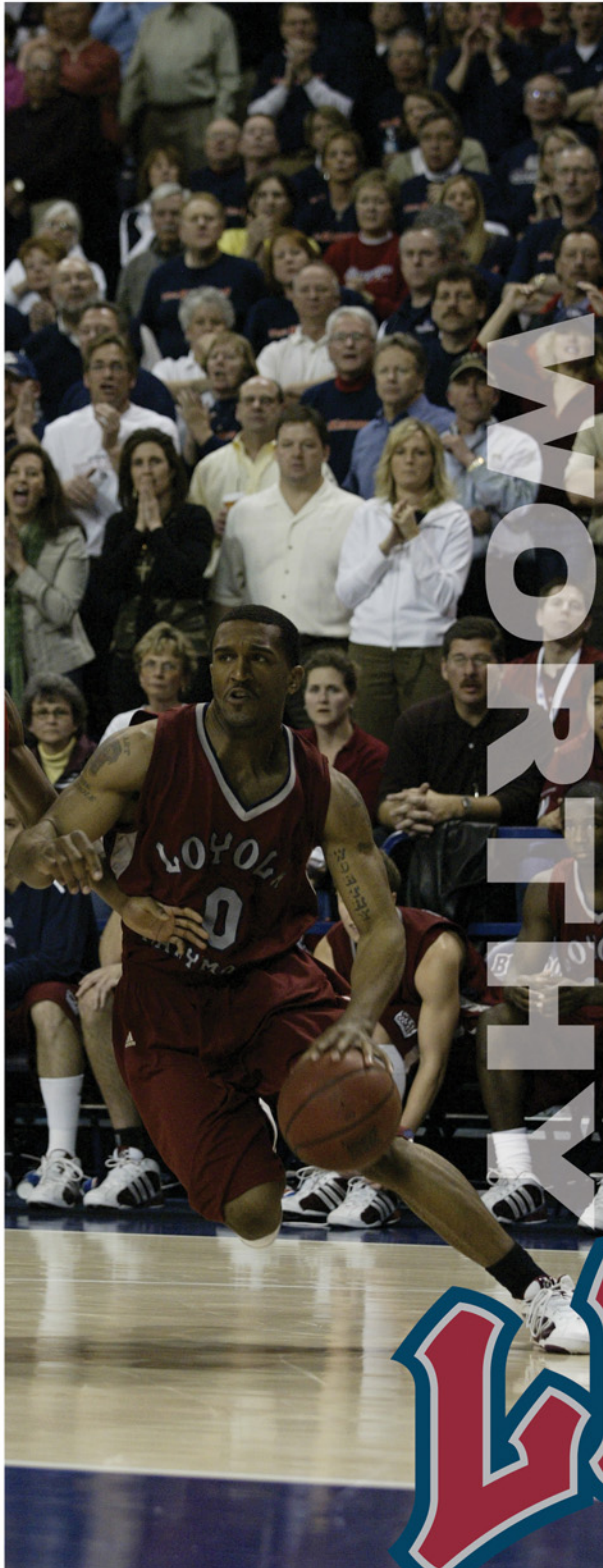

# 2006-07 Preview

## Lions Look to Worthy Knight For WCC Run

*After turning heads in Tention's first season, Lions will mix experience and youth to make another run at WCC title.*

What a first season it was for Rodney Tention and the Loyola Marymount men's basketball program.

After growing pains in non-conference saw them stuck with five setbacks coming at the buzzer and/or overtime, Tention stayed focused, kept things simple and knew his team would gel.

They did, and it came in a way LMU fans had not seen in almost two decades. The success has the Lions looking for even more for the upcoming 2006-07 season.

The Lions finished in second place in the WCC, tied with Saint Mary's at 8-6. It was the most WCC wins since the 1996 and 1992 seasons. With the number two seed in the WCC tournament, the Lions defeated Saint Mary's for the first semifinal win since 1989 and the first championship game appearance since that same year. In the title game the Lions fell to fourth-ranked Gonzaga on the Bulldog's home floor at the buzzer.

Entering in his second season, Tention will have to combine returning talent with the league's largest recruiting class of true freshman. The Lions return three starters and nine letterwinners from last year's squad. In the transition from 2005-06 to 2006-07, Tention will have to overcome the loss of five players, four of whom played four years in the program and leave having played 331 games together as Lions (Chris Ayer, Dustin Brown, John Haywood, Wes Wardrop) and another due to injury (Daryl Pegrum).

"The important part of replacing solid starters like Chris and Wes is to challenge everyone coming in to step up their game," said Tention. "We also have to challenge each of our returning players to become better as leaders. We will challenge the newcomers to put in the work that it takes to win at this level."

The Lions might have two of the better players in the WCC in seniors

**Brandon Worthy** (6-2, 205, Sr., San Jose, CA) and **Matthew Knight** (6-8, 240, Sr., Tasmania, Australia), a pair of WCC first-team selections who both scored their 1,000th career point in the WCC tournament. Both also earned WCC All-Tournament team honors, setting themselves as one of the best returning inside-outside tandems in the league and player of the year candidates.

"The leadership of Brandon and Matty is important. They are going to have to be really good senior leaders," said Tention. "They are no different than any of the higher profile players. They are going to get a lot of attention from our opponents and they will not be able to do it themselves."

The 2005-06 season was his first injury free campaign for Worthy, a fifth-year season working on his graduate degree, since he was a freshman in 2002. In the final half of WCC play and in the tournament, Worthy's stock rose as one of the better all-around players in the league.

"The last 10 games of the season, Brandon really got into the groove of the offense. This system is good for him because it opens up the floor and allows him to run, drive and create free throw opportunities," said Tention. "We need Brandon to really lock in this season, he and Matty. Teams are going to double on Matty, get in Brandon's face. They have to keep battling mentally at a high, high level."

The San Jose native was second on the squad in scoring with 15 points per game while ranking in the top-five in the WCC in steals with 53 and assists with 130. In the last 11 games of the season he averaged 21 points, including 15 points, six rebounds and six assists in the WCC Championship. His aggressive play took him to the free throw line 197 times where he made 162 of them. Both numbers were second in the conference behind Adam Morrison. In the win over Pepperdine he tied a school mark from the free throw line by going 15-for-21 in the win.

While Worthy took over the last half of conference, the Lions most consistent player from start to finish was Knight. The stats the forward from Australia put up in 2005-06 put his name all over the LMU record books. He became the first player since Hank Gathers to average a double-double on the season, scoring a team high 16.2 points per contest and 10.0 rebounds per game. He had 17 double-doubles, a streak of six straight and

finished hitting 51.9 percent from the field.

