Marquette Opens Four-Match Road Tilt

The Marquette women's soccer team will put its four-match unbeaten streak on the line when it hits the road for a season-long four-match tilt beginning Friday, Oct. 3. The Golden Eagles will first travel down I-94 to Chicago to play DePaul on Friday, at 3 p.m., before heading to No. 1 Notre Dame on Sunday at 2:30 p.m. CT.

A Closer Look at the Golden Eagles

The Golden Eagles (6-3-2, 2-0-1) will look to extend their unbeaten streak after defeating USF and Connecticut 1-0 and tying Pepperdine (0-0) and Providence (1-1). Sophomores Julia Victor and Kristi Laurenzi each scored for Marquette last weekend. Laurenzi's goal in the 27th minute against UConn marked MU's first first-half goal of the season, and the seventh Golden Eagle to score. In net, redshirt freshman Natalie Kulla has started the last five matches in net, has allowed just one goal in conference play and owns a 0.40 goals against average, which ranks fourth in the BIG EAST and 13th in the nation.

Scouting DePaul

The Blue Demons enter the MU game with a 2-9-0 overall record and are still without a win in BIG EAST play. Sophomore Tara Strickland leads the team with seven points (2g, 3a). Sophomore Jenna Fagerman and freshman Michelle Scandora have each tallied two goals this season, while sophomore goalkeeper Kelsey Hoinkes has seen just over 700 minutes in nine games, tallying a 2.17 goals against average. The team's only two wins of the season have come with Hoinkes in net. DePaul returned nine starters from last season, when they finished last in the BIG EAST's National Division. The Blue Demons roster also features 20 underclassmen.

The top-ranked Fighting Irish are the only undefeated and untied team in the nation at 10-0-0 (3-0-0 BIG EAST). Notre Dame will host USF on Friday, before its match-up with the Golden Eagles

Marquette will have its hands full with Notre Dame as its scoring offense ranks third in the nation and boasts three players who each have scored more than 10 points this season. Defensively, Notre Dame boasts a .958 save percentage, allowing just three goals on the season. Senior All-American forward and MAC Hermann Trophy candidate Kerri Hanks leads the team with 10 goals and two assists, and tops the BIG EAST in goals and points. Freshman Melissa Henderson is second in the BIG EAST with eight goals and third in the league with 16 points. Junior Kelsey Lysander has seen the vast majority of minutes in net, allowing three goals in 802:33. The Notre Dame defense has stifled teams this season, allowing just 23 shots on goal.

Sunday's match will be the fifth all-time meeting between the two schools. Notre Dame has had the upper hand over the Golden Eagles, leading the all-time series 3-1.

In both schools first meeting since 1996 on Sept. 30, 2005, the Golden Eagles upset the Fighting Irish, 4-1, at Valley Fields. Notre Dame avenged that loss with a 3-0 win over Marquette in the 2005 BIG EAST semifinals, and knocked MU out of the 2006 BIG EAST Tournament with a 2-0

The Marquette women’s soccer team placed another Golden Eagle on the BIG EAST Honor Roll following an undefeated weekend as junior defender Katie Miller was MU’s latest honoree. It was announced Sept. 29 by conference officials. Miller’s selection marked the fourth honor roll nod the Golden Eagles have received this season.

Miller played an integral role in Marquette’s win and tie this weekend as she played the entire 200 minutes over both games. She was a part of MU’s defensive contingent that allowed just one goal on the weekend and held Connecticut scoreless.

Last Time Out

It was an all out battle Sunday afternoon at Valley Fields as the Marquette women’s soccer team used its first first-half goal of the season to defeat Connecticut, 1-0. Sophomore Kristi Laurenzi scored the decisive goal in the 27th minute.

Spread the Wealth

Despite the scoring drought, the Golden Eagles have proved that at any given time anyone can step up and score as seven different MU players have tallied a goal. Sophomore Julia Victor and junior Kelly Wepking each have two goals apiece, while sophomores Lauren Acree, Ashley Bares, Rosie Malone-Povolny and Kristi Laurenzi, and freshman Danielle Martens each have tallied one score this season.

Kulla Named BIG EAST Goalkeeper of the Week

Redshirt freshman Natalie Kulla earned BIG EAST Goalkeeper of the Week honors on Sept. 22 following a pair of shutouts in which she totaled seven saves and helped the Golden Eagles go 1-0-1. The freshman recorded 208:24 minutes of scoreless play in net last week, including four saves in an overtime win at USF on Sept. 19. Kulla also blanked Pepperdine for 110:00 and totaled five saves, including a pivotal stop in the first overtime from Pepperdine’s leading scorer. Along with the 83:29 scoreless minutes she

registered at Auburn (Sept. 14), Kulla pushed her scoreless streak in net to 292:53.

Cusick Honor Roll x3

Senior defender Shannon Cusick was named to the BIG EAST Honor Roll Sept. 22 for the third time this season. Cusick played all 208-plus minutes last weekend and was integral to limiting USF and Pepperdine to 16 total shots. Against USF, the Golden Eagles’ stifling defense allowed just six shots, two of which were on goal. Against Pepperdine, Cusick controlled MU’s defense when Pepperdine was awarded five corner kicks in a 20-minute block of time in the second half, and allowed just three shots total in overtime.

Let’s Take Shots

Regardless of the number of goals the Golden Eagles have scored this season, one thing that is not lacking is the amount of scoring opportunities they have created. Marquette has out-shot its foes 195-87 putting 77 of those attempts on goal. Against Samford, MU put a season high 16 shots on target. The Golden Eagles average 17.7 shots per game.

Home Sweet Home

Protecting their home pitch is something the Golden Eagles do not take lightly, and it shows as Marquette is an impressive 106-30-9 all-time at Valley Fields.

Cusick Named to BIG EAST Honor Roll, Again

For the second consecutive week senior Shannon Cusick was named to the BIG EAST Honor Roll (for the week of Sept. 8-14) announced by league officials on Sept. 8. Cusick played an integral role in Marquette’s 1-1 week, where despite out-shooting No. 24 Wis.-Milwaukee 15-5, the Golden Eagles dropped a 1-0 decision to the Panthers to mark MU’s first loss of the season.

Cusick was a critical defensive presence in MU’s overtime win over BYU where the Cougars took 12 shots, the most Marquette has allowed in a single game all season, but helped hold BYU’s leading scorer and MAC Herman Award candidate Katie Larkin to just one shot for the match.

Better Late than Never

Marquette has had a way of keeping the game interesting as all eight of its nine goals scored this season have come after the 69th minute. Four of MU goals have come in the 90th minute, or in overtime. The Golden Eagles are 3-0-2 in overtime games.
