The Marquette University men's basketball program enters the 2009-10 campaign, it's second season under the direction of head coach Buzz Williams, poised to begin another successful chapter in the team's storied history. The Golden Eagles have advanced to the NCAA Championship in each of the past four seasons and own 25-win campaigns in each of the last two years. The program is in its fifth season in the BIG EAST Conference.

Roster Features Same Numbers, New Players

Marquette fans will see some familiar jersey numbers on the floor in 2009-10, but a majority of the faces wearing the Blue & Gold will be making their respective MU debuts.

Head coach Buzz Williams welcomes seven newcomers to campus this Fall and returns just one starter (Lazar Hayward) and six let-winners from last season's 25-10 squad.

The team's recruiting class is nationally ranked, but only one player (Jimmy Butler) besides Hayward saw more than 10 minutes per game on the court in 2008-09.

Hayward One Of League's Top Returnees

Senior forward Lazar Hayward, who has displayed significant improvement in each of his three previous seasons, enters his final campaign as one of the top returning performers in the BIG EAST Conference.

The Buffalo, N.Y., native finished among the league leaders in scoring (10th, 16.3 ppg.), rebounding (7th, 8.6 rpg.) and free throw percentage (4th, .820) last season. Among returning players, he is fifth in scoring and third in rebounding and free throw percentage.

Lundy Joins Staff, Monarch Moves Up Bench

Former High Point University head coach Bart Lundy is in his first season with Marquette as the director of basketball operations and Scott Monarch, who served in that role in 2008-09, moves up the bench this year as an assistant coach.

Lundy, who owns over 200 career victories at the collegiate level, directed HPU for six seasons and was also the head coach at Queens University at Charlotte for five years. Monarch worked as an assistant under Buzz Williams at New Orleans in 2006-07.

Hayward Claims USA Basketball Roster Spot

Senior forward Lazar Hayward became the 14th player in Marquette history to represent the University in international play for USA Basketball with his selection to the World University Games roster.

The World University Games is organized by the International University Sports Federation and held every other year. The 2009 men's basketball competition will take place July 2-12 in Belgrade, Serbia, with 24 men's teams expected to compete for gold. Eligible athletes for the USA team must be currently enrolled in a college or university and have remaining NCAA athletic eligibility.

University of Wisconsin head coach Bo Ryan has been selected by USA Basketball to serve as head coach.

Senior Class Leaves Mark In MU's Record Book

Three players (Jerel McNeal, Dominic James and Wesley Matthews) concluded their respective Marquette careers ranked among the program's top-10 all-time scorers and combined with Dwight Burke the most recent senior class has few peers.

McNeal finished as Marquette's all-time leader in points (1,985), games played (130) and steals (287). James was third in points (1,749) and second in assists (632). Matthews claimed eighth in points (1,673) and first in free throws made (549).

The four-member class combined to contribute 510 games played, 5,637 points, 1,978 rebounds and 1,376 assists while leading Marquette to 94 total victories and a pair of NCAA Championship wins in four appearances.

MU Returned To NCAA's For Fourth-Straight Year

Marquette made its fourth-straight appearance in the NCAA Championship and 27th overall in 2008-09, marking the first time since 1980 the program has advanced to the postseason four-consecutive years.

The 1980 appearance actually capped a 10-year run in the NCAA's, which included the 1977 National Championship squad. Legendary coach Al McGuire led MU to a 67-59 win over North Carolina in the title matchup that season, one of nine NCAA appearances during his tenure.

McNeal, Matthews Claim All-Conference Accolades

Senior guards Jerel McNeal and Wesley Matthews both earned All-BIG EAST accolades for their efforts in 2008-09.

McNeal was named to the All-BIG EAST First Team for the first time in his career, but the announcement marked the fourth-straight season he claimed league-wide recognition. McNeal was tabbed to the all-rookie squad as a freshman and to the all-league second team as both a sophomore and junior. He was also the BIG EAST Defensive Player of the year in 2006-07.

Matthews' All-BIG EAST Second Team recognition marked the first of his standout career at Marquette.

Golden Eagles Claim 10th BIG EAST Win, Again

MU claimed the team's 10th league victory of the season with the 73-59 decision over St. John's, reaching the 10-win mark for the fourth-straight year.

Marquette finished with 12 league victories, which marked the highest total since the program joined the BIG EAST.

