

MAROUETTE FACES RIVAL WISCONSIN IN NCAA FIRST ROUND

Golden Eagles and Badgers meet for the fourth time in the NCAAs

The Marquette University women's soccer team heads to Madison for a matchup with Wisconsin in the first round of the NCAA Championship at 7 p.m. on Friday at the McClimon Soccer Complex.

The Golden Eagles (12-7-2) earned an at-large berth to the NCAAs after claiming the BIG EAST Conference regular season championship and a runner-up finish in the conference tournament. Redshirt sophomore forward Carrie Madden leads Marquette with six goals and 17 points, while BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year Morgan Proffitt and Molly Pfeiffer have each recorded 13 points.

The last time the Golden Eagles and the Badgers met was in exhibition action on Aug. 11 when Marquette fell 2-0. UW's Dani Rhodes scored in the third minute, followed by Rose Lavelle in the 29th to give the Badgers a 2-0 lead and the final margin.

Marquette, which has received bids in 1999-02, 2005, 2008-13, and 2016, is competing in the NCAA tournament for the 13th time in program history. The Golden Eagles hold a NCAA tournament record of 9-9-4 and are 7-4-1 in first round games. The team has advanced to the second round six times and has reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2005, 2010, and 2012.

Wisconsin has reached the NCAA tournament, where it is 14-17-2, for the 19th time in program history. In their last outing, the Badgers fell to Michigan in the first round of the Big Ten tournament on penalty kicks. Wisconsin is led offensively by senior midfielders Rose Lavelle (five goals, four assists) and Micaela Powers (four goals, six assists) who each have 14 points this season.

Marquette is 5-6-2 all-time against the Badgers and is 1-1-1 against them in the NCAA tournament. All three NCAA Championship contests have come at Valley Fields, where MU has advanced to the Sweet 16 in 2014 on penalty kicks and topped UW, 1-0, in 2005 in the first round. Marquette dropped the first NCAA meeting, 3-2, to Wisconsin in 2002.

Should the Golden Eagles advance, they would face the winner of No. 1-seeded Florida and FGCU in the second round next weekend.



KEY MAROUETTE STORYLINES:

- The Marquette coaching staff was honored as the BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year, marking the fourth such honor from the BIG EAST for Markus Roeders and MU. Roeders also earned the honor twice in Conference USA
- Four MU players were honored with BIG EAST postseason honors, including BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year Morgan Proffitt. Proffitt earned a spot on the all-league first team, while Liz Bartels was on the second team and Maddy Henry and Emily Hess earned all-freshman team honors.
- Proffitt was named to the All-BIG EAST Championship Team along with Henry and Carrie Madden.
- Marquette's 12 victories surpass last season's win total of eight and give MU double-digit triumphs for the 20th time in program history. It is MU's highest win total since it went 18-4-0 in 2013
- The Golden Eagles earned a share of their sixth BIG EAST regular season championship and their 10th conference title overall (including Conference USA).
- Marquette has reached the quarterfinals of the BIG EAST Tournament all 12 years it has been a conference member and earned a spot in the semifinals for the ninth time in 12 years. It also made its fourth title match appearance.
- Freshman Maddy Henry has started every game in net for MU and recorded the first three shutouts of her career in consecutive wins over St. John's, Xavier and Providence. She added a fourth on Oct. 20 at Villanova and is a two-time BIG EAST Freshman of the Week.
- Carrie Madden, in her third year at Marquette, leads MU with six goals and five assists for 17 points.
- MU's Markus Roeders captured his 300th career head coaching victory on Oct. 23 against Butler. He is fourth all-time at Marquette in terms of overall victories behind former women's coaches Tat Shiely (basketball/volleyball) and Terri Mitchell (basketball) as well as current coach Jody Bronson (tennis).
- MU, which has played three overtime matches in a row on six occasions in program history, won three consecutive OT matches for the first time ever from Oct. 23-Nov. 4.
- Marquette's non-conference schedule included six RPI top-50 teams. MU sits 26th in RPI as of Nov. 7.
- Golden Eagles are making their 13th appearance in the NCAA Championship and their first since 2013.

