Q - What are you striving to achieve with the program this season?

A - Our main program goal is to be a perennial top-25 type team. You have to have the potential and respect to be in one of the better programs in the country. If we do that, we have a better chance to play in the NCAA tournament this year. That is our ultimate goal. Our returning players experienced a lot of success last year, but they were very disappointed that they did not go to the NCAA tourney. It left a bad taste in everyone's mouth. That, in itself, will be the biggest motivating factor this season. It was an unsatisfying season for the players, coaches, staff and myself.

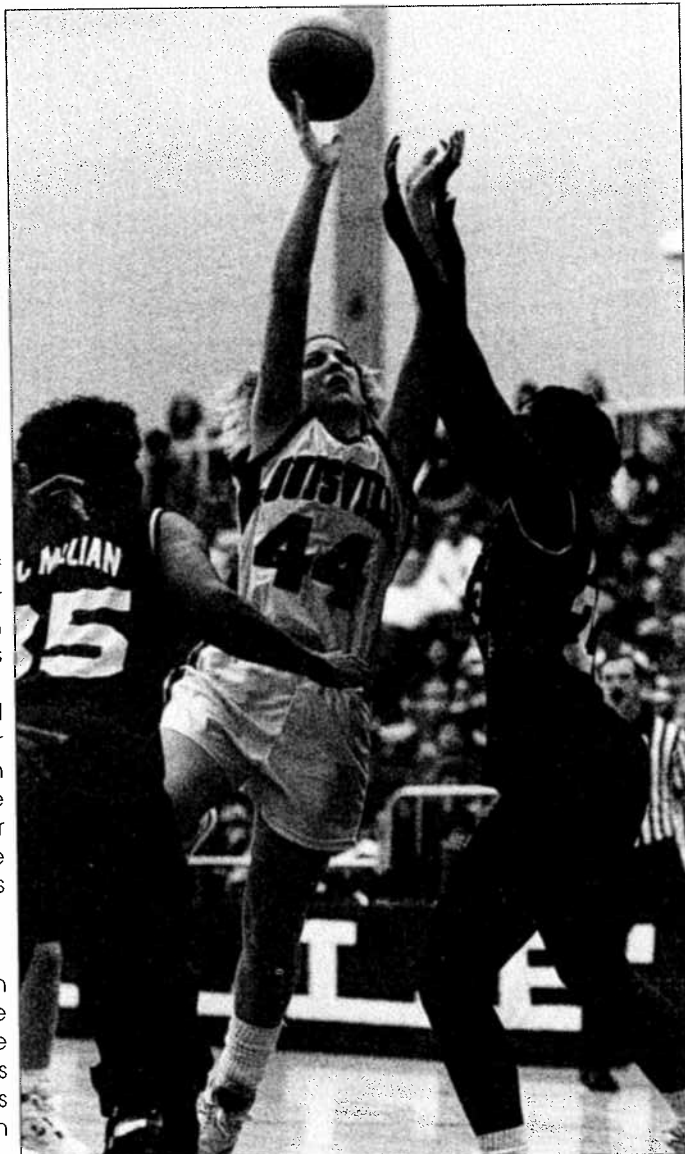
Q - What do you see as your strengths and weaknesses?

A - The main strength is that the bulk of our team has been playing together for at least two seasons, so we have a good core of players that will be playing their third year together. Anytime you have that, that's a real strength. We're not really counting on our new players coming in and having to shoulder the burden of success, but we do expect them to contribute quite a bit. Another main strength is the fact of disappointment of not getting an NCAA bid last season. This will make the team more intense this season.

Our weaknesses are centered around statistical things. I was disappointed with the team's shooting percentage last year (43 percent). We missed a ton of easy shots all season long which would have made a difference in the outcome. We must improve our team field goals this year. I think with the experience factor that it will happen. Statistically, our weaknesses are things that we definitely must focus on. However, our strengths of our program is the first step at this point.

Q - What is your style of play?

A - We play an uptempo beat. We are not a run and gun team. I like to maintain discipline on the court, yet allow the players to be creative. Every game I have 18 goals. The first one is rebounding. Rebounding is our key, especially for the guards and forwards. Second is the 70/20 theory. That is 70 percent or less of the shots from the field and 20 percent or more attempted from the line. When this balancing act happens, we are a 12-0 team. It shows that when we go to the line, we've created a play..
