#### The Senior Salute

##### Beam, Chester A.: F-21-6:4-180-Senior

Nickname . . . "Bubba" . . . Beam was thought lost for the 1952-1953 campaign because of heart ailment . . . however, a later doctor's examination allowed him to play 20 minutes . . . in his first varsity appearance of the 1952-1953 season he netted 11 points in a second half substitution roll and personally won the Purdue victory . . . by mid season he had won back his job . . . a rugged player who does not mind contact . . . has a deadly one hander . . . rebounder, was third high on the team with 105 . . . had a game average of 8.8 . . . point job of 15.2\* . . . made 25 points against Georgetown in the opening round of the N.I.T., a job gained him second team tourney choice.

##### Cox, Cortland K.: G-22-5:11-165-Senior

Nickname . . . "Corky" . . . the quiet man who does a consistent workmanlike job comes up with occasional flurries of brilliance which make him personally responsible for vital victories . . . won the Bradley game played at Peoria with a brilliant 22 point set shot . . . in addition to being Great Long shot artist, Cox can also drive well and has a firm away one hander . . . good ball hawk, Cox draws Louisville's defensive assignments, which brings more attention to the fact that as a regular he made only 63 fouls during the 19 season, and was out on personals but once during the year . . . should be ready for another season . . . point potential mark is 16.4\*.

##### Noble, Charles E.: F-G-22-6:4-200-Senior

Nickname . . . "Chuck" . . . the type player whom we in Louisville think is a real American . . . (please see back of brochure for details) . . . has tallied 782 points in two years varsity competition . . . averaged 17.0 points a game last year and has a point potential in 20.4\* . . . highest on the team . . . holds the University all time scoring mark of 36 points game . . . the team's playmaker, and finest passer . . . If he has a best shot it is a start foot one hand set . . . can score from close in with either hand . . . was second on the team in rebounds with 142 . . . key man in the Cardinal's drive toward being the best team nation.

##### Powell, William S.: C-F-21-6:5-180-Senior

Nickname . . . "Sebree" . . . one of the men who gave Coach Hickman that powerful strength which won so many of last year's games . . . can play forward as well as center always makes his presence felt in rebound situations under the boards . . . good defensive in best shot is a "hesitating" one hander . . . has a point potential mark of 11.2\* . . . an Kentucky boy he is a conscientious, hard working student and player.