### Tention's Keys to Success in 2006-07:

- All-WCC and possible player of the year candidates Brandon Worthy and Matthew Knight: their leadership of the team and how they handle being the focal point all season.
- How quickly the five players with experience in Tention's system gels with the seven players who no experience in the system.
- The other three returning players and their improvement from last year to the 2006-07 season.
- The transition of the five freshmen to the college game.



"Matty did some great things for us last year and he has to do it better this year," said Tention. "If he can get his free throw percentage up to 70 percent, he is a 20-10 type player. He understands the offense and is powerful on the block. It is my job as a coach to get him better from 15 to 18 feet. If he does that, he will be a very complete player."

Joining Worthy and Knight as a returning starter will be redshirt junior **Jon Ziri** (6-2, 200, Jr., Tempe, AZ). The fourth-year player from Arizona was one of the biggest surprises of 2005-06. After being inserted into the starting line-up in the fourth game of the season, Ziri became a jack-of-all-trades for the Lions. Ziri finished the season averaging 25.3 minutes, up from eight he averaged the year prior. He averaged 5.8 points, 4.3 rebounds while earning 72 assists and 47 steals, which was second on the squad.

Also returning in 2006-07 for the Lions will be senior **John Montgomery** (6-1, 175, Sr., Menlo Park, CA) and sophomore **Marko Deric** (6-9, 230, So., Perth, Australia). In his fifth-year as a Lion, Montgomery proved big off the bench. He played in all 30 games while averaging 14.4 minutes a contest, both personal highs. The back-up point guard provided steady play in crunch time for Tention, dishing out 63 assists, hitting 14 three-pointers with 19 steals. As for Deric, he played in 21 games on the year. He showed improvement throughout the season and finished averaging five minutes on the season.

"JZ (Ziri), Monty and Marko have to get better. They understand their role and what they should be doing," said Tention. "We really have five guys who know the system and seven who are brand new. Our season will hinge on when they gel together. They will come together. It is a matter of how soon. How soon will we have to stop relying on our five returning players is a big question to our season."

One of those seven who will be new to the system is former starter **Damian Martin** (6-2, 200, Jr., NSW, Australia). The fourth-year player from Australia was forced to serve a medical redshirt season in 2005-06 due to a torn Achilles

tendon suffered while playing the Australian National Team. He was never able to practice for the Lions in Tention's first season.

"I am really not worried about Damo," said Tention. "He has played at the college level before and he competes at such a high level, he will be able to pick-up the system. We need him to get more confident in his shooting."

In his first two seasons, Martin played in 57 games, starting in 36 of them. He averaged 27 minutes with 4.3 points per game. He added 173 assists and 93 steals to rank among the leaders during both seasons.

In addition to the experience, Tention signed five true freshmen to letters of intent heading into the season. **Max Craig** (7-0, 260, Fr., Quebec, Canada), **Shawn Deadwiler II** (6-3, 175, Fr., Chandler, AZ), **Mason Maynard** (6-9, 220, Fr., Glendale, AZ), **Terron Sutton** (6-9, 230, Fr., Los Angeles, CA) and **Brad Sweezy** (6-6, 195, Fr., Westminster, CA) will all join the Lions this coming season.

Sutton, who played locally for Price High School, was the CIF Division-VA Player of the Year. Joining Sutton in earning CIF honors was Sweezy, who was an All-CIF Division-III first-team selection. Maynard and Deadwiler, both from Arizona, earned all-region and all-state honors, while Craig comes to the Lions from St. Thomas More Prep and plays for the Canadian national program.

"We addressed some of our needs with this freshman group," said Tention. "We added size in the front court and added depth, quality depth, at every position. I like the fact that we have good size with three guys over 6-9. All five bring different aspects to the team. But all five come from great high school programs and love to compete."

With the bar already raised after just one season, possibly its best returning tandem since the late 1980s, a group of incoming talent capable of big things, and the simple, uptempo approach the players seem to love for second-year coach Tention, the success of year one might pale in comparison to the second year come tournament time.

# Rodney Tention

When Rodney Tention arrived on the campus of Loyola Marymount University as the 23rd head coach of the men's basketball program in 2005, many things had not changed in the conference he once played in. As a familiar face to those in the West Coast Conference, Tention was well-known as one of the many reasons the WCC is among the top in Division I basketball.

In his first season at the helm of the Lions he added to that reputation.

All Tention did in his first season as an NCAA Division I head coach is lead the Lions to levels of success that have not been seen in 17 years. Tention took over the Lions and led them to a second place finish in the WCC and an appearance in the WCC Tournament Championship.

Prior to his arrival, the Lions had not had a winning record in the WCC since the 1995-96 season, had not advanced to the championship game of the WCC tournament since 1989, and had finished last in the WCC at 3-11 the year prior to his arrival.

After a learning curve of a non-conference season that saw the Lions drop five games at the buzzer or in overtime, Tention's uptempo style finally took hold and has set the table of success for year's to come.

Tention helped LMU to an 8-6 WCC mark in his first season, the most WCC wins since 1991-92 and 1995-96. The second place finish was the best since that same 1996 season. With the second seed in the NCAA tournament, the Lions earned a win in the semifinals for the first time since 1989 and advance to the WCC title match for the first time since Hank Gathers and Bo Kimble last led them there in that '89 year.

In addition, Tention had three players (Brandon Worthy, Matthew Knight, Wes Wardrop) earn first-team All-WCC honors. It is only the third time in program history the Lions had three first-team members of the All-WCC team, the first since 1990. In addition, Knight and Worthy earned WCC All-Tournament honors for leading the Lions in the WCC tournament, the first all-tournament selections since 1997.

The success in his first season at LMU came as no surprise to those who have followed the San Francisco alum. Tention played three seasons with San Francisco and joins the Lions after eight seasons as an assistant at the University of Arizona.

Tention has been no stranger to success. In 10 seasons at the NCAA Division I level, Tention has helped coach teams to 10 straight postseason appearances, including nine trips to the NCAA tournament. He has spent the last eight seasons under Lute Olson where he worked primarily with the perimeter players while helping with scouting reports, game day preparation and was one of the key players in Arizona's nationally-renowned recruiting efforts. In his time at Arizona, the Wildcats posted a record of 206-56 (.786).

Tention is familiar with LMU and the WCC as he graduated from the University of San Francisco in 1988 after playing three seasons with the Dons. "It is fantastic to return to the WCC. I love the conference, and I loved it when I was in it. I follow my alma mater and I know the guys in the conference well. LMU is a special place and this is a special conference," said Tention. "This league is full of very good coaches and it is going to be a challenge."

