MARQUETTE SEEKS THIRD BIG EAST CHAMPIONSHIP

Golden Eagles are the two-time defending tournament champion

For the third straight season, the Marquette University men's lacrosse team will face top-seeded Denver in the BIG EAST Conference Men's Lacrosse Championship, presented by Jeep.

The Golden Eagles (6-7, 3-2 BIG EAST) and No. 3 Pioneers (11-2, 5-0 BIG EAST) will meet in the tournament semifinals on Thursday, May 3 at 3:30 p.m. Central time in a contest televised live on CBS Sports Network with Ben Holden (play-by-play) and Evan Washburn on the call at Villanova Stadium

Marquette is 4-2 all-time in the league's post-season tournament and, while a perfect 4-0 in the last two seasons, lost both of its previous semifinal games played at Villanova Stadium in 2014 and 2015. Denver is 6-2 all-time against the Golden Eagles but have fallen to Marquette in the 2016 final and 2017 semifinal.

MU is led into Thursday's contest by junior John Wagner's team-best 27 goals and 35 points, while freshman Anthony Orsini, who has missed three of the last four games, sits second with 14 goals and 21 points. Wagner has scored 15 times in BIG EAST play to lead the league and has game winners in all three of MU's conference wins.

The fourth-seeded Golden Eagles tied for sec-

ond in the league standings at 3-2 with league wins over Georgetown, St. John's and Providence, but lost the tie-breakers for the No. 2 and 3 seeds by virtue of their goal differential against Villanova and GU.

Marquette fell at Denver, 7-4, in the regular season finale for both squads on Saturday at Peter Barton Stadium as the Pioneers won 11-of-13 face-offs and out-shot MU, 37-25. Ethan Walker posted four points, including three assists, while Austin French posted a hat trick.

Denver (11-2, 5-0 BIG EAST) earned its fifth BIG EAST regular season crown and has never lost to a BIG EAST foe during regular season action (26-0). Ninth-year head coach Bill Tierney leads a Pios squad that has won seven in a row since an 11-9 loss at Notre Dame on March 10. DU's only other loss came at Duke, 15-12, on Feb. 16 in Durham after it surrendered a fourth-quarter lead.

Tierney is second all-time in NCAA victories (392) behind Duke's John Danowski (395) and has won seven NCAA titles, six at Princeton in addition to his 2015 crown with Denver.

Trevor Baptiste, a 2017 Tewaaraton Award finalist and the No. 1 pick in the 2018 MLL Draft, is second all-time in NCAA history in both ground balls and faceoff victories and owns a

career mark of .719 (1,104-1,536) at the X in his illustrious career. Walker paces the DU offense with 42 goals and 63 points, while French has a team-high 26 helpers this season.

Walker scored four times in last year's 16-8 regular season win over Marquette in Milwaukee, but was held scoreless in MU's 11-8 triumph in the BIG EAST semifinals a week later. Wagner scored a then-career high four goals for Marquette in the semifinal win and goalie Cole Blazer made 12 saves and assisted his own effort with a goal as time expired.

In addition to last year's semifinal win over the then-No. 2 Pioneers, Marquette took down top-ranked Denver at Peter Barton Stadium in the 2016 title game. The victory snapped a 22-game home winning streak by DU and was the Pioneers' first loss to a BIG EAST team since joining the league.

The winner of Thursday's semifinal game will face either No. 17/18 Georgetown (two seed) or No. 12/14 Villanova (three seed) in the championship on Saturday, May 5 at 1 p.m. Central time.

MARQUETTE MAKING FIFTH TRIP TO BIG EAST SEMIS

• The two-time reigning BIG EAST tournament champions qualified for the league tournament semifinals for the fifth time in as many seasons and are in search of their third tournament crown. The Golden Eagles lost in the semifinals during each of their first two trips to the conference tournament with a 9-8 loss to Villanova in 2014 and a 12-8 loss to Georgetown in 2015, both of which came at Villanova. MU's last two tournament appearances have resulted in championship in both 2016 and 2017 at Denver and Providence.

