MARQUETTE VERSUS CINCINNATI - ALL-TIME SERIES RECORD

Tonight marks the 25th time the Golden Eagles and Bearcats have met on the hardwood, with MU holding a 16-8 advantage in the all-time series. UC has won three of the last four meetings. Last season, when both squads were members of Conference USA, Cincinnati picked up a 79-69 win over Marquette on Feb. 7 at the Al McGuire Center.

MARQUETTE IN THE BIG EAST

This season marks the first for the Golden Eagles in the BIG EAST - the nation's top women's basketball conference. Marquette captured its first game in the new conference on Dec. 6, downing St. John's, 60-57, at the Al McGuire Center. Last time out (Feb. 16), MU dropped a 74-59 decision at #8/6 Connecticut.

MARQUETTE IN THE AL MCGUIRE CENTER

The Golden Eagles hold an outstanding 30-6 (.833) record since the Al McGuire Center opened for play on Jan. 4, 2004 with a 76-42 victory over Columbia. So far this season, MU is 10-3 on its homecourt. Last season, Marquette compiled a 12-3 (.800) mark at home.

SENIOR NIGHT

Tonight marks the final regular season appearance at the Al McGuire Center for the Golden Eagles' trio of senior guards - **Amber Johnson**, **Tierra Shirley**, and **Carolyn Kieger**. They will be honored in a ceremony immediately following tonight's game.

IS 60 THE BAROMETER?

Marquette is 1-8 in games in which it records less than 60 points on the scoreboard this season. MU is 16-1 when scoring 60 or more points.

ROAD TESTED

Marquette is 7-5 so far on the road this season. All five losses have come in BIG EAST play. Last season, the Golden Eagles were 5-7 overall on their opponents' home courts.

TODAY'S RANDOM NOTE

Marquette is 0-3 in BIG EAST games against its former Conference USA colleagues. The Golden Eagles have dropped games at home to DePaul and at Louisville and USF.

MARQUETTE VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

MU has posted a 1-4 record this season vs. ranked opponents, losing at home to #13 DePaul and #7 Rutgers and on the road at #20 Notre Dame and #8 Connecticut. The Golden Eagles defeated #23 St. John's in Queens. Under Terri Mitchell, Marquette is 10-24 (.294) against ranked foes - including an 0-7 mark against teams in the top-10.

STARTING STREAK STOPS IN STORRS

At Connecticut on Feb. 25, **Danielle Kamm** and **Carolyn Kieger** each came off the bench for the first time this season. For Kamm, it marked the first time in 33 games - dating back to the Feb. 7, 2005 game at Louisville - that she was not in the starting lineup. For Kieger, it was the first time in her 117-game career that she was not among the starting five.

"Q" RATING = EFFICIENCY

Junior **Christina Quaye** is connecting at a 58.8% clip from the floor in her last four games. The Chicago native is 30-for-51, while averaging 15.2 points per game during the span.

ELLIS PHENOMENAL IN HER LAST 14

In her last 14 games, freshman **Krystal Ellis** is averaging 12.4 points, 3.1 rebounds, 3.4 assists, and 1.9 steals per game. She is shooting well from the perimeter, connecting on 45.1% of her shots (23-51), including. She is also connecting on 81.6% from the charity stripe - 31-for-36. Included in the span are two 20-point + performances (23 at WVU; 21 at St. John's).

QUAYE NAMED TO BIG EAST HONOR ROLL FOR THIRD TIME

Junior **Christina Quaye** was named to the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll on Feb. 20 - her third such honor this season. The 6-1 forward averaged 22.0 points, 7.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists, 1.0 blocks, while shooting 69.2% from the field (18-26) and 50.0% from three-point land (3-6) helping Marquette to a 1-1 record. Quaye scored 23 points at USF on Feb. 16, tying her season-high. She was 9-for-13 from the floor, while pulling down seven boards. Last time out, against Georgetown this past Sunday, she replicated her stat line from USF, going 9-for-13 from the field, while also grabbing seven rebounds. She was also named to the BIG EAST's weekly honor roll on Dec. 12 and Dec. 27.

KIEGER FINALIST FOR TOP POINT GUARD AWARD

Senior **Carolyn Kieger** is one of the final nominees for the 7th Annual Nancy Lieberman Award. The award is a national project of the Rotary Club of Detroit honoring the nation's top collegiate point guard in women's

They will select three finalists from this list and one winner at the end of March 2006. The announcement of the three finalists and one winner will be made during the Final Four Weekend (April 2-4th, 2006).

CLEARLY KRystal - BIG EAST ROOKIE OF THE WEEK AGAIN

Freshman **Krystal Ellis** was honored by the BIG EAST Conference as its Rookie of the Week, it was announced on Feb. 13. It is the second time the Racine native has been honored with a weekly award by the league office. She earned the same honor on Jan. 23. Ellis won her most recent award after helping pace Marquette to a 74-59 win at No. 23/24 St. John's on Feb. 8. She shot 8-of-14 from the floor, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range, while also recording four rebounds and three steals in 30 minutes of action. Ellis scored eight of the first 12 points of the game and 11 of the first 19 Golden Eagle points. MU's radio broadcast team - connected on five treys on Feb. 5 at Cincinnati.

MONFRE, BEFORE AND AFTER

Entering the Seton Hall game on Jan. 28, freshman **Erin Monfre** had struggled from the perimeter, connecting on just 7-of-41 (.171) from beyond the arc. Since then, the sharpshooter has connected on 15-of-30 (.500) from the outside.

CAREER-HIGH IN ASSISTS FOR ELLIS

Freshman **Krystal Ellis** tallied a career-best eight assists at Connecticut on Feb. 25. The total surpassed her previous single-game high of seven, at USF.

KIEGER TOPS IN BIG EAST; FIFTH NATIONALLY IN ASSISTS

Senior point guard **Carolyn Kieger** ranks first in the BIG EAST in assists per game. The 5-6 floor general is averaging 6.7 helpers per game (168 total assists). *According to the latest official NCAA statistics (as of Feb. 13), Kieger ranks fifth nationally in that statistical category.*

MORE ABOUT KIEGER'S ASSISTS

Senior point guard Carolyn Kieger tallied 10 assists against Georgetown - her second double-digit assist total of the season and the sixth time in her career she has dished out 10 or more helpers. In her career, she has registered nine or more assists in a single game 21 times and eight or more 33 times.

