point scorer last season, enters his senior year with 1,102 points. A similar season to his past two at U of L would place him among the Cardinals' top 20 all-time scorers. Williams, who has produced two of the Cards' four triple-doubles in school history, is also within reach of the top five at U of L in career three-point goals (currently 10th with 138) and assists (currently 13th with 360). He could also rise to among the top ten in rebounding (currently 653, 224 short of 10th) and steals (currently 124, 36 short of 10th).

■ **Ten Tournament Teams From BIG EAST** -- Ten BIG EAST Conference teams were selected to participate in post-season play in 2008, including a record-tying eight in the NCAA Tournament (Georgetown, Louisville, Notre Dame, Connecticut, Pittsburgh, Marquette, West Virginia, Villanova). The eight selections match the BIG EAST participants in 2006. Three BIG EAST teams advanced to the Sweet 16, matching the Pac 10 for the most. One BIG EAST team participated in the National Invitation Tournament (Syracuse, which reached the quarterfinal round) and Cincinnati played in the inaugural College Basketball Invitational. The BIG EAST is the only league in the nation to have a team advance to the NCAA Elite Eight each of the last seven years.

■ **Cards Among Nation's Top Five Teams in Early Rankings --** Louisville is among the top ten teams in the nation for 2008-09 in preseason rankings by a trio of national web sites. U of L is second nationally in a CBSSports.com preseason ranking by Gary Parrish, one of seven BIG EAST teams among the top 16. ESPN.com's Andy Katz has the Cardinals fifth in his preseason ranking, which was updated following the early-entry NBA draft withdrawal deadline had passed for players. Seven BIG EAST Conference teams were in the top 25, including three of the first five picks -- No. 2 Pittsburgh, No. 4 Notre Dame, and Louisville. The Cardinals are No. 6 in a similar ranking by Jeff Goodman of Foxsports.com, with eight BIG EAST teams ranked. The Cardinals will face nine teams in '08-09 that are included among the Top 25 listings.

■ **Pitino Will Face Two Former Assistants --** U of L Coach Rick Pitino will face two of his former assistant coaches during the 2008-09 season: Tubby Smith (Minnesota) and Mick Cronin (Cincinnati). Nineteen former assistants to Pitino rose to a collegiate head coaching position. There are eight current members of that group, including Cronin; Scott Davenport at Bellarmine; Billy Donovan at Florida; Marvin Menzies at New Mexico State; Herb Sendek at Arizona St.; Smith; Kevin Willard at Iona; and Ralph Willard at Holy Cross. Pitino has a collective 21-5 record in games against his former assistants (3-0 vs. Ralph Willard; 7-4 vs. Tubby Smith; 6-0 vs. Billy Donovan, 2-1 vs. Mick Cronin, 1-0 vs. Scott Davenport, 1-0 vs. Marvin Menzies, 1-0 vs. Kevin Willard). Two former assistants are currently NBA head coaches: Jim O'Brien (Indiana) and Reggie Theus (Sacramento).

Five former Pitino players also became collegiate head coaches, four of which are currently active, including Travis Ford of Oklahoma State; John Pelphrey of Arkansas; Sean Woods of Mississippi Valley State; and Donovan. Including games against both his 23 former assistants and former players who went on to become collegiate head coaches, Pitino is 25-6 (record vs. former players as head coaches: 3-1 vs. Travis Ford, 1-0 vs. John Pelphrey).

■ **Cards Are in New Practice Facility Home, Await New Arena in 2010 --** Louisville opened the Yum! Center in August of 2007, a facility which includes dedicated practice facilities, offices and other amenities for the Cardinals.

Ground has also been broken on a new riverfront arena in downtown Louisville in which the U of L men's and women's basketball teams will serve as the primary tenants. The \$450 million arena will seat 22,000 and include 72 private suites, 60 loge boxes and a host of amenities for fans. Existing electric company and health insurance company structures will be cleared in late summer of 2008 before construction begins, with the arena scheduled for completion in the fall of 2010. Texas based PC Sports will oversee the design and construction of the project and HOK is the architect.

■ **Cards Had 16 on Network TV --** Louisville appeared on network television on 16 occasions during the regular season last year. Every possible U of L game over the past 25 years (all but 12) have been televised on either a live or delayed basis -- a total of nearly 800 games -- including over 240 network television appearances.