SCOUTING THE BADGERS:

• Wisconsin was eliminated in the first round of the Big Ten tournament after falling to Michigan in penalty kicks, 4-2, on Oct. 30. Sophomore Emily Borgmann netted the equalizer for UW to tie the match 1-1, but after an even score in regulation and two overtime periods, the Wolverines would go on to clinch the victory after scoring four consecutive penalty kicks. UW sits at No. 35 in the RPI rankings and are led offensively by senior Rose Lavelle, who leads the team in shots with 69, points at 14 and goals with five on the year. Before the tournament, Wisconsin had not lost since Sept. 25 against Indiana and had alternated between wins and ties, most notably notching a 1-0 shutout win against then-No. 8 Minnesota on Oct. 1.

MU CAPTURES SIXTH BIG EAST REGULAR SEASON TITLE OVER DEPAUL

• Eli Beard scored her first goal of 2016 just 57 seconds into overtime against DePaul on Oct. 28 to lift Marquette to the No. 1 seed in the BIG EAST tournament and a share of their sixth regular season title with a 3-2 win over the Blue Demons. Senior midfielder Morgan Proffitt scored a pair of goals to help MU rebound from 1-0 and 2-1 deficits for the win. The regular season title is MU's 10th all-time, counting MU's decade-long stay in Conference USA.

PROFFITT RECOGNIZED AMONG NATION'S ELITE

• Senior Morgan Proffitt has continued to rake in accolades following an All-BIG EAST First Team campaign as a junior, placing her among the top players in NCAA Division I. The Columbus, Indiana native began the summer with an invitation to U.S. Women's National Team Under-23 training camp in Charlottesville, Virginia and ended up making the 20-person squad for a tourna-

After a gold medal performance with the U.S. U-23 WNT, Proffitt was named to the watch list for the MAC Hermann Trophy, a candidate for the Senior CLASS Award and selected as the BIG EAST Conference Preseason Defensive Player of the Year. Proffitt, the third MU player to ever be named to the MAC Hermann Watch List, has started 82-of-84 matches in her career and has recorded 10 goals, including four game winners.

• She was named a 2016 All-BIG EAST First Team selection and the BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year while leading Marquette to the league's regular season crown. Proffitt has recorded a five goals as a senior and tied a career best with two in the regular season finale against DePaul. She was also named to the All-BIG EAST Championship Team..

MU ONE OF MOST SUCCESSFUL CURRENT BIG EAST TEAMS SINCE 2005

• Since entering the BIG EAST Conference in 2005, Marquette has proven to be among the conference's elite women's soccer programs. The Golden Eagles have accumulated an overall record of 171-64-31 since that time and a mark of 92-22-10 in league action, which includes six regular season conference titles and a pair of tournament championships in 2012 and 2013. MU, which has missed the NCAA tournament just three times since its addition to the league, went a remarkable 39-1-1 in BIG EAST play in the four seasons from 2010-13.

NCAA RPI RANKINGS RECOGNIZE MU'S STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

• The NCAA's eighth RPI rankings of 2016 were released on Nov. 7 and showed the Golden Eagles second among all BIG EAST members with an RPI of 25. Georgetown paces its league counterparts in seventh place nationally, while Providence (No. 62), DePaul (No. 54), and St. John's (No. 73) also join MU in the top 100. Despite a .500 record (4-4-2) through non-conference action, Marquette's RPI ranking is boosted by pre-conference matchups with No. 1 Stanford, No. 20 Nebraska, No. 23 Kansas, No. 26 Northwestern, No. 37 Santa Clara and No. 49 Michigan.