Prior to his arrival in Tucson, Tention spent six seasons at the College of Notre Dame in Belmont, Calif. He spent three years as an assistant for the Argonauts from 1991-94, recruiting the talent that led the school to its first NCAC playoff appearance in 1994, and three years (1994-97) as the head coach while the program transitioned from the NCAA Division II level to the NAIA.

Before heading to the College of Notre Dame, Tention served as an assistant at the University of South Florida in Tampa from 1989-91 where the team made back-to-back postseason appearances, including to the NCAA West Regional First Round in 1989-90 after the Bulls won the Sun Belt Conference tournament. In two seasons with South Florida, the Bulls went 39-21 (.650), including a 20-win season in his first season.

They are currently known as Notre Dame de Namur University and are NAIA.

He received his start in the collegiate coaching ranks as an assistant coach at Skyline Community College in San Bruno, Calif., during the 1988-89 campaign in which the team captured the Coast Conference Championship.

While at USF, Tention averaged 10.5 points and 4.3 rebounds in his three-year career at USF, where he was a two-year captain and the team's most valuable player. He played for Jim Brovelli, who recently served as an assistant coach with the NBA's Denver Nuggets. Tention's first season in 1985-86 with USF was cut short when he fractured his elbow after dunking a ball in a game against San Jose State. The Dons were 4-1 at the time of his injury and he was given a medical redshirt for the season. The following year he recovered in a big way as he was an All-WCAC Honorable Mention selection, ranking second in assists with 5.2 per game and second in steals with 2.2 per game.

Tention's final season at USF might have been his best as he once again earned All-WCAC Honorable Mention honors. He ranked 24th in the league in scoring (11.0), setting a career high with 308 points. He also ranked fifth in assists (3.8) and fourth in steals (1.9) in the same season the Lions finished a perfect 14-0 in league play and 28-4 overall.

Tention competed in the junior college ranks at Grossmont Community College and was the squad's captain and MVP of the Pacific Coast Conference and an All-State selection after averaging 14 points, eight assists and five rebounds per game during the 1984-85 season. He set the single season record in assists with 259 in 1985, averaging 8.1 per game.

He started his collegiate career at the Air Force Academy in 1983-84 where he played for former WCC coach Hank Egan. As a true freshman he played in all 27 games, starting in 23 for the Falcons. He averaged 6.9 points and 3.9 rebounds per game and led the team in steals with 32 and had a season and team high eight assists in a single game.

Tention received a bachelor's degree in sociology from the University of San Francisco in 1988 and earned a master's in public administration from the College of Notre Dame in 1995. He and his wife, Rebecca, have two sons, Justice and Miles.



## ASSISTANT COACH • 7th SEASON

## Brian Priebe

Brian Priebe will enter his 14th season as an NCAA Division I men's basketball coach and seventh at Loyola Marymount University. Priebe spent five seasons at Eastern Washington before coming to LMU for the 2000-01 season and is in his second season with Head Coach Rodney Tention.

Priebe and the rest of the Lions' staff in their first season together at LMU, helped the Lions earn second place in the WCC and its first WCC Tournament title game appearance in 17 seasons.

Priebe will continue to coordinate the recruiting efforts of the LMU program, a similar role he held at Eastern Washington. LMU's first recruit with Priebe, Sherman Gay, became the first LMU player to earn West Coast Conference Defensive Player of the Year honors in 2004. In addition, Priebe helped recruit players who own more than 20 records in the LMU history books. While at EWU, Priebe helped sign Alvin Snow, the state of Washington 4A Player of the Year, and Eddie Lincoln, the 3A Player of the Year. It was the first time in school history the Eagles signed a Washington Player of the Year.

In addition to his recruiting, Priebe is the position coach for the perimeter players where he has shown he is a quality teacher of the game. In six seasons four of his players have earned accolades within the West Coast Conference, including Marcus Smith (All-WCC Honorable Mention), Brandon Worthy (two-time All-WCC), Damian Martin (WCC All-Freshman team) and Wes Wardrop (first-team All-WCC).

Priebe also serves as LMU's academic coordinator. The Lions had Smith and Pablo Machado named to the WCC Academic All-Conference team, also a first since 1997. In 2003 and 2004 Jason Dickens joined the list of Academic All-WCC selections at LMU. In the recent report released by the NCAA, the LMU men's basketball program earned an APR of 1000, a perfect score. In addition, the Lions have been earning their degrees. In six seasons, 18 of 20 (94%) LMU seniors have graduated. At EWU, he had 16 Academic All-Big Sky performers and one academic All-America team selection.

Priebe is a 1995 graduate of Washington where he spent two seasons (1993-95) as the senior student assistant for former Washington Head Coach Bob Bender at the Pacific-10 school. Following his bachelor's degree in history at UW, he completed his master's degree in athletic administration at EWU in 1997 while serving in his assistant role. Prior to his collegiate coaching experience, Priebe was the head coach of the South Puget Sound BCI (1994), an assistant varsity coach at Snohomish County Christian High School (1992-93) and the head varsity coach for the Cascade High School AAU Team (1992-94). He also brings a wealth of camp experience, serving as a director of the EWU camps (1996-99), the Kelowna (B.C. Canada) High School Camp (1996), co-director of the University of Washington Camp (1993-95) and Gary Payton's Basketball Camp (1993-95).

Professionally, he has been an NABC member since 1995 and served on the National Assistant Coaches Committee from 2000-03. Active in the community, Priebe serves as an elder and board member at the Del Rey Hills Evangelical Church locally.

The 33-year-old Priebe and his wife Kristen have three daughters, Anna, Maya, and Sara. The family resides in Westchester, three blocks from the University.

## ASSISTANT COACH • 2nd SEASON

## Calvin Byrd

Like the rest of the Loyola Marymount men's basketball coaching staff, Calvin Byrd brings a successful background to the Lions' program. Byrd enters his second season at Loyola Marymount after spending four seasons at the University of the Pacific. Byrd is no stranger to the WCC as he coached two seasons at the University of San Francisco before joining the Tigers.

Byrd and the rest of the Lions' staff in their first season together at LMU, helped the Lions earn second place in the WCC and its first WCC Tournament title game appearance in 17 seasons. He is in his eighth year as an assistant coach at the NCAA Division I level. Throughout

his career, success has followed Byrd. As an assistant his teams hold a record of 133-103 (.563) overall and are 75-55 (.576) in conference play.