■ **Cardinal Spurts** — Over its 36 games last season, Louisville produced 48 runs of 8-0 or better. The Cards forced their opponents into 82 scoring droughts of three minutes or more. U of L opened its game against Boise State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament with a 10-1 start and added a 10-0 scoring run later in the half to take a 36-26 halftime lead. Against Oklahoma in the second round, the Cardinals scored 14 unanswered points as part of a 23-4 first-half run in building a 44-22 halftime lead. The Cardinals had a 13-0 first half run while holding Tennessee scoreless for nearly seven minutes (from 15:29 until 8:36) and added an 8-0 run early in the second half.

■ **Academic Success** -- Nine of the Cardinals' 11 seniors over the last three years have earned their degrees including all four seniors in 2006-07. Of the Cardinals' three seniors in 2007-08, David Padgett earned his bachelor's degree a year early and took graduate courses last season while Juan Palacios and Terrence Farley are on target to graduate this summer. The U of L men's basketball team earned the 2004-05 Conference USA Sport Academic Award, presented to the team in each sport with the highest grade point average for the current academic year. Seven members of the Cardinal basketball team earned recognition on the U of L Athletic Director's Honor Roll for the 2006 fall semester (3.0 or better GPA).

■ **Cards Defensive Numbers Impressive** -- The Cardinals effectively used multiple defenses -- zone variations, man-to-man and full-court pressure -- during the 2007-08 season, ranking among the top defenses in the nation.

□ The Cardinals held 18 of its opponents below 40 percent accuracy from the field, including 12 of its last 20 opponents. U of L's 38.8 field goal percentage defense ranked eighth in the nation.

□ Louisville held 18 opponents to 60 or fewer points last season. The Cardinals were 22nd nationally in scoring defense, allowing 61.5 points a game. Oklahoma scored just 48 against the Cardinals in the NCAA second round. U of L's scoring defense was its lowest in 59 years (since allowing 59.2 points a game during the 1948-49 season). A dozen BIG EAST foes scored 60 points or less.

□ Louisville held five teams to 20 or fewer points in a half, including four in the BIG EAST (Georgetown, Rutgers, St. John's, Marquette, Iona twice).

□ The Cardinals were 31st nationally in blocked shots (4.9). Louisville blocked as many as seven shots in 10 games, including seven swats vs. Tennessee in the NCAA Tournament. The Cardinals blocked 13 shots against both Marshall and Iona, their most since swatting a school-record 18 shots vs. Holy Cross on Dec. 7, 2003.

□ Louisville gathered double-digit steals on 14 occasions last season, including seven of the last 15. Louisville was No. 57 in the nation in steals (8.0 per game). The Cards produced 14 steals at Georgetown in its regular season finale, matching a season-high. U of L generated 14.8 points a game off turnovers. The Cardinals scored 25 of its 78 points off 16 Oklahoma turnovers in the NCAA second round.

□ Over the last six seasons (since 2002-03), just 16 teams connected on 50 percent or better from the field against U of L, a span of 203 games. Just three teams hit 50 percent against the Cardinals in 2007-08 (at Seton Hall, at Georgetown, North Carolina).

□ Louisville has ranked among the nation's top 35 in field goal percentage defense in five of the past six years, including 25th last year (.402).

■ **Williams Fills Up a Box Score** -- Terrence Williams produced two triple-doubles as a junior, just the third and fourth in U of L history. He was also flirting with a triple-double in two other BIG EAST outings with 11 assists, nine rebounds, seven points and three steals at USF; and eight points, eight rebounds and eight assists against St. John's. He produced six double-digit rebounding efforts during the season and grabbed seven or more rebounds on 20 occasions. Williams was among the BIG EAST leaders in assists (4.5,

seventh in the BIG EAST), rebounding (7.2, 11th), assists-turnovers ratio (1.54, 12th) and minutes played

(35.9, fourth). Williams handed out 161 assists as a junior, the fifth best single season effort in assists ever at U of L. Williams' 13 assists vs. Hartford is tied for the third most ever at Louisville and his 11 assists against USF is tied for the 10th most for U of L.

■ **Cards Are in New Practice Facility Home, Await New Arena in 2010** -- Louisville opened the Yum! Center in August of 2007, a facility which includes dedicated practice facilities, offices and other amenities for the Cardinals.

