The Lady Cards started out slow as UNC Asheville jumped to a 11-5 lead in the first five minutes.

After a timeout, Louisville connected on two straight baskets to cut the deficit to two. After Emily Hill completed a three-point play, the Lady Cards went on a 17-2 run to take a 26-16 lead with 3:26 left in the half.

All-American candidate Jill Morton led the comeback, scoring eight of her first half 10 points in that run. Morton finished the game with 17 points and five assists.

The Louisville defense forced UNC Asheville into 23 turnovers, 13 in the first half. The Lady Cards turned those turnovers into 29 points.

Sophomore Janelle Antoine made a big contribution to the win. Antoine averaged just 2.2 points last season, led the Lady Cards with a career-high 23 points.

The Lady Cards opened the second half with a 19-6 run to go up 53-32. But UNC Asheville went on a 11-2 run to get back within 12. Then the Lady Cards put the game out of reach with another run of 13-5 for a 68-48 lead.

Senior Alison Bass put in a double-double performance with 17 points and 13 rebounds.

With eight minutes left in the first half the Lady Cards

led by nine points. The Seawolves went on a 6-0 run to get within one point at the six minute mark. Louisville kept the lead but Alaska Anchorage pushed and the Lady Cards had a 35-33 lead at the half.

Louisville faced No. 19 Kansas in the championship game of the Great Alaska Shootout. The Lady Cards made just two field goals in the first nine minutes and trailed 24-8 before going on a 9-0 run.

The Lady Cards gained some momentum behind the three-point line. Kara Kessans connected on 3 of 3, Jill Morton 1 of 1 and Marju Sober 1 of 2. Louisville shot 83.3 percent from the arc, and trailing just five points at the half.

In the second half the Lady Cards kept fighting back behind the play of Kessans. The Lady Cards got within three points early in the second half. But Kansas All-American Lynn Pride kept Louisville at bay with 19 points and six assists.

Kessans connected on four more three-pointers, connecting on 7 of 8 for the game. Shanta Bowens added 10 points and six assists in the second half to spark the Cardinals from the bench.

Kara Kessans finished the game with a career-high 24 points. Morton added 14 points and six assists and Bowens finished the game with 12 points and six boards. For Kansas, Suzi Raymant added 17 points and 13 rebounds.

Senior guard Jill Morton became the 17th Lady Card to score 1,000 career points with her first basket against Maryland Eastern Shores. With 17:11 left in the first half, Morton connected on a three-point field goal from the right corner to make history. Morton finished the game with 19 points, hitting 5 of 5 from the three-point line, in just 20 minutes.

Maryland Eastern Shores kept the game close in the first 9 minutes, until Louisville opened a 10-point lead behind a three-pointer by Stacey Hillman at the 11:07 mark. The Lady Cards led by as many as 24 and went into the break with a 50-28 lead.

The second half belonged to the Lady Cards. They outrebounded the Lady Hawks 50-24 and scored 35 points off the Hawks' 27 turnovers.

Senior forward Alison Bass led the Lady Cards with 20 points and three steals. Hillman added 17 points, and sophomore Kara Kessans added 10 points. Center Shamika Ingram pulled down a career-high seven rebounds and Jenny Knight dished out nine assists.

The Lady Hawks' Nicole Council led all scorers with 29 points, including 9 of 10 from the line.

The Bellarmine Lady Knights stayed with the Lady Cards throughout most of the first half. At the 11:44 mark, the Lady Cards took the lead. Even with the lead, Louisville could not pull away until Morton started her first half flurry.

Morton converted on a three-point play the old-fashioned way. The next trip down the floor she connected on two free throws and later in the run made a driving scoop shot.

"Jill got the ball in her hands and took over," said co-head coach Martin Clapp. "We need to look for Jill and get her shots; she's as good as we've got in our league."

The Lady Cards opened the second half with a 13-6 run to make it 58-35 and put an end to any hope that Bellarmine had for an upset. Louisville held as large a lead as 31, on two separate occasions in the second half.