Of the 16 teams in the BIG EAST since 2005-06, only MU and Pittsburgh have captured at least 10 victories in each of the the last four campaigns.

Recruiting Class Garners National Rankings

Marquette's first complete recruiting class under head coach Buzz Williams is a consensus top-25 group according to several national publications.

MU's seven newcomers (five freshmen, one junior and one sophomore) are ranked third by HoopScoopOnline.com and Hoopmasters.com, 14th by ESPNU.com, 16th by Rivals.com and 17th by Scout.com.

Each of the impressive accomplishments listed above, as well as numerous others, were recorded during head coach Buzz Williams' first season leading the Marquette University men's basketball program.

The Golden Eagles' performance in 2008-09 mirrored that of a program firmly established in the tenure of a successful head coach, not that of a team under the direction of a first-year mentor.

Williams directed MU to a 25-10 overall record last season, which included a school-record 12 BIG EAST victories. The Golden Eagles advanced to the second round of the NCAA Championship and were ranked among the nation's top-25 teams the entire campaign. A pair of players, Jerel McNeal and Wesley Matthews, claimed all-league accolades and McNeal also claimed All-America honors.

Off the court, Williams and his staff assembled a consensus top-25 recruiting class, a group rated as high as No. 1 in the country by HoopScoopOnline.com. The program's community service efforts have also reached new heights under Williams, highlighted by "Buzz's Bunch." This group, founded by Williams, focuses on providing opportunities for special needs children to attend games and summer camps. The Golden Eagles have also continued and strengthened their long-standing relationships with Children's Hospital as well as Special Olympics.

In 2007-08, Williams served as an assistant coach with the Golden Eagles in his first season at Marquette. MU concluded the year 25-10 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2003.

His coaching career has included stints as an assistant, associate head and head coach. He has nearly 15 years of experience at the NCAA Division I level. Williams has recruited and coached over 20 players who have earned all-conference accolades, including one league player of the year, two conference freshmen of the year and an Associated Press All-American (McNeal).

Williams arrived in Milwaukee after serving for one season as the head coach at the University of New Orleans. He guided the Privateers to a 14-win campaign in 2006-07 and his roster featured Bo McCalebb, the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. UNO claimed fourth place in the Sun Belt's Western Division and advanced to the league tournament quarterfinals. The squad claimed as many victories on the road that season as it had in the previous three seasons combined. His recruiting class for the 2007-08 season was ranked in the top 50 nationally by HoopScoopOnline.com.

Prior to UNO, Williams served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Texas A&M for two seasons (2004-05/2005-06) under head coach

Billy Gillispie. Both of his recruiting classes with the Aggies were ranked among the best in the nation and featured some of the top-ranked talent at the prep level. The squad made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 25 years in 2005-06 and the previous team posted the top turnaround in the nation, improving its win total in 2004-05 by 14 games compared to 2003-04.

Williams spent four seasons (2000-01/2003-04) at Colorado State, serving as an assistant the first three seasons before being promoted to associate head coach in 2003-04. Two of his recruiting classes were ranked among the 40-best in the nation, including the 2003 group, which was tabbed No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference.

Colorado State made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 13 years during his tenure and he was named one of the top assistants in the country by HoopScoopOnline.com. Williams was previously an assistant at Northwestern State (1999-2000), Texas A&M-Kingsville (1998-99) and Texas-Arlington (1994-98).

Williams signed the highest-rated recruiting class in the history of the Southland Conference while at Northwestern State. The Demons advanced to their first ever NCAA Tournament the following season and two of his recruited players were named all-conference, while one was tabbed Southland Conference Tournament MVP.

His accomplishments at Texas A&M-Kingsville include signing the 1998-99 Lone Star Conference Freshman of the Year and a third team All-America guard.

At Texas-Arlington, Williams recruited a Southland Conference Freshman of the Year and signed the first Academic All-American in the school's history. Williams was a student assistant coach from 1992-94 at Oklahoma City University where he assist-

The Van Alstyne, Texas, native earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Oklahoma City University in 1994 before completing his master's work in the same field at Texas A&M-Kingsville in 1999.

Williams is married to the former Corey Norman and the couple has two daughters, Zera (6) and Addyson (1), and two sons, Calvin (5) and Mason (3).

