The No. 11/12 Marquette University men's basketball program tips off its 91st season of competition Saturday night when the program hosts IUPUI at the Bradley Center. The opening tip is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. and will be broadcast live in the greater Milwaukee area on Time Warner Sports Channel 32. Lou Canellis (play-by-play) and Mike Kelley (analyst) will have the call for the ESPN regional production.

MU Hopes To Continue Season-Opening Success

Marquette has enjoyed a tremendous amount of success on opening night and hopes to continue that trend in 2007-08.

The Golden Eagles are 75-15 all-time in campaign lidlifters, including a 77-66 victory over Hillsdale to begin the 2006-07 season. MU owns a six-game winning streak in season openers and has claimed seven of eight during head coach Tom Crean's tenure.

Opening night notes: In 1923, Marquette allowed only five points against Milwaukee Normal in a 22-5 victory ... MU has hit the century mark twice in season openers, scoring 107 versus North Dakota (1960) and 106 against Charleston (1980) ... the squad's lone overtime lidlifter came against UNLV (1994), an 82-74 victory.

Rankings Share The Same View

Marquette has been a consensus top-15 selection in a number of preseason polls across the nation, creeping as high as eighth (CollegeHoopsNet.com) in the country.

The Golden Eagles own the 11th position in the initial Associated Press poll and are 12th in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll.

MU has been included in the final AP poll a total of 18 seasons, most recently in 2006-07 when the team was 22nd in the nation. The squad last concluded the campaign nationally ranked in back-to-back years in 2002 and 2003 and had an impressive 11-year run from 1969 to 1979.

Georgetown is fifth in the AP, followed by Louisville at No. 6 and Marquette at No. 11. Pittsburgh is No. 22. Five teams made the preseason ESPN/USA Today polls. Again, Georgetown was fifth and Louisville sixth. Marquette is 12th followed by Pitt (20th) and Villanova (25th).

James, McNeal Highlight Talent On Roster

Junior guards Dominic James and Jerel McNeal were both named Preseason First Team All-BIG EAST at the league's media day in late October, continuing a trend of individual recognition established early in the Tom Crean era.

The talented duo has claimed preseason spots on several all-conference teams, including Rivals.com, Blue Ribbon College Basketball Yearbook, Athlon Sports and Lindy's.

James was a First Team All-BIG EAST honoree in 2006-07 and McNeal was tabbed the league's top defensive player as a sophomore.

Acker Set To Take The Court; Wait Is Over

Sophomore transfer Maurice Acker returns to regular season competition Saturday night for the first time since the 2005-06 campaign, when he starred as a freshman at Ball State University.

Acker, the 2005-06 Mid-American Conference Freshman of the Year, last took the court in March of 2006. In accordance with NCAA transfer rules, the Hazelcrest, Ill., native sat out the 2006-07 campaign.

Acker's former coach at BSU, Tim Buckley, is in his first season with the Golden Eagles as an assistant coach. Buckley signed Acker while with the Cardinals and is in his second stint at MU. He was a member of Crean's first staff in 1999-2000, before accepting the head position in Muncie, Ind.

The 5-8, 165-pounder capped his BSU career with a seven-point effort at Buffalo (March 6, 2006) in the quarterfinals of the 2006 MAC Championship. The Cardinals dropped that contest 80-72.

Ticket Sales Reaching New Heights As 2007-08 Begins

Marquette's season-ticket base, which now numbers well over 8,000, is at the high-level it has been in the Tom Crean era.

A pair of BIG EAST Conference matchups (Georgetown and Notre Dame) are already sold out and tickets are only available through the five-game mini plan. The outing with the Hoyas, slated for national television, is the earliest game ever at Marquette to sell-out. MU's record-setting numbers have been made possible in large part because of over 1,000 new season ticket orders.

"Mr. Basketball" Awards Piling Up At Marquette

"Mr. Basketball" is the highest state honor a prep athlete can receive and three members of the Marquette men's basketball program have claimed that honor during their respective standout careers.

Freshman Scott Christopherson is the most recent player to have earned the honor, claiming the accolade from the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Association in 2007. Junior guard Wesley Matthews captured the award in 2005 and graduate assistant manager Julian Swartz (Waukesha South) was tabbed the state's best talent in 1999.

Freshman Mbakwe Lost For 2007-08 Campaign

Freshman forward Trevor Mbakwe will miss the 2007-08 season due to an isolated fibular collateral ligament sprain to his left knee.