KOVALENKO TERRIFIC IN LAST 10

Sophomore **Svetlana Kovalenko** is emerging as one of the top reserves in the BIG EAST. In her last 10 games, the 6-3 native of St. Petersburg, Russia is averaging 9.1 points and 3.9 rebounds, while shooting 51.6%

from the floor (32-62), 50.0% (8-16) from the perimeter, and 82.6% from the charity stripe (19-26) during the stretch. *For the season, she is averaging 7.3 points and 4.8 boards.*

'TIS ALWAYS THE SEASON OF GIVING

In its last four games, Marquette has registered a remarkable 81 assists on its 92 field goals - a passing percentage of .880. Last time out at Connecticut Rutgers, MU had 20 assists on its 23 buckets. Against Rutgers, they had 19 helpers on 20 baskets. *So far this season, MU has 442 assists on its 617 field goals - a .716 percentage.*

HIGHEST POINT TOTAL IN ALMOST SIX YEARS

Marquette's 92 points against Providence was the highest total of the 2005-06 season. It was also the most points scored in a game since Feb. 3, 2000, when the Golden Eagles put 95 points on the scoreboard against Southern Miss.

AND THE FRESHMEN SHALL LEAD THEM...

The freshman trio of **Krystal Ellis**, **Erin Monfre** and **Marissa Thrower** were Marquette's offensive spark in the Seton Hall and Providence games. The trio of newcomers combined to score 36 points in each contest. Against Providence on Jan. 31, Ellis had 17, while Monfre added 10 and Thrower a career-high nine. On Jan. 28 versus Seton Hall, the newcomers total made up half of the team's 72 points. Ellis led the way with a game-high 16 points, while Monfre tallied a career-best 12 and Thrower contributed eight points. *In those two games, the trio shot 59.5% from the floor (25-42) and 52.9% from the perimeter (9-17).*

THE 1,200 CLUB

Senior **Carolyn Kieger** became the 12th Golden Eagles player to pass the 1,200 point mark in her career. She now has 1,236 points, which puts her at 10th all-time on Marquette's career scoring list and needs 54 to pass Tammy Shain (1989-92) for ninth on the list.

QUAYE'S "GRAND"

Junior **Christina Quaye** became the 18th player in the history of the Marquette women's basketball program to reach the 1,000-point mark in her career. Quaye achieved the milestone in the first half of the Jan. 25 game at Villanova. She now has 1,120 career points, good for 16th all-time.

TWO BOARDS, TWO ASSISTS...

That's all that point guard **Carolyn Kieger** needed to record a triple-double at St. John's on Feb. 8. The senior registered 10 points, eight rebounds and

eight assists in 35 minutes of action. In the 30-year history of Marquette women's basketball, no player has registered that statistical milestone.

COMEBACK FOR THE AGES - THIRD BEST IN NCAA HISTORY

Trailing by as many as 21 points in the first half - down 23-2 to start the game - *Marquette put together the third-best comeback in NCAA Division I history to win, 80-75, at West Virginia on Jan. 21.* On Feb. 20, Texas State erased a 32-point deficit, to take a 73-71 victory over Texas-San Antonio. MU's comeback is tied for the second-best comeback this season, as Dartmouth also erased a 21-point deficit to beat Siena, 86-82 in overtime, on Jan. 3.

THE KIEGER 600

Senior **Carolyn Kieger** became Marquette's second member of the 600-assist club. Only one other women's player - Joan Pitrof (689) - has achieved the feat. Kieger has 666 career helpers.

A PASSING FAD

With senior point guard and assists leader **Carolyn Kieger** out due to injury, the Golden Eagles picked up the slack, dishing out 23 assists on MU's 32 field goals - the second-highest total of the season. Each of the nine players who

saw action tallied a helper, led by **Danielle Kamm's** career-high six dimes. **Krystal Ellis** and **Amber Johnson** each had four.

KIEGER MISSES FIRST GAME OF CAREER

Senior **Carolyn Kieger** missed the first game of her career against Providence on Jan. 31. The 5-8 point guard did not play due to injury. She had started the previous 111 games.

SECOND SYLLABLE, RHYMES WITH "THREE"

Freshman **Erin Monfre** shook off a season-long slump from the perimeter against Seton Hall on Jan. 28. The 5-11 guard from Waukesha hit her first four attempts from the perimeter, en route to a 4-for-5 day from the outside. Entering the game, Monfre had hit just 7-of-41 from three-point land.

ELLIS NAMED BIG EAST ROOKIE OF THE WEEK (JAN. 23)

Freshman **Krystal Ellis** was selected as the BIG EAST Rookie of the Week on Jan 23 after a 2-0 week in which she averaged 18.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 1.5 steals. She shot an outstanding 70.6% from the floor (12-for-17), including 7-of-8 from three-point land (87.5%) and a perfect 5-for-5 from the free throw line. Against Pittsburgh on Jan. 18, she scored 13 points, on 5-of-8 shooting from the floor. But her finest effort of the season came at West Virginia on Jan. 21. The Racine native poured in a collegiate-best 23 points - 19 of which came in the second half. Ellis shot 7-for-9 from the floor and connected on all five of her three-point attempts. She was also a perfect 4-for-4 from the line. In addition to her career scoring night against the Mountaineers, Ellis also set new career marks in rebounding (7) and assists (5).

MORE KRYSTAL

Ellis' perfect 5-for-5 shooting night from the perimeter set a new Marquette single-game proficiency mark. Additionally, her five three-pointers made were the most in a game since Lesley Juedes '05 - now part of MU's radio broadcast team - connected on five treys on Feb. 5 at Cincinnati.

KIEGER IN VERY SELECT COMPANY

Senior point guard **Carolyn Kieger** is the only player in the history of women's basketball program to register statistical milestones of 1,000 points (1,236), 400 rebounds (458), 500 assists (666) and 185 steals (193). Only one other player in the history of the men's program has achieved such a feat - Tony Miller '95 (1,027 points/561 rebounds/556 assists/185 steals).

THAT LEFT A MARK

The 21-point loss to #7 Rutgers at home on Feb. 22 was the highest margin of defeat since the Al McGuire Center opened in January, 2004.