■ **Valuable Cards** — U of L was noted as the third most valuable men's basketball program in the nation according to a recent Forbes story. The Cardinals were valued by the publication at \$24.4 million, behind only North Carolina and Kentucky, in money generated for the institution, conference and in incremental spending by visitors within the local community.

■ **Trends** -- U of L is 99-5 over the last nine seasons when scoring 80 or more points (72-5 under Pitino; 9-1 in '07-08) ... Over the past nine years, Louisville is 80-7 when shooting 50 percent or better from the field (11-1 in '07-08) ... U of L is 130-23 when holding its opponent below 70 points over the past seven years under Pitino (23-3 in '07-08) ... U of L was 26-2 on the season when leading with five minutes to go, 26-1 when shooting better from the field than its opponent, 20-2 when leading at halftime, and 16-2 when allowing fewer than 60 points.

■ **Cards Tied For Most League Wins**

-- Although it's with a first-ever 18-game league schedule, the Cardinals tied for its most conference victories in school history this year. U of L has won 14 league games three times: this season, 2004-05 (14-2 in Conference USA) and 1967-68 (14-2 in Missouri Valley). Louisville has finished second or better in its conference in three of the last four years and in 23 of the last 32 years.

■ **Cards Tough on the Road** — The Cardinals have won 11 of its last 14 games on an opponents home court and 14 of its last 18. Louisville won eight of its 11 true road games this year. Louisville's six BIG EAST victories on the road matched Georgetown for the most in the league. At Pittsburgh, Louisville became the first team to ever win two games in Pitt's Peterson Events Center, where the Panthers have a 96-10 record in six seasons. Louisville won at Marquette on Feb. 4, breaking the Golden Eagles' 14-game home win streak that started after U of L won there last season. The Cards also won at Rutgers, USF, DePaul and Providence in BIG EAST action; at intrastate rival Kentucky; and at UNLV, when U of L broke UNLV's 19-game home winning streak. Louisville won six of its eight BIG EAST Conference road games last season. Louisville had a 4-4 record in neutral site games last season.

■ **Cards 5-2 vs. Top 20 Teams** -- The Cardinals were 5-2 against Top 20 teams during the 2007-08 season. Louisville won 59-51 over then No. 6 Georgetown on Feb. 9. It was the first time the Cardinals had defeated a team ranked as high as No. 6 since Jan. 21, 2004 when U of L beat No. 6 Cincinnati 93-66 in Freedom Hall -- the same year U of L beat two No. 1 teams in Florida (12/13/03) and Kentucky (12/27/03). The Cardinals also posted victories over No. 13 Marquette on Jan. 17; No. 16 Marquette on Feb. 4; 90-85 over No. 17 Notre Dame on Feb. 28; and 79-60 over No. 5/6 Tennessee on March 27 in the NCAA East Region semifinals. The Cards two losses to ranked teams were in falling 55-52 at No. 11/10 Georgetown on March 8 and 83-73 to top-ranked North Carolina on March 29 in the NCAA East Region championship game.

■ **Tough Schedule** -- U of L's schedule was ranked as the fourth toughest in the RPI. U of L faced eleven teams in the 2008 NCAA Tournament during the season, compiling a 9-5 mark against those foes. The Cardinals also faced two 2008 NIT participants (1-1). Nineteen of the Cardinals' games -- nearly two-thirds of its schedule -- were played against teams that reached postseason competition in 2007. All but five of the Cards' 13 non-conference opponents were 2007 NCAA Tournament participants. Seven BIG EAST Conference teams were ranked among the nation's top 25 in the ESPN/USA Today final poll: No. 6 Louisville, No. 12 Georgetown, No. 17 West Virginia, No. 18 Pittsburgh, No. 19 Notre Dame, No. 21 Marquette, and No. 24 Villanova. Four additional U of L regular season opponents were ranked or among those receiving votes: No. 20 Purdue, Connecticut, UNLV and BYU.

**Cardinals in the NCAA Tournament**

■ Louisville made its 34th NCAA Tournament appearance in 2008. The Cardinals have reached the NCAA Tournament 25 of the last 32 years (five of the last six, seven of the last 10 years, 13 of last 17). The Cards have reached the Sweet 16 on 16 occasions, its first this year since 2005. Louisville is seventh in tournament victories (56) and is sixth in NCAA Tournament appearances (34). U of L has a 57-36 overall NCAA Tournament record, reaching the Final Four eight times.

