



Jody Martin hit 48 treys last season.

Shelley Sanders and Janice Felder were too much for Louisville on the second leg of the road trip at Southern Miss. The Eagles outscored the Cardinals 22-7 over the last 5:58 of the game to snap Louisville's six-game winning streak with a 78-67 victory.

Felder scored 19 points and Sanders, who scored 17 in the first half, finished with 21. Louisville went on a 22-7 run midway through the second half to take a 60-56 lead after Carol Edwards hit a three with 5:58 left. Sanders then started the Southern Miss run with a layup and tied the score at 60 with two free throws. Tanya Bullock hit back-to-back baskets to give the Golden Eagles a 64-60 lead with 3:08 left and the Eagles never looked back.

Strong inside play by South Carolina's Marsha Williams and clutch three point shooting by Karen Middleton was the difference in Louisville's 66-62 loss to South Carolina at Cardinal Arena.

Louisville held a slim 31-29 halftime lead, but Middleton broke loose with three treys and 13 points in the second half as the Cardinals fell for the second straight time.

The fast-breaking Florida State Lady Seminoles blitzed past the Cardinals 86-52 to extend the losing streak to three. FSU held a 31-26 halftime lead but then outscored Louisville 37-12 during a ten minute stretch of the second half to go on top 76-40.

Four Seminoles hit the double-digit mark with Wanda Burns leading the way with

20 points and 10 assists.

The Lady Cards snapped the three game skid with a 92-64 victory over Austin Peay in the final home game of the regular season at Cardinal Arena. Six Louisville players hit the double-figure mark with Jody Martin leading the way with 17 points. The Cardinals led by as many as 31 in the second half on the way to hitting a season high 60.0 percent from the field.

Louisville blitzed Cincinnati early, forcing the Bearcats into 23 first half turnovers and coasted to a 90-46 victory to run the record to 19-7. Louisville, which led wire-to-wire, controlled every

aspect of the game and forced Cincinnati into a season-high 39 turnovers.

The Cardinals earned their 20th victory with a 98-58 win over Northern Arizona during the opening round of the Northern Lights Classic at the University of Alaska at Anchorage. Louisville, which never trailed, hit 58.6 percent in the game, including 62.1 in the second half. Knox hit 12 of 16 field goals and a free throw for 25 points to earn Player of the Game honors.

Round two of the tournament pitted the Cardinals against Appalachian State. The Cardinals continued their dominance of the Northern Lights field with a 109-61 victory to advance to the championship. Doyle hit the 30 point mark, as Louisville scorched the nets in the first half when it hit 61.9 percent from the field.

Northern Illinois senior guard Lisa Foss broke loose in the second half for 19 points as the Huskies staged a second half comeback to overtake the Cardinals 63-60 in the championship game. The Cardinals, who led 26-18 at the intermission, struggled from the floor in the second half, hitting only 37.8 percent while the Huskies hit 61.3 percent. Doyle, Knox and Rose earned all-tournament honors.

The road weary Cardinals closed out the regular season with a 70-57 victory at Virginia Tech. The victory improved the Cardinals record to 22-8 on the season and a third place finish in the Metro with a 9-5 mark. Doyle hit 10 of 19 field goals and five free throws for 25 points.

Louisville advanced to the semi-final round of the Metro Tournament with an 85-75 victory over Memphis State in opening round action. The Cardinals, who trailed 43-37 at the break, went on a 22-9 run midway through the second half to seal the victory. Doyle, who had 15 rebounds, and Knox led the way with 21 and 20 points respectively.

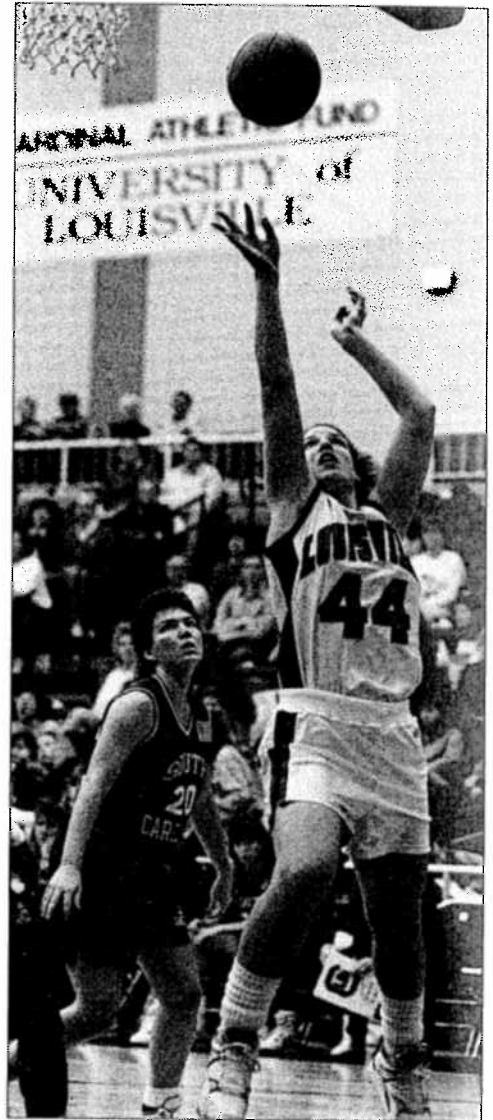
Strong inside play by Florida State's Chantelle Dishman once again proved to be the difference as Louisville was knocked out of the Metro Tournament with a 83-70 loss. Doyle scored 14 points before fouling out with 3:53 left to lead Louisville.

For their regular season efforts, the Cardinals earned a bid to the NWIT in Amarillo, Texas, marking the first post-season tournament appearance by a Louisville squad in seven years.

First-round opponent Kansas forced Louisville into 25 turnovers and dropped Louisville into the losers bracket with a 71-66 loss. U of L, which shot only 38.4 percent from the field, was led by Doyle's 15 points and eight rebounds.

Doyle was unstoppable against Notre Dame in the second round, and the Cardinals posted an 80-75 victory in the first meeting between the two schools. Doyle scored a career-high 34 points and pulled down 10 rebounds.

Alabama-Birmingham ended Louisville's season on a disappointing note, handing U of L an 81-75 loss. Doyle, who earned all-tournament honors, led all scorers with 25 points, but fouled out late in the game. The freshman forward set a NWIT and school record with 25 straight free throws over the three games.
