## BRIEFLY

The 2007-08 season was a roller coaster ride for LMU, who emerged with a perfectly level 15-15 overall record and 7-7 mark in West Coast Conference play for their fifth consecutive season at or above .500. A relatively young squad, the Lions displayed their growing pains from game-to-game, winning no more than three games in a row but never dropping more than three in a row, either. With 11 roster players returning and a strong recruiting class entering the fray for 2008-09, LMU is set for many more winning seasons.

## LMU AT THE WCC TOURNAMENT

LMU made its 15th appearance at the West Coast Conference Tournament, earning a #4 seed and a first round matchup with Saint Mary's. The Lions started strong and held a 40-37 halftime lead but went cold in the second half, falling to a 71-67 defeat. The Lions are now 9-13 all-time at the WCC Tournament. They were the tournament champions in 2004 while also reaching the final in 2001 and 2007. LMU's loss in the 2008 championships marked the first time since 2002 that the Lions had not advanced past the first round.

## SEASON REVIEW

Coming into the 2007-08 season, LMU was aware of its faults: a young squad and lack of explosive scorer. Even so, hopes were high with a talented sophomore class and several players who could step up on any given night. That would be the story of the season as the Lions were led in scoring by seven different players in the season's first 12 games and had three players average more than 10 points a game, although no player averaged more than 11. In the end, LMU rode its highs and lows to an even 15-15 record, tying for third place in the West Coast Conference at 7-7.

The year featured several memorable victories. The first came during LMU's first win of the season, when senior Amanda DeCoud raced the length of the floor in the final five seconds and hit a runner at the buzzer for a 61-59 win at UNLV. Late-game heroics were also in order in the WCC opener at Portland on January 10 when freshman Renahy Young made the game-winning layup with 12 seconds remaining for a 73-71 victory.

On November 24, the Lions won their home tournament for the first time since 2003, defeating Indiana State 74-51 in the final of the Ayres Hotel Thanksgiving Tournament. A month later, LMU and Cal State Bakersfield locked up in an instant classic that saw the Lions prevail 95-90 in double overtime. The game was the first multiple-overtime game in LMU history and several single-game top-five marks were set. Once conference play began, the focus turned to Head Coach Julie Wilhoit, who recorded her 300th career victory on February 2 with a 68-64 win at San Francisco. She got #301 five days later

when the Lions poured it on in the second half to overcome a 10-point deficit and hand Gonzaga its first loss in conference.

## DECOUD, YOUNG NAMED ALL-WCC

Senior Amanda DeCoud and freshman Renahy Young each received honorable mention All-West Coast Conference recognition when the conference office announced the annual post-season awards Monday. The honor is the second for DeCoud while Young also earns a spot on the All-Freshman Team.

The guard duo provided a lift for the Lions on offense this season, finishing one-two on the team in scoring and assists. Young is the first Lion to be named to the All-Freshman Team since current senior Valerie Ogoke was honored in 2004-05 and the first LMU freshman on the All-WCC teams since Bryn Britton was honorable mention in 1998-99. For DeCoud, she was also named to the honorable mention team last season.

## WILHOIT NOTCHES 300TH WIN

Already the winningest coach in LMU women's basketball history, Head Coach Julie Wilhoit reached a personal milestone on February 2 at San Francisco with her 300th career victory. In her 20-year coaching career, her breakdown includes 88 wins in five seasons at IUPUI, 33 wins in two years at Pitt-Bradford, and 182 wins in the last 13 seasons at LMU.

Since taking over an LMU program that had only five winning seasons in its first 14 years, Wilhoit has guided the Lions to five more winning campaigns, including each of the last four years, and the 2003-04 WCC Championship.

## DYNAMIC DUO

In senior Amanda DeCoud and freshman Renahy Young, LMU had its own version of that Hollywood tradition of buddy movies with the older veteran teaming with the young upstart. The pair found a groove playing together that has brought aggressiveness from the guard position and lifted the Lions during their WCC run.

Between the two of them, DeCoud and Young had 34 double-digit scoring games and reached double figures in the same game 10 times, including six during WCC play. LMU was 8-2 when both players score 10-or-more points.

Against Cal Poly, Young and DeCoud proved a lethal combination. Young led the way with 23 points with DeCoud just behind with 21 in the victory. It was the first time since January 31, 2004 that LMU had two players score 20-plus points in the same game (Kate Murray, 28, and Adrienne Slaughter, 20).

## HOME SWEET HOME

LMU's victory over Gonzaga was its eighth triumph at Gersten Pavilion this season, topping the seven home wins recorded in each of the three previous years. The Lions went 10-5 at home in 2007-08, including a five-game home

winning streak from November 24-December 28, to post their eighth consecutive season of above-.500 home ball.