RICHARD IS THE DIFFERENCE IN THE MIDFIELD

• Junior LSM Noah Richard has played a big role in Marquette's victories this season, all of which have come with him in the lineup. The West Chester, Pennsylvania native recorded a pair of caused turnovers in MU's first two games of the season (along with five ground balls at Detroit) and had a ground ball against Ohio State before leaving the game with an injury. The junior then missed MU's next three games (losses to Bellarmine, Robert Morris and Michigan) before returning for the BIG EAST-opening win over Georgetown. Richard has notched at least four ground balls in the six games since returning from injury, picking up a career-high eight on April 7 at St. John's and April 20 at No. 3 Duke. He led MU with 24 ground balls (4.8/game) and four caused turnovers in BIG EAST play with a pair of points.

FLEMING AND WAGNER CAP STUNNING RALLY VS. PC

• Marquette scored the last five goals in the April 14 overtime victory over Providence in the final 1:51 of game play after trailing by four, 11-7, with under two minutes left in regulation. Freshman Griffin Fleming capped the furious fourth quarter rally with the tying goal as time expired after three quick MU strikes pulled MU within one. The Friars won the final face-off of regulation and attempted to kill the remaining seconds before freshman midfielder Evan McGreen flung the ball into the air towards the middle of the box. Marquette SSDM Luke Anderson grabbed the ball and quickly got it downfield to Fleming for the score.

• John Wagner scored three goals in the last two minutes of play after MU trailed 11-7 on Kevin McCordic's goal with 2:26 left in the fourth quarter. Wagner scored at the 1:37 and 36-second mark of the fourth before posting the OT winner just 14 seconds into the extra session.

MELILLO LEADS FACE-OFF UNIT

• Senior faceoff specialist Zachary Melillo has earned a pair of BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll mentions in 2018 after going 15-of-20 against Detroit Mercy on Feb. 24 and 17-of-26 against No. 8 Villanova on March 31. In the four games following a return from injury on March 31 against VU, he won at a 69.2 percent clip (63-of-91) against the Wildcats, St. John's, Notre Dame and Providence. He ranks 14th nationally with a winning percentage of 59.6 in 2018.

• He holds a career 55.6 percent mark at the dot in his MU career and tied his own MU record in the Golden Eagles' NCAA tournament game at Notre Dame last season with 19 wins. His work against Denver's Trevor Baptiste in the last two BIG EAST Championships paved the way for MU's two league tournament crowns. He currently sits sixth in NCAA Division I among active face-off specialists with 560 career wins, including his time at NJIT as a freshman.

• Melillo was called the 2016 team MVP by head coach Joe Amplo because of what his presence at the face-off X meant to the entire Marquette squad. The Warren, New Jersey native went on to set the MU career face-off win record in just his first season with 178 victories. That 56.2 percent clip ranked him 21st in the nation and helped him earn All-BIG EAST Second Team accolades.

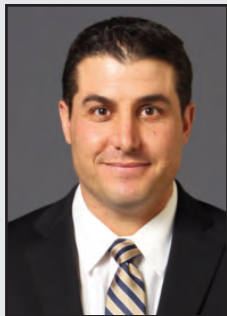

HEAD COACH JOE AMPLO

Seventh Year/Sixth Season • Farmingville, N.Y. • Hofstra (2000)



In just five seasons of competition, Joe Amplo has built the Marquette program into a BIG EAST Conference Champion and established himself as one of the top head coaches in NCAA Division I men's lacrosse.

Amplo, a Team USA assistant coach and member of the NCAA Division I Men's Lacrosse Committee, was named the first head coach in Marquette history on Feb. 4, 2011 and has built a program in his likeness to national relevance.

Marquette has qualified for the semifinals of the BIG EAST tournament during each year as a league member and has increased its overall win total all but one season. Thirteen Golden Eagles have earned 22 All-BIG EAST honors in four conference campaigns, while five players have earned USILA All-America recognition and nine have been selected in either the NLL or MLL drafts.

The 2014 BIG EAST Conference Coach of the Year guided the Golden Eagles to a 10-win campaign in just their third season of competition in 2015 and in 2016 led Marquette to its first-ever NCAA tournament appearance on the heels of a victory over No. 1 Denver in the BIG EAST Championship game. The Golden Eagles earned a No. 6 national seed in the NCAA playoffs and fell to eventual NCAA Champion North Carolina by a single goal in the first NCAA tournament game ever played in the state of Wisconsin.