While at Pacific the last four seasons, the Tigers achieved unmatched success. Byrd was part of the staff that led the Tigers to back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the second round in 2004 and 2005. The 2004-05 season was the best in school history as the Tigers went 27-4, knocking off Pittsburgh in the first round. During his four years at Pacific, the Tigers had three 20-win seasons and won more than 65 percent of their games, posting a record of 72-38.

Byrd was responsible for off-campus recruiting, working with athletic performance and conditioning, wing player development and other on-court assistant coaching duties at Pacific. He also was the Tigers' academic coordinator.

Prior to Pacific, he was at USF from 1999-2001. At USF, Byrd was the Dons off-campus recruiting coach and the team's academic coordinator. Byrd was also in charge of equipment and travel at USF, in addition to scouting opponents and on the court coaching. The Dons went 31-27 in his two years with the program. After a standout career at Villanova University, Byrd played professional basketball in the Atlantic Basketball Association and in Switzerland.

He began his coaching career as an assistant coach at his alma mater, St. Joseph Notre Dame High School in 1996. Calvin was a McDonald's All-American in 1989 at St. Joseph's. After two years at the high school level, Byrd moved on to his first NCAA Division I coaching job, at UC Irvine during the 1998-99 season.

Calvin and his wife Jodie live in Westchester with their daughter Alexa, and son Miles.

## ASSISTANT COACH • 2nd SEASON

## Steve Wachs

Steve Wachs made his return to his alma mater in 2005-06 and enters his second season as an assistant coach for the Lions. After six seasons as the top assistant at Cal Poly Pomona, Wachs returned to LMU after graduating in 1996 with a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology.

Wachs and the rest of the Lions' staff in their first season together at LMU, helped the Lions earn second place in the WCC and its first WCC Tournament title game appearance in 17 seasons. The success at LMU was also no surprise for Wachs, as he is yet another assistant that comes from a successful background.

Wachs was part of six straight winning seasons for the Broncos, including three consecutive 20-win seasons and appearances in the NCAA Tournament. Last year, Wachs helped Cal Poly Pomona to one of the most successful seasons in school history as they advanced to the NCAA Division II Elite Eight with a 24-7 record.

In the 2003-04 season, the Broncos earned a 21-7 record and made their second straight appearance in the NCAA Division II playoffs, which was a first for the program. It was also the first time Cal Poly Pomona has recorded consecutive 20-win seasons in the program's history as they were 23-7 in 2002-03 when they captured the NCAA Division II West Region championship and advanced to the national quarterfinals for the first time since 1964. The Broncos claimed a record of 103-40 (.720) in Wachs' five seasons.

He has served as the team's recruiting coordinator, bringing some of the best players in school history, including the California Collegiate Athletic Association Player of the Year and the All-West Region MVP. He has also served as the team's academic coordinator, coordinated the team's film exchange program and directed the Cal Poly Pomona Summer Basketball Camp. In addition, he taught classes in the University's Psychology and Sociology Department.

Prior to his six years at Cal Poly Pomona, Wachs earned his Masters of Social Work from the University of Southern California in 1998. He has an emphasis in community organization, planning and administration.

During his four years at LMU, he served as the men's basketball team's administrative assistant (1996-97) and as team manager (1992-96). He assisted the Lions in scouting opponents, coordinated the summer camps and film exchange program. His tenure was spent with coach John Olive.

# #0 Brandon Worthy

**Briefly:**

Brandon Worthy enters his fifth and final year at Loyola Marymount University. A two-time All-WCC performer, Worthy will be a candidate for Player of the Year in the West Coast Conference in 2006-07.

**2005-06 Season Notes at LMU:**

Worthy earned first-team All-WCC in 2006-07 as he ranked ninth in the conference in scoring at 15.0 points per game. He led the Lions in scoring in both of the WCC tournament games, scoring 19 against Saint Mary's (3-5-06) and 15 against Gonzaga (3-6-06) on his way to All-Tournament honors. On the season he also ranked third in assists (4.33), third in steals (1.77), fifth in free throw percentage (.822) and second in assist/turnover ratio (1.59). In conference play, he averaged 17.1 points per game, ranking eighth. His 5.07 assists per WCC contest led the league while ranking seventh in steals with 1.64 per contest. The fourth-year junior from San Jose scored his 1,000th career point in the win over Saint Mary's, becoming the 27th player in LMU history to join the 1,000-point club. In his career he now has 1,015 points (12.7 per game), 280 rebounds (3.5 rpg), 272 assists (3.40 apg), and 134 steals (1.68 spg). In LMU history, he ranks 26th all-time in scoring and eighth all-time in steals. His 162 free throws made this season was second most in the WCC in 2006 and is ranked ninth all-time for a single season in LMU history, just three behind Mike Yoest in 1987 and replaces the 149 he had as a freshman in 2003. His 376 in his career is fifth all-time at LMU. This season he has a career-best eight games with 20 or more points, setting a career high with 32 points against Saint Mary's (1-23-06). He added 27 more against the Gaels in the second meeting (2-27-06) and 19 in the WCC Semifinals to give him 78 points in three games against SMC. Also this season he posted a 23-point effort in the home win over Pepperdine (2-11-06), going 15-for-21 from the free throw line. The 21 attempts are the second most in LMU history. He had nine games this season where he was perfect from the charity stripe, hitting 8-for-8 in the final regular season game against the Gaels (2-27-06). He also set a career-high with nine assists at San Diego (2-6-06). In league play he scored double digits in 11 of the 14 game, earning six of his eight 20-point games in that stretch. He added five or more assists in eight of those games, going nearly 2-to-1 on assists to turnovers in the WCC. Against conference foes, he went 67-for-156 from the field, hitting 11-for-33 from the three-point line. He finished the season hitting a three-pointer in each of the last six games, including a 4-for-5 effort in the WCC tournament. To go with his points in the tournament, he put together impressive numbers. In the win over Saint Mary's he went 7-for-16 from the field, 2-for-3 from long range with four rebounds and three steals. Against Gonzaga is line read like this: 15 points, six rebounds, six assists, one steal and one turnover.

