MARQUETTE MAKES SECOND NCAA APPEARANCE AT NOTRE DAME

The BIG EAST Champion Golden Eagles will face the Irish for the second time in 2017

Marquette will make its second appearance in the NCAA Men's Lacrosse Championship on Sunday, May 14 with an 11 a.m. Central time matchup with fourth-seeded and No. 5/7 Notre Dame at Arlotta Stadium in Notre Dame, Indiana.

The NCAA First Round contest will be broadcast live on ESPNU with John Brickley (play-by-play) and Matt Ward (analyst) on the call as the Golden Eagles and Fighting Irish square off for the sixth time.

Marquette (8-7) earned the BIG EAST Conference's automatic bid with a 10-9 win over Providence in the championship game of the league tournament on May 6. The Golden Eagles also upset then-No. 2 Denver, 11-8, in the semifinals, following a four-game skid to end the regular season.

All-time goal and points leader Ryan McNamara leads MU into the first weekend of NCAA play with a team-best 33 points (20 goals, 13 assists), while a total of four Golden Eagles have between 29 and 33 points, with Tanner Thomson, Joe Dunn and Andy DeMichiei joining McNamara in that group.

Notre Dame (8-5) has lost its last two games since a three-game winning streak spurred by a 11-10 win over Marquette on April 11 in

Indiana. The Irish won their Atlantic Coast Conference semifinal game over then-No.4 Duke, 7-6, on April 28, before falling to North Carolina, 14-10, in the ACC title game. ND also fell in overtime to No. 17 Army, 10-9, on Saturday in West Point.

Sophomore Ryder Garnsey paces the Irish with 39 points on 19 goals and 28 assists and junior Mikey Wynne leads ND with 28 goals on the year. Senior midfielder Sergio Perkovic has 22 goals in 2017 and notched six of those, including the game winner with 25 seconds remaining, in the last meeting with Marquette in April.

In that April MU loss, the Golden Eagles rebounded from an 8-2 deficit to tie the game 10-10 with 7:56 left on Joe Dunn's fourth goal of the day. Marquette could not get back on the board and dropped its fifth game in as many meetings to the Irish, with the last two coming by just one goal after MU rallied to tie in both.

The Golden Eagles are looking for their first win in NCAA tournament competition following last season's first round loss to eventual national champion North Carolina, 10-9, as the No. 6 national seed in Milwaukee. A win would also be MU's first over an ACC institution as Marquette enters the weekend a combined 0-11 against the Irish (0-5), Duke (0-5) and North Carolina (0-1).

The advancing team from Sunday's game at Notre Dame will face the winner of fifth-seeded Denver and Air Force on Saturday, May 20 at James M. Shuart Stadium in Hempstead, New York. The quarterfinal game will be hosted by Hofstra University, the alma mater of MU head coach Joe Amplo.

MU CLAIMS SECOND BIG EAST TITLE

• Marquette won its second BIG EAST Conference tournament in a row on Saturday afternoon with a 10-9 victory over Providence, following an 11-8 semifinal win over No. 2 Denver on Thursday. Goalie Cole Blazer was named the championship's most outstanding player after making 23 saves in the two games, while seniors Grant Preisler, Nick Eufrazio and Joe Dunn joined Blazer on the all-tournament squad. The Golden Eagles entered the weekend as the league's No. 4 seed and picked off the top-ranked Pioneers and third-seeded Friars to claim the league's automatic NCAA bid for the second consecutive year. Preisler posted a team-best seven points over the course of the tournament, while sophomore John Wagner played a big part in the semifinal win over Denver with a game-best four goals.

BLAZER SECURES THE CREASE

• Goalie Cole Blazer has continued his stellar play in net during his first full campaign as MU's starter in 2017, culminating in BIG EAST Championship Most Outstanding Player honors last weekend. The junior made a total of 23 saves in the wins over No. 2 Denver and Providence and also contributed to his own cause with a goal as time expired against the Pioneers in the semifinals.