Amplo led MU on a surprise run to the NCAA tournament in 2017 by becoming the first No. 4 seed to win the BIG EAST Championship after upsetting top-seeded and No. 2 Denver, 11-8, in the semifinals. The Golden Eagles then downed tournament-host Providence in the final as junior goalie Cole Blazer took home most outstanding player honors. MU earned the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Championship where it fell to fourth-seeded and No. 7 Notre Dame 15-9 in the first round.

The Marquette defense ranked among the nation's leaders all of 2016, leading to recognition for MU's three MLL draft picks in graduate students Liam Byrnes and B.J. Grill and senior Jacob Richard. Byrnes was named the 2016 BIG EAST Conference Defensive Player of the Year, a first team all-league performer, the most outstanding player at the BIG EAST tournament and a USILA Second Team All-American.

Amplo came to Marquette with 11 years of collegiate coaching experience, 10 of which came at his alma mater, Hofstra University. He served as associate head coach with the Pride for three years, and was the team's defensive coordinator. During his time at Hofstra, Amplo participated in 11 NCAA Championships, three as a student-athlete and eight as a coach. In 2011, Hofstra had the nation's No. 1 defense, boasting the lowest goals against average in the country. In his first stint with Hofstra, Amplo worked under then-head coach John Danowski, now the coach of three-time NCAA Champion Duke University.

From his return to Hofstra in 2003 through 2011, the Pride posted a 76-49 record and advanced to five NCAA Championships. He coached 21 All-Americans at Hofstra, including five conference players of the year, Tewaaraton Award winner Doug Shannahan (2001) and Tewaaraton Award finalist Chris Unterstein.

As a student-athlete, he was an All-America East performer as a senior in 1999 when he started all 16 games and led the school to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Championship. He played in 58 games in his career and notched 91 ground balls, 40 of which came during his senior season.

In addition to his work with Hofstra, Amplo is active on the lecture circuit and is the founder of the Golden Eagle Lacrosse Club, which operates clinics, camps and competitive club teams for the Milwaukee area lacrosse community. The Farmingville, New York native attended Sachem High School in Lake Ronkonkoma, New York, where he earned four letters in both lacrosse and football and was an all-conference performer.

Amplo graduated from Hofstra in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in geography and earned a master's degree in college student counseling. He and his wife, Jennifer, reside in Cedarburg, Wis. and have three daughters, Sophia, Charlotte, and Lily.

Amplo was named to the NCAA Division I Men's Lacrosse Committee on July 1 and was selected as an assistant coach with the U.S. Men Lacrosse National Team for the 2018 FIL Men's World Championship.

In addition to extending at-large invitations for the national tournament with the NCAA Committee, the group convenes each summer in Indianapolis to discuss pertinent topics to NCAA Division I men's lacrosse, including rules changes, NCAA Championship qualification and format, officiating and media rights.

With the U.S. Men's National Team, Amplo serves alongside Duke head coach John Danowski, whom he worked under as an assistant coach at Hofstra.

Amplo was also honored in 2017 as the USILA's Howdy Myers Man of the Year and a '40 under 40' honoree by the *Milwaukee Business Journal*.

WAGNER COMES UP CLUTCH AGAIN

• John Wagner has stepped into a more prominent role as the lone returning starter on offense and is leading the way for the Golden Eagles with 27 goals and eight assists in 2018. The St. Davids, Ontario native has five game winners through MU's first 12 games, including overtime clinchers against then-No. 4/6 Ohio State (3/2), then-No. 16/18 Georgetown (3/24), St. John's (4/7) and Providence (4/14). He also scored the winner against Jacksonville in the season opener on Feb. 17 with under 10 seconds remaining.

• Wagner tied for second on the team with 22 goals as a sophomore and posted a combined six goals against Denver last season, including a career-high four in the BIG EAST semis. He also scored a total of five goals at Notre Dame with a hat trick in the 2017 NCAA First Round.

• Wagner experienced an up-and-down freshman season in 2016, playing in all 16 games, but scoring in just two of them. The Canadian carved out a more prominent role on the first line as a sophomore and had an eight-game scoring streak that was snapped against Duke on April 22, 2017.