■ Only five teams -- Kentucky (49), UCLA (40), North Carolina (40), Kansas (37) and Indiana (35) -- have more NCAA Tournament appearances than Louisville's 34.

■ U of L Coach Rick Pitino has a **35-12** record in NCAA Tournament play (.745), ranking him third among active coaches in winning percentage and 11th all time. Only six coaches have coached more Final Four teams than Pitino's five, a feat matched by two others. Pitino is the only coach to lead three different teams to the Final Four; is one of only four coaches to lead four different schools to the NCAA Tournament; and one of 10 active collegiate coaches who have won an NCAA Championship.

■ Only four teams have been to more Sweet 16 appearances than Louisville's 16 since the NCAA began Sweet 16 records in 1975 (North Carolina 22, Kentucky 20, Duke 19 and UCLA 17; Kansas also has 16).

■ U of L Coach Rick Pitino has guided 13 teams to NCAA tournament appearances, including five of his last six years at Louisville. His last six straight Kentucky teams reached the NCAA Tournament. The Wildcats won the 1996 NCAA title and were national runner-up in 1997 under his guidance.

■ The 2008 tournament was the fourth time the Cardinals entered the tournament as a No. 3 seed, including 1979, '82 and '94. U of L has a 9-4 record as the No. 3 seed, reaching the Final Four ('82) and three other Sweet 16s ('79, '94, '08) from that position.

■ U of L faced eleven teams in the 2008 NCAA Tournament during the season (prior to the tournament), compiling a 9-5 mark against those foes (defeated Georgetown, Kentucky, Notre Dame, Marquette twice and Pittsburgh, UNLV, Villanova and West Virginia; lost to Brigham Young, Connecticut, Georgetown, Pittsburgh and Purdue).

■ Louisville faced two teams in the 2008 National Invitational Tournament field, producing a collective 1-1 record against those foes (beat Syracuse; lost to Dayton). Four BIG EAST teams competed in the 2007 NIT, including NIT national champion West Virginia.

■ **Cards Earn No. 2 Seed in BIG EAST** -- Louisville earned its second straight No. 2 seed in the 2008 BIG EAST Championship presented by Aeropostale after finishing in a tie for second place with Notre Dame during the regular season. Louisville fell to No. 7 seed Pittsburgh 76-69 in overtime in the quarterfinals of the tournament on March 13, its only game in the event. Pittsburgh went on to claim the BIG EAST Championship, beating Georgetown 74-65 in the title game. Louisville has a composite 66-39 conference tournament record and the Cards have won 15 conference tournament titles. Louisville has finished second or better in its conference during the regular season in three of the last four years. The Cardinals' four losses in the BIG EAST during the regular season this year were by a total of 16 points, including three by a total of six points.