• As of May 7, the junior sits 15th in NCAA Division I with a save percentage of .536 and a goals against average of 8.74 (14th nationally). He is a two-time All-BIG EAST Second Team selection and has also been selected to the All-BIG EAST Championship team as MU won titles in 2016 and 2017.

• Blazer, a mechanical engineering major, is the closest thing to a local player on the Marquette roster, hailing from Libertyville, Illinois, which sits 55 miles to the south of Milwaukee down I-94 just across the Wisconsin-Illinois border. No player for the Golden Eagles in program history has ever grown up closer to the Milwaukee campus.

DEFENSE ADJUSTS TO NEW LEADERSHIP

• One of the main tasks for head coach Joe Amplo with the 2017 squad was maintaining a defense that had to replace three USILA All-Americans (Liam Byrnes, B.J. Grill and Jacob Richard) from Marquette's top defensive unit of a year ago. The Golden Eagles boasted one of the NCAA's stoutest defenses in 2016, surrendering just 8.13 goals per contest (eighth in NCAA Division I), but returned just one starter at defenseman in senior Nick Eufrazio along with goalie Cole Blazer.

MARQUETTE 16-6 IN ONE-GOAL GAMES

• The ability to perform in tense late game circumstances has been a hallmark of the Marquette program under head coach Joe Amplo, evidenced by an all-time record of 16-6 in one-goal games following 2017 wins over Georgetown, Air Force and Providence and losses at Villanova and Notre Dame. The Golden Eagles captured four one-goal victories in the first five games of 2015 and won eight straight one-goal contests until a loss at Georgetown on March 21, 2015. In addition to being 16-6 all-time in games decided by one goal, MU is 4-2 all-time in overtime games as a program. The Golden Eagles' last one-goal win in 2016 came over No. 1 Denver, 10-9, to claim their first BIG EAST tournament championship. They also lost by the same score to North Carolina in the 2016 NCAA First Round.

DUNN HAS PAIR OF FOUR-GOAL GAMES SINCE START OF BIG EAST

• Senior attackman Joe Dunn has emerged into a big part of MU's late season run and as of May 7 leads the team with 23 goals on the year. The West Chester, Pennsylvania native earned 2017 All-BIG EAST Championship honors for his play in MU's second straight league tournament run, which included two goals and a pair of assists against No. 2 Denver in the semifinals. Dunn, who entered 2017 with a single season career-high of seven goals, has posted some of his top goal totals this season against the toughest competition. In addition to four goals in MU's BIG EAST opener at Georgetown, he added another four at No. 7/10 Notre Dame, a pair of tallies against No. 4 Duke and a hat trick on Senior Day against No. 2 Denver.

MCMNAMARA FUELS MU

• MU's lone All-BIG EAST Preseason Team honoree Ryan McNamara propelled the Golden Eagles into the 2016 postseason by breaking the Marquette single-season and career goal scoring records while earning USILA All-America recognition. McNamara became the second MU player to reach 100 career points in last year's regular season finale and passed Conor Gately's career goal mark in the process. He surpassed Gately's career points record of 140 at Providence on April 15, 2017 and became the first player in program history with 100 goals in the 2017 BIG EAST title game win at Providence:

McNamara at MU:

- 100 career goals (first)
- 149 career points (first)
- 49 career assists (second)
- 399 shots (first)

• The Eagan, Minnesota native became the second player in MU history to be named to the watch list for the Tewaaraton Award, the top individual honor in collegiate lacrosse. McNamara joins former teammate Conor Gately as Tewaaraton Award Watch List honorees. He also broke Tyler Melnyk's single season goal and point standards with 40 and 57, respectively, in 2016.