Colorado State-Pueblo (exhib.) 73 Marquette 94

MILWAUKEE (AP) -- Lazar Hayward scored 23 points and Jerel McNeal added 22, making new coach Buzz Williams a winner in No. 16 Marquette's 94-73 victory over Division II Colorado State-Pueblo in their season-opening exhibition game Saturday.

One of Marquette's three senior guards, Wesley Matthews, left the game late in the second half after he appeared to turn an ankle and had to be helped off the court. The severity of his injury was not immediately known.

Matthews scored 16 before the injury, and Dominic James added 11 as the Golden Eagles showed every indication that they'll continue to have the same kind of fast-paced, potent offense they were known for under Crean.

But poor free-throw shooting dogged Marquette on Saturday -- they were 10-for-16 in the first half and 66.7 percent for the game -- and the Golden Eagles allowed the ThunderWolves to avoid a first-half blowout with hot outside shooting.

The Golden Eagles' strong transition game took over in the second half, as Marquette opened up with a 16-8 run that included a 3-pointer and an alley-oop dunk by James and back-to-back fast-break layups by Hayward.

An acrobatic alley-oop layup by Hayward off a pass from McNeal put Marquette ahead 65-44, and Pueblo couldn't shoot its way back into contention.

Houston Baptist 64 No. 16/17 Marquette 95

MILWAUKEE (AP) -- Wesley Matthews scored a career-high 27 points and No. 16 Marquette rolled past Houston Baptist 95-64 Friday night in Buzz Williams' debut as the Golden Eagles' head coach.

Jerel McNeal had 20 points and Lazar Hayward added 19 points and 12 rebounds for Marquette. The Golden Eagles never trailed and broke open the game with a 14-0 spurt to start the second half.

Matthews added a career-high eight assists and five steals.

Gordon Watt led Houston Baptist with 17 points and Baron Sauls added 15.

Matthews and McNeal combined for nine points at the start of the second half, turning a 42-34 lead into a 56-34 cushion. Houston Baptist lost the ball five times and missed all four of its shots during the spurt.

Matthews, whose previous career high was 22 points, made 7 of 11 shots, including a pair of 3-pointers, and 11 of 12 free throws.

Marquette forced 25 turnovers and tallied 13 steals. James tied a career high with six steals. Jimmy Butler, a junior college transfer, had 10 points on 5-of-8 shooting.

Marquette, a guard-oriented team already lacking in size, played without two freshmen big men: 6-foot-10 center Chris Otule will miss several weeks after injuring his left foot in practice last week and 6-foot-7 forward Joseph Fulce is out with a knee injury.

Chicago State 87 No. 15/17 Marquette 106

MILWAUKEE (AP) -- Marquette scored its most points in almost 28 years, but the Golden Eagles' defensive performance in the second half of a 106-87 victory over Chicago State on Monday night left first-year coach Buzz Williams disappointed.

"It's not poor me, it's not pity me, I'm not trying to be a prophet or foresee the future, but we can't allow teams to score 51 points (in the second half) in our building," Williams said. "To be honest with you, you can't allow teams to score 51 points whether you're playing at a park or no matter what gym."

Wesley Matthews scored 26 points for the Golden Eagles (2-0), who last scored 106 points against Charleston on Dec. 1, 1980. He shot 7-for-14 from the field and made all 10 of his free throws to go with nine rebounds, three assists, two blocks and two steals.

Matthews had 27 points in the season opener and is one of the reasons the Golden Eagles have scored at least 90 points in consecutive games for the first time since the 1994-95 season.

"I think he's a lot more comfortable," said teammate Lazar Hayward, who scored 19 of his 21 points in the second half. "This offense is predicated on guys who can do a lot of different things. That's why he stands out a little more than last year."

Jerel McNeal added 17 points, six assists and four rebounds for Marquette.

MILWAUKEE (AP) -- Wesley Matthews scored 25 points and Lazar Hayward had a career-high 25 and 10 rebounds as No. 17 Marquette continued its dominance over Wisconsin-Milwaukee with a 100-80 triumph on Saturday.

Jerel McNeal had 22 points and five steals and Dominic James added 16 and eight assists for the Golden Eagles (3-0), who have won all 36 meetings between the two schools which are separated by four miles. Texas Southern 68 No. 15/15 Marquette 85

MILWAUKEE (AP) -- Jerel McNeal scored 20 points and Lazar Hayward added 18 to lead No. 15 Marquette to a 85-68 victory over Texas Southern on Tuesday night.