DOUBLE-DIGIT DEFICITS

The comeback against West Virginia on Jan. 21 *was the third time this season that Marquette had erased a double-digit deficit in the second half*, en route to a win. MU trailed by 17 against St. John's on Dec. 6 (60-57 win) and was down 10 to Wis.-Milwaukee on Dec. 18 (70-62 win).

DK AND THE SUNSHINE BAND

Junior **Danielle Kamm** tied her single-game career-best at West Virginia by connecting on four trifectas. She was 4-of-5 from beyond the arc versus the Mountaineers. Kamm did the same at Notre Dame on Jan. 10.

TRIPLE TROUBLE, Y'ALL

Marquette connected on 10 of its 16 attempts from the perimeter against West Virginia, including 9-of-12 in the second half. Freshman **Krystal Ellis** led the long-distance charges, hitting all five of her attempts from the perimeter, while **Danielle Kamm** was 4-of-5.

Junior **Jasmine McCullough** tied her career-highs in scoring (19) and blocked shots (4) at Syracuse on Jan. 14. The St. Louis, Mo. native was 9-of-14 from the floor, while swatting four Orange shots. She also pulled down seven rebounds.

DOUBLE DOUBLE-DOUBLES

Two Marquette players registered statistical double-doubles at Notre Dame on Jan. 10. **Christina Quaye** scored 10 points and tied her collegiate-high with 12 rebounds. **Carolyn Kieger** had 11 points and a season-best 10 assists. The last time two Marquette players tallied double-doubles in the same game came on Dec. 16, 2002, when **Crystal Weaver** (11 points, 10 rebounds) and **Carolyn Kieger** (16 points, 11 rebounds) did so at LaSalle.

HOLIDAY FOOD DRIVE A MAJOR SUCCESS

During the food drives on held in conjunction with the Dec. 18 Wis.-Milwaukee and Dec. 21 South Dakota State game, Marquette women's basketball collected 213 pounds of food, with all proceeds going to MU's Campus Kitchen at Marquette. The Campus Kitchen delivers meals to community service agencies in Milwaukee, and helps feed hundreds of individuals each week.

SVETLANA, FOR STARTERS

Sophomore **Svetlana Kovalenko** earned her first start of the season - and second of her career - against Rice on Dec. 30. The St. Petersburg, Russia native responded with a season-best 10 points on 4-of-5 shooting from the floor, as well as six rebounds and two assists in 20 minutes of action.

CAREER-HIGH DOZEN REBOUNDS FOR KOVALENKO

Sophomore forward **Svetlana Kovalenko** grabbed a career-high 12 rebounds against South Dakota State on Dec. 21. The native of St., Petersburg, Russia had seven offensive boards.

JUST ANOTHER CASE OF HISTORY REPEATING ITSELF

For the second consecutive year, the Marquette-Notre Dame game was ended on a last-second, buzzer-beating shot. And for the second straight year, it was Marquette that ended up on the short end. ND's Megan Duffy was credited with the final tallies in a 67-65 overtime win on Jan. 10 in South Bend. Last season, ND's Jacqueline Batteast hit a three-pointer at the buzzer to take a 50-47 victory at the Al McGuire Center.

GOLDEN EAGLES OFF TO A FAST START

Marquette began the season winning 10 of its first 11 games - the best start in program in history. During that stretch, the Golden Eagles posted an eight-game win streak - the second-longest win streak ever.

QUAYE NAMED TO BIG EAST HONOR ROLL AGAIN

Junior **Christina Quaye** earned her second BIG EAST weekly honor roll on Dec. 27, after helping to lead the Golden Eagles to their seventh straight win. The 6-1 forward scored 20 points and grabbed five rebounds, while shooting 7-for-10 from the floor. She earned the same award on Dec. 12 after averaging 21.0 points and 4.0 rebounds, while shooting 65% from the floor (13-20) - including 66.7% from three-point land - and 80% from the charity stripe (12-for-15). On Dec. 6, Quaye's season-high 23 points helped the Golden Eagles bounce back from a 17-point deficit in the second half to pull away from St. John's, 60-57 - MU's first-ever win in BIG EAST play. Next time out, at Penn State on Dec. 9, Quaye led Marquette with 19 points, on 6-of-8

shooting from the floor, including a career-best 3-of-4 from the perimeter.

KIEGER NAMED TO BIG EAST HONOR ROLL

Senior **Carolyn Kieger** was named to the BIG EAST honor roll on Dec. 19, after helping to lead the Golden Eagles to their sixth consecutive victory - a 70-62 over Wis.-Milwaukee on Dec. 18. With the win, MU improved to 8-1 on the season - the best start in program history. Against UWM, the Roseville, Minn. native tied her season-high, scoring 16 points on 5-of-7 shooting from the floor and 6-of-8 from the charity stripe. Eleven of her 16 came in the second half, as Marquette erased a 10-point deficit and built as much as a 10-point advantage. She also added four rebounds, seven assists and a season-best five steals in 36 minutes of play.

BROUGHT TO YOU BY THE LETTER Q AND THE NUMBER 3

Junior **Christina Quaye** connected on a career-best three three-point field goals at Penn State on Dec. 9. She was 3-for-4 from the perimeter. Entering the game, Quaye had hit just one of her previous attempts from beyond the arc this season.

DK DOUBLES IT UP

Junior **Danielle Kamm** registered her first double-double of the season against St. John's on Dec. 6. The 6-2 forward had 12 points and a season-high 10 rebounds.

Q FIRST ONE TO 20

Junior **Christina Quaye** was the first Golden Eagles player to score 20 or more points in a single-game this season. She tallied 23 points - three shy of her career-best - against St. John's on Dec. 6.

FAMINE AND FEAST FROM THREE-POINT LAND

The Golden Eagles entered the second half against St. John's on Dec. 6 in a shooting slump from the outside - connecting on just two of their last 23 attempts from beyond the arc - 8.6%. In the second half against the Red Storm, it was a different story. Marquette hit 4-of-7 from three-point land, including its last three: a trifecta by **Carolyn Kieger** that capped a 21-6 run over a nine-minute span; a game-tying trey by **Krystal Ellis** with 2:09 to play; and the eventual gamewinner by **Danielle Kamm** that gave the blue and gold the lead with 44 seconds left.

GOOD MORNING...