**2004-05 Season Notes at LMU:**

Played another abbreviated season thanks to knee surgery on Dec. 29 following the Virginia game. He still finished the season second on the team in scoring with 11.8 points per game and was ranked 20th in the WCC. He also finished third on the team in steals with 38, and ranked second in the WCC with an average of two per game. On the season he finished 12-for-27 from the three-point line, good for third all-time in LMU history for a single season while ranking seventh in the WCC in shooting at 51.0 percent. His 3.74 assists per game ranked fifth. He also placed second on the team in free throws (65) and attempts (86). After taking a season off due to injury, he played a team-high 30 minutes in first game in over a year in win over Monmouth (11/20/04). He finished with nine points, six rebounds, three assists and a career-high five steals. The following game, a win over Northern Colorado (11-24-04), he had first double-digit game since March 1, 2003 11 points in just 20 minutes. He then broke out with the best game of his young career at the time against UC Riverside (11-27-04), playing 29 minutes, with 26 points, eight assists and five steals. He also had five rebounds and hit 9-for-9 from the free throw line while establishing a career-mark going 3-for-4 from three-point line. He continued to be a difference maker for the Lions as he went a perfect 5-for-5 from the field for 15 points in win over Denver (12-1-04), adding four assists, three steals and five rebounds. In the win over Long Beach State (12-4-04) he went 10-for-12 from the free throw line, scoring all 10 points from the line, leading the team with five assists. In showdown with No. 16 Washington (12-12-04) he went 7-for-11 from the field and led team with 18 points, 10 in the final five minutes. He added seven assists and two steals. Suffered knee strain against Virginia (12-23-04) and did not return until he missed nine games. Made his return and played 22 minutes off the bench in win over Pepperdine (1-29-05). Worthy had best game since returning from injury, hitting 8-for-9 from the field for 19 points, including 3-for-3 from three against San Diego (2-3-05). Against Saint Mary's (2-17-05) he scored 14 points on 6-for-10 shooting with three assists, four rebounds and two steals in 21 minutes. The following

week at Pepperdine (2-26-05) he scored 16 points with six assists and five rebounds with two steals with no turnovers.

**2003-04 Season Notes at LMU:**

Suffered a broken bone in his right hand in the final exhibition game and did not play in the regular season for the Lions... granted a medical redshirt year at the conclusion of the season... was named team captain in the fall and prior to season-ending injury remained a team leader throughout the season.... leadership off the court crucial to Lions' winning season.

**2002-03 Season Notes at LMU:**

Worthy had a record first season of collegiate basketball for the Lions, averaging 11.0 points per game, which ranked him fourth all-time as a freshman in LMU history. His 342 points also ranked fourth all-time as a freshman, earning him West Coast Conference Honorable Mention honors. Worthy was also second on the squad with 43 steals, third with 71 assists and fourth with 99 rebounds. He capped the season fourth in the WCC in free throw percentage, hitting on 149-of-181 from the charity stripe (82.3 percent), ranking 10th all-time in LMU history, replacing Ed Bento (1962), in free throws made. In his collegiate opener against Loyola Chicago (11-22-02), he set the freshman record for points in a debut with 24 while adding a team-high six rebounds. He was 10-for-11 from the free throw line. At the Great Alaska Shootout against Montana (11-29-02) he finished with eight points, going 6-of-6 from the free throw line, hitting four straight in the final minute to secure the win. He began his freshman season hitting 26-for-29 free throws (.897) through four game. He continue his hot shooting from charity stripe against UC Irvine (12-4-03), going 9-of-10 from the free throw line and 3-of-4 from field for team-high 15 points. At home against Long Beach State (12-14-02) he finished with 14 points in 11 minutes off the bench, hitting 8-of-9 from free throw line while adding two steals and two rebounds. The game against Cal State Northridge (12-19-02) marked his first start of career, scoring 12 points on 4-of-6 shooting. In the win over Portland (2-6-03) he played a team-high 30 minutes off the bench to score 14 points, hitting 10-of-10 from the free throw line while adding seven rebounds, two assists and three steals. In the upset over Gonzaga he played 19 minutes and finished with eight points off the bench, hitting 6-of-6 free throws, including two in the final seconds to clinch win. At Santa Clara (2-13-03) he had a game-high 19 points in 23 minutes, going 9-for-11 from charity stripe while playing with the flu.

# #5 John Montgomery

**Briefly:**

John Montgomery has played two seasons at LMU after redshirting his true freshman year in 2002-03. He will enter his senior campaign in 2006-07. After playing as a walk-on his first three seasons, Coach Tention awarded him with a scholarship in 2005-06 and he lived up to the task.

**2005-06 Season Notes at LMU:**

Montgomery played in all 30 games and earned career-bests in all most every stats category. Montgomery finished the regular season averaging 3.0 points, 2.1 assists and 0.6 steals per contest. He went on to set career-highs with 89 points, 63 assists, 19 steals, 24 rebounds, 14 three-pointers and 26 total field goals. As a back-up point guard he finished fourth on the team in three-pointers and assists. From the field he hit 31.0 percent, going 26.4 percent from the three-point line and 79.3 percent from the free throw line. He scored five points against Washington (11-25-05) and had what was then a career-high five assists against UC Santa Barbara (12-3-05). He played 18 minutes against Northern Colorado (12-17-05) and finished with career-best eight assists, four points and a steal. He played a career-best 28 minutes with seven points against Hawaii (12-20-05) and then set a career high with nine points at UNLV (12-29-05). He played the final five minutes to help LMU earn win over Santa Clara (1-21-06), scoring six points in 20 minutes. He continued his role as a clutch player by closing wins in the final minutes as he played 21 minutes with six points in win over Saint Mary's (1-23-06). He added seven points with two assists and two steals against Pepperdine (1-28-06) and had eight points with two assists on two three-pointers against Santa Clara (2-25-06). In the WCC tournament he played 12 minutes in the win over Saint Mary's (3-5-06) and 14 against Gonzaga (3-6--6). He went on to score four points with two steals.

**2004-05 Season Notes at LMU:**

Montgomery finished his sophomore season averaging two points a game in eight appearances. He had ACL surgery following the season as he tore his ACL in practice leading up to the WCC tournament. Leading up to that campaign he had 3.2 points and 1.2 rebounds to go with 17 assists and seven steals while playing in all five games during the Lions' Europe tour. During the regular season he made first appearance of the season with two assists and two rebounds in five minutes of action in win over Northern Colorado (11-24-04). He then played two minutes off the bench against Northern Arizona (12-29-04) and 12 minutes with a three-point field goal at Utah State (12-30-04). Against the Aggies he added two assists. He then played two minutes at Minnesota (1-3-05) and six minutes with four field goal attempts at home against Santa Clara (1-20-05). He had a season-high seven points on 2-for-3 shooting, including a three-pointer against Saint Mary's (1-22-05). He hit 2-for-3 from the charity stripe, with three assists, two rebounds and a steal. He played 12 minutes and went 2-for-3 from three-point line, scoring six points with a steal and a rebound on the road against Santa Clara (2-19-05).