WAGNER PROVIDES MORE CONSISTENCY

• Midfielder John Wagner experienced an up-and-down freshman season in 2016, playing in all 16 games, but scoring in just two of them. The Canadian has been able to carve out a more prominent role on the first line as a sophomore and had an eight-game scoring streak that was snapped against Duke on April 22. The 6-foot-2 lefty scored a career-high four points in the BIG EAST semifinal win over No. 2 Denver and has already doubled his point production from a year ago (6 points (2016) to 22 points (2017)). His production in the BIG EAST semis is nothing new as the St. Davids, Ontario native also scored twice in the 2016 conference tournament against Villanova.

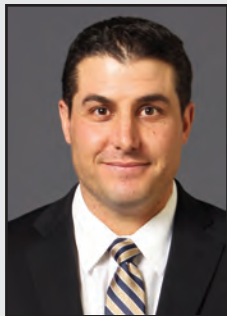

HEAD COACH JOE AMPLO

Sixth Year/Fifth Season • Farmingville, N.Y. • Hofstra (2000)



In just four seasons of competition, Joe Amplo has built the Marquette program into a BIG EAST Conference Champion and established himself as one of the top head coaches in NCAA Division I men's lacrosse.

Amplo, a Team USA assistant coach and member of the NCAA Division I Men's Lacrosse Committee, was named the first head coach in Marquette history on Feb. 4, 2011 and has built a program in his likeness to national relevance.

Marquette has qualified for the semifinals of the BIG EAST tournament during each year as a league member and has increased its overall win total each season. Ten Golden Eagles have earned 16 All-BIG EAST honors in three conference campaigns, while five players have earned USILA All-America recognition and five have been selected in either the NLL or MLL drafts.

The 2014 BIG EAST Conference Coach of the Year guided the Golden Eagles to a 10-win campaign in just their third season of competition in 2015 and in 2016 led Marquette to its first-ever NCAA tournament appearance on the heels of a victory over No. 1 Denver in the BIG EAST Championship game. The Golden Eagles earned a No. 6 national seed in the NCAA playoffs and fell to eventual NCAA Champion North Carolina by a single goal, 10-9, in the first NCAA tournament game ever played in the state of Wisconsin. Individually, Amplo was named the USILA Howdy Myers Man of the Year in 2016 and a '40 under 40' honoree by the *Milwaukee Business Journal*.

Marquette's first-ever season of men's lacrosse in 2013 included a three-game winning streak in April as the squad finished 5-8 overall. The Golden Eagles first win in program history at Air Force came in just the second game for the first-year program.

His second season as head coach marked Marquette's first year of BIG EAST competition, which resulted in conference coach of the year honors for Amplo. Marquette posted a 4-2 conference record that included overtime wins over St. John's and Georgetown and finished second overall in the BIG EAST to earn MU's first ever postseason appearance.

Amplo came to Marquette with 11 years of collegiate coaching experience, 10 of which came at his alma mater, Hofstra University. He served as associate head coach with the Pride for three years, and was the team's defensive coordinator.

During his time at Hofstra, Amplo participated in 11 NCAA Championships, three as a student-athlete and eight as a coach. In 2011, Hofstra had the nation's No. 1 defense, boasting the lowest goals against average in the country. In his first stint with Hofstra, Amplo worked under then-head coach John Danowski, now the coach of three-time NCAA Champion Duke University.

From his return to Hofstra in 2003 through 2011, the Pride posted a 76-49 record and advanced to five NCAA Championships. He has coached 53 all-conference players at Hofstra, including five conference players of the year, four rookies of the year and 21 All-Americans. One of those players, Doug Shannahan, earned the Tewaaraton Award in 2001, honoring the top player in college lacrosse. Amplo has also coached another Tewaaraton Award finalist in Chris Unterstein, 13 North-South All-Stars and six USILA Scholar All-Americans.

As a student-athlete, he was an All-America East performer as a senior in 1999 when he started all 16 games and led the school to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Championship. He played in 58 games in his career and notched 91 ground balls, 40 of which came during his senior season.