Junior forward **Danielle Kamm** connected on six of her first seven shots in the first half against Wisconsin on Dec. 2, including her only three-point attempt, to score 13 points in the first 20:00 of play. It was the highest first-half output by any Marquette player this season.

GOOD AFTERNOON...

After playing just seven minutes in the first half at Wisconsin on Dec. 2 due to foul trouble, junior **Christina Quaye** made the most of her 14:00 of action in the second half, connecting 4-of-5 shots from the floor and 4-of-8 from the charity stripe, en route to scoring 12 points.

GOOD NIGHT...

Freshman **Marissa Thrower** tallied a season-best three points at Wisconsin on Dec. 2, and they all came when MU needed it most. With the Golden Eagles up 20 points with 3:03 to play, the Badgers went on a 13-2 over the next 2:26, cutting the deficit to just nine points with 37 seconds to play. Thrower connected on one of two free throws and a layup, to help seal the deal for MU.

BE CAREFUL WHAT YOU WISH FOR

Entering the Wisconsin game on Dec. 2, it was noted that Marquette had not had a player foul out of a game during the 2005-06 season. Well, 26 personal fouls later, both **Jasmine McCullough** and **Svetlana Kovalenko**

fouled out. It was the first time one or more players committed their fifth and disqualifying foul since Feb. 5, 2005 at Cincinnati, when McCullough and **Danielle Kamm** both had their nights end early.

MCCULLOUGH EARNS ALL-TOURNAMENT HONORS

Senior forward **Jasmine McCullough** was named to the Wingate Classic all-tournament team for her outstanding play in Montana on Nov. 25-26. For the two games, the 6-1 St. Louis native averaged 14.0 points, 6.5 rebounds, and 2.5 steals. Against Montana State, McCullough poured in a career-high 19 points, including connecting on 9-of-10 free throws.

FRESHMEN EARN FIRST START

Freshmen **Erin Monfre** and **Krystal Ellis** each earned their first collegiate starts against Northern Colorado and Montana State, respectively.

FIRST THINGS FIRST

Freshmen guards **Krystal Ellis** and **Erin Monfre** each tallied their first collegiate points in their career against Oakland on Nov. 20. Ellis regular season. Ellis found the scoring column on a fastbreak layup with 12:22 left in the second half. She also connected from long-distance with 9:06 left, totalling five points. Monfre connected on a three-pointer from the left wing, with 3:54 left, giving the Golden Eagles their biggest lead of the game, at 25 points - 72-47. **Marissa Thrower** tallied her first collegiate bucket against Montana State on Nov. 26.

Carolyn Kieger scored 15 points - all in the last 10:00 of the second half - as Marquette rallied to a 54-46 win at Evansville. She was 3-for-4 from the floor - including a key three-pointer in the far corner with just under 2:00 to play - that helped seal the win for the Golden Eagles. Jasmine McCullough and Christina Quaye each tallied double-digits in the scoring column, contributing 14 and 11 points, respectively. Quaye pulled down a game-high 12 boards, to go along with four blocks and four steals. The first half was marked by tough defense and turnovers on both ends of the court, as the Golden Eagles and Purple Aces each registered 13 turnovers apiece. Both teams struggled from the floor, as well, as Marquette shot just 24% from the floor (6-25) and Evansville just under 28% (8-29). The Purple Aces took a 21-19 lead into the half. In the second half, both teams traded baskets for the first 6:11, before McCullough connected on a trifecta as the shot clock was running down, tying the score at 26-26. With 10:01 remaining, Kieger got her first numbers in the scoring column, connecting from beyond the arc off an Amber Johnson pass. Marquette would not trail the rest of the way, building as much as an eight-point lead - which was also the final margin of victory. It was McCullough's play early on that kept Marquette close in the first half. The 6-1 post player hit her first four shots from the floor, en route to a 6-for-8 shooting night. She also grabbed seven rebounds, dished out four assists, and blocked two shots. And down the stretch, it was Kieger and Quaye who helped shoulder some of the load, combining for 25 of MU's 35 points. Overall for the game, Marquette shot 34.8% from the floor (16-46), 22.2% from the perimeter (4-18) and 72% from the charity stripe (18-25). They outrebounded the Purple Aces, 46-31, and committed 25 turnovers.

Christina Quaye led four players in double-figures with 17 points, as Marquette cruised to a 72-58 win over Oakland this afternoon at the Al McGuire Center. Jasmine McCullough scored 14 points and grabbed five boards, while Carolyn Kieger added 12 points, seven boards and eight assists, Danielle Kamm chipped in with 11 points, six rebounds and three assists for the Golden Eagles, who improve to 2-0 on the season. Marquette started strong out of the gate, as Kieger connected with Quaye and McCullough for layups on the first three possessions of the game. Oakland scored five unanswered points, to take its first lead of the game, 8-6, with 3:15 into the game. Neither team gained more than a three point advantage for much of the first half, trading the lead and tying the score until a layup by Svetlana Kovalenko with 4:20 left in the frame gave MU a 27-25 advantage. They would not trail the rest of the game, building as much as a six-point lead - 33-37 - at the break. The basket was Ellis' first of her collegiate career. The Golden Eagles continued to build on that double-digit lead, going up by as many as 25 points, after Erin Monfre connected on her first collegiate field goal - a three-pointer, which put MU up 72-47, with 3:54 to play. Marquette shot 5-for-9 from the perimeter in the second 20:00. But Oakland did not give up easily, though, outscoring Marquette, 10-0, to close out the game. Amber Johnson scored eight points in her first start of the season, while Tierra Shirley dished out four assists in reserve play. Marissa Thrower saw her first collegiate action, grabbing four rebounds and tallying a block and a steal in 10 minutes of action. Classmates Krystal Ellis (five points, two rebounds, two assists) and Erin Monfre (three points, one assist) also saw their most significant action of the season.

