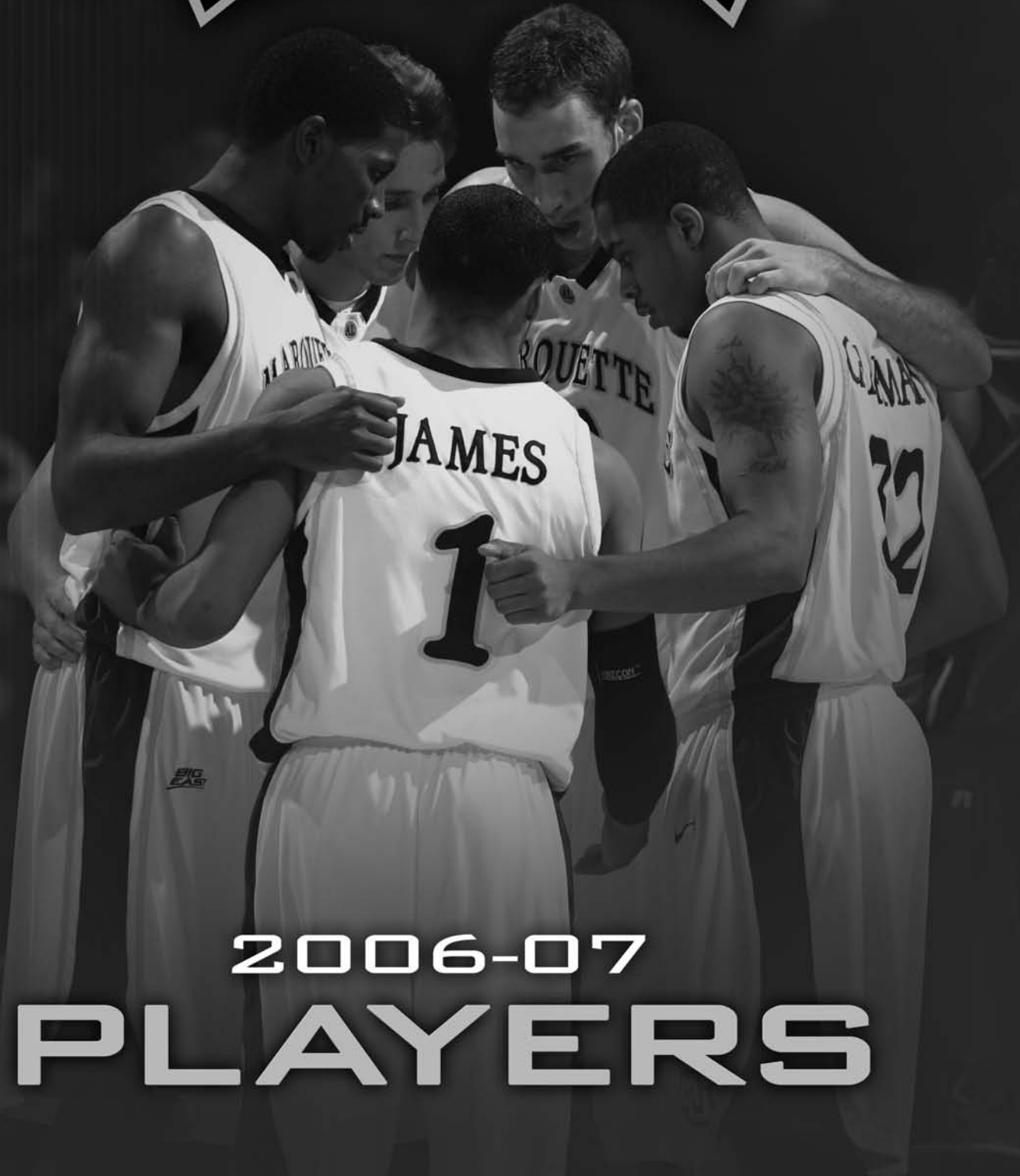

## 2005-06 NOTES:

Kinsella played in 14 games and made two starts ... made his season debut against South Dakota State (Dec. 3) and recorded two points in seven minutes of action ... played a career high 16 minutes against Oakland (Dec. 19) and recorded a season high three points and one block ... recorded his second consecutive game of one tally from the field and one board against Delaware State (Dec. 22) in four minutes of play ... his field goal with four seconds left gave Marquette its largest lead of the game, 50 points, against Lewis (Dec. 28) ... recorded his first point in three contests at West Virginia (Jan. 14) in just one minute of action ... tallied back-to-back blocks in four seconds against Notre Dame (Jan. 20) ... finished the game with a career high three blocks ... Made his first start of his career against St. John's (Feb. 1) ... recorded his second consecutive start at Villanova (Feb. 4) and recorded a season high three rebounds in seven minutes of play ... returned to action against Providence (March 4) after an emergency appendectomy sidelined him for four games.

## 2004-05 NOTES:

Played in 16 games, averaging 1.6 points and 1.3 rebounds... missed the entire month of December due to a right foot injury... averaged 2.0 points, 1.4 rebounds and 5.2 minutes in MU's five games prior to the injury... scored a season high six points twice (Nov. 15 vs. Illinois St. and Mar. 14 vs. W. Michigan)... had eight points in 18 minutes over Marquette's final two games.

## 2003-04 NOTES (AT MPLS. TECH):

Earned first team NJCAA All-American honors... started all 28 games and averaged 17.6 points, 10.4 rebounds and 1.3 blocks... led Minneapolis Tech to a 24-4 record... led the team in scoring, rebounding and blocked shots... was second on the team with 24 three-point field goals... recorded 16 double-doubles... selected Marquette over Iowa State and UNLV.