BARTELS AGAIN SHOWING ALL-LEAGUE FORM

• The increased recent production for All-BIG EAST Second Team selection Liz Bartels has come after head coach Markus Roeders altered the midfield and forward units midway through league play to put her up further in the attack. Bartels responded with goals in the wins at Providence and VU and her ability on the ball has generated numerous chances for Marquette's offense. The Omaha, Nebraska native was an All-BIG EAST First Team selection as a sophomore in 2014 and a second team choice as a junior in 2015 and a senior this season.

HENRY IS A NEW FACE IN NET FOR THE GOLDEN EAGLES

- Freshman Maddy Henry joins an exclusive club of Marquette goalkeepers as just the fourth primary starter since MU's entrance to the BIG EAST Conference for the 2005 campaign. The previous three keepers started in net for the length of their entire MU careers and each earned multiple AII-BIG EAST accolades. Henry, a freshman from Omaha, Nebraska, hopes to join Laura Boyer (2005-07; Overland Park, Kansas) and Natalie Kulla (2008-11; St. Louis) as goalkeepers from America's Heartland to experience success in Blue and Gold. Amanda Engel (2012-15; Centennial, Colorado) graduated in 2016 and was a four-year starter and two-time AII-BIG EAST selection.
- The unanimous All-BIG EAST Freshman Team selection has also posted her highest save totals against the best competition MU has faced this year, putting up seven saves at No. 2 Stanford and eight saves at No. 24 Northwestern. Her first shutout came on Oct. 2 as she made six saves against St. John's at Valley Fields and followed that up with shutouts at Xavier on Oct. 6 and Providence on Oct. 9. HEAD COACH MARKUS ROEDERS

21st Year • Idstedt, Germany • UNC Asheville (1990)



Entering his 21st year as head coach of the Marquette women's soccer team, Markus Roeders has built a renowned program that is synonymous with success.

Moreover, he has developed a program with a winning tradition, one that is a consistently nationally ranked and one of the top teams in the BIG EAST Conference. It is evident by career accomplishments and emphasized by the results of past seasons.

With a career mark of 290-111-44 entering 2016 (.686 winning percentage), Roeders has proven he can coach a team that knows how to win. The Golden Eagles have posted winning season each of the last 19 seasons and have won no fewer than 10 games. He has guided MU to 12 NCAA tournament appearances and advanced as far as the Sweet 16 three times (2005,

2010, 2012).

During his tenure, Roeders has produced 118 all-conference, 66 all-region, and 12 All-America selections. His teams have won nine regular-season conference titles, including five consecutive BIG EAST regular season crowns from 2009-2013, and four tournament championships, including back-to-back titles in 2012 and 2013. In 12 NCAA tournaments, Roeders owns a 6-3-2 record when those games are played at Valley Fields and 9-7-4 overall.

Effective September 1, 1999, Roeders took on additional duties as a member of the NCAA Division I Women's Soccer Committee, which oversees all aspects of the NCAA Tournament and the NCAA's regional rankings. He concluded his assignment on the committee with the end of the 2002 season. He also served as chair of the Great Lakes Region committee. Roeders is involved with the National Soccer Coaches Association of America's (NSCAA) national and regional rankings committee and serves as Chair of the BIG EAST Women's Soccer Coaches Committee.

A native of Idstedt, Germany, Roeders began his collegiate soccer career at Brevard Junior College in Brevard, N.C., before transferring to UNC Asheville, where he became associated with former Marquette men's soccer coach Steve Adlard, then coach of the Bulldogs.

Roeders received an associate degree from Brevard in 1987. A two-time member of the Big South Presidential Honor Roll, he earned a bachelor's degree in business administration from UNC Asheville in 1990.

Roeders, who has a 'B' coaching license and is a head coach for the Region II ODP in which he has traveled to national tournaments as well as international events including France, Costa Rica and Brazil. He and his wife Katherine have a son, Kegan.