Carolyn Kieger had a game-high 16 points, while Christina Quaye and Danielle Kamm each had 12, as Northern Colorado downed the Golden Eagles, 57-54. Kieger was 5-for-9 from the floor, including 2-for-4 from three-point land. She also added five rebounds and seven assists. Quaye and Kamm pulled down 11 and eight rebounds, respectively. The game was a tale of two halves, as Marquette (2-1) led by as many as 14 points. After the first media timeout at the 15:18 mark, both squads were knotted at 6-6. But the Golden Eagles proceeded to outscore the Bears, 17-6, over the next nine minutes, capped off by a Kieger trey. They led 31-17 at the break. The Golden Eagles defense held the UNC offense to just 17 points, on 8-of-30 shooting from the floor (26.7%) and just 1-of-16 from beyond the arc. MU held a 25-17 edge on the glass. But Northern Colorado - who came off a double-digit win over Illinois on Wednesday - came out firing in the second half, scoring 10 unanswered points before Jasmine McCullough's layup with 15:12 left. Again, UNC went on an 8-2 run, tying the game on a three-pointer from Jena Fosdick with 12:28 to play. Marquette responded over the next six minutes, taking a six-point lead at 49-43 - after Svetlana Kovalenko scored in the paint on a nifty turnaround layup with 6:02 to play. Northern Colorado whittled the MU lead to one, 54-53, after a three in the deep left corner. Marquette could not capitalize on its next two possessions, opening the door for Northern Colorado to take its first lead of the contest with just over a minute to play on a driving layup. Kamm missed a three on Marquette's next possession but McCullough grabbed the offensive board and tried to lay it in but missed - one of 18 missed layups for the Golden Eagles in the contest. Christina Quaye had 19 points to lead Marquette to its fifth consecutive victory, a 73-63 win at Penn State. The 6-2 junior was 6-for-8 from the floor, while also grabbing three rebounds in 26 minutes of play. The Golden Eagles (7-1) and Lady Lions (4-4) began the game trading baskets before a steal and fastbreak layup by Krystal Ellis gave Marquette its first lead of the game, at 9-8. They built as much as an eight-point lead, after a Quaye layup with 4:37 left made it 32-24. But PSU countered with nine unanswered points and took a one-point lead, at 33-32, with 1:55 to play in the half. Quaye's bucket with seven ticks on the clock gave MU a 34-33 lead going into the locker room at halftime. In the second half, Penn State began by scoring five quick points, taking a four-point lead. But Marquette began to settle down and match their tough play on the defensive side of the ball with some stellar offense. The Golden Eagles took the lead on the second of two free throws by Quaye with just under 17:00 to play, making it 41-40, and did not trail the rest of the way. MU built as much as an eight-point lead, at 54-46, after Svetlana Kovalenko hit a free throw with 8:40 to go. The Lady Lions went on a 12-5 mini-run, cutting the Marquette lead to just one at 59-58, with just under five minutes to play. That's when Jasmine McCullough took over, scoring five straight points - including a free throw which pushed the MU lead up to six - at 66-60 - with 2:01 to play. Marquette hit 5-of-7 free throws down the stretch to seal the game. McCullough added 17 points and seven rebounds while Kovalenko and Carolyn Kieger each chipped in with 10. Kieger played all but two minutes on the night, tallying six assists to just one turnover. Off the bench, Krystal Ellis added eight points, two assists and four steals. For the game, Marquette shot 45.5% from the floor (25-55), including a season-best 7-of-14 from the perimeter. They were 16-of-21 from the charity stripe (76.2%). The Golden Eagles outrebounded the Lady Lions, 34-28, and dished out 17 assists to 10 turnovers - just three in the second half.

Danielle Kamm scored 10 of her 13 points during a crucial second-half stretch, as Marquette extended win streak to six, downing Wis.-Milwaukee, 70-62, at the Al McGuire Center. The win improved the Golden Eagles' record to 8-1 overall - the best start in program history. Down by as many as 10 points in the second half - 37-27, with 17:50 to play - Marquette rallied back to take the lead on a Kamm trifecta with 13:24 left, making the count 41-39. Kamm capped off the 19-6 run with a traditional three-point play, giving MU a five-point advantage at 46-41 with just under 12:00 to go. UWM came back to take a one-point lead, after an Emily Markert three-pointer with 8:59 left. But it was short-lived, as an 11-4 Marquette run, capped by a Jasmine McCullough layup, put the game out of reach. The Golden Eagles led by 10 points - its largest lead of the game - with :21 ticks remaining. It was a sloppy first half for the Golden Eagles, who committed four turnovers on their first six possessions of the contest, en route to 13 overall in the half. Despite shooting 50.0% (12-24), MU did not lead during the first half of play, as UWM built as much as a seven-point lead on several occasions. UWM connected on 51.9% of its shots from the field (14-27) and took a 31-27 lead into the break. Carolyn Kieger led MU with 16 points, seven assists, and five steals. The Golden Eagles shot a season-best 55.6% from the floor for the game (25-45), including a scorching 61.9% in the second frame (13-21). They were 3-for-9 (33.3%) from the perimeter and just 17-for-28 from the charity stripe (60.7%). Both teams finished with 31 rebounds. Individually, McCullough tallied her first double-double of the season, scoring 11 points and pulling down a career-high 12 rebounds. Svetlana Kovalenko and Christina Quaye each had nine points.

Three Golden Eagles scored in double figures as Marquette defeated South Dakota State, 67-55, at the Al McGuire Center. With the win, the Golden Eagles extend their win streak to seven games, its longest since the 1999-2000 season. Christina Quaye led all scorers with 20 points and five rebounds, while Jasmine McCullough and Danielle Kamm chipped in 17 and 11 points, respectively. Svetlana Kovalenko added six points and a career best 12 rebounds, and Carolyn Kieger contributed six rebounds and a season-high nine assists. The Golden Eagles collectively out rebounded the Jackrabbits, 45-32. Marquette shot 47.4% (27-of-57) from the field for the game from the field for the game, compared to just 35.0% (21-of-60) from South Dakota State. After grabbing the early advantage, 17-12, on the heels of Kamm's eight points, South Dakota State rallied back for a 13-2 run midway through the half to take a 28-21 lead. MU came out of the locker room with intensity and scored six of the first eight points to take its first lead in almost 20 minutes, 36-34, three minutes into the second half. Marquette extended its lead to 10 points (48-38) with 12:29 remaining with the help of three buckets from McCullough. The Jackrabbits came back to cut the Golden Eagles lead to three (48-45) while scoring on three straight possessions. Marquette responded hitting back-to-back treys from Quaye and freshman Erin Monfre to keep the Golden Eagles ahead 55-47 with 7:05 remaining in the game. A 7-0 run helped Marquette push its lead to 14 (65-51) with 4:05 left in the game en route to the win.

