Marquette Returns to Valley Fields to Host Louisville and Cincinnati

The Marquette women's soccer team returns to the friendly confines of Valley Fields this weekend as it opens a four-match homestand to complete the regular season. Marquette will host a pair BIG EAST National Division foes in Louisville on Friday, Oct. 17, at 7 p.m., and Cincinnati on Sunday, Oct. 19, at 1 p.m. A live webstream radio broadcast will be available for both games courtesy of WMUR, as well as live stats via gametracker.

A Closer Look at the Golden Eagles

Marquette (9-4-2, 3-1-1 BIG EAST) sits atop the American Division standings, with 16 points, four points ahead of West Virginia. The Golden Eagles look to extend its two-match win streak after a double-overtime victory at St. John's, 2-1, and a 1-0 shutout of Syracuse. Soccer Buzz and Soccer America National Team of the Week member Ashley Bares scored both game winners last weekend and is second on the team with seven points with three goals and one assist. Sophomore Julia Victor leads the team with eight points on three goals and two assists. Including Bares' and Victor's tallies, 10 Golden Eagles have registered goals this season.

Reigning BIG EAST Rookie of the Week goalkeeper, Natalie Kulla, has started the last nine games. She has the league's seventh-best goals against average, 0.71, and tied for the sixth-best shutout total with five.

Scouting Louisville

The Cardinals (5-5-3, 3-2-2 BIG EAST), who stand tied for fifth place (11 points) in the BIG EAST National Division, will round out a season-long four-match road tilt this weekend at MU and USF. Louisville has tallied 21 goals, led by junior Lindsay Boling with six goals, who also leads the team with 12 points. Goalkeepers Katie Zoeller and Chloe Kiefer have split time in net, playing six and eight games apiece. Junior Zoeller has allowed five goals in 510:00, for a goals against average of 0.88. In over 700 minutes in net, freshman Kiefer has allowed 12 goals, with a goals against average of 1.45.

Marquette is 11-5-1 all-time against the Cardinals. The Golden Eagles will be looking to avenge the 1-0 loss they suffered in the 2007 BIG EAST Tournament Quarterfinals when the two teams last met.

A Sneak Peak at Cincinnati

Cincinnati (7-5-2, 3-2-2 BIG EAST), tied for fifth place (11 points) with Louisville, is unbeaten in its last four games under first-year head coach Michelle Salmon. The Bearcats registered wins over Connecticut (2-1) and Seton Hall (2-0), and tied Providence (1-1) and Rutgers (0-0). Nine different players have scored this season for Cincinnati led by freshman Julie Morrissey and junior Melissa Bigg with four and three goals each, respectively. Junior goalkeeper Andrea Kaminski was named the BIG EAST Goalkeeper of the Week for Oct. 13, following a pair of shutouts against Seton Hall and Rutgers. She has been credited with three shutouts and a 1.42 goals against average over 1,269 minutes in net.

The Golden Eagles have a 10-8-2 advantage over 15 years of play with the Bearcats. The last match finished in a 1-1 draw at Cincinnati last season. UC will play at USF on Friday before traveling to Milwaukee.

“Quoting” Coach Roeders

“Our team understands that we have a lot to play these last two weekends of the regular season and it will be good to play at home. Our ladies are focused and we are in a position where our defensive game is very good, and offensively we seem to click. Earlier in the year, we created chances but didn’t necessarily convert them. Since then, those chances have turned into goals and ultimately into winning games.”

Last Time Against Louisville

The Marquette women’s soccer team saw its run for the BIG EAST Tournament Championship halted with a 1-0 heartbreaking loss at Louisville Nov. 4, 2007, in the BIG EAST Quarterfinals. Kate Cunningham scored the lone goal of the game off a penalty kick Louisville was awarded after junior Shannon Cusick was called for a foul inside the penalty box at the 17:54 mark.

Last Time Against Cincinnati

Senior Allison Mallams scored her third goal of the weekend as the Marquette women’s soccer team battled to a 1-1 double overtime tie at Cincinnati on Oct. 21, 2007. It was the Golden Eagles third straight tie of the season, fourth overall. For the game, Marquette out-shot Cincinnati 33-12, 21 shots were on goal. Mallams launched a school record 12 shots, nine of which were on goal. Marquette found the back of net to go ahead 1-0 in the 62nd minute when Mallams ran onto a through ball from senior Christy Zwolski and knocked it past Kaminski for the score.

Marquette fired off four shots following its goal in attempt to score again, but one defensive miscue led to Erin MacDonald scoring Cincinnati’s game-tying goal at the 78:45 mark. Melissa Bigg found MacDonald open in front of MU’s goal and MacDonald put it past Boyer on the far post to even the score 1-1.