POWELL SPARKS THE MU OFFENSE

- Forward Darian Powell led Marquette in both 2014 and 2015 with seven goals in each of her first two seasons of action after sitting out both 2012 and 2013 with injuries (she aims to return as a sixth-year senior during the 2017 campaign). The La Porte City, lowa native scored four of her seven goals in Marquette's final three regular season matches last season as MU defeated Villanova and Butler before falling at DePaul in overtime.
- Powell has recorded four goals and an assist entering the conference tournament and has seen her production improve with an increase in minutes since her switch to midfield. She posted a goal and assist in the overtime victory over Butler and, after being named to the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll on Monday, Oct. 24, is on the precipice of breaking into the MU career record book. Powell is currently two goals away in 20 in her career, which would tie her for 10th in MU history, and one match winner shy of seven, currently the No. 10 spot in that category.

WINS AT PROVIDENCE AND VILLANOVA KEEP STREAKS ALIVE

- The Golden Eagles earned their fourth-straight win and third shutout in a row with a 2-0 victory at Providence on Oct. 9. That win gave Marquette its 11th victory all-time (11-0-2) against the Friars and its 11th shutout, as it has outscored PC, 32-2, in the history of the series. Providence's scoreless streak against Marquette dates back eight matches to Oct. 10, 2010 and a total of 693:42 of game time.
- Marquette's 2-0 win at Villanova on Oct. 20 was the eighth all-time in as many meetings against the Wildcats, who have never scored a goal against the Golden Eagles. MU tallied a pair of goals in the win to push their goal advantage in the series to 12-0. Marquette's final goal on Thursday came on a Villanova own goal in the second half, meaning the Wildcats have scored more goals for MU than they have for themselves in the history of the series.

GOLDEN EAGLES CONTINUE TO GET IT DONE IN THE CLASSROOM

- Twenty-five women on last year's 35-member team earned at least a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 during the 2015-16 academic year and were honored on the BIG EAST Conference All-Academic Team. That group includes three student-athletes who carried 4.0s through both semesters in redshirt freshman Courtney Dugan and juniors Caroline Fink and Kirsten Timmer. The Golden Eagles were also given the NSCAA Team Academic Award for the 2015-16 academic year with a cumulative GPA of 3.39.
- Fink, who holds a cumulative GPA of 4.0 as an elementary education and communication studies major, was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District 6 First Team and is currently on the Academic All-America ballot.

BARRINGTON HIGH'S PFEIFFER AND MADDEN BREAKING THROUGH

• Forwards and Barrington High School products Molly Pfeiffer and Carrie Madden lead the Golden Eagles in points this season and are playing key roles up top for Marquette. Pfeiffer scored the match-tying goal in the 89th minute against Milwaukee on Sept. 9 and the match winner against Michigan on Aug. 28. She now has a career-best four goals in 2016 after tallying three in each of the last two campaigns, while Madden has led MU in points during BIG EAST action, and scored her first career goal against Cal Poly on Sept. 16.

LIVE COVERAGE AT ALL-TIME HIGH IN 2016

• Outside of the Aug. 19 season opener at Nebraska, every match in 2016 will feature a live video broadcast, including eight of nine conference matches on the BIG EAST Digital Network through FOX Sports Go. The remainder of the home schedule will be streamed live through GoMarquette.com's All-Access player, while road non-conference contests will feature a video broadcast from the host institution. In addition to accessing FOX Sports Go online and through the iOS and Android applications, fans can now download FOX Sports Go to Apple TV, Roku and Amazon Fire TV.

NEW WORLD CLASS INDOOR FACILITY TO HOUSE MU SOCCER

• A new indoor athletic performance center, which will combine indoor playing fields for Marquette's soccer and lacrosse programs, an indoor track, and a world-class athletic performance research facility was announced on Jan. 29, 2015 by MU President Dr. Michael R. Lovell. The facility will be located on the 800 block of Michigan Street and is expected to house offices and locker rooms for MU soccer. Through a strategic partnership with the NBA's Milwaukee Bucks, cutting-edge faculty and student research in sports performance, medicine, nutrition and rehabilitation will enhance the performance of Marquette student-athletes and professional athletes worldwide.