Freshman Krystal Ellis scored a career-high 17 points but it was not enough as Marquette dropped a 67-52 decision at home to #13/11 DePaul. Ellis was 7-for-13 from the floor, including 3-for-6 from the perimeter. She also added four rebounds and four assists in 28 minutes of action. After a Danielle Kamm tip-in made it 7-7 just under 4:00 into the game, the Golden Eagles went cold and struggled to find a rhythm. DePaul went on a 12-0 run, taking a 21-7 lead. Christina Quaye finally got Marquette back on the board with a jumper with 9:32 left in the first. DePaul forced 23 Marquette turnovers and recorded 26 points off those miscues. The Golden Eagles made just 20 of their 60 total attempts for the game. Led by four players in double figures, Marquette won its second straight contest in BIG EAST play defeating Pittsburgh, 71-62, in its first ever matchup with the Panthers tonight at the Al McGuire Center. Pittsburgh's Mercedes Walker led all scorers with 21 points and 12 rebounds, but a balanced effort from MU - shooting 55.0% (22-40) from the floor - was the difference in the game. Junior Jasmine McCullough tallied a team-high 14 points, on 6-for-11 shooting from the field. Pitt jumped out to an early five-point lead (21-16) as the Golden Eagles struggled early on. But MU quickly found a rhythm. A jumper from Carolyn Kieger helped to spark a 17-2 run, as the Golden Eagles led by as many as 10 points with 1:36 left in the first. The Panthers rallied and Marquette took a four-point lead, 33-29, into the locker room at the intermission. The Golden Eagles ended the half shooting a season-best 60.9 percent (14-of-23) from the field. After Pitt scored the first five points in the second stanza, the Golden Eagles tallied six straight points, extending their lead to nine points (43-34) with 15:15 remaining in the game. Two Pitt buckets and two free throws cut the Golden Eagles lead to four, but two free throws from Kieger and a jumper from Krystal Ellis gave Marquette back an eight-point advantage, 48-40. The Panthers never came any closer than four points the rest of the way. Marquette took its biggest lead of the game, at 12 points (65-53), with 5:13 remaining after sophomore Svetlana Kovalenko made consecutive layups, en route to the nine-point win. Ellis added 13 points while Christina Quaye tallied 11 points and six rebounds. Kieger registered 10 points and nine assists - her fifth game this season with nine or more helpers. Despite shooting a meager 32.9% (24-for-72), the Panthers forced 21 Marquette turnovers and won the rebounding battle, 37-34, while tallying 20 offensive boards.

Krystal Ellis poured in a career-high 23 points, including 19 in the second half, as Marquette took home a terrific come-from-behind win, 80-75, at West Virginia. Ellis was 7-for-9 from the floor - including 5-for-5 from the perimeter - while knocking down all four of her attempts from the charity stripe. She also added a collegiate-bests in rebounding (7) and assists (5). Marquette began the game ice cold from the field, connecting on just one of its first eight shot attempts, coupled with eight turnovers. West Virginia - and its standout guard Meg Bulger - took advantage of the Golden Eagles' troubles, scoring 21 unanswered points and taking a 23-2 lead with 12:37 to go in the first half. Bulger had 11 of the Mountaineers' 23 points. A Jasmine McCullough layup ended MU's drought and began a mini 14-6 run, capped by a beautiful three-quarter court pass from Carolyn Kieger to Ellis with 6:51 to play, making it 29-16. But West Virginia would close the half outscoring Marquette, 14-9, and took an 18-point lead into the locker room at the half, up 43-25. After a McCullough turnover on Marquette's first possession of the second half contributed to a fastbreak layup for WVU, the Golden Eagles' offense kicked it up a notch or two. Or three. Three-pointers, to be exact. Ellis nailed the first of her five second-half treys the next time down, and the MU run had begun. Ellis and Danielle Kamm combined to shoot an outstanding 9-for-10 from beyond the arc in the second frame. With 10:30 to play WVU's Bulger picked up her fourth foul, as she hacked McCullough in the paint. She would go to the bench and the Golden Eagles would take over, using a 33-10 run to take the lead with 8:20 to play on Ellis' fifth trifecta. Marquette sealed it down the stretch with clutch 5-for-5 free throw shooting to close out the contest. MU shot a season-best 56.8% (25-44) - including 69.6% (16-23) in the second half - besting the previous season-high set last time out at home against Pittsburgh. Three other MU players tallied double-digits in the scoring column. Kamm and Svetlana Kovalenko each tallied 14 points, while Christina Quaye had 10. Kieger had nine points and eight assists.

Christina Quaye became the 18th player to score 1,000 career points tonight, but it was not enough as Marquette had its three-game game win streak snapped, losing 72-58 to Villanova at the Pavilion in Villanova, Pa. Quaye's layup with 8:47 left in the first half was the milestone field goal. She ended up with 19 points, on 9-of-14 shooting. The first half began with both teams trading baskets for the early moments. Marquette (13-5, 4-3 BIG EAST) led 8-4 after two Danielle Kamm free throws with 14:42 left. But the Wildcats (11-6, 3-4) would respond with eight unanswered points, making it 12-8 with 12:50 to play. The Golden Eagles tied it at 12-12 on consecutive buckets by Marissa Thrower and Kamm. Villanova went up six (20-14, 9:08), before two straight baskets by Quaye - including her 1,000th career point - cut it to 20-18. Once again, Nova went back up six (26-20, 3:57) before Carolyn Kieger scored five consecutive points, on a traditional three-point play and two free throws, making it 26-25. The Wildcats led, 30-27 at the break. Six of Villanova's eleven first-half field goals were three-pointers. Kamm and Quaye led MU with six points apiece at the break. Villanova began the second half on an 8-2 push, taking a 38-29 lead with 16:47 left in regulation. They extended their run to 13-4, after a three in the deep corner gave the Wildcats the first double-digit lead of the game at 11 points (43-31). For the game, Marquette shot 48% from the floor (24-50), including 2-of-5 from three-point land. They were 8-for-9 from the charity stripe and outrebounded the Wildcats, 33-29. They had 17 assists and 15 turnovers.