Mbakwe will redshirt in 2007-08 and have four seasons of eligibility remaining. The St. Paul, Minn., native will have surgery in the coming weeks and immediately begin the rehabilitation process.

Mbakwe's surgery will also allow the opportunity to address a pre-existing condition in the same knee, which has served as a consistent source of pain and would have limited his productivity this season.

Guard Corps Ready To Provide Rebounding Support

For Marquette to be successful in 2007-08, the squad's ultra-deep guard corps must provide consistent help with rebounding at both ends of the court.

The loss of freshman Trevor Mbakwe to a season-ending injury only magnified the importance of contributions by MU's six guards on the boards.

Fortunately for the Golden Eagles, the roster features the top two rebounding guards in the entire BIG EAST. Junior Wesley Matthews chipped in 5.3 boards per game in 2006-07 and classmate Jerel McNeal added 4.8 boards per outing.

Weynmi Efejuku of Providence was third at 4.3 caroms per contest and MU's Dominic James finished 17th (3.1 rpg.) among those backcourt players back for the upcoming campaign.

BIG EAST To Include All 16 Teams In League Tourney

The Presidents of the BIG EAST Conference voted to include all 16 member institutions in the men's and women's basketball championship tournaments beginning in 2009.

Currently, the top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings advance to participate in the men's and women's championships. The men's championship is held in New York City at Madison Square Garden. The women's championship is held in Hartford, Conn., at the Hartford Civic Center.

The new format will have the teams seeded 9 through 16 meet on the first day of competition. The matchups will be No. 9 vs. No. 16, No. 10 vs. No. 15, No. 11 vs. No. 14 and No. 12 vs. No. 13.

The winners of those four games will meet seeds 5 through 8 on the second day of play. The 9/16 winner will advance to play the No. 8 seed. The 10/15 winner will play the No. 7 seed. The 11/14 winner will meet the No. 6 seed. The 12/13 winner will play the No. 5 seed.

Those four winners will advance to play the top four seeds in the quarterfinal round. Thus, the top four seeded teams still will not play until the quarterfinals, which occurs in the current 12-team format.

Marquette Tabbed Third In Preseason Coaches Poll

The Marquette University men's basketball team has been picked to finish third in the league according to the 2007-08 BIG EAST Preseason Coaches' Poll. The Golden Eagles collected 191 points, just behind preseason co-favorites Georgetown and Louisville, which each earned 217 points in the balloting. Fourth-place Pittsburgh received 170 points. The league's 16 head coaches did not place their own teams on their respective ballots.

James Named To Wooden Watch List

Marquette University junior Dominic James has been named to the preseason watch lists for both the John R. Wooden Award and Naismith Trophy, which honor the nation's top collegiate talent.

The Richmond, Ind., native, who was recently named to the Preseason All-BIG EAST Team, is one of 50 players to make the cut for the Wooden Award. The listing includes eight players from the BIG EAST Conference.

The list is composed of 50 student athletes who, based on last year's individual performance and team records, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most coveted trophy. These top 50 candidates are comprised of returning players. Transfers, freshmen, and medical redshirts are not eligible for this preseason list, but will be evaluated and considered for both the Midseason Top 30 list and the National Ballot. Players not on the preseason list are eligible for the midseason top 30 and ballot. Last year, Kevin Durant of the University of Texas was the first freshman to win the Wooden Award.

A new affiliate and an expanded coverage area highlight the Marquette Radio Network, which spans from northern Wisconsin to Indiana, for the 2007-08 men's basketball season.

WPJP 100.1 FM (Port Washington) is the newest member of the 12-station network, which features ESPN Radio 1510 AM/1290 AM (Milwaukee) as its flagship.

Each of the team's games will be carried live throughout the network, with broadcasts also including pregame and postgame coverage. In Tom Crean's eight seasons, Marquette has averaged over 20 wins a year, won a conference championship and made seven postseason appearances, highlighted by the 2003 Final Four, the program's third appearance all-time and first since 1977.

He is a two-time recipient of the Ray Meyer Conference USA, NABC District XI and USBWA District V Coach of the Year awards, and in 2003 won the Coach Clair Bee Award as well as being named a finalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year Award.

Crean's 65.7 winning percentage and 165 victories place him third in both categories all-time at Marquette.