Marquette (4-0) failed to score 100 points for the first time in three games as the Golden Eagles struggled at times in the first half against Texas Southern (0-4). Marquette, which had averaged a Big East leading 100.3 points in its first three games, ended up with 19 turnovers.

Marquette turned it up on the defensive end, forcing 20 turnovers resulting in 29 points. The Golden Eagles had a total of 11 steals, led by McNeal with four. Wesley Matthews, who averaged 26 points in Marquette's first three games, had 13 and Dominic James added 11 points.

Marquette was bidding to set a school record of three straight games with scoring at least 100 points. The last time Marquette scored 100 points for two straight games was during the 1954-55 season when it beat Bowling Green and Detroit.

CHICAGO (AP) -- Wesley Matthews scored 17 points and No. 15 Marquette used a 20-0 first-half run Friday night to rout Northern Iowa 73-43 in the Chicago Invitational Challenge.

Playing its first game outside of Milwaukee this season, Marquette (5-0) cruised to victory before a small crowd at the Sears Centre. The Golden Eagles also got 15 points from Lazar Hayward and 13 from Jerel McNeal.

Northern Iowa (3-2) was led by Kwadzo Ahelegbe's 11 points.

After an initial feeling-out period, the Golden Eagles broke it open early with the 20-0 run, using a variety of shots and strong defense. During the spurt, Matthews hit a 3-pointer, Dominic James made two 3s' on either side of a timeout, Jimmy Butler followed in a miss and McNeal found the range on yet another 3-pointer on a pass from James.

Central Michigan 67 No. 25/rv Marquette 81

MILWAUKEE (AP) -- Marquette never practices shooting free throws. The Golden Eagles got all the work they needed at the line against Central Michigan anyway.

Wesley Matthews went 10-for-10 on free throws and scored 18 points, Dominic James added 15 points and No. 25 Marquette bounced back from its first loss with an aggressive defense that stymied the Chippewas in an 81-67 victory Tuesday night.

When that happened, Marquette went to the line, shooting 81.6 percent (31-of-38) in a game that featured 49 fouls and a plodding pace.

MILWAUKEE (AP) -- Jerel McNeal scored a season-high 26 points, leading No. 25 Marquette on a second-half comeback to beat in-state rival Wisconsin 61-58.

McNeal scored 19 of his points in the second half, including the go-ahead 3-pointer with 5:26 left. Marquette (7-1) survived a late 3-pointer and layup by Wisconsin's Trevon Hughes and some shaky free-throw shooting of its own to hold on in the final minutes.

Hughes' 3-pointer cut Marquette's lead to 58-54 with 1:20 left in the game. An errant Marquette pass then dribbled out of bounds to Wisconsin, but the Badgers' Joe Krabbenhoft stepped on the baseline on the other end to give the ball back to Marquette.

Lazar Hayward hit one of two free throws, but Hughes hit a layup to cut the lead to 59-56 with 25.9 seconds left. Maurice Acker and Hayward each hit only one of their two free throw attempts in the final 22 seconds, but the Golden Eagles held on to win.

Marquette trailed 33-27 at the half. But with Hughes in foul trouble and sitting out early in the second half, Marquette went on a 12-5 run to tie the game at 46 with just over 10 minutes left in the game — with all 12 points coming from McNeal.

The Golden Eagles had a chance to take the lead after a steal by Dominic James, but Hayward was called for an offensive foul on an aggressive drive to the basket.

Cincinnati 50 No. 25 Marquette 84

MILWAUKEE (AP) -- Jerel McNeal scored 26 points and hit a career-high seven 3-pointers as Marquette rolled to an easy 84-50 victory over Cincinnati on Sunday.

"He's already hard to guard," head coach Buzz Williams said. "But when he gets in a groove he becomes really hard to guard. And I think the thing that helps him is he had six assists, which is a high number for him."

Wesley Matthews added 17 points for Marquette (13-2, 2-0 Big East), which won its first two Big East Conference games for the first time since joining the conference in 2005. Marquette upset Villanova 79-72 Thursday in its Big East opener.

Cincinnati (10-4, 0-1 Big East), which struggled with shooting throughout the game, was led by Rashad Bishop and Larry Davis with 11 points each. The Bearcats top scorer, Deonta Vaughn, had been averaging 15.2 points per game, but was held to no points on Sunday as he missed all eight shots he took.