CONNOLLY GROWING INTO ROLE ON CLOSE D

• Junior Brendon Connolly is in his first season starting on close defense after playing his first two seasons at LSM and leads the squad with 16 caused turnovers, seven more than his closest teammate (Noah Richard with nine). The Towson, Maryland native picked up a career-best five ground balls against No. 14/15 Notre Dame on April 11 and took a handful of second half face-offs on the wing. He also chipped in his first career assist for a game-tying third quarter goal against the Irish after racing downfield to complete a clear himself. His 16 caused turnovers so far in 2018 rank sixth for an MU player in a single season.

BLAZER SECURES THE CREASE

• Goalie Cole Blazer earned his first BIG EAST weekly accolade of 2018 on March 26 when he was named the league's defensive player of the week after posting a then-season-high 15 saves in Marquette's league-opening OT win over Georgetown on March 24. He topped that mark with 16 saves at St. John's on April 7 in MU's second BIG EAST win.

• Blazer continued his stellar play in net during his first full campaign as MU's starter in 2017, culminating in BIG EAST Championship Most Outstanding Player honors. The junior made a total of 23 saves in the wins over No. 2 Denver and Providence and contributed to his own cause with a goal as time expired against the Pioneers in the semifinals. He posted a .521 save percentage as a junior with a 9.17 goals against average.

• He was named to the 2018 All-BIG EAST Preseason Team, is a two-time All-BIG EAST Second Team selection and has also been selected to the All-BIG EAST Championship team as MU won titles in 2016 and 2017.

NEW FACES ON OFFENSE

• Entering 2018, the Marquette offense returned just one of its top seven and two of its top 11 scorers from last season and has had to adjust without the services of Tanner Thomson, who is redshirting this season. Junior John Wagner and Jack Zerrillo were the only to players returning with more than two goals to their credit last season and MU has had to try different combinations early this year with varying results.

MU CLAIMS FOURTH TOP-FIVE WIN OVER OSU

• The Golden Eagles picked up their first win over a ranked opponent this season against then-No. 4/6 Ohio State on March 2 in the Midwest Lacrosse Classic in Pontiac, Michigan. The 8-7 overtime victory pushed MU's record to 4-9 all-time against top-five teams in the USILA Coaches' Poll, 18-6 in one-goal games and 33-1 when entering the fourth quarter with the lead (Marquette has since lost to Bellarmine in OT after entering the fourth with the advantage). In addition to the win over the Buckeyes, MU owns top-five wins over Villanova (No. 5) and Denver (No. 1) in 2016, as well as Denver (No. 2) in last year's BIG EAST tournament.

MARQUETTE IS THE TWO-TIME REIGNING BIG EAST CHAMPION

• Marquette won its second BIG EAST Conference tournament crown in 2017 with a 10-9 victory over Providence, following an 11-8 semifinal win over No. 2 Denver. Goalie Cole Blazer was named the championship's most outstanding player after making 23 saves in the two games, while then seniors Grant Preisler, Nick Eufrazio and Joe Dunn joined Blazer on the all-tournament squad. The Golden Eagles entered the weekend as the league's No. 4 seed and picked off the top-ranked Pioneers and third-seeded Friars to claim the league's automatic NCAA bid for the second consecutive year. Preisler posted a team-best seven points over the course of the tournament, while then-sophomore John Wagner played a big part in the semifinal win over Denver with a game-best four goals. It was the first time the four seed had claimed the tournament title.

ORSINI TIES MU FRESHMAN RECORD

• Freshman attackman Anthony Orsini tied a Marquette freshman record with four goals in MU's 13-6 win at Detroit Mercy on Feb. 24 and was named the BIG EAST Conference Freshman of the Week on Monday afternoon. His mark tied him with Conor Gately, who posted four on April 13, 2013 against High Point.

• Orsini also added an assist for five points, the second highest point total for an MU freshman. That mark is second only to Gately's seven points at Mercer on March 12, 2013.

MU USES SEASONAL DOME; AHPRC BROKE GROUND ON MARCH 6

• Marquette's seasonal dome over the FieldTurf Revolution 360 surface at Valley Fields provides a climate-controlled practice and game facility for the Golden Eagles during the winter months. The Golden Eagles played all their home games at Valley Fields for the first time in 2016, after making the move in towards campus from Hart Park in Wauwatosa, where they had played during their first three seasons.