## 2002-03 NOTES (AT RICE):

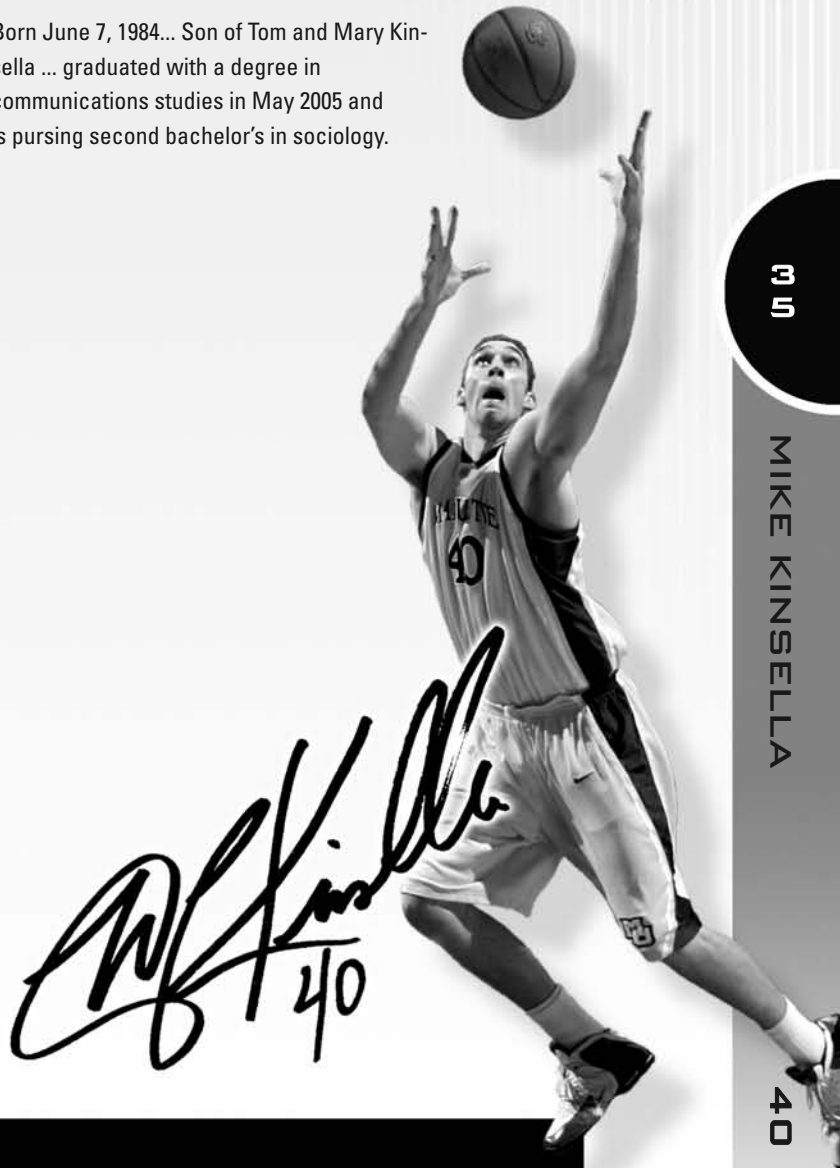

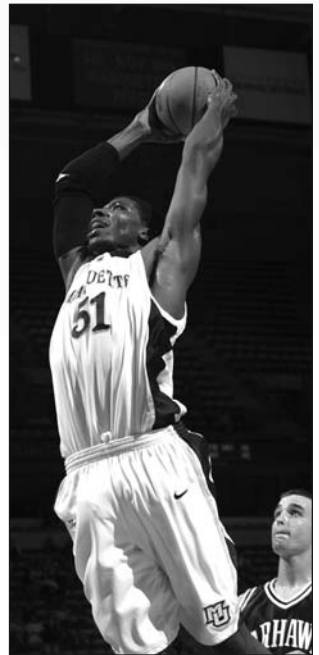

## 2005-06 NOTES:

Played in 24 games, making seven starts including five straight ... led the team in blocks with 16 ... averaged 3.1 points per game and 2.2 rebounds per game ... was a perfect 3-for-3 from the floor, scoring nine points in win over Rice (Nov. 18) ... grabbed five rebounds against Winthrop (Nov. 19) ... came off the bench to score four points at Nebraska (Nov. 30) and eight points against South Dakota State (Dec. 12), his most points since his season debut against Rice ... registered four points, matched his career best two blocks and added an assist and a steal in five minutes of action against Oakland (Dec. 19) ... registered a career best three blocks against Delaware State (Dec. 22) ... matched his career high four attempts from the charity stripe, converting three against Delaware State ... tallied all six of his points, four rebounds and two steals in the second half against Lewis (Dec. 28) ... had another solid performance off the bench against no. 2 Connecticut (Jan. 3) with five points, three rebounds, one steal and one block ... earned his third start of the season at Seton Hall (Jan. 11) ... started in his third consecutive game at DePaul (Jan. 17) and scored five points, all from the free throw line, and grabbed five rebounds ... matched his career high number of blocks with two at DePaul ... contributed to Marquette's bench scoring with four points at Pittsburgh (Jan. 28) ... played one minute against St. John's (Feb. 1) and grabbed one rebound ... played his first game in five games against Providence after having missed six games because of mononucleosis.

Averaged 16.7 points and 8.0 rebounds for NDSCS last season... Led the team in field goal percentage (54.7) and blocked shots (49)...