Marquette put the game away at the start of the second half with a 25-4 run. Lazar Hayward scored 11 of Marquette's first 13 points during that run, including three 3-pointers. Hayward finished with 16 points.

Rutgers 76 No. 18/15 Marquette 81

NEW BRUNSWICK, N.J. (AP) -- Wesley Matthews was unaware he set a school record with his 10-for-10 shooting, but was very conscious of the foul shot he missed when his Marquette team was watching a huge lead nearly slip away.

"You take it how you can get it," said Matthews after his 23 points and six rebounds helped No. 18 Marquette survive a furious Rutgers rally and take an 81-76 win Wednesday night. "It shouldn't have been a game like this, we [almost] blew a 21-point lead. That happens. It's the Big East, you're on the road."

Dominic James had 15 points and six assists and Jimmy Butler came off the bench for nine points for the Golden Eagles (14-2), who won their sixth straight in starting 3-0 in the Big East for the first time since joining the conference in 2005.

Rutgers (9-7, 0-3), which dropped its fourth straight, got 22 from Mike Rosario. The freshman helped shoot the Scarlet Knights back in it after a six-point first half in which he shot 0-for-6 from 3-point range.

Rosario made two 3-pointers during Rutgers run, and Corey Chandler added 19 points and seven rebounds for the Knights. J.R. Inman scored all nine of his points in the second half.

MILWAUKEE (AP) -- Jerel McNeal scored 26 points to lead No. 18 Marquette past No. 25 West Virginia 75-53 Saturday.

Dominic James added 17 points and Wesley Matthews scored all 13 of his points in the second half for the Golden Eagles (15-2, 4-0 Big East), who recovered from a rough shooting start against a physical Mountaineers team to take control in the second half.

Marquette took control with a 16-5 run down the stretch--and most of the Golden Eagles' points came at the free throw line, stoking the ire of West Virginia coach Bob Huggins.

With Marquette leading by 2, McNeal began the run with a 3-pointer at the 8:29 mark, earning a slap on the backside from coach Buzz Williams as he got back on defense.

PROVIDENCE (AP) -- No. 14 Marquette rallied from a 13-point deficit in the second half and beat Providence 91-82 on Saturday night in a game interrupted when Jonathan Xavier came out of the stands to protest the non-call.

Lazar Hayward scored 25 points, hitting the go-ahead 3-pointer with 2:10 left, and Jerel McNeal also scored 25 as Marquette (16-2, 5-0 Big East) extended the best start of its tenure in the Big East. The Golden Eagles last started 5-0 in the conference when they were a member of the Great Midwest in 1992-93.

WASHINGTON, D.C. (AP) – Marquette started running through "the gauntlet" Saturday, and the Golden Eagles overcame the first challenge with good ball-handling and 23 points from Wesley Matthews.

Matthews was 9-for-16 from the field, including a career-high five 3-pointers on eight attempts, and No. 10 Marquette opened the brutal homestretch to its regular season schedule with a 78-72 victory over Georgetown.

Jerel McNeal added 22 points, seven assists and six rebounds while playing all 40 minutes, and Lazar Hayward had 17 points and 11 rebounds for the Golden Eagles, who committed only six turnovers and shot 48 percent.

Marquette (23-4, 12-2) is chasing its first Big East regular season title, and the Golden Eagles will certainly earn it if they get there. Their final four games are against No. 1 Connecticut, No. 7 Louisville, No. 4 Pittsburgh and No. 24 Syracuse, prompting guard Dominic James to tell coach Buzz Williams "Here comes the gauntlet" after Tuesday's win over Seton Hall.

The Golden Eagles took the lead for good on Matthews' 3-pointer with 7:58 to play, but they couldn't build a lead bigger than six points until the game's final minute. In a vital possession, Marquette worked the shot clock to single digits before McNeal found Jimmy Butler for an open layup to make it 73-67 with 54 seconds to play.

No. 2/2 Connecticut 93
No. 8/10 Marquette 82

MILWAUKEE (AP) – Jim Calhoun's 800th career victory came thanks in large part to senior guard A.J. Price, who scored a career-high 36 points as No. 2 Connecticut beat No. 8 Marquette 93-82 on Wednesday night.

