2005-06 SEASON

MEN'S BASKETBALL - Picked 12th in the preseason Big East Conference coaches poll, the men's basketball team finished fourth during regular season, earned a first-round bye in the conference tournament and a number seven seed in the NCAA Tournament. The team's 20 victories were the most since 2002-03. Senior Steve Novak was one of four unanimous All-Big East Conference first team selections and was named to the final ballot for the John R. Wooden National Player of the Year Award. Freshman Dominic James was selected as the conference's Rookie of the Year, and joined fellow freshman Jerel McNeal on the Big East's All-Rookie Team.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL - The Golden Eagles advanced to the Championship game of the Women's National Invitation Tournament, dropping a 77-65 decision at Kansas State. MU finished with a 22-11 record, including a 9-7 mark in its first season of play in the BIG EAST. Christina Quaye and Carolyn Kieger were each selected to the All-BIG EAST Second Team, while Krystal Ellis was named to the conference's All-Rookie team. Additionally, Kieger ended her career as Marquette's all-time leader in assists, compiling 694 in her outstanding four-year playing career.

WOMEN'S SOCCER - The Marquette women's soccer season posted its most successful campaign in history in 2006. The Golden Eagles regular-season highlight came in a 4-1 win over no. 5 Notre Dame. Paced by that effort, Marquette soared to as high as no. 6 in the polls and advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time in history. Head coach Markus Roeders was named BIG EAST and Great Lakes Coach of the Year while sophomore Laura Boyer was named Third Team All-American by Soccer Buzz.

MEN'S SOCCER - Marquette tabbed Louis Bennett as its head coach in the off-season. In Bennett, Marquette gets 10 years of head coaching experience with five NCAA tournament berths, the past four years leading his team to the second round of the tournament.

WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY - The nationally-ranked Golden Eagles finished third in their first-ever BIG EAST Championship in Bronx, N.Y. Six Marquette runners placed in the top 30 of the race. After a sixth-place finish at the NCAA Great Lakes Regional, the Golden Eagles made their sixth consecutive appearance at the NCAA Championship in Terre Haute, Ind. MU finished 29th overall.

MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY - Led by David Henderson and Jeremy Williams, who finished 35th and 29th respectively, Marquette finished eighth at the BIG EAST Championship in Bronx, N.Y. and advanced to the NCAA Great Lakes Regional in Bloomington, Ind., where it placed 20th overall.

VOLLEYBALL - The women's volleyball team registered a winning record, 17-13 overall, marking the first time in Division I history Marquette volleyball has recorded back-to-back winning seasons. Sophomore Kimberly Todd was named First Team All-BIG EAST, while senior Theresa Coughlin was a Second Team selection.

GOLF - Led by a second place finish from senior Joe Weber, the Marquette men's golf team earned its highest finish at a conference meet in school history, coming in third. The senior laden team posted two victories during the year, capping one of the best seasons on record for the Golden Eagles. Despite having five seniors Nathan Colson, Mark Eldridge, Kyle Murphy, Steve Sass and Weber the team was balanced by its youth and should be as competitive in the future. Head coach, Tim Grogan, was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year.


MEN'S TENNIS - The men's tennis team had its finest season ever registering a program best 17-9 overall record and finished fourth at the BIG EAST Conference Championship. Eight men's tennis players capped the season with winning records.

WOMEN'S TENNIS - The women's tennis team nearly doubled its wins total from last season, posting an overall record of 9-17. The nine wins also mark the most wins since the 1999-2000 season. Erin Watkins led Marquette with 21 singles victories.

WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD - Marquette was 12th overall at the BIG EAST indoor championship. At that meet, Michaela Courtney finished second in the mile run, while also placing fifth in the 3,000m. Cassie Peller was fifth in the 1,000m. Courtney went on the break the school record in the mile, en route to qualifying for the NCAA championship in that event.

MEN'S TRACK & FIELD - The Golden Eagles finished 11th at the BIG EAST indoor championship. At that meet, Raymond Bratchett cleared 7'0" in the high jump, while Brent Des Roches was fifth in both the 3,000m and 5,000m runs.