## WINNING MONTHS

LMU's 4-3 mark in the opening month of play was its second consecutive winning November and eighth of the last nine Novembers that the Lions have posted a winning mark. With a 4-4 ledger in December, 3-3 in January, and 4-3 in February, LMU registered 13 consecutive months of .500 or better dating back to previous seasons. Unfortunately, that streak came to an end when LMU lost its two games in March 2008.

## WINNING NON-CONFERENCE SLATE

With an 8-7 record through the non-conference schedule, LMU posted its second consecutive winning season outside of WCC play. Under Coach Wilhoit, LMU has recorded a winning non-conference record seven times, including six of the last eight years.

## LIONS INK WCC TOP RECRUITING CLASS

All-Star Girls Report has rated the LMU women's basketball 2008 recruiting class as the 58th-best in the nation and tops among West Coast Conference schools. The Lions will welcome four new faces in 2008-09 in freshmen Alex Cowling, Monica DeAngelis, and Mikah Maly-Karros and transfer Candice Nichols.

"I am extremely excited about this incoming class because for the first time, we did not want to bring in anyone but these young women and, more importantly, they did not want to go anywhere besides LMU," Head Coach Julie Wilhoit said. "When we first met with each of them, we walked away knowing that these were players that we wanted to coach."

Cowling is a 5-11 guard/forward from Benicia. The 24th-ranked guard and 73rd-ranked overall player in the country by Hoopgurlz/Scout.com, Cowling racked up the Player of the Year honors in 2007, earning no less than four such awards: Sports Focus NCS Player of the Year, Bay Shore Athletic League MVP, *San Francisco Chronicle* East Bay Player of the Year, and *Contra Costa Times* Player of the Year. She led St. Patrick's/St. Vincent High School to its first appearance in the state championship, averaging a double-double of 25.2 points and 12.1 rebounds per game. DeAngelis comes to LMU from Windward High School in Santa Monica. In 2006, DeAngelis helped the Wildcats to a Southern Section championship, earning First Team All-State Division IV honors along the way. A three-time First Team All-League and All-CIF performer, DeAngelis averaged 21.4 points, 3.0 assists, 3.0 rebounds, and 3.0 steals per game as a junior. A 5-7 guard, DeAngelis was picked by *Sporting News* for the 2007-08 preseason Honorable Mention All-American Team. She enters her senior season ranked seventh in the state of California in career three-point baskets made with 324 in her three seasons. DeAngelis is also an excellent student,

being named to the Dean's List all three years. She is a member of the National Arts Honor Society and the Academic Honors Society. Maly-Karros is the most local of the quartet, coming out of Manhattan Beach's Mira Costa High School. Like DeAngelis, *Sporting News* has selected her as a preseason Honorable Mention All-American. A three-time First Team All-Bay League performer, Maly-Karros was an Honorable Mention All-American selection by Street and Smith after averaging 21.1 points, 16.2 rebounds, 3.4 blocks, 3.1 steals, and 2.4 assists per game as a junior. Last year, the 6-1 forward led the Mustangs to the CIF Division IA Finals, earning Bay League Most Outstanding Player accolades. She has been named to her class-specific All-State team each season by Cal Hi Sports and has been awarded All-CIF status three times. In the classroom, Maly-Karros is a Principal's Honor Roll student and a Scholar Athlete.

The final piece of the LMU recruiting puzzle is Candice Nichols, a freshman who transferred to LMU from Washington in January. A 5-10 guard from Carson, CA, Nichols was a standout player at Long Beach Poly, earning two-time CIF First Team honors. She was a two-time First Team All-Moore League selection and was named to the CIF All-Freshman Team in 2004, All-Sophomore Team in 2005, and All-Junior Team in 2006. She helped lead Poly to the state championship as a junior and the CIF Southern Section title as a sophomore. In 2007, Nichols was the #83 player ranked nationally by Hoopgurlz.com. Due to NCAA transfer rules, she will have to sit out the remainder of the 2007-08 season and the first half of 2008-09 before appearing for the Lions. She will then have three seasons of eligibility remaining.

LMU's recruiting class was ranked the eighth-best among western schools, trailing only seven Pac-10 programs. The ratings were conducted in December, before it was announced that Nichols would be joining the Lions.

## LIONS JOIN PUSH TO "THINK PINK"

On Thursday, February 7 against Gonzaga, LMU teamed up with the Women's Basketball Coaches Association and over 600 high school, junior college, college, and AAU teams in the "Think Pink" initiative, designed to raise awareness for breast cancer. Fans who wore pink were admitted for \$2 and the first 500 fans were given specially-designed "LMU Think Pink" t-shirts. The game was also "Pack the House Night" as LMU attempted to set a new single-game attendance record. Although they fell short of the attendance goal, a victory over previously-unbeaten Gonzaga and the awareness generated for breast cancer resulted in an all-around memorable night.