In addition to his work with Hofstra, Amplo is active on the lecture circuit and is the founder of the Golden Eagle Lacrosse Club, which operates clinics, camps and competitive club teams for the Milwaukee area lacrosse community. The Farmingville, New York native attended Sachem High School in Lake Ronkonkoma, New York, where he earned four letters in both lacrosse and football and was an all-conference performer.

Amplo graduated from Hofstra in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in geography and earned a master's degree in college student counseling. He and his wife, Jennifer, reside in Cedarburg, Wis. and have three daughters, Sophia, Charlotte, and Lily.

Amplo was named to the NCAA Division I Men's Lacrosse Committee on July 1 and was selected as an assistant coach with the U.S. Men Lacrosse National Team for the 2018 FIL Men's World Championship.

In addition to extending at-large invitations for the national tournament with the NCAA Committee, the group convenes each summer in Indianapolis to discuss pertinent topics to NCAA Division I men's lacrosse, including rules changes, NCAA Championship qualification and format, officiating and media rights.

With the U.S. Men's National Team, Amplo serves alongside Duke head coach John Danowski, whom he worked under as an assistant coach at Hofstra.

FACE-OFF UNIT RECEIVES BOOST FROM MELILLO

• Junior faceoff specialist Zachary Melillo was called last year's team MVP by head coach Joe Amplo because of what his presence at the face-off X meant to the entire Marquette squad. The Warren, New Jersey native went on to set the MU career face-off win record in just his first season with 178 victories. That 56.2 percent clip ranked him 21st in the nation and helped him earn All-BIG EAST Second Team accolades.

• The 2016 All-BIG EAST Championship Team member has picked up the pace after a slow start to his junior year and went 19-of-25 against St. John's and 18-of-25 at Notre Dame on April 11.

THOMSON EMERGES AS A THREAT IN THE MIDFIELD

• Junior Tanner Thomson doubled his goal scoring total for the season against St. John's on April 8 with six goals, the second-most ever scored by a Marquette player in a single game. Thomson's effort helped MU tie a program-record with 17 goals in the win over the Red Storm as he looks to replicate his torrid pace from the end of 2016 into this season.

• Thomson ended the 2016 campaign on an absolute tear, recording 12 of his 19 goals (and 14 of 21 points) over the final four contests, all against ranked opponents. That included a total of seven goals and an assist against then-No. 1 Denver (two games (3-0-3 and 4-1-5)), two goals and an assist against then No. 16 Villanova, and a hat trick in the NCAA tournament against eventual national champion North Carolina. The Toronto native was an All-BIG EAST Championship Team selection and had not scored in an MU uniform prior to his first collegiate start against Robert Morris on March 12, 2016.

DEPTH ON DISPLAY IN SEASON OPENER

• Marquette's dominant 17-1 season-opening victory at Jacksonville featured 14 different goal scorers, including eight players registering their first career tallies. MU head coach Joe Amplo pulled most of his starters after taking an 11-0 lead through three quarters of action to allow his younger players to get extended time. The Golden Eagles outscored JU, 6-1, in the fourth quarter, led by a pair of goals from freshman Dylan Dobrosky in his first career game.

• The win over the Dolphins also set new program records for goals scored (17) and fewest allowed (1) in a single contest. The goals scored record surpassed the previous total of 15 from March 15, 2014 against Detroit, while the previous goals allowed record was set at Richmond in a 7-2 win on Feb. 27, 2016.

MARQUETTE HAD HISTORIC 2016 CAMPAIGN

• The 2016 season was a historic one for the Marquette men's lacrosse program, which captured its first BIG EAST Conference tournament championship and hosted the first-ever NCAA playoff game in Wisconsin. MU's automatic NCAA berth came in just its fourth season of competition and its third as a BIG EAST member after playing the 2013 campaign as an independent. The Golden Eagles claimed the NCAA bid by defeating then-No. 1 Denver, 10-9, in the BIG EAST title game to snap the Pioneers' NCAA-best 22-game home winning streak. 2016 BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year Liam Byrnes led the charge for Marquette and was named the tournament's most outstanding player after leading MU to victories over then-No. 16 Villanova and the Pios.