Jerel McNeal scored 26 points for the Golden Eagles (23-5, 12-3), who played most of the game without guard Dominic James who broke a bone in his left foot in the first half.

James played only four minutes, and the school announced after halftime that he broke the fifth metatarsal in his left foot. No timeline was given for his return. James, one of the Golden Eagles' trio of standout senior guards, has 1,749 points and is considered one of the Big East's top defensive players.

Maurice Acker picked up the majority of James' minutes running the offense, and the Golden Eagles kept rallying after Connecticut squandered several chances to run away.

After yet another Marquette rally, Price finally clinched the game by hitting a 3-pointer to put the Huskies ahead by eight points with 1:10 left in the game.

Trailing by 11 early in the second half after Price hit two 3-pointers and a jumper on three straight possessions, Marquette went on a 12-0 run that included two 3-pointers by Acker to take a 1-point lead with 12:07 remaining.

Price hit the clinching 3-pointer from the left wing with 1:10 remaining, then added two free throws to put Connecticut ahead 91-81 with 45.5 seconds left.

LOUISVILLE (AP) – Andre McGee finished with a season-high 16 points in 28 minutes as the Cardinals (23-5, 14-2 Big East) kept their hopes for a conference title alive by suffocating the Golden Eagles (23-6, 12-4) in a 62-58 victory, who hung tough despite playing without injured star guard Dominic James.

Louisville survived behind the play of McGee and forward Terrence Williams, who had 14 points, eight rebounds and seven assists.

Wesley Matthews led Marquette with 19 points, but Louisville harassed the Golden Eagles into a season-low 34 percent shooting while holding them to their second-lowest point total of the season.

McNeal, Marquette's leading scorer, managed just 10 points on 3-of-19 shooting, including 2-of-10 3-pointers. Lazar Hayward had 16 points and 10 rebounds for the Golden Eagles, but Marquette wore down just enough in the second half to let the Cardinals escape.

Marquette didn't fold, even without James, its senior star who broke his foot during a loss to No. 2 Connecticut last week. James didn't make the trip after having surgery, but had been in constant contact with Williams, offering advice until tipoff.

Jerel McNeal scored 23 points and Lazar Hayward had 22, but Marquette lost its third straight to a team ranked in the top six, all since senior point guard Dominic James broke a bone in his foot. Wesley Matthews added 16 points but Maurice Acker, filling in for James, was held to six in 29 minutes.

No. 25/25 Syracuse 86 No. 13/15 Marquette 79

MILWAUKEE (AP) -- Marquette is a different team with Dominic James wearing a suit instead of a uniform.

Jonny Flynn scored 20 of his 24 points after halftime, and Andy Rautins added a key 3-pointer and layup as the 25th-ranked Orange beat the 13th-ranked Golden Eagles 86-79 in overtime Saturday.

Jerel McNeal scored 25 points for the Golden Eagles in the final home appearance for their highly regarded trio of senior guards: McNeal, James and Wesley Matthews.

James again watched from the bench, his season having come to an end when he broke a bone in his foot in the opening minutes of a Feb. 25 loss to Connecticut.

Syracuse led 80-77 on a 3-pointer by Rautins with 2:29 left in overtime, but Marquette cut the lead to one on two free throws by Lazar Hayward. With the shot clock running down, Rautins hit a driving layup to give the Orange an 82-79 lead with 1:23 left.

Hayward missed on the other end - but Flynn missed a 3-pointer, giving the Golden Eagles a chance to tie.

Matthews missed a wide open 3-point attempt, but a tie-up under the basket gave the ball back to Marquette with 16 seconds left. McNeal then collided with Flynn near the Marquette bench, but officials ruled that McNeal stepped out of bounds.

Flynn and Rautins combined to go 4-for-4 from the free throw line in the last 13 seconds.

St. John's 45 No. 21/21 Marquette 74

NEW YORK (AP) -- Wesley Matthews scored 20 points and No. 21 Marquette snapped a four-game losing streak by holding St. John's to a Big East tournament-record 10 points in the first half on the way to a 74-45 victory.

Lazar Hayward added 17 points for the fifth-seeded Golden Eagles (24-8), who advanced to Thursday's quarterfinals against fourth-seeded and 10th-ranked Villanova.

Paris Horne had 15 points for the Red Storm (16-17), who advanced to the second round with a 64-59 victory over Georgetown. The last time St. John's won two games in a Big East tournament was 2000, when the Red Storm won the third of their three titles.