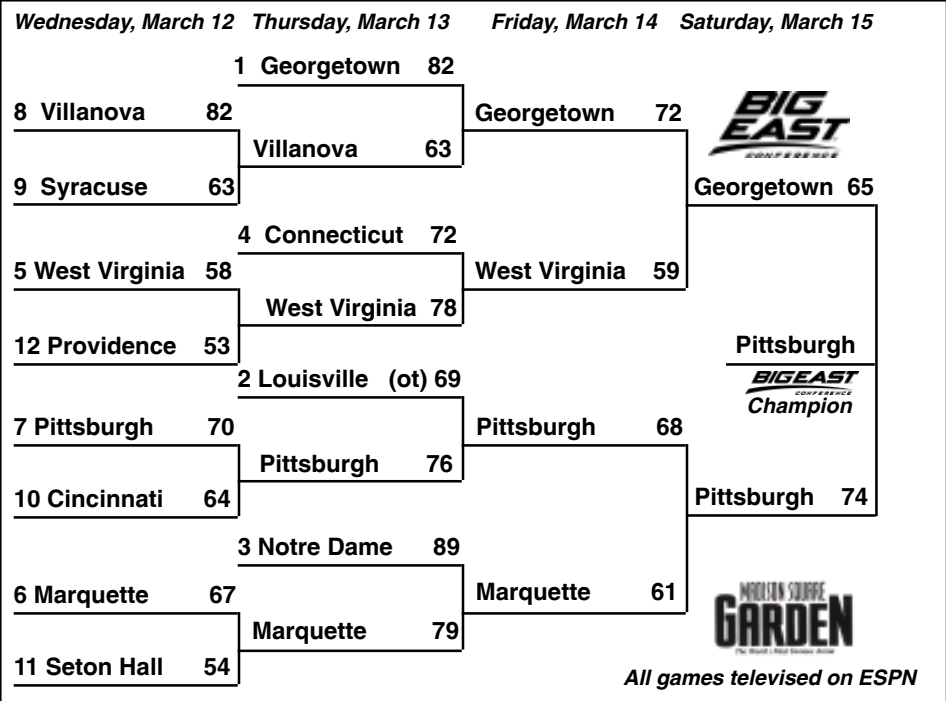

■ **Pitino Gained 500th Victory** -- U of L Coach Rick Pitino attained his 500th collegiate career victory with an 85-75 victory over Marshall on Dec. 18, 2007. Pitino, who has a 521-191 record in his 22nd collegiate season, is tied for the 14th fastest to reach 500 wins by the number of games; and is the seventh fastest by the number of seasons. The feat is even more impressive considering Pitino took over losing programs at each of his four collegiate coaching stops. The Cardinals' victory over Morehead State on Dec. 26, 2007 was his 150th at Louisville (currently 169-67 at U of L). U of L's win over Iona was his 100th in Freedom Hall while coaching at Louisville (106-18). Pitino coached his 700th collegiate game when the Cards beat Georgetown on Feb. 9.

■ **Pitino's Unique Accomplishment** -- By leading the Cardinals to their first NCAA Final Four since 1986 three years ago (2005), U of L Coach Rick Pitino became the first coach in NCAA history to guide three different schools to the NCAA Final Four. Pitino has coached five Final Four teams (Providence 1987; Kentucky 1993, 1996 and 1997; Louisville 2005), including winning the 1996 NCAA Championship at Kentucky and a runner-up finish in 1997. Pitino is one of 10 coaches all-time who have reached the Final Four at least five times.

■ **Pitino Impact Dramatic** — Pitino's impact on the U of L program has gone well beyond his on-court success. In the last three years, the overall grade point average of the men's basketball team reached the highest it has been since U of L has recorded that statistic since 1984. In 2005, the Cardinals won the Conference USA award for the highest basketball team GPA in the league. Average season attendance rose nearly 2,000 in Freedom Hall to a sold-out situation in the first year of Pitino's arrival and U of L has a waiting list totaling nearly 3,000 seats. Direct gifts to men's basketball have exceeded \$10 million since 2001. A \$1 million renovation of Cardinal Arena was funded through private donations upon his arrival. U of L built Minardi Hall, a \$4.6 million campus dormitory, and the Yum! Center, a \$15.2 million practice facility, with a large portion of the private funds raised through Pitino's efforts. Indirectly since Pitino's arrival, general donations to the Cardinal Athletic Fund have risen over \$2 million and U of L's net marketing financial benefits have risen over \$3 million.

■ **Pitino Third in Best Coaching Starts** -- U of L Coach Rick Pitino ranks third among the best coaching starts all-time in 22 seasons. Pitino's 521 victories in his initial 22 years as a head coach is an incredible feat given Pitino took over losing programs at each of his four collegiate coaching stops.

**HEAD COACH RICK PITINO**



In his 22nd season as a collegiate head coach and seventh at Louisville, U of L Coach **Rick Pitino** has compiled a 521-191 overall record (169-67 at U of L). The only coach to take three different schools to the NCAA Final Four including his 2005 Cardinal team, his .732 winning percentage ranks him 10th among active coaches and No. 30 all-time. Among active coaches, Pitino (Massachusetts '74) has the third-highest winning percentage in NCAA Tournament games (.754 winning percentage, 35-12 record in 13 NCAA tournament appearances). He guided Kentucky to three NCAA Final Four appearances in eight seasons (1989-97), winning the 1996 NCAA Championship and reaching the national title game in 1997. He has also served as head coach at Providence College (1985-87, 1987 Final Four), Boston University (1978-83), as well as the NBA New York Knicks (1987-89) and Boston Celtics (1997-2001).

■ **Pitino In Freedom Hall** -- During coaching stints at Providence, Kentucky and Louisville, Coach Rick Pitino has amassed a 120-20 record in Freedom Hall, including a 108-18 mark in his seventh season at U of L. Two of his NCAA Tournament wins came in Freedom Hall.