Freshman Krystal Ellis scored a game-high 16 points, while fellow classmates Erin Monfre and Marissa Thrower tallied 12 and eight points, respectively, as Marquette beat Seton Hall, 72-51, in front of 2,082 fans at the Al McGuire Center tonight. The trio of newcomers combined for half (36) of the Golden Eagles' 72 points in the game. Marquette 92, Providence 59 - Jan. 31, 2006

BIG EAST Conference Game - Al McGuire Center - Milwaukee, Wis.

With all five starters in double figures, led by freshman Krystal Ellis' 17 points, Marquette defeated Providence, 92-59, in a BIG EAST conference game. The Golden Eagles played without senior Carolyn Kieger, who suffered a sprained ankle in practice yesterday. It was the first time in 111 games that Kieger did not suit up and start for MU. Along with Ellis, junior Christina Quaye tallied 13 points; juniors Danielle Kamm and Jasmine McCullough each added 12 points and freshman Erin Monfre contributed 10 points. The Golden Eagles also had a solid night on the glass, outrebounding the Friars, 43-38, including 24 total boards in the first half. Quaye and Kamm led Marquette's rebounding effort grabbing eight boards apiece. Marquette also dished out 23 assists, led by Kamm's six helpers. The Golden Eagles started the game with a 7-0 run and hopped on a 12-3 run over six minutes highlighted by three treys from Kamm to lead by 15 points, 31-16. A lay-up from Ellis gave Marquette its largest lead of the half, 17 points (35-18), with 2:33 left in the first. The Golden Eagles took a 16-point advantage into the locker room at halftime, at 37-21. Kamm led all scorers in the first with 11 first half points on 4-of-6 shooting including three of her five attempts from beyond the arc. Ellis drained a three pointer to help the Golden Eagles open the second half. Marquette extended its lead to 24 points (55-31) with thanks to lay-ups from Ellis and senior Tierra Shirley. Marquette held onto the lead and pushed it to 37 (92-55), its largest advantage of the game, when Svetlana Kovalenko sunk her first trey of the game and then hit consecutive free throws to close out the game. Marissa Thrower and Svetlana Kovalenko each tallied nine points, while Amber Johnson and Tierra Shirley scored five points apiece. For the game, MU shot 51.6% (32-62) - the fourth time in the last five games that the Golden Eagles shot 50.0% or better from the field. Marquette's 92 points on 32-of-62 shooting mark its largest point total of the season and the highest total since scoring 95 points at Southern Miss on Feb. 3, 2000.

BIG EAST Conference Game - Freedom Hall - Louisville, Ky.

Jasmine McCullough scored 12 points and Carolyn Kieger 11 as Marquette dropped a 70-58 decision to Louisville at Freedom Hall tonight. It is the third straight loss to the Cardinals, dating back to last season in Conference USA play. The Golden Eagles struggled out of the gate, missing their first nine attempts from the floor, as Louisville raced out to a 7-0 lead. MU got on the board on a Christina Quaye layup with 14:59 left in the half. The Cardinals led 13-4 with 11:30 to go, before Carolyn Kieger knocked down a jumper from the foul line and Quaye added a triple, making it 13-9 with just under 10 minutes to play. Louisville responded with six unanswered points of its own over the next two minutes, to take a 10-point lead (19-9) with 7:48 to go. They led by as many as 16 points - 28-12 - with 3:26 to play, but Marquette closed the half on a 6-0 push, making it 28-18 at the break. MU shot just 21.9% (7-32) and were outrebounded 27-19 in the first half. Kieger and Quaye each had five points. Louisville started the second half scoring four quick points, but Marquette would quickly add four of its own as the two teams traded baskets for the first four minutes of play. Marissa Thrower converted a traditional three-point play with 15:50 to play, cutting the Cardinals lead to just nine - at 36-27. But the Cardinals would counter, going on a 12-6 push to take a 48-33 advantage with 10:47 left in regulation. Marquette answered with another run - 10-4 - capped by two Tierra Shirley free throws, making it 52-43 with 7:24 to play. But that was as close as MU would get as Louisville would deliver its final run - a 14-8 push over the next four minutes - going up by 15 points (66-51) with 3:30 to play. Quaye had nine points and nine rebounds while Svetlana Kovalenko also added nine points. For the game, Marquette shot just 35.6% (21-59) - including just 4-of-16 from the outside. They connected on 12-of-17 from the charity stripe (70.6%) and were outrebounded by the Cardinals, 39-33. They dished out 12 assists and committed 16 turnovers.

BIG EAST Conference Game - Carnesecca Arena - Queens, N.Y.

Krystal Ellis scored 21 points, leading five Marquette players in double digits in a 74-59 win at #23 St. John's. It was Marquette's first win over a ranked opponent since Jan. 8, 2004. Marquette began the contest scoring on its very first drive, as Ellis took it to the hoop for two. But St. John's would answer back with seven unanswered points. After another Ellis bucket, SJU connected on a three-pointer and led, 10-4, with 15:52 to play in the first. But the Golden Eagles would take over. A steal and fastbreak layup from Ellis, followed by a jumper from Carolyn Kieger at the elbow, tied the game at 10-10. Marquette took its first lead of the contest on another driving layup from Ellis, with 13:00 to go in the frame. The freshman guard tallied eight of MU's first 12 points. A long two-pointer by Kieger capped off a 10-0 Golden Eagles run that lasted 5:32. A deep trey from Ellis made it, 19-14, before back-to-back field goals from Jasmine McCullough put MU up 23-14, extending the run to 19-4 over 11:04. Marquette took its biggest lead of the break with 58 ticks on the clock - at 29-17 - as McCullough made one of two from the charity stripe. SJU added a late bucket and MU took a 29-19 lead into the locker room at the break. MU's defense held St. John's to just 17.2% shooting from the field. McCullough began the second half with a quick two, putting MU back up 12. But St. John's would respond, outscoring the Golden Eagles 18-6 over the 3:13 and tying the game at 37-37 on a jumper by Kia Wright with 13:23 to play. But that was also close as SJU would get. Four straight possessions with a three-pointer - two by Svetlana Kovalenko and one each by Christina Quaye and Ellis put Marquette up seven - 48-41 - with 11:07 to go. St. John's cut it to four - 54-50 - with 6:52 to go, before Kamm tallied five straight points - including the trey with 3:46 to go - as Marquette went up nine. The Golden Eagles sealed the victory by connecting on 13-of-14 free throws over the final 4:22. McCullough scored 11 points and grabbed five rebounds, while Quaye, Kieger, and Kovalenko each tallied 10 points. Kieger also added eight rebounds and eight assists.