National Recognition

Crean's revival of Marquette's storied basketball program has not gone unnoticed by the national pollsters as the Golden Eagles have spent 62 weeks in the rankings since November 2001.

Prior to first appearing during Crean's tenure in the AP Top 25 on November 27, 2001,

Marquette had been ranked for just 24 weeks the previous 15 seasons.

Marquette's consecutive year-end rankings in 2002 and 2003 were the first time for the program in a quarter century, and on March 4, 2003, the school earned its highest ranking since 1978 by reaching No. 8 in the AP poll, which the team matched in 2006-07.

Player Development

Personally driven by an intense commitment to improve, Crean has structured a program at Marquette that focuses heavily on individual instruction and has allowed his players to stay ahead of the competition.

The development of Golden Eagle players under Crean's tutelage can best be illustrated by the program's representation with international basketball this past summer. Current players Dominic James, Wesley Matthews and Jerel McNeal were all invited to tryouts for USA Basketball to represent the country at the 2007 Pan American Games. Recognized among the top young talent in collegiate basketball, Marquette's trio of selections was the most of

Through eight seasons, Golden Eagles players have earned 19 All-Conference selections and the program's first conference player of the year award, when Dwyane Wade won Conference USA's top honor in 2003. Wade also went on to become the first Marquette player since 1978 to be named an Associated Press First Team All-America and finalist for the John R. Wooden Award.

The 2007 season saw a pair of Golden Eagles rated among the league's best. Sophomore guard Dominic James was tabbed first team all-league and classmate Jerel McNeal was named the BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year. He also claimed a spot on the all-conference second team.

In 2006, Steve Novak was one of four unanimous selections to the All-Big East first team. Novak was selected 32nd overall by the Houston Rockets in 2006 NBA Draft.

In 2005, Travis Diener joined Wade as players under Crean's mentoring who earned All-American and All-Conference honors, as well as going on to be selected in the NBA Draft.

Marquette basketball has been represented on national player of the year balloting in each of the last six seasons.

Fan Support and Television Exposure

Crean's passion and commitment on the court has paid dividends off of it. The program has set total attendance records four times, and since 1999 has drawn nearly two million fans.

Students on the Milwaukee campus have flocked to the Bradley Center in record numbers, making it one of college basketball's best environments. Marquette has finished among the nation's top-25 in average attendance in each of the last six seasons, including a clip of 15,345 per game in 2006-07 to rank 14th overall.

Overall, attendance has increased 70-percent and the top 10 crowds of all-time have occurred during Crean's tenure (all coming since 2002). Marquette's elevated status nationally has made it a favorite of television. Crean's squad has had 87 games televised nationally on network or cable since 2001.

Career Overview

Crean was named the 15th head coach in Marquette basketball history on March 30, 1999.

Before arriving in Milwaukee, Crean served on the Michigan State basketball staff for four seasons, holding the position of associate head coach for the last two. During that time, the Spartans compiled an 88-41 record and made four consecutive postseason appearances, including a trip to the 1999 Final Four. Michigan State's recruiting coordinator; Crean was instrumental in bringing two-time Big Ten Player of the Year Mateen Cleaves and 2000 John R. Wooden Award finalist Morris Peterson to East Lansing.

Prior to his tenure at Michigan State, Crean spent the 1994-95 season as an assistant coach at Pittsburgh and served as the associate head coach at Western Kentucky from 1990 to 1994. Crean got his start in coaching on the Division I level in 1989-90, serving on Jud Heathcote's staff at Michigan State.

A native of Mount Pleasant, Mich., Crean earned his bachelor's degree in parks and recreation with a minor in psychology from Central Michigan in 1989. While pursuing his degree, Crean coached basketball at Alma College and Mount Pleasant High School.

Tom Crean vs. Ranked Opponents

Marquette is 18-23 (43.0) against ranked opponents, including 8-9 (47.0) against the Top 10, under Tom Crean. All-time, Marquette is 90-130 (40.9) against ranked opponents, including a 32-81 (28.3) record against the Top 10. 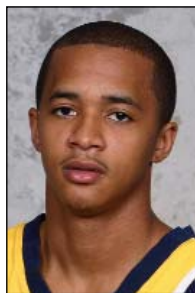

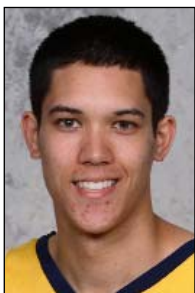