■ **Cards Were Unbeaten in February** -- Louisville's nine-game winning streak Feb. 2 through March 2 was its longest since winning nine straight during U of L's 2005 Final Four season (Jan. 8 - Feb. 5, 2005). U of L was unbeaten in February (8-0) for the first time in 25 years (since the 1982-83 Final Four season when U of L was 9-0 in February). U of L has won 13 straight games in February dating back to the 2006-07 season.

■ **Pitino One of Eleven with Two Different Final Four Schools** -- U of L Coach Rick Pitino is the only coach to take three different schools to the Final Four. Only 11 coaches have taken teams from two different schools to the NCAA Final Four. Pitino has coached five Final Four teams (Providence 1987; Kentucky 1993, 1996 and 1997; Louisville 2005), including winning the 1996 NCAA Championship at Kentucky and a runner-up finish there in 1997. Pitino is one of 10 coaches all-time who have reached the Final Four at least five times.

■ **Pitino Third in Active NCAA Winning Percentage** -- Pitino has a 35-12 record in NCAA Tournament play (.745), ranking him third among active coaches in NCAA Tournament winning percentage behind Duke's Mike Krzyzewski and Florida's Billy Donovan (Pitino is 11th on the all-time list). Pitino has guided 13 teams to the NCAA Tournament, including five of his last six at Louisville. He has guided a team into the NCAA Tournament in 11 of his last 13 seasons coaching in the collegiate ranks (last six straight Kentucky teams from 1992-97; 2003-05, '07 and '08 at U of L). Pitino's teams have won 20 of his last 26 games, spanning his last seven NCAA Tournament appearances (1996, 1997, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2007, 2008).

## U of L Basketball Tradition

■ Louisville made its 34th NCAA Tournament appearance in 2008. The Cardinals have reached the NCAA Tournament 25 of the last 32 years (five of the last six, seven of the last 10 years, 13 of last 17). The Cards have reached the Sweet 16 on 16 occasions (twice in the last four years). Louisville is seventh in tournament victories (57) and is sixth in NCAA Tournament appearances (34). U of L has a 57-36 overall NCAA Tournament record, reaching the Final Four eight times.

■ U of L has an all-time 1556-824 record in 92 seasons of intercollegiate basketball. The Cardinals are 18th among all NCAA schools in victories.

■ Eighteen Louisville players have earned All-America status, the latest being Francisco Garcia in 2005. The Cardinals have had 57 players drafted by the NBA, the latest of whom is Francisco Garcia being chosen in the first round (23rd overall) in the 2005 NBA draft. Garcia is currently with the Sacramento Kings.

■ U of L is tied for seventh nationally with eight Final Four appearances overall. No other school went to the Final Four four times during the 1980s and Louisville won two NCAA titles in that decade, winning the national championship in 1980 and 1986. Coach Rick Pitino has guided four teams to the NCAA Final Four. Louisville's 34 NCAA Tournament appearances is sixth best all-time and its 57 NCAA Tournament victories is the seventh most.

■ Louisville owns a 653-135 record in 52 seasons in **Freedom Hall** (.829 winning percentage), the Cards' home since 1956. Freedom Hall has been the site of six NCAA Final Fours, four additional NCAA events and 10 conference tournaments. ESPN College Basketball magazine noted Freedom Hall as the nation's "Best Playing Floor."

■ Louisville has won its conference championship or finished second in its

league in 23 of the last 32 years, including its second place finish in the BIG EAST the last two years straight.

■ Louisville is the only school in the nation to have claimed the championship of three major national post-season tournaments including the 1948 NAIB Championship, the 1956 NIT title and the 1980 and 1986 NCAA Championships.

■ U of L is second all-time in the NCAA with 46 consecutive winning seasons (not current). The Cards played winning basketball from 1944-45 through 1989-90, winning 20 or more games on 31 occasions during that period.

■ Louisville has two representatives in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. Cardinal All-American and former Washington Bullets All-Star **Wes Unseld**, who was inducted in 1988 while former head coach **Denny Crum** was inducted in 1994.

■ Louisville has ranked among the top 10 nationally in average home attendance each of the last 28 years, including the last 25 straight in the nation's top five. With sellout crowds the norm and ranking fifth nationally in home attendance, the Cardinals have a waiting list of over 3,000 wanting to purchase season tickets. Louisville was 15-2 at home during the 2007-08 season, averaging 19,481 fans.

