MILWAUKEE -- Few dates on the calendar can match the majesty and splendor of "Championship Friday" during the summer camp schedule at the Al McGuire Center.

While regular season titles were claimed by Senegal, Minnesota, West Virginia, Seton Hall and Houston, there are still plenty of accolades to be decided and burning questions to be answered on Friday. A tiebreaker scenario was needed and the United Nations was consulted to determine the Olympic Division champion and each of the other divisions were separated by only one game in the final standings.

MIKE BAHR'S (Boston) performance on Thursday rivaled that only of the legendary Heath Joubert, whose performance last week brought tears to the eyes of nearly everyone fortunate enough to witness it. Casey claimed the honor for the second time. **CHRIS MCKENNA** (USA), **MATT ANDERSON** (Arkansas), **RYAN VAN BLARCOM** (St. John's) and **QUINTON HOOKER** (Milwaukee) were tabbed camper of the day for their respective divisions.