• MU officially broke ground for its new Athletic and Human Performance Research Center at a ceremony Tuesday, March 6. The \$24 million, 46,000-square-foot AHPRC will be built in phases under a long-term master plan. The first phase will include:

- Space for faculty researchers who work in a wide variety of academic fields.
- Locker rooms and support space for the lacrosse programs and golf team.
- Additional strength and conditioning spaces for the athletic department
- centralized core of laboratories for conducting human performance research.

TWO FORMER WISCONSIN H.S. PLAYERS ON MU ROSTER

• For the first time Marquette has a pair of players on its roster who played lacrosse in the state of Wisconsin in Jordan Schmid (Waukesha, Wis./Kettle Moraine H.S.) and Moey Lardy (Cedarburg, Wis./Cedarburg). Schmid, who will redshirt the 2018 season after suffering a knee injury in the fall, helped Kettle Moraine to a pair of state titles as junior and senior, and posted 120 goals and 232 points in 71 games over his final three seasons. Lardy, whose parents now live in California, spent his first two years of high school in Cedarburg, Wisconsin and played with the Amplify Lacrosse Club. Either would be the first Wisconsinite to play for Marquette when they make their debut, as the only other player from the state to ever appear on the MU roster was Ryan Condon (Wausau, Wis.) in 2013, who never played for the Golden Eagles.

TANNER THOMSON TO REDSHIRT 2018

• Senior Tanner Thomson will redshirt the 2018 season, it was announced prior to the start of spring scrimmages. The 2017 All-BIG EAST Second Team selection is MU's returning scoring leader with 39 goals and 55 points in 38 career games and tallied 20 goals and added 14 assists as a junior in 2017. HERSHMAN ON PUERTO RICO NATIONAL TEAM

- Sophomore faceoff specialist Jared Hershman was announced as a member of Puerto Rico's Men's National Team for the 2018 Federation of International Lacrosse (FIL) World Championships in Netanya, Israel on July 12-21. He is one of 23 members of the active roster, along with nine alternates, and joins University of Tampa's Alex Patton as the lone face-off specialists. Puerto Rico gained membership to the FIL a little over a year ago and whittled its first-ever team from 80 eligible players following player assessment camps, tournament play and a two-day tryout.

- Hershman appeared in five games for the Golden Eagles during his freshman season at the face-off position, going 3-for-11 including two faceoff wins against No. 20 Ohio State. In the absence of Zachary Melillo due to injury this season, Hershman has done a respectable job in his place, including an 11-of-20 performance in the 2018 BIG EAST opener against Georgetown on March 24.

MARQUETTE ALUMNI HAVING PRO LACROSSE SUCCESS

- Seven recent Marquette student-athletes have found success in Major League Lacrosse since their days in Blue and Gold. Defensemen Liam Byrnes ('16) and B.J. Grill ('16) each finished up their second seasons in the MLL in 2017, as did current MU assistant coach Jacob Richard ('16), who was traded to the Charlotte Hounds during the offseason. Classmate Conor Gately ('16) was selected in the 2017 MLL Supplemental Draft and concluded his rookie season with the Rochester Rattlers alongside Ryan McNamara ('17). Andy DeMichie ('17) and Jordan Greenfield ('15) were each selected in the 2018 MLL Supplemental Draft by the Florida Launch and Boston Cannons, respectively.

MARQUETTE HAD HISTORIC 2016 CAMPAIGN

- The 2016 season was a historic one for the Marquette men's lacrosse program, which captured its first BIG EAST Conference tournament championship and hosted the first-ever NCAA playoff game in Wisconsin. MU's automatic NCAA berth came in just its fourth season of competition and its third as a BIG EAST member after playing the 2013 campaign as an independent. The Golden Eagles claimed the NCAA bid by defeating then-No. 1 Denver, 10-9, in the BIG EAST title game to snap the Pioneers' NCAA-best 22-game home winning streak. 2016 BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year Liam Byrnes led the charge for Marquette and was named the tournament's most outstanding player after leading MU to victories over then-No. 16 Villanova and the Pios.