**2003-04 Season at LMU:**

In his first season of action as a redshirt freshman, he appeared in 21 games for the Lions, averaging 6.9 minutes per game with 13 assists and four steals. He was key off the bench in the Lions' wins over Central Connecticut State, Cal State Fullerton, Colgate and Northern Colorado. Made first collegiate appearance, playing four minutes with a defensive rebound and an assist in the win over Binghamton in the Mohegan Sun Classic (11-29-03). Montgomery continued strong play off the bench, scoring first collegiate points on a three-pointer in championship game of the tournament against Central Connecticut State (11-30-03). He played 12 minutes with a rebound, assist and steal in the win. In the return home, he played two minutes in win over Cal Poly (12-3-03), play three minutes in homecoming game against UNLV (12-

6-03), four minutes in double overtime win over Denver (12-16-03) and two minutes at Long Beach State (12-23-03). He played some big minutes for the Lions in the win over Cal State Fullerton (12-30-03), earning two assists in the six minutes on the floor. He then had a season-best 15 minutes with two assists and two points in the win over Colgate (1-2-04). He played 10 minutes with two steals and a rebound in solid effort against Gonzaga (1-10-04) to open conference play. His play continued to improve with 19 minutes, an assist, steal, two rebounds and two points against

Portland (1-12-04). He played seven minutes in win over San Diego (1-15-04), nine minutes at Santa Clara (1-17-04) and then had best game of season in win over Northern Colorado (1-20-04). Against the Bears he scored what was then a career-high eight points in 20 minutes. He added three assists and four rebounds. The next game he played eight minutes against rival Pepperdine (1-24-04) and then five minutes with two assists and a rebound in win over Santa Clara (2-12-04). He played two minutes with an assist in victory over San Diego (2-14-04) and played two minutes in road win over Saint Mary's. He came up big in WCC First Round win over Portland (3-5-04), playing seven minutes with an assist and then played four minutes with another assist in WCC Quarterfinals against Pepperdine (3-6-04).

# #14 Matthew Knight

**Briefly:**

Matthew Knight enters his third season at Loyola Marymount and is a two-time All-WCC performer. He earned first-team honors as a sophomore, becoming the first player since Hank Gathers to average a double-double. Will enter the 2006-07 like his teammate Brandon Worthy, a preseason Player of the Year candidate in the West Coast Conference. His experience also extends beyond LMU as a member of the Australia under-20 team that won the World Championship and for the under-23 team in the 2005 World Championships. This summer he toured with the Australian National Team, playing with and against the world's best players.

**2005-06 Season Notes at LMU:**

Matthew Knight had the type of season that made him a Player of the Year candidate in the West Coast Conference and earned him first-team All-WCC honors. Knight ranked seventh in the WCC at 16.2 points per contest and led the WCC in rebounds at 10.0 per game. In WCC play he increased those averages to 17.6 ppg and 10.6 rpg, ranking fifth and first, respectively. Knight became the 22nd member of the 500-rebound club with five rebounds against Saint Mary's (2-27-06), as he now totals 528 (6.9 rpg) in his career at LMU. He also has scored his 1,000th career point against Gonzaga (3-6-06) in the WCC tournament to make him the 28th player in LMU history with 1,000 points. He now has 1,005 points (13.2 ppg). In addition, he is just the 11th player in LMU history to have 1,000 points and 500 rebounds. As a junior, Knight led the WCC with 17 double-doubles, giving him 19 in his career. This season he had stretches of six and four consecutive double-doubles. He scored in double figures in every WCC game this season and had a career-best 32 points and 18 rebounds against Long Beach State (11-30-06). In addition to scoring and rebounding, he ranked fourth in the WCC in shooting percentage (.519), ninth in blocked shots (0.77), first in offensive rebounds (3.73) and second in defensive rebounds (6.23). The tone for his season started in the first game, going for 22 points and 10 rebounds, his third career double-double against BYU (11-18-05). He went to the free throw line a record 15 times against Montana (11-21-05), hitting another personal record of 10 and then became just the seventh player in LMU history to score 30 or more points with 15 or rebounds as he went for 32 and 18 against Long Beach State. In the second meeting against Montana (12-6-05) he had fourth straight double-double with 22 and 11 (12-6-05). Skipping to conference play, he opened with 22 points, nine rebounds and three steals in win over San Diego (1-7-06). He followed that with his seventh double-double (22 and 15), going 11-for-15 from the field in double overtime win over USF (1-9-06). In those two games he hit 75 percent in two games from the field to earn WCC Player of the Week honors. In the trip to the Pacific Northwest he had his eighth double-double, this one coming against Portland (1-14-06) with 22 and 11. He was 8-for-14 from the field, making him 29-for-42 in conference play to start the season. He then went for 18 and 11 on the road against No. 6 Gonzaga (1-16-06) and had 10th double-double with 10 and 10 against SCU (1-21-06). He earned his 11th with 19 and 11 while holding SMC's Daniel Kickert to just six points in the win over the Gaels (1-23-06). He ran his streak of double doubles to six with 18 and 16 against Pepperdine (1-28-06). In the win over USF (2-4-06), he had the streak snapped but still managed 22 points and six rebounds. He was back to his old ways with double-doubles against USD (2-6-06) with 15 and 13 and then had 19 and 13 against Pepperdine (2-11-06). On the season he had 15 or more points to go with 15 or more rebounds in five games this season, the most by any one player in a single season since Hank Gathers, including 15 points and 16 boards in win over Saint Mary's (3-5-06) in the WCC semifinals. He added 11 points and 11 rebounds against Gonzaga (3-6-06) to earn WCC All-Tournament team honors, first player to do so since 1997.