National Nods

The accolades continue to roll in for the Marquette women’s soccer team this week. Sophomore forward Ashley Bares picked up two national honors Tuesday to go along with her BIG EAST Honor Roll nod as she was named to Soccer America Women’s Team of the Week and the Soccer Buzz Elite Team of the Week.

Bares tallied both of Marquette’s game-winning goals last weekend as the Golden Eagles defeated St. John’s, 2-1 in double overtime and shutout Syracuse, 1-0. She first scored MU’s golden goal in the 103rd minute in MU’s win over the Red Storm, and followed that up with the lone goal in a 1-0 defeat at Syracuse. Bares has registered three goals

this season - all three strikes have been credited as game winners. She is currently second on the team with seven points (3g, 1a).

Kulla Named League’s Top Rookie (Oct. 13)

Following a pair of BIG EAST American Division wins over St. John’s and Syracuse, redshirt freshman Natalie Kulla was named BIG EAST Rookie of the Week.

Kulla totaled seven saves over 192:52 in a 2-0-0 week for the Golden Eagles. She had three saves in a 2-1 double overtime win at St. John’s on Oct. 10 and posted four saves in a 1-0 win at Syracuse on Oct. 12. The shutout against the Orange was her fifth of the season. This is the first BIG EAST Rookie of the Week award for Kulla and the second weekly honor for her as she was named BIG EAST Goalkeeper of the Week on Sept. 22, 2008.

Last Time Out

For the second consecutive game sophomore Ashley Bares scored the game-winning goal as the Marquette women’s soccer team topped Syracuse, 1-0, at SU Soccer Stadium Sunday afternoon. Bares scored the lone goal of the game in the 28th minute as her sister, junior Brittany Bares, served the ball in and Ashley was able to bury it far post. It was all the Golden Eagles needed to hang on for the win despite the numerous chances to score.

Miller Named to the BIG EAST Honor Roll

The Marquette women’s soccer team placed another Golden Eagle on the BIG EAST Honor Roll as junior defender Katie Miller was MU’s latest honoree. It was announced Sept. 29 by conference officials. Miller’s selection marked the fourth honor roll nod the Golden Eagles have received this season.

Spread the Wealth

The Golden Eagles have proved that at any given time anyone can step up and score, as nine different MU players have tallied a goal. Sophomore Julia Victor leads the team with three goals, while junior Kelly Wepking, sophomore Kristi Laurenzi and freshman Danielle Martens each have two goals apiece. Junior Becky Ryan, sophomores Lauren Acree, Ashley Bares, and Rosie Malone-Povolny each have tallied one score this season, and senior Katie Kelly and junior Anna Sawicki scored their first goals of the season in a 4-2 win at DePaul.

All-Tournament Team

Following its runner-up honors in the Milwaukee Cup, despite finishing 2-0, three Golden Eagles were named to the all-tournament team. Senior defender Shannon Cusick, junior goal keeper Chelsey Turner and sophomore midfielder Lauren Acree each were named to the all-tournament team.

TV Time

For the second straight season Time Warner Sports Channel 32 will broadcast Marquette men's and women's soccer and volleyball matches. Time Warner Sports will produce two women's soccer matches against Wis.-Milwaukee (Sept. 3) and Pittsburgh (Oct. 26).

MU Picked Third in the BIG EAST

The Marquette women's soccer team was selected to finish third in the American Division in the 2008 BIG EAST preseason women's soccer poll announced by conference officials. The votes were cast by the league's 16 head coaches, who were not permitted to vote for their own team or players.

Notre Dame and West Virginia were tabbed as the favorites as the Irish received all 15 first-place votes and were picked to win the National Division, while the Mountaineers received nine first-place votes and were picked to win the America Division. Both programs also won their respective divisions last year.

The Golden Eagles, who finished the 2007 season 12-4-4, picked up 90 points - the fifth highest overall point total behind Notre Dame, West Virginia, Connecticut and Louisville. Marquette finished third last season in the American Division with a 5-3-3 conference mark.

Roeders Weekly Podcasts

As part of Golden Eagle Podcasts each week, men's soccer head coach Louis Bennett and women's soccer head coach Markus Roeders will participate in a weekly coaches' show podcast. The podcast interviews will reflect on the previous weekend's game and a look ahead to the next.

Kelly Selected to Preseason All-BIG EAST Team

Senior defender Katie Kelly, a third team All-BIG EAST selection from a season ago, was selected to the All-BIG EAST Preseason Team. Kelly returns to Marquette for her final season to help lead Marquette's defensive contingent. She was a key component of MU's stifling backline that recorded a program record 12 shutouts and didn't allow a goal through nine of the Golden Eagles' first 10 games of the 2007 season. She has also been Marquette's secret weapon on offense

each of the last three seasons, as she stands third on MU's all-time assists list with 22. Last season she ranked third in the league with nine assists, a mark that is the third best single-season total in program history.