USF 66, Marquette 57 - Feb. 16, 2006

BIG EAST Conference Game - USF Sundome - Tampa, Fla.

Despite Christina Quaye's 23 points, seven rebounds, and three assists, the Golden Eagles dropped a 66-57 decision to South Florida in Tampa tonight. She was 9-of-13 from the floor, including 2-of-4 from three-point land. After a Quaye bucket on Marquette's first possession, USF scored the next 11 points. A Jasmine McCullough jumper from the elbow with 14:55 left ended the run. USF took its biggest lead of the half - 11 points - after a bucket with 13:15 left made it 15-4. But the Golden Eagles would respond with an 10-2 run over the next 4:48, capped by a fastbreak layup by Carolyn Kieger, cutting the deficit to 17-14. But USF would respond with an 9-2 push of its own, taking a 26-16 advantage with 3:47 left in the frame. Erin Monfre would heat up in the closing minutes of the half - burying two three-pointers - the second of which cut the Golden Eagles' deficit to just four, at 30-26, with 1:39 left. South Florida would eventually take a 32-26 lead into the locker room at the break. In the second half, both teams played even basketball for the first seven minutes of the game before a Krystal Ellis spin move, followed by a pretty pass to Quaye made it a four point ballgame - at 41-38 - with 12:46 to go. Quaye hit a three with 9:14 left, beginning a stretch in which she scored eight straight points for the Golden Eagles, including a bucket which tied the game at 50-50 with 6:02 to play. Both MU and USF traded baskets for the next five minutes, before the Bulls' Jessica Dickson - the nation's leading scorer - hit a three at the top of the key with 1:44 to go, which put USF up 61-56. They sealed the victory - the first in 12 tries against Marquette dating back to when both teams were members of Conference USA - with late free throws. Jasmine McCullough added 12 points and eight rebounds, while Krystal Ellis had 10 points and a career-best seven assists. Danielle Kamm added six rebounds. For the game, Marquette shot 47.1% (24-51), including just 4-of-19 from the perimeter. They hit 5-of-9 free throws and narrowly outrebounded the Bulls, 36-35. The Golden Eagles committed 16 turnovers.

Christina Quaye poured in 21 points and Danielle Kamm added 15 as Marquette beat Georgetown, 67-60, in front of the second-largest crowd in Al McGuire Center history this afternoon. The attendance mark of 3,019 was the largest this season and ranked second behind the crowd of 3,165 for the Feb. 29, 2005 game win over DePaul. Quaye registered her second straight 20-point performance, as the Chicago native connected on 9-of-13 shots from the floor, including 1-of-2 from the outside. She also had seven rebounds. Marquette began the contest strong, leading by as many as 11 points - at 17-6 - with 13:05 to play in the first half. That stretch included a 12-0 spurt, capped by a Quaye layup. The Golden Eagles increased their lead to 12, going up 21-9 with 11:36 to play. But Georgetown would respond, opening up a 12-2 run over the next 4:23, cutting the MU lead to just two, at 23-21. Two free throws by Svetlana Kovalenko and a trey from Kamm put Marquette up seven, - at 28-21 - but the Hoyas would close out the half on a 9-2 push. Marquette entered the halftime break with a 32-30 advantage. Kamm led MU with 13 points at the break. The two teams traded baskets through the beginning of the second half before Georgetown's Kierra Marlow's jumper tied the ballgame at 39-39 with 14:23 to go. MU scored the next seven points, en route to a 21-9 run, capped by a trifecta from Krystal Ellis on the left wing, which gave the home squad a 12-point lead (60-48), with 6:18 to play. Georgetown would cut it to as little as four, with 41 ticks remaining, but free throws down the stretch from Ellis, Quaye and Carolyn Kieger sealed the MU victory. Kamm scored 13 of her 15 in the first half, connecting on 6-of-14 from the floor, while also tallying a team-high eight rebounds, two assists, and two blocks. Ellis added 10 points, three boards, four assists and two steals. Kieger dished out 10 assists - her second such double-digit performance of the season. Kovalenko added eight points off the bench. For the game, Marquette shot 43.1% (25-58), including 50.0% (13-26) in the second half. They had 22 assists to 25 field goals, and committed just 10 turnovers. They outrebounded Georgetown, 38-36.

Christina Quaye was the lone Marquette player in double figures, with 14 points, as the Golden Eagles dropped a 71-50 decision to #7/8 Rutgers at the Al McGuire Center tonight. The junior forward was 5-for-11 from the floor, connecting on 2-of-4 from the perimeter. She also had three rebounds. Rutgers won the tip and scored the first basket just six seconds into the game, en route to an early six point lead (9-3). The Scarlet Knights quickly pushed the lead to 10, at 15-5, with just over six minutes into the first half. The Scarlet Knights maintained a double-digit advantage for much of the first half before the Golden Eagles cut it to six - 23-17 - after Quaye scored down low in the paint. Rutgers responded with a 6-0 run to take a 12 point edge, 29-17, with less than five minutes remaining in the first and took a 33-24 lead into the locker room at the break. MU shot just 35.7% (10-28) in the first 20:00 of action, countered to Rutgers' 51.7% (15-29). Rutgers All-American guard Cappie Pondexter led all scorers with 20 points on 7-of-10 shooting, while Matee Ajavon added 18 points and nine assists, and Essence Carson contributed 12 points for the Scarlet Knights. Svetlana Kovalenko added eight points while also grabbing a team-high nine rebounds, as Marquette held a 31-30 rebounding advantage. Mitchell was pleased with the play of her sophomore super sub. Krystal Ellis added eight points, while Erin Monfre and Marissa Thrower each had six. Jasmine McCullough recorded a team-best five assists. The Golden Eagles registered 19 assists on their 20 field goals during the game.

Svetlana Kovalenko had 12 points and Krystal Ellis 11 as Marquette dropped a 74-59 decision at #8/6 Connecticut. Kovalenko scored 10 of her 12 in the first half, connecting on 5-of-9 from the floor, while also adding eight rebounds, two assists and two steals in 30 minutes of action.