St. John's had three field goals in the first half and the third, a banked rebound jumper by Justin Burrell with 1:28 left, made it 31-10 and brought a sarcastic cheer from the crowd at Madison Square Garden.

Marquette then closed the half on a 7-0 run for a 38-10 lead.

The Red Storm shot 13.6 percent in the half (3-for-22), missing all six of their 3-point attempts, and they committed 10 turnovers.

The 10 points were the lowest ever in a half in a Big East tournament game, breaking the 14 scored by Georgetown against Seton Hall in 2001, a 58-40 loss for the Hoyas. It was the fewest St. John's scored in a half since it managed 10 against Duke on Feb. 25, 2007. The Red Storm trailed by 24 at the half of that 67-50 loss.

NEW YORK (AP) -- Dwayne Anderson's last-second layup fell in as the buzzer sounded and his only field goal of the game gave No. 10 Villanova a 76-75 victory over No. 21 Marquette on Thursday in the quarterfinals of the Big East tournament.

The fourth-seeded Wildcats (26-6) led by 17 points in the first half, but Marquette took its first lead since the game's early minutes on a 3-pointer by Lazar Hayward that made it 75-74 with 1:40 to play.

The Wildcats led 45-28 with a minute left in the half and were up 47-31 at the break as the Golden Eagles shot just 20.8 percent (5-for-24) with McNeal and Wesley Matthews, the other guards in the senior trio with James, were a combined 2-for-18 from the field.

But in the second half, McNeal, Matthews and Maurice Acker, James' replacement at the point, all started scoring and the Golden Eagles chipped away, closing within 62-56 with 9:47 left on Acker's 3-pointer.

Acker hit his third 3 of the game with 2:56 left to make it a one-point game and Butler made it 72-all with a free throw 43 seconds later.

McNeal had 15 points for Marquette, while Hayward had 13 points and 11 rebounds. Acker added a season-high 12 points and Matthews had 11 points and 10 rebounds.

BOISE (AP) -- Lazar Hayward made the big plays, Marquette made its foul shots. Needing a late rally, that was enough for the Golden Eagles.

Hayward scored 26 points and Marquette hit 10 straight free throws down the stretch to hold off Utah State 58-57 Friday in the first round of the West Regional.

The Golden Eagles blew a 14-point lead, then overcame a 49-43 deficit. Hayward spurred the comeback, muscling for key baskets and rebounds and drawing a couple of big fouls.

Jerel McNeal and Wesley Matthews each scored 14 points for sixth-seeded Marquette (25-9).

The Golden Eagles went 14-for-17 from the foul line in the second half, including 10 in a row as they regained the lead and held off one final push by their Western Athletic Conference opponent.

BOISE (AP) -- Freshman Kim English came off the bench to "pinch shoot" for the hurting J.T. Tiller and made two free throws with 5.5 seconds left to give Missouri the go-ahead points in an 83-79 victory over Marquette.

After the English free throws, Marquette's Lazar Hayward stepped over the baseline on the ensuing inbounds pass, and the Golden Eagles (25-10) were forced to foul. Leo Lyons made two more free throws to ice the game and Missouri moved onto the West Regional semifinals to play Memphis.

It ruined a wonderful effort from Marquette senior Jerel McNeal, who matched his career high with 30 points, and Wesley Matthews, who scored 24.

DeMarre Carroll finished with 15 points and Lyons led the Tigers with 18, including a nifty spin under the basket for a three-point play that gave Missouri a 79-78 lead with 48.7 seconds left after they'd trailed by four.

Nearly lost in the commotion was the return of Marquette's Dominic James, who made an unexpected comeback less than a month after a broken foot was supposed to have shut down his season. Largely considered Marquette's best player, he got plenty of playing time but didn't make a difference.

The game certainly brought flashbacks for Marquette, which trailed by 17 to Villanova in the second round of the Big East tournament, came all the way back but ended up losing by one.

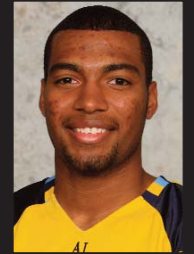

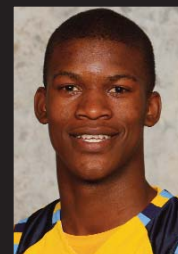