**2004-05 Season Notes at LMU:**

Proved to be the go-to-guy for the Lions all season and for his efforts he earned All-West Coast Conference honorable mention honors as a sophomore. He finished the 2005 regular season averaging a team best 15.4 points and 5.9 rebounds per game while starting all 28 games. He led the team in minutes with 28.9 points per game and led the team in scoring in 18 of the 27 games. He was only player to start every game this season and finished the season ranked 10th in the WCC in scoring and 11th in rebounds. His 10.5-point turn around on the season was been the best in the WCC as he scored in double figures in all but four games. He ranked sixth in the league in shooting percentage (.512) and was second in the league in offensive rebounds (2.82). Knight's 20 points on 6-for-11 shooting from the field and a career-best 8-for-8 from the free throw line against Saint Mary's (2-17-05) was his eighth 20-point game of the season. Knight earned his second straight double-double with 19 points and a career-best 12 rebounds against Northern Arizona (12-29-04). He

was the player since Ime Oduok in 1994 to have back-to-back double-double games. He had a then career-high 20 points on 7-of-10 shooting in win over Northern Colorado (11-24-04). He then led the team with 17 points in career-best 33 minutes in home win over Denver (12-1-04). On the game he was 6-for-9 from the field while adding an assist, a block and four rebounds. He then exploded for the Lions in win over San Diego State (12-18-04) to become the first Lion to score 30 points in a regular season game since Jan. 1998. Knight finished with 30 points on 13-of-21 shooting, going 4-of-4 from the line with a then career-high nine rebounds. Continued torrid pace at Virginia (12-23-04)

with first career double-double, scoring a game-high 27 points with 10 rebounds. He went 11-for-19 from the field, 5-of-6 from the free throw line and two assists and two blocks. In conference play he led both teams with 20 points and nine rebounds at Gonzaga (1-13-05), going 10-for-18 from the field, grabbing five offensive rebounds. He had his sixth 20-point game of the season against Santa Clara (1-20-05) on 8-for-14 shooting and then scored 25 points on 10-for-16 shooting at San Diego (2-3-05). In that game he added eight rebounds and went five-for-five from the charity stripe. In win at USF (2-5-05) despite first half injury, scored game winning three-point play with 19 seconds remaining. He scored on lay-up and hit free throw to give Lions lead and the win while finishing with 12 points, five rebounds and an assist. Finished the game against Saint Mary's (2-17-05) with a quiet 20 points, hitting 6-for-11 from the field and career-best 8-for-8 from charity stripe.

**2003-04 Season Notes at LMU:**

Knight was slowed by ankle surgery following the World Championships in late July and missed the first six games of the season. The first-year player from Australia averaged just under six minutes per game while playing eight of the Lions first 16 games. However, in 10 of the Lions' last 11 games he averaged 21.4 minutes per game, scoring 8.0 points and 4.7 rebounds per game. The shortened season continued with a concussion suffered against the Waves, keeping him out of another game against Saint Mary's. He finished fifth on the team in scoring against WCC opponents with 5.8 points and fourth with 3.9 rebounds per game. On the season he averaged 4.9 points and 3.5 rebounds per game, ranking 11th all-time among freshman at LMU with 3.50 rebounds per contest. Played first game as a Lion against the UCLA Bruins (12-13-03).

**High School:**

Played for the Australian Institute of Sport, which is similar to the prep schools in the United States... played in hometown of Burnie, Tasmania before joining AIS... was selected to play for Australia's junior national team in the 2003 World Championships held in Thessaloniki, Greece, July 10-20... played in 13 of 17 games in the first half of the AIS season, leading the team to a 14-3 record... averaged more than 11 points per game while shooting 50 percent from the field (64-of-128) in his first season with AIS... also averaged 6.8 rebounds per game (88) in an average of 23 minutes... was among the team leaders in blocks with 10 and steals with 11... played for the Tasmania under-16 team in 1999 and 2000, the under-18 team in 2001 and 2002, and the under-20 team in 2003... was a member of the All-Australian Junior Camp in 2002 and 2003 while also playing for the Australian Junior Men's Team Oceania Qualification Series in 2002.

Matthew James Knight was born on May 31, 1985 in Burnie, Tasmania, Australia... he is the son of Debbie and Scott Knight... father played professional Australian Rules Football... has one sister, Rachel... supports Make A Wish Foundation in Australia... an Elementary Education major.

## Briefly:

Damian Martin is in his fourth year at Loyola Marymount University and after serving a medical redshirt in 2005-06 he will be a redshirt junior. In two seasons he has 93 steals while averaging a team-best 27.8 minutes for players the last two seasons. Was on the list of possible players to represent Australia in the next summer Olympics. # #23 Jon Ziri

## Briefly:

Jon Ziri is in his fourth season of collegiate basketball at LMU after serving as a redshirt in 2003-04. Earned valuable playing time as a freshman, playing in 25 of 29 games in his first season of action and then came through for the Lions as a redshirt sophomore when he was inserted in the line-up after three games.

## 2005-06 Season Notes at LMU:

In his third season with the program and just his second of action, Ziri was placed into the starting line-up after the third game of the year and he never left. His consistent all-around play helped the Lions win eight of their first 10 in WCC play. Ziri finished the season averaging 6.0 points per game (fifth on the team) with 4.3 rebounds, 2.4 assists, and 1.6 steals. He is third on the team in rebounding and in conference games he averaged 5.6 per game to rank 11th in the WCC. He also ranked 10th with 2.86 assists and an impressive second with 2.14 steals per game in WCC contests. After averaging just over 13 minutes a game in the first three games, he would finish the season averaging 25.3 minutes. He earned first career start against South Alabama and played 26 minutes with four points and five boards (11-28-05). He then scored a career-best 16 points in win over UC Santa Barbara (12-3-05), going 6-for-12 from field and 4-for-8 from 3-point line. He chipped in nine points with three assists and three rebounds against USC (12-10-05) before getting 10 points, three assists and two rebounds against Northern Colorado (12-17-05) and ended non-conference with 14 points on 6-for-12 shooting against San Diego State (12-31-05) and had his second straight game with seven rebounds as he had seven two nights earlier against UNLV (12-29-05). Opened conference with eight points, five assists, two steals and five rebounds against San Diego (1-7-06), and on the next night he had six points, six rebounds, six assists and three steals in the win over San Francisco (1-9-06) in a career-best 39 minutes. He continued stellar play in WCC contests with 11 points, eight assists and three assists in 30 minutes against Portland (1-14-06). He averaged 8.3 ppg, 6.3 rpg and 4.2 apg in WCC play after three games. He had another solid outing against USF (2-4-06) in the second meeting, scoring six points, with eight rebounds, two assists, a block and two steals. His consistent play continued with eight points and seven rebounds in the win over San Diego (2-6-06). He had six points (two three-pointers) with seven assists, eight rebounds and three steals in win over Pepperdine (2-11-06) and scored 11 points with seven rebounds, two assists and two steals against Santa Clara (2-25-06). He had only two points in WCC semifinal win over Saint Mary's (3-5-06), but came through with five rebounds, five assists and a steal. To end the season he scored six points with four rebounds and two steals in WCC championship against Gonzaga (3-6-06).