## LIONS CLAIM AYRES HOTEL THANKSGIVING TOURNAMENT TITLE

LMU's quest for its first Ayres Hotel Thanksgiving Tournament title since 2003 was fulfilled as the

Lions steamrolled their way through their home tournament to clinch their fourth crown in the tourney's 11-year history. Defense was the key to the championship, as the Lions held both their opponents under 25% shooting to win by an average margin of 26.5 points. In Friday's opener against Jackson State, the LMU defense limited the Lady Tigers to 3-for-22 (13.6%) shooting in the first half to take a 30-14 halftime lead and cruised to a 69-39 victory. Sophomore Lisa Helmers had a game-high 12 points on four three-pointers while senior Amanda DeCoud added 11 points, five assists, and four steals. Redshirt freshman Aleyse Evans chipped in with 11 rebounds. Saturday's final pitted the Lions against an outstanding Indiana State squad that had knocked off ranked Vanderbilt the week before. LMU showed no fear, taking it to the Sycamores early. ISU missed 16 of its first 18 shots as LMU jumped out to an 18-point lead in the first half. Indiana State would get no closer than 14 and LMU had its first home tournament title in four seasons with a 74-51 win. Helmers again led the way with 16 points and another four from downtown to earn All-Tournament honors. DeCoud was named the tournament Most Valuable Player after another solid performance with nine points, six rebounds, five assists, and three steals. Senior Valerie Ogoke chipped in her second double-double of the year with 12 points and 10 rebounds to go alongside Evans' second straight 11-rebound game.

## LMU VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

LMU faced two opponents ranked in the national top-25 this year, visiting #12 Cal and #22 George Washington. Losses in both games dropped the Lions to 0-8 against ranked teams since 2002.

## AN HISTORIC NIGHT

Fans in attendance at LMU's victory over Cal State Bakersfield witnessed one of the greatest games in program history. In addition to being the first double-overtime game LMU has ever played, the teams and individuals combined to feature on several records lists. Among them are:

- LMU's 95 points are tied for the third-most in program history.
- LMU's 60 rebounds were the sixth-most in a game ever.
- Jenna Sybesma's 29 points tied for the second-most by a junior and she came one free throw away from LMU's 10th 30-point performance.
- Senior Valerie Ogoke's 18 rebounds tied for the second-most in a game and were the most ever by an LMU senior. They were also the most by a WCC player this season.
- The 185 points scored by both teams was the third-highest combination ever, trailing only the 190 points against UC Riverside on December 1, 1981 (LMU 91, UCR 99) and the 188 at San Diego on February 21, 1991 (LMU 95, USD 93, OT).

## LMU PLACES SECOND AT HILTON LAX HOLIDAY TOURNAMENT

The second incarnation of the LMU/Hilton LAX Holiday Tournament brought excitement to Gersten Pavilion over the Winter Break. The first day's play saw Kansas State defeat Arkansas-Little Rock 52-40 in the opener to advance to the championship game. The Wildcats would have a long wait before their opponent was determined as LMU and Cal State Bakersfield waged a duel for the ages. The Lions started well, jumping out to a 13-2 lead by making six of their first eight shots. The Roadrunners recovered and the teams traded shots in a game that featured 10 ties and 10 lead changes. CSUB led 64-61 with 2:21 remaining in regulation until junior Jenna Sybesma, who had never attempted a three-pointer in her three seasons at LMU, calmly knocked down a triple to tie the game. Neither team scored again as the game went into overtime. LMU opened the first OT with a 6-1 run, only to see Bakersfield come back to tie it again when Christine Kepenekian stole an inbounds pass with seven seconds left and feed Ke'Airra Jones, who sank a baseline jumper as time expired to send the game into a second OT. LMU again opened up a five-point lead in the second OT but the Roadrunners again came back to tie. Freshman Renahy Young untied it with a three-point play and the Roadrunners had one last chance but missed a breakaway layup when they were down two as LMU celebrated a 95-90 victory. Sybesma led five LMU players in double figures with career-highs of 29 points and 14 rebounds for her first career double-double. Senior Amanda DeCoud (16 points, eight assists), sophomore Lisa Helmers (16 points), Young (11 points), and junior Cassady Moore (10 points) also reached double figures while senior Valerie Ogoke grabbed a career-high 18 rebounds.

The excitement and drama from Friday's play was absent on Saturday as the exhausted Lions and Roadrunners could not keep up with their rested opponents. UALR claimed third place with a 69-54 victory over CSUB in the consolation game while Kansas State took home the tournament title with a 70-47 win over the Lions. DeCoud had 10 points and six assists to lead LMU while Sybesma and Helmers earned All-Tournament honors.

## LIONS IN SEASON OPENERS

For the fifth consecutive season, LMU opened its campaign away from Gersten Pavilion. The loss at Boise State was the fifth in a row to start the season and ran the Lions' losing streak when starting the year on the road to nine games.