■ Only four times in the last 43 years have the Cardinals failed to reach either the NCAA or NIT post-season tournaments. U of L reached the Elite Eight round of the NCAA Tournament last year.

■ The Cardinals are one of the most televised teams in college basketball. U of L games were televised on national networks during the 2007-08 regular season on 16 occasions (nine ESPN, four CBS, two ESPN2, one VERSUS). Every possible U of L game over the past 25 years has been televised on

either a live or delayed basis -- a total of nearly 800 games -- including over 240 national television appearances.

■ The Cardinals have been ranked on 443 occasions in the AP poll, seventh-most all-time. After attaining a No. 6 preseason ranking, the Cardinals fell out of the polls after five weeks (mid-December). U of L returned to the AP poll on Feb. 11 at No. 23 and remained among the nation's Top 25 teams since then. The Cardinals were No. 13 in the March 16 final AP poll. U of L had a 5-2 record against Top 25 foes last season. U of L finished the 2006-07 season at No. 16 in the AP poll.

■ One former Cardinal is active on NBA rosters during the 2007-08 season: **Francisco Garcia** of the Sacramento Kings. At least 17 former Cardinals are playing professionally now with other U.S. or foreign teams. Thirty U of L players have reached the NBA during the last 36 years.

■ U of L has retired the numbers of four of its former hoop greats: **8 Charlie Tyra**, **31 Wes Unseld**, **35 Darrell Griffith** and **42 Pervis Ellison**.

■ Louisville leads the nation with 59 all-time 1,000 point scorers, a plateau reached by two Cardinals last season (Juan Palacios and Terrence Williams). North Carolina is second with 58.

■ Aside from basketball lettermen, some notable U of L alumni include: the late **Johnny Unitas** (football), **Mitch**

**McConnell** (U.S. Senator, Kentucky), **Chris Dodd** (U.S. Senator, Connecticut), **Bob Edwards** (former National Public Radio host), **Tom Jackson** (ESPN commentator) and 16 players active in the NFL during the 2007 season.

■ U of L's co-ed cheerleading squad has won 13 national cheerleading titles, including winning the 2007 National Cheerleading

Association Championships in Daytona Beach, Fla. The Cards' all-girl squad has won six championships (2001-05; 2007) and U of L also won the small coed national title in 2005 and 2006, its first two times competing in the event. The Ladybirds, U of L's dance team, has won six national titles (including four in the last six years) and won the NCA title last year.

■ U of L is among the nation's top 15 teams in winning percentage over the last seven years under Coach Rick Pitino, posting a 169-67 record in those seven seasons (.716 winning percentage).

## Head Coach Rick Pitino

Rick Pitino, one of the most brilliant minds in coaching, began a new era in University of Louisville men's basketball when he was named head coach of the Cardinals on March 21, 2001.



The only coach in NCAA history to take three different teams to the NCAA Final Four, Pitino's up-tempo style, pressure defense, strong work ethic and family atmosphere have quickly returned the Cardinals to national prominence.

In 22 seasons as a collegiate head coach at four different schools, Pitino has compiled a 521-191 record, a .732 winning percentage that ranks him 10th among active coaches. His current contract ties him with U of L through the 2012-2013 season.

Pitino's most recent Cardinals overcame early injuries to its front line to win 27 games against a schedule rated as the fourth-toughest in the nation. An aggressive, multiple defensive attack helped U of L earn a second-place finish in the BIG EAST Conference for the second consecutive year and advance to the Cards' second NCAA Elite Eight appearance in four years.

In 2006-07, Pitino's youthful squad also battled through injuries to win eight of its last ten games and rise among the nation's top 20 teams over the last four weeks. The Cards won 24 games, including a pair on the road over top 15 ranked teams, earned a second-place finish in the BIG EAST Conference and were No. 16 in the final Associated Press ranking.

The Cardinals were No. 3 in the nation in the final 2004-05 ESPN/USA Today poll while posting a stellar 33-5 record, matching the most victories in U of L history. U of L won its first-ever Conference USA regular season title and also claimed the league tournament championship. Louisville reached its first NCAA Sweet 16 since 1997 as the No. 4 seed in the Albuquerque Regional before advancing to its first NCAA Final Four since 1986.