DEMICHIEI RETURNS IN NO. 6 FOR THE GOLDEN EAGLES

• Senior midfielder Andy DeMichiei also emerged late in 2016 to provide stability in the midfield, which suffered the loss of Kyle Whitlow to injury and the subsequent move of Ryan McNamara into the attack unit. DeMichiei's late season scoring surge started in the BIG EAST tournament, during which he honored Whitlow by wearing the Canadian's No. 6 uniform. The Pittsburgh native posted a hat trick, including the game winner, in the BIG EAST semis against Villanova and scored twice against Denver in the title contest. DeMichiei, who will again don No. 6, also set the MU single-game scoring record last season with a seven-goal outburst at St. John's.

2016 SENIORS HAVING PRO LACROSSE SUCCESS

• Marquette had a trio of players drafted in the 2016 Major League Lacrosse Collegiate Draft and all three had very successful rookie campaigns following the conclusion of their MU careers. Defenseman Liam Byrnes was the first Marquette player to hear his name called in the third round (21st overall) and started on defense for the Florida Launch. Current MU assistant coach Jacob Richard earned a role with one of the MLL's deepest SSDM group with the New York Lizards, while current MU director of lacrosse operations B.J. Grill helped the Denver Outlaws to the MLL title as a starting defenseman. Additionally, attackman Conor Gately was selected by the Rochester Rattlers in the 2016 MLL Supplemental Draft and Byrnes is also playing for the Georgia Swarm of the National Lacrosse League as a transition player.

AMPLO AND JOSETTI ADVANCING SPORT OF LACROSSE

• Joe Amplo and associate athletic director for compliance Danielle Josetti (men's lacrosse sport administrator) were each honored with major awards at the annual Intercollegiate Men's Lacrosse Coaches Association (IMLCA) Convention in Baltimore on Dec. 9, 2016. Amplo was named the USILA's Howdy Myers Man of the Year, while Josetti was given the Extra Man Award by the IMLCA for her help in growing the game and the MU program. Amplo also earned recognition by the Milwaukee Business Journal in January on its annual '40 under 40' list.

NEW SEASONAL DOME IN PLACE; INDOOR FACILITY PLANNED

• Marquette's newly completed seasonal dome over the FieldTurf Revolution 360 surface at Valley Fields provides a climate-controlled practice and game facility for the Golden Eagles during the winter months. The Golden Eagles played all their home games at Valley Fields for the first time in 2016, after making the move in towards campus from Hart Park in Wauwatosa, where they had played during their first three seasons.

• A new indoor Athletic Performance and Research Center (APRC), which will combine indoor playing fields for Marquette's lacrosse and soccer programs, an indoor track, and a world-class athletic performance research facility, was announced in the spring of 2015 by MU President Dr. Michael R. Lovell. The facility will be located on the 800 block of Michigan Street and is expected to house offices and locker rooms for MU lacrosse. Through a strategic partnership with Aurora Health Care and the NBA's Milwaukee Bucks, cutting-edge faculty and student research in sports performance, medicine, nutrition and rehabilitation will enhance the performance of Marquette student-athletes and professional athletes worldwide. It was announced in January 2016 that Aurora Health Care will provide \$40 million in capital investment to the start of the \$120 million project.

MU TEAMS WITH ZABLOCKI VA MEDICAL CENTER

• Head coach Joe Amplo and the Golden Eagles have teamed with the Clement J. Zablocki VA Medical Center and Marquette's PT Adaptive Ability Club to coach the Milwaukee Eagles, one of six wheelchair lacrosse teams in the United States. The team features paralyzed American veterans, which MU staff members and student-athletes coach at the Marquette Gym on campus. The team was organized by Dr. Kenneth Lee, a professor at the Medical College of Wisconsin, who works with the Spinal Cord Injury Center at the VA hospital.