## 2004-05 Season Notes at LMU:

Ziri played in 25 games as a redshirt freshman and averaged 8.2 minutes per game. He finished with 2.4 points and 1.2 rebounds per game while hitting 11 three-pointers. He started his playing career on the Europe tour and scored 32 points in five games (6.4), earning 10 steals, second on the team. He made his debut against Northern Colorado (11-24-04) with 10 minutes off the bench, scoring first field goal and hit a free throw for three points. He added three rebounds. In the win over Denver (12-1-04) he played in second game, playing eight minutes and had an assist and two rebounds. In win over Long Beach State (12-04-04) he came off the bench for three minutes, earned two rebounds and two assists. Against 16th-ranked Washington (12-12-04) he hit first three-pointner of career and finished with five points in 17 minutes with

four rebounds and an assist. He came off the bench in victory over San Diego State (12-18-04) for best game of young career to date, scoring 11 points, hitting on 4-of-9 from the field, 2-of-6 from long distance and a free throw. He played 17 minutes in win over Colgate (12-21-04) with an assist and three rebounds. Scored five points with an assist and a block in Northern Arizona (12-29-04) victory, going perfect from the field. He played 12 minutes and scored five points with an assist and a steal

against No. 20 Gonzaga (1-13-05) and then at home against Saint Mary's (1-22-05) he played 15 minutes with nine points, three assists, two steals and no turnovers. He was 4-for-9 from the field. He gave the Lions nine big minutes off the bench late in come back win at San Francisco (2-5-05), scoring five points with two rebounds and two steals.

## 2003-04 Season Notes at LMU:

Served his redshirt season at LMU... earned first action as a Lion during European Tour... impressed coaches with play, averaging 6.4 points and 4.2 rebounds per game during the five-game tour... was second on the team with five three pointers, hitting three in the first game win... finished with 13 points in that game... added seven assists and had a game-high seven rebounds in game two... also had four steals in that game one.

## High School:

Ziri is a 2003 graduate of Marcos De Niza High School in Tempe, Ariz... a two-year letterwinner while playing all four years for head coach Dave Stark... Ziri led Marcos De Niza to the 5A State Title as a junior in 2001-02 with a 60-49 win over Highland... he made three three-pointers and scored 16 points in the championship game... he finished his junior campaign averaging 17 points and nine rebounds per game... was a McDonald's All-American nominee and earned second-team all-state honors... Ziri was named to the All-Southeast Valley and All-Central Region teams following last season's state championship... followed junior season with a record senior year... was named All-American while taking home all-state, all-league, all-conference and all-city honors in his final season... was named Central Region Co-MVP.

Jonathan Bernard Ziri was born Oct. 21, 1985 in Mesa, Ariz... he is the son of Tia Cass and Joseph Ziri... he has a sister, Amina, and a brother, Joe, who plays basketball for Mesa Community College... a double major in Business Administration and Sociology.

## #20 Terron Sutton

### Briefly:

Terron Sutton joins the Loyola Marymount men's basketball program for his first season of collegiate basketball. Sutton will come to LMU after playing four seasons at Price High School, helping the team to four straight CIF Championships heading into his senior season.

### High School:

He earned first-team All-CIF honors in his final season, taking home the highest honor in CIF as he was named the Player of the Year in the Southern Section of Division-VA in the state of California. He led his team to their eighth straight Southern Sectional Championship, defeating Renaissance 66-27 in his soon to be home Gersten Pavilion for the title. He continued to show his versatility with seven points, nine rebounds and five blocks in the blow out win. Price finished the season 25-8 overall and 8-0 to win their league. Sutton led his team in one blowout after another in the playoffs, defeating Pioneer Baptist 90-19 in the second round, a 62-30 win against Joel John Scholastic in the quarterfinals and a 60-52 win over Delphi Academy in the semifinals. In the State Championships, Price defeated San Pasquel 93-39 in round one but then lost to Sante Fe Christian 72-53 in the second round.

In his junior season he exploded into a role of team leader, earning first-team All-CIF and first-team all-league. As a 6-5 freshmen, Sutton started his career at Price without much basketball experience. He managed to make the varsity squad, gaining experience primarily as a back-up. Sutton saw his playing time and his size increase in his sophomore season. He averaged five rebounds a game in his second season and then in his junior season he had grown to 6-9 and became Price's main inside defender. Sutton became a full time starter and averaged eight points and nine rebounds per contest. In addition, he allowed Price to run an aggressive trapping defense to help Price to the state championship. His career-best just happen to be in the title game, as he earned a double-double with 12 points and 11 boards.

### Briefly:

Max Craig joins the Loyola Marymount program for his first season of collegiate basketball. A Canadian native, Craig played for St. Thomas More School in Oakdale, Conn.

### High School:

Craig, who is from Montreal, Canada, helped the Canadian Junior National Team to a 3-3 record in the 2006 Albert Schweitzer Turnier tournament, which featured 16 teams from around the world in an international competition, this past April.

Craig brings size to the Lions program. At 7-0, 260 pounds, the French-Canadian was a force for the Canadian Junior National Team this April. He scored the team's only double-double in the 109-81 win over China. He finished with 10 points and 10 rebounds in just 15 minutes off the bench to lead Canada.

A Dean's List student at St. Thomas More School in Oakdale, Conn., he speaks French as his primary language. He helped the team to a 16-5 record and a semifinal appearance in the Class A Finals. Recent Lion graduate Dustin Brown also attended the prep school. St. Thomas More School competes with other prestigious New England prep schools as a member of the Southeastern New England Athletic Conference (SENE) division of the New England Prep School Athletic Conference (NEPSAC).

## #50 Mason Maynard

### Brief from Coach:

Mason Maynard joins the Lions program for his first year of collegiate basketball. Joins the team from Mountain Ridge High School in Arizona.

### High School:

Maynard comes to the Lions from Mountain Ridge High School in Glendale, Ariz. His senior season saw him become one of the top players in the 5A Northwest region, leading the entire region in rebounds and blocks while ranking sixth in scoring. He finished the year averaging 9.1 rebounds per game, nearly two more per game than the next player in the rankings. He added 13.3 points and 47 blocks to his resume.

At 6-9, 220 pounds, Maynard brings more size to the Lions line-up. While leading Mountain Ridge to a 16-12 overall record and a 6-6 mark in 5A-Northwest play, Maynard tallied 11 double-doubles while putting up solid numbers in the process.

Against North Canyon he scored 21 points with 11 rebounds and seven blocks to lead Mountain Ridge to a 61-46 win. Some of his other double-double games included a 20-point, 12-rebound performance in the first meeting against O'Conner and then a 22-point, 18-rebound outburst in the second meeting.