The successes of the 2005 Final Four squad were built upon the efforts of his early teams at U of L. Four years ago, the Cardinals won 16 straight during one stretch and rose to as high as fourth in the national polls before a trio of key injuries disrupted the Cardinals' flight. U of L won 20 games in back-to-back seasons for the first time in six years. Pitino gained his 400th career coaching victory with a 73-65 victory over then top-ranked Florida on Dec. 13, 2003, the first of two wins that season U of L achieved over No. 1 ranked foes.

In his second year at U of L in 2002-03, the Cardinals reached the No. 2 position in the Associated Press poll and spent time as the nation's top team in the Ratings Percentage Index and Sagarin Ratings. After a 1-1 start, the Cardinals reeled off an incredible 17 straight victories, one short of the school record and the second-highest ever in Conference USA history. U of L won its first-ever Conference USA Tournament title.

Pitino did not wait for the Cardinals to make an upward move. In his first year at

Louisville in 2001-02, he guided an undersized, often outmanned squad to a 19-13 record, upsetting the nation's fourth-ranked team along the way to earning a post-season tournament appearance in the NIT, nearly reversing the Cardinals fortunes the season prior to his arrival (12-19 in 2000-01).

Even under great adversity, Pitino's teams have persevered. After losing 60 percent of its scoring and four key upperclassmen from its 2005 NCAA Final Four team, Louisville battled through destructive injuries and inexperience during the 2005-06 season to post a 21-13 record in its first year in the BIG EAST Conference, concluding the year in the NIT national semifinals.

A 2006 inductee to the New York City Hall of Fame, Pitino has the third-highest winning percentage in NCAA Tournament games among active coaches, winning 75.5 percent of his games in the post-season event with a 35-12 record in 13 tournament appearances.

For three and a half years, Pitino served as president and head coach of the NBA's Boston Celtics. With the Celtics, he took over a team that had posted a franchise worst 15-67 record before his arrival. He quickly made an impact, improving the Celtics' victory total by 21 games in his first season. He resigned his position with the storied franchise on Jan. 8, 2001 after compiling a 102-146 record there.

He guided Kentucky to three NCAA Final Four appearances in his last five years at Kentucky, winning the 1996 NCAA Championship and reaching the national title game in 1997. In eight seasons with the Wildcats, he amassed a 219-50 record (.814) while winning two league crowns and an impressive 17-1 record in the Southeastern Conference Tournament. While at UK, Pitino coached three Wildcats who earned All-America honors and eight players who were drafted by the NBA, including six in the first round (three lottery picks).

Pitino, 55, got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant at Hawai'i in 1974 and served as a full-time assistant there in 1975-76. He served two seasons as an assistant at Syracuse under Jim Boeheim from 1976-78.

Pitino was only 25 years old when he accepted his first head coaching job at Boston University in 1978. He produced a 91-51 record in five years there, departing as the most successful coach in BU history. In his final season there, he guided the Terriers to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 24 years. He was twice named New England Coach of the Year (1979, 1983).

Pitino left Boston U. to become an assistant coach for the New York Knicks from 1983-85, where he worked with head coach Hubie Brown. It was a team he would return to lead as its head coach in two seasons.

He was head coach at Providence College for two seasons (1985-87), producing a 42-23 record there. He guided the Friars to an NCAA Tournament appearance in 1986 and a trip to the NCAA Final Four in 1987, winning the regional championship in Freedom Hall.

Before his stint at Kentucky, Pitino served as head coach of the New York Knicks for two seasons. In his initial year there in 1987-88, the Knicks improved by 14 victories and made the NBA Playoffs for the first time in four seasons. The Knicks won 52 games in 1988-89 and swept the Philadelphia 76ers in the first round of the NBA Playoffs.

Aside from his hoops prowess, Pitino has achieved success off the court as well in such realms as broadcasting, publishing, motivational speaking and horse racing. He is an accomplished author, producing such books as the best seller "Success Is A Choice" and "Lead to Succeed."

He earned his degree in 1974 at Massachusetts, where he was a standout guard for the Minutemen's basketball team. His 329 career assists rank eighth all-time at UMass and his 168 assists as a senior is the sixth-best single season total ever there. Pitino was a freshman during NBA legend Julius Erving's senior year.

Born Sept. 18, 1952, Pitino is a native of New York City where he was a standout guard for Dominic High School in Oyster Bay, Long Island. There, he captained his team and established several school scoring marks.

Pitino and wife Joanne have five children: Michael, Christopher, Richard, Ryan and Jacqueline.
